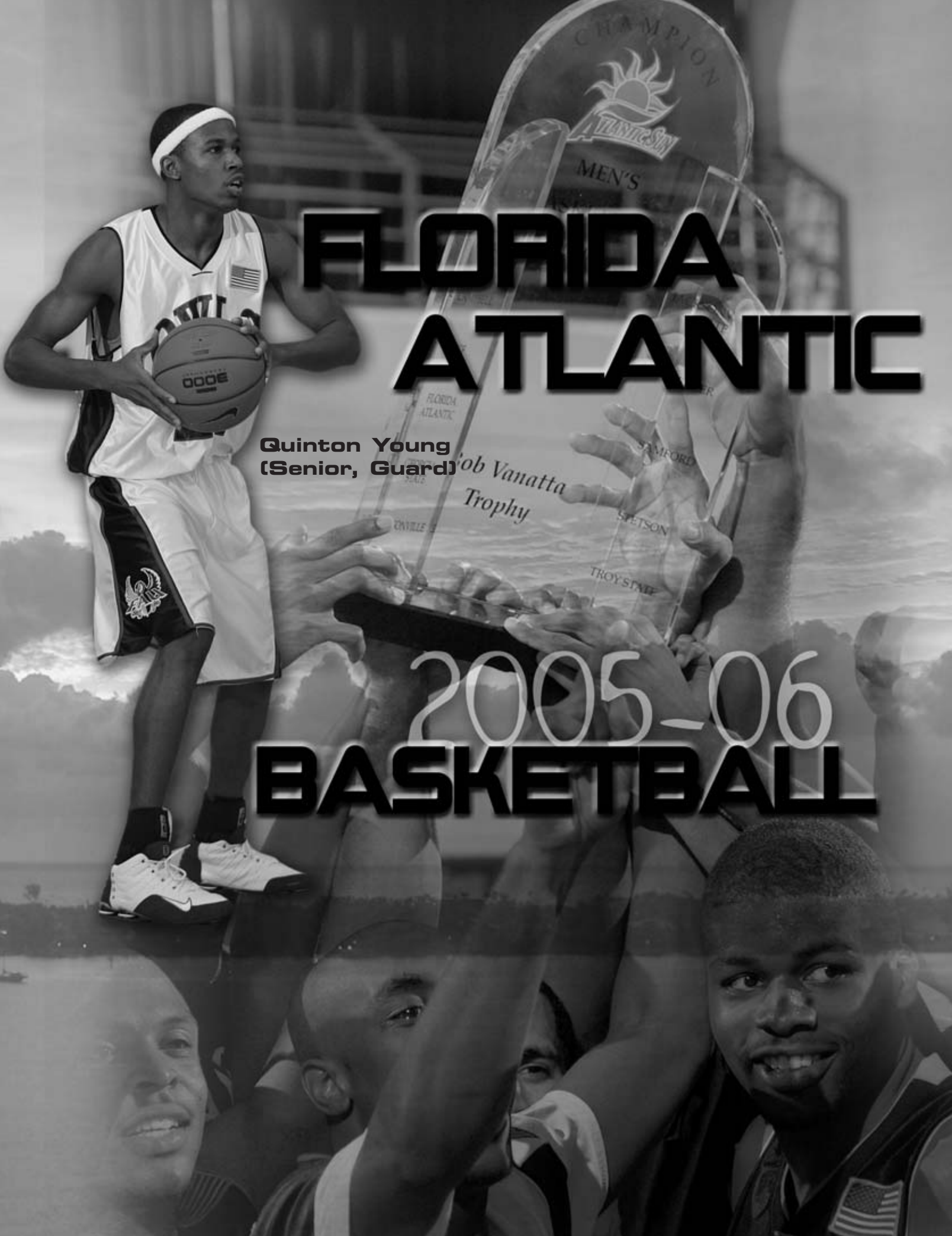




COACH MATT DOHERTY

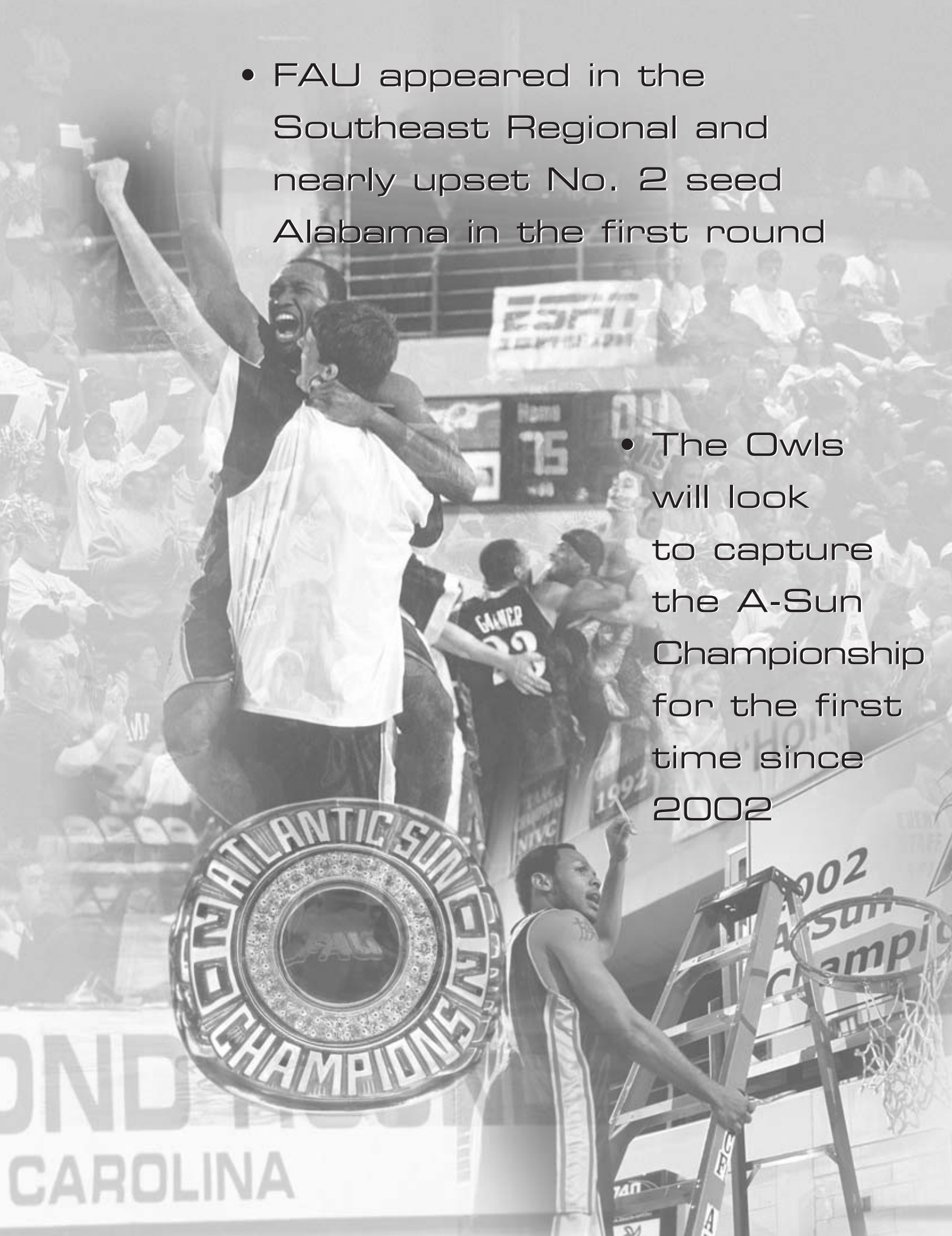

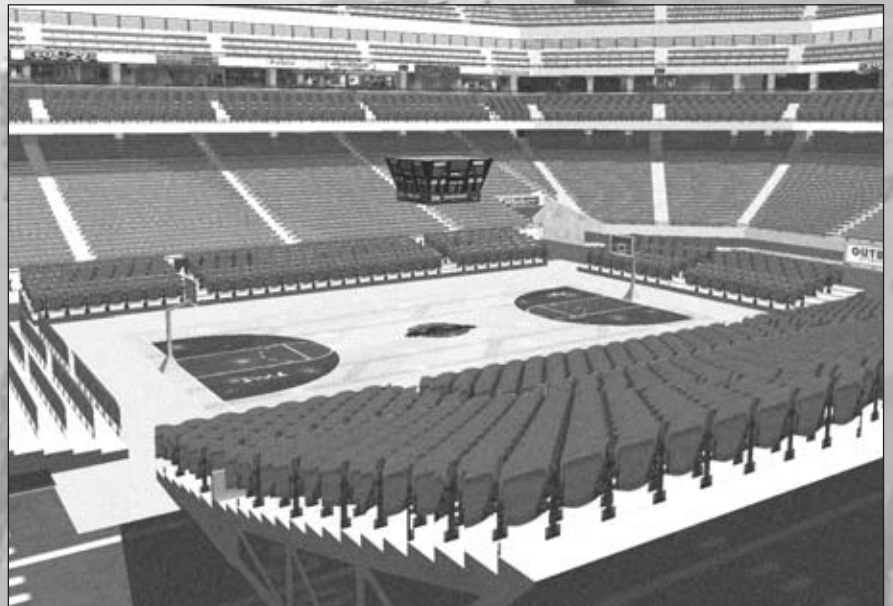

DIRECTIONS TO FAU ARENA

FAU Arena is located on Florida Atlantic University's Boca Raton campus. From I-95, take exit 45 (Glades Road) and go east approximately one-half mile. The main entrance is on the left side of the road. After turning left, proceed straight for approximately one-quarter of a mile. After passing through a traffic light, take the first left and the gymnasium will be on the right.

CREDENTIALS

Media credentials are issued to members of the working media only. Working space at the media tables is assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis. Please call in advance to allow phone lines to be assigned. There is no charge for parking.

Requests for credentials should be made either in writing or by phone to: Florida Atlantic University, Athletic Media Relations Office-Oxley, 777 Glades Road, Boca Raton, FL 33431. The phone number is (561) 297-3163. Requests may also be faxed to (561) 297-3499.

Working members of the media are asked to present press credentials at the main entrance where they will be directed to seating. Only those who have received credentials through the sports information office will be allowed access to the designated media area.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Per NCAA guidelines, still photographers and videographers will be allowed to shoot from six feet beyond each baseline. Photographers must sit or kneel while shooting.

Due to lighting, strobe lights are helpful. Prior to set-up, it is recommended to consult with the Athletic Media Relations Office at least three weeks in advance.

MEDIA SERVICES

The media entrance to the FAU Gymnasium is the main entrance. Programs, media guides and game notes are available prior to the in the media room, and complete statistical packages are distributed following the game. There will be a telephone line available for filing stories as well as a fax machine in the gymnasium. For special phone line needs, please contact the Athletic Media Relations Office in advance.

PHONE LINES FOR RADIO

All requests for phone lines for visiting radio crews must be made at least one month in advance through the Athletic Media Relations Office. Standard, analog phone line service is available at FAU Gymnasium. For non-conference opponents, there will be a charge of \$75 per phone line for radio broadcasts. For conference opponents, there will be one courtesy line available and a \$75 charge for additional lines. Requests for additional phone lines or ISDN service will need to be directed through Bell South. Please contact the Athletic Media Relations Office for information.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Matt Doherty, members of his staff or players during the season, must be coordinated through the Athletic Media Relations Office. For phone interviews, all players will be asked to return calls. The Athletic Media Relations Office will not release player telephone numbers.

Practices are open to the media if advance arrangements are made through the Athletic Media Relations Office. It is suggested to make arrangements at least one day prior to attending practice.

Post-game interviews with Coach Doherty and the visiting coach will take place in the media room, located just outside the gym area in the southeast corner of the gymnasium.

Prior to the end of the game, all media covering the game should make their requests for post-game player interviews with a member of the athletic media relations staff. Players will be brought to the media room following the interview session with the coaches.

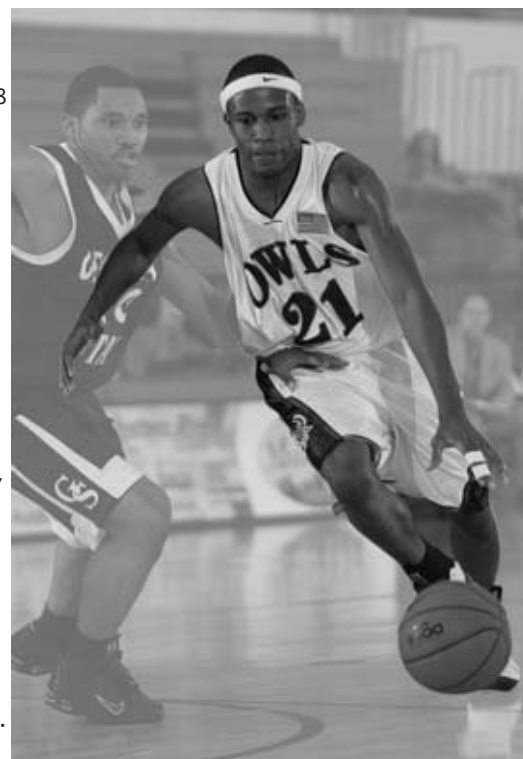

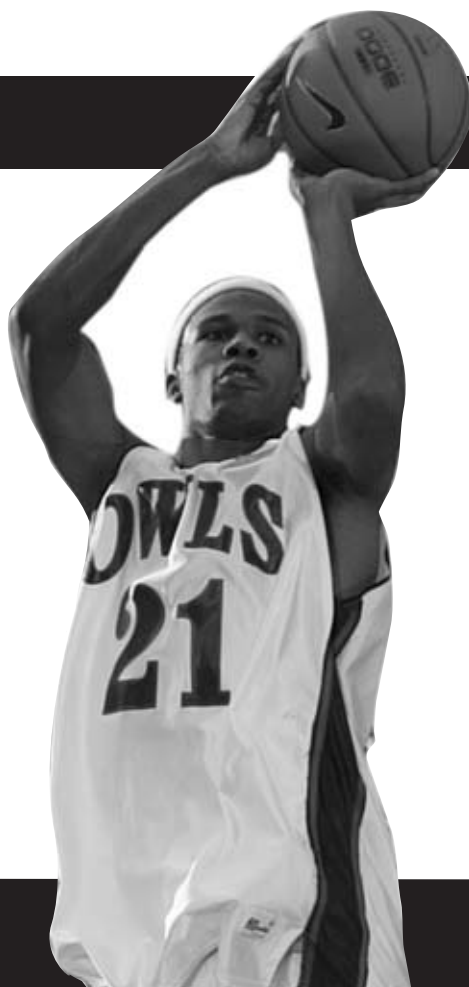

MATT DOHERTY

Head Coach

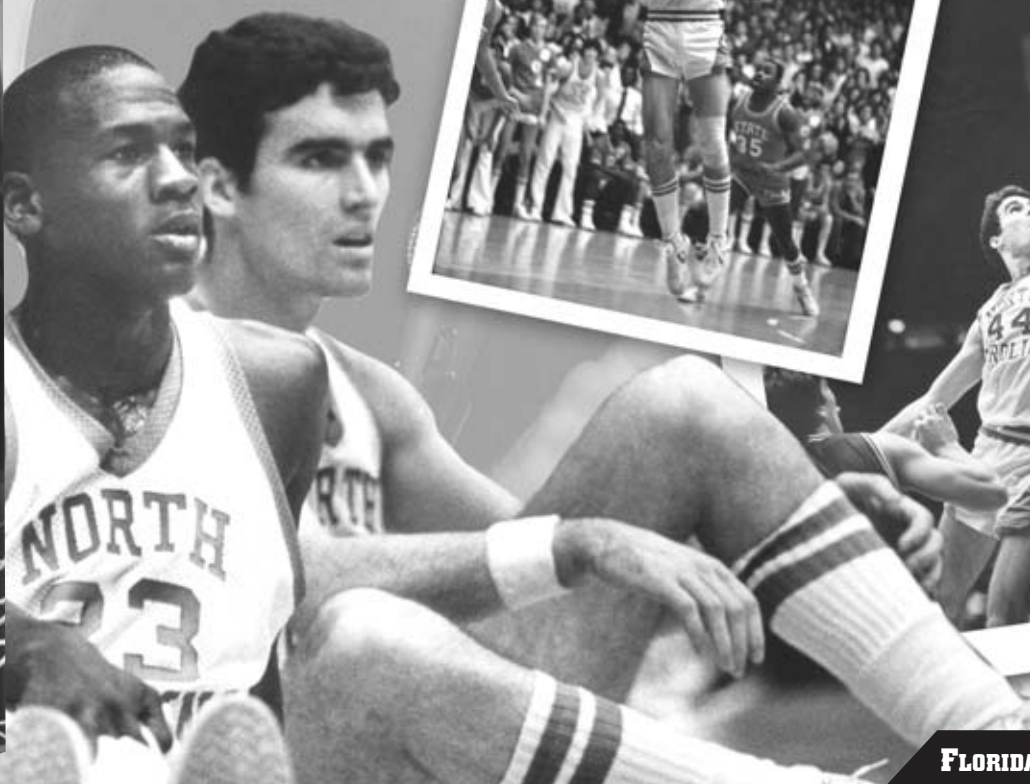
Matt Doherty was named Florida Atlantic University's head men's basketball coach on April 18, 2005. He became the fifth head coach in FAU basketball history. He brings one of the most dynamic basketball backgrounds in the nation that includes coaching at the highest levels as well as associations with some of the best teams, coaches, and players in the game's history.

Doherty first made a name for himself when he played in 129 games during a stellar four-year career at North Carolina from 1980-84 under the legendary Dean Smith. He helped lead the Tarheels to the 1982 national championship while playing alongside players such as Michael Jordan and James Worthy.


He began his coaching career at Davidson College in 1989 as an assistant before moving on to Kansas three years later to begin a seven-year stint with Roy Williams and one of the nation's top programs during that time period.

During Doherty's time at Kansas his duties included organizing the school's national and international recruiting efforts. The results of that were staggering.

The Jayhawks went 202-42 (.828) with an average of 29 wins per season. Doherty recruited eight McDonald's All-Americans, coached five All-Americans and eight future NBA players. Some of those recruits included Jacque Vaughn, Raef LaFrentz, Paul Pierce, Eric Chenowith, Jeff Boschee, and Nick Collison. Kansas would win six conference championships and play in the NCAA Tournament in each of Doherty's seasons, including the 1993 Final Four. In 1999, he was named head coach of Notre Dame, guiding the Fighting Irish to their best season in a decade.

Doherty served as head coach at Notre Dame for the 1999-00 season. He immediately turned around a team that was without a 20-win season since 1988-89. By the time the season had ended, the Fighting Irish had finished with a 22-15 record, defeated five ranked opponents, and had played in the championship game of the NIT. That season, Doherty led Notre Dame to a pair of victories over defending national champion Connecticut. He also coached future NBA players Troy Murphy, Ryan Humphrey, and Matt Carroll.

In 2000, Doherty took over at his alma mater. In his first season at UNC, Doherty led the Tarheels to a 26-7 record and was named the Associated Press National Coach-of-the-Year. The team was the Atlantic Coast Conference regular season co-champion and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Along the way, North

Carolina was ranked no. 1 in February. He coached All-Americans and first-round NBA draft choices Brendan Haywood and Joe Forte. During that season, Doherty also put together one of the top-five recruiting classes in the nation.

Doherty's history of being one of the nation's top recruiters continued in his second season at North Carolina, when he signed Raymond Felton, Sean May, and Rashad McCants, players who would play instrumental roles on North Carolina's 2005 national championship team. In his final year at North Carolina, Doherty's team won the Preseason National Invitation Tournament, was ranked as high as no. 12 and advanced to the NIT following the season.

As a player, Doherty was a starter as a sophomore on North Carolina's national championship team that went 32-2. In all, North Carolina won at least 28 games in each of the four seasons Doherty starred as a small forward while garnering three ACC regular season and two ACC Tournament titles as well as four NCAA Tournament appearances. Doherty became only the second player in ACC history to post 1,000 points, 400 rebounds, and 400 assists in a career. In his four years, North Carolina went 117-21 (.848).

As a senior, Doherty received the Jim Tatum Award, which is given to the UNC student-athlete with the most outstanding achievements in his or her sport and constructive participation in the community. He graduated in four years and received a bachelor's of science degree in business administration.

His basketball success made him a natural as an analyst, a role he has served for ESPN, CSTV, and C-SET (Carolinas Sports Entertainment Television) in various capacities since 2003. Doherty has also been a scout for the NBA's New York Knicks and has organized and coached at various basketball camps, including the Matt Doherty Basketball Academy in Mooresville, NC.

Doherty is married to the former Kelly Propst of Concord, NC. They have a son, Tucker (8), and a daughter, Hattie (6).

Rex Walters was an immediate addition to Matt Doherty's staff at Florida Atlantic when Doherty took over the head coaching post in April 2005. Walters brings a wealth of experience to the Owls, including a standout collegiate and professional playing career.

Walters most recently spent the past two seasons as an assistant coach at Valparaiso University under Homer Drew. Prior to that, he served as a volunteer assistant coach at Blue Valley Northwest High School in Overland Park, KS, helping to lead the Huskies to the 2003 Kansas Sub State Championship.

As a player, Walters starred at both Northwestern and Kansas. As a freshman and sophomore at Northwestern, he was named honorable mention All-Big Ten. After transferring to Kansas, he led the Jayhawks to a two-year mark of 56-12 and a pair of Big Eight championships.

Walters, a guard, was an All-Big Eight selection both years with the Jayhawks, playing for Roy Williams. His senior season in 1992-93 coincided with Doherty's first on Williams' staff as an assistant. That was the year Walters helped lead the team to the Final Four and was named Big Eight Athlete-of-the-Year.



Following his collegiate career, Walters was selected no. 16 overall in the 1993 NBA Draft by the New Jersey Nets. He played his first two seasons with the Nets before playing two more with the Philadelphia 76ers under Larry Brown. He concluded his NBA career playing three seasons with the Miami Heat under Pat Riley.

After seven years in the NBA, Walters played professionally for two seasons in Spain, including stints with Leon and the Canary Islands. During that time, he also played for the Kansas City Knights of the American Basketball Association, helping the team to the ABA title in 2002.

Walters is a 1993 graduate of Kansas, earning a B.S. in education. He and his wife, Deanna, have four children, Addison (9), Drew (7), Riley (4) and Gunner (2).





JAMES STAFFORD

Assistant Coach

The 2003-04 squad posted a 20-11 record, advanced to the MAC Tournament championship game, and received a bid to the NIT. Stafford has also been an assistant at Duquesne, Wisconsin and Siena Heights University in Adrian, MI.

In addition to his collegiate experience, Stafford brings to the Owls an extensive and highly successful AAU coaching background. From 1996 to 2000, he was the head coach for Team Wisconsin and guided the team to a 124-25 record. He also led Team Detroit to the 1993-94 state title.

A native of Detroit, MI, Stafford has coached several players who have gone on to play in the NBA. Some

of those include Michael Finley, Reece Gaines, Jermaine Jackson, Maurice Taylor, Mike Dunleavy and Mike Wilkes.

Stafford began his coaching career as an assistant at Siena Heights for the 1990-91 season. He then took the head coaching position at St. Mary's of Redford High School in Detroit from 1991-93.

Stafford played four years at Siena Heights where he earned a bachelors degree in criminal justice in 1991. He and his wife, Tracy, have three sons; Jalen (9), Darius (6) and Joshua (4).

James Stafford begins his first season on Matt Doherty's staff at Florida Atlantic. He brings several years of collegiate and high school coaching experience to FAU. Most recently, he served in the same role with the University of Toledo.

At Toledo, Stafford helped guide the Rockets to back-to-back winning seasons and trips to the Mid-American Conference Tournament.

In 2003-04, MDC posted a 17-13 record before going 27-5 last season on its way to winning the Southern Conference Championship. MDC was ranked among the top-three in the state during the 2004-05 campaign. The 27-5 mark was the best in school history. Balado recruited four of MDC's all-conference selections a year ago, including the player-of-the-year.

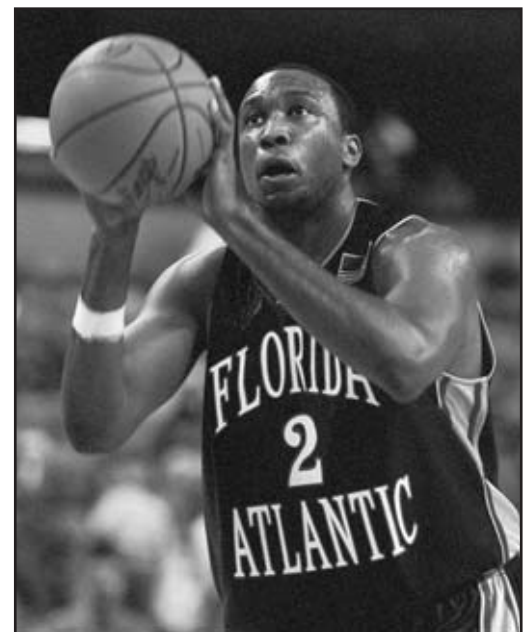

Atlantic Sun Conference

HISTORY

Founded September 19, 1978, the Atlantic Sun Conference has operated over a quarter century in the ever-changing landscape of intercollegiate athletics with a consistent commitment to its Constitutional Mission to "assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports." Formerly known as the Trans America Athletic Conference, the A-Sun changed its name in June of 2001 and introduced a new visual identity that distinguishes the league.

Bill Bibb became the A-Sun's third full-time commissioner when he took the reigns in October of 1991. Bibb followed Lou McCullough (1983-91) and Bob Vanatta (1979-83). The A-Sun office has been in Macon, Georgia, since April, 1992, after relocating from Athens, Georgia (1983-1992). The first office was located in Shreveport, Louisiana (1979-1983).

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Atlantic Sun Conference continues to prove that it excels both athletically and academically. In 2004-05, more than 50 percent of the conference's student-athletes who participated during the season earned all-academic honors. For the spring season alone, 51.1 percent of student-athletes in the A-Sun were honored, as compared to 50.0 percent during the fall, giving the conference a 50.6 percent total.

This marks the second consecutive year that the A-Sun has surpassed the 50 percent total. Belmont University won the A-Sun All-Academic Trophy for the fourth consecutive year. The award is given annually to the conference school with the greatest percentage of student-athletes receiving all academic honors. The Nashville school finished with a remarkable 68.8 percent of all student-athletes earning the honor. Belmont has won the award each of the four years that it has been a member of the league. For the third consecutive year, women's cross country had the highest rate of student-athletes earn all-academic, as 71.3 percent (92 of 129) were honored, with women's tennis placing second at 68.9 percent.

Three student-athletes earned Academic All-American honors, highlighted A-Sun Student-Athlete of the Year Will Emerson's appearance on the men's basketball first team.

The bar for academic excellence in the league was set in 2003-04 as Belmont broke its own single-season conference mark with 71.4% of its athletes earning All-Academic honors (152 of 213). A record 52.8 percent of all A-Sun athletes earned all-academic honors that year.

ATHLETIC EXCELLENCE

The A-Sun has continually matched its classroom achievement with success on the playing fields. Over the past eight years, the A-Sun has posted NCAA wins in each of the team sports that it sponsors. For the seventh straight season the A-Sun advanced multiple teams to the NCAA Baseball Championship, with tournament champion Stetson and Florida Atlantic receiving bids. A total of 17 A-Sun baseball student-athletes were selected in the 2005 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft including seven in the top-10 rounds. The A Sun also sent multiple teams to the NCAA men's golf championship for the third straight season. The men's basketball title chase was the tightest in the NCAA with seven teams finishing within two games of regular season co-champs Gardner-Webb and UCF. The A-Sun also featured NCAA Championship victories in both men's and women's soccer. Even the league's newcomers made waves in the postseason last year as North Florida reached the championship game at the Division II College World Series while Kennesaw State's softball team made a run to the D-II title game as well. East Tennessee State captured conference titles and NCAA berths in both men's golf and men's tennis.

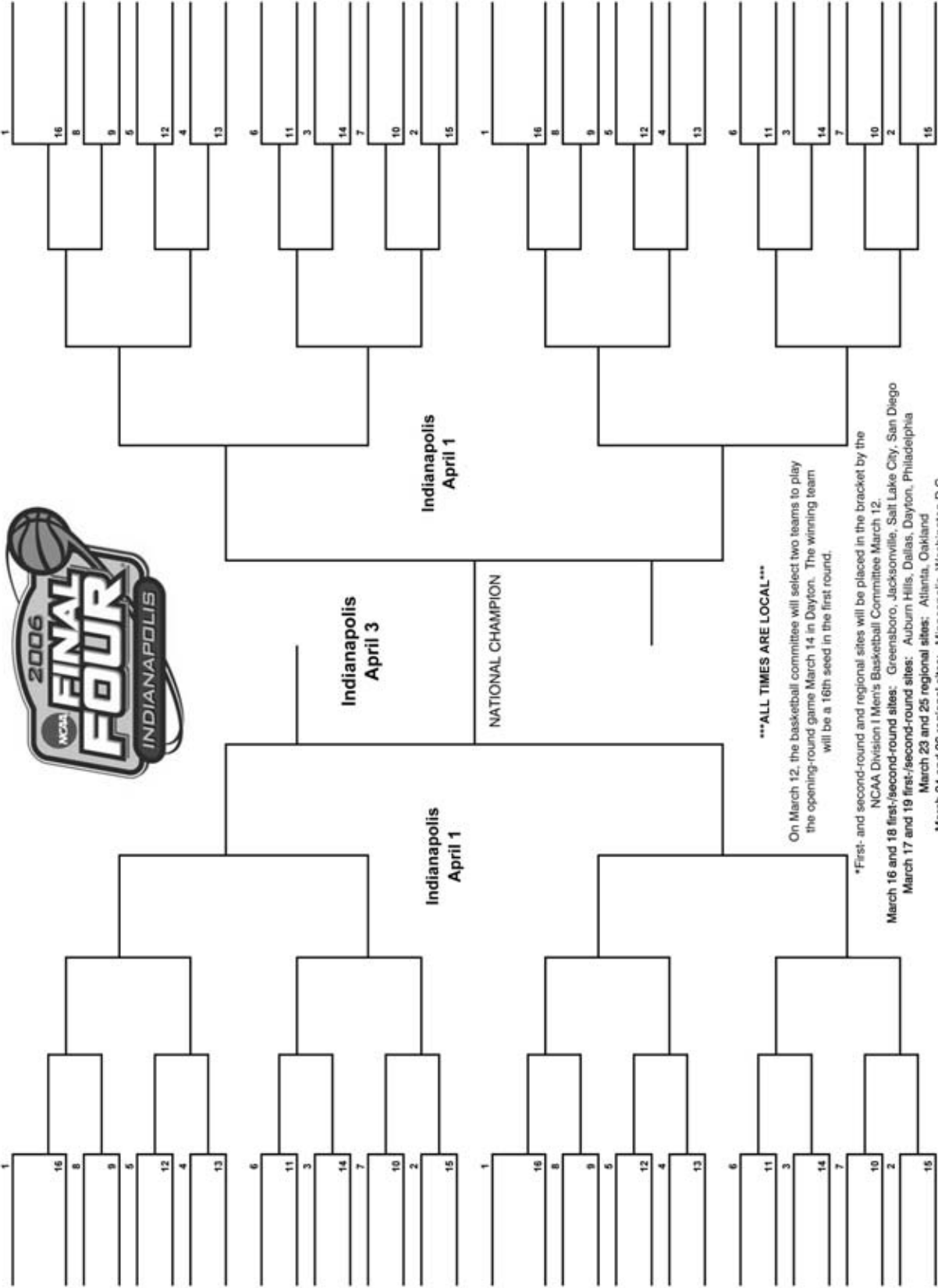

Frank T. Brogan '81

PRESIDENT — FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY



FRANK T. BROGAN became the fifth president of Florida Atlantic University in March 2003. Previously, he was lieutenant governor of Florida, the state's commissioner of education, superintendent of schools in Martin County, Florida, and a principal, assistant principal, dean and fifth-grade teacher in Martin County public schools.

President Brogan and his twin brother, John, were born in Cincinnati, Ohio, the youngest of six children. The first member of his family to graduate from college, President Brogan received a bachelor's degree in education *magna cum laude* from the University of Cincinnati in 1976. Two years later, he moved to Florida to teach at Port Salerno Elementary School on the Treasure Coast. He continued

his education at FAU earning a master's degree in education in 1981. In rapid succession, he became dean of students at Indiantown Middle School, assistant principal and then principal at Murray Middle School, Martin County's elected superintendent of schools, Florida's commissioner of education (the youngest person ever to hold that office), and, in 1999, lieutenant governor on the Bush-Brogan ticket. He had just been elected to a second term as lieutenant governor when he decided to seek the presidency of his alma mater, FAU.



President Brogan has been a champion of public education all his life. He considers his most important achievement as commissioner of education to have been building greater accountability into Florida's public school system, and he is a strong advocate of accountability in higher education as well. His goals for FAU include supporting its continued growth as an important center of teaching, research and public service activities; increasing access to higher education across

the University's seven-county service region; encouraging diversity in FAU's student body, faculty and staff; supporting world-class research initiatives; fostering close, mutually supportive relationships with the communities the University serves; and making FAU an ever-stronger engine of economic development for South Florida.

In addition to championing education, President Brogan has served as a leader for other important causes. Craig Angelos

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

CRAIG ANGELOS was named Director of Athletics at Florida Atlantic University in July 2003, assuming oversight responsibility for the institution's 17-team intercollegiate athletic programs.

When Angelos first arrived, he enthusiastically embraced his multi-faceted role. He has since moved at a rapid pace to take the program to the next level, by working with President Brogan, FAU students and staff. His efforts and the Athletic Department's growth is built on four fundamental principles; institutional control, academic excellence, fiscal integrity, and winning championships.

Since his arrival, he has been instrumental in Florida Atlantic's Division I-A ascension and Sun Belt Conference affiliation by conducting a feasibility study, compiling a market assessment as well as a strategic plan for the University's move. He initiated and chaired the University's brand identity campaign and saw it come to a conclusion with new marks in the spring of 2005. Along the way, a television contract was secured in 2004 that saw ESPN and Fox Sports produce five of the six football road games that aired. The department also became the fourth university within the state of Florida to have an all-sports apparel deal with

Nike, Inc., joining Florida State, Florida and Miami.

In his first two years at FAU, five conference titles have been captured and the Owls have represented the university in post-season competition seven times. Two individuals earned All-America status while two earned Academic All-America honors. The department's commitment to a holistic approach to student athlete excellence culminated in 2005 with 40% of the student-athletes maintaining a 3.0 G.P.A. and with the National Consortium for Academics and Sports honoring FAU as an Academics and Sports Outreach and Community Service Program Honor Roll member. This was made possible in part due to the recent creation of a Champs/Lifeskills program that assists the student-athletes development in the areas of academic and athletic excellence, personal and career development and community service.

Perhaps, most significantly, under his leadership this past year the department has been able to develop a three year balanced budget plan that will assure the long-term stability of the athletic programs.

Angelos' efforts to market the teams, build a fan base and showcase the University on national television has greatly enhanced the overall image of the athletics program. In 2004, football ticket sales rose 30%, attendance was improved by 130% and student attendance rose 906% despite not playing a home game until six games into the schedule. His search for a new basketball coach came to a conclusion in early April with the hiring of Matt Doherty, who earned the Associate



Press 2001 national coach of the year award and put FAU on the map as one of only two universities in the country that has a football and men's basketball coach who has earned Division I-A national coach-of-the-year honors.

Almost immediately after his arrival at FAU, Angelos initiated a master plan and review of all athletic facilities, including the feasibility of building an on-campus football and basketball venue that would solidify the athletic department's position among top-tier institutions. That project has also moved forward at a rapid pace. His plan not only includes the "Carrier Dome Like" facility but, every team will be touched by facility improvements upon its completion.

Prior to coming to FAU, he was the Deputy Director of Athletics and Chief Operating Officer at Indiana University since January 2002. While there, he supervised many aspects of the athletic department including the football program and was instrumental in negotiating a Nike contract for 23 of its 24 sports. Previously, he was at the University of Miami (FL) for eight years, serving in a variety of

positions but mostly in the number two-spot under athletics director Paul Dee. Prior to arriving on campus, he spent three years at the NCAA as a legislative assistant interpreting rules and regulations of the association. He is now entering his 15th year as an administrator in intercollegiate athletics.

A graduate of the Creighton University School of Law in Omaha, NE, Angelos worked for a short time in a mid-size litigation firm in Los Angeles, CA. However, he ultimately decided to combine his legal background and his love for athletics and gravitated towards a career in intercollegiate athletics. During his undergraduate years at Brigham Young University in Provo, UT, Angelos was the starting first baseman on the varsity squad. He later played for one year in the Italian professional baseball league in Udine, Italy.

The 43-year old Angelos and his wife, Kristin, have been married for 20 years and keep busy with their six children, Alayna (16), Alexis (13), Abigail (10), Austin (8), Aaron (5), and Alivia (2).

Athletic Review

MEN'S BASKETBALL...

The 2004-05 season marked the end of one of the most productive careers in FAU history. Mike Bell ended his two-year stint with the Owls as the school's first A-Sun Player-of-the-Year. He also received Associated Press All-America Honorable Mention. In April, former Notre Dame and North Carolina head coach Matt Doherty was named as the Owls new coach.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL...

The Lady Owls advanced to the A-Sun Tournament for the sixth straight year under head coach Chancellor Dugan. FAU has won at least 10 A-Sun games for four consecutive seasons. The Owls finished second in the A-Sun in points per game.



BASEBALL... FAU continues to be one of the top collegiate programs in the Southeast as the team posted its seventh consecutive winning season in 2005. The Owls entered the season as the reigning A-Sun champions while three former players played in the Major Leagues in 2005. For the sixth time in seven years, the Owls appeared in the NCAA Tournament.

CROSS COUNTRY...The women's cross country team produced the best year in program history as the Owls finished second at the A-Sun Championship and 14th at the NCAA South Regional. Senior Raynell Hagberg was named All-Conference after her ninth-place finish at the A-Sun meet while Trisha Doyle was named to the All-Freshmen team. The men's team, with four freshman runners, placed eighth at the A-Sun Championship.

FOOTBALL...FAU completed yet another exceptional season under head coach Howard Schnellenberger. Over two dozen seniors signified the end of the program's inaugural recruiting class. The Owls' success, in their fourth year as a program, included a road upset of Hawaii to start the season. The team's 20 combined wins in 2003 and 2004 tied Miami (FL) for tops in Florida.

MEN'S SOCCER...The Owls had their best season ever, sharing their first regular season A-Sun Championship. FAU led the nation in goals per game. Bjorn Totland was named A-Sun Player-of-the-Year, the second consecutive season the honor went to an Owl. Five others received All-Conference honors.

MEN'S GOLF...The men's golf made strides in head coach Johnny Orsino's first season at the helm. The Owls won their fifth tournament championship at the Golf Daytona Beach Invitational and secured top five finishes at four separate tournaments, finishing the year eighth at the A-Sun Championship.



MEN'S TENNIS...FAU continues to be one of the top programs in the A-Sun. The team has posted winning seasons in seven of the last nine campaigns. Two Owls received Second-Team All-Conference honors in 2005.

WOMEN'S SOCCER ...The 2004 version of the women's soccer team was one of the best yet for head coach Brian Dooley, who completed his fifth straight winning season. The Owls have averaged nearly 14 wins per season during the stretch and have won A-Sun Regular Season titles in two of the past three years. Several individual records were broken in 2004 while just four seniors departed from the second-highest scoring squad in team history. All three of FAU's First-Team All-Conference selections return in 2005.

WOMEN'S GOLF...Individual performances stood out for the women's golf team in 2004-05. Freshman June Bolme was named A-Sun All-Conference and A-Sun All-Freshman after notching three top-ten finishes and a 78.28 scoring average to lead the team. As a team, the Owls placed fifth at the A-Sun Championship.

SOFTBALL...The Owls are the A-Sun's most successful program ever. Since its inaugural season of 1995, FAU has won a record eight conference championships. FAU has also appeared in six NCAA Tournaments, also an A-Sun record. Head coach Joan Joyce has won 510 games as FAU's only head coach.

MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SWIMMING...In their first season as members of the Sun Belt Conference, both the men's and women's swimming and diving teams made immediate statements as both finished third at the Sun Belt Championship. The men's 200 medley relay broke the school record at the championship, and the teams picked up five first-place finishes.

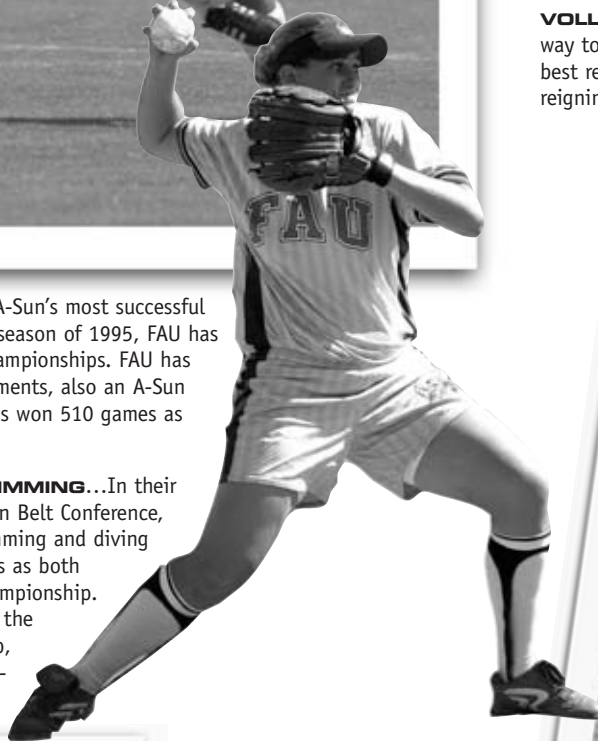
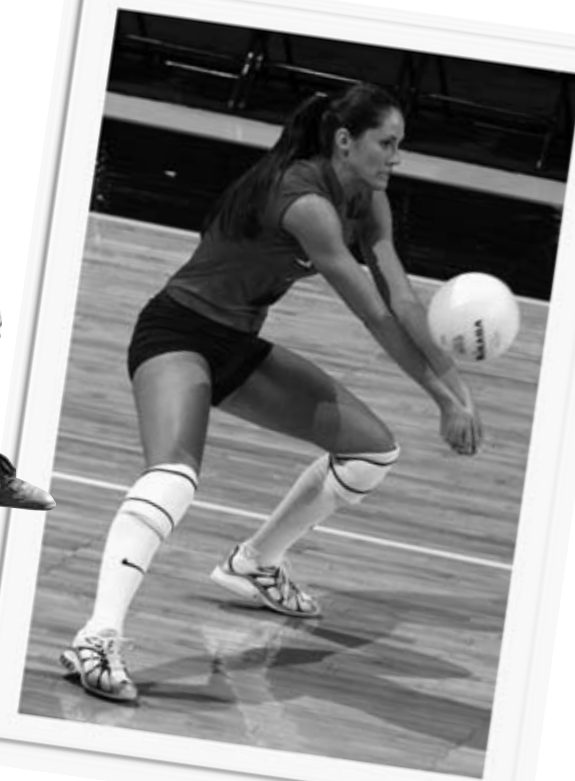


WOMEN'S TENNIS ... For the second time in three years, FAU captured the A-Sun Championship in 2005. Alena Dvorakova ended her four-year career as the A-Sun Player-of-the-Year and the all-time winningest singles and doubles player in FAU history.

WOMEN'S TRACK AND FIELD... FAU continued its success of recent years in 2005 by finishing third at the A-Sun Championship, the third consecutive time the Owls have claimed a top-three finish.

Sophomore Yanique Booth (100m hurdles), junior Marilyn Stephens (400m) and both the 4x100m and 4x400m relay teams qualified for the NCAA East Regional, a program high, while seven Owls received All-Conference honors.

VOLLEYBALL...The Owls raced through the A-Sun on their way to the regular season championship. The team posted its best record in its 12 seasons in Division I and will return the reigning A-Sun Player-of-the-Year in 2005.

ASSOCIATE AD - SENIOR WOMAN ADMINISTRATOR

MELISSA DAWSON became Florida Atlantic Associate Athletic Director and Senior Woman Administrator June 1, 2001. She is the University's first person to hold the SWA position, in a full-time capacity, demonstrating the University's commitment to the growth and development of women's sports.

Since coming to Florida Atlantic, Dawson placed her finger prints on the quality of game operations, worked to improve facilities and consolidated

both the training rooms and the equipment room to encompass the needs of the entire athletic department. She supervises several teams, and monitors student-athlete welfare for the entire department.

Dawson came to FAU from Florida State University. While the title of SWA is new for her, the inner workings of college athletics is not. The Inverness, FL native held various positions at FSU during her 12-year tenure, all of which are an asset as FAU continues to strive towards success.

She was hired in 1990 as an equipment manager for the Seminoles and was promoted in 1991 to an Administrative Assistant position. In that role,

Dawson worked directly with women's volleyball, basketball and softball. She graduated in April of 1992, from Florida State, with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education.

The following Fall, Dawson's title, but not home, changed once again to Assistant Home Event Manager, a position which provided her the opportunity to coordinate all invitationals, conference championship and NCAA tournaments hosted by FSU.

She was again promoted in August of 1993 to Assistant Director of Athletic Facilities and Operations, a position she held until her departure from FSU for FAU. As Assistant Director of Facilities, Dawson directly

supervised the daily operations of volleyball, soccer and softball and assisted in the daily game operations for tennis and swimming. She also served as the manager of eight athletic facilities, the liaison between FSU and Nike and supervised an equipment staff of five, all while earning a Master of Science in Athletic Administration in April of 1996. She has served as the tournament director or assistant tournament director for ACC Championships, NCAA Regional Championships and the 1996 NCAA Division I Women's Tennis Championship.



Ed Hayward

ASSOCIATE AD - COMPLIANCE

ED HAYWARD came to FAU in March of 1996 with the daunting task of establishing a strong compliance office while preparing and guiding the University through the NCAA Self Study.

Hayward was rewarded in the winter of 1999 with a promotion to Associate AD at which time he assumed the

responsibility of overseeing several sports. Hayward came to FAU after serving as Florida International University's Compliance Retention and Academic Support Athletic Coordinator from January 1992 to February 1996.

Hayward, who received his masters of science in sports administration in December of 1991 from St. Thomas University, came to Florida from Tennessee Technological University where he served as Admissions Counselor from the University's Office of Admissions from 1988 to 1990.

Hayward, who received his B.A. with an emphasis in journalism in 1988 from Tennessee Technological University, became involved with the support and advisement of Foot Fraternity Inc (football) while working at Tech and continued his community support upon becoming a resident of Miami. He was a four-year letterman for the Golden Eagles ('83-'85, '87) and in the program's extended history Hayward is one of seven to rush for 1,000 yards (1,021 '85).

He has been a road race coordinator for the Miami

Runners Club and has served on the board of directors. Hayward also volunteers for Boys Town of Florida, Miami division, and was a football coach for the North Miami Parks' Recreation Department.

Hayward resides in Miami with his wife, Lisa, and three children Christian (10) and Myles (7) and daughter Virginia Brya (3).

RANDY LANGEJANS joined the Florida Atlantic staff in June of 2004 with the goal and mission of working one-on-one with the staff to grow and manage a competitive budget. Langejans came to Florida Atlantic from Northern Arizona

University where he has served for more than two decades. The last two years he has served as the associate athletic director for operations, which included the managerial aspects of a 5.5 million dollar 15-team budget, following a 12-year stint as an assistant athletics director for business. In that capacity, the Northern Arizona graduate oversaw the day-to-day operations of the football, men's basketball and the cross country and track and field programs. And, he currently serves as a

member of the NCAA Division I men's tennis national committee. His position at NAU also provided opportunities to serve as tournament manager for several Big Sky indoor and outdoor track and field championship meets, two league men's basketball tournaments, two of the last three Big Sky men's and women's tennis tournaments in the Valley and two NCAA I-AA football playoff games. He also coordinated financial matters for the various sports camps on campus.

Langejans first joined the Northern Arizona staff as a graduate assistant and volunteer football coach, a position he held for three years. He also served as an athletics ticket coordinator for two years before assuming the assistant athletics director post in 1990. A former 20-year high school official, he earned his degree in recreation leadership with emphasis in business administration in 1984.

TERRY MOHAJIR Terry Mohajir was named Florida Atlantic University's Associate Athletics Director for Development in December 2004. Since that time he has overseen all development operations for the department. In addition, he has become immersed in

developing a scholarship program called the Champions Club at FAU. Mohajir served in a similar role at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. His last appointment at UMKC saw him serve as the assistant athletics director for external relations, a position he held from 1999 to 2004. efforts for a new training room and strength and conditioning center. Mohajir organized the bid and successfully pitched to the conference presidents to host the Mid-Continent Conference men's and women's basketball tournaments in 2003 and 2004. He also organized UMKC's effort to land the 2005 NCAA Women's Basketball Midwest Regional. He and his wife Julie have two daughters Maria and Molly.

CHAMPS/Life Skills Program



PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Student-Athlete Center for Academic Excellence offers a variety of personal development programming for student-athletes. In recent years, FAU's personal development

programming has been conducted through a series of workshops designed to help students not only make a successful transition to college life, but also to prepare them for success beyond FAU once they graduate. Recent workshops have focused on time management, study skills, drug and alcohol awareness, gambling, financial planning, sport psychology, and health and wellness topics.

FAU's Life Skills program also includes sections of the First Year Experience course (SLS 1501) that are specifically designed for freshmen student-athletes. These classes are required for all freshmen student-athletes. While the curriculum for these classes



will follow the traditional SLS model that is currently in place at FAU, certain topics (e.g., time management, freshmen transitional issues, drug and alcohol education, communicating with the media, etc.) are taught in a manner that will help meet the unique

needs of the student-athlete population. Students' involvement with this class has had a positive impact on their academic performance and helps them build a strong connection to the FAU community.

STUDENT-ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL (SAAC)

Each athletic team at FAU has at least two representatives on the Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC), a leadership and service organization that exists for the betterment of the student-athlete experience. SAAC meetings provide students with a vehicle to express any concerns that they may have with existing practices and to offer suggestions for improvements in the future. The SAAC also organizes a wide variety of community outreach activities each semester. This past year was particularly productive for the SAAC as they organized a holiday party for and donated gifts to a community of underprivileged youth and held a National Student-Athlete Day event that exposed a group of children to the life of a college student-athlete.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT

The Student-Athlete Center for Academic Excellence strives to provide its student-athletes with opportunities for career exploration, development, and job placement. The center achieves these goals by offering the student-athletes a variety of programs to prepare them for their future careers. These programs include mock interview days, workshops on interviewing skills, networking, and dressing for success, and resume and cover letter information sessions

This past year, the SACAE also developed several programs to help with job placement. The center

developed a Job Bank to assist students with finding summer jobs and internships. The SACAE also initiated a Student-Athlete Mentor Program. This program is designed to match FAU student-athletes with business people in the greater South Florida community with similar fields of interest. Mentors become off-campus advisors to students, able to introduce students who are well schooled in theory to the real and practical world of business. The program is also a fine opportunity for students to make friends in the business community and receive advice and help from very successful people.

NCAA Compliance

Florida Atlantic University's Athletic Compliance Office functions within the realm of the University's compliance structure, coordinating, monitoring and verifying compliance and meeting all NCAA requirements. FAU is committed and compelled to the principle of institutional control in the operation of its athletics department in a way that is constant within the rules and regulations of the NCAA and the University.

The Athletics Compliance Office commitment is to maintain control of its athletics program through responsible administrators, faculty and institutional bodies; to educate coaches, staff, student-athletes and other individuals involved with the athletics program of their institutional responsibilities under the rules; to develop operating systems within the athletics department and the University that provide guidance in how to work within the rules; and to discover and report any violations of the rules that occur. Each individual involved in intercollegiate athletics is obligated to maintain competency in knowledge of the rules; to act within his or her realm of responsibility in full compliance with the governing legislation; and to report any violation of NCAA, conference and/or institutional rules of which he or she is aware.

As the University strives for excellence on and off the field of competition, the highest regard for ethical conduct must also be sought. In order for the athletic department to exist, outside participation is required and must be emphasized. However, any inappropriate activity outside the rules and regulations of the NCAA could jeopardize the student-athlete's eligibility to compete athletically. Everyone involved inside or outside the University must do his or her part in order to foster an environment that is supportive of the NCAA operating principle of competitive equity. Each person has a role and responsibility and has accountability when it comes to compliance of NCAA rules and regulations.

FIVE RULES OF ATHLETIC COMPLIANCE

- 1 Only coaches and athletic department staff members are permitted to be involved in the recruiting process. Alumni, friends and "other representatives of athletic interest" who are not employed by the University are not permitted to contact a prospect (or members of the prospect's family) by letter, telephone or in-person (on or off campus) for the purpose of soliciting their participation in the athletic program. FAU faculty members are permitted to have contact with the prospects, but only while on the campus.
- 2 A prospect remains a prospect even after he or she signs a Letter of Intent or financial aid agreement to attend the University. The prospect does not lose his/her prospect status until the start of classes at FAU or the beginning of official team practice prior to the start of classes.
- 3 The prohibition of contact with a prospect is intended to relate to unavoidable incidental contacts with a prospect by representatives of a member institution's athletics interest. It is understood that such a contact is not prearranged by the athletics representative or an athletic department staff member; is not made for the purpose of recruitment of the prospect; and involves only normal civility. For example, if you meet a high school student or junior college student-athlete, you can talk with them about anything except FAU athletics. If you are attending a public function and find yourself talking to the parents of a prospect, you can talk about anything that doesn't relate to the athletic department.
- 4 If a student-athlete accepts any benefits or special consideration based on his or her status as an athlete or because of athletic skill, the student-athlete will lose all eligibility for intercollegiate athletic participation. Do not do anything for prospective or enrolled student-athletes without specific authorization from the FAU Athletic Compliance Office.
- 5 Representatives of athletic interest are reminded that NCAA rules regarding enrolled student-athletes remain in effect throughout the entire year, including summer breaks. When student-athletes complete their final season of eligibility, they must abide by NCAA rules until the end of that academic year and/or until they are no longer receiving athletically related financial aid.

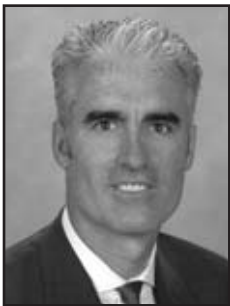

Florida Atlantic University unveiled its new University mark, athletic logo and academic seal—collectively known as the University marks—in February 2005.

The marks were developed through an 18-month process that included distilling more than 4,000 comments from students, faculty, staff, alumni and community members through e-mails, focus groups and surveys.

The University now has its first true logo, a unified athletics logo and a refined official seal—a critical step in strengthening FAU's brand identity.

According to FAU President Frank T. Brogan, "We created a distinctive new look for the face that

the University turns toward the public, a look that accurately reflects the pride FAU takes in being a center of outstanding scholarship, 21st century research and dedicated community service and a place where students make

memories that last a lifetime. It is about keeping the best of tradition while embracing the future of FAU."

THE TOM OXLEY ATHLETIC CENTER

Tom Oxley, a local businessman, an FAU alum, and an avid polo enthusiast, stepped forward with a donation that allowed the athletic center to become a reality. The 54,000-square-foot, state-of-art facility houses the football locker room, training room, weight room, meeting rooms and coaches' offices. But, it doesn't stop there. The Oxley Center also opens its doors to individual locker rooms for women's track, soccer, softball and volleyball, as well as the respective coaches' offices. The Athletics Director, and administrative staff also call the Oxley Center home. All FAU students are privileged to use the computer study lab and classrooms. The facility overlooks the baseball "B" field, the soccer game field, the softball stadium, the Boca Raton airport, and two football practice fields.

TENNIS COURTS

The men's tennis team, which ended the 2001 regular season with a No. 50 national ranking, an Atlantic Sun Championship, the first in a FAU men's sport, and its second-consecutive trip to the NCAA tournament, makes use of two tennis facilities. The newly renovated FAU courts complete the athletic complex, with six lighted courts nestled between the baseball stadium, behind the aquatics area and next to the soccer game field. The men's and tennis teams call Patch Reef Park home, a facility that houses 17 lighted tennis courts and locker rooms for both teams. It is also a practice or tune-up facility for professional tennis players training for one of the many south Florida tour events.

AQUATIC CENTER

The swim team moved just yards away from its 25-yard pool to an Olympic-size meter pool. The meter pool has hosted the Independent Collegiate Conference Swim Meet and has served as the winter training facility for hundreds of collegiate swimmers, as well as the training site for FAU's men's and women's swim teams. The change to a meter pool was vital for the program to continue to attract Olympic swimmers to the teams. The pool also features a diving well for one and three meter events. The dive team also uses the Coral Springs Aquatic Center for platform practice and competition.



FAU ARENA

The FAU Arena opened its doors to women's basketball in 1984; men's basketball and women's volleyball were added in 1988. The facility seats 5,000 for games and houses locker rooms for two varsity teams.



SOCCER CHAMPIONSHIP PLAYING FIELD

The completion of what is now called the "Game Field" – better known to the women's soccer team as "Heaven" – concluded the 10-year development of five on-campus soccer fields, in conjunction with the Greater Boca Raton Beach Tax District. FAU hosted the Atlantic Sun Conference Women's Soccer Championship in 2000 and 2003. The University has also served as practice site for several international teams, Team USA and the women's soccer professional combines.

FOOTBALL PRACTICE FIELDS

Two full-sized practice fields are overlooked by the Tom Oxley Athletic Center, and are used 12 months of the year. Room is available to add a astro-play surface.



BASEBALL STADIUM

FAU's baseball team, ranked as high as no. 8 nationally in 1999, is afforded the opportunity to practice on two full-dimension fields. Field "B" was the original home field for baseball, but with growing fan support, a new field was constructed in 1991. Plans are being considered for a new stadium. The stadium field, which features AAA baseball lighting, is known as the best playing surface in South Florida and recently received an endorsement from Cal Ripken. FAU fans enjoy the beach/picnic atmosphere along both foul lines where beach chairs, coolers and grills are a staple.



SOFTBALL FIELD

Through the assistance of FAU football, Hooters, Inc. and the State of Florida Title IX fund, the Owls can continue their success in one of the best softball facilities in the country. FAU, which just captured its seventh-consecutive championship and its fifth-consecutive regional appearance, plays on a palm tree-lined field complete with stadium, concession, press box and covered batting cage.
