It took a block at the end of regulation, the biggest crowd of the season, and a couple of huge stops for the Florida Atlantic University men's basketball team to overcome Florida International, 91-88, in overtime in the first round of the Sun Belt Conference Tournament at FAU Arena on Wednesday.

"It wasn't the prettiest game, but our guys found a way," FAU Head Coach Rex Walters said. "This is what college basketball is all about."

Carlos Monroe led the Owls with 26 points and 15 rebounds for his 11th double-double of the season, tied for second-most in a single campaign in FAU history. DeAndre Rice scored 23 points, and Jeff Parmer added 18 points and eight boards. Paul Graham contributed 17 points, giving the Owls four players in double-figures. In unfamiliar territory, the Owls trailed at halftime, 36-34. It

was the first time FAU trailed at home after 20 minutes since January 26, 2006 vs. Lipscomb, a span of 16 games.

FAU hit 50.0 percent (15-for-30) of its field goal attempts, led by a 7-for-11 effort by Monroe, who finished the first half with 14 points and eight rebounds. Jeff Parmer (seven points) and Paul Graham (six points) each went 3-for-6 from the field in the opening stanza. Nikola Gacesa led the Golden Panthers with nine. FIU shot 48.4 percent (15-for-31) in the first frame. Neither team led by more than five points in the first half.

The Owls held a 24-12 paint-point edge through 20 minutes, but the Golden Panthers turned 13 FAU turnovers into 15 points.

Rice hit a layup with 11:30 remaining in the second half to tie the game at 54, but a foul and a technical foul were called on Derrick Simmons on the ensuing possession. FIU would make all four free throws, and a few minutes later back-to-back threes gave the Golden Panthers a 66-58 lead with just under nine minutes remaining.

Following an intentional foul and two Alex Galindo free throws, FIU had stretched its lead to nine, 70-61 with 7:20 remaining in regulation. Following a three-point play by Rice and a steal and slam by Graham, the Owls had cut the lead down to 70-68 with six minutes left.

With 5:15 remaining, Rice hit a

2006-07 FAU NEWS AND NOTES || fausports.com

Back-to-Back... The win over South Alabama guarantees FAU a winning regular season for the second-consecutive year. It's the first time since the program moved to D-I. FAU had three consecutive winning seasons from 1989-90 to 1991-92.

Outside Florida... FAU is 3-11 outside the Florida state line this season. FAU was 3-10 outside the state of Florida last season and 4-6 in 2004-05 (10-27 over the last three seasons). The Owls are 31-17 within state lines in those three seasons. FAU's wins outside Florida this season have come against New Orleans, Longwood and Western Kentucky.

Four-headed Monster... If Jeff Parmer finished with a 10.0+ scoring average (currently 10.2) he will give FAU four scorers that average 10+ points for the first time since at least 2001-02. FAU hasn't had three players average double-figures since 2001-02, when Raheim Brown (15.4), Jeff Cowans (11.5) and Earnest Crumbley (11.3) accomplished the feat.

South Siders... FAU is 4-1 against its half of the bracket. The Owls were 1-1 against their first opponent, WKU, 2-0 against New Orleans and 0-1 against Arkansas State. FAU is 2-4 against the top half of the bracket. The only teams FAU posted losing records against that currently remain are Middle Tennessee (0-2), North Texas (0-1) and ASU.

100/100... With four more assists, Paul Graham will have 100 assists on the season. Brent Crews already has surpassed the century mark. If Graham reaches 100 helpers, it will be the first time since 2001-02 that the Owls had two players post 100+ assists (120 - Earnest Crumbley, 105 - Anthony Slater).

Monroe and Rice Honored... Carlos Monroe and DeAndre Rice were named to the Second-Team All-Sun Belt. Monroe earns second-team honors despite being the only player in the top seven in scoring (3rd) and rebounding (2nd), and also leads the conference in field goal percentage (60.1). Rice is among the league's most lethal long-range snipers at 48.0 percent from deep and 50.0 percent from the field overall. He leads the Owls in scoring at 19.8.

20/20/20... The Owls had three players score 20+ points against New Orleans on Feb. 21. Carlos Monroe (30) and Paul Graham (22) set new career-highs and Jeff Parmer (21) tied his career-high.

It's the first time three players have scored 20+ points since December 4, 2005 when DeAndre Rice (29) Rodney Webb (25) and Paul Graham (20) hit the mark.

Efficient O... The Owls have hit at least 50 percent of their field goals in nine of their last 15 games. Twice in that stretch they hit 60+ percent. Entering this week, FAU was ranked no. 20 in the nation in field goal percentage at 48.6%. Carlos Monroe is 22nd among individuals at 60.1 percent. Monroe also entered the week 29th in rebounding at 9.2.

Bottom's up... The two teams receiving the fewest points in the Sun Belt Conference pre-season poll (Louisiana-Monroe and Florida Atlantic, 21 pts.) were the no. 4 and no. 6 seeds, respectively in the tournament.

Both teams are in their first year in the SBC. The Owls posted the third-most wins by a first year SBC team. The 10 victories are the second-most by a first-year team outside of the 1991-92 merger season with the American South Conference, when ULL won 12 games and Arkansas State won 11. ULM had 11 wins this year.

First Half Differences... FAU had led at the break in every home game this season until Wednesday's first-round meeting with FIU. Additionally, the Owls have led at the half in eight of their 17 road contests, going 4-4 in those eight games. The wins came at UNF (28-18 at the half), New Orleans (47-42), Longwood (43-31) and Western Kentucky (37-35). The losses came against Marist (35-34), North Texas (28-24), Arkansas State (36-32) and Troy (42-40). The Owls have failed to hold a halftime lead six times this season (twice at home, four times on the road) and have come back from a half-time deficit twice (trailing 34-33 at FIU, 36-34 vs. FIU - 1st Rd SBC Tourney)

Vs. Winners... FAU is 7-7 this season against teams with a .500 or better record at the time the two teams played. All the wins have come against conference opponents: Louisiana-Monroe, New Orleans (2x), Florida International, Troy, Western Kentucky and South Alabama.

Lucky No. 7... After falling in the season's first four games with eight players active, FAU picked up its first win of the 2006-07 season against North Florida on Nov. 22 with just seven players active. FAU did not have all five of its returners active in the same game until January 4 at New Orleans.

No Experience Necessary... Derrick Simmons is the only player on FAU's roster with more than one season of DI basketball experience. Entering the season, seven of FAU's 14 players had not played a Division I basketball game.

No Experience Necessary II... Entering the season FAU's roster had just 219 DI games played under its belt. 69 of those games belong to David Anderson, who is no longer with the team, and 21 games belong to Jeff Parmer who played at Providence his freshman year. If you take away Anderson's games played, 52 of which came at Gardner-Webb before transferring, FAU had just 150 games played, which would rank as the ninth-fewest in all of Division I basketball according to a study by the America East conference based on SID responses.

No Experience Necessary III... Even with Anderson, FAU had just 61 career DI starts under its belt entering 2006-07, the 11th fewest in DI basketball according to the same study.

Home is Where the Heart is... Sammy Hernandez, a 6-5 250-pound forward, has transferred from George Mason to Florida Atlantic. He was an important part of the GMU team that advanced to the Final Four in 2005-06. Hernandez won two high school championships while playing high school basketball in the state of Florida during his prep career.

First Time Winners... The only first-year Sun Belt teams to win the Sun Belt Conference Tournament are Virginia Commonwealth in 1980 and Louisiana-Lafayette in 1992.

Conference Tournament History... Five times the Owls made the Atlantic Sun Tournament. They were 5-4 all-time in tournament games, winning the tournament and automatic NCAA bid in 2001-02. They have not made it past the second round in any year other than 2001-02. A-Sun Tournament History

HEAD COACH REX WALTERS (16-14, 1st Year) || fausports.com

Rex Walters was named the sixth head men's basketball coach at Florida Atlantic University on April 28, 2006. The promotion from associate head coach came after one season of working side-by-side with Matt Doherty in laying a foundation for college basketball in Boca Raton.

Walters joined the FAU staff on April 20, 2005. One year and eight days later, he became a head coach for the first time in his coaching career.

He will lead an Owls' roster of 14 student-athletes—including 13 players recruited since his original hire date—into the program's first season in the Sun Belt Conference. He returns five regulars who averaged 4.3 points per game or more last season, including leading scorer DeAndre Rice (16.1 ppg) and A-Sun All-Freshmen honoree Carlos Monroe (11.0 ppg).

With Walters on the sidelines in 2005-06, Florida Atlantic closed its tenure in the Atlantic Sun Conference with a 15-13 record overall and the program's best conference record at 14-6. The 15 victories were a five-win improvement over 2004-05, when the Owls went 10-17 overall.

Prior to Florida Atlantic, Walters' first collegiate coaching job came at Valparaiso, a two-year stint as an assistant under Homer Drew. The 2003-04 Hornets were 18-13 overall and finished first in the Mid-Continent Conference with a record of 11-5.

The following season, Walters' second on the bench, Valparaiso went 15-16, earning third place in the MCC with a 10-6 mark. His coaching career began in 2002-03 in Overland Park, KS, where he served as an assistant coach for a Blue Valley Northwest High School team that reached the Kansas Class 6A State Tournament.

Walters' pedigree for coaching began as a player, receiving tutelage from some of the game's legendary coaches. Roy Williams at the University of Kansas and the NBA's Chuck Daly, Larry Brown and Pat Riley all mentored Walters during his years as a player.

He first made his name known in college, starring for two seasons at Kansas. In 68 starts under Williams, he averaged 15.6 points per game, leading the Jayhawks in scoring during both his junior and senior campaigns.

KU combined to go 56-12 overall in 1991-92 and 1992-93, winning back-to-back Big Eight titles and reaching the 1993 Final Four. Walters was named to the All-Big Eight team both seasons and won Big Eight Male Athlete of the Year as a senior in 1993.

As a junior, Walters averaged 16.0 points per game as the Jayhawks went 27-5. In his senior season, KU had a record of 29-7, with Walters scoring at a clip of 15.3 points per game.

Walters was an outstanding scorer from all areas of the court at Kansas, shooting nearly 51% from the field, 42% from three-point range and 85% at the free throw line. His college career originally began at Northwestern University, where he earned honorable mention from the Big 10 in 1989-90 after leading the team in scoring (17.6 ppg), three-point shooting (47.3%), free throw shooting (79.4%) and assists (125) as a sophomore.

It was during his senior season at Kansas that Walters made his first connection with Doherty, who joined the team as an assistant coach. The two reunited again for Doherty's single season at FAU, opening the door for Walters' move to the top.

After graduating from Kansas in 1993 with a B.S. in education, Walters was taken by New Jersey as the 16th overall pick in the 1993 NBA Draft. He went on to play seven seasons in total with the Nets, Philadelphia 76ers and Miami Heat, averaging 4.6 points and 1.7 assists per game in 13.7 minutes.

Walters averaged a career-best 6.8 points per game for Philadelphia in 1996-97, and made 67 career starts in 335 games. His career assist-to-turnover ratio was nearly two-to-one.

He was New Jersey's top three-point shooter in 1994-95 (36.2%) and Philadelphia's top long-range marksman in 1996-97 (38.5%). A constant competitor who is always ready for the game, he averaged 12.8 points and 7.3 assists per game in eight starts for the 76ers to end the 1995-96 season.

Walters' professional career spanned nine seasons in total, ending in 2002 after playing internationally for two years and also winning an American Basketball Association title with the Kansas City Knights.

A native of Omaha, NE, Walters and his wife, Deanna, have four children: Addison (9), Drew (7), Riley (4) and Gunner (2).

Jeff Parmer and Sean Alarcon were in the starting lineup for their Florida Atlantic debut. Each had five points and made one three-point attempt.

Seydou Kone also made his FAU debut, going 0-for-2 from the floor with one rebound in 10 minutes.

Simmons Shines in Sun Belt Opener

Derrick Simmons stepped up when the Florida Atlantic University men's basketball team needed him the most.

The junior scored 12 points in a span of 6:05 in the second half to spur the Owls to victory over the Troy Trojans, 91-87, at FAU Arena on Wednesday.

Simmons would lead the team in scoring with a career-high 21 points and four rebounds, his biggest shots coming with the team's top two scorers, Paul Graham and Carlos Monroe, not on the court. Graham left with an ankle injury and Monroe had foul trouble when Simmons made his run.

The Trojans were led by Ramsey's 22. They finished with five players scoring in double-figures while FAU finished with four.

Carlos Monroe scored 23 points and grabbed 15 rebounds for his fourth-career double-double and DeAndre Rice scored 22 points but the Florida Atlantic University men's basketball team couldn't overcome 38 free-throw attempts and a 50.0 percent shooting night by the University of Denver as the Pioneers held on for a 90-85 victory in Magness Arena on Thursday.

FAU shot 47.7 percent from the floor and 70.6 percent from the free-throw line, but with the game tied at 78 with 3:13 remaining, DU put together a 6-0 run thanks to a missed tip-in, a turnover and an offensive rebound and never looked back. Rice hit a three with 1:06 remaining to get FAU within three, 84-81, and a Monroe free throw would trim it to two, 84-82 with 29 seconds left.

The Owls were forced to foul in a comeback attempt, but DU hit all six of its free throws in the final 30 seconds. FAU held a 36-33 rebounding edge but Denver shot 38 free throws (26-for-38), compared to just 17 for FAU (12-for-17).

DU was led by DaShawn Walker's 25 points and Joseph Jackson added 21 off the bench. Walker went 5-for-12 from behind the arc to lead the Pioneer's 10-for-19 effort from deep.

Paul Graham left the game after being fouled hard by Walker who was whistled for an intentional foul and is listed as day-to-day with a lower back injury. Head Coach Rex Walters was ejected at the 12:44 mark of the first half following his second technical. Assistant coach Mike Balado took over in his place.

Rice Ties Scoring Record in Loss

DeAndre Rice tied a Florida Atlantic University men's basketball school record with 39 points but Troy University forced overtime and pulled out a 92-87 victory in Troy, AL on Saturday.

Rice went 12-for-24 from the floor, 10-for-16 from behind the arc, and grabbed three rebounds. The 10 made threes were one shy of FAU's school record. He has scored 71 points in his last two games and ties Ernest Crumbley for the school record for points in a single game. Crumbley scored 39 against Campbell on February 26, 2004. Brent Crews led Florida Atlantic with 10 rebounds while Paul Graham had a team-high seven assists. Carlos Monroe narrowly missed a double-double with 12 points and nine rebounds.

Troy had three players finish with more than 20 points led by Sammy Sharp's 25. Cedric Jackson added 21 and 10 rebounds while Richard Chaney scored 23 points.

FAU held a 42-40 halftime lead, but for the fourth-consecutive road game the Owls dropped a decision in which they were tied or led at the half.

The Owls took a six-point lead, 64-58, with 13:15 left in regulation on a pair of Rice free throws but the Trojans fought back to tie the game at 66 with 10:03 left. FAU rebuilt its lead to as many as nine, 78-69, with 5:47 left on two more free throws by Rice, but a 10-2 Trojan run had cut the lead to a single point, 80-79, after a pair of Jackson free throws with 3:55 remaining. Jackson was 10-for-10 from the charity stripe in the contest and the Trojans were 24-for-29 as a team. FAU attempted just 12 free throws, making 10.

A layup by Jeff Parmer gave FAU a three-point lead with 3:10 left, but a three by Boo Ramsey tied it up at 82 just 20 seconds later. Rice's 10th made triple of the night gave the Owls a three-point margin once again with 2:17 left, but Chaney's three with 28 seconds connected and sent the game to overtime as an off-balance shot at the buzzer by Rice was no good.

In the overtime, neither team was able to connect on a field goal attempt, but Troy made eight trips to the free throw line to FAU's two, and outscored the Owls 7-2 in the extra frame, including four clutch free throws by Chaney.

The Owls shot 45.7 percent in the game, 48.1 percent from deep and 83.3 percent from the line. The Trojans (9-12, 4-6 SBC) hit 43.3 percent of their field goals, 33.3 percent of their attempts from long range and 82.8 percent of their free throws.

Monroe, Graham Lead Owls in Upset Over WKU

Carlos Monroe registered his third-consecutive double-double and Paul Graham came away with two critical steals in the final seconds as the Florida Atlantic University men's basketball team walked into Bowling Green, KY and posted a huge win over Western Kentucky, 78-73.

Monroe was nearly unstoppable in the game, going 10-for-12 from the field and 6-for-10 from the line for 26 points while grabbing 12 rebounds - both game-highs. Graham gave FAU 17 points, but perhaps his biggest plays came on the other side of the ball, picking up two steals with less than 10 seconds left to secure the win.

UNO's Bo McCalebb led all scorers with 34 and James Parlow hit six threes and finished with 20 points.

FAU held a slim 38-37 lead at the break, but outscored UNO 60-40 in the second half, shooting 67.6 percent. The Owls posted a 46-26 rebounding edge in the ball game.

DeAndre Rice gave the Owls four scorers in double-figures, scoring 12 points. Derrick Simmons added nine and Brent Crews four. Graham led all players with seven assists.

The Owls (14-13, 9-7 SBC) are above .500 for the first time in 2007.

Owls Upend Jaguars

Carlos Monroe posted his 10th double-double of the season by halftime and DeAndre Rice scored 23 points on senior night as the Florida Atlantic University men's basketball team picked up a win over South Alabama, 79-69, on Wednesday at FAU Arena.

Monroe led all players with 12 points and 11 rebounds before the break. He was 6-for-11 from the floor. DeAndre Rice was 3-for-3 from behind the arc and converted both first-half free throw attempts for 11 first-half points. Daon Merritt led South Alabama with six in the first half.

Florida Atlantic shot 50.0 percent in the opening 20 minutes, while holding South Alabama to a lowly 23.3 percent. FAU out-rebounded USA 27-15. The Jaguars hit just two of their last 20 attempts from the floor in the opening session.

Two USA free throws by Brandon Davis gave the Jaguars a 18-15 lead with 7:58 left in the first half, but the Owls would finish the frame on a 20-4 run that saw Rice score eight of his 11 first-half points.

The Owls led 44-32 with 15 minutes remaining in regulation following a pair of free throws by Monroe, who finished with 21 points and 15 boards.

Rice reentered the game with six minutes remaining and immediately scored a layup to put the Owls up 11, 60-49. Rice would hit another huge bucket late in the shot clock at the five minute mark to balloon the Owl lead back up to 10, 62-52.

In perhaps the play of the game, following a Monroe missed free throw, Simmons grabbed the offensive board for a put-back and the harm and FAU's lead blossomed to 14 with just over four minutes remaining, 66-52. Simmons had 12 second-half points and finished with 16.

With the win, FAU clinches a home game in the first round of the Sun Belt Conference Tournament against a yet to be determined opponent. It is the team's fifth win in a row, sixth in a row at home.

The Owls (15-13, 10-7 SBC) clinched their second consecutive winning season, the first time the team has accomplished that since moving to Division I. The program posted three-consecutive winning campaigns from 1989-90 to 1991-92. The win is FAU's second over a top-three team in the conference in a week.

MTSU Snaps FAU's Five-Game Win Streak

Derrick Simmons and Paul Graham scored 17 points apiece but the Florida Atlantic University men's basketball team fell in its final regular-season contest, 79-59, at Middle Tennessee on Saturday.

The Owls hit just 38.1 percent of their field goals while allowing MTSU to hit 52.7 percent.

FAU trailed 36-28 at the half as MTSU used a diversified attack that saw seven players score at least four points. The Owls were led by Graham's 11 through 20 minutes. Carlos Monroe had seven points and six rebounds in the opening frame despite attempting just four field goals.

Monroe finished a single point shy of his 11th double-double of the season, scoring nine points and grabbing 11 boards in the contest. MTSU finished with four players in double-figures, led by Calvin O'Neil's 15.

The biggest difference in the game came down low, where the Blue Raiders outscored the Owls 34-4 in the paint in a physical contest. MTSU was also able to turn 19 FAU turnovers into 28 points, and led the entire game.

The Owls finish the regular season as the no. 6 seed for the upcoming Sun Belt Conference Tournament and will host no. 11 Florida International on Wednesday, February 28.

Owls Advance to Quarterfinals of SBC Tournament

It took a block at the end of regulation, the biggest crowd of the season, and a couple of huge stops for the Florida Atlantic University men's basketball team to overcome Florida International, 91-88, in overtime in the first round of the Sun Belt Conference Tournament at FAU Arena on Wednesday.

Carlos Monroe led the Owls with 26 points and 15 rebounds for his 11th double-double of the season, tied for second-most in a single campaign in FAU history. DeAndre Rice scored 23 points, and Jeff Parmer added 18 points and eight boards. Paul Graham contributed 17 points, giving the Owls four players in double-figures. In unfamiliar territory, the Owls trailed at halftime, 36-34. It was the first time FAU trailed at home after 20 minutes since January 26, 2006 vs. Lipscomb, a span of 16 games.

FIU's Alex Galindo came up with an offensive rebound with 51 seconds left and a chance to give his team a three-point lead, but he dropped the ball out of bounds and gave the Owls life.

Rice was fouled on the next possession. He would sink both and put the Owls in front, 80-79, with 40 seconds left, but Galindo would atone with a three pointer at the 25-second mark, putting the Owls down two.

Six seconds later, Rice would head to the free throw line after being fouled on a drive. He made both and tied the game at 82.

Monroe came up with a game-saving play, blocking Villegas's shot underneath the basket with less than 10 seconds left. A jump ball would give the Owls possession with 2.2 seconds left. Rice's half-court shot was wide, sending the game to overtime.

A Monroe free throw was the first point of the overtime, 83-82, with 3:45 left. A Fuller tip-in with 2:40 remaining and a Mike James layup gave FIU a three-point lead with 2:20 left, but Rice cut the lead back to one with a layup 15 seconds later.

A Sean Alarcon swipe and score gave the Owls a 87-86 lead with 1:21 left in the extra frame. After a frenzy under the basket, a Monroe right hook gave the Owls an 89-88 lead with 30 seconds left. FIU's Fuller would miss a three with 12 seconds left.

A season-best crowd of 2,017 helped the Owls overcome a nine-point second-half deficit. It's the biggest crowd since February 4, 2002, when 2,110 fans packed FAU Arena.

Crews posted a career-high 11 assists before fouling out, and Rice had a career-best six swipes in the ball game.
