

OUR COACH

Coach Dave Brazell is beginning his ninth year as coach of the Antelopes of Grand Canyon College.

This year may be a new experience for our coach as each previous year's record has been better than the year before. The first year Coach Brazell came to be cage mentor, which was the third year of the college, the record was 5 wins and 15 losses. From that time

the fortunes of the Antelopes have improved steadily with the mighty climax of last year's 20 and 0 record. The Antelopes have not had a losing season since 1953-54.

Coach attended high school at Harrison, Arkansas, where he made all-conference in football and all-conference and all-district in basketball. He entered the service between his junior and senior year and finished his high school education while in the Marines. In the Marines Mr. Brazell was a member of the First Marines and went ashore at Okinawa on "D" Day. He received the Purple Heart during this campaign. After the war the regiment moved on to Tientsen, China.

Coach Brazell was discharged in 1946 and immediately entered Arkansas State Teacher's College, Conway, Arkansas. Here he was a three year letterman on the Teacher's College football team. That isn't bad considering it took him only 2½ years to receive his Bachelor of Science Degree. Coach then transferred to the University of Arkansas where he received his Master's Degree.


Coach Brazell coached football, basketball, and baseball at Bentonville High School in Arkansas before moving to Arizona.

This will be a building year, according to Coach, with the possibility of a real good team the next two years.



jumping and shooting ability, Jim is expected to break into the starting line-up when he starts playing.




DAVE ANFINSON


LLOYD AYCOCK






DOUG TURNER




