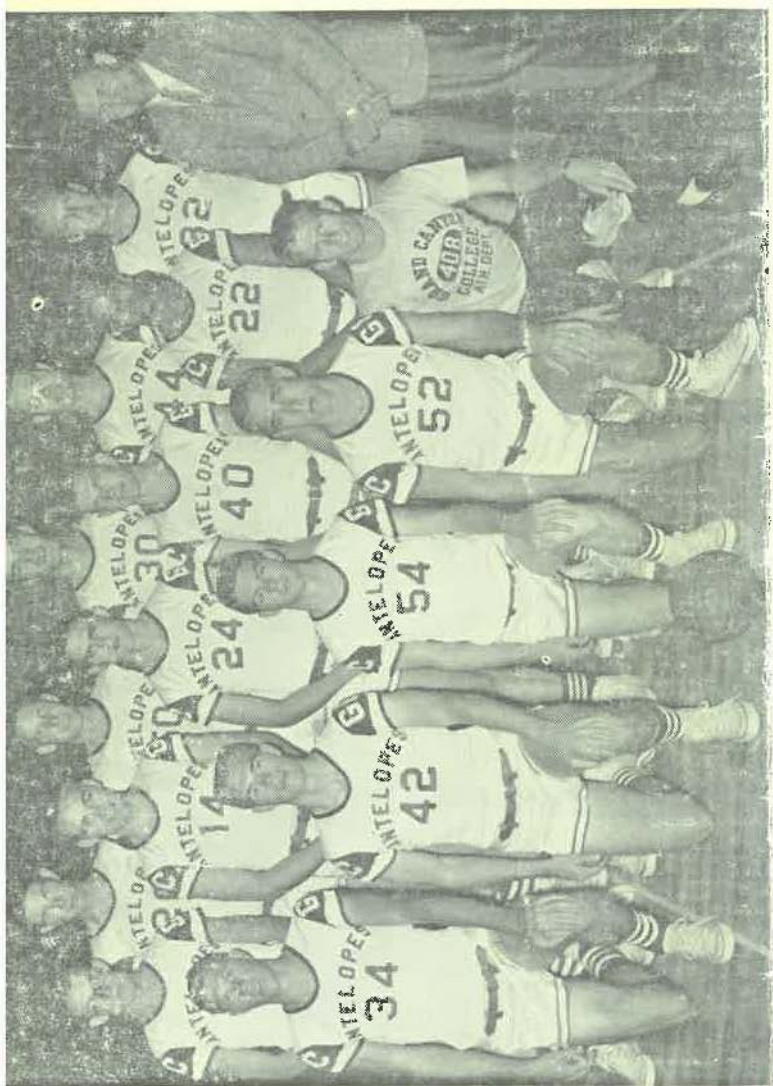

## OUR COACH

Coach Dave Brazell is returning this year as head of the Antelope herd after a year's leave of absence to work toward his doctor's degree at Arizona State University.



DAVE BRAZELL

This marks the 11th year Coach has been with Grand Canyon College with all but last year serving as head basketball and baseball coach.

The Antelopes have won 112 and lost 85 during this period and have not suffered a losing season since 1953-54 when they compiled 9 wins against 14 losses.

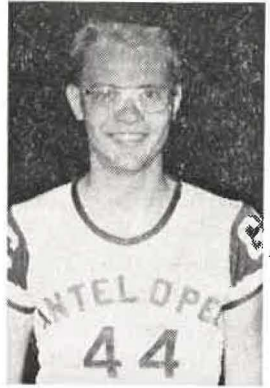
Coach attended High School at Harrison, Arkansas, where he made all-conference in football and all-conference and all-district in basketball. He entered the service between his junior and senior year and finished his high school education while in the Marines. In the Marines Mr. Brazell was a member of the First Marines and went ashore at Okinawa on "D" Day and received the Purple Heart in this campaign. After the war the regiment moved on to Tientsen, China. Coach continued his education and athletics at Arkansas State Teachers College finishing his Bachelor's Degree in 2½ years. After this Coach transferred to the University of Arkansas where he received his Masters Degree.

Before coming to Arizona Coach Brazell also coached football, basketball and baseball at Bentonville High School in Arkansas.

According to Coach this year's team should make a good showing, however, the schedule is the toughest yet. The Antelopes will have to go to keep that string of winning seasons going.

## DAVE ANFINSON

6'6" center from Glendale High School. Dave is a junior this year having lettered both his freshman and sophomore years. Playing mostly in the roll of a reserve, Dave is determined his last two years will see him playing more.



## LLOYD AYCOCK

A starter on last year's team Lloyd seems to be sewing up one of the starting guard positions. A great hustler with good defensive abilities, Lloyd has added the scoring punch which should make him a top-notch performer.



## BOB BUZZARD

Bob is a graduate of Washington High School where he was an outstanding performer for Coach Christensen's Rams. He attended the Palo Verde Junior College last year averaging some 19 points per game. A sophomore, much is expected from this lad the next three years.





### **JERRY CONNER**

This big 6'3" boy played outside last year but has been shifted under the basket to take advantage of his rugged rebound work. Jerry hails from Casa Grande where he was selected to play on the all-star team following his senior year.

### **JIM COOK**

A second Washington High graduate, Jim has been looking real good in practice and is sure to see a lot of action. He could be in the starting line-up at one of the guard positions.



### **DAVE CREECH**

This lad is trying to regain his basketball legs after spending three years on Uncle Sam's team. He attended Stetson University before going into the service where he was a starting guard. He has a deadly long shot, and should be a real asset to the Antelope cause.



### **NOEL FRANK**

6'4" senior has only the first semester of eligibility remaining. He was a starter for the Antelope five last year averaging 15 points per game. Noel is a graduate of Camelback High School and Eastern Arizona Junior College.

### **GARY GILLIAM**

At 6'3" this fellow plays against boys much larger. A sophomore and graduate of Washington High, Gary is playing forward this year and if pre-season scrimmages are an indication he should be hard to stop.



### **JIM JOHNSTON**

Jim is a big 6'4" sophomore and graduate of Chandler High School who had to work last year instead of trying out for the team. Jim has a real good touch and should develop into a real top-notch player.







### **BENNY LINDSEY**

This 6'3" graduate from Phoenix Christian is playing his last season for the Antelope five. Benny has been the team's leading rebounder and leading scorer the last two seasons, last year averaging better than 19 points per game.

### **HARRY MARTIN**

Another senior and two-year letterman Harry has one of the best long shots on the team. This ability puts him right in the middle of battle for a guard spot.



### **PAUL NIX**

A 6'2" junior Paul is an outstanding pitcher on the Antelope baseball team who decided he could also play basketball. After having worked out daily at the boy's club where he was employed this summer the results of his determination are very evident.





### **CHARLIE TAYLOR**

This jumping-jack was a stand out for Coach Howard Dean at Eloy last year. He should develop into one of the best all-around performers the Antelopes have had in some time.

### **MAYNARD TIDMORE**

This is Maynard's senior year and certainly it is his hope that this will be his best. He has chronic feet trouble which slows him down during early practice but has been doing real well as the season grows nearer. He has a real fine hook shot. Maynard has been a starter at center the last two years.

Grand Canyon College is proud to be the first and only church-related Liberal Arts College in Arizona.

Grand Canyon College is fully accredited by the University of Arizona and the Arizona State Board of Education. Grand Canyon College graduates have already received recognition for outstanding achievement.

The student body is large enough to support a complete liberal arts program, with a full schedule of social, cultural, and athletic activities. It is small enough to preserve the close personal relationships between students, and between students and faculty, which are essential to a satisfying college experience.

The college has an enrolment of 726 for the school year 1960-61 and has increased its enrolment each year.

Although the college receives one-third of the current income from fee, tuition, rents, etc., one-third from the Baptist General Convention of Arizona, it still depends on friends for the remaining third of the budget.
