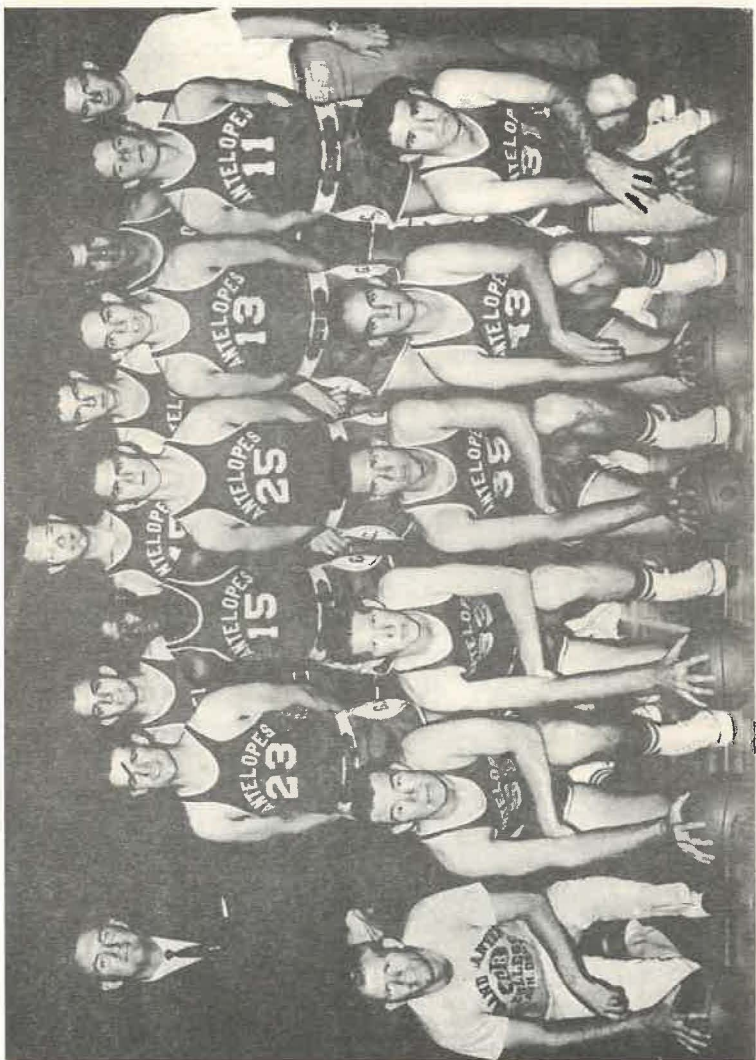

OUR COACH

Mr. Brazell



Coach Dave Brazell is starting his 12th year as head coach of the Antelope five. During this period, the Antelopes have won 126 games while losing 93 and have not had a losing season since 1953-54. Last season the crew won 14 and lost 8.

Coach attended High School at Harrison, Arkansas where he made all-conference in football and all-conference and all-district in basketball. He entered the service between his junior and senior years of high school but finished his high school education while in the marines. In the marines Mr. Brazell was a member of the First Marines and went ashore at Okinawa on "D" day, he also received the purple Heart in this campaign. After the war the regiment moved to Tiensten, China. Here Coach was a starting forward on a marine team which won the northern China championship.

Mr. Brazell continued his education and athletics at Arkansas State Teachers College finishing his Bachelor's Degree in 2½ years. After this Coach transferred to the University of Arkansas where he received his Master's Degree. At the present time, Coach is enrolled in the Doctoral program at Arizona State University.

Before coming to Arizona, Coach Brazell coached football, basketball, and baseball at Bentonville High School in Arkansas.

Coach is also president of the Arizona Assn. for health, physical education and recreation.

Assistant Coach

This is Coach Aycock's first year in the capacity of Assistant Coach. He will be in charge of the Junior Varsity team.

Mr. Aycock is directing the intramural program at GCC as he has done for the past two years, and teaches in the Physical Education department.



Coach Aycock is a graduate of North Phoenix High School where he was one of their most outstanding athletes. Football basketball, and baseball were his main sports, making all state in football and baseball.

In college Coach transferred to GCC his sophomore year and was a very valuable member of both the basketball and baseball team for three years.

Season's Outlook

This will be the shortest team GOC has had on the floor in 6 or 7 years. Only one boy on the squad is over 6' 3". At the present time it looks as though a couple of the starters may stand at 6' 3" with the other three even shorter.

Everything is not dark. however, Coach Brazzell states this year's crew will be the strongest out front we have had in a number of seasons.

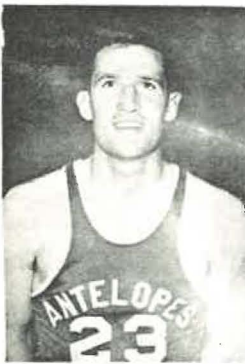
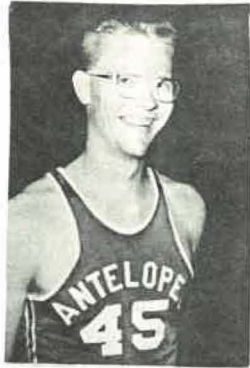
We have 5 or 6 boys out there who can give the opposition a tough time.

DAVE ANFINSON

6'6" center from Glendale High School. A two year letterman has played mostly as a reserve. As the tallest man on the team, Dave could really give the Antelopes a shot in the arm if he comes through this last year.

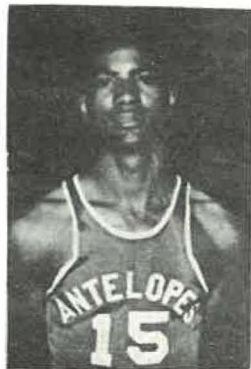


GERRY BREWER

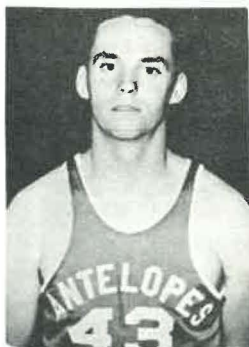
PHIL BROWN

the difference in our team this year.

JIM COOK

Jim was a starter the first semester last year but had to drop out the second semester. Averaged 11.5 points per game as a guard. Jim is expected to see plenty of action at the guard position and could very well receive a starting call come opening game.



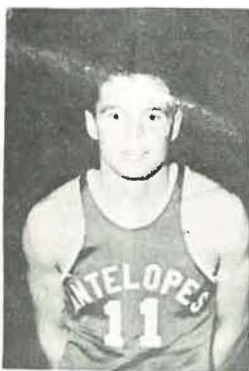
JOE CORDOVA

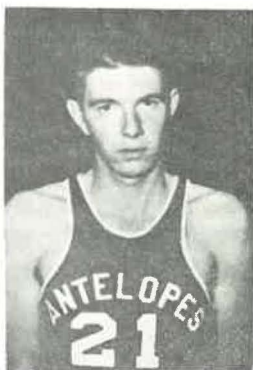
DUB FOSSUM

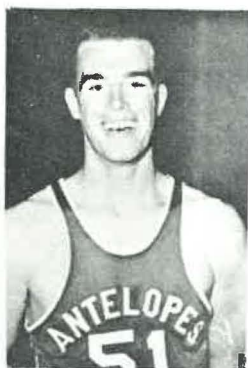
TERRY HANLEY

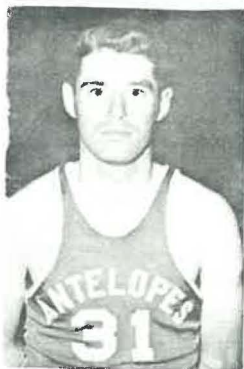
PAUL NIX

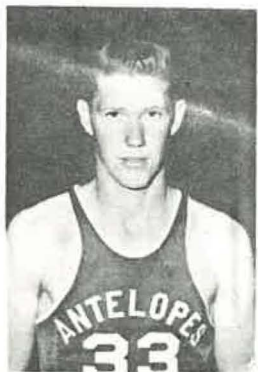
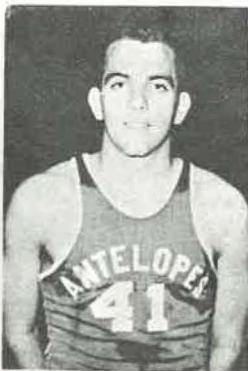
JIM SHIRLEY
