## OUR COACH



Coach Dave Brazell is starting his 13th year as head coach of the Antelopes. During this period the locals have won 135 and lost 106. Last year was the first season the Antelopes have failed to break even since 1953-54. Lack of height was the major cause in most of last years reverses. This problem according to coach still exists.



Coach is a native of Arkansas, where he attended high school at Harrison where he took part in all sports. After time for our Uncle Sam during World War II coach continued his education at Arkansas State Teacher's College where he finished his Bachelor's degree before transferring to the University of Arkansas where he received his Master degree. At the present time coach is enrolled in the Doctoral program at Arizona State Univ.

Before coming to Arizona Coach Brazell coached football, basketball, and baseball at Bentonville High School in Arkansas.

## ASSISTANCE COACH

This is Coach Aycock's second year in the capacity of Assistant Coach. He will also be in charge of the Junior Varsity team.

Mr. Aycock is directing the intramural program at GCC as he has done for the past two years, and teaches in the Physical Education department.

Coach Aycock is a graduate of North Phoenix High School where he was one of their most outstanding athletes. Football, basketball, and baseball were his main sports, making all state in football and baseball. In college Coach transferred to GCC his sophomore year and was a very valuable member of both basketball and baseball team for three years.



## SEASON'S OUTLOOK

Many of the same problems face us this year which were present last season. Height will be our major problem according to Coach Brazell. Our record last year could have been much better had we been able to pull down a couple of rebounds in the right place. Our shooting should be on par with any team we play, and if we can get extra effort on defense and come up with that rebound we should fair somewhat better than last season.

The boys we have although very little taller than those of last season, jump better and could do a better job.

### Gerry Brewer

Gerry is one of the best all-around basketballers to play at G.C.C. in sometime. Even better than 18.5 per game average is his defensive ability. In only one game last season did the man in which he guarded score his average.



### Phil Brown

Even though Phil is only 5' 11" this season finds him playing one of the inside positions. Phil has a pair of fast hands and a soft shot which will help him see a lot of action.

### Steve Bush

Steve will divide his time between center and forward. His shooting ability is his chief asset. Steve played on the J. V. team last year. He has been hitting the basket with real regularity so far this season.



### Dub Fossum

This little jumping-jack is in the thick of the fight for a starting guard position. Dub lettered as a freshman and is looking better than ever this season. Best ability is his long jump shot.

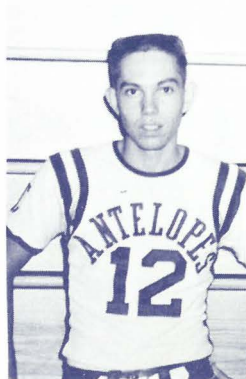


### Bill French

Al is a Phoenix College graduate of two years ago. A good outside set shooter and ball handler, Al will probably be used at both the guard and forward position.

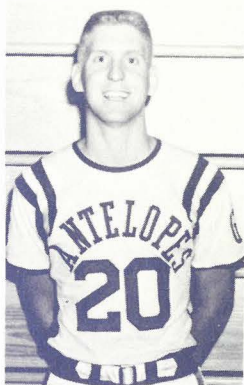
### Lynn South
