OUR COACH



Coach Dave Brazell is starting his 14th year as Head Coach of the Antelopes. During this period the locals have won 144 and lost 118. For the last two seasons the Antelopes have failed to break even. Previous to this the last losing season was



1953-54. Lack of height was the major cause in most of these reverses. This problem according to Coach still exists.

Coach is a native of Arkansas, where he attended high school at Harrison taking part in all sports. After time for our Uncle Sam during World War II, Coach continued his education at Arkansas State Teacher's College where he finished his Bachelor's Degree before transferring to the University of Arkansas where he received his Master's Degree. At the present time Coach is enrolled in the Doctoral program at Arizona State University.

Before coming to Arizona Coach Brazell coached football, basketball, and baseball at Bentonville High School in Arkansas.

ASSISTANT COACH

This is Coach Aycock's third year in the capacity of Assistant Coach.

Mr. Aycock also directs the intramural program at



GCC as he has done for the past three years, and teaches in the Physical Education department.

Coach Aycock is a graduate of North Phoenix High School where he was one of their most outstanding athletes.

Football, basketball, and baseball were his main sports, making all state in football and baseball. In college Coach transferred to GCC his sophomore year and was a very valuable member of both basketball and baseball teams for three years. This experience makes Mr. Aycock a valuable member of the coaching staff.

SEASON'S OUTLOOK

In asking Coach Brazell to give a thumbnail sketch of this years team, Coach said to print last years statement. The main thought in that statement was "lack of height." The Antelopes have added a couple of boys who are taller than last years crew, but they still aren't tall enough.

Last years team was a classic example of the need for a taller team. We had the best shooters we've ever had, yet we didn't quite break even because of those rebounds.

Larry Barfield

This transfer from Paris Junior College in Texas is going to give both basketball and baseball a try at GCC. At 6'4" Larry should help a great deal in the rebound department so badly needed by the Antelopes.



Phil Brown

This will be Phil's last season with the local hardwooders. An excellent shooting touch and good speed should make this fellow an outstanding guard. Last year Phil played under the basket and still managed an 8 point average. Scored 27 points in one game last year for a season high.

Dub Fossum

Shooting is Dub's strong point, especially the long jump shot. He has lettered two years in both basketball and baseball. This experience should earn him a starting position at one of the guard spots.



Bill French

Much is expected of this fellow. Bill averaged 18 points per game last season while playing center on the Antelope team. This year will find him dividing his time between guard and forward. Bill played for Coach McGrath at Eastern Arizona before coming to GCC.



Terry Hanley

This is Terry's third year with the Antelopes. He was a Washington High star in his high school days. Terry was hurt much of last season, but is ready to fight for a starting guard position. Good shooting ability and good hustle will help him log a lot of playing time.

Roger Jackson

Roger played on the J. V. team last year. This product of Ajo High School has a good shooting eye and could develop into a strong over-all performer.



Ron Lewis

Ron was the top scorer for Coach Benny Lindsey at Phoenix Christian last season. His outstanding play earned him a spot in the all-star game played at Flagstaff this past summer. Ron could easily be one of the future stars for the Antelopes.



Allen Pile

Al is in his second season as an Antelope. Lettered last year at guard but because of his jumping ability may be moved inside to improve the rebound strength. Al played at Phoenix College before transferring to GCC.

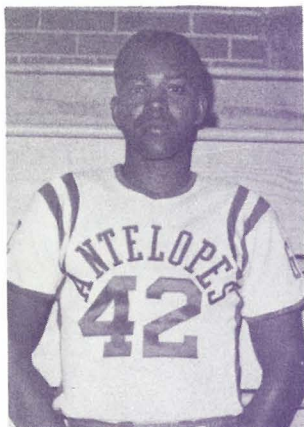
Lynn South

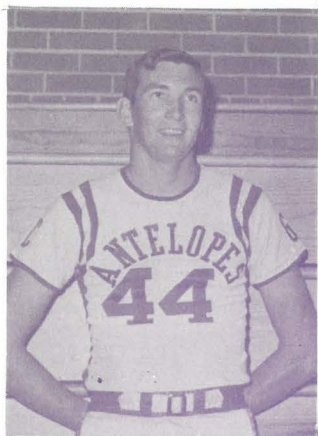
Richard Thompson
