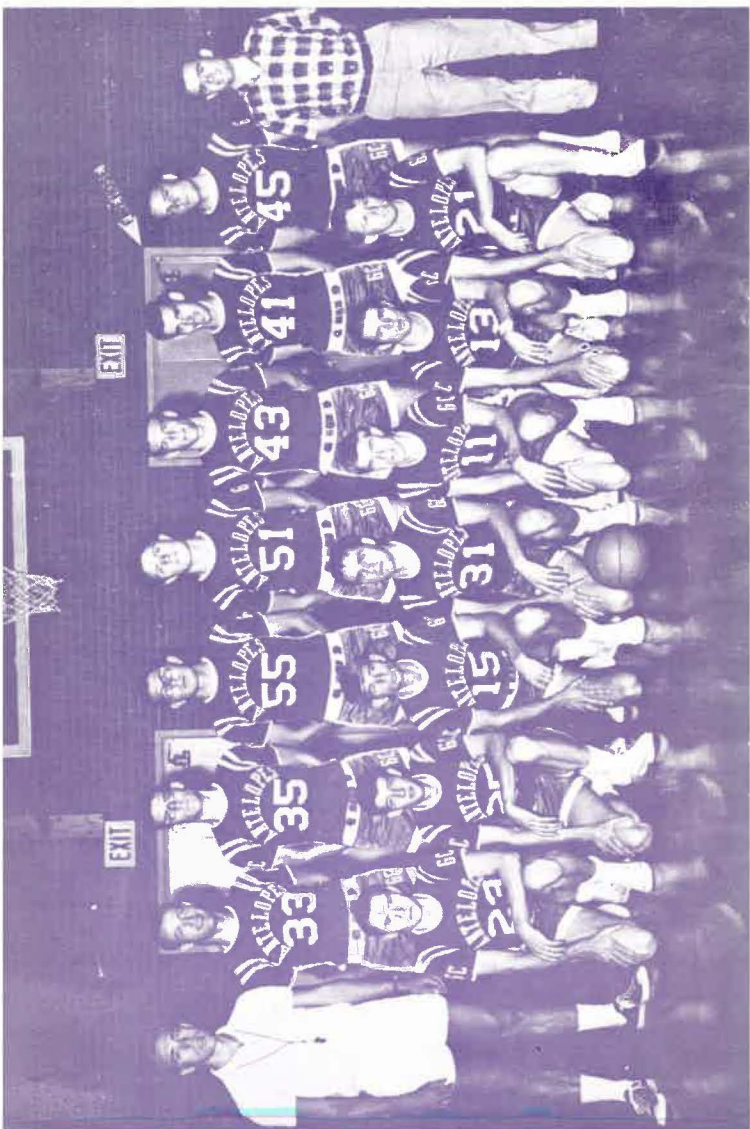

COACH LINDSEY



Coach Ben Lindsey will be starting his second year as head mentor of the Antelope herd.

In his first season Coach put together a high scoring squad which set an all time scoring record of 89.7 points per game and 2155 points for the season.

Coach Lindsey is an alumni of Grand Canyon College. During this time "Big Ben" set most of the present Antelope scoring records. (1) Most points in a three year career, 1235. (2) Most points in a single season, 510. (3) Most points in a single game, 44, and (4) Highest average for a single season with a 23.2 average

Since receiving a bachelors degree at Grand Canyon Coach received a masters degree from Arizona State University where he is currently enrolled doing work beyond this degree.

Before becoming basketball coach at G.C.C., Mr. Lindsey was head basketball and baseball coach at Phoenix Christian High School for three years.

Coach is married and has a son four.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



Coach Dave Brazell is in his 16th season at Grand Canyon College. A native of Arkansas, Coach is a graduate of Harrison High School in Arkansas, Arkansas, Arkansas State Teachers College and the University of Arkansas.

Since moving to Arizona, Coach has furthered his education at Arizona State

For 14 years Mr. Brazell coached the basketball team in addition to his now present job of Athletic Director and Baseball Coach. During this time the Antelopes won 151 games while losing 134. The best record was 1958 - 59 when the hardwood crew were undefeated, winning all 20 games.

Last year's baseball team was 23 and 12 against some of the toughest teams in the country. Over the past four seasons the Antelopes are 79 - 40. This next season promises to be another exciting one with the locals playing close to a 40 game schedule with about 35 of these on the home diamond.

Mr. Brazell is active in numerous professional organizations. At the present time he is Chairman for the Men's Athletic Division of the Southwest District of the American Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation. Mr. Brazell is also a past president of the Arizona Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

SEASON'S OUTLOOK

Coach Ben Lindsey will open his second season as head basketball coach at Grand Canyon College with a 14 man squad built around last year's two top scorers, senior Wayne Bateman and junior Bill Sullivan. Bateman headed the Antelope scorers last season with a 17.5 per game average and Sullivan finished a strong second with 15.0 per game.

Wayne and Bill should be helped a great deal with their inside chores by 6' 5" Junior College transfer Ron Waddell and 6' 4" sophomore returnee Duane Gagnon. 6' 5" transfer Jim Nelson and 6' 3" freshman Jim Murphy are also looking good.

Heading the guard positions are J. C. Helton and Ernie Foote, a couple of small but extremely quick ball hawks. Jim Carlile, a transfer from Eastern Arizona Junior College, will not be eligible until the second semester but is expected to add a great deal of scoring punch at that time. Gerald Nikolaus, Dennis Holt, and Bob Corley fill out what should be a very strong group of guards. Leaper Ron Lewis and newcomer Lee Dollar round out the Antelope squad.

Facing a 27 game schedule including the Top of Nation Tournament in Alamosa, Colorado, and many of the strongest small college teams in the Southwest, Coach Lindsey feels his squad will be on the winning side of .500. The big question is whether or not the improvement in rebounding will be enough to offset what has been a crippling weakness in recent Antelope editions: If it is, the season's outlook should be a bright one.

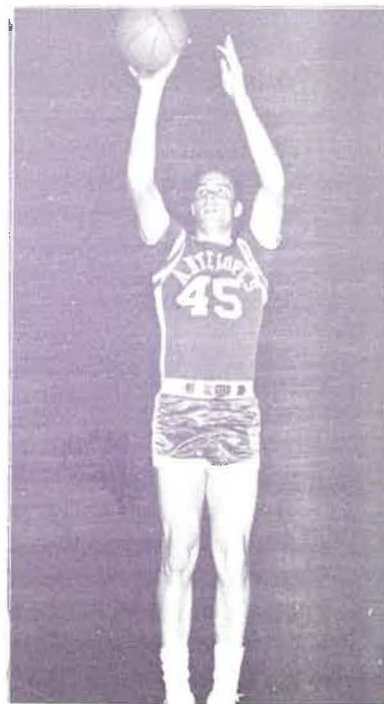

Junior

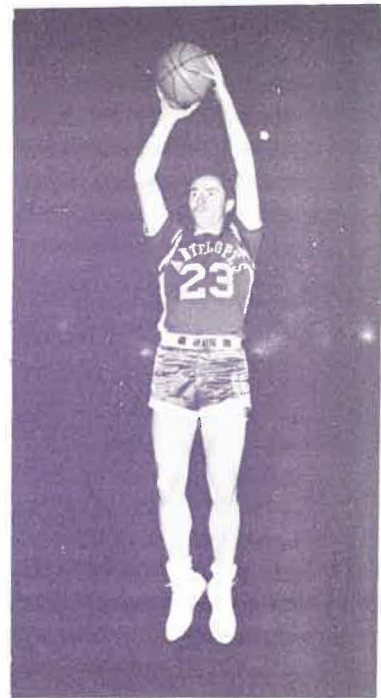

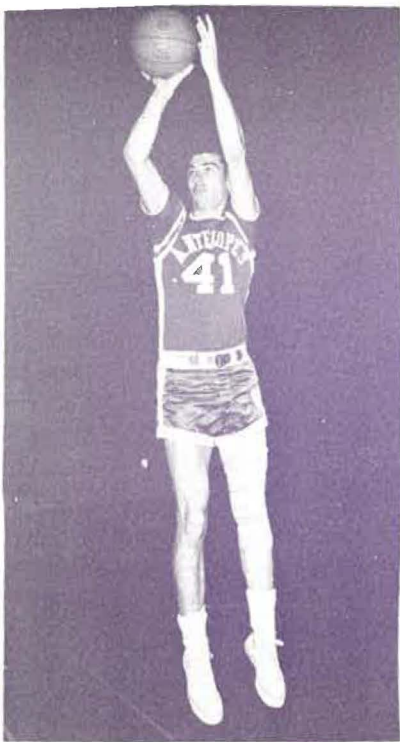
BOB CORLEY

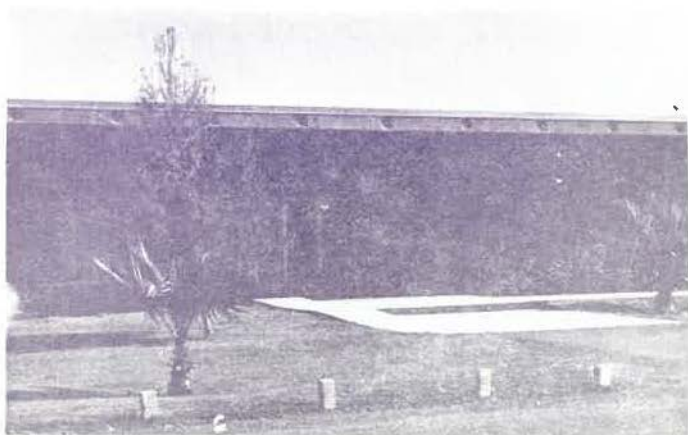
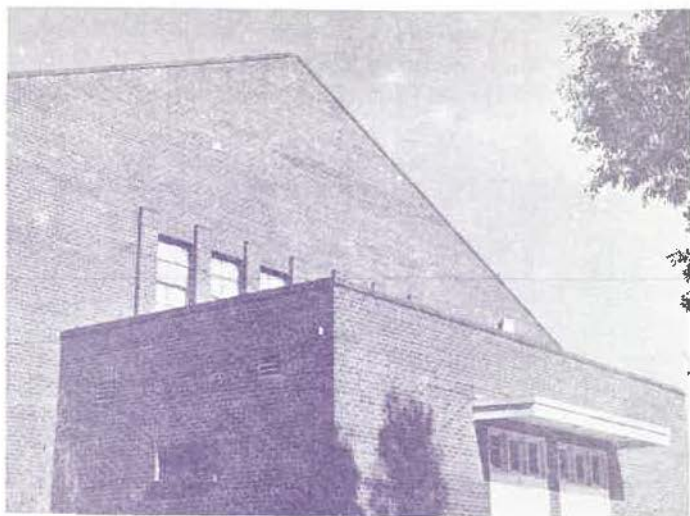
