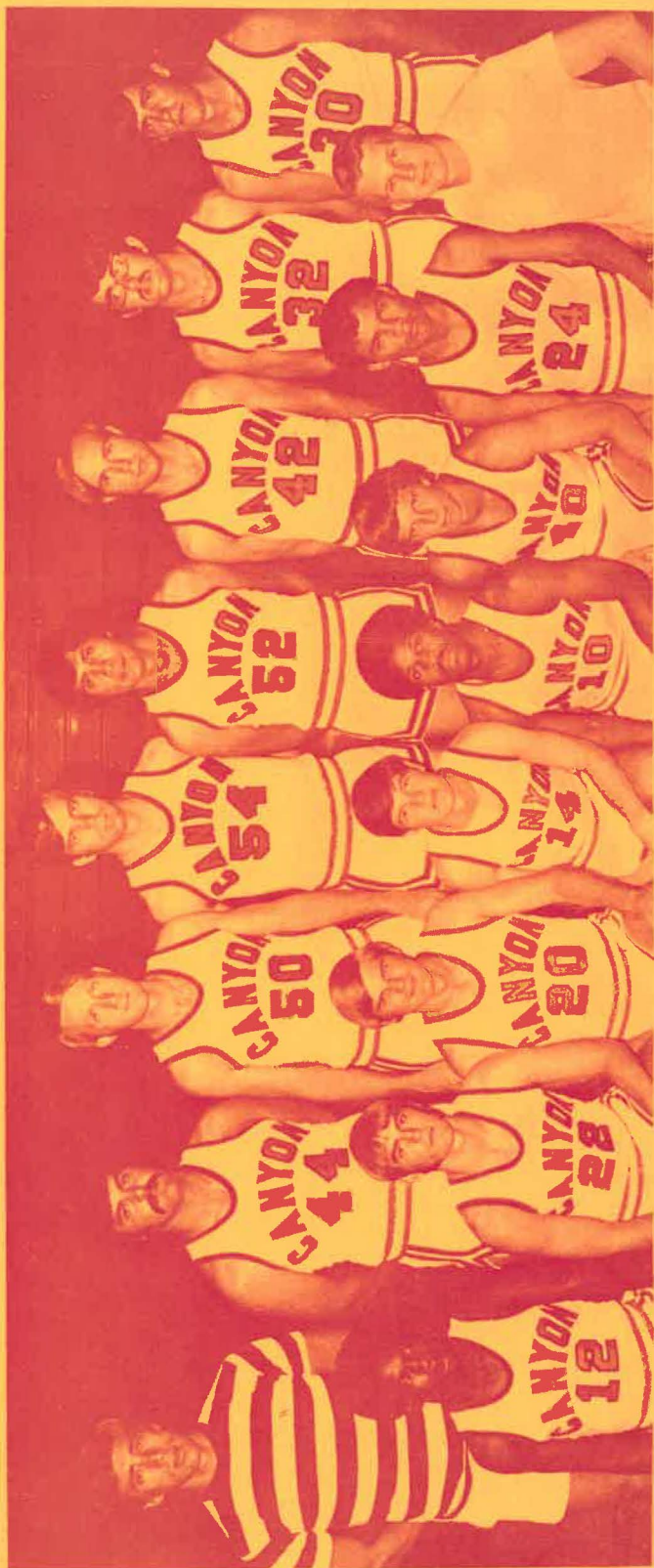

COACH LINDSEY



Coach Ben Lindsey will be starting his seventh year as head mentor of the Antelope herd.

In his first three seasons, Coach put together a hustling, high scoring crew, but lack of height kept the Antelopes around the .500 mark with records of 11-13, 14-13, and 11-13.

The next two years the Lindsey Lopes came on strong with records of 14-11 and 21-6, which led to their first berth ever in the N.A.I.A. District 7 playoffs.

Last year Lindsey suffered his worst won-lost record with the Lopes as they skidded to a 10-17 mark. This left Coach's career record at 81-73.

Coach is an alumnus of Grand Canyon College. During this time "Big Ben" broke four school scoring records, two of which still stand. His most points in a single game, 44, and most points in a three year career, 1235, may be hard for future players to match.

Since receiving a bachelors degree at Grand Canyon, Coach received a masters degree from Arizona State University where he is currently enrolled doing work beyond this degree.

Before becoming basketball coach at G.C.C., Lindsey was head basketball and baseball coach at Phoenix Christian High School for three years.

Coach's wife, Jerri, is also an alumnus of G.C.C. and has earned a masters degree from Arizona State University. They have two sons, Yancy and Randall, and a daughter, Mandy.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



Coach Dave Brazell is in his 21st season at Grand Canyon College. A native of Arkansas, Coach is a graduate of Harrison High School in Arkansas, State College Of Arkansas, and the University of Arkansas. Since moving to Arizona Coach has found time to earn an Ed. D. degree

at Arizona State.

For 14 years Dr. Brazell coached the basketball team in addition to his present job of Athletic Director and Baseball Coach. During this time, the antelopes won 151 games while losing 134. The best record was 1958-59 when the hardwood crew was undefeated, winning all 20 games.

Last year's baseball team was 39 and 19 against some of the toughest teams in the country. The local nine was ranked in the top ten in the nation in the college division for almost the entire season. The Antelopes again qualified for the District Tournament -- a feat they have accomplished every year since becoming eligible for the playoffs. They won the district and area tournaments and again qualified for the national tournament.

Over the past five seasons the Antelopes are 176-70. This next season promises to be another exciting one with the locals playing close to a 48 game schedule with about 40 of these on the home diamond.

Dr. Brazell is active in numerous professional organizations. He is past Chairman for the Men's Athletic Division of the Southwest District of the American Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation, also a past president of the Arizona Association for Health, Physical Education, and Recreation.

SEASON'S OUTLOOK

Several new faces will dot the 1971-72 basketball picture as the Antelopes at Grand Canyon College prepare to meet their most challenging schedule ever. A 28 game slate against some of the West's finest small college basketball teams will begin December 3rd when the Lopes open at home against Southern Utah State.

Only two players return from last year's 10-17 crew, worst in Coach Ben Lindsey's six years at the helm. Rob Babcock, 6'3" guard and Jim Irvine, 6'5" forward, both Sophomore lettermen, are the returnees. Irvine averaged 11.5 PPG and 6.1 RPG as a starter for last year's Lopes while Babcock averaged 5.1 PPG in mostly a relief role.

Newcomers who should definitely see plenty of action for the rejuvenated Lopes are 6'7" center Rudy Santa Cruz, J.C. transfer from Phoenix College, 6'4" Rodney Baxter, J.C. transfer from York, Neb., and 5'11" guard Bernie Teague, a quick and speedy transfer from Palmer J.C. in Iowa.

Gary Bretz, 6'7" center, Steve Dunse, 6'3" forward, and Eugene Helton, a 5'11" sharpshooting guard, all redshirted last season and are ready to go this year.

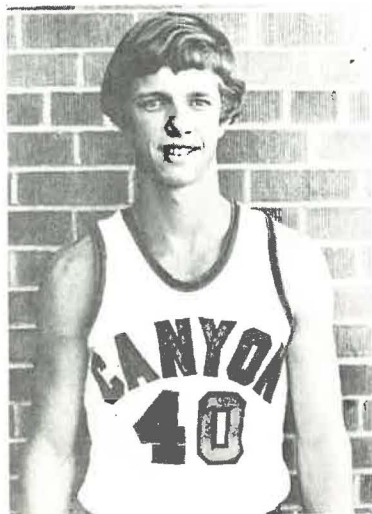
Other promising newcomers are 6'4" Craig Darrington, former player at Mesa J.C. via a stint in the military, and two fine freshmen prospects in 6'4" guard Kelly Bateman from Agua Fria H.S., and 6'0" guard David Everett from Rochester, New York.

This year's squad should be much improved in several different areas over that of last year's team. This improvement should come in the form of better quickness, better ballhandling, and better outside shooting. Because of added quickness and speed, the Lopes' defense will also be given more emphasis.

With the loss of "Big Jim Rice" the Lopes rebounding will undoubtedly suffer, but possibly the most crucial weakness could be too many new players and lack of experience. A few games and time will tell.

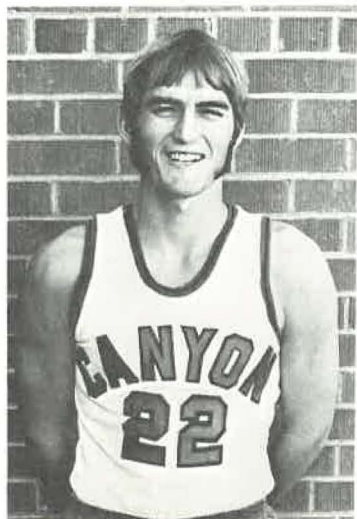
GARY BRETZ

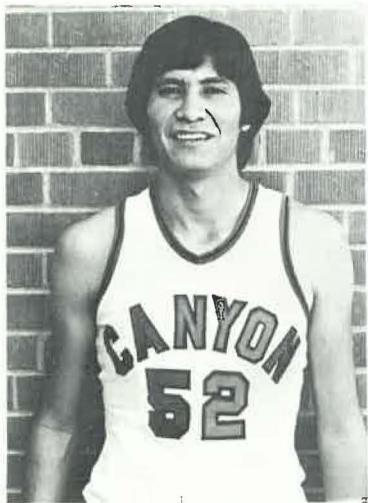


RUDY SANTA CRUZ

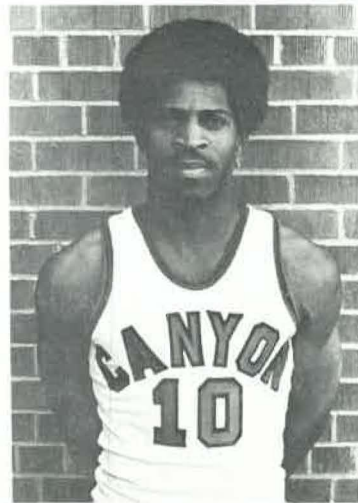

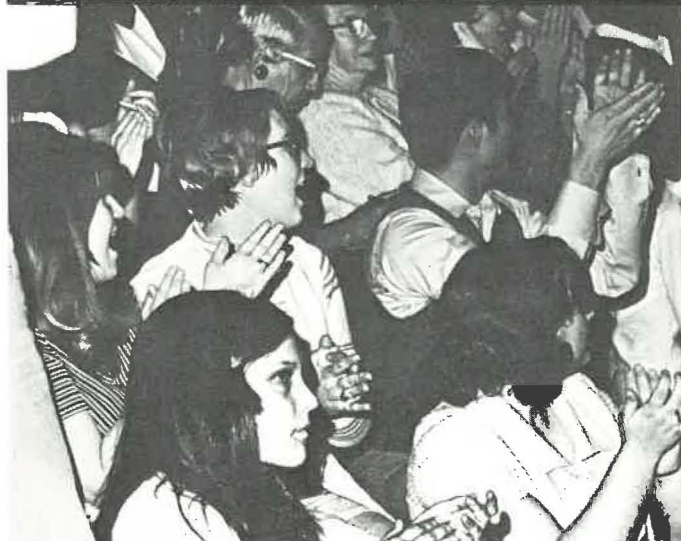
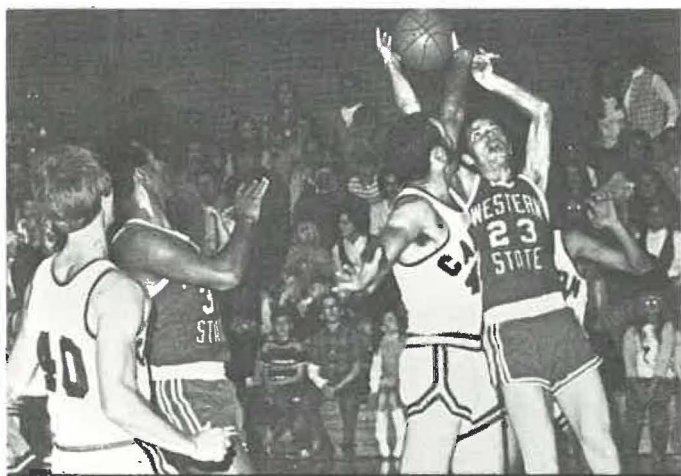
