






ARIZONA'S COACH OF THE YEAR...

This past year the State of Arizona bestowed on Ben Lindsey its highest honor in coaching by selecting him, along with ASU's Frank Kush, as ARIZONA''S COACH OF THE YEAR. Bayard Forrest, Lindsey's prize player during the past four years, was also honored as the AMATEUR ATHLETE OF THE YEAR.

Ben Lindsey will be starting his twelfth year as head mentor over the Antelopes. During this period of time the Lopes have established themselves as a national powerhouse in small college basketball, highlighted by the winning of 1975's NAIA NATIONAL BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP. Lindsey's overall career record as a coach is

Lindsey's overall career record as a coach is 202-103 with his best efforts being the last three years when his charges attained a combined record of 85-8. In 1973-74 Lindsey's Lopes made a strong bid for an undefeated season when they won their first 24 games before losing their next to last regular season game. They then went on to win the District Championship and advanced to the NAIA Nationals where they were eventually upset, finishing with a 28-2 record. In 1974-75 the Lopes were not to be denied as they went all the way, winning the NAIA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP and finishing with a 30-3 record. Last season the Lopes again put together a fantastic regular season record, but fell in the second round of the NAIA Nationals to Newberry S.C. 58-65. This ended their season record at 27-3.

Coach Lindsey's teams have been characterized by solid team defense and a well-drilled offense. In recent years the Lopes have consistently been among the nation's top defensive teams. The past four years have seen Lindsey's teams hold their opponents to a combined field goal percentage of .395, while their own machine like offense has clicked at a .473 rate.


Lindsey's system of play has led the previously unknown school to national recognition. Over the past three years the Lopes have consistently been ranked in the top five college division teams in the nation by Associated Press and U.P.I. The Lopes have also been featured in Sports Illustrated on two different occasions.

Coach Ben Lindsey GRAND CANYON COLLEGE ANTELOPES



In the eight years the Antelopes have been members of the NAIA, they have qualified six times for post season play, winning the District Championship the last four years in a row and advancing to the NAIA National Tournament in Kansas City, Missouri. Coach Lindsey has been twice selected as NAIA District Coach of the Year, NAIA Area Coach of the Year, and in 1975 was selected by the National Association of Basketball Coaches as a candidate for Kodak's National College Division Coach of the Year.

Coach is a native Arizonan, born in Glendale, AZ., and is an alumnus of Grand Canyon's class of '62. During this time "Big Ben", a sharpshooting forward, broke four school scoring records, two of which still stand. His most points in one season, 510, and most points per game, 23.2, were broken in 1966-67 by Wayne Bateman. His most points in a single game, 44, and most points in a three year career, 1235, and most field goals in one game, 18, still remain on the books.

Since receiving a bachelors degree at Grand Canyon, Coach has earned a masters degree plus doing additional work at Arizona State University.

Coach's wife, Jerri, is also a teacher. She is an alumnus of Grand Canyon and has also earned a masters degree from Arizona State University. They have two sons, Yancy and Randall, and a daughter, Mandy.

Athletic Director

GRAND CANYON COLLEGE

Coach Dave Brazell is in his 26th season at Grand Canyon College. A native of Arkansas, Coach is a graduate of Harrison High School in Arkansas, University of Central Arkansas, and the University of Arkansas. His doctoral work was completed at Arizona State University.

For 14 years Dr. Brazell coached the basketball team in addition to his job of Athletic Director and Baseball Coach. During this time, the Antelopes won 151 games while losing 134. The best record was 1958-59 when the hardwood crew was undefeated, winning all 20 games.

Last year's baseball team was 44 and 18 against some of the toughest teams in the country. The local nine was ranked in the top ten in the nation in the college division for almost the entire season. The Antelopes again qualified for the District Tournament; a feat they have accomplished every year since becoming eligible for the playoffs. In a three of five series, the Antelopes captured three of four from Southern Utah to advance to the Area Tournament. In the area tournament the local crew lost in the finals to St. Mary's of Texas.

Over the past five seasons, the Antelopes are 208-85. This next season promises to be another exciting one with the locals playing close to a 60 game schedule with about 48 of these on the home diamond.

Dr. Brazell is active in numerous professional organizations. He is past Chairman for the Men's Athletic Division of the Southwest District of the American Association for Health, Physical Education, and Recreation. Three years ago, the Arizona Coaches Association dedicated the State High School game to Dr. Brazell. After that he traveled to St. Joe, Missouri, where he was inducted into the NAIA Baseball Coaches Hall-of-Fame.

SEASONS OUTLOOK

To say that the Antelopes of Grand Canyon College are in the midst of a rebuilding year is a gross understatement. With the loss of first team all-Americans Bayard Forrest and David Everett (Forrest was drafted in the 2nd round by Seattle and Everett in the 4th by Portland) plus the likes of Bob Stout, Steve Pappas, and Dan Schnidt, the chore of holding together one of the most powerful small college programs in the nation could by a monumental task. All the Lopes have done during the last four years is win four straight District Championships, one National Championship, attain an AP national ranking of 2nd, and win 104 games while losing only 18. --- Not to mention the setting of numerous individual, team, and school records.

Coach Ben Lindsey is not one to live in the past, however, and this year's edition of the Antelopes promises to be more than just another rebuilt model. Several new players have been added to the handful of returnees and the new talent appears to have the ability to keep the Lopes on the winning trail.

Principal players returning from last year's 27-3 squad are 6'3" Mike Osborne, 6'5" george Holm, and 6'6" Jon Forrest. Osborne was a starting guard while Holm and Forrest shared starting duties at the forward spot. 6'0" guard Richard Bacon, 6'5" Wayne Harrison, and 6'3" forward Duame Poole also return as does redshirts Chuck Moorer, a 5'9" guard and Dan Martin a 6'5" forward.

Three former all-conference players from the Arizona JUCO league head the list of new players and they should give the Lopes some much-needed help. They are George Hall, $6^{1}7''$ center, and Ed Dawson, $6^{1}0''$ guard, both from Mesa Community College, and $6^{1}3''$ swingman Nate Stokes from Central Arizona J.C.



The Lopes appear to be strong at the guard position with a great deal of depth. Inside the Lopes will be smaller than they have been in several years, but could offset this with quickness and jumping ability. Experience will be the biggest obstacle to overcome, however, as only four players have seen any appreciable varsity action. According to head coach Ben Lindsey, the early season games will be critical in developing the maturity and leadership necessary if the Lopes hope to capture their fifth District title in a row and another trip to Kansas City.




RICHARD BACON




ED DAWSON



GEORGE HALL Center 6'7" Junior



Forward 6'5" Junior



Forward 6'5" Senior



Forward 6'5" Senior




CHUCK MOORER

Guard 6'3" Junior



DUANE POOLE


Forward 6'3'' Senior


