

Over 200 Wins...

Ben Lindsey will be starting his thirteenth year as head mentor over the Antelopes. During this period of time the Lopes have established themselves as a national powerhouse in small college basketball, highlighted by their winning of the 1975 NAIA NATIONAL BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP.

Lindsey's overall career record as a college coach is 222-112 with his best efforts being the last four years when his teams attained a combined record of 105-17. In 1973-74 Lindsey's Lopes made a strong bid for an undefeated season when they won their first 24 games before losing their next to last regular season game. They then went on to win the District Championship and advanced to the NATA Nationals where they were upset by one point in the second round, finishing with a 28-2 record.

In 1974-75, however, the Lopes were not to be denied as they went all the way, winning the NATA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP and finishing with a 30-3 record. In 1975-76 the Lopes again made it to the NATIONAL TOURN-ament, but were stopped by a strong Newberry S.C. team before ending their season at 27-3. This also ended the sensational four year careers of first team ALL-AMERICANS Bayard Forrest and David Everett. Both were drafted in early rounds by the NBA. Forrest is presently playing with the Phoenix Suns.

Last season Lindsey was faced with a monumental task of rebuilding and came through admirably, leading the Lopes to a 20-9 season record and again qualifying for post-season play for the sixth year in a row. The Lopes failed to win the District Championship for the first time in five years, however, as an experienced team for Southern Utah State nipped the Lopes 66-64 and then went on to win the title.

In the nine years the Antelopes have been members of the NAIA, they have qualified seven times for postseason play, winning the District Championship four of
those years and advancing to the NAIA National Tournament in Kansas City, Missouri. Coach Lindsey has been
twice selected as NAIA District Coach of the Year, and
in 1975 was selected by the National Association of
Basketbail Coaches as a candidate for National College
Division Coach of the Year. The State of Arizona bestowed its highest honor in coaching on Coach Lindsey
in 1975 by selecting him as ARIZONA'S COACH OF THE
YEAR. Bayard Forrest, Lindsey's prize player, was also

honored as ARIZONA'S AMATEUR ATHLETE OF THE YEAR.

Coach Lindsey's teams have been characterized by solid team defense and a well-drilled offense. The Lopes, in recent years, have consistently been among the nation's top defensive teams. Lindsey's system of play and leadership have led Grand Canyon College to national recognition. On several occasions in recent years the Lopes were ranked in the top five college division teams in the nation by Associated Press and U.P.I. The Lopes were also featured in Sports Illustrated on two different occasions.

Coach is a native Arizonam, born in Glendale, AZ., and is an alumnus of Grand Canyon's class of '62. During this time "Big Bem", a sharpshooting forward, broke five school scoring records, three of which still stand. His most points in one season, 510, and most points per game, 23.2, were broken in 1966-67 by Wayne Bateman. His most points in a single game, 44, most points in a three year career, 1235, and most field goals in one game, 18, still remain on the books.

Since receiving a bachelors degree at Grand Canyon, Coach has earned a masters degree plus doing additional work at Arizona State University.

Coach's wife, Jerri, is also an alumnus of Grand Canyon and a school teacher. She specializes in Learning Disabilities and has earned a masters degree from Arizona State University. They have two sons, Yancy and Randall, and a daughter, Mandy




Dr. Dave Brazell ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Coach Dave Brazell is in his 27th season at Grand Canyon College. A native of Arkansas, Coach is a graduate of Harrison H.S. in Arkansas, Univ. of Central Arkansas, and the Univ. of Arkansas. His doctoral work was completed at Arizona State University.

For 14 years Dr. Brazell coached the basketball team in addition to his job of Athletic Director and Baseball Coach. During this time, the Antelopes won 151 games while losing 134, including a 20-0 season in 1958-59. Last year's baseball team was 39-24 against some of

Last year's baseball team was 39-24 against some of the toughest teams in the country. The local nine was ranked in the top ten in the nation in NAIA for almost the entire season. Over the past ten seasons, the Antelopes have averaged 40 wins against 15 losses. This next season promises to be another exciting one with the locals playing close to a 60 game schedule with about 48 of these on the home diamond.

Dr. Brazell is active in numerous professional organizations. He is past Chairman for the Men's Athletic Division of the Southwest District of the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, and Recreation. Four years ago, the Arizona Coaches Association dedicated the State High School All-Star game to Dr. Brazell. After that he traveled to St. Joe, Missouri, where he was inducted into the NAIA Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame. Last year, Coach received a beautiful 25-year plaque from the American Association of College Baseball Coaches.



J. C. Helton ASSISTANT COACH

Coach J.C. Helton is a former Antelope himself having played for the Canyon in 1965-68. Since that time Coach Helton has been teaching and coaching at Issac Junior High School in Phoenix, where he has built powerhouses in all sports. His basketball teams have won over eighty percent of there games including the State Junior High School Championship and numerous other tournaments.

Mr. Helton will be assisting Coach Lindsey on a part-time basis while continuing his duties at Issac Junior High. He formerly helped in 1968-69 when he led the Lope freshman team to a 14-4 record.

His wife Elaine is employed by Westcor Inc. They have a daughter Sabrina and a son John.

Seasons Outlook

Seven lettermen, including four starters, return from the Antelope's 1976-77 squad which went 20-9 on the season, qualifying them for post-season play for the sixth consecutive year. 6'7" center George Hall heads the list of returnees along with 6"4" forward Nate Stokes. Hall led the Lopes in both scoring and rebounding last season with 16.3 PPG and 9.2 RPG and was honored as a member on the All-District team. Stokes was second in scoring and rebounding with 12.0 and 7.0 respectively and appears to be headed for an even better senior year. Other returning starters are 6'3" Mike Osborne and 6'0" Richard Bacon. Osborne and Bacon were the Lope's starting guards last season and averaged 9.0 PPG and 9.2 PPG respectively. Other top returnees are 6'6" forward Bill Price, 5'9" guard Chuck Moorer, 6'6" center-forward Jeff Churchill, and 6'0" guard Ed Dawson.

Four junior college transfers have joined the Lopes and should add a great deal of strength and depth to the team. Heading the list of J.C. transfers is Ray Arvizu, a 6'2" all-conference and all-district guard from Glendale Community College. Arvizu scored 18.2 PPG for the Gauchos last year. Willie Polk, a 6'5" swingman from Yavapai College and Hank Herrington, a 6'5" forward from Phoenix College, are also promising newcomers as is 5'10" Jim Pappas from Oakton J.C. in Illinois. Polk and Herrington averaged 15.0 PPG and 16.7 PPG respectively while garnering second team honors in the Arizona JuCo league. Other outstanding newcomers are 6'9" Ray Jackson who spent last year attending Phoenix College and Grace College of Indiana, and George Slade, a 6'5" forward who was all-everything in the greater Rochester, New York area. Slade averaged 25.0 PPG as a high school prep.

The Antelope's main strength this year should be their over-all experience, as is evidenced by six of their top seven players returning from last year's team. Depth




should also be a strength, expecially at the guard spot. Bill Price appears to be much improved over last year and should bolster the inside strength along with Jeff Churchill. While the Antelopes are not blessed with abundant height, their rebounding, however, should be adequate.

Although it appears that the Lopes may be stronger than last year's team it will be difficult to match their 20-9 record. The Lopes will be facing a schedule of outstanding opponents headed by the University of Arizona whom the Lopes will be playing for the first time ever. Other traditionally strong opponents will be Northern Arizona, U of San Diego, UC-Riverside, Biola, Cal-Baptist, and the always tough NAIA District 7 schools. The Lopes who have a tradition of their own to live up to, including four District Championships (1972-76) plus a National Championship in 1975, appear to have the stuff to contend with their schedule, however, and if Coach Lindsey can again find the right combination, Lope fans should be able to enjoy another winning season of basketball.




George Hall CENTER 6' 7" SENIOR

Nate Stokes CO-CAPTAIN FORWARD 6' 4" SENIOR

A former all-conference junior college player, Nate had an outstanding year with the Antelopes last season finishing as the team's second leading scorer and rebounder with 12.0 PPG and 7.0 RPG. Nate has worked hard in the off-season and appears to be ready for a great senior year. Probably the most talented player on the team, Nate can do a little bit of everything. An exciting player to watch, Nate is a prime candidate for all-American.



Ed Dawson GUARD 6' 0" SENIOR

Ed came to Grand Canyon last year from Mesa Community College where he was second team all-conference. After a fine start last year, Ed was crippled by a chronic ankle sprain and never fully recovered. This year Ed's ankles appear to be in good shape and if everything goes right Ed could be in for a fine year. An excellent playmaker and passer, Ed can also score with his deadly outside shot.




Chuck Moorer GUARD 5' 9" SENIOR


Richard Bacon GUARD 6' 0" JUNIOR


Hank Herrington FORWARD 6' 5" JUNIOR


Abidemi Lawal FORWARD 6' 3" JUNIOR


James Pappas GUARD 5' 10" JUNIOR


Willie Polk FORWARD 6' 5" JUNIOR


Jeff Churchill CENTER 6' 6" SOPHOMORE


Bill Price FORWARD 6' 6" SOPHOMORE
