



DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPS

Dr. Bill Estes ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATOR



Dr. Bill Estes is the new Athletic Administrator and Assistant to the President at Grand Canyon College. Among the Athletic Administrator's work is the area of long range planning and development of the Athletic program.

Dr. Estes, a native of Denton, Texas, came to Grand Canyon from Belmont College in Nashville, Tennessee where he was an Assistant Professor of Psycology and the Assistant Baseball Coach.

Dr. Estes received his BS and MS Degrees from North Texas State University in Denton, Texas and his Doctor of Education from George Peabody College in Nashville,

GRAND CANYON COLLEGE ANTELOPES

Coach Lindsey's teams have been characterized by solid team defense and a well-drilled offense. The Lopes, in recent years, have been among the nation's top defensive teams. Their consistently tough schedule has contributed to frequent high national rankings by Associated Press and U.P.I. and the Lopes have also been featured in Sports Illustrated, Sporting News, and other national publications on numerous occasions.

Coach is a native Arizonan, born in Glendale, Arizona, and is an alumnus of Grand Canyon's class of '62. During this time "Big Ben", a sharpshooting forward, broke five school scoring records, three of which still stand. His most points in one season, 510, and most points per game, 23.2, were broken in 1966-67 by Wayne Bateman. His most points in a single game, 44, most points in a three year career, 1235, and most field goals in one game, 18, still remain on the books.

Since receiving a bachelors degree at Grand Canyon, Coach has earned a masters degree plus doing additional work at Arizona State University.

Coach's wife, Jerri, is also an alumnus of Grand Canyon and a school teacher. She specializes in Learning Disabilities and has earned a masters degree from ASU. They have two sons, Yancy and Randall and a daughter, Mandy.



Dr. Dave Brazell ATHLETIC DIRECTOR


Coach Dave Brazell is in his 28th season at Grand Canyon College. A native of Arkansas, Coach is a graduate of the University of Central Arkansas and the University of Arkansas. His doctoral work was completed at Arizona State University.

For 14 years Dr. Brazell coached the basketball team in addition to his job of Athletic Director and Baseball Coach. During this time, the Antelopes won 151 games while losing 134, including a 20-0 season in 1958-59.

Last year's baseball team again excelled against some of the toughest teams in the country. This next season promises to be another exciting one with the locals playing close to a 60 game schedule with about 50 of these on the home diamond.

Dr. Brazell is active in numerous professional organizations. He is past Chairman for the Men's Athletic Division of the Southwest District of the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, and Recreation. He is presently Chairman of the NAIA Baseball Rules Committee and Secretary of the NAIA Baseball Coaches Assoc. Along with these duties, Dr. Brazell serves on the Committee responsible for conducting the National Baseball Tournament.

Five years ago the Arizona Coaches Association dedicated the State High School All-Star game to Dr. Brazell. After that he traveled to St. Joe, Missouri, where he was inducted into the NAIA Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame. He has also been presented with a beautiful plaque from the American Association of College Baseball Coaches for twenty-five years of coaching.



J.C. Helton ASSISTANT COACH

Coach J.C. Helton is a former Antelope himself having played for the Canyon in 1965-68. Since that time Coach Helton has been teaching and coaching at Issac Junior High School in Phoenix, where he has built powerhouses in all sports. His basketball teams have won over eighty percent of there games including the State Junior High School Championship and numerous other tournaments.

Mr. Helton will be assisting Coach Lindsey on a part-time basis while continuing his duties at Issac Junior High. He formerly helped in 1968-69 when he led the Lope freshman team to a 14-4 record.

His wife Elaine is employed by Westcor Inc. They have a daughter Sabrina and a son John.

Seasons Outlook

The old cliche, "So what do you do for an encore?", is never more applicable than after you win the NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP! The Antelopes for the second time in their history will be facing this ominous task. Last year's Antelope basketball team surprised everybody and walked away with a 30-3 record and their second NAIA NATIONAL BASKFTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP. The Lopes were also champs in 1975. For this year's team to do the same would be a feat far beyond the imagination of most mathematicians and oddsmakers. And yet, this is exactly what the 78-79 Antelope basketball team will be attempting to do.

Gone from last year's team are the two big inside
guns of George Hall and Nate Stokes. It will be difficult
to replace these two top scorers and rebounders, however,
junior college transfers Gerard Ross 6'9", Hap Smith 6'5",
and Charlie Farrell 6'3" appear to have the talent to take
up the slack. They will be helped by inside returnees of
6'6" Jeff Churchill, 6'9" Ray Jackson, 6'5" Hank Perrington,
and 6'6" returning starter Bill Price. 6'6" forward
Matt Barney, who becomes eligible second semester, should
also help. This year's team strength should lie in the
backcourt, however, as the Lopes return their two starting
guards in 6'6" Willie Polk and 6'4" Ray Arvizu. Arvizu
was the Lope's third leading scorer last year with 13.0 PPG
and Polk scorched the nets in Kansas City for 15.0 PPG in
five games and was runner-up for MVP honors. Also returning in the backcourt will be Rich Bacon and Jim Pappas,
two outstanding seniors who played important roles in last
year's campaign.






ward Jeff Churchill, and additional help from new recruits will again make the Lopes a national contender.



GUARD 6'4" SENIOR



GUARD 6'4" JUNIOR



GUARD 6'0" SENIOR



JUNIOR



GUARD 6'1" FRESHMAN



GUARD 6'2" JUNIOR



FORWARD 6'3" JUNIOR



FORWARD 6'5" SENIOR



CENTER 6'9" SOPHOMORE



Guard 5'10" SENIOR



GUARD 6'6" SENIOR



FORWARD 6'6" JUNIOR



CENTER 6'9" JUNIOR


