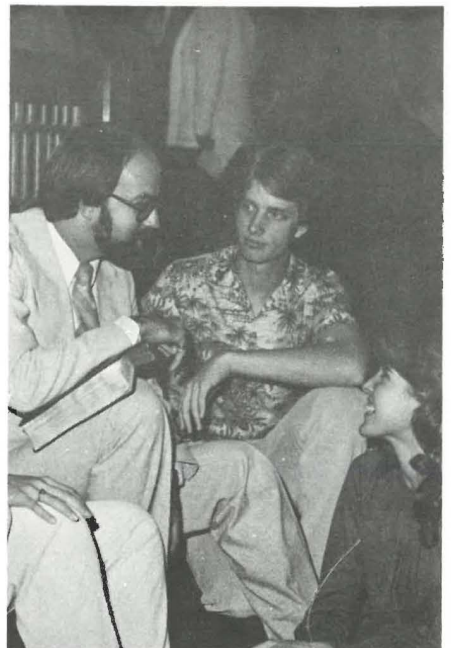
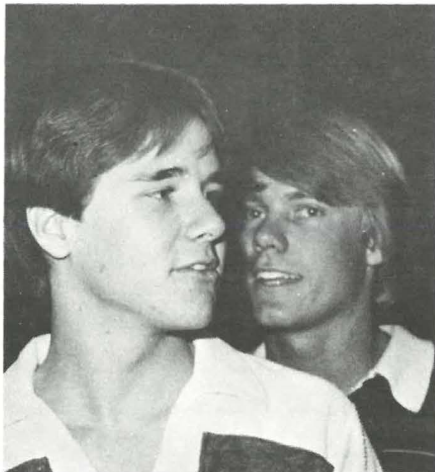
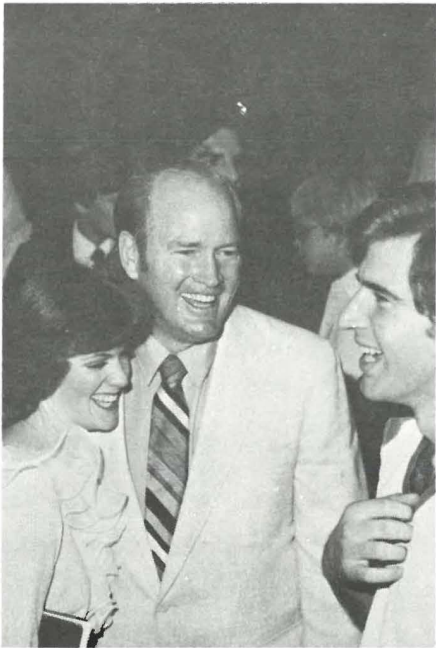

THE GRAND CANYON CLASSIC: CAN THE 'LOPES WIN THE 12TH EDITION?

Can the defending tournament champions come out on top again in what proves to be one of the Grand Canyon Classic's most nationally varied two nights, as Canyon hosts three powerhouses; Point Loma (Ca.)'s Crusaders, Oklahoma Baptist's Bison, and the Cardinals of William Jewell (Mo.).

Since its inception in 1970 under the direction of Ben Lindsey, the Classic annually fields one of the finest college-level tournaments in the country.. This year's version is no exception, as weach of the four teams finished strong in 1980-81, and each is a perennial contender for its respective district championship.

Canyon again kept the championship plaque in 1980, defeating California-State-Stanislaus 71-59 for the title after holding off Fresno Pacific 67-56 in the opening round. The victories extended Canyon's domination of the Classic. The 'Lopes are 20-2 in tournament play over the years, losing only to arch-rival California Baptist in the championship game in 1972 and to NCAA II power Augustana in 1978, again in the championship round.

Look for anything to happen during this tournament. The lowest scoring game was a Canyon victory (48-45) over Fort Lewis in 1971. On the other end of the spectrum, 196 points were scored in 1978 when Fort Hays State (Ks.)defeated Westminster (Utah) by 12, 104-92. The biggest margin of victory occurred in 1974, when Missouri-Kansas City defeated Northwest Missouri State by 41 points, 102-61.

The 12 edition of the Grand Canyon Classic should be exciting and entertaining. We hope that you enjoy the four games over these two nights. We think that you'll see some of the finest collegiate basketball anywhere!

NIGHT BASEBALL COMES TO BRAZELL FIELD!

In times past, Canyon baseball could be compared to Chicago Cubs baseball in at least one respect: neither club played at a park that had lighting. After December, the 'Lopes will no longer share that problem with the big leaguers from the Windy City. Thanks to the fund raising efforts of a group of Antelope Foundation members and the Antelope Foundation itself, over \$120,000 has been raised for the purpose of installing lighting. The main thrust consisted of the sale of 8 x 16' sign spaces along the outfield fence of Brazell Field. Some 22 signs were sold for 5-year periods at the rate of \$1,000 per year, and an additional pledge of \$10,000 from Arthur Stegall and Sons Ranches helped sweeten the pot. The Antelope Foundation furnished the costs of the signs for the refurbished fence. In addition, Phoenix Coca-Cola Company pledged \$1,800 a year for a 7-year period toward the construction of a permanent structure to house concessions, press box, and restroom facilities.

The college employed Musco Sportlighting of Muscatine, Iowa on October 21 to install a 115-fixture lighting system on Brazell Field in time for the 1982 baseball season. Scheduled installation date is requirements for color television broadcasting and offer essentially the same levels of lighting as the fields at ASU and UofA.

The new lighting is already paying off, as Gil Stafford announced among his 46 home game schedule such apponents as rival ASU and Arizona, Northern Colorado, Wichita State, New Mexico State and the University of Southern California. At least 11 games will be televised over American Superchannel.

This young veteran brings you all the action and, as he did last year, makes you feel that you're a part of that fast break or making the tag at the plate. His smooth, informative style will keep you abreast of the goings-on in 'Lopes country all year long. His extensive baseball and basketball background as athlete and commentator are a pleasure to absorb. Tune in to KWAO 10 minutes ahead of game time and catch the continuing saga of Keith and the 'Lopes.

Student and faculty interest was great in the program's first year, and the Valley high schools and jucos sat up and took notice! With Coach already hard on the recruiting trail, look for the Lady 'Lopes to make a strong run at the District 7 crown in '82.

—Lopes to Receive TV Coverage in '81-82.

The "new kid on the block" in the world of sports media coverage during the 1980's is cable television. With the relaxation in FCC regulations during the last 5 years, cable television networks have sprung up virtually everywhere. This variation of the television medium is already revolutionizing sports programming across the U.S. ESPN Atlanta Superchannel, USA network, and other vehicles already exist for national cable coverage that is almost entirely sports-oriented. Professional sports are either organizing cable hook-ups for themselves or actually starting their own cable stations for the purpose of covering themselves. The potential for exposure exposure and revenue is being discussed by college athletic department administrators across the nation and is filtering down to the junior college and high school ranks as well.

It is in light of this broadcasting phenomenon that Phoenix's American Superchannel affiliate is creating the Arizona Sports Programming Network (ASPN). Under the leadership of sports director and longtime Valley broadcasting figure George Allen, ASPN has purchased rights to broadcast certain selected games of the Phoenix Suns, Phoenix Inferno, ASU Sun Devils, and now the 'Lopes of Grand Canyon College.

The comprehensive sports package for the 'Lopes includes 4 basketball and 13 baseball games as well as the possibility of post-season coverage in these sports and the finals of the District 7 tennis tournament, held this year in Phoenix. The televised regular season basketball games are listed below:

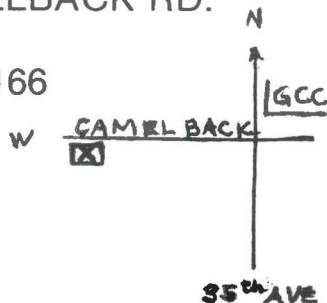

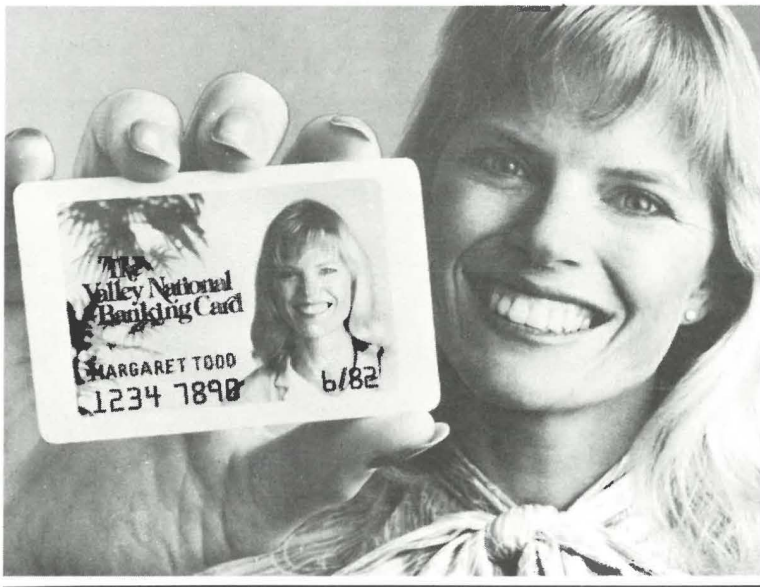

The first edition of Coach Bev Spitler's Lady 'Lopes performed creditably in a 1981 season highlighted by victories over NAIA District 7 Rival Eastern New Mexico and two heartbreaking 5-set losses to perennial district champ Southern Utah State. Taking a team whose aggregate collegiate experience consisted of just 5 years' spread among 13 players, Spitler moved quickly to establish a solid program that will begin to make its presence felt among the nation's leaders within the next two years. Only one starter, senior captain Debbie Crouse, and one reserve, Mardy Gokie, have completed their college careers. 5 starters will return in fall of '82; '81 frosh Lisa Cooney, Kim Estes, and Doreena Matlock, '81 sophomore Carol Rieger and junior Faye Tigges. Student and faculty interest was great in the program's first year, and the Valley high schools and jucos sat up and took notice. With Coach already hard on the recruiting trail, look for the Lady 'Lopes to make a strong stand at the District 7 crown in '82.

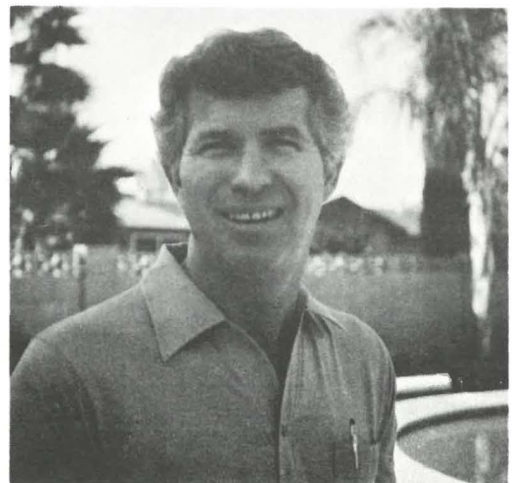

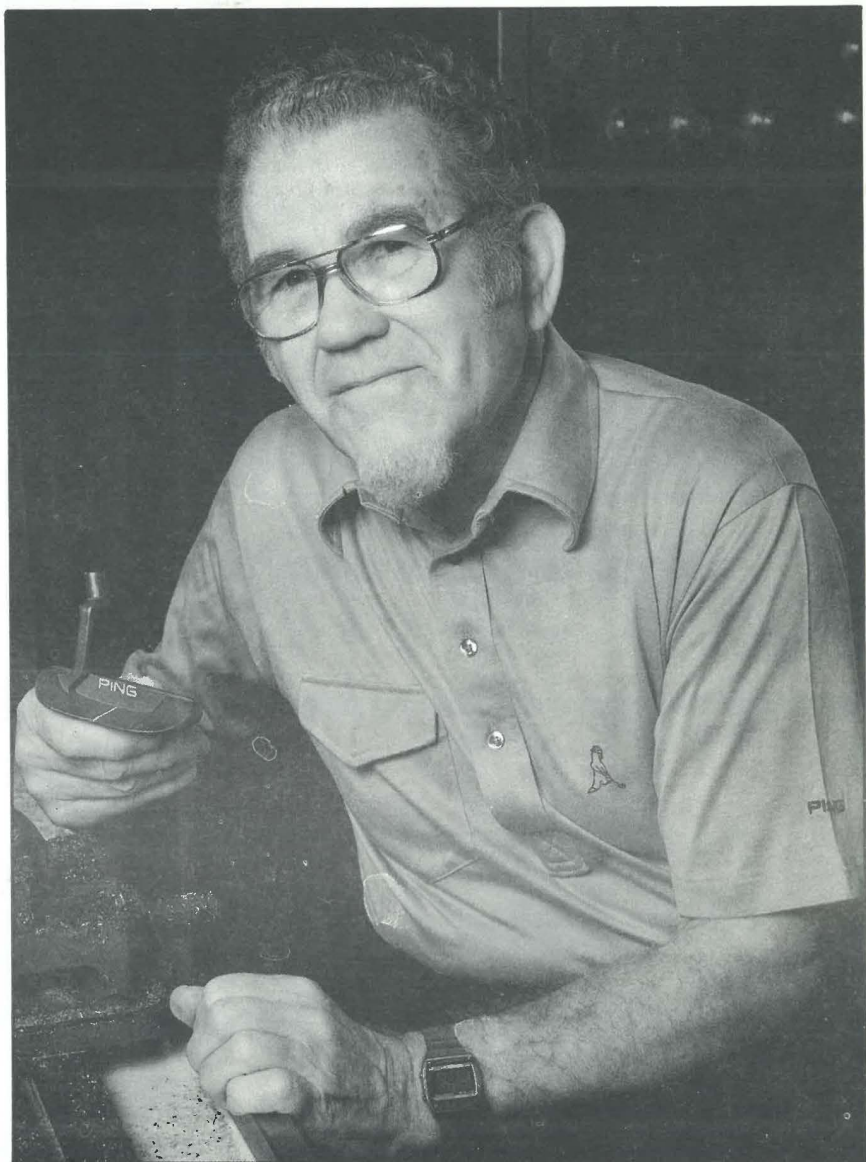
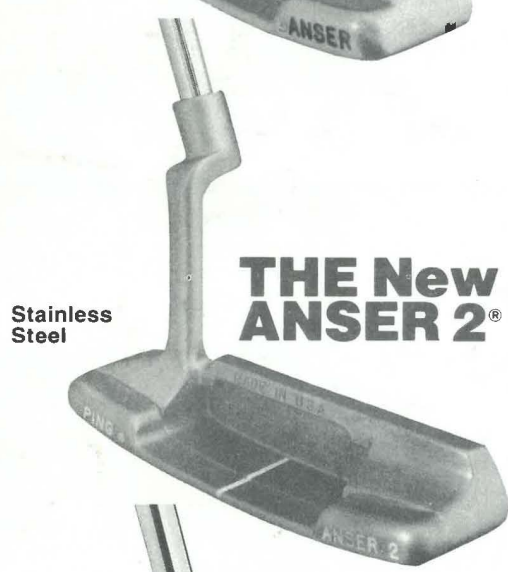
