NOTE TO MEDIA AND FANS

The Grand Canyon College Basketball Magazine was specifically designed to aid the media and fans in becoming better acquainted with the 1983-84 Grand Canyon Antelopes basketball team. Any comments or questions regarding any material in this magazine should be directed to the Sports Information staff at Grand Canyon College.

Members of the media who wish to cover Grand Canyon College or their opponents are welcome. Due to lack of space, however, seating for media is extremely limited. If you need to request working credentials, please contact Athletic Media Director, Keith Baker. All requests for credentials will be handled through the athletic office. Every attempt will be made to provide working space.

Press passes will not be mailed to out of town media personnel. Passes must be arranged for in advance and picked up at either the Athletic Office or at the door prior to the game. All members of the media will enter through the main entrance on the south side of the gymnasium.

Table space at courtside will be reserved for members of the broadcast media. Television crews are assigned to the north end of the table, while radio crews will be assigned to the south end. Visiting radio crews will be limited to two seats at the table. If space is not used by members of the broadcast media, then members of the print media may feel free to use table space courtside.

A telephone will be available immediately following each game and a telecopier is also available in the athletic office in the gymnasium. Statistics will be provided to the media at half-time and immediately following each game.

For visiting radio stations, a courtesy line is available for broadcasts back to your home city, arrangements are handled on a first come, first served basis. Contact Keith Baker in the Athletic Office for use of this line.



Tommy is a graduate of Grand Canyon College, class of '83, with a bachelor of science in Business Administration. Tommy is doing additional work at Arizona State University while coaching at Canyon to attain his teacher certification for Arizona.

Tommy is also the son of NBA referee Tommy Nunez, Sr.









JIM PYERS



There is a lot of newness surrounding the Grand Canyon College Basketball team as they enter the 1983-84 campaign. John Shumate begins his first season as Head Coach, Tommy Nunez is in his first year as the top assistant, and a host of new players fill out the roster.

Shumate takes over for Jav Arnote who led the 'Lopes to a 40-19 record in his two seasons at the helm. Arnote led Canyon to playoff appearances in both of his seasons as Head Coach. before accepting the head coaching job at Northern Arizona University this past summer. Shumate is beginning his career as a coach at a rather high level. After a seven year NBA career, he'll try to keep tradition going for the 'Lopes as Canyon basketball teams have not missed qualifying for the district playoffs since the 1970-71 season when they finished 10-17 under Ben Lindsey. Canyon has great tradition in their basketball.

Shumate faces a major rebuilding task in his first year, having only three returning lettermen to build around. Eight lettermen are gone alone with

four starters from last year's team which finished 23-8 and ranked #1 in the District 7 at the end of the regular season. Gone from the backcourt is the high powered scoring of Jim Pyers and Elliott "Dinky" Jones. The two accounted for 40% of the 'Lopes offensive output last season. Also gone are starters Bob Kulovitz and Bryan Gillis. Gillis led the club in rebounding in his senior year. Two excellent reserves, Carl Powell and Anthony McKinney, are also gone. With two others out because of academic problems, the Canyon Coaching staff finds only three left from last year's squad.

Leading the group of returnees are inside men Mike Boatright and Cornell Staples. Boatright (6'8", 210) finds himself playing a role of the leader for the team while Staples (6'5", 210) also can carry some of that load. Boatright finished the season last year as the second leading rebounder.

Billy Carter is the other returning 'Lope. "B.C." served primarily in a reserve role in his first year at Canyon but having shown some flashes of being an excellent off-guard in early pre-season drills, Billy should play a big role

It is plain to see that Canyon will have to rely upon newcomers to shoulder much of the load this season. With most of last year's scoring gone, Canyon needed to import some talented players who could put the ball in the basket. They were able to corral several players who have the ability to do just that.

Leading the list of newcomers has to be Junior guard, Bryan Williams. Bryan is a local high school product who left Phoenix to play at Fresno State his freshman year. An injury to his knee slowed his progress and after a brief stay at the University of Tulsa, Bryan came to GCC last spring. Williams truly does have major college ability if he is able to stay healthy.

Another top transfer is John Graves, a 6'10" senior who comes to GCC from Baylor University. John has also spent time at Glendale Community College where he was an explosive scorer. An excellent shooter for a big man, Graves will be




relied on to provide much needed offensive punch.

Canyon might be able to consider this season one of it's best recruiting years in recent history. The 'Lopes have a host of freshmen who should see playing time in their first seasons. Dormin Jones and Michael Walto head the list of incoming frosh, both of them coming from John F. Kennedy high school in Granada Hills, California. Other freshman showing early ability to play on the collegiate level are Scott Wells (6'2", G), Jean-Marc Grindatto (6'6", F) and Kevin Tucker (6', G).

Rounding out the list of newcomers is Junior College transfer Brad Parrish, who should ad a good deal of strength inside, and four year school transfer Ricky Davis (Oklahoma Baptist)

Many factors can make or break a season. What it really boils down to is how well the 'Lopes can come together and compete over the 29 game season. As for now, only time will tell how the 'Lopes fair in 1983-84.





A Biology major. Parents are Raymonde and Jo Grindatto. Full name is Jean-Marc Grindatto. Also plays tennis, soccer and skis.







Cornell Staples Guard-Forward Senior 6-5, 205 Phoenix, Arizona **Cornell Staples** #25






John Graves Forward-Center Senior 6-10, 205 Phoenix, Arizona # 35


Bryan is a Business Administration major and the son of Ruby Williams. Full name is Bryan Keith Williams.
