

The Stations:

Channel 39

Channel 39 and Grand Canyon College basketball hook up for the first time ever in 1987-88. A growing station in the valley, Channel 39 is a non profit station operating out of North Phoenix Baptist Church. With a broadcast range covering Phoenix, Channel 39 has the capability to reach approximately 180,000 homes in the Valley. With their motto, "The Channel Arizona Families Can Trust," Channel 39 does not solicit funds in order to raise money for the network. With a transmitter relocation expected in the near future, Channel 39 will soon be more powerful than ever in the metro-Phoenix area.

ASPN

The Arizona Sports Programming Network reunites with Grand Canyon for this season. ASPN is no stranger to Canyon fans, having aired games for several years. Sports Director George Allen has slated four live telecasts for this season.

ASPN is a sports oriented station on the Dimension Cable system. With a loyal sports audience already developed, ASPN provides excellent exposure for 'Lopes basketball this season.

GSN

The Glendale Sports Network, like Channel 39, begins its first year of association with Grand Canyon. GSN is operated by the City of Glendale Cable Communications Office and airs on Glendale's Republic Cable System on Channel 104. GSN will air all 16 home games on a one day tape delay basis and also be in charge of production of all of the live telecasts for

Channel 39 with the exception of the four games produced by ASPN.

ACTS Satellite Network

The American Christian Television System is a network owned by the Southern Baptist Convention. ACTS offers a uniqueness to Christian oriented television in that they do not solicit funds on the air. ACTS will carry five Saturday night games LIVE on national television. ACTS is also new to sports related telecasts, just starting this fall with NAIA level football.

KXEG (1010 AM)

KXEG and Grand Canyon College basketball hook up for their third consecutive year. A growing radio influence in the valley, KXEG is owned by the Mid America Gospel Radio Network. KXEG operates on a News/Talk format with a Christian emphasis and has carried Los Angeles Dodgers Major League Baseball, Phoenix Pride professional soccer, and University of Arizona athletic events in addition to Grand Canyon College basketball and baseball.

KXEG's format lends itself well to sports playby-play broadcasts. In addition, KXEG's greatest listener appeal falls into the 25-49 age bracket. Studies have shown this group to be more interested in basketball than any other sport.

KXEG's 1010 signal can be heard throughout the valley and Maricopa county. Their signal is 1,000 watts daytime and 250 watts night. The non-directional signal adds to the advantage of advertising on Grand Canyon Basketball Broadcasts on KXEG.

The Announcers:

Keith Baker, Channel 39, GSN, and KXEG

Keith will begin his seventh season "behind the mike" for the 'Lopes radio broadcasts, and his first season in television in 1987-88. Starting on the broadcast team for Canyon while still a sophomore in college, Keith has handled play by play for 'Lopes basketball and also three NAIA College Baseball World Series Tournaments. His enthusiastic professional style will keep you up on all of the action this

George Allen, ASPN

George Allen and ASPN return to Canyon for the 1987-88 season. Allen is the former host of KTAR radio's "Sports Talk" show now run by Greg Schulte and Tim Roye. A true veteran of the broadcast business, Allen has logged such credits as Phoenix Suns Basketball, Arizona State football, basketball and baseball as well as a few World Title Boxing events.

Age: 36


Year at Canyon: 2nd

Garrick Barr begins his second season at Grand Canyon College, coming with Paul Westphal from Southwestern College last year. Garrick's association with Westphal goes much further than that however. Like Canyon's other two coaches, Scott Mossman begins his second season at Grand Canyon College. As he did last year, Scott will serve the 'Lopes on a part-time basis this season.

Much of Scott's work comes in behind-the-scenes groundwork with recruits and planning practice sessions. His efforts enabled the 'Lopes to land several of their top recruits last spring.

Mossman graduated from Phoenix's Sunnyslope High School in 1976 where he played varsity basketball. After two seasons at Scottsdale Community College, he moved on to Mid-America Nazarene College in Olathe, Kansas where he graduated with a bachelor of science degree in physical education in 1982.

Debbie Anderson Student Trainer

Debbie begins her first season at Grand Canyon College as student trainer under the direction of Rudy Sanchez. Debbie has spent the past three years working at Glendale Community College as a student assistant trainer.

Debbie is a graduate of Deer Valley High School in Phoenix where she played basketball for four years, serving as a team captain for one season.

A graduate of Grand Canyon, class of 1982, Keith was a member of the 'Lopes first three NAIA National Championship baseball teams as a pitcher. He remains in the Canyon record book as the last Antelope to throw a no-hitter.

Ron Singleton, 1987 Honorable Mention All American and seventh round draft selection of the NBA's Phoenix Suns

Grand Canyon College's second year Head Coach Paul Westphal seems to be having problems these days. The toughest problem for the upcoming 1987-88 basketball season may be deciding which of his recruits will see playing time. Well it may not be that easy, but with the talent that Westphal has lined up, the 'Lopes will be gunning once again for the NAIA District Championship.

Actually, Westphal didn't seem to have many problems at all adjusting to coaching at the NAIA level a year ago when he took over for former Phoenix Suns teammate John Shumate. The 'Lopes rebounded from a down year in 1986-87 when they finished 18-9 and failed to qualify for the playoffs for the first time in 13 years. Last year's team finished 26-12 and lost on the road in the finals of the NAIA District VII Tournament to Western State College of Colorado. The 'Lopes started the playoffs with a stunning 94-87 win at Fort Lewis College in the first round. The loss in the district finals left Canyon one game away from the NAIA National Tournament at Kemper Arena in Kansas City, Missouri, so it is no wonder that the 'Lopes have one thing on their minds this season.

"Our success this year will largely depend on how dedicated we are," said Westphal of this year's team. "We have the potential to be strong inside, strong outside and can pass the ball. Our personnel gives

us a great chance to go to Kansas City.'

That personnel will have to pick up the slack left with the departure of All District VII and Honorable Mention NAIA All American guard Ron Singleton. Singleton, who was selected in the seventh round of the NBA draft in June, led the team last year in scoring with a 19.1 points per game average. Also gone are All District center Cecil Scroggins and starter Mike Greene.

Canyon returns four lettermen from last year's team, all of whom started at one time or another during the season. Leading the group of returning players is point guard Rodney Johns. Johns averaged 11.2 points and 3.6 assists per game last year. The other three returning players are all inside players. Ron Akre, who led the team in 3-point FG percentages last year, returns as does Bob Gallagher and Bob Henige. All four will be pressed hard for playing time as the list of redshirts and newcomers brings some impressive players.

Eleven players (five new recruits, five red-shirts and a walk-on) could provide the bulk of the potential for Canyon in 1987-88. Post men Robert Enge (6-9, 220, center) and Blair Oliphant (6-8, 215, centerforward) are top prospects inside. Both are JUCO transfers who were selected All Conference in their respective areas. Westphal says Enge is 'a better inside player than anyone we had last year," and that Oliphant will battle with returning forward Bob Gallagher. Red-shirt Gary Ware could be the team's smartest, most versatile and most

talented player. At 6-6, Ware can go inside as well as shoot the 3pointer. He displayed these attributes in the Purple/White game last year, scoring 40 points and grabbing nine rebounds. Freshman forward Emilio Kovacic rounds out the inside players. A late addition to the team, he shows much promise of being a dominant NAIA player.

Seven guards round out the list of newcomers, four of which were red-shirted last year. Danl Williams could be the most talented of the bunch. Called a "phenomenal shooter," by Westphal, he transfers from Pan American University. Mike Ledbetter has been in the program for a full year, transfers from St. Edward's University in Texas and has a fine shooting touch with aggressiveness and jumping ability that makes him play much bigger than his 6-2 frame. Darren Dunlap is a 6-2 transfer from the University of Colorado where he played for two years and Ron DaLessio will still be a freshman after sitting out last year. The young newcomer among the guards is Spokane, Washington's 1986-87 High School Player of the Year, Mark Wheeler. An exciting athlete, Wheeler was the League MVP while averaging only nine points per game. He also averaged over eight assists and six rebounds per game. Also looking for playing time at the guard spot will be Craig Johnson. Even though only 5-9, he could be the most exciting player on the team with his exceptional jumping ability. The younger brother of the Boston Celtics' Dennis Johnson, he looks to be a real crowd pleaser. Mark Dyer rounds out the list of newcomers. A transfer from lowa, he has his work cut out for him with so many talented players. But Dyer is a fighter, always hustling, so don't count him out.

For Westphal, who was encouraged by the team's 26-12 record of a year ago, this year's team offers more depth and speed than last year, a combination that encourages Westphal to full court press more next season. And Westphal seems to be an avid believer in the collegiate three-pointer as the 'Lopes put up 551 bombs last year, and could go beyond that in the coming season.

As for the 38 game schedule ahead of the 'Lopes this year, Westphal calls it "twice as tough, but I like it a lot better." Schedule highlights include trips to Oklahoma and Washington to play some of the finest NAIA teams in the country as well as perennial powerhouse Westmont College CA and District VII rising power Fort Lewis College. Returning to the schedule will be an old foe, Northern Arizona University and an exhibition vs. Athletes in Action.

The 'Lopes have also already set the table for two years to come with some player personnel that will redshirt this season. Chad Olson (6-10, Jr., C), Mario Lopez (6-7, Sr., F) and Mike Hoyle (6-2, Jr., G) will get used to basketball the Westphal way this season and be ready to go in 1988-
