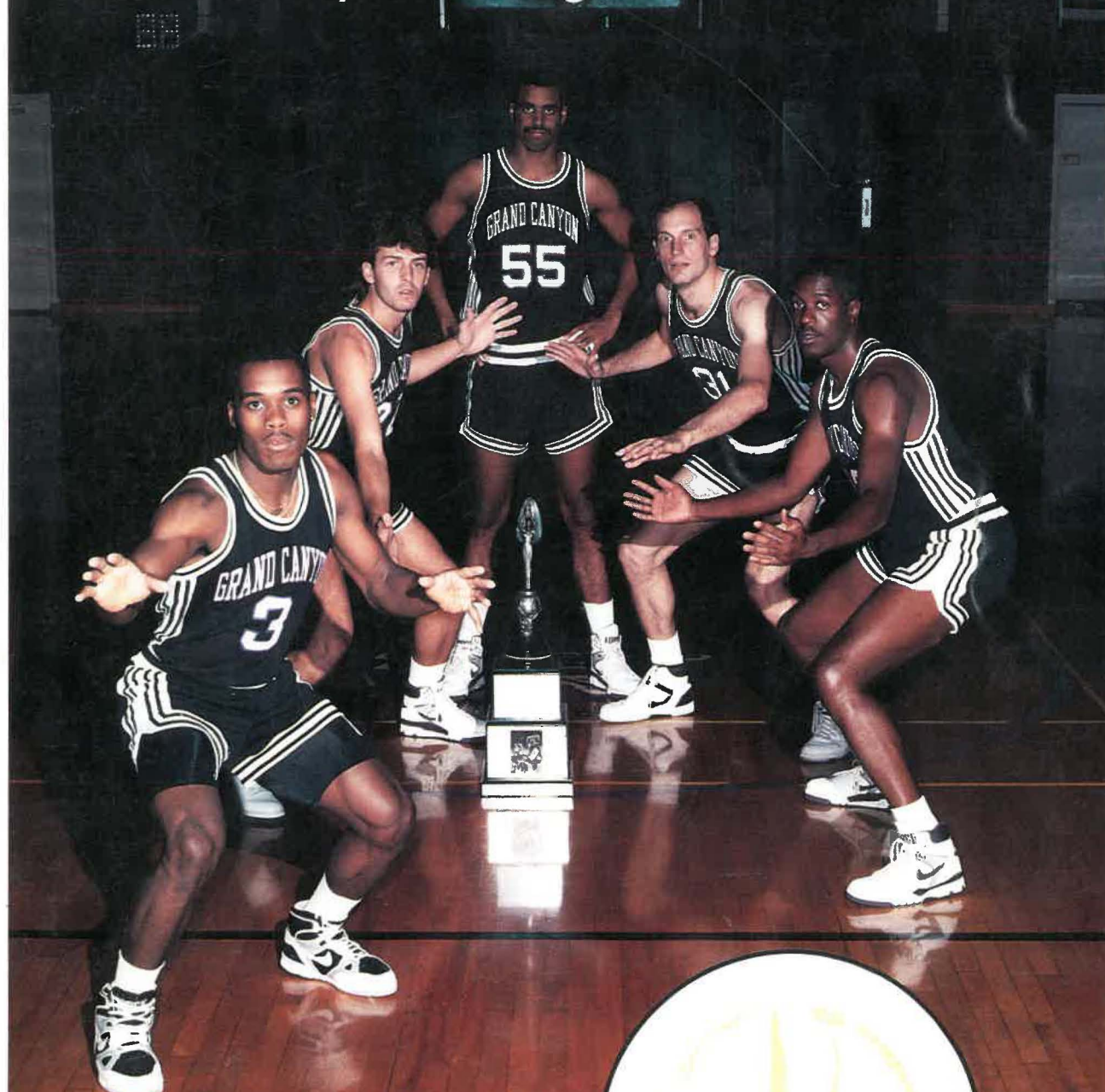

This publication featuring the 1988-89 Grand Canyon College men's basketball team has been prepared to aid you in covering the Antelopes this season. Additional information is available by contacting the Canyon Office of Sports Information.

Media Information -- To obtain credentials for a Grand Canyon home contest, contact the Antelope Sports Information Office at least two days in advance of the game. Passes and seating at courtside press row are limited to WORKING MEDIA ONLY. If media credential can not be picked up in advance, they will be left at the Press-Will Call entrance at the main entrance to Antelope Gym. Credentials will not be mailed.

Radio -- Permission to broadcast a Grand Canyon game from Antelope Gym should be requested through the Sports Information Director. Stations may use a courtesy line available at courtside. Space will be provided for a broadcast crew of two.

Services -- The Grand Canyon Sports Information Staff will provide game programs, notes, and cumulative statistics prior to tip-off. Statistical summaries will be provided at halftime and a full boxscore will be provided post-game. A limited number of telephones are available for post-game media use in the Sports Information Office on a first-come, first-served basis. Media desiring press table phone service should contact the Sports Information Director.

Interview Policy -- For players, contact the Sports Information Office at least one day in advance of the requested interview and we will have the player return the call. Player interviews will not be granted during practice or the day of a game. To speak with Coach Westphal, call the basketball office directly (602/589-2818). The best time to reach Coach Westphal is Noon-2:30 pm weekdays. Home phone numbers will not be given out.

Postgame -- Coach Westphal and at least one member of the Antelope team will meet with the media following the game immediately outside the 'Lopes dressing area. Following a brief "cooling off" period, the 'Lopes dressing area will be opened to the media for access to other squad members. If agreed to by visiting coach, we will have that coach and a player available following the game. A press pass is required for entrance to the dressing areas.

ON THE AIR WITH THE 'LOPES:

Radio Station KXEG, 1010 AM

Grand Canyon College and Christian radio outlet KXEG combine efforts for the 1988-89 'Lopes basketball season as Canyon "Defends the Crown" as 1988's NAIA National Champions. This is the fourth season that Canyon basketball has been heard on KXEG. KXEG is owned by the Mid-America Gospel Radio Network and operates on a News/Talk format with a Christian emphasis. KXEG has carried a portion of the Los Angeles Dodgers games in the past as well as Univeristy of Arizona football and basketball. KXEG's 1010 signal can be heard throughout the valley and Maricopa County. Thier signal strength is 1,000 watts daytime and 250 watts night. KXEG will once again focus coverage on the 'Lopes when they are away from Antelope Gym, airing all road contests as well as all playoff appearances. See the schedule on page one for game times.

ACTS & TV Channel 39

The American Christian Television System and local affiliate, Channel 39, will again see a portion of the Grand Canyon College home schedule in 1988-89. The 'Lopes have five dates on tap for viewers not only in Phoenix, but around the nation as well. ACTS is a satellite network owned by the Southern Baptist Convention . Bill Westphal is in his first season at Grand Canyon succeeding his brother Paul, who moved on to become an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns and becomes the eighth head basketball coach in Canyon's history.

Grand Canyon was 37-6 under Paul Westphal in 1988 and won the school's third NAIA National Championship. Bill has tried to keep the family tradition going as he has guided the 'Lopes to the NAIA District 7 Championship with a 26-4 record and a berth in the NAIA National Tournament. The three titles ties Canyon with Kentucky State University, Hamline College(MN) and Tennessee A & I for the most national titles won by an NAIA school. Paul Westphal left Grand Canyon with a two year record of 63-18.

Bill Westphal, 44, spent the last two seasons at Occidental College in the Eagle Rock area of Los Angeles, where he had also coached for seven seasons earlier in his career. Bill earned the distinction of NAIA District 7 Coach of the Year for his efforts this season.

On the collegiate level, Westphal has coached for 13 seasons and has compiled a 195-153 (.560) record. He spent nine seasons at Occidental where he was 136-104 and won three Southern California Intercolligiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC) titles. Over the last two years Westphal's teams were 25-27.

Westphal coached for three seasons at Western Washington University in Bellingham where he posted a 33-45 career mark. He also served for two seasons as an NBA Assistant to Paul Silas with the San Diego Clippers (1980-82).

Westphal began his coaching career at Glendale High School in Glendale, Calif. His fourth and final season at the high school level propelled him to the head position at Occidental for the 1973-74 season. His last Glendale team was 24-3 and 5th ranked in the CIF 4-A Polls. At Glendale, Westphal was a two-time Foothill League Coach of the Year.

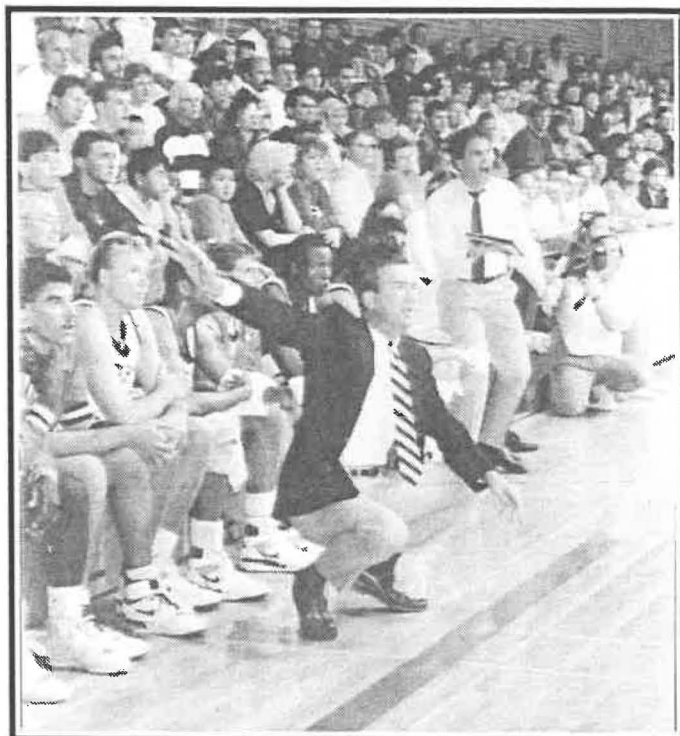
In his playing career, Bill preceded Paul at Manhattan Beach, California's Aviation High School and at the University of Southern California. At 6'7", Bill earned South Bay Player of the Year honors and was honored as a collegian at USC with the Most Improved Player Award (1965) and Most Inspirational Player Award (1966). Westphal also played for Athletes in Action for two years following his career at USC.

Bill earned his undergraduate degree in physical education at USC and completed his masters degree in education at Occidental.

Bill and his wife Lynne have three daughters; Kristie (20), Kelly (14) and Kendra (11).

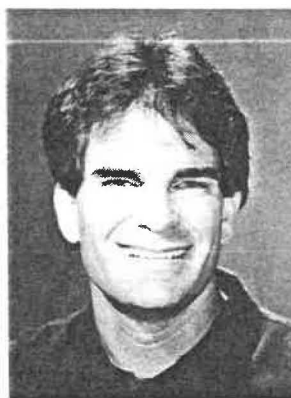

Garrick Barr begins his third season at Grand Canyon College, coming with Paul Westphal from Southwestern College prior to the 1986-87 season. Garrick was retained by Paul's brother Bill when the latter assumed the head coaching position from the former last summer. Barr and Paul Westphal were teammates in high school at Aviation High in Redondo Beach, California. Barr ranks second on Aviation High's Career Scoring list to, you guessed it, Paul Westphal.

Garrick is a graduate of the University of California, Irvine where he played varsity basketball for four seasons. He was a part-time starter in each of his last two seasons, and graduated in 1973 with a bachelor of arts degree in philosophy.

Garrick's coaching experience includes a year at Glendale Community College (1984-85) as an assistant and three years under Paul Westphal, one at Southwestern College (1985-86) and the last two at Grand Canyon. He has also worked with the popular Adams/Westphal Basketball Camps during the summer.

Garrick was married this past summer to the former Cherrie Lewellyn and enjoys photography. He has worked with the Grand Canyon Sports Information Office and took the pictures displayed in last year's guide including the celebrated cover shot. Once a professional free-lance photographer, Garrick has also worked in the commercial airline industry prior to his coaching background.

Scott Mossman begins his third season at Grand Canyon College. As he has done for the last two years, Scott will serve the 'Lopes on a part-time basis this season.

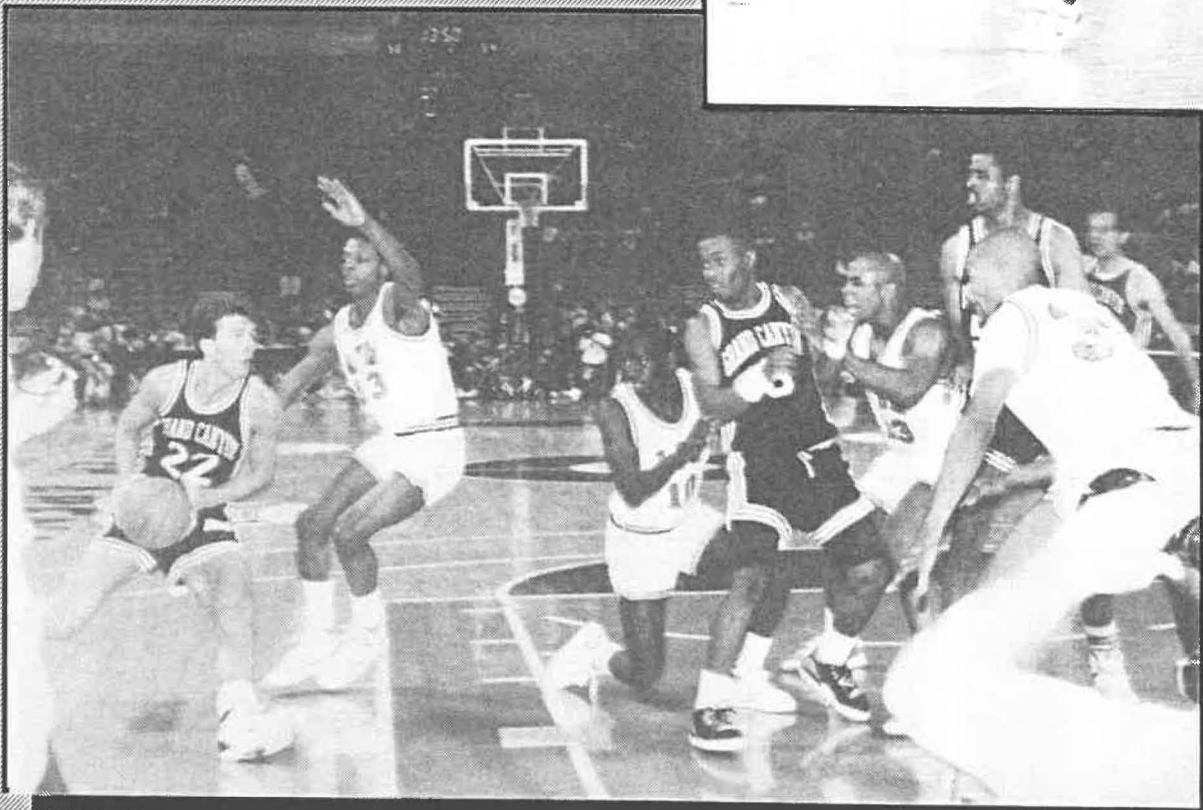
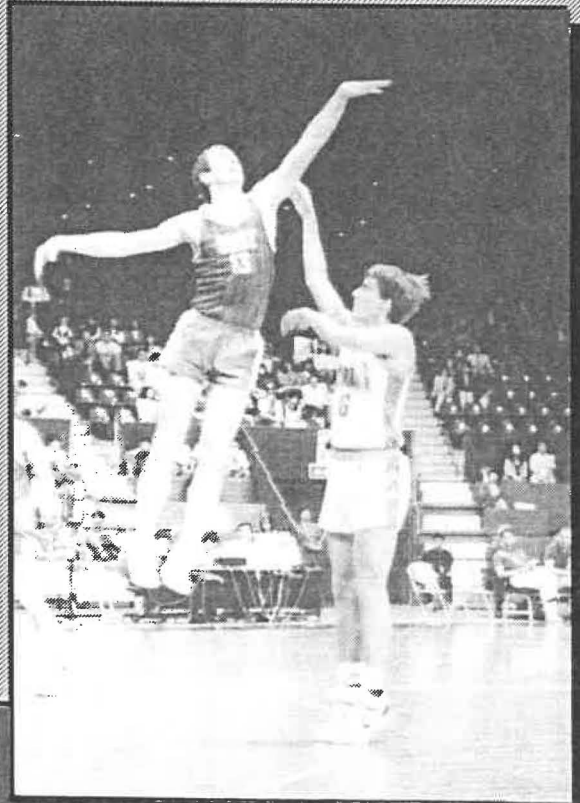
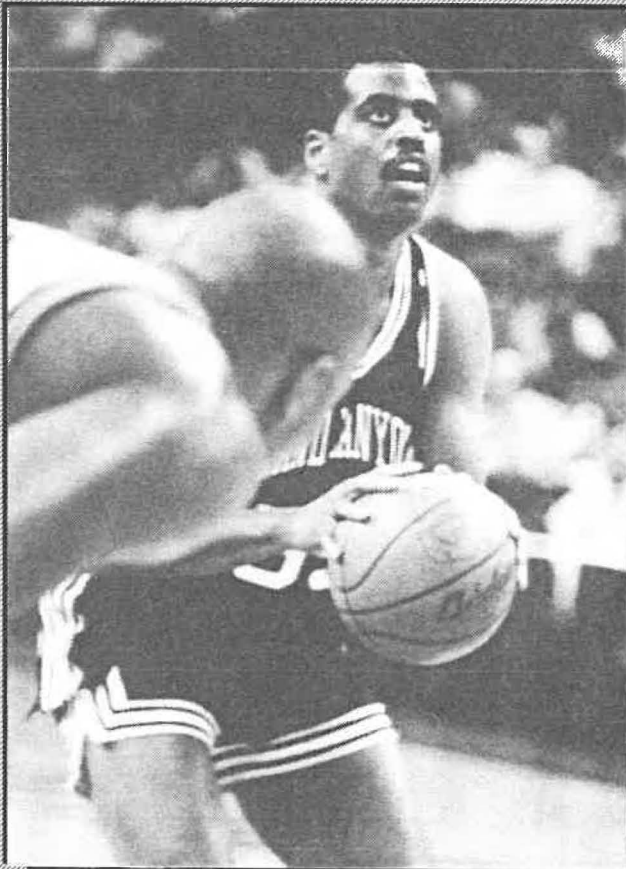

Mossman graduated from Phoenix's Sunnyslope High School in 1976 where he played varsity basketball. After two seasons at Scottsdale Community College, he moved on to Mid-America Nazarene College in Olathe, Kansas where he graduated with a bachelor of science degree in physical education in 1982.

Scott returned to the valley and was a volunteer assistant for Ralph Flores at Glendale Community College in 1984-85 (along with current Canyon assistant Garrick Barr). Scott also served as an assistant coach at Casa Grande High School during the 1985-86 season where he was teaching at that time. Scott now works in the Deer Valley School District as an instructor in the In-School -Suspension program.

Scott and his wife, Debbie, were married during the summer of 1987.

GRAND CANYON: 1988-89 -- Appeared in 14 games during the regular season for the 'Lopes ... scored a career high 16 points in a 141-57 rout at West Coast Christian College. 1987-88 -- Saw limited action for Canyon during the '88 Championship season ... officially played only 36 minutes during the season ... did see action at the NAIA National Tournament in opening round win vs. Hastings College (Nebraska) ... connected on his only 3-point attempt in that game ... career high of nine point came in a 121-79 win over Point Loma Nazarene CA in title game of 1987 Grand Canyon Classic Tournament. 1986-87 -- A transfer for the 'Lopes from the University of Iowa ... was a member of the Hawkeyes basketball team but did not see action in any games.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from Dubuque Hempstead High School in Dubuque, Iowa ... played basketball all four years in high school and earned team MVP honors as a senior ... was selected All City, All Conference and All State and was the conferences third leading scorer ... also participated in track and tennis.

1987-88, The Year in Review



LOPES WIN 1988 NAIA NATIONAL TITLE --

Grand Canyon College captured its record-tying third NAIA Basketball Championship with a stunning 88-86 overtime win over the University of Auburn-Montgomery on March 22, 1988 at Kemper Arena in Kansas City, Missouri. The 'Lopes captured previous titles in 1975 and in 1978.

JOHNS WINS NATIONAL TOURNAMENT MVP HONORS --

Grand Canyon's senior guard Rodney Johns led the 'Lopes throughout the tournament and was honored as the Tournament's Most Valuable Player. Johns scored a game high 41 points in the title game, including a 17 foot jumper from the top of the key with :02 remaining in overtime to break a 86-86 tie, giving Grand Canyon the win. Johns had also scored 39 points in a semi-final win over Waynesburg College of Pennsylvania on the previous night. In the five game tournament, Johns averaged 30.2 points per game.



LOPES SET NAIA TEAM SCORING MARK --

In route to their Championship, Grand Canyon set a new single season team scoring record with 4,093 points. Playing 43 games certainly helped, but the 'Lopes also had to stay alive long enough to play that many games. Canyon was given a run for the scoring record by David Lipscomb College of Tennessee. Lipscomb was eliminated however in the Quarterfinals by Auburn-Montgomery. The 'Lopes averaged a school record 95.2 points per game on the year.

THREE NATIONAL TITLES TIES RECORD --

With the 1988 Title in hand, Grand Canyon becomes only the fourth school in NAIA history to win three National Championships. Grand Canyon has won Titles in 1975, 1978 and 1988. Hamline College MN (1942, 1949 and 1951), Kentucky State (1970, 1971 and 1972) and Tennessee A & I (1957, 1958 and 1959) have also won three.

POST SEASON PLAY --

Grand Canyon has appeared in NAIA District or National Tournaments in 17 of the 20 seasons they have been eligible to compete for championships. This season marked the 16th time Canyon has been in post-season play in the last 17 seasons. They won their eighth NAIA District 7 Championship over-

all and their first since the 1979-80 season.

NATIONAL TOURNAMENT EXCELLENCE --

Canyon ranks seventh All-Time in NAIA National Tournament Winning Percentage. The 'Lopes streaked through with five straight wins in 1988 and improved their tournament record to 17-5 in eight Tournament appearances.

LOPES WIN DESPITE DEPLETED ROSTER --

Grand Canyon won the 1988 Title despite having its roster trimmed to only nine players for post-season play. In all, Canyon lost 55 player games due to injury or suspension throughout the course of the season. Three primary players were lost late in the season. Leading scorers Danl

Williams and Gary Ware were suspended just prior to post-season play for a team rules violation while freshman center Emilio Kovacic suffered a broken foot with five games remaining in the regular season.

TOURNAMENT TERRIFIC --

The 'Lopes were entered in six tournaments last year and won all six. Canyon claimed championships at the U.C. San Diego/La Jolla Tip-Off Tournament, their own Grand Canyon Classic, the Mesa Ski Country Classic, and the Western New Mexico Invitational in addition to winning two post-season tournaments, the District 7 and NAIA National tournaments.

OTHER NOTES FROM '87-'88

-- It was a record setting year for the 'Lopes. In all, Canyon set 12 single season records, most of them offensively oriented. The longest standing record to fall was the record for wins in a season. The 1975 and 1978 National Champions each recorded 30 wins while this year's team shattered that mark with 37 victories ... The 37 wins was also just two shy of the NAIA National record for single season victories ... Seven other individual single season or career records also fell

... Head Coach Paul Westphal used 13 different starting lineups on the season but settled on one lineup over the final nine games of the season when the 'Lopes played their best team basketball of the season ... Ten different players started at least four games during the season ... the 'Lopes finished the season by winning their last 12 games ... the 'Lopes have also won their last 21 straight at Antelope Gymnasium. The 'Lopes were 4-1 last year at NPBC.

NATIONAL CHAMPS VISIT THE ORIENT --

As winners of the 1988 NAIA National Title, Grand Canyon was invited to take part in the World Sports Fair, April 30-May 2 in Tokyo, Japan. Canyon was one of four teams competing in a round robin tournament. The 'Lopes won once and lost twice in taking third place. Canyon dropped their opening game to the eventual winner of the games, the Czechoslovakian College Select Team by a 76-72 margin. The 'Lopes then defeated the Japan College All Stars 97-79 before falling to the Japanese National Team 83-78. The 'Lopes were guests of the Japanese Amateur Basketball Association (JABBA) who sponsored and sanctioned the event. Fuji Film was also instrumental in hosting Grand Canyon as representatives of the NAIA and the United States. Team members, coaches and the rest of the traveling party were treated to a tour of the city of Tokyo which included the Imperial Palace grounds, the Asakusa Cannon Temple, Ueno Zoo and Park and the Tokyo Tower.

WESTPHAL MOVES ON --

After only two seasons with the Antelopes, Paul Westphal received an offer he couldn't refuse. After returning from Tokyo, Japan, Westphal was offered the #1 Assistant Coaching position with the NBA's Phoenix Suns. Westphal, who starred for the Suns during his own playing career, accepted the position and left Grand Canyon with a two year mark of 63-18 and a three year collegiate record of 83-27.

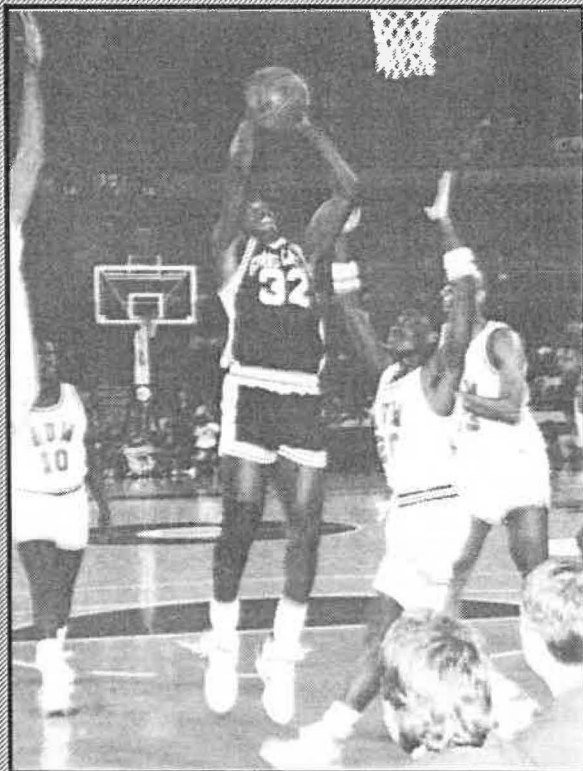

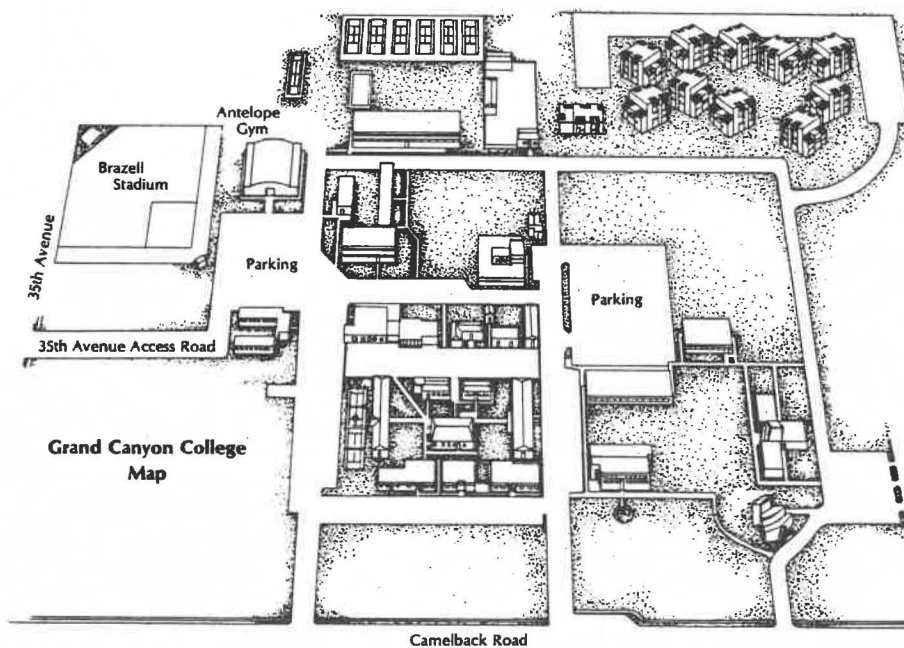
Academics and Faculty

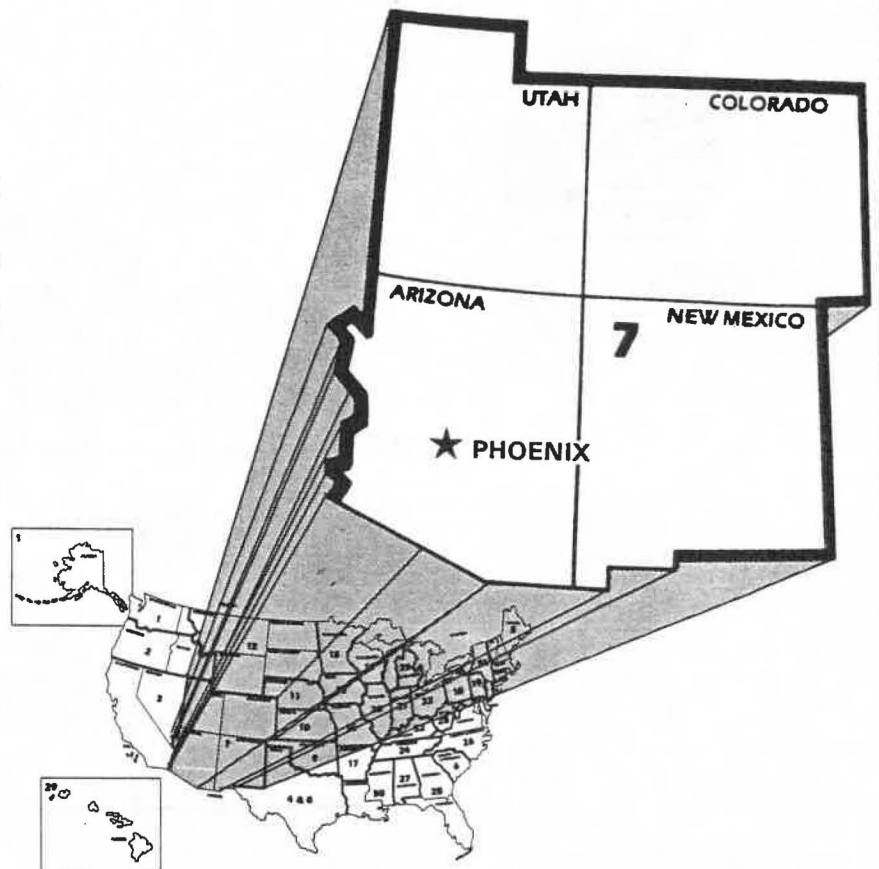
The NAIA's District 7

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association, currently administering programs of intercollegiate athletics to nearly 500 fully-accredited colleges and universities of moderate enrollment. The fundamental tenet of the NAIA is that intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the total educational program of the institution. This belief is strongly reflected in the governing documents, activities and organizational structure of the association.

HISTORY AND PURPOSE

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB), the NAIA emanated from a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" inaugurated in 1937 in Kansas City, Missouri. The conversion of the NAIB to the NAIA came in 1952 when the organization expanded beyond basketball and added national championship events in golf, outdoor track and field and tennis. Football, cross country, baseball and swimming and diving were added to the championship calendar in 1956, and wrestling (1958), soccer (1959), bowling (1962-78), gymnastics (1964-84), indoor track and field (1966), ice hockey (1968-83) and volleyball (1969-80) were later additions.

Of major significance to the NAIA was the establishment of the women's division within the association on August 1, 1980. The NAIA's decision to offer competitive opportunities and championships in women's athletics was passed by the membership following two years of study and proposals by an ad hoc committee on the implementation of a women's division in the NAIA. Currently, the association conducts nine championship event programs for women in the sports of basketball, cross country, fast-pitch softball, indoor and outdoor track and field, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis and volleyball.

The initial purpose of the NAIA — to provide national championship athletic opportunities to institutions below the so-called "major" level — has indeed been well served. The association clearly outlines its own responsibilities and those of its members: a sound athletics program, administered and controlled by those responsible for the administration of the institution. This means direct supervision in caliber of competition, financing of the program and taking steps to assure that financial assistance is made available only through the institution and under the same general policies as aid to all students. In short, the basic premise is that the athletics program is a basic component of the overall educational process and not an entity apart.

ATHLETICS — EDUCATION FOR LEADERSHIP, CHARACTER, CITIZENSHIP

ADMINISTRATION

The NAIA is governed by two bodies. The Council of Presidents, composed of one president from each district, is responsible for fiscal matters, academic standards and supervision of the national staff. The 10-person National Executive Committee, elected by the membership, is responsible for organizing championship events and overseeing the committees and associations. The executive director and his staff conduct the day-to-day operation of the National Office, headquartered in Kansas City, Missouri.

The district is the basic unit of the NAIA. The association is organized into 32 geographical districts spread throughout the 50 states and a part of Canada. Each district is governed by a district executive committee, headed by the district chairman. The district executive committee administers district playoff events, the champions of which qualify to compete in NAIA area and national championship competition.

Eligibility rules within the NAIA govern all play in all sports recognized by the association, not just postseason play. All eligibility guidelines must be adhered to by all members, including those holding dual affiliation with other associations. Certification of eligibility of all NAIA participants is accomplished through a network of people including faculty athletics representatives, district eligibility chairs, and the National Eligibility Committee.

MEMBERSHIP

Any four-year college or university or upper-level, two-year institution in the United States and Canada that awards the bachelor's degree or equivalent may hold active NAIA membership. Active member institutions must be fully accredited by an appropriate accrediting agency or commission.

OBLIGATION OF MEMBERSHIP

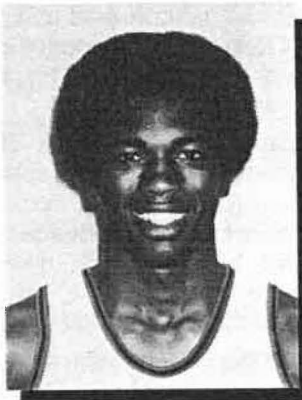
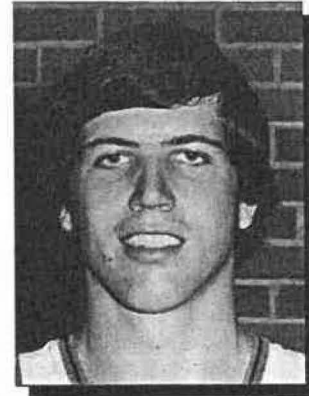
Member institutions must conduct their intercollegiate athletics programs with the standards of the regulatory associations in which they hold membership and the NAIA. They must pay their annual membership dues and be in support of the policies of the NAIA. Where institutional rules and standards are more stringent than those of the regulatory group or the NAIA, those rules and standards of the institution are recognized and supported by the NAIA.

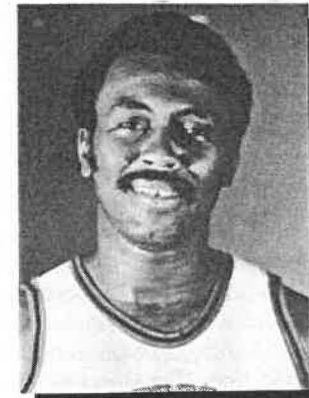

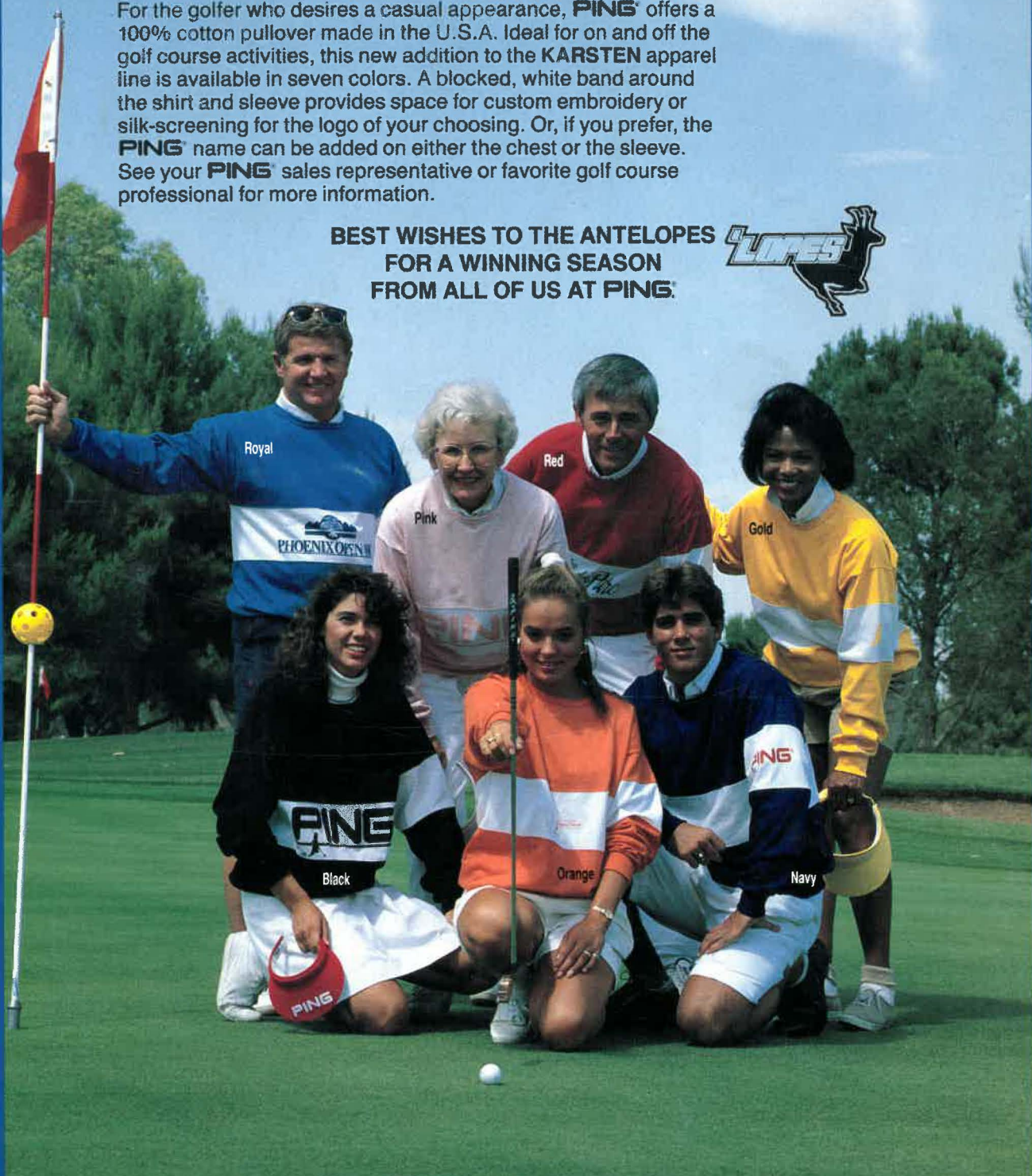
