



Bill Westphal is in his second season at Grand Canyon after leading the 'Lopes to the District 7 Championship in 1988-89. The 'Lopes advanced to the NAIA National Championship in Kansas City, MO and were defeated in the first round by Western Montana.

Bill Westphal, 44, spent the two seasons at Occidental College in the Eagle Rock area of Los Angeles, where he had also coached for seven seasons earlier in his career, before coming to Canyon. Bill earned the distinction of NAIA District 7 Coach of the Year for his efforts this past season.

On the collegiate level, Westphal has coached for 13 seasons and has compiled a 195-154 (.558) record. He spent nine seasons at Occidental where he was 136-104 and won three Southern California Intercolligiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC) Titles.

Westphal coached for three seasons at Western Washington University in Bellingham where he posted a 33-45 career mark. He also served for two seasons as an NBA Assistant to Paul Silas with the San Diego Clippers (1980-82).


Westphal began his coaching career at Glendale High School in Glendale, Calif. His fourth and final season at the high school level propelled him to the head position at Occidental for the 1973-74 season. His last Glendale team was 24-3 and 5th ranked in the CIF 4-A Polls. At Glendale, Westphal was a two-time Foothill League Coach of the Year.

In his playing career, Bill preceded Paul at Manhattan Beach, California's Aviation High School and at the University of Southern California. At 6'7", Bill earned South Bay Player of the Year honors and was honored as a collegian at USC with the Most Improved Player Award (1965) and Most Inspirational Player Award (1966). Westphal also played for Athletes in Action for two years following his career at USC.

Bill earned his undergraduate degree in physical education at USC and completed his masters degree in education at Occidental. Bill and his wife Lynne have three daughters; Kristie (21), Kelly (15) and Kendra (12).

Garrick Barr begins his fourth season at Grand Canyon University, coming with Paul Westphal from Southwestern College prior to the 1986-87 season. Garrick was retained by Bill Westphal when he assumed the head coaching position vacated by his brother prior to the 1988-89 season. Barr and Paul Westphal were teammates in high school at Aviation High in Redondo Beach, California. Barr ranks second on Aviation High's Career Scoring list to, you guessed it, Paul Westphal.

Garrick is a graduate of the University of California, Irvine where he played varsity basketball for four seasons. He was a part-time starter in each of his last two seasons, and graduated in 1973 with a bachelor of arts degree in philosophy.

Garrick's coaching experience includes a year at Glendale Community College (1984-85) as an assistant and three years under Paul Westphal, one at Southwestern College (1985-86) and the last two at Grand Canyon. He has also worked with the popular Adams/Westphal Basketball Camps during the summer.

Garrick is married to the former Cherrie Lewellyn and enjoys photography. He has worked with the Grand Canyon Sports Information Office and took the pictures displayed in in this years media guide. Once a professional free-lance photographer, Garrick has also worked in the commercial airline industry prior to his coaching background.



Scott Mossman Assistant Coach College: Mid America Nazarene (1982) Age: 28 Year @ Canyon: 3rd


Scott Mossman begins his fourth season at Grand Canyon University. As he has done for the last three years, Scott will serve the 'Lopes on a part-time basis this season.






JOEY ALLISON 5-10, JR. GUARD ATWATER, CA #34

1988-89 Season Wrap-up

Grand Canyon entered the 1988-89 season as the "Defending National Champions". They exited the season losing to unheralded Western Montana in the opening round of the NAIA National Tournament in defense of their title. In between Canyon hopped around the top ten of the national rankings and played against some the top teams in the nation. In the end Canyon ended with a 26-5 record and placed three players on the All District team, one making the first team, had four players named to All Tournament teams, and won every tournament they played in, except the one played in Kansas City.

The 'Lopes started the season ranked #2 in the pre-season poll but quickly dropped to #5 despite a 5-0 record. Canyon hit their lowest spot in the rankings when they slipped to a 16-4 record and were #7. But, in the final poll of the season the 'Lopes climbed back up to where they started the season at #2.

A tough schedule was part of the 1988-89 season that kept the 'Lopes competitive. They started the season with the Southwest Texas State Jowers Jamboree Tournament where NAIA mainstays Oklahoma City and St. Mary's TX gave the 'Lopes a quick awakening to the coming season. Canyon came away from the tourney defeating eventual National Champoins St. Mary's in the Championship and Craig Johnson received the MVP award.

The 'Lopes took on Emporia State and U.C. Riverside in their own Days Inn/Grand Canyon Classic defeating both teams by a total of three points. Riverside went on to play in Hawaii where they defeated then top ten ranked University of Iowa. Canyon hit the west coast for a nine game trip and came back just over .500 for the journey. They went 5-4 and faced Riverside on their own court where they gained revenge with a 92-78 victory.

The 'Lopes returned home for the rest of the season and extended their Antelope Gym winning streak to 35 games by capturing the final seven games of the regular season. Canyon hosted the District 7 Playoffs at North Phoenix Baptist Church and defeated Colorado Mines (109-82), Denver University (111-88), and Mesa State CO (115-95) on their way to the District Championship.

Craig Johnson made the All District team as he averaged 17.8 ppg and 7.2 apg. Joining Johnson as Honorable Mention selections were Danl Williams who led the 'Lopes with 20.5 ppg and Mike Ledbetter, a do everything player who average 12.4 ppg, 3.5 rpg, and 2.6 apg.

The 'Lopes took home trophies from five tournaments they won in 1988-89. Included where the Southwest Texas State Jowers Jamboree, their own Days Inn/Grand Canyon Classic, the Occidental Tiger Cage Classic, their own Grand Canyon 'Lopes Round Robin, and the NAIA District 7 Tournament.

Grand Canyon University is a Christian, Liberal Arts college which provides academic excellence in an environment where a Christian perspective is emphasized. BACKGROUND

On June 1, 1989 Grand Canyon College became Grand Canyon University. Founded in 1949, the College was moved from Prescott, Arizona in 1951 to its current location in Phoenix. Situated on 70 acres just west of interstate highways 10 and 17, the University is encompassed by the Phoenix Metropolitan area. This makes the College easily accessible and convenient for visitors and students. The

original buildings were constructed in 1951 and are still in use today as office space and auxiliary classroom space. The Tell Science Building, The Dr. C.J. and Thelma Smith Arts Complex and the Samaritan College of Nursing represent the additions made in recent years.

STUDENT BODY


With a small student body of approximately 1,800 students, the type of students attracted to the University determines the degree of success in achieving the objective set by the University. Of the 1,800 students, over 85% find at least a portion of the money they need for school through scholarships, grants, loans and job opportunies provided by the University. ACADEMICS AND FACULTY

Students today are studying methods and gathering facts and wisdom in nearly 50 different major academic disaplines, as well as six areas of pre-professional study and 16 additional minors. Our first master's program, in education, offers two alternative degrees. Grand Canyon selects its instructional staff to fulfill its mission, emphasis being placed upon character, academic competence, teaching ability and personality.

ATHLETICS

Recently becoming a university will also mean a change for the 'Lopes athletic programs as they ponder moving into the NCAA. In 1988, Grand Canyon won their first ever NAIA Men's Division All Sports Competition, a guide that indicates overall excellence in an athletic program. Along with championship teams in basketball, baseball, volleyball, golf, and tennis; the University also sponsors soccer, women's basketball and men's and women's cross-country teams.


The NAIA's District 7

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS



The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association, currently administering programs of intercollegiate athletics to nearly 500 fully-accredited colleges and universities of moderate enrollment. The fundamental tenet of the NAIA is that intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the total educational program of the institution. This belief is strongly reflected in the governing documents, activities and organizational structure of the association.

HISTORY AND PURPOSE

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB), the NAIA emanated from a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" inaugurated in 1937 in Kansas City, Missouri. The conversion of the NAIB to the NAIA came in 1952 when the organization expanded beyond basketball and added national championship events in golf, outdoor track and field and tennis. Football, cross country, baseball and swimming and diving were added to the championship calendar in 1956, and wrestling (1958), soccer (1959), bowling (1962-78), gymnastics (1964-84), indoor track and field (1966), ice hockey (1968-83) and volleyball (1969-80) were later additions.

Of major significance to the NAIA was the establishment of the women's division within the association on August 1, 1980. The NAIA's decision to offer competitive opportunities and championships in women's athletics was passed by the membership following two years of study and proposals by an ad hoc committee on the implementation of a women's division in the NAIA. Currently, the association conducts nine championship event programs for women in the sports of basketball, cross country, fast-pitch softball, indoor and outdoor track and field, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis and volleyball.

The initial purpose of the NAIA — to provide national championship athletic opportunities to institutions below the so-called "major" level — has indeed been well served. The association clearly outlines its own responsibilities and those of its members: a sound athletics program, administered and controlled by those responsible for the administration of the institution. This means direct supervision in caliber of competition, financing of the program and taking steps to assure that financial assistance is made available only through the institution and under the same general policies as aid to all students. In short, the basic premise is that the athletics program is a basic component of the overall educational process and not an entity apart.

ADMINISTRATION

The NAIA is governed by two bodies. The Council of Presidents, composed of one president from each district, is responsible for fiscal matters, academic standards and supervision of the national staff. The 10-person National Executive Committee, elected by the membership, is responsible for organizing championship events and overseeing the committees and associations. The executive director and his staff conduct the day-to-day operation of the National Office, headquartered in Kansas City, Missouri.

The district is the basic unit of the NAIA. The association is organized into 32 geographical districts spread throughout the 50 states and a part of Canada. Each district is governed by a district executive committee, headed by the district chairman. The district executive committee administers district playoff events, the champions of which qualify to compete in NAIA area and national championship competition.

Eligibility rules within the NAIA govern all play in all sports recognized by the association, not just postseason play. All eligibility guidelines must be adhered to by all members, including those holding dual affiliation with other associations. Certification of eligibility of all NAIA participants is accomplished through a network of people including faculty athletics representatives, district eligibility chairs, and the National Eligibility Committee.

MEMBERSHIP

Any four-year college or university or upper-level, two-year institution in the United States and Canada that awards the bachelor's degree or equivalent may hold active NAIA membership. Active member institutions must be fully accredited by an appropriate accrediting agency or commission.

OBLIGATION OF MEMBERSHIP

Member institutions must conduct their intercollegiate athletics programs with the standards of the regulatory associations in which they hold membership and the NAIA. They must pay their annual membership dues and be in support of the policies of the NAIA. Where institutional rules and standards are more stringent than those of the regulatory group or the NAIA, those rules and standards of the institution are recognized and supported by the NAIA.


