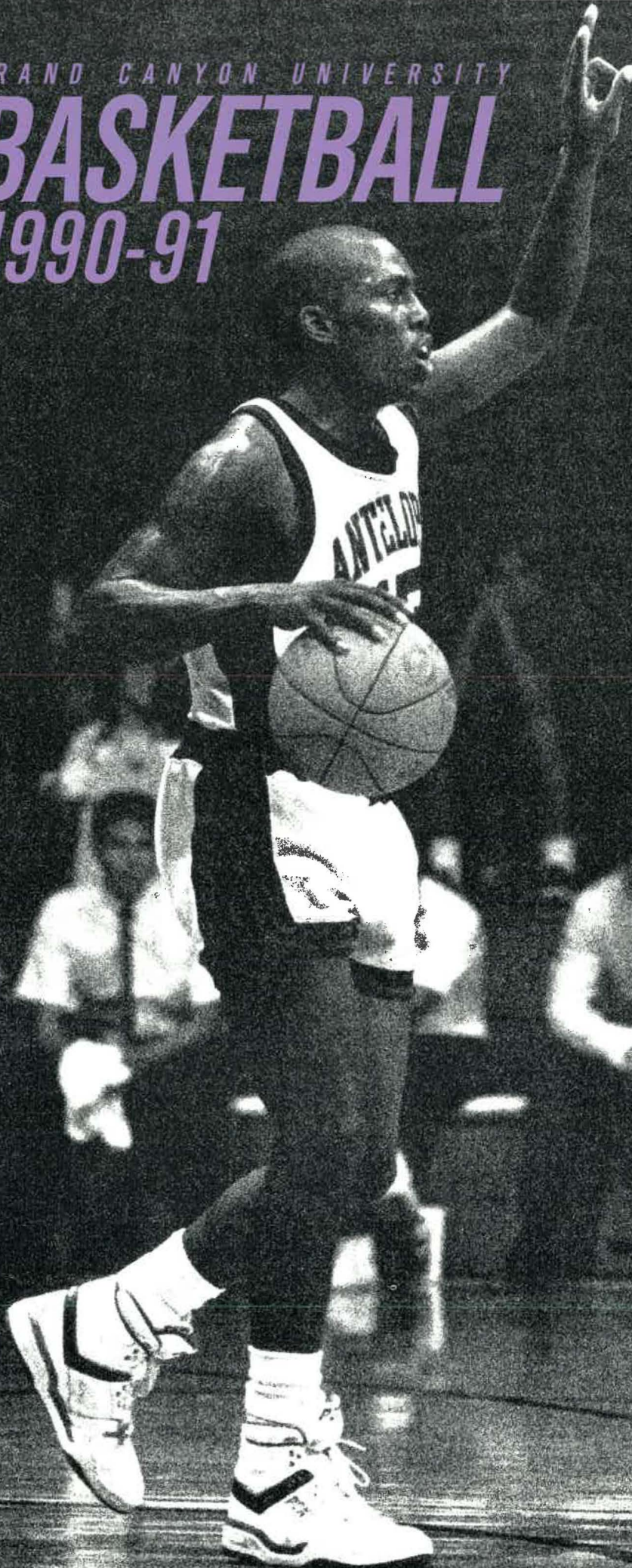

This publication featuring the 1989-90 Grand Canyon University men's basketball team has been prepared to aid you in covering the Antelopes this season. Additional information is available by contacting the Grand Canyon University Sports Information Office.

**Media Information** – To obtain credentials for a Grand Canyon home contest, contact the Sports Information Office at least two days in advance of the game. Passes and seating at courtside press row are limited to **WORKING MEDIA ONLY**. If media credentials can not be picked up in advance, they will be left at the Press-Will Call entrance at the main entrance to Antelope Gym. Credentials will not be mailed.

**Radio** – Permission to broadcast a Grand Canyon game from Antelope Gym should be requested through the Sports Information Director. Stations may use a courtesy line available at courtside. Space will be provided for a broadcast crew of two.

**Services** – The Grand Canyon Sports Information Staff will provide game programs, notes, and cumulative statistics prior to tip-off. Statistical summaries will be provided at halftime, and a full box score will be provided post-game. A limited number of telephones are available for post-game media use in the Sports Information Office on a first-come, first-served basis. Media desiring press table phone service should contact the Sports Information Director.

**Interview Policy** – To interview players, contact the Sports Information Office at least one day in advance of the requested interview and we will have the player return the call. Player interviews will not be granted during practice or the day of a game. To speak with Coach McCrary, call the basketball office directly (602/589-2818). The best time to reach Coach McCrary is Noon-2:30 pm weekdays. Home phone numbers will not be given out.

**Post-game** – Coach McCrary and at least one member of the Antelope team will meet with the media following the game immediately outside the 'Lopes dressing area. Following a brief "cooling off" period, the 'Lopes dressing area will be opened to the media for access to other squad members. If agreed to by the visiting coach, we will have that coach and a player available following the game. A press pass is required for entrance to the dressing areas.

## LEIGHTON McCRARY

### HEAD COACH

COLLEGE: PHILANDER SMITH COLLEGE, AR

AGE: 38

YEAR @ CANYON: 1ST

Leighton "Mac" McCrary begins his first season at the helm of the Antelopes after spending the past six seasons as the top assistant at Arkansas State University.

McCrary, who has built up quite a reputation as a recruiter, hails from Chicago, but has spent his playing and coaching career in Arkansas. The 38-year-old graduated from Philander Smith College in Little Rock in 1974, where he finished in the top 25 percent in his class with a physical education degree and lettered four years in basketball. In 1982 "Mac" added a Master's degree in adaptive physical education to his resume from the University of Arkansas-Little Rock.

While at ASU, McCrary helped guide the Indians to three 20 win seasons and three trips to the National Invitation Tournament. Their best showing at the NIT came in 1987-88 when they advanced to the quarterfinals as they ended up with a 21-14 record.

In his final season the Indians posted a 17-11 record despite having only one returning starter from the previous season. Arkansas State put together a 109-75 (.592) record during coach McCrary's six year stay and never produced a losing season.

Arkansas State Head Coach Nelson Catalina had this to say about McCrary. "Leighton helped us build a successful Division I program here," said Catalina. "With GCU moving from the NAIA to NCAA Division II, he will be able to take them to the next level because he knows the NCAA format."

An active participant in AAU basketball for seven years, McCrary assisted with the U.S. Junior National Olympic Men's Team in the summer of 1983. The select team spent two weeks touring the Soviet Union and was made up of future college All-America team members Tommy Amaker (Duke), Bruce Dalrymple (Georgia Tech), Ricky Blanton (Louisiana State), and Kenny Smith (North Carolina).

McCrary earned his high school diploma from Dunbar Vocational High School in 1970 where he graduated in the top 10 percent of his class.

Coach McCrary began his coaching career at East Side High School in Menifee, Ark. where he established a 68-24 record over three years. His last stint at the high school ranks came at Parkview High School in Little Rock, where he was a basketball aide for five seasons (109-46), before accepting the position at ASU.

As with every one at Canyon, Athletic Director Gil Stafford is excited about the prospects of the new coach, "We are pleased to be able to land Leighton and we're looking forward to a bright and long future with Leighton directing our program."

Leighton and his wife Jacquelin have two children, Jami Lyn (13) and Briana (10). Mac also has a son Leighton Jr. (13) and a daughter Shawnece (11) from a previous marriage.

**ASSISTANT COACH**  
**COLLEGE: GCU**  
**YR @ CANYON: 1ST**

Rodney Johns returns to Canyon for his first season of coaching after completing a successful career playing on the court. Johns was an intragual part of the 1988 squad that captured Canyon's fourth NAIA National Basketball Championship.

Johns begins his first official season on the Canyon staff after coaching on an interim basis at the end of the 1989-90 season. Rodney adds the familiarity aspect of Canyon and the Phoenix area to the coaching staff. Making the adjustment from playing at the NAIA level to coaching at the NCAA level is quite a step that Johns should be able to handle according to Coach McCrary.

"Rodney is a self-motivated individual that will benefit our staff in all aspects of our program. He's becoming well rounded as a coach," said McCrary.

As a player, Johns earned 3rd team NAIA All-American honors as a senior after a stellar performance in Kansas City for the NAIA National Tournament. In five games at Kemper Arena Johns averaged 30.2 ppg, and in the championship, on his way to a game high 41 points, he hit a 17 foot jumper with :02 remaining in overtime to defeat Auburn-Montgomery 88-86 for the National Title. His scoring feats and clutch performances earned him tournament MVP.

A local high school product out of Phoenix Union, Johns jumped around the JUCO circuit in Arizona playing both at Scottsdale Community College (1982-83) and South Mountain Community College (1983-84). He played his final two seasons at Grand Canyon.

After his award filled collegiate career Johns was drafted in the 3rd round of the NBA draft by the Phoenix Suns, but didn't last through the final cuts. He eventually went on and played a year of professional ball in New Zealand.

Johns just finished his undergraduate degree at Grand Canyon with a major in criminal justice. Rodney and his wife Michelle have a daughter Brittany (1). Rodney also has three other children, Tamareus (9), Latoyia (9), and Rodney Jr. (6).

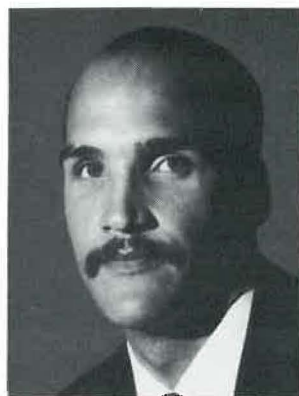

Danny also returns to the Canyon basketball program after having played here from 1985-87. This is his first season with coaching responsibilities at the collegiate level as he is finishing up his degree in education. Last season Young assisted at Washington High School where they went 26-1, with their only loss coming in the state semi-final game.

Coach McCrary had this to say about Young's desire to coach. "Danny is very eager and assertive in his coaching responsibilities, hopefully he can be steered to the point where he can handle both the coaching aspects and his school needs." said McCrary.

A native basketball and football product, Young earned All-America honors in both sports coming out of Duncan High School in southern Arizona. Before playing at Canyon, Young spent a season at both Western New Mexico University and Northern Arizona before coming to Canyon.

A unique, well spoken individual, Tim comes to Canyon from across the Pacific Ocean where he coached at Honoka'a High School in Hilo, Hawaii and directed the basketball program there from 1987-89. At the collegiate level Coach Lovejoy assisted at the University of Hawaii-Hilo for two season (1985-87).

At Hilo he played an important part in the turn around of a dismal program. The Vulcans were 4-24 his first season but did a dramatic flip and put together a 28-10 record and a final eight National Tournament appearance.

"Tim has proven accomplishments on his resume. He'll bring his experience, new ideas and contacts to the program," said McCrary.

Concentrating on Canyon's recruiting, Lovejoy's contacts throughout the Midwest and West should only expand the recruiting base Coach McCrary already has established.

*In his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level, Leighton McCrary may have already set the tone for years to come with his early season conditioning program. Mile runs at 6:30 in the morning, study halls twice a day, and eating breakfast, lunch and dinner together will at least breed familiarity among the players. No matter what Canyon's record is come March one thing is for sure, the 'Lopes will be a disciplined and determined group of players this season.*

*All these activities will hopefully lead to a successful season as Coach McCrary looks to implement a fast-paced, full-pressure game plan. Offensively, Canyon will look to stay with what has made them successful in the recent past by running, running some more, and running until the end. Defensively expect to see full-court, non-stop pressure and according to McCrary, "We plan on picking them up at the airport, guarding them on the bus, and not stopping until the game is over."*

*So it is obvious why the pre-season workouts are so important to the coming season, but McCrary is just as committed to what goes on off the court as well as on the court. For things to work out as planned McCrary believes it takes everything away from the court to make things work on the court. That explains the togetherness he is trying to establish.*

*"My main goal is to make sure our guys represent GCU with a lot of character both on and off the court and to work hard on the court and in the classroom. I want everyone of our seniors to graduate, and I'm going to do every thing I can do to make that possible," said McCrary.*

*With Canyon being full-fledged members of the NCAA this season, this commitment will be needed to be successful. The 'Lopes will play in the Great Northwest Conference this season and play some highly regarded teams outside the conference. Unfortunately, Canyon will have to serve a one-year probation before they can qualify for Division II post-season. So the 'Lopes will be dually affiliated with the NAIA this season and hopefully we can expect to see them make one last trip to the NAIA National Championship in Kansas City.*



*Individually Canyon returns six players that saw a substantial amount of playing time last season. Two individual, Eric Taylor (6-7 Sr. F) and Joshua Ondigo (6-9, Jr. C) could be considered returning starters, though Ondigo was slowed towards the end of the season because of health reasons. Joey Allison (6-0, Sr. G) played well late in the year and started the last seven games of the season. The ageless Derek Jones (32 yrs old, 6-6, Sr. F) also put up some of his best numbers at the close of the season. Seniors Mike Johnson (6-9, C) and Cliff Gaines (6-5, F) had their*

*moments during the year and demonstrated their ability to contribute. One returnee that made an impression on the JV team and that has seen limited action with the varsity is Joseph Odhiambo (6-3, Sr. G-F) a small, but powerful player down low.*

## ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Grand Canyon University is a 4-year Christian, Liberal Arts college which provides academic excellence in an environment where a Christian perspective is emphasized. The University strives to attract dedicated, ambitious people who want to expand both in knowledge and spirit. In emphasizing a liberal arts education which supports a Christian perspective the University prepares students for a life of leadership, responsibility, and growth. The University is open to academically and morally qualified students regardless of national origin, race, creed, sex or religious beliefs.

### BACKGROUND

On June 1, 1989, Grand Canyon College became Grand Canyon University. Founded in 1949, the College was moved from Prescott, Arizona, in 1951 to its current location in Phoenix. Situated on 70 acres just west of interstate highways 10 and 17, the University is encompassed by the Phoenix Metropolitan area. This makes the College easily accessible and convenient for visitors and students. The

original buildings were constructed in 1951 and are still in use today as office space and auxiliary classroom space. The Tell Science Building, The C.J. and Thelma Smith Arts Complex and the Samaritan College of Nursing represent the additions made in recent years.

### STUDENT BODY

With a small student body of approximately 1,800 students, the type of students attracted to the University determines the degree of success in achieving the objective set by the University. Of the 1,800 students, over 85% find at least a portion of the money they need for school through scholarships, grants, loans and job opportunities provided by the University. Motivated, personable students who excel academically and spiritually help the campus grow as a community which adds to the success of the University.

### ACADEMICS AND FACULTY

Students today are studying methods and gathering facts and wisdom in nearly 50 different major academic disciplines,

as well as six areas of pre-professional study and 16 additional minors. Our first master's program, in education, offers two alternative degrees. Grand Canyon selects its instructional staff to fulfill its mission, emphasis being placed upon character, academic competence, teaching ability and personality.

### ATHLETICS

Recently becoming a university will also mean a change for the 'Lopes athletic programs as they enter into the NCAA. The Antelopes will compete in NCAA Division II competition in all sports with the exception of baseball, which will be a NCAA Division I member. In 1988, Grand Canyon won their first ever NAIA Men's Division All Sports Competition, a guide that indicates overall excellence in an athletic program. Along with championship teams in basketball, baseball, volleyball, golf, and tennis; the University also sponsors soccer, women's basketball and men's and women's cross-country teams.





The Great Northwest Conference enters its ninth season well established as one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the country. Last year four GNC teams posted 20 win seasons, an almost unheard of performance.

For the past two years GNC teams have posted a better than 70% winning percentage against non-conference NCAA Division II, III and NAIA teams and have given some Division I teams a serious scare and in December 1989 Alaska Anchorage stunned the college basketball world by upsetting #1 ranked Michigan. That Michigan team went on to win the NCAA National Championship.

Three of the 20 win teams return to the conference this year. Alaska-Anchorage, the conference marquee name, was 22-8 last year, placing third in the North Central Regional. The Seawolves matched GNC champion Metro State's 8-2 conference mark, but lost the title on conference tie-breakers. Metro State finished last season 28-4 and was runner-up in the North Central Regional.

Metro State left the GNC this year to join the fledgling NCAA Division II conference comprised of teams in the Rocky Mountain area.

Original GNC member Eastern Montana also had a 20 wins last year, 20-9, but just 5-5 in conference play. Ernie Wheeler's team is hopeful of challenging for the title this season. The new kid on the block is a national powerhouse in the NAIA ranks. Grand Canyon University had a 20+ win season last year advancing to the second round of the national tournament in Kansas City. Grand Canyon joined the GNC last year but will not be eligible for NCAA post-season play and the GNC Championship until 1991-1992.

GNC teams have reached NCAA Division II post-season play in all but the conference's initial season of 1982-83. The GNC began to emerge as a regional force in 1986 as Alaska-Anchorage stunned #11 ranked California Riverside in the West Regional before bowing to host Hayward State in the regional final.

In 1987 Eastern Montana won the conference title and then defeated conference rival Alaska-Anchorage in the West Regional final to advance to the NCAA Division II Final Four. Eastern lost in the semi-finals to Gannon University by six points after an ankle injury hampered star Jerome Johnson, who scored 18 points in the first half prior to the injury.

1988 saw the GNC again reach the Final Four with Alaska-Anchorage taking the GNC banner to the championship game. The Seawolves were edged in the title game 75-72 by local favorite Lowell College.

1989 was a Cinderella season for Alaska-Fairbanks. The Nanooks, fueled by the dynamic duo of Andre Green and Bart Hakeman, won the GNC title with an 8-4 conference mark although posting just a 16-13 season record. UAF scored some big wins including a near miraculous comeback from a 20 point deficit in the final three minutes of regulation at Sacramento State to tie and then win in overtime.

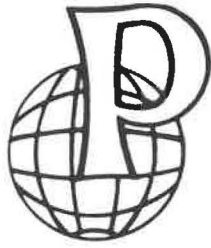
Last year Metropolitan State and Alaska-Anchorage, both ranked nationally in the Top 10 most of the season, battled down to the wire each posting an 8-2 conference mark. Conference tie-breakers gave the title to Metro State and both teams represented the GNC in NCAA Division II post-season play.

The GNC will be apart of the West Region in 1990-91 and will compete with five members. This means the GNC will be at-large qualifiers for post-season play as the conference's automatic berth in the tournament was forfeited when conference membership fell below six schools with the loss of Metro State and Sacramento State. The conference lineup for this season will feature original conference members Alaska-Anchorage, Alaska-Fairbanks, Eastern Montana, and Seattle Pacific plus newcomer Grand Canyon University.

It promises to be another season of great college basketball following the Great Northwest Conference in 1990-91.
