About 'Lope-Sided

'Lope-Sided is the official media guide of the Grand Canyon University athletic department. 'Lopes-Sided will be published three times throughout the collegiate athletics calendar (September 1993, November 1993 and February 1994). The publication serves as the media guide of the seasonal sports highlighted and provides out of season reports and student-athlete and alumni features.

To the Media

Any questions or assistance needed in arranging interviews can be obtained by contacting ElizaBeth Warner, sports information director at 589-2795. Athletes and coaches are typically available before and after practice. GCU student-athletes are not available for interviews on game days prior to game time. Requests for interviewing a student-athlete after the GCU event should be brought to the attention of ElizaBeth Warner or a member of the sports information staff.

Credentials

Working press credentials can be obtained by calling the GCU sports information office 24 hours prior to event time. Working media with credentials have access to the team locker rooms and be assigned a seat at the event.

Game Night Services

Game programs, pre-game notes, line-ups and cumulative statistics are furnished prior to the event. Halftime and final game statistics are provided along with post game quotes. All information can be obtained by contacting the sports information staff or visiting the sports information office. Telephone and fax services are available after each Grand Canyon event and are located in the sports information office. Media outside the greater Phoenix Valley may arrange to receive final statistics, event summary and post-game quotes transmitted via facsimile.

Photographers

Event access will be available to photographers from media outlets which have received credentials from the GCU sports information office.

Radio and Television

Electronic media must obtain contact the GCU sports information office at least 24 hour in advance to ensure broadcast locations. Radio media representing visiting teams must contact the GCU sports information office at least 48 hours prior to the event. A limited amount of radio broadcast lines are available and are assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis. Radio crews must be limited to a team of two.

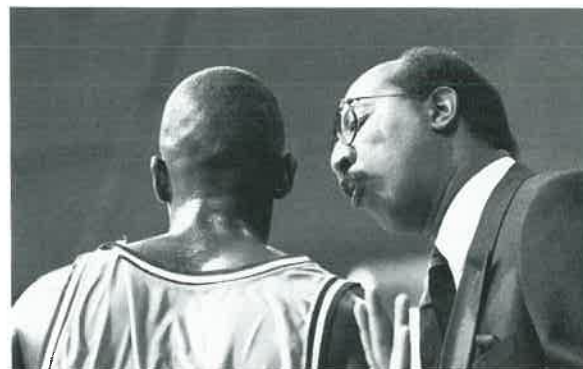

FACING A NEW SEASON

'Lopes add spice and numbers for 1993-94

Last year the Grand Canyon University men's basketball team filled the number seven spot in the pre-season polls, posted 21-10 overall record, ranked as high as tenth during regular season, made a second consecutive appearance at the NCAA Division II national tournament, hosted a third team All-American player, two first team all-conference players as well as a second team GTE Academic All-American team member. Since then, however, the team has lost 10 talented players, four of them starters. But fourth year Head Coach Leighton McCrary remains optimistic about the 1993-1994 basketball season.

"The early part of the upcoming campaign will be an adjustment process," McCrary said. "Many challenges lay ahead, but enthusiasm and spirit are evident among the team members. I am confident that once the players get acclimated and begin to gel as a team, their strengths and talents will be exposed."

A host of new faces grace the Canyon court this season as nine newcomers join the GCU roster. Most are transfer students with junior college experience and four are 6-foot-9 inches or taller. "We have more big men than ever," McCrary said. "We hope this will contribute to the rebounding aspect of the game which has been a weakness for us in the past. We also have some great perimeter players. I feel the team is a healthy combination of talent with a lot of depth."

Also new this year is the 35 second shot clock. In previous seasons, the players had 45 seconds to offensively handle the ball and convert it into a point. "I don't know how the shortened time will impact our game, if it will

help or hinder the big guys," McCrary said. If they can rebound the ball and get it off quick it could be a big help, but if they are slow to recover, we could end up four on five on the other end and that would hurt us."

McCrary is pleased with the addition of assistant coaches Roger Franks and Shane Meuschke, as well as graduate assistant Norman Karsevar. "They work hard burning the midnight oil, but continue to have fresh ideas. They adjust to me as and are innovative in their thinking," McCrary said.

Headlining the six returning players on Canyon's team is senior Chester Hayes, the

only full-time returning starter, and senior Elbert Meeks, a part-time starter on last year's team. Entering his fourth season in a 'Lopes uniform, Hayes is expected to be a key contributor on the floor as well as supply the necessary leadership.

"Chester and I have been through the same four years," McCrary said. "We will graduate together, he with a degree in education and I with an advanced education in coaching."

McCrary hopes that Meeks will have a lot to offer the team in the 1993-1994 season and sees leadership potential in returning players Chris Eymann, Dana Pope and Trent Hudgens.

With so many new players, McCrary must take a different approach than he has in the past. "I want to bring out the leadership skills in the team as quick as possible and get them to a level where they can coach themselves," McCrary said. "I want to get to the point where there is less intervention from me and they rely more on each other for support."

McCrary is seeing that support develop on and off the court through what it is largely in response to the Bible studies the team holds each morning before conditioning. He says it helps loosen the players up, they are able to express their opinions and personal feelings in front of

each other and it creates a special friendship between them. "When the players know each other this personally, they see each other in a different light and it becomes easier to play together on the court," McCrary said. "They lift each other up and believe in each other."

Although the players are a close unit, there is a lot of individual competition for starting positions. "With so many new faces, everything is wide open," McCrary said. "The positions will go to the ones that work the hardest throughout the entire year and I will keep them challenged."

"This team has a lot of potential," McCrary said. "Opportunity and talent are definitely there."

1993-94 ANALYSIS

The Strengths: The team unity. The squad has developed a strong friendship in the preseason and is the key to their success according to Coach Leighton McCrary. "Their unity should carry over to the court and help them gel as a strong team on the court."

The Concerns: Running the floor when we need to. "The conference is very strong this season," McCrary said. "University of Alaska-Anchorage, Seattle Pacific University and Chaminade University are all loaded this year. Chaminade didn't lose a player from a very sound and successful team last year." Canyon will be adjusting to a new game plan and new players this season and are hopeful the loss of 8 top players from 1992-93 won't hurt that much in the early season.

The Angle: Grand Canyon will be building on the skills of their new recruits and adjusting the new combinations. "We have a lot of players that will be gaining valuable NCAA experience this season," McCrary said.

The Coach: Leighton McCrary, beginning his fourth season at the helm of the Lopes men's basketball team. He has led the team to a 61-28 (.685) record in three years and is the fourth winningest basketball coach at Canyon with a .685 percentage.

The Returnees: Chester Hayes is the only returning starter and is joined by Elbert Meeks, Chris Eymann, Dana Pope and Trent Hudgens.

The Tradition: In its 44rd season, the Grand Canyon University Men's Basketball program has captured eight District titles, three NAIA championship banners, and placed third the last two seasons at the NCAA Division II West Regional tournament. Springing Into Action 'LOPES ANXIOUSLY AWAIT SPRING SEASONS

Women's Tennis

Grand Canyon's women's tennis team finished the 1993 season as the No. 5 team in NCAA Division II play. Despite the loss of All-Americans Lucie Ludvigova and Nathalie Bachich, the 'Lopes are expected to continue in their strong tradition of winning again this year.

Newcomer Denise Valentin has made a strong showing already this fall, finishing as a semi-finalist in singles and doubles competition at the Rolex Regional Championships held in early October.

The 'Lopes return three squad members from last seasons's national qualifying team in juniors Tanya and Tina Lopez and sophomore Penny Statters. Three new teammates joined the squad in August which include Valentin (Volklingen, Germany), Harriet Cotton (Cooke County College (TX)/Tunbridge Wells, England) and Michelle Burdick (Odessa Junior College (TX)/Enid, Oklahoma).

Canyon enters their third season as NCAA members and are led by fifth-year Head Coach Carol Sandvig.

Men's Golf

The men's golf team has rebounded well this fall after losing a majority of their team from a season ago.

GCU, who have finished tenth at the NCAA Division II national golf championships the last two years, has added eight new members this year.

Sophomore Derek Nannen (Univ. of Nebraska/Geneva, Nebraska), Dan Campos (Phoenix College/Phoenix, Arizona) and Bob Mayer (Pima Community College/Scottsdale, Arizona) headline the newcomers for Canyon. Head Coach Dr. Dave Brazell returned three team members, Erik Bradford and sophomores Jess Westley and Jay Scott this fall.

Campos and Nannen have made immediate impacts already this fall seeing time

as Canyon's No. 1 and No. 2 golfers. Campos tied for the medalist honors at GCU fall invitational and won the first NCAA District 7 qualifying invitational.

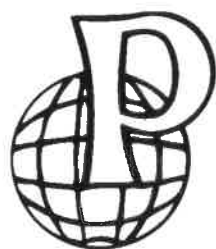
Baseball

TRANSITION PLAY: Hanks guides 'Lopes in new tradition of women's basketball

New is definitely a good word to describe Grand Canyon University 1993-1994 women's basketball team.

Headlining the newness of this year's team is first year Head Coach, Julie Hanks. Hanks is no stranger to winning programs. After an extremely successful basketball career at Northern Arizona University, she has proven herself to be a well accomplished coach. Her most recent success at Phoenix College, she transformed the women's basketball program from a 6-16 season to a 17-11 team a season later.

Hanks steps into a program at Canyon that faces an overall record of 48-90 (.348), and hasn't posted a winning season since its inaugural season in 1988-1989. Hanks plans to turn the program around quickly.

"The past is gone," Hanks said. "You just have to take it day by day and improve from there. I have been a player myself, so I know what it takes to coach players effectively. I am knowledgeable in the game so I can present myself confidently and positively to my team."

Hanks seeks to enhance the program with enthusiasm and dedication. "The key to any successful program is commitment and discipline. You need to start with a commitment and back it with some sort of discipline," Hanks said.

In addition to Hanks, eight fresh faces will be present on the court this season, combined with six players returning with court experience at Canyon. The transfers might be new, but they bring solid experience to the team. Seniors Tammy Leikem and Lynne Long come to Canyon from NCAA

Division I programs and are joined by three former Junior College All-Americans. Hanks feels newcomers Liekem, Heather McDonald and Angie Deters will have a lot to offer the program. A 6-foot-4-inch Kodak All-American, Liekem is expected to supply a lot of leadership along with fellow seniors Long, and returning upperclassmen Rosie Peacock and Angie Dodson.

"The strengths of this year's team will be their quickness, strong defense and their depth," Hanks said. "Everyone is very compatible. There is no "one" star on the team."

The overall attitude of the team is pleasing to Hanks. "A good combination is evident of old and new in this area," Hanks said. "The returning players are tired of losing seasons in the past and are anxious for a change, while most of the new players are coming off of winning seasons and are looking to continue their success."

The Canyon team will adapt Hanks style of play in pushing the ball up the floor, run a controlled fast break, press and attack from the get

go. "We want to make it exciting and get people to come watch us play," she said.

"Our goal for the beginning of the year is to keep fresh attitudes and play in a team manner," Hanks said. "When you are a positive coach like I am, the team's attitude stays positive."

"I came here to win," she said. "Our challenge this year is to win as many games as possible and post a record above .500. We want to be contenders in the conference and possibly get a national bid."

"I want to excite the people," Hanks said. "I want to let them know we are here and we're ready to play."

1993-94 ANALYSIS

The Strengths: The depth. Coach Hanks has 14 players quality players who can make things happen on the floor. The Lady 'Lopes sport six seniors, two of which come from strong NCAA Division I programs. Coach Hanks also has four juniors, two sophomores and two freshman to count on this season.

The Concerns: Staying healthy and keeping the team unity in tack from game one to the final game of the year. The squad has nursed several nagging injuries in the preseason and Coach Hanks hopes the team can run well with very few injuries throughout the season.

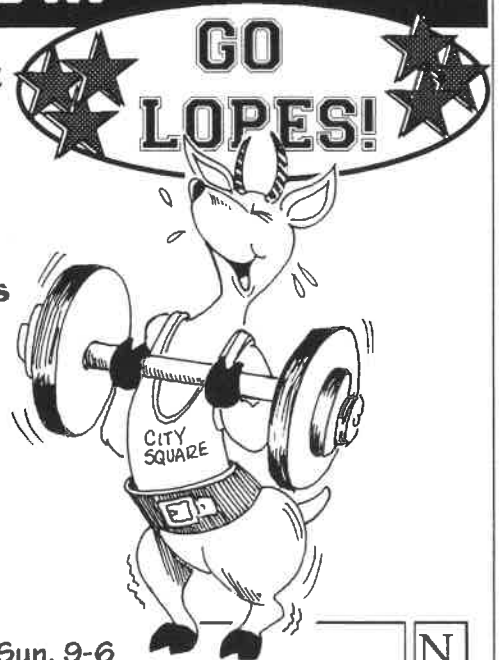

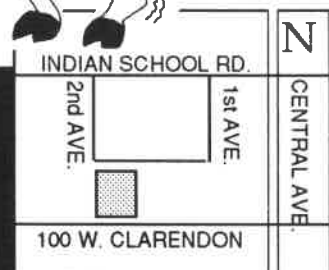

"I'm just sure with the energy of the night," Smith said, "they are going to rack up a few that night."

A check will be presented to The Bridge's parent organization, Southwest Leadership Foundation, after the final match.

"We've had a good season, which makes it all that much sweeter," Smith said.

Aces probably will be continued next year.

"Perhaps it will be bigger and perhaps it won't be," Smith said.

"But I don't think it's

The Lopes found sponsors willing to pledge a dollar amount for every service ace executed on the home court. At the end of the season, the money will be donated to The Bridge, a transitional housing program for homeless families.

"I'm glad that we're able to participate in this," Said Dee Ann Cameran, 22, an outside hitter on the team. "I'm glad there are people willing to back us up. Without sponsors it wouldn't mean anything."

Smith says the players are reaping the rewards of service.

"It's kind of a change for the kids to know they have the ball in their hands and they can make a difference in the ball game, but they can make a difference in someone's life as well."

The team has raised \$1,460. One home matche remain in the season, including the final game on Oct. 30 vs. the

From 'Lopes to major leagues? It happens more than you think

Grand Canyon University doesn't resemble a factory.

But one wonders.

Consider for a moment that the Baptist-affiliated institution of higher learning on West Camelback Road has pumped approximately 40 athletes into the major leagues in the 40 years the school has been in existence.

That may not be a record, but it is darned impressive considering the school's enrollment only recently reached 1,800.

As the big-league season winds down, no fewer than six former Antelopes can be found on rosters, including California Angels outfielder Tim Salmon, the leading candidate for American League rookie of the year honors.

Canyon baseball Coach Gil Stafford, who heavily recruits Arizona players, modestly credits the state's high schools and community colleges for the excellent athletes they turn out.

"We provide them with a place to play and try to provide an atmosphere where they can grow up to be men and prove themselves," Stafford said. "And we throw a bit of baseball at them and some of it sticks."

Obviously, there's more to it than that.

"Our theory is to take what they have and make it better," said Stafford, a former minor leaguer who turned pro after graduating from Maryvale High School. "We undercoach rather than overcoach and try to improve on the positives and not dwell too much on the negatives."

But no system is perfect. California Angels pitcher Paul Swingle is a perfect example. He walked on at Canyon and told Stafford he could pitch. But he ended up as an outfielder.

"Sometimes it is better to be lucky than good," said Stafford, referring to not using Swingle as a pitcher. "He's proof I know nothing about coaching, although he did throw a bit for us at the end."

Stafford admits Canyon's family

we would be that close. And Stafford is like a father figure. He teaches off the field about being a man, showing respect for other people, how to treat people decent and not acting like some goofball and getting into trouble."

Salmon, who still calls the Valley home, had to end his spectacular year a bit early when he broke his left ring finger. He recently underwent surgery to repair it. He finished the year with a .283 batting average, 31 home runs and 95 RBIs.

"The biggest thing I learned at Canyon was a work ethic," Salmon said. "And preparation for the minors. When you get to the minors you are on your own. Nobody's going to take you out there and make you take extra hitting practice. You have to want to do it. That's the reason a lot of good players who go to the big leagues don't make it. It's dog eat dog."

Salmon admits the school's religious studies had a big influence on him.

"I didn't become a Christian until I went to Canyon," Salmon said. "A lot of ballplayers went there and religion didn't mean much to them, but it did for me

atmosphere and small campus are not for everybody.

"Every student athlete has to choose where they are happiest," Stafford said. "We try to make an atmosphere where they feel comfortable, have some fun and have an opportunity to put things together so they can handle the pro atmosphere. If we've done anything, that's it."

Swingle of Mesa Dobson High and Mesa Community College and Salmon, Greenway High School, share the California roster with outfielder Chad Curtis, who is a product of Benson High School and Cochise College. All three played at least one year (1989) together at Canyon.

"Tim and Chad are like brothers to me," Swingle said. "I don't think at a big university

Leighton McCrary enters his fourth season as the men's head basketball coach at Grand Canyon. He led the Antelopes to their second consecutive NCAA post-season opportunity last season after finishing second in the Pacific West Conference with a 21-10 and 7-5 conference record. The 'Lopes have finished third at the NCAA Division II West Regional Tournament the last two seasons.

McCrary has added three new assistant coaches to the program as well as 10 new

players this season. GCU returns one starter, Chester Hayes from last year, but hopes the new members will provide the talent and depth necessary to pick up where last year's team left off.

McCrary, 41, originally from Chicago, Ill., spent his playing and coaching career in Arkansas. A 1974 graduate of Philander Smith College in Little Rock, he earned a physical education degree and lettered four years in basketball. In 1982, he added a master's degree in adaptive physical education from the University of Arkansas-Little Rock to his resume.

He spent six seasons as the top assistant coach at Arkansas State University before coming to GCU in 1990. While at Arkansas State, McCrary helped guide the Indians to three-20 win seasons and three trips to the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). Their best showing at the NIT came in 1987-88 when they advanced to the quarterfinals. Arkansas State put together a 109-75 (.592) record during coach McCrary's six year stay and did not produced a losing season.

An active participant in AAU basketball, McCrary assisted the U.S. Junior National Olympic Team in the summer of 1983. The selected team spent two weeks touring the

Soviet Union and consisted of future college All-America team members Tommy Amaker (Duke), Bruce Dalrymple (Georgia Tech), Ricky Blanton (Louisiana State), and Kenny Smith (North Carolina).

McCrary began his coaching career at East Side High School where he established a 68-24 record over three seasons. His last stint at the high school level came at Parkview High School in Little Rock, where he was a basketball assistant for five seasons (109-46), before moving to Arkansas State.

McCrary and his wife Jacquelin have two children, Jami Lyn and Briana. McCrary also has a son, Leighton Jr., and a daughter, Shawnee, from a previous marriage.

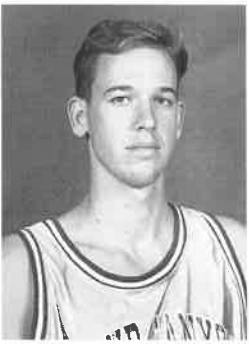

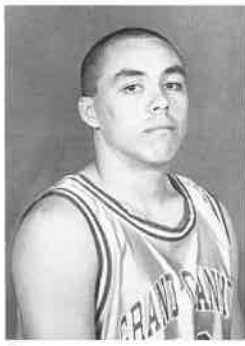

Meuschke and his wife, Beth, recently moved to Phoenix from Warrensburg, Missouri.



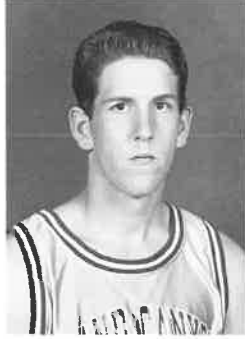
