# From Grand Canyon University Athletics

## To The Media

Any questions or assistance needed in arranging interviews can be obtained by contacting Deron Filip, sports information director at 602/589-2795. Athletes and coaches are typically available before and after practice. GCU student-athletes are not available for interviews on game days prior to game time. Requests for interviewing a student-athlete at a practice or after a GCU event should be brought to the attention of Deron Filip.

## Credentials

Working press credentials can be obtained by calling the GCU sports information office 24 hours prior to event time. Working media with credentials have access to the team locker rooms and are provided with a designated seat location at each event.

## Game Night Services

Game programs, pregame notes, lineups and cumulative statistics are furnished prior to each event. Halftime and final game statistics also will be available. All information can be obtained by contacting the sports information staff or visiting the sports information office.

Telephone and fax services are available after each Grand Canyon event and are located in the sports information office. Media outside the metro Phoenix area may arrange to receive final statistics, an event summary and postgame quotes transmitted via facsimile.

## Photographers

Event access will be available to photographers from media outlets which have received credentials from the GCU sports information office.

## Radio and Television

Electronic media (radio and television) must obtain contact with the GCU sports information office at least 48 hours in advance to ensure broadcast locations. A limited amount of radio broadcast lines are available and are assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis.

# BLUEPRINTS FOR SUCCESS

A new conference. New players. A new gymnasium.

It's apparent that Coach Leighton McCrary will be working with some raw materials, as he enters his fifth season as "foreman" of the men's basketball program.

After going through a season of emotional ups and downs (1993-94), McCrary already likes what he sees in the "plans" for the upcoming season with his practically brand new Antelopes.

"This is a sharp group mentally," McCrary said of his 1994-95 squad. "They have very good direction and have personal goals that are constructive."

Grand Canyon finished the season last year with a 14-15 overall record and 6-6 in the Pacific West Conference.

The team pulled off a surprise, defeating Alaska-Anchorage to capture the Pac West tournament crown and advance to the NCAA Division II West Regional Tournament for the third consecutive season. The 'Lopes were then defeated by San Francisco State in overtime, bringing the season to a halt.

After winning conference championships for four straight seasons, McCrary's club will no longer enjoy the friendly confines of the Pac West Conference. Like most of Canyon's athletic programs, men's basketball finds itself with the unenviable challenge of competing in the California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA).

It's no secret that the CCAA is well represented come tournament time. One of its members, Cal State-Bakersfield, is the two-time defending Division II national champion.

McCrary said that like his own team, Bakersfield lost a lot of players but has reloaded. He also looks for the University of California-Riverside and Cal State-Dominguez Hills to be other frontrunners.

For Canyon, establishing early chemistry will be crucial in preparing for conference play.

"We have to come together quickly," McCrary said. "We're playing in the best Division II conference in the nation."

Coming together could be a major project, considering that the 'Lopes have only two returners (Bobby Noble and Tom Shuey), with the latter not being eligible until January.

Noble played in 29 games last season, averaging 7.0 points and 5.8 rebounds per game. Shuey averaged 8.7 points and 5.3 rebounds in 24 games.

As far as the newcomers are concerned, McCrary points to three who should provide some immediate results.

Kenny Archbold, a transfer from Eastern Arizona College, will be counted on for his leadership at the point guard position.

Archbold averaged about eight points and four assists per game for EAC two years ago.

With Shuey unavailable until second semester, Horacio Llamas figures to play a major role in the middle. The 6-foot-10, 305-pound Llamas enters Canyon's program after spending two seasons at Pima Community College.

Finally there's Curtis Cathey, whom McCrary said could very easily make a name for himself in the new conference. Cathey transfers to Canyon after playing at Los Angeles Harbor College two seasons ago.

"When all is said and done," McCrary said, "Curtis has the

capability to quietly dominate a ballgame. He's very explosive."

Explosiveness seems to be what will characterize this team, especially in the open floor. McCrary, however, is more interested in developing a well-rounded style of play.

"We love to run," McCrary said, "but we want to be just as effective in a half-court game.

"We'll take what's given to us and take advantage of our talent."

Another type of advantage that the 'Lopes would like to enjoy is that of the home court. The new Antelope Gymnasium, with a seating capacity of 2,000, is scheduled to be completed by early December. McCrary said he feels privileged to benefit from something for which his predecessors have worked.

"They were the pioneers who wanted this building all along," McCrary said. "I want to uphold the feelings that they've had for a long time."

McCrary added that the new facility will only enhance the image of the university.

"It will provide a stronger sense of pride for Grand Canyon," he said. "It will also dress up the community. We'd like the community to see it and be a part of it as well."

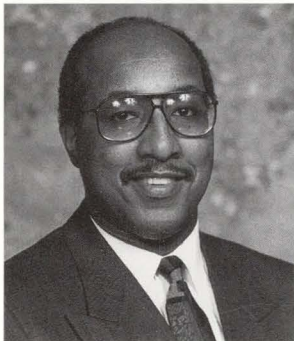

## Coach Leighton McCrary

Beginning his fifth season at the helm of the men's basketball program, Leighton McCrary has directed the Antelopes to four consecutive postseason appearances - one in the NAIA and three at the NCAA Division II level.

McCrary's clubs have also been at the top of the Pacific West Conference (formerly the Great Northwest Conference) the past four seasons. McCrary was named the Great Northwest Conference Coach of the Year for the 1991-92 season.

Last season, Canyon upset Alaska-Anchorage, capturing the Pac West tournament crown and receiving an automatic bid to the Division II West Regional Tournament.

This season, McCrary will lead his team into the highly competitive California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA). One of the conference's members, Cal State-Bakersfield, is the two-time Division II national champion.

McCrary, 42, originally from Chicago, spent his playing and coaching career in Arkansas. He earned his bachelor's in physical education, while lettering four seasons in basketball at Philander Smith College in Little Rock.

Before arriving at Canyon in 1990, McCrary spent six seasons as the top assistant coach at Arkansas State University. While there, he helped guide the Indians to three 20-win seasons and three trips to the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). Their best showing at the NIT was in 1988, when they advanced to the quarterfinals. McCrary also assisted with the U.S. Junior National Olympic Team in the summer of 1983.

McCrary began his coaching career at East Side High School in Menifee, Ark., where he established a 68-24 record over three seasons. He then assisted at Parkview High School in Little Rock for five seasons before moving on to Arkansas State.

McCrary and his wife Jacquelin have three children: Jami Lyn, Briana and most recently Donovan, born in September, 1994. McCrary also has a son, Leighton Jr., and a daughter, Shawnee, from a previous marriage.

## Asst. Coach Roger Franks

Roger Franks enters his second season as an assistant coach at Grand Canyon, after having a successful head coaching career at Mountain View High School in Arkansas.

During his four-year career at MVHS, Franks, 38, compiled an overall record of 94-21. He led his teams to two conference championships and regional and district championships. He earned all-star coaching honors three times during his career. Before his tenure at Mountain View, Franks served as a graduate assistant under Coach

McCrary at Arkansas State University.

Franks resides in Phoenix with his wife, Christy.

## Asst. Coach Norman Karsevar



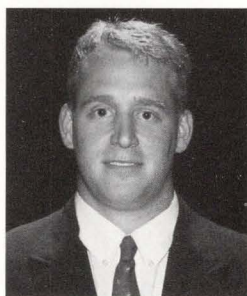
