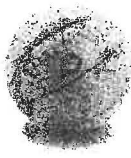

ATHLETICS

To The Media

Any questions or assistance needed in arranging interviews can be obtained by contacting Deron Filip, Sports Information Director, at 602/589-2795. Athletes and coaches are typically available before and after practice. GCU student-athletes are not available for interviews on game days prior to game time. Requests for interviewing a student-athlete at a practice or after a GCU event should be brought to the attention of Deron Filip.

Credentials

Working press credentials can be obtained by calling the GCU sports information office 24 hours prior to event time. Working media with credentials have access to the team locker rooms and are provided with a designated seat location at each event.

Event Services

Men's basketball guides, game notes, lineups and cumulative statistics are furnished prior to each event. Halftime and final game statistics also will be available. All information can be obtained by contacting the sports information staff or visiting the sports information office. Telephone and fax services are available after each Grand Canyon event and are located in the sports information office. Media outside the metro Phoenix area may arrange to receive final statistics, an event summary and postgame quotes transmitted via facsimile.

Photographers

Event access will be available to photographers from media outlets which have received credentials from the GCU sports information office.

Radio and Television

Electronic media (radio and television) must obtain contact with the GCU sports information office at least 48 hours in advance to ensure broadcast locations. A limited amount of radio broadcast lines are available and are assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis.

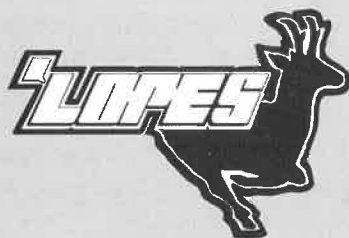

SEASON OUTLOOK

After a season in which the Grand Canyon University men's basketball team finished with a record of 23-6, you would think they would be satisfied.

Think again.

The Antelopes' season came to an unfortunate end last year in the NCAA Division II West Region semifinals against Cal State-Bakersfield, who would eventually represent the west region in the Elite Eight in Louisville, Ky.

Aside from the season's abrupt end, the 'Lopes did make it further in the Division II postseason than any previous year. Two seasons ago, they were ousted in the first round by UC-Davis. This year, the program hopes to make it to the next level, and head coach Leighton McCrary has the athletes to do it.

Returners

Contrary to last season, McCrary will not have the luxury of returning most of his players. This year, there are only six returners, all of whom will be looked upon to provide a certain degree of leadership. Of these returners, senior Kenny Archbold is the lone starter.

"Kenny is the man," McCrary said. "He is our stabilizer and coach on the floor."

And why shouldn't he be? Last season, Archbold averaged 15.9 points per game, led the team in assists (84) and averaged 4.4 rebounds per game, earning second team all-conference honors in the California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA). Archbold also earned postseason accolades, averaging 26 points in the two west region games and being named to the all-tournament team.

This year, Archbold is a preseason second team All-American selection.

"We've had preseason All-Americans in past years, which can create some added pressure on a player," McCrary said. "But there is no doubt in my mind that Kenny can handle it, because he has worked hard and earned this honor."

Other returners this year include Nathan Hansen, Derek Hersha, Michael O'Guinn

(redshirt), Larry Reed and Shelton Simmons.

Newcomers

With six newcomers this year, McCrary hopes to use the preseason schedule to get some much-needed experience in Division II basketball.

"There is no substitute for experience," McCrary said. "We will hopefully learn from our mistakes in the preseason."

With five of the six newcomers being transfers, the learning should come faster than usual. These players include Bobby Alexander, Jerry Allen, Bill Barquin, Tony Gillette and John Williams. The sixth newcomer is freshman Mark Murphy from Moon Valley High School.

McCrary added that he'll keep things uncomplicated during the preseason, using it as an opportunity to develop team chemistry and to help the new players to adjust to his style of play.

Athletic Talent

In McCrary's opinion, this is the most athletic team he has coached at Canyon. That's saying a lot, considering that in his previous six years, he has guided each team to the postseason.

This year's team will be different from those teams of the past two years in that the style will be more run-and-gun to complement the athleticism. The increased pace will provide some compensation, after the departure of last season's NCAA Division II Player of the Year Horacio Llamas and the 1994-95 CCAA Conference Player of the Year Eric Langford, both of

whom established a dominant inside game for the last two years.

The CCAA

As always, the CCAA will be considered one of the tougher Division II conferences in the nation. With two teams ranked in one of the preseason top ten polls (No. 1 Bakersfield and No. 9 Canyon), the conference will be up for grabs.

Kebu Stewart returns again for Cal State-Bakersfield this year after taking himself out of the last year's NBA draft. He was last season's CCAA Player of the Year and led the Roadrunners to the Division II West Region championship. Bakersfield will rank high in most polls.

Although Canyon and Bakersfield appear to be the frontrunners, the CCAA is a consistently strong conference from top to bottom.

"Everyone will be ready," McCrary said. "Don't count anyone out."

Looking Ahead

Staying healthy this year is a main concern for McCrary. With only 12 players on the current roster, keeping everyone healthy will be a top priority.

McCrary is also looking to see how quickly everyone will gel together as a team. He's telling his players to leave their egos on the shelf and grasp on firmly to the team concept.

"I think that we are going to be a very good team," McCrary said. "I want our kids to look, act and play like champions, and nothing short of that."

HEAD COACH

Leighton McCrary

Alma Mater: Philander Smith College, 1976
M.A.: University of Arkansas-Little Rock, 1982
Head Coaching Tenure at GCU: 7th year
Head Coaching Record at GCU: 115-60

Beginning his seventh season at the helm of the men's basketball program, Leighton McCrary has directed the Antelopes to six consecutive postseason appearances - one in the NAIA and five at the NCAA Division II level.

McCrary's clubs were at the top of the Pacific West Conference (formerly the Great Northwest Conference) for four seasons. McCrary was named the Great Northwest Conference Coach of the Year for the 1991-92 season.

Last season, the 'Lopes advanced as far as the West Regional semifinals, their best postseason finish as a Division II program.

In addition to his accomplishments with the GCU basketball program, Coach "Mac" has had equal success writing for professional publications and serving as a guest speaker for national coaches clinics.

McCrary, 44, originally from Chicago, spent his playing and coaching career in Arkansas. He earned his bachelor's in Physical Education, while lettering for four seasons in basketball at

Philander Smith College in Little Rock. In 1982, he added a master's in Adaptive Physical Education from the University of Arkansas-Little Rock.

Before arriving at Canyon in 1990, McCrary spent six seasons as the top assistant coach at Arkansas State University. He helped guide the team to three 20-win seasons and three trips to the National Invitational Tournament.

McCrary began his coaching career at East Side High School in Menifee, Ark., where he established a 68-24 record over three seasons. He then assisted at Parkview High School in Little Rock for five seasons before moving on to Arkansas State.

An active participant in AAU basketball, McCrary assisted with the Junior National Olympic men's team in the summer of 1983, touring the Soviet Union.

McCrary and his wife, Jacquelin, reside in Phoenix and have three children: Jami Lyn, Briana and Donovan. McCrary also has a son, Leighton Jr., and a daughter, Shawnece, from a previous marriage.



ASSISTANT COACH

Norman Karsevar

Alma Mater: Mount Olive College, 1990
Tenure at GCU: 4th year

Norman Karsevar is in his second season as Coach McCrary's top assistant and begins his fourth season overall at Canyon. He is a graduate from Mount Olive College in North Carolina, where he earned his degree in Business Management.

Karsevar, 30, played basketball for four years at Mount Olive, leading the team in scoring his final two

seasons. He was selected as an honorable mention all-conference member his senior season.

A native of Miami, Fla., Karsevar graduated from Athens Drive High School (Raleigh, N.C.). Before coming to Canyon, Karsevar coached girls' basketball at Hale High School in Raleigh. He is single and resides in Glendale.



ASSISTANT COACH

Scott Mossman

Alma Mater: Mid-America Nazarene College, 1982
Tenure at GCU: 6th year (2nd returning)

Scott Mossman is in his second season at Canyon after returning last year. He played a major role in recruiting the players for the 1988 NAIA National Championship team during his previous tenure with the Antelopes (1986-90).

Before arriving at Canyon in 1986, Mossman was a volunteer assistant at Glendale Community College in 1984-85 and also served as an assistant coach at Casa Grande High School during the 1985-86 season, while

teaching there as well. From 1990-95, Mossman had been an assistant coach at Biola University.

Mossman, 38, graduated from Mid-America Nazarene College in Olathe, Kansas, with a bachelor of science degree in Physical Education in 1982, after attending Scottsdale Community College for two years and graduating from Phoenix's Sunnyslope High School. He and his wife, Debbie, have one child, Sarah.



ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT

Roger Lefebvre

Alma Mater: New England College, 1992
Tenure at GCU: 3rd year (2nd returning)

Roger Lefebvre returned to the Canyon coaching staff last year after a two-year hiatus. Lefebvre had been the head assistant coach at Clarke College (IA) in 1993-94 and served as an assistant at Scottsdale Community College the next year. At Clarke, Lefebvre served as a recruiting coordinator, defensive coordinator and strength and conditioning coach.

During his stint at Canyon in 1992-93, Lefebvre saw the Antelopes capture the Pacific West Conference

title with a 21-10 record. He was responsible for scouting, film exchange and academic progress. Lefebvre continues those duties this season.

A native of Rochester, New Hampshire, Lefebvre graduated from St. Thomas Aquinas High School in Dover, N.H., and earned his bachelor's degree in English from New England College in 1992. He and his wife, Susan, were married a year ago in September and reside in Phoenix.
