

To The Media

Athletes and coaches are typically available before and after practice. GCU student-athletes are not available for interviews on game days prior to game time. Requests for interviewing a student-athlete at a practice or after a GCU event should be brought to the attention of Deron Filip.

Credentials

Working press credentials can be obtained by calling the GCU sports information office 24 hours prior to event time. Working media with credentials have access to the team locker rooms and are provided with a designated seat location at each event.

Event Services

Basketball guides, game notes, lineups and cumulative statistics are furnished prior to each event. Halftime and final game statistics also will be available. All information can be obtained by contacting the sports information staff or visiting the sports information office. Telephone and fax services are available after each Grand Canyon event and are located in the sports information office. Media outside the metro Phoenix area may arrange to receive final statistics, an event summary and postgame quotes transmitted via facsimile.

Photographers

Event access will be available to photographers from media outlets which have received credentials from the GCU sports information office.

Radio and Television

Electronic media (radio and television) must obtain contact with the GCU sports information office at least 48 hours in advance to ensure broadcast locations. A limited amount of radio broadcast lines are available and are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

Head Coach

LEIGHTON McCRARY

Alma Mater: Philander Smith College, 1974 M.A.: University of Arkansas-Little Rock, 1982 Head Coaching Tenure at GCU: 8th year Overall Record at GCU: 138-66

Beginning his eighth season at the helm of the men's basketball program, Leighton McCrary has directed the Antelopes to

seven consecutive postseason appearances-one in the NAIA and six at the NCAA Division II level.

McCrary's clubs were at the top of the West Pacific Conference (formerly the Great Northwest

Conference) for four seasons. McCrary was named the Great Northwest Conference Coach of the Year for the 1991-92 season.

A year ago, the 'Lopes advanced as far as the West Regional semifinals for the second consecutive season.

addition to accomplishments with the GCU basketball program, Coach "Mac" has had equal success writing for professional publications and serving as a guest speaker for national coaches clinics.

McCrary, 45, originally from Chicago, spent his playing and coaching career in Arkansas. He earned his bachelor's in Physical Education, while lettering for four seasons in basketball at Philander Smith College in Little Rock. In 1982, he added a master's in Adaptive Physical Education from the University of Arkansas-Little Rock.

> Before arriving at Canyon in 1990, McCrary spent six seasons as the top assistant coach at Arkansas State University. He helped guide the team to three 20-win seasons and three trips to

the National Invitational Tournament.

McCrary began his coaching career at East Side High School in Menifee, Ark., where he established a 68-24 record over three seasons. He then assisted at Parkview High School in Little Rock for five seasons before moving on to Arkansas State.

An active participant in AAU basketball, McCrary assisted with the Junior National Olympic men's team in the summer of 1983, touring the Soviet Union.

McCrary and his wife, Jacqulin, reside in Phoenix and have three children: Jami Lyn, Briana and Donovan. McCrary also has a son, Leighton Jr., and a daughter, Shawnece, from a previous marriage.

Roger Lefebvre begins his eighth season as an assistant coach at the

collegiate level, including his fourth at Grand Canvon.

Lefebvre was the head assistant at Clarke College (IA) in 1993-94 and served as an assistant at Scottsdale Community College the next year. At Clarke, Lefebvre served as

a recruiting coordinator, defensive coordinator and strength and conditioning coach.

During his stint at Canyon in 1992-93, Lefebvre saw the Antelopes capture the Pacific West Conference title with a 21-10 record. He was responsible for scouting, film exchange and academic progress. In each of the last two seasons, the 'Lopes have posted 23-6 records and have advanced to West Region semifinals.

> In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Lefebvre has organized and run several basketball camps across the country.

> Lefebvre has also had success in professional publications, including The Courtside, the periodical of National

Association of Basketball Coaches.

A native of Rochester, New Hampshire, Lefebvre graduated from St. Thomas Aquinas High School in Dover, N.H. and earned his bachelor's degree in English from New England College in 1992. He and his wife, Susan, were married a in September of 1995 and reside in Phoenix.

In his seven seasons as head basketball coach at Grand Canyon University, Leighton McCrary has established himself as one who has a knack for instilling team chemistry into his respective clubs. Recruiting primarily junior college transfers, McCrary has

become accustomed to introducing new players to his philosophy and style of play.

With only three players returning from last year's squad, Coach "Mac" will be working overtime this season, but is looking forward to the task at hand.

"I'm teaching most of these players things," new

McCrary said, "and it's exciting for them and for us. I'm real excited about going to practice because (the new situation) is helping me coach more."

Practice Makes Perfect

To help the newcomers make the adjustment to Grand Canyon basketball, McCrary has put more of an emphasis on preseason scrimmages to create more of a comfort zone for his players on the court.

"They're all pretty smart and catch on real quick," McCrary said. "But the scrimmages put everyone in a lot of different situations."

One returner who will bring experience with his knowledge of various game situations is senior Jerry Allen, a transfer last season from Los Angeles Harbor College. Allen played in all 29 games a year ago, averaging 12.4 points per game (second on the team) and 3.9 rebounds.

Allen agrees that the additional scrimmages have helped the players "get to know each other's games."

McCrary Counting on Allen

The Antelopes finished the 1996-97 season with a 23-6 overall record and a 9-3 conference mark in the California Collegiate Athletic Asso-

> ciation. In the postseason, they advanced to the West Regional semifinals, where they were defeated by the eventual NCAA Division II National Champions—Cal State Bakersfield.

> McCrary said that Allen's experience in the national tournament, along with the additional basketball

knowledge he gained during the offseason, make him a natural leader.

"You've always got to have a main man or two on your team," McCrary said. "Jerry's the person we're going to lean on this year and he'll have to take that upon himself."

Allen said he is ready to meet his coach's challenge.

"I'm not used to being a leader," he said, "but I've worked on being more vocal on the court and keeping the guys together off the court."

According to Allen, the team has already developed what Allen calls "more of a family this year."

Allen added that he is not putting an emphasis on his personal goals for his final season but more importantly wants to help lead the 'Lopes to a conference title, which would insure a more advantageous position in the postseason.

Two Other Returners

Seniors Nathan Hansen and Bill Barquin will also play an important role, McCrary said. Hansen is in his third year with the program and brings some additional experience, while Barquin will be looked upon again to provide a spark off the bench with his three-point shooting.

A Host of Newcomers

As far as the newcomers are concerned, juniors Prince Edmonds and Enrique Zuniga figure to be prominent members in the backcourt. Zuniga was a member of Mexico's junior team, the same team for which former Canyon player, and current Phoenix Sun, Horacio Llamas played.

Bolstering the power forward position will be juniors Kelvin Otis and Andre Hall. Rounding out newcomers are the multi-dimensional Justin Mora, Rudy Byron, Davin Johnson, Touré Knighton and Nate Scott.
