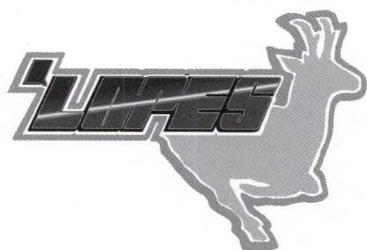

Head Coach

LEIGHTON McCRARY

Alma Mater: Philander Smith College, 1976
M.A.—University of Arkansas-Little Rock, 1982
Head Coaching Tenure at GCU: 9th year
Overall Record at GCU: 155-76

Beginning his ninth season at the helm of the men's basketball program, Leighton McCrary has directed the Antelopes to seven consecutive postseason appearances—one in the NAIA and seven at the NCAA Division II level.

McCrary's clubs were at the top of the Pacific West Conference (formerly the Great Northwest Conference) for four seasons. McCrary was named the Great Northwest Conference Coach of the Year for the 1991-92 season.

Two years ago, the 'Lopes advanced as far as the West Regional semifinals for the second consecutive season.

In addition to his accomplishments with the GCU basketball program, Coach "Mac" has had equal success writing for professional publications and serving as a guest speaker for national coaches clinics.

McCrary, 46, originally from Chicago, spent his playing and coaching career in Arkansas. He earned his bachelor's in Physical Education, while lettering for four seasons in basketball at

Philander Smith College in Little Rock. In 1982, he added a master's in Adaptive Physical Education from the University of Arkansas-Little Rock.



Before arriving at Canyon in 1990, McCrary spent six seasons as the top assistant coach at Arkansas State University. He helped guide the team to three 20-win seasons and three trips to the National Invitational Tournament.

McCrary began his coaching career at East Side High School in Menifee, Ark., where he established a 68-24 record over three seasons. He then assisted at Parkview High School in Little Rock for five seasons before moving on to Arkansas State.

An active participant in AAU basketball, McCrary assisted with the Junior National Olympic men's team in the summer of 1983, touring the Soviet Union.

McCrary and his wife, Jacquelin, reside in Phoenix and have three children: Jami Lyn, Briana and Donovan. McCrary also has a son, Leighton Jr., and a daughter, Shawnee, from a previous marriage.

Norm Karsevar begins his sixth season overall at Mount Olive, leading the team in scoring his final two seasons. He was selected as an honorable mention all-conference member his senior season.



In two of his four years as Coach McCrary's top assistant, the Antelopes advanced as far as the West Region semifinals. He is a graduate from Mount Olive College in North Carolina, where he earned his degree in Business Management.

Karsevar, 32, played basketball for four years at Hale High School in Raleigh.

A native of Miami, Fla., Karsevar graduated from Athens Drive High School (Raleigh, N.C.). Before coming to Canyon, Karsevar coached girls' basketball at Hale High School in Raleigh.

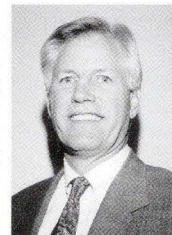

Before his career at San Diego, he coached both boys' and girls' teams at the high school level. Marshall was able to take both his Pomona and San Diego clubs overseas to compete in Australia, China, Denmark, New Zealand and Sweden. He has also produced instructional videos that are produced by Championship Books and Video Productions.



Marshall earned his bachelor's from San Diego State in English Literature and received his secondary teaching credential. He resides in Chandler with his wife, Kathy, and children, Samantha (18), Cameron (16), Kimberly (9), Tommy (8), James (4) and Dominick (1).

1998-99 SEASON OUTLOOK

Men's Basketball

Another trip to the West Regional postseason tournament...another early exit.

That was the all too familiar story for the Grand Canyon University men's basketball team a year ago, as the Antelopes were bounced from the first round of the tournament by a very beatable Cal State Los Angeles team.

The loss left the Canyon players' heads hanging and left head coach **Leighton McCrary** wondering "what could have been" for his team. The tournament became wide open as defending national champion Cal State Bakersfield was stunned in its only game of the tournament by Seattle Pacific. Tournament-host California Davis won the regional and went on to win its first national title.

McCrary has seen his teams qualify for postseason play in each of his eight years at Canyon.

On the bright side for the 'Lopes, they can learn from last year. Unfortunately for the returners, "Coach Mac" is quick to remind them of last season's abrupt end.

"I thought we could have gone farther than we did," McCrary said. "They (returners) should know that it takes a different attitude going into the postseason. It takes an in-depth determination, which is something I can't coach."

Senior guard **Prince Edmonds**, who had never been in a postseason game prior to last year, said the team could have come out a little more relaxed.

The "C Squad"

Despite the disappointment from last season, McCrary said this year's squad is not short on confidence.

"This team's confidence level is tremendous," he said. "They are very hungry to prove to themselves that they are good."

As a way of pumping themselves up, the players have designated themselves as the "C Squad," with the "c" standing for championship.

"A bunch us were sitting around the apartments last year when we came up with 'C Squad,'" Edmonds said, "and it sounded good. That's our ultimate goal anyway, so it stuck.

"I personally will not accept anything less than a national championship."

Depth Chart

Although Edmonds appears to be one of this year's standouts, McCrary said that this team, for the most part, will have a variety of contributors.

"We don't have a go-to guy like we did with the (Jerry) Allens, (Kenny) Archbolds, (Chad) Briscoes and Horacios (Llamas)," McCrary said. "But we do have a group of guys that we can bring to the table who can all contribute."

Guards—Edmonds was second on the team in scoring a year ago with a 11.1 points per game average. The six-foot guard saved his

best for last, posting his first double-double of the season with 21 points and 10 rebounds in the regional loss to Los Angeles.

Enrique Zuniga, from Guadalajara, Mexico, also returns for his second and final season. Zuniga averaged 10.0 points last season, while shooting a team-best 51.3 percent from the floor.

A final returner is **Touré Knighton**, who started 15 games as a freshman last season and averaged 5.0 points and 3.0 rebounds.

New to the club are junior sharp shooters **Spencer Inman** (Phoenix College) and **Kenny Mullins**. McCrary expects the two to play a major role in Canyon's strong perimeter game.

Also added to the mix are points guards **Seneca Hester** and **Melvin Steward**, who begin their respective careers after playing for only one season at the junior college level. Freshman **Rob Cox** (Agua Fria High School) will most likely redshirt this season.

Forwards—One player who is looking for some redemption this season is **Nate Scott**, who had his junior year cut short due to injury. Scott was fourth on the team with his 7.9 scoring average and pulled down 5.2 rebounds per game (2nd on team).

Justin Mora is another member who is hoping to avoid the injury bug. Mora missed the first eight games of the season after recovering from a knee injury. McCrary said the six-foot-five senior is the only one on the roster who can play four different positions.

Juniors **Kwaku Amoaku** and **Quincy Shannon** and freshman **Justin Goodere** are additions.

Post Players—McCrary will look for two returners to step up their game in this area of vulnerability.

Andre Hall was second in the conference in blocked shots last year with 49 (1.8/game), while also averaging 6.1 points and 4.7 boards. **Kelvin Otis** should see some increased playing time. Otis played in all 27 games last year, but averaged only 6.0 minutes per game.

CCAA Expansion

This year, the conference expands to 12 teams with five schools from northern California being added to the fold: California Davis, Chico State, Cal State Stanislaus, San Francisco State and Sonoma State. The result of the merge will be a single-division format. That could change for next season, along with the possible addition of a post-season conference tournament, McCrary said.

Now the six eligible teams that qualify for regionals will come from only two leagues—the CCAA and Pac West. Also, conference play commences one month earlier, forcing teams to get the kinks out earlier than normal.

"(The new CCAA) has its pros and cons," McCrary said. "In the future, we might look to play home-and-home games with the South (members from the original CCAA) and cross with the teams from the North. This would give us more preseason games."

McCrary sees the 'Lopes finishing third or fourth in the CCAA for the upcoming campaign, which should put them right in the thick of regionals and a chance to go where no Canyon team has gone before—the NCAA Elite Eight.

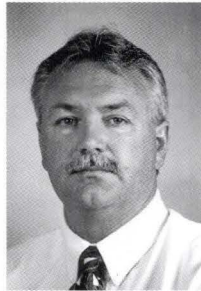

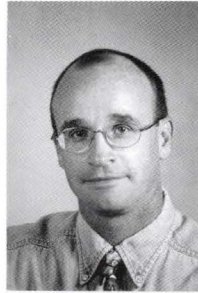
