To The Media

Athletes and coaches are typically available before and after practice. GCU student-athletes are not available for interviews on game days prior to game time. Requests for interviewing a student-athlete at a practice or after a GCU event should be brought to the attention of David Wahlstrom.

Credentials

Working press credentials can be obtained by calling the GCU sports information office 24 hours prior to event time. Working media with credentials have access to the team locker rooms and are provided with a designated seat location at each event.

Event Services

Basketball guides, game notes, lineups and cumulative statistics are furnished prior to each event. Final match statistics also will be available. All information can be obtained by contacting the sports information staff or visiting the sports information office. Telephone and fax services are available after each Grand Canyon event and are located in the sports information office. Media outside the metro Phoenix area may arrange to receive final statistics, an event summary and postgame quotes transmitted via facsimile.

Photographers

Event access will be available to photographers from media outlets which have received credentials from the GCU sports information office.

Radio and Television

Electronic media (radio and television) must obtain contact with the GCU sports information office at least 48 hours in advance to ensure broadcast locations. A limited amount of radio broadcast lines are available and are assigned on a first-come first-served basis.



Head Coach EIGHTON McCRARY

Leighton McCrary is beginning his tenth season at the helm of the GCU Men's

Basketball program, which ties him for third in Canyon history for longevity as Basketball Men's Coach. Prior to last season, Coach "Mac" had directed the Antelopes to seven consecutive postseason



McCrary's clubs were at the top of the Pacific West Conference (formerly Great Northwest Conference) for four seasons. McCrary was named the Great Northwest Conference Coach of the Year for the 1991-92 season.

Three years ago, the 'Lopes advanced as far as the West Regional semifinals for the second consecutive season.

In addition to his accomplishments with the GCU basketball program, Coach Mac has had equal success writing for professional publications and serving as a guest speaker for national coaches clinics.

McCrary, 47, originally from Chicago, spent his playing and coaching career in Arkansas. He earned his bachelor's in Physical Education, while lettering for four seasons in basketball at Philander Smith College in Little Rock.

> In 1982, he added a master's in Adaptive Physical Education from the University of Arkansas-Little Rock.

Before arriving at Canyon in 1990, McCrary spent six seasons as the top

assistant coach at Arkansas State University. He helped guide the team to three 20-win seasons and three trips to the National Invitational Tournament.

McCrary began his coaching career at East Side High School in Menifee, Ark., where he established a 68-24 record over three seasons. He then assisted at Parkview High School in Little Rock for five seasons before moving on to Arkansas

An active participant in AAU basketball, McCrary assisted with the Junior National Olympic men's team in the summer of 1983, touring the Soviet Union.

McCrary and his wife, Jacqulin, reside in Phoenix and have three children: Jami Lyn, Briana and Donovan. McCrary also has a son, Leighton Jr., and a daughter, Shawnece, from a previous mar-

Assistant Coach NORM KARSEVAR

Alma Mater: Mount Olive College, 1990 Tenure at GCU: 7th year

Norm Karsevar begins his seventh season overall at Canyon. In

two of his five years as Coach McCrary's top assistant, the Antelopes advanced as far as the West Region semifinals.

He is a graduate from Mount Olive College in North Carolina, where

he earned his degree in Business Management.

Coach "K" as he is referred to by players and others alike is the key figure in Grand Canyon's post play. Coach K has worked Canyon's big men to prominence since he has been here, including Horacio Llamas who played at Canyon from 1994-96. Llamas became the first Mexican born player to ever play in the NBA.

> In addition to coachin the big men, Coach K plays a vital role in recruiting all the players that come to Canyon.

Coach K, 33, played basketball for four years at Mount Olive, leading

the team in scoring his final two seasons. He was selected as an honorable mention all-conference member his senior season.

A native of Miami, Fla., Coach K graduated from Athens Drive High School (Raleigh, N.C.). Before coming to Canyon, Karsevar coached girls' basketball at Hale High School in Raleigh.

Season Outlook

ADDITION BY MULTIPLICATION

After missing the NCAA Division II West Regional for the first time since leaving the NAIA ranks, Head Coach Leighton McCrary is hoping to gain back some national prominence and looks to do so with numbers. This year's roster shows 18 players on it, each of which hope to make a difference in one way or another to help Coach "Mac" start a new streak of consecutive appearances in Division II's version of the Big Dance.

"We don't have that one person, like in past years, that is considered THE MAN," said McCrary, "we have a bunch of guys who can be THE MEN if they can just gel together." Doing that might be a tough task considering the newcomers that make up the majority of this large roster. Of the 18 players listed on the roster, only six were part of the system last season, and two of those players were redshirts. The theory behind the mass of players is the hope of addition by multiplication. The one struggle with that theory is the lack of knowledge on each other's personality and type of game. Needless to say, chemistry will be a priority heading into the team's first few games.

Despite being new to the Canyon system, every player on the roster knows how to play the game. Of the 12 new players on Canyon's roster there are only two players who are coming right out of the high school ranks. "My biggest challenge right now is to not overcoach, because of their experience I want these young men to just play ball," said McCrary, "I don't want their rationale making a pass to be because that is how we practiced it, I want their pass to come because that is what occasion dictated; to play more on instinct."

THE MEN

The Seniors. Returning this year are three seniors who each played in the majority of games for Grand Canyon last season. Spencer Inman returns as the team's leading three point shooter, as he was able to lead the 'Lopes with his .348 3-pt shooting percentage last season. Kwaku Amoaku returns to help provide that senior leadership that is so invaluable on good collegiate teams.

The Juniors. Of the six Juniors on this year's roster, only one is familiar to Canyon fans, and that player is Toure Knighton. Knighton returns for his junior year as a captain. Given his age (24), and his experience in athletic situations from playing minor league baseball, Knighton will be looked to by most all on the team for guidance and leadership in dealing with the rigors of playing CCAA Basketball night in, and night out. Last season

Knighton averaged 7.0 point and 3.7 rebound per game, but statistics really cannot show what Knighton brings to the table. Kenny Mullins is the lone other returning Junior from last season, however Mullins did redshirt last season. The four other juniors are transfers Kweli Baker (San Jose State), Marques Chin (Shoreline CC), Dan Gottlieb (Santa Monica College), and Zach Miller (Edmonds CC).

The Sophomores. Rarely do you find any college team that has six sophomores on its roster, and none of them have played at the school before. Each of this year's sophomore class are transfers from other four-year colleges and universities. Leading this class are Damon Key, Lee McCowan, Steve Moss-Kelly, and Eddie Turner, with Moss-Kelly and Turner both coming from Eastern Washington. These four figure to factor highly in GCU's success this season. The remaining sophomores are both transferring in from major 4-year universities. Tariq Chaney transfers to Canyon from Arizona State, and Mike Oliver comes to GCU from the University of Tennessee.

The Freshmen. Canyon boasts more freshmen on its roster this season than in any other season in recent history, three. Of these three newcomers, one is returning following a redshirt season last year, Justin Goodere. The other two were highly touted prospects from Phoenix, guard Seth Dittrich, and forward Arthur Daniels. Daniels figures to make the most noise of any freshmen this season due to his stellar high school career at the Phoenix power, Moon Valley High School.

COMPETITION

The CCAA. Once again the CCAA is loaded. The conference that has four National Championships between its schools this decade alone, will once again prove to be a powerhouse. Like so many years in the past Cal State Bakersfield is the hands down favorite to win the conference crown. Coming into the season with a #3 pre-season national ranking, the Roadrunners look poised to make a run at their fourth National Championship this decade. Last years Champions, UC Davis, looks equally strong with two starters returning from last year's squad that went 18-4 in CCAA play. Last year's West Region Champion, Cal State San Bernardino, came out of the CCAA and looks to repeat with two of its starters from a year ago returning. Even if they may not considered a favorite in this league, any team is capable to beat the other team on any giver night. That is why the California Collegiate Athletic Association is often given the distinction as the best collegiate conference in the nation, regardless of division.

50th Anniversary Retrospective

Throughout the storied history of Grand Canyon's history, one thing has remained constant, Basketball. Men's Hoops is the only sport that has been with Grand Canyon since the inception of the institution. There have been many 50 teams that have come through this institution, two of which captured the ultimate victory in collegiate athletics, a National Championship. In 1975, Grand Canyon College captured the school's first National Championship for any sport. Another Championship soon followed as GCU regained the crown in 1978. Both of those clubs were coached by Ben Lindsey who has the most career coaching victories at Canyon with 317. Then again in 1988, led by head coach, Paul Westphal, the Antelopes captured their third NAIA National Championship. Immediately following this championship season, Paul Westphal made the jump to the NBA as an assistant coach for the Phoenix Suns, where he eventually took over as head coach and led them to the


ventually took I them to the NBA Finals in his first season. Currently Westphal is the head coach for the NBA's, Seattle Supersonics.

Throughout Canyon's time as a University Canyon has captured five conference championships, and made seven postseason appearances, including two at the NCAA Div. II West Regional Semi-Finals.

Not only have there been successes at the team level, individual success has


also come to Canyon coaches and players, with two of those played playing in the NBA at one time or another during their professional careers.

The first player to reach such height was Bayard Forrest who played at Canyon from 1972-1976. Forrest played for the Phoenix Suns for two years. Forrest's greatest basketball day for the Suns came on the day his son Adam, who now attends GCU, was born because not only did Forrest welcome a new son into his family, but he also dunked on hall of famer Kareem Abdul-Jabar that evening. While at Canyon, Forrest placed his name on to many Canyon records of which he still holds today. Forrest still holds career records at GCU for career points (2,195), field goals made (911), field goals attempted (1,703), free throws made (373), free throws attempted (534), and most rebounds (1,544).



Currently Forrest is a Pastor and lives in Colorado.

The other player to reach basketball's highest level of play is Horacio Llamas. Llamas was the first Mexican-born played to have ever played in an NBA game. Horacio played for two seasons at Canyon, from 1994-1996. During his senior season at Canyon, Llamas was selected as the Basketball Times NCAA Div. II Player of the Year. A honor that came from his all-around skills and ability to make others miss. During that season Llamas set a GCU record by blocking



106 shots, which pushed his career total to 172, which is also a GCU record.
Currently Llamas is rehabing some nagging injuries and hopes to be playing again the the NBA soon.

If the next fifty years of Canyon Hoops are as exciting and historic as the first fifty, the next generation of those growing up in Phoenix, and the state of Arizona will have many great memories to share with our players of the future.
