# 2000 INFORMATION GUIDE

### To The Media

Any questions or assistance needed in arranging interviews can be obtained by contacting David Wahlstrom, Sports Information Director, at 602/589-2795. Athletes and coaches are typically available before and after practice. GCU student-athletes are not available for interviews on game days prior to game time. Requests for interviewing a student-athlete at a practice or after a GCU event should be brought to the attention of David Wahlstrom.

### Credentials

Working press credentials can be obtained by calling the GCU sports information office 24 hours prior to event time. Working media with credentials have access to the team locker rooms and are provided with a designated seat location at each event.

### Event Services

Men's basketball guides, game notes, lineups and cumulative statistics are furnished prior to each event. Final game statistics will also be available. All information can be obtained by contacting the sports information staff or visiting the sports information office. Telephone and fax services are available after each Grand Canyon event and are located in the sports information office. Media outside the metro Phoenix area may arrange to receive final statistics, an event summary and postgame quotes transmitted via facsimile.

### Photographers

Event access will be available to photographers from media outlets which have received credentials from the GCU sports information office.

### Radio and Television

Electronic media (radio and television) must obtain contact with the GCU sports information office at least 48 hours in advance to ensure broadcast locations. A limited amount of radio broadcast lines are available and are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

# ON THE RISE AGAIN IN PHOENIX

Prominence and excellence are two words that describe men's basketball at Grand Canyon University. Head Coach Leighton McCrary has run a very successful program at Canyon since he first stepped on to the campus back in 1990. Averaging just over 18 wins a season in his previous 10 campaigns, "Coach Mac" has a reputation for putting together teams that are a force to be reckoned with across the nation.

This season looks to be no different. The past two seasons have been lack luster ones for the 'Lopes as they have failed to make the postseason in both years. For a program that never missed a regional bid in Coach McCrary's previous eight campaigns, the past two seasons can be looked at as disappointments. "Sometimes God has a way of stepping in and saying it is not your time," said McCrary in reference to the last two seasons.

The 1999-2000 season featured some outstanding talent, but injuries and the lack of team chemistry laid heavy on the season. What the difference a year makes. Much excitement is in store for the 2000-2001 season. "This year the team is much better, because we are a team; the guys are inseparable, and we have bonds that don't break," said McCrary. "Last year we had a lot of individual talent, but not nearly the amount of camaraderie that this team has," McCrary added. Adding on to that thought said junior captain Eddie Turner, "This is the closest team that I have ever played on at any level, including Division I."

"Goal is an overrated word, we need to focus and have a vision to make ourselves better," said McCrary. "If we get better, then we really have won because we are better individuals in life." McCrary went on to add, "The CCAA, from top to bottom, is the best conference in the nation, it all depends on what

team makes the least amount of mistakes."

This year the team will be led on and off the court by Division II Bulletin Pre-Season All-American, senior Toure Knighton. Knighton is in his fourth year at Canyon and is the undeniable go to guy. "He is the most solid player I have ever coached, he does the little things; rebounds, knows how to get fouled, very consistent things that we will use and ride for as long as we can," said McCrary. Knighton will bring senior leadership on and off the court from his experience of the Coach Mac system, as well as his days in professional baseball with the Texas Rangers system, who selected him in the 4th round of the 1993 amateur draft.

Looking to aid Knighton is junior Eddie Turner and sophomore Arthur Daniels. Turner is in his second season at Canyon after transferring in from Eastern Washington. Turner will continue to be a force down low this year for Canyon after being second on last year's team in points (11.3) and rebounds (5.9). Turner will be looked to be Canyon's big presence in the middle.

Daniels is a sophomore from Phoenix, AZ, in his second year wearing a 'Lopes uniform.

Coming off a very good freshman campaign in which he averaged 5.1 points and 4.1 rebounds per contest. "I want this guy on my side in the fox hole, he is an extremely hard worker who wants to win," McCrary added about his young sensation.

Looking to head up the point guard responsibilities this year is junior Marques Chinn who redshirted last season after transferring to Canyon from Shoreline Community College. "He helped us out a lot last year in practice, and this year he will bring good attributes that will help the team at gametime," said McCrary.

Senior Kweli Baker looks to have a good season following a knee injury limited him to 16 games last season. "He can shoot and rebound, and right

now is getting back into the flow after his injury," said McCrary.

One surprise for the team this year is in the form of junior Chris Costello who transferred from Chaminade to Canyon just to attend school. After being discovered shooting around in the gym by assistant coach Norm Karsevar early in the school year, Chris was persuaded to try out for the team. He discovered a new burning desire to play again, and should see some good minutes.

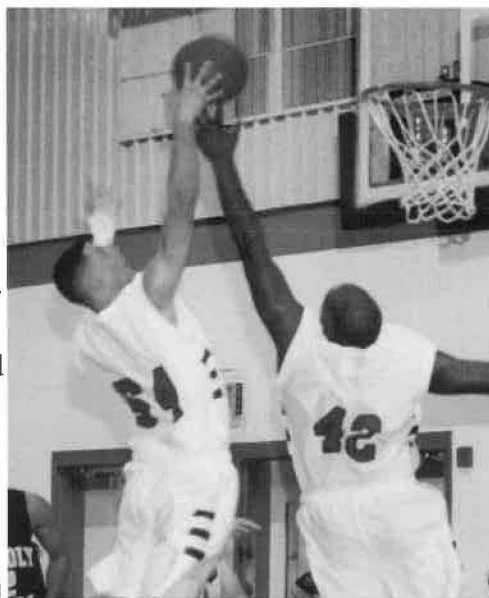
Senior Kenny Mullins has the green light to shoot the three ball at any time while fellow senior Dan Gottlieb will be looked upon for his energy and quickness around the rim for rebounds and blocked shots.

Freshman Jabari Riggins brings a lot of talent from A.C.Davis High School in Yakima, WA. "He knows championship caliber play on the high school level and he knows how to win; he is learning about how to be in control and bring guys together, which is critical as a point guard," said McCrary.

Other new players to the roster this year include junior transfers Jovian Dobrzanski and Matt Swenton. Dobrzanski transfers in from Cuesta College and is a native of Crystal Falls, MI. Recruited as a shooter, Dobrzanski will help a lot with his arsenal, especially from behind the three-point arc. Swenton is a walk-on transfer from South Mountain CC, who is in the process of addressing himself into the McCrary system of basketball.

Walk-on junior John Janssen displayed a great work ethic so far in the pre-season. "He is the hardest worker in practice and I have great respect for hard work," said McCrary.

The 2000-2001 season will be an exciting one for sure. UC San Diego is new to the CCAA after UC Riverside made the jump to Division I ranks, and the Big West

Conference. After very successful campaigns at the Division III level, UC San Diego should play up to CCAA standards. "Everyone is on equal ground, anybody can beat anybody in this conference," said McCrary.

When answering which teams will be looked upon as the teams to beat, Coach Mac had this to say, "Cal State L.A., Cal State Bakersfield and Cal State San Bernardino all have outstanding teams, but in this conference there are no easy games."

Togetherness, unity, and respect are what the 2000-2001 Grand Canyon University Men's Basketball team is about. That along with their talents will carry them through this season. The tough conference that is the

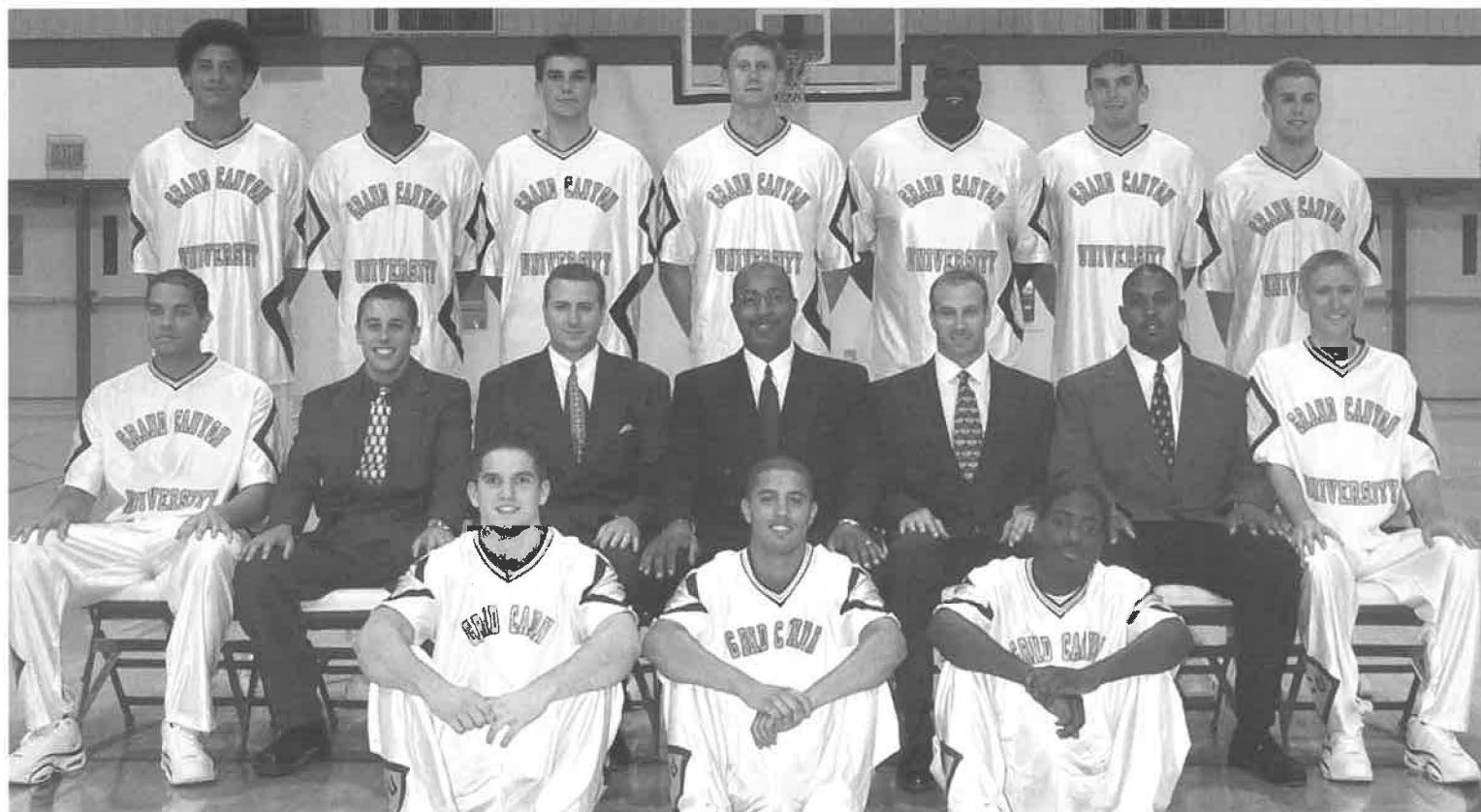
CCAA will have to look to the desert and be wary of a team, that like the mythical bird for which their city is named, will look to rise from the ashes to claim its place among the elite again.

Leighton McCrary is beginning his eleventh season at the helm of the GCU Men's Basketball program, which places him third in Canyon history for longevity as Men's Basketball Coach. Prior to last two seasons, Coach "Mac" directed the Antelopes to eight consecutive postseason appearances—one in the NAIA and seven at the NCAA Division II level.

McCrary's clubs were at the top of the Pacific West Conference (formerly the Great Northwest Conference) for four seasons during that time span. Also, McCrary was named the Great Northwest Conference Coach of the Year for the 1991-92 season. Three years ago, the 'Lopes advanced as far as the West Regional semifinals for the second consecutive season.

Widely respected by his peers, McCrary continues to bring the energy and enthusiasm necessary to be competitive in the CCAA, year in and year out. During Canyon's six seasons in the CCAA, McCrary has yet to finish with a losing conference record, compiling a 54-38 record (.587 winning percentage), in what is considered the premier NCAA Division II conference in the nation. During the first four years in the CCAA, McCrary led the 'Lopes to four consecutive 2nd place regular season finishes, and one conference championship that came at the last CCAA

Championship tournament in 1995.

In addition to his accomplishments with the GCU basketball program, Coach Mac has had equal success writing for professional publications and serving as a guest speaker for national coaches clinics.

McCrary, 48, originally from Chicago, spent his playing and coaching career in Arkansas. He earned his bachelor's in Physical Education, while lettering for four seasons in basketball at Philander Smith College in Little Rock. In 1982, he added a master's in Education from the University of Arkansas-Little Rock.

Before arriving at Canyon in 1990, McCrary spent six seasons as the top assistant coach at Arkansas State University. He helped guide Arkansas State to three 20-win seasons and three trips to the National Invitational Tournament.

A former active participant in AAU basketball, McCrary assisted with the Junior National Olympic men's team in the summer of 1983, touring the Soviet Union.

McCrary and his wife, Jacquelin, reside in Phoenix where they have raised their four older children, Tamiko, Leighton Jr., Jami Lyn, and Briana; and are currently raising their youngest son, Donovan, who was born in 1994.

# COACHING STAFF

## Norm Karsevar

Mount Olive College, 1990  
Tenure at GCU: 8th year



Norm Karsevar begins his eighth season overall at Canyon. In two of his six years as Coach McCrary's top assistant, the Antelopes advanced as far as the West Region semifinals.

Karsevar is a graduate from Mount Olive College in North Carolina, where he earned his degree in Business Management.

Coach "K", as he is referred to by players and others alike, is the key figure in Grand Canyon's post play. Coach K has worked Canyon's big men to prominence since his tenure at Canyon begun in the 1993-94 season. One of Karsevar's most notable students in Horacio Llamas, who played at Canyon from 1994-96. Llamas became the first Mexican born

player to ever play in the NBA.

In addition to coaching the big men, Coach K plays a vital role in recruiting the players that end up committing to Canyon to play ball.

Coach K, 34, played basketball for four years at Mount Olive, leading the team in scoring his final two seasons. He was selected as an honorable mention all-conference member his senior season.

A native of Miami, Fla., Coach K graduated from Athens Drive High School (Raleigh, N.C.). Before coming to Canyon, Karsevar coached girls' basketball at Hale High School in Raleigh.

## Roger Lefebvre

New England College, 1992  
Tenure at GCU: 6th year



Roger Lefebvre returns to Grand Canyon for his third stint and sixth overall year as an assistant coach for the Antelopes.

For the last two seasons Roger was the head women's coach and sports information director at Salem-Teikyo University in West Virginia. During his time at Salem-Teikyo Roger guided the Lady Tigers to double the amount of wins than the two years prior to his arrival.

A native of Rochester, New Hampshire, Roger's first stint with Canyon was just after his graduation from New England College in 1992, as he served on Coach Mac's staff with responsibilities ranging from scouting and film exchange to academic

progress. Immediately following the 1992-93 season, Roger left the Canyon program to take the head assistant position at Clark College in Iowa.

Following his two year stint at Clark College, Roger returned to Canyon for the 1995-96 season and remained with the 'Lopes until taking his first head coaching duties at Salem-Teikyo.

Roger is the youngest of three children, and has just recently received his master's degree in sports science from The United States Sports Academy.

Roger and his wife Susan currently reside in Avondale where they are raising their one year old son, RJ.

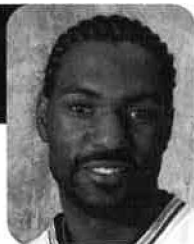

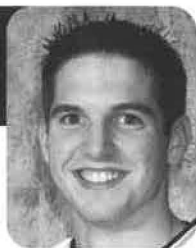

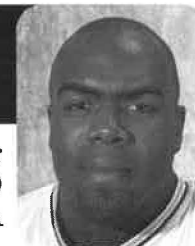

# 1999-2000 REVIEW

The 1999-2000 season was one of streaks for the Grand Canyon University men's basketball program. The season began with the worst start in the programs' history since 1956 (1-6). The season, however quickly turned around as Canyon rattled off twelve wins in their next thirteen contests, including a streak of ten straight games in which the Antelopes came away with a victory. The 'Lopes then finished the season, much of the same way they began it, dropping seven of their last nine games to eliminate any chance of a return to the postseason.

On the year, Canyon had three players average double-figure scoring, led by junior Toure Knighton, who averaged just over 13 points per contest. Sophomore transfer Eddie Turner and Senior sharpshooter Spencer Inman both averaged 11.3 points per contest.

Newcomers Steve Moss-Kelly and Lee McCowan rounded out the top five with 9.6 and 8.2 points per game, respectively. Knighton and Turner also cleaned up on the boards for Canyon, averaging 7.4 and 5.6 per game, respectively. Freshman newcomer, Arthur Daniels had a very good beginning to what should amount to a stellar career, averaging 5.3 points and 4.0 rebounds, while playing in every game last year for the Antelopes. Daniels added a great deal of enthusiasm and athleticism to a team ripe with experience.

Despite a 15-14 overall record, and a 11-11 CCAA mark, Canyon had some positives to take away from the '99-00 season, one thing they did not take away that they will look to remedy in the '00-01 season is a playoff berth.
