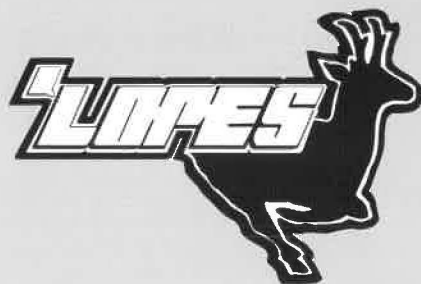

Coaching Staff

Head Coach LEIGHTON MCCRARY

*Alma Mater: Philander Smith College, 1974
Years at Grand Canyon: 13th year
Head Coaching Record: 205-135*

Leighton McCrary is entering his thirteenth season at the helm of the GCU Men's Basketball program, which places him second in Canyon history for longevity as Men's Basketball Coach. Prior to the last four seasons, Coach "Mac" directed the Antelopes to eight consecutive post-season appearances—one in the NAIA and seven at the NCAA Division II level.

McCrary's clubs were at the top of the Pacific West Conference (formerly the Great Northwest Conference) for four seasons during that time span. Also, McCrary was named the Great Northwest Conference Coach of the Year for the 1991-92 season. Six years ago, the 'Lopes advanced as far as the West Regional semifinals for the second consecutive season.

Widely respected by his peers, McCrary continues to bring the energy and enthusiasm necessary to be competitive in the CCAA, year in and year out. During Canyon's eight seasons in the CCAA, McCrary has compiled a 63-51 conference record (.553 winning percentage), in what is considered the premier NCAA Division II conference in the nation. During the first four years in the CCAA, McCrary led the 'Lopes to four consecutive 2nd place regular season finishes, and one conference championship that came during the last CCAA Championship tourna-

ment in 1995.

In addition to his accomplishments with the GCU basketball program, Coach Mac has had equal success writing for professional publications and serving as a guest speaker for national coaches clinics.



McCrary, 50, originally from Chicago, spent his playing and coaching career in Arkansas. He earned his Bachelor's in Physical Education, while lettering for four seasons in basketball at Philander Smith College in Little Rock. In 1982, he added a Master's in Education from the University of Arkansas-Little Rock.

Before arriving to Canyon in 1990, McCrary spent six seasons as the top assistant coach at Arkansas State University. He helped guide Arkansas State to three 20-win seasons and three trips to the National Invitational Tournament.

A former active participant in AAU basketball, McCrary assisted with the Junior National Olympic men's team in the summer of 1983, touring the Soviet Union.

McCrary and his wife, Jacquelin, reside in Phoenix where they have raised their four older children, Tamiko, Leighton Jr., Jami Lyn, and Briana; and are currently raising their youngest son, Donovan, who was born in 1994.

Assistant Coach NORM KARSEVAR

*Alma Mater: Mount Olive College, 1990
Year at Grand Canyon: 10th year*

Norm Karsevar begins his tenth season overall at Canyon. In two of his seven years as Coach McCrary's top assistant, the Antelopes advanced as far as the West Region semifinals.

Karsevar is a graduate from Mount Olive College in North Carolina, where he earned his degree in Business Management.

Coach "K", as players and others refer to him, is the key figure in Grand Canyon's post play. He has worked Canyon's big men to prominence since his tenure at Canyon began in the 1993-94 season. One of Karsevar's most notable students is Horacio Llamas, who played at Canyon from 1994-96. Llamas became the

first Mexican born player to ever play in the NBA.

In addition to coaching the big men, Coach K plays a vital role in recruiting the players that end up committing to Canyon to play ball.



During his college years, he played basketball for four seasons at Mount Olive, leading the team in scoring his final two seasons, and was selected as an honorable mention all-conference member his senior season.

A native of Miami, Fla., Coach K graduated from Athens Drive High School (Raleigh, N.C.). Before arriving to Canyon, Karsevar coached girl's basketball at Hale High School in Raleigh.

2002-03 Season Outlook

After the 2001-02 season the Grand Canyon men's basketball team looks to improve on last year's 10-17 overall record. There are seven players returning to the 2002-03 team and head coach **Leighton McCrary** will be counting on them to bring that experience to the floor. McCrary has also brought in seven new players to fill the roster and anticipates the veterans to teach the newcomers what is expected of them. McCrary wants to get the team intensity level up, "that in itself should get us more wins than last year." He also believes, "We can have the best season possible if the guys maximize their whole being from metal to physical. If they do that, we will be very successful in the upcoming year."

Returners

There are seven veterans on the 2002-03 team and Coach "Mac" is counting on all of them to utilize last years experience to their advantage. Senior guard, **Delano Somers** and junior guard, **Jabari Riggins** will be relied upon to provide leadership to this year's team according to McCrary. Somers returns as Canyon's leading scorer last season averaging 17.8 points per game, while pulling down 5.6 boards per game. Riggins led the squad with

82 assists last year and averaged 5.5 points per game.

Senior guards, **Dante Garner**, **Sean Harris**, and **Ronnie Newman** also return. Garner averaged 5.8 points per game and 4.2 rebounds per game last year. Harris was second on the squad with 62 assists and averaged 8.7 points per game, while Newman saw time in all but two contests.

Rounding out the returners are sophomore forward/center **Murphy Stewart** and senior forward **John Janssen**. Although Murphy saw little playing time last season, Coach Mac plans on Murphy to step up and play this year. Janssen returns for his final season, after appearing in every contest as a junior.

Newcomers

Four of the seven newcomers to Canyon this season are transfers to include: junior guards, **Garrett Brown** (Bakersfield College), and

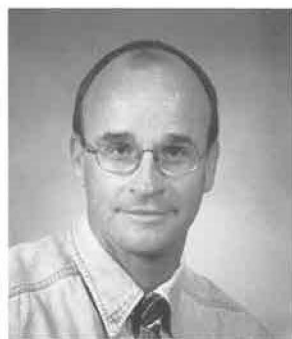
