Credentials

Since space is limited, accommodations are a priority to media that covers GCU Athletics on a regular basis and are a priority to any visiting schools requests. Working media with credentials have access to team locker rooms and are provided a designated seat location at each event.

Notes, lineups cards and cumulative statistics are furnished before each event. Final game stats will be available when complete after the contest.

Wireless Internet, telephone and fax services are available for each Grand Canyon event and are located in the sports information office and athletic venues.

Head Coach Dan Nichols

Arizona State University, 1985

Overall Tenure at GCU: 1st year



Dan Nichols became Grand Canyon University's 11th men's basketball head coach on July 18, 2008.

He came to GCU after spending seven seasons as head coach at South Mountain Community College in Phoenix. Nichols teams went 127-89 at South Mountain, winning three Arizona Community College Athletic Association championships and two region titles.

His 2007-08 SMCC team was ranked No. 5 in the National Junior College Athletic Association Division II polls. The Cougars finished seventh at the NJCAA National Championships.

In 2007-08, Nichols' SMCC team went 25-8 overall, 16-6 in the ACCAC. SMCC went 2-1 at the national tournament. Nichols was named the ACCAC Coach of the Year and the NJCAA District 1 Coach of the Year in 2007-08.

Nichols coached five junior college All-Americans. He coached former Grand Canyon University players Noe Alonzo and Rudy Bogan at SMCC.

In 1999-00, Nichols was an assistant at Cal Baptist University, which went 14-14. From 1995-2001, he coached at Maryvale and Central High Schools in Phoenix, compiling a 66-52 record. His teams made three region tournament appearances and qualified for the state tournament once.

Nichols also worked for Quantitative Scouting from 1999-01, providing offensive analysis and scouting services for NBA teams.

He earned his bachelor's degree in Physical Education from Arizona State University in 1985. Nichols obtained his master's degree in Counselling & Human Relations from Northern Arizona University in 2000.

Assistant Coaches

Joel Taylor



Joel Taylor begins his first year as assistant coach at Grand Canyon University. Taylor was an assistant at Northwest Missouri State for one year, helping the Bearcats get off to a school-record 17-0 start en route to the best record in school history at 29-3. NMSU won the conference championship and conference tournament, advancing to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight for the first time in school history. Taylor was the head coach at Colorado Northwestern Community College for a year and two years as an assistant at Eastern Wyoming College, which won two region and two league titles. Taylor played for two years at Northwest Missouri State, advancing to the NCAA Division II Sweet 16. His team was ranked No. 5 in the nation. The Bearcats went 47-14 during his playing career. He played for two years at Eastern Wyoming College, going 46-22. Taylor was a First Team all-conference selection, and won conference title. An All-State player, Taylor was born in Delta, Utah.

Daven Vo



Daven Vo begins his first season at Grand Canyon. He is in charge of player development, recruiting and game preparation. Vo comes to GCU after serving as the assistant at South Mountain Community College during the 2007-08 season. There he was instrumental in the development of two All-Americans and a 25-8 record that led to a consolation championship at the national tournament. Prior to SMCC, Vo served as a graduate assistant during the 2006-07 season at the University of Oklahoma. He studied under the tutelage of Jeff Capel and assisted in player development. An Oklahoma City native, Vo played at St. Gregory's University. He earned academic and all-conference honors his senior year in the highly competitive Sooner Athletic Conference. He played basketball and tennis at Westmoore High School. The son of The and Houn

Vo, he is the youngest of five.

Larry Watkins



Larry Watkins is in his first year at Grand Canyon. He was an assistant at South Mountain Community College. His duties included film breakdown, advanced scouting and game planning. He will resume that role at GCU. Watkins was the head JV coach at Maryvale H.S., and assisted the varsity program. He ran track & field at SMCC. He is a category manager for Crescent Crown Distributors. He and his wife, Theresa, have three children and reside in Avondale.

Harry Cannon



A former head coach at Scottsdale Community College from 1982-86, Harry Cannon served as an assistant at South Mountain Community College for four years. He will work with the guards at GCU. SCC captured a region title and climbed to a No. 1 national ranking in 1984. Cannon coached Dan Nichols at SCC. He later assisted at Carl Hayden High School, winning three state titles and earning 12 final four appearances. He played at Clarendon Junior College, Abilene Christian and Oregon State. He is a retired counselor in the Phoenix Union High School District.

Corey Wallace



Corey Wallace begins his first year as an assistant at Grand Canyon after serving one year at South Mountain Community College. He is in charge of monitoring student-athletes progress, and will assist at practice. Wallace earned Defensive MVP honors at SMCC in 2001. He is a graduate of Tucson Cholla High School. Wallace has been in charge of the Mesa Summer Pro-Am league since 2006. He is the owner of VIP Enterprises, a promotional company that sponsors many events in the Valley.

The on-campus facility is a school color-coordinated Purple & Black 2,000-seat capacity venue, and is a part of a larger facility that encompasses the Old Antelope Gymnasium. The Antelopes been fortunate to display their share of banners in Antelope Gym, remembering national and league championship seasons.

The newer gym was also the site of a celebrity basketball game headlined by the likes of Magic Johnson and Deion Sanders, as part of the Super Bowl XXX festivities in Phoenix in 1996.

The Phoenix Suns have used Antelope Gymnasium for private workouts. University of Arizona's Head Basketball Coach Lute Olsen also used the facility for one of his many successful basketball coaching videos.

Season Outlook

Maybe the best part about this team is the unknown.

“We’re an unknown quantity,” Grand Canyon first-year coach Dan Nichols said. “That’s a good thing because anything could happen.”

Grand Canyon is new in so many ways this year. A completely new coaching staff with 10 new players signals a lot of question marks. But they are question marks not only are the Lopes unsure of, but the rest of the Pacific West Conference as well. That only makes it more difficult for opponents trying to gauge what kind of deck the Antelopes are playing with.

“I know it’s a great league with some outstanding teams and excellent coaches,” Nichols said. “I think everybody’s wondering what we might do.”

For starters, Grand Canyon will have a new look on the floor, not only in terms of personnel, but in its brand of basketball. Nichols is preaching an emphasis on the defensive end with a physical, bruising element and get-after-it approach on the boards.

“We’ll control the tempo to our liking,” Nichols said.

Grand Canyon will use multiple defenses, a pressing style, ball control within its passing game and stress a more selective approach shooting.

“It’s more of a classic basketball style, running down the court when numbers present themselves, and if not, getting the ball set up,” Nichols said. “You’ll see everything you normally see, but the emphasis won’t be on shooting the ball quickly. We have spectacular dunkers like Eric Cuen and Engen Nurumbi, who can fly.

“The dedication to the defensive end is something they’re going to have to get a hold of.”

Last year, the Antelopes went 12-15, allowing 73.6 points per game. If Nichols and his staff have their way, those numbers will reverse on the wins and losses end, and shrink in terms of points allowed.

So how do they accomplish that?

Center Mike Golleher, a sophomore from Scottsdale Community College, is expected to be a presence on the defensive end.

“We feel like Mike Golleher is going to be the strongest player, physically, in the league, but we’re going to need someone to back him up,” Nichols said. “He’ll be able to defend the post and rebound.”

Nurumbi, a senior who transferred from the University of Minnesota two years ago but sat out last season, is another big body in the post. His offensive skills could be one of the bigger surprises in the league if he puts his mind to it. Junior college transfer Dave Cuen is another newcomer with a proven track record, and could help on both ends of the floor. Returners Milee Karre and Brandon Dempster already have a feel for the league, and have proven they can score at this level. Eric Cuen had a successful junior college career, and could provide a nice lift as a reserve or starter.

“Dave Cuen and Engen Nurumbi, they’ll provide plenty of punch,” Nichols said. “I expect that Milee and Brandon will bring leadership. The Cuen brothers were extremely successful junior college players, and Engen can be as talented as anybody around.”

Karre’s experience at the guard play will be invaluable to a team getting its feet wet in so many ways. Nichols may use Dempster at the guard spot, alongside Karre. Shansan Chambers played sparingly two years ago with GCU, and has a feel for the game. Nichols may also lean on newcomers Dane Hill, Kevin Daugherty and Brandon McGruder at the guard spot.

“I don’t think I’ve had this many perimeter shooters since I’ve been coaching,” Nichols said. “Three-point shooting should be one of our strong points.”

So if the Antelopes get production out of the guard play and adhere to a physical, defensive game, this could be a season full of close games.

“I think we’re going to play almost everybody tight, and if we shoot well from the line, we’ll win,” Nichols said. “I think you’re going to see a lot of close ballgames that will be won at the free throw line.

“The emphasis is going to be on rebounding, defense and physical play. That’s something we know we can do.”

2007-08 Statistics

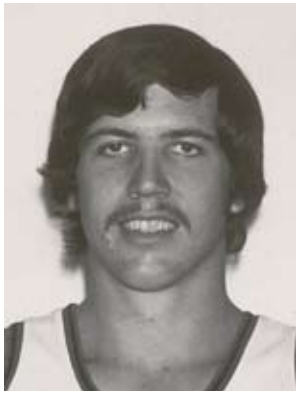

Grand Canyon to Grand Stage

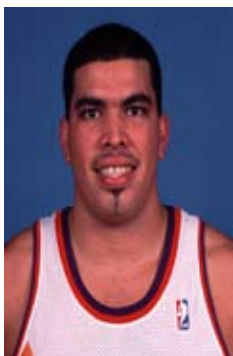
Bayard Forrest



Bayard Forrest became the first Antelope to go from Grand Canyon University to the NBA. He played for the Phoenix Suns from 1977-1979. Forrest played in 139 regular season games and 15 playoff games before retiring in 1980 with a back injury. He averaged 4.1 points and 4.1 rebounds, logging 15.3 minutes per game in his two seasons with the Suns. The Suns

made a playoff appearance each season Forrest was in the NBA. Forrest was a member of Grand Canyon's team from 1972-1976, and still has his name atop many of the school records. His 2,195 career points and 1,544 career rebounds have been untouchable since his departure from campus in 1976. Forrest also has the career marks in field goals made and free throws made. In addition to his career rebound record, he holds three of the top five rebounding season total high marks, his school-record 420 set in the 1972-73 season when he was a freshman. In 1974-75, Forrest helped lead the 'Lopes to their first of three NAIA National Championships. He was a three-time NAIA First Team All-American from 1974-76. The Forrest tradition continued at GCU with his youngest daughter Mandy attending the school on a volleyball scholarship. Mandy was a four-year volleyball letterwinner, and in 2003 earned First Team All-California Collegiate Athletic Association honors.

Horacio Llamas



Horacio Llamas joined Bay Forrest as the second Antelope to jump to the NBA ranks as a player. He was a member of the Phoenix Suns from 1996-1998. Llamas became the First Mexican born player to play in the NBA. Llamas hailed from El Rosrio Sinaloa, Mexico. He played in 28 games over his two-year NBA career, seeing time in 20 games during the 1997-1998 season. Llamas was a two-year letterwinner at GCU from 1994-96. During his senior year, Llamas earned Basketball Times Division II Player of

the Year honors, in addition to being named a First Team All-American.

Llamas holds two blocked shot records at GCU, and had 172 in his two years. His 106 blocks in a season and 10 in a game remain as school bests. Llamas earned First Team All-CCAA honors twice, and was MVP of the CCAA Tournament in 1995.

John Shumate



John Shumate had a five-year career in the NBA with the Buffalo Braves, Phoenix Suns, Detroit Pistons, Houston Rockets, San Antonio Spurs and Seattle SuperSonics. He averaged 12.3 points and 7.5 rebounds in his NBA career. He was named to the NBA all-rookie squad in 1975-76. A college player at Notre Dame, Shumate coached at Grand Canyon University from

1983-1986, compiling a 58-33 record that included two trips to the postseason. Shumate also served as an assistant coach at Notre Dame for two seasons prior to taking the GCU job and two seasons after leaving GCU. Following his second stint as assistant coach at Notre Dame, Shumate was named head coach at Southern Methodist University in 1988. He then returned to the NBA as an assistant coach with the Toronto Raptors in 1995. In 1998, he joined the Suns community relations staff before being named a Suns college scout in 2001. In 2003, Shumate coached the Phoenix Mercury of the WNBA. In 2004, he returned to the Suns staff as a college scout.

Paul Westphal



Paul Westphal enjoyed a 12-year NBA career with the Celtics, Suns, Knicks and the SuperSonics before joining GCU as the Head Coach of the basketball program in 1986. He was an NBA All-Star. In two years as head coach at GCU, Westphal went 63-18 and won the NAIA National Championship in 1988. In 1993, Westphal was named Head Coach of the Phoenix Suns. The

Suns went 62-20 his first season, losing to the Chicago Bulls in the NBA Finals. Westphal coached seven seasons in the NBA, compiling a 267-159 record for a .626 winning percentage with the Suns and SuperSonics. Westphal later coached at Pepperdine University from 2001-06. In 2007, he was named as an assistant coach with the Dallas Mavericks.

Grand Canyon Greats

Ben Lindsey, GCU's all-time winningest coach, coached the USA Men's Basketball Olympic Festival West Team in 1978.



Lindsey's teams went 317-137 (.698) from 1965-81 at Grand Canyon University. His Antelope teams won two NAIA national championships, going 30-3 each year in 1974-75 and 1977-78. His team's run to the 1978

national title featured an 88-82 five-overtime win over Central State in the NAIA quarterfinals.
