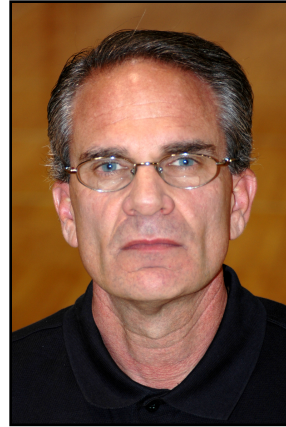

Scott Mossman returned to Grand Canyon University in 2004 for what became his third stint with the Antelopes and first as head men's basketball coach. Mossman graduated from Phoenix Sunnyslope High School in 1976 before continuing his basketball playing career at Scottsdale Community College. After two seasons at SCC, he moved onto Mid-America Nazarene University in Olathe, Kan., where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education in 1982. In addition to his coaching duties, Mossman is also the co-founder and president of Quantified Scouting Services, which provides unique statistical analysis for NBA teams.

Mossman resides in Phoenix with his wife Debbie and daughter Sarah.

**2006-07 Season**

Mossman restored life in Grand Canyon men's basketball program in 2006-07. In his third year at the helm, he guided GCU to a 21-8 record, Pacific West Conference title and NCAA Division II West Region semifinal appearance. The Antelopes found themselves ranked fifth in the NCAA West Region. They tripped up Seattle Pacific in the first round of the postseason before falling to West Region No. 1 seed Humboldt State. It marked GCU's first trip to the postseason in nine years. Mossman was named the PacWest Coach of the Year.

**2005-2006 Season**

Mossman's second season was a vast improvement over the 2004-05 season. In his second year, he guided Grand Canyon to a 19-8 record, bettering his first season by six wins, eight fewer losses and a .256 win percentage hike. GCU spent most of the season ranked in the Top 25 -- the first time the 'Lopes saw their name in the polls since 1997, and their 92.5 points per game ranked third in the nation. Mossman earned NCAA Division II Independent Coach of the Year honors.

**2004-05 Season**

Mossman helped GCU to a tremendous turnaround in his first year as head coach. He took a team that was 3-24 the previous season and steered the Antelopes to a 13-16 mark. Three of those losses came at the hands of Fresno State, South Florida and Utah Valley. The 10-win improvement marked the first time in three years GCU reached double-digit win totals.



## Assistant Coach Matt Spivey

Matt Spivey enters his third year as an assistant coach at Grand Canyon. He was a member of the 2006-07 Antelope team's return to the NCAA postseason. Spivey is responsible for player skill development, administrative and recruiting duties and oversees academic progress. Prior to coaching at GCU, Spivey served as a coach at Westwood High School in Fort Pierce, Fla., for three years. Spivey played collegiately at Bethel College in Mishawaka, Ind., and was a member of the 1998 NAIA National Championship team. He has a Master's Degree in English/Literature from Northern Arizona University. Spivey lives in Phoenix.



## Assistant Coach Casey Weitzel

Casey Weitzel enters his third year as assistant coach at Grand Canyon. He plays an active role in recruiting and also handles administrative duties. Weitzel was part of GCU's return to the postseason in 2006-07. Prior to his coaching days at Grand Canyon, Weitzel coached at Issaquah High School in Washington in the summer of 2004. He played on GCU's junior varsity team in 2004-05, and was the varsity team manager that season. Weitzel played at Issaquah High School, where his dad served as an assistant varsity coach. Weitzel lives in Peoria.



## Assistant Coach Mike Grothaus

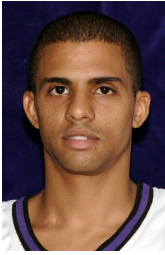
Mike Grothaus is a first-year assistant coach at Grand Canyon. He is responsible for film exchange, scout team, recruiting and administrative duties. His coaching experience also extends to the club level in Gilbert, Ariz., from 2004-06. Grothaus played three years at Grand Canyon from 2004-07, and was part of the Antelopes 2006-07 squad that went 21-8, advancing to the NCAA Division II West Regional. Prior to his playing career at GCU, he played one season at Jamestown College in North Dakota. He played for Gilbert High School, which won an Arizona state championship in 2003. Grothaus lives in Phoenix.



## Assistant coach Sam Ballard

Sam Ballard is a first-year assistant coach with the Antelopes. He coached at Mountain Pointe High School for 10 years, advancing to the semifinals once and quarterfinals four times, in addition to winning four region championships. Ballard also coached at Camelback High School for seven seasons, advancing to the state tournament three times. He also had coaching stops at Phoenix College, Paradise Valley High School, Yavapai

College and Judson High School. He won the 1980 Arizona Independent Athletic Association state championship with Judson, and won AIAA Coach of the Year honors that same year. He won region Coach of the Year honors in 1995, 1998, 2001, 2004 and 2005. He was the All-Arizona Coach of the Year (*The Arizona Republic*) and the East Valley Coach of the Year (*East Valley Tribune*) in 1998. He was the Arizona Coach of the Year (ArizonaVarsity.com) in 2006. He and his wife, Brigitte, have three children, Jordan, Morgan and Derrick, and reside in Phoenix.



## Assistant coach Ryan Nelson

Ryan Nelson joined Grand Canyon's basketball coaching staff in 2007. He is responsible for player development duties. Nelson worked as a developmental coach for Precision Hoops in North Phoenix for two years. Nelson played two seasons at Grand Canyon, setting the school's game (20) and season (263) assist records in 2006-07. That same year, Nelson led all NCAA divisions in assists average (9.7). His 20 assists in a single game also matched the NCAA's best for the three divisions that season. Nelson played at St. Mary's (Calif.) College and Glendale Community College after completing his high school career at Avondale Westview High School in 2001. Nelson lives in Phoenix.

*Antelope Gymnasium opened in 1994 and hosts all of Grand Canyon University's NCAA contests in Volleyball, Men's and Women's Basketball and dozens of amateur tournaments, concerts and other year-round events.*



The on-campus facility is a school color-coordinated Purple & Black 2,000-seat capacity venue, and is a part of a larger facility that encompasses the Old Antelope Gymnasium. The Antelopes been fortunate to display their share of banners in Antelope Gym, remembering national and league championship seasons.



The newer gym was also the site of a celebrity basketball game headlined by the likes of Magic Johnson and Deion Sanders, as part of the Super Bowl XXX festivities in Phoenix in 1996.

The Phoenix Suns have used Antelope Gymnasium for private workouts. University of Arizona's Head Basketball Coach Lute Olsen also used the facility for one of his many successful basketball coaching videos.

The facility is located on the northwest corner of campus at 3300 W. Camelback Rd., Phoenix, Arizona.

# 2007 Season Outlook

**G**one are the names Westphal and Llamas, both who found spots in the NBA, the former now reemerging in the game's brightest lights.

Gone are the glory days of the 1988 NAIA national championship when then-coach Paul Westphal, now a Dallas Mavericks assistant, was in charge. Gone is the big guy Horacio Llamas, who had a cup of Joe in the NBA. Gone is the 1974-75 Antelopes team that went 30-3 to win an NAIA national title.

But not all is gone. In fact, what Grand Canyon University men's basketball team can hang its head on is trailed the Antelopes all which ended with a trip Division II regional the first time in nine Antelopes advanced to this year's Antelopes who played a role in national title, and an man who could write story one day.

Coach Scott ties to Grand Canyon some of the finer program's successful program in search of a last year. GCU won the Conference and then game of the West Arcata, Calif., beating before falling to No. 1 State.

“Rudy Bogan, obviously I’m expecting big things from him,” Mossman said. But it’s more than just Bogan. It has to be, what with the facelift GCU will see to its lineup cards this season. “I got so many new faces this year,” Mossman said.

Faces that cannot compare to yesteryear’s heroes quite yet, but names, nonetheless, that carry a world of potential.

Senior transfer center Brad Kanis, a 7-foot-2, 240-pound enforcer on the defensive end from Southern Utah, is the tallest player ever recruited to GCU. He set a school record with 10 blocks against Utah Valley last year. Kanis will apply for a fifth year of eligibility.

“Brad is athletically gifted,” Mossman said. “He has good hands. We are excited about the opportunity to coach him and continue his development.”

## Postseason party plans anyone?

When Scott Mossman took over as head coach four years ago, he wanted to instill some excitement back into Grand Canyon's proud basketball program. Let them run, he figured. Let them run.

For two seasons, the Antelopes have been running. Heck, there's even green and yellow shirts circulating around campus that claim, "Nothing runs like a 'Lope." Maybe that was never more apparent than last season when the Antelopes ran to new heights in the West, returning to the NCAA Division II postseason for the first time in nine years en route to a 21-win season.

It was a journey that witnessed the 'Lopes running to Arcata, Calif., for a date in the NCAA postseason dance. But it wasn't just a quick sprint. The Antelopes pinned Seattle Pacific with an 87-65 opening round NCAA playoff win on March 9, 2007, to extend their stay in the postseason party.

"It was incredible," Mossman said. "It's not too often that a Division II school plays a playoff game where people are camped out overnight waiting for tickets. But that's the kind of scene it was.

"That's the kind of atmosphere I hope we can have here at Grand Canyon this year."

Following the win over Seattle Pacific – a win that Chaminade assistant coach Mo Maggiolino said, "Grand Canyon went in there and smacked Seattle Pacific," – the Antelopes saw their season come to a close in a 95-81 loss to Humboldt State.

"We felt like we walked away with our heads high out of that tournament," Mossman said.

Not since the 1997-98 season when the Antelopes finished 17-10, bowing out in the first round of the NCAA

West Regional in a loss to Cal State Los Angeles, had a Grand Canyon team advanced to the postseason. GCU is still in search of its first regional championship at the NCAA Division II level.

"I guess if you're writing the perfect script or the perfect plan, the escape from the regional playoffs or advancing to the Elite Eight is what we're looking for," Mossman said.

Grand Canyon won three national championships while competing at the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics level. The banners in Antelope Gymnasium relive those magical seasons: 1974-75, 1977-78 and 1987-88. And while Grand Canyon is 20 years removed from a national title on the hardwood, the excitement that returned to Purple, Black & White basketball last year can't be mistaken.

"I think we're getting there," Mossman said.



Last year didn't begin exactly the way the Antelopes hoped for. In fact, after a 4-2 start, GCU found itself asking lots of questions following a 44-point loss at Cal State San Bernardino.

"It was one of the worst losses in my coaching career," Mossman said. "I kind of thought the season was teetering on the brink a little bit. But we kind of regrouped."

A 5-1 showing in Hawaii on two separate Pacific West Conference trips restored more belief. More belief that this team was for real, considering the difficulties of playing in Hawaii. After all, it is a long flight, and PacWest member Chaminade doesn't host the nationally-televised Maui Invitational for nothing.

The second leg of the Hawaii contests in which the Antelopes went 3-0, with back-to-back wins over Chaminade, was only part of a 10-game win streak the 'Lopes used to close the season. The win streak was the longest since Grand Canyon ran off 10 in a row in the 1999-2000 campaign.

"I think we really established ourselves as one of the powers in the conference," Mossman said. "We made every big play we needed to make. In a lot of ways, it was one of my most satisfying seasons. They were a tough group, and they knew how to win. I was really proud of my seniors. They deserved everything they earned last year."

That doesn't mean the party has to end.

"Every year our goal is to play an up-tempo game," Mossman said. "We want to kind of establish that as our identity this year. Get up and down the floor and play an exciting brand of basketball for the Antelope fans."

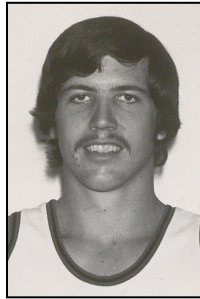

# Grand Canyon to Grand Stage

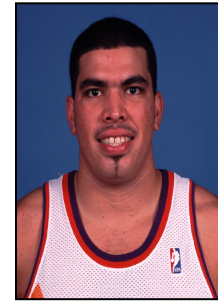
## Bayard Forrest

Bayard Forrest became the first Antelope to go from Grand Canyon University to the NBA. He played for the Phoenix Suns from 1977-1979. Forrest played in 139 regular season games and 15 playoff games before retiring in 1980 with a back injury. He averaged 4.1 points and 4.1 rebounds, logging 15.3 minutes per game in his two seasons with the Suns. The Suns made a playoff appearance each season Forrest was in the NBA. Forrest was a member of Grand Canyon's team from 1972-1976, and still has his name atop many of the school records. His 2,195 career points and 1,544 career rebounds have been untouchable since his departure from campus in 1976. Forrest also has the career marks in field goals made and free throws made. In addition to his career rebound record, he holds three of the top five rebounding season total high marks, his school-record 420 set in the 1972-73 season when he was a freshman. In 1974-75, Forrest helped lead the 'Lopes to their first of three NAIA National Championships. He was a three-time NAIA First Team All-American from 1974-76. The Forrest tradition continued at GCU with his youngest daughter Mandy attending the school on a volleyball scholarship. Mandy was a four-year volleyball letterwinner, and in 2003 earned First Team All-California Collegiate Athletic Association honors.



## Horacio Llamas

Horacio Llamas joined Bay Forrest as the second Antelope to jump to the NBA ranks as a player. He was a member of the Phoenix Suns from 1996-1998. Llamas became the First Mexican born player to play in the NBA. Llamas hailed from El Rosrio Sinaloa, Mexico. He played in 28 games over his two-year NBA career, seeing time in 20 games during the 1997-1998 season.



Llamas was a two-year letterwinner at GCU from 1994-96. During his senior year, Llamas earned *Basketball Times* Division II Player of the Year honors, in addition to being named a First Team All-American. Llamas holds two blocked shot records at GCU, and had 172 in his two years. His 106 blocks in a season and 10 in a game remain as school bests. Llamas earned First Team All-CCAA honors twice, and was MVP of the CCAA Tournament in 1995.

## John Shumate

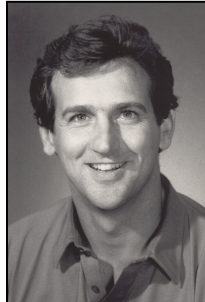
John Shumate had a five-year career in the NBA with the Buffalo Braves, Phoenix Suns, Detroit Pistons, Houston Rockets, San Antonio Spurs and Seattle SuperSonics. He averaged 12.3 points and 7.5 rebounds in his NBA career. He was named to the NBA all-rookie squad in 1975-76. A college player at Notre Dame, Shumate coached at Grand Canyon University from 1983-1986, compiling a 58-33 record that included two trips to the postseason. Shumate also served as an assistant coach at Notre Dame for two seasons prior to taking the GCU job and two seasons after leaving GCU. Following his second stint as assistant coach at Notre Dame, Shumate was named head coach at Southern Methodist University in 1988. He then returned to the NBA as an assistant coach with the Toronto Raptors in 1995. In 1998, he joined



the Suns community relations staff before being named a Suns college scout in 2001. In 2003, Shumate coached the Phoenix Mercury of the WNBA. In 2004, he returned to the Suns staff as a college scout.

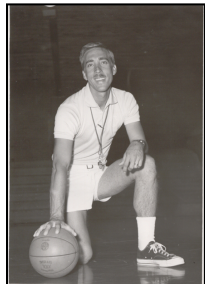
## Paul Westphal

Paul Westphal enjoyed a 12-year NBA career with the Celtics, Suns, Knicks and the SuperSonics before joining GCU as the Head Coach of the basketball program in 1986. He was an NBA All-Star. In two years as head coach at GCU, Westphal went 63-18 and won the NAIA National Championship in 1988. In 1993, Westphal was named Head Coach of the Phoenix Suns. The Suns went 62-20 his first season, losing to the Chicago Bulls in the NBA Finals. Westphal coached seven seasons in the NBA, compiling a 267-159 record for a .626 winning percentage with the Suns and SuperSonics. Westphal later coached at Pepperdine University from 2001-06. In 2007, he was named as an assistant coach with the Dallas Mavericks.



## Other Grand Canyon highlights

Ben Lindsey, GCU's all-time winningest coach, coached the USA Men's Basketball Olympic Festival West Team in 1978. Lindsey's teams went 317-137 (.698) from 1965-81 at Grand Canyon University. His Antelope teams won two NAIA national championships, going 30-3 each year in 1974-75 and 1977-78. His team's run to the 1978 national title featured an 88-82 five-overtime win over Central State in the NAIA quarterfinals.
