### Did you know? ...

The SEC is one of just two conferences in the nation to have all of its teams ranked at least one week in the AP top 25 since 1999-2000.

- The RPI has ranked the SEC the No.1 overall conference in all of college basketball in five of the past 12 seasons.

- Every SEC team has played in the NCAA Tournament at least once since the 2002 season.

- The SEC record for most Sweet 16 appearances in an NCAA Tournament is four set in 1986 when Auburn, Alabama, Kentucky and LSU advanced past the first two rounds and in 1996 when Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky and Mississippi State did it.

- Eight SEC players were chosen in the 2012 NBA Draft. Over the last five NBA Drafts, 35 SEC players have heard their names called. Seven were chosen in 2010.

- 400 former SEC players have been selected in the NBA Draft since 1949.
- 110 players have been taken in the NBA Draft since 1990, including 12 in 2012, eight in 2007 and seven each in 2010, 2005 and 2004.
- 55 players have been selected in the first round of the NBA Draft since 1990.
- 29 players chosen as lottery picks in the NBA Draft since the Draft Lottery was incepted in 1985, including four in 2010 and three in both 2012 and 2007.

## Did you know? ...


- The SEC has captured 11 NCAA Championships and four NIT titles, putting the SEC as one of the nation's top basketball conferences.
- The SEC led all other conferences with five NBA All-Star selections in 2010 in Atlanta's Joe Johnson and Al Horford and Boston's Rajon Rondo.
- Each of the 126 conference games will be televised live as part of the SEC's historic 15-year agreements with CBS Sports and ESPN that began in 2009-10.
- National coverage of the SEC Basketball Tournament has been expanded with the semifinals and championship game broadcast on ESPN on ABC. The SEC Network and ESPN3 will televise the first two rounds of the tournament March 13-17 in Nashville. The SEC Network, ESPNU and ESPN3 will televise the quarterfinals.





# 1985 SEC Tournament Champions

Gerald White calmly sank two free throws with 10 seconds left in overtime to give eighth-seeded Auburn its first SEC Tournament Championship. The Tigers, who reached the 20-win plateau for the second straight year, became the first team win four games in four days in SEC Tournament history. Frank Ford punctuated Auburn's upset win with a slam dunk at the buzzer. Auburn, which scored the first basket of the game, didn't regain the lead until the closing seconds of overtime. Two free throws by Buck Johnson gave Alabama a 46-40 lead with 7:36 left in regulation. Ford hit the front end of a one-and-one to cut the Tide lead to 49-47 with 58 seconds left. A baseline jumper by Ford with :10 left sent the game into overtime tied at 49. Auburn limited starters Buck Johnson and Bobby Lee Hurt to just eight second half points, all from the free throw line. Tournament MVP Chuck Person scored 12 of his game-high 16 points in the first half. Auburn defeated Ole Miss 68-60 in the SEC Tournament first round, beat LSU 58-55 in the quarterfinals and slipped by Florida 43-42 in the semifinals.






# 1985 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16





# No 32 Rex Frederick Retired Jersey




Rex Frederick (1957-59), pictured at midcourt, had his #32 Auburn jersey retired Mar. 4, 2006. The Birmingham, Ala., native was a Helms Athletic Foundation selection in 1959 and was a three-time All-SEC selection. He is Auburn's all-time leading rebounder with 14.3 rebounds per game while his 904 career rebounds ranks fifth on the Tigers' all-time rebounding chart. Frederick left as Auburn's all-time leading rebounder and scorer with 937 points.

# No 15 John Mengelt Retired Jersey



John Mengelt (1969-71) became the first Tiger to have his Auburn jersey retired (#15), January 6, 2001. He played only three varsity years, finishing his career as Auburn's all-time leading scorer with 1,920 points. An All-American and All-SEC selection, Mengelt's 60 points vs. Alabama is still an AU record.

Chuck Person (#45) and his brother Wesley Person (#11) both had their jerseys retired Feb. 18, 2006. Chuck Person (1983-86) was a two-time All-American in 1985 and 1986 and a three-time first-team All-SEC selection. "The Rifleman" is Auburn's all-time scoring leader with 2,311 points (without the 3-point shot). The Brantley, Ala., native led the Tigers to their greatest run in history reaching the 1986 NCAA Tournament Elite Eight with wins over No. 1 seeded St. John's and fourth-seeded UNLV before falling to eventual National Champion Louisville.
