2021-22 PRESEASON NOTES

Alabama welcomes back 10 letterwinners from last season's 26-7 squad that finished 16-2 during SEC play and went on to sweep both the conference regular season and tournament championships. However, of the 10 returnees, only one starter is back from that squad in All-SEC performer Jaden Shackelford.

In addition to earning second-team accolades from the league's head coaches, Shackelford brings a wealth of experience and leadership to the 2021-22 squad, having played in 64 games (51 starts) across his two seasons. That will certainly be needed as head coach Nate Oats welcomes in five newcomers on this year's team as he looks to replace four starters from a year ago. In addition to the newcomers, redshirt freshman Alex Tchikou, who is coming off an achilles injury that forced him to redshirt last season, returns to suit up for the 2021-22 campaign.

Despite losing four starters, the Crimson Tide does return its top two scorers in Shackelford (14.0 ppg) and junior Jahvon Quinerly (12.9 ppg). Both Shackelford (63-of-184) and Quinerly (52-of-120) ranked among the league leaders in total threes made, while Quinerly led the team in three-point field goal percentage at 43.3 percent. Also returning is senior guard Keon Ellis, who is poised to have a breakout season in 2021-22. Despite averaging 5.5 points a game last year, Ellis shot 50.4 percent (60-of-119) from the floor and 38.9 percent (21-of-54) for beyond the arc, both of which ranked second on the team. He is also the leading returning player in both rebounds (4.0 rpg) and steals (35) per game.

Oats will also rely on a pair of veteran newcomers in transfers Noah Gurley and Nimari Burnett to help ignite one of the nation's most potent offenses. Gurley is a graduate transfer who comes to Tuscaloosa after having played in 88 games and made 83 starts across his three seasons at Furman. The Fayetteville, Ga., native finished his career with the Paladins as a three-time All-SoCon performer. Last season, Gurley averaged 15.4 points, 2.5 assists and 5.8 rebounds on his way to earning second team All-SoCon honors.

Burnett, who is the sixth transfer Oats has signed at Alabama, played in just 12 games at Texas Tech a year ago. The 6-4 shooting guard was a five star prospect according to ESPN and a four-star by Rivals and 247sports. Notably, he had the Crimson Tide among his final list as a high school senior before ultimately opting to go to Texas Tech.

In addition to the transfers, Oats welcomes a trio of highly-rated freshmen to campus this year in five star signee JD Davison and a pair of four-star prospects in Charles Bediako and Jusaun Holt.

As has been the norm as Oats enters his third season at The Capstone, Alabama has a challenging non-conference slate which is highlighted by playing three of last year's NCAA Final Four teams. UA will take on defending national champion Baylor in the Big 12/SEC Challenge (Jan. 29), national runner up Gonzaga for the Battle in Seattle (Dec. 4) and Final Four participant Houston (Dec. 11) in non-league action. The Tide will also participate in the ESPN Events Invitational in Orlando (Nov. 26-28), which features teams such as Dayton, Kansas and Iona - the Tide's first round opponent. Alabama's lone true road contest will be a tough challenge against Memphis inside the FedExForum.

Oats enters his third season at the helm of the Crimson Tide program in 2021-22. Coming off of last year's record-setting campaign, Oats has compiled a record of 42-22 (.656) at The Capstone. He owns a career record of 138-65 (.680) through six seasons as a D-I head coach, which include four years as the head coach at Buffalo.

Alabama led the nation in three-pointers made (348) and attempted (989) as well as total rebounds (1,343) during the 2020-21 season.

Alabama ranked second in the nation in average possession length (14.2), third in three-pointers per game (10.5) and 11th in adjusted tempo (73.3 possessions per game).

The Crimson Tide clinched the program's eighth regular season SEC title with its victory at Mississippi State and seventh SEC Tournament championship.

Alabama has officially made eight Sweet 16 appearances in program history (the 1987 team had its Sweet 16 vacated due to NCAA rule infractions).

Alabama set a program record of winning 19 games (finishing 19-0 in such contests) last year when scoring 80 or more points. UA went 12-4 across its 16 games of hitting the 80-point mark in a game during Nate Oats' first season in 2019-20, bringing his two-year total to 31-4 when UA reaches 80 or more points in a game.

21

Alabama made its 21st NCAA Tournament appearance last season, reaching the Sweet 16 in the process. The Tide owns a 21-21 (.500) all-time NCAA Tournament record.

23

Alabama made a school and SEC record 23 three-pointers in its game at LSU on Jan. 19, 2021, breaking its on conference record of 22 set at Auburn in 2020. The Crimson Tide knocked down 23-of-43 treys (53.5 percent) on its way to the 105-75 road victory.

348-OF-989

Alabama set a school record for threes made and attempted for a second consecutive season. The Tide's 989 attempts also ranked second-most in SEC history, while the 348 ranked fourth-best by any conference team.

815

Number of SEC wins for Alabama, which ranks second among all league teams (Kentucky has 1,020). The Crimson Tide's SEC winning percentage of .562 is third-best in the conference annals, behind Kentucky (.780) and Tennessee (.564).

NATE OATS

Head Coach 3rd Season at UA
 MARANTHA BAPTIST, 1998 7th Season Overall

- When Nate Oats was formally introduced as head men's basketball coach at The University of Alabama on March 28, 2019, he promised fans would see an entertaining, up-tempo and fast-paced style of play. And that's exactly what he has delivered during his time in Tuscaloosa.
- The immediate success became evident in his second year at the helm of the program as Oats guided the 2020-21 Crimson Tide to one of its best seasons in the program's illustrious history. Alabama finished the year with a 26-7 overall mark, won 16 conference games (16-2), captured both the SEC regular season and tournament championships, and ended the year ranked No. 5 in the Associated Press' final national rankings which matched the best end-of-season ranking in program history.
- As a result, Oats was rewarded midway through the 2020-21 season with a contract extension that is set to keep him in charge of the Crimson Tide basketball program through March 14, 2027.
- An indicator of Alabama's resurgence can be seen by looking at the last two NBA Drafts. Prior to his arrival, the Tide had just one men's basketball player selected among the top 15 picks from 1992-2019. As a coach who is known for developing talent, Oats has now had an Alabama player selected in the NBA Draft Lottery (top-14 pick) in back-to-back years – a first in program history. The New Orleans Pelicans selected Kira Lewis Jr. No. 13 overall in the 2020 NBA Draft Lottery while Joshua Primo was taken by the San Antonio Spurs at No. 12, making UA one of three schools across the nation to have an NBA Lottery pick in each of the last two drafts.
- Furthermore, Herbert Jones was taken by the Pelicans with the fifth pick in

the second round (No. 35 overall) of the 2021 Draft which gave Alabama two players drafted in the same year for the 11th time in program history and the first since 1995. That Tide was also one of only 11 schools nationwide to have more than one player selected.

- Both Primo and Jones earned their way onto draft boards as a result of one of the best seasons in the 100-plus years of Alabama basketball. The 2020-21 Alabama squad claimed both the Southeastern Conference regular season and tournament championships – the only power five program to sweep both the regular season and tournament titles in 2021 – and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time since 2004.
- The season's success snapped some lengthy dry spells within the program as Oats guided Alabama to its first conference championship in 19 years (dating back to 2002), first tournament championship in 30 years (dating back to 1991) and first Sweet 16 showing in 17 years (dating back to 2004). As a result, Oats was named the 2021 SEC Coach of the Year, making him the fourth Alabama head coach to earn the recognition while he earned the accolade for the third time in his career (Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year in 2018 and 2019). Oats was also honored as the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District Coach of the Year and was one of four finalists for the 2021 Naismith National Coach of the Year.
- Oats has boasted eight players who have earned SEC postseason honors, coached three NBA Draft picks, three SEC First Team honorees, the 2021 SEC Tournament MVP and the 2021 SEC Player and Defensive Player of the Year.
- Across his two years, the Tide has combined to lead the nation in three-pointers made per game (10.7), total three-point shots made (682) and total threes attempted (1,946) while averaging more than 80.5 points per game and breaking several school and conference records along the way. Additionally, UA has collected 35 games (out of the 64 he has coached) of scoring 80 or more points, including a school-record 19 such contests in 2020-21.
- Similar to his expectations on the court, Oats places a high emphasis off the court, particularly in the classroom and the community. Since take over the reigns in 2019, 20 men's basketball players have been named to either the SEC Academic Honor Roll or SEC First Year Honor Roll while earned have graduated and earned a diploma. Additionally, the team set a record for cumulative grade point average in 2020 while maintaining a team GPA over above 3.0 during his time at the helm.
- The program's success has also resulted positively on the recruiting trail as Oats and his staff have signed back-to-back top-10 recruiting classes in 2020 and 2021. Excluding graduate transfers and JUCO signees, of the eight signed players during Oats' two seasons at Alabama, four have been five-star prospects while the other four were all rated as four-star signees. Moreover, the 2020-21 team alone features three McDonald's All-Americans (Jahvon Quinerly, Nimari Burnett and JD Davison).
- Whether it's on the court, in the classroom or out recruiting future Crimson Tide stars, Oats' has returned a winning attitude around the Alabama program. Much of that he credits to instilling three core values that make up the pillars on which the team's culture is built – Max Effort, Continuous Growth and Selfless Love.

2021-22 PRESEASON TEAM NOTES

ALABAMA SET TO BEGIN 109TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL

- Alabama returns its top two scorers and 10 letterwinners from last season's SEC Championship team
- In addition, UA welcomes the nation's No.11-ranked signing class, which includes McDonald's All-American and 5-star prospect JD Davison, as well as highly-ranked freshmen Jusuan Holt and Charles Bediako, along with highly-touted graduate transfer Noah Gurley (Furman)
- Alabama is in its 109th season of basketball in 2021-22. The Tide's first season of hoops came in 1912-13. There was no season in 1943-44 due to World War II.
- The Tide holds an all-time record of 1,717-1,068-1 (.616), which includes an 815-629 (.565) record in SEC play. By capturing its 800th SEC win, Alabama joined Kentucky as the only two teams in conference history to reach the milestone. UA also became the third team in the SEC and 34th team in NCAA history to reach 1,700 program wins. Only Kentucky and Arkansas have more wins than the Crimson Tide.
- UA won the program's eighth SEC regular season championship, finishing with a 16-2 league record which tied for the most wins in the conference in program history. In addition to claiming the 2021 crown, the Crimson Tide also claimed regular season titles in 1934, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1976, 1987 and 2002.
- Alabama has now won seven SEC Tournament titles with this year's championship game victory over LSU. It was the first tournament title by the Tide in 30 years, with the last coming in 1991. In all, the Tide has won 15 combined championships - the eight regular season titles ranking third-most and the seven tournament championships ranking second-best in the league.
- UA has made 37 NCAA (21) or NIT (16) appearances in program lore. It was the program's third appearance since 2012 (also earned an at-large bid in 2018).
- The Tide made its 21st NCAA Tournament appearance in program history and has reached its eighth Sweet 16 showing. Alabama owns a record of 21-21 (.512) in NCAA Tournament games.
- Alabama also ranks second in the SEC in league victories and third in all-time winning percentage.

IN THE PRESEASON RANKINGS

- After finishing No. 5 in the final Associated Press Top-25 poll last season, Alabama will begin the 2021-22 season ranked No. 14 in the Associated Press' top-25 preseason poll, which was announced Oct. 17.
- It's the first time since 2011 that Alabama has been ranked by the AP in the preseason poll, checking in at No. 19 that year.
- Alabama will have 10 games versus teams ranked among the AP top 25 and 15 games against teams that are either ranked or receiving votes (does not include the possibility of playing Belmont and Kansas in Orlando, which would make it 17)
- Four non-conference games will be against teams ranked in the poll's top-15 - No. 1 Gonzaga, No. 8 Baylor, No. 12 Memphis, No. 15 Houston (possibility of playing No. 3 Kansas in Orlando)
- Five SEC teams ranked among top 25 (tied for most of any conference)
- The Tide is one of five SEC teams ranked in the top-25 poll, with Kentucky at No.10, Arkansas at No. 16, Tennessee at No. 18 and Auburn at No. 22. An additional two SEC teams received votes to be ranked: LSU (No. 37, 7 votes) and Mississippi State (No. 41, 5 votes).
- The Tide ended the 2020-21 campaign ranked No. 5 in the AP Poll, matching the highest ranking in program history.
- In other top-25 preseason rankings, CBSSports.com has the Crimson Tide ranked highest at No. 11 in the nation, SI.com has Alabama ranked No. 14 while ESPN.com ranked UA No. 15

QUINERLY, SHACKELFORD BOTH HONORED WITH PRESEASON AWARDS

- The Tide's backcourt duo of Jahvon Quinerly and Jaden Shackelford have already begun to get noticed as one of the top guard tandems in not only the SEC, but in the nation
- The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame recently announced the Quinerly was named to the Watch List for the Cousy Award, given to the nation's top point guard, while Shackelford was selected to the West Award Watch List for the top shooting guard
- The duo also garnered recognition from around the league, as both SEC and national media members selected Quinerly and Shackelford both to the Preseason All-SEC First Team

TOP TWO SCORERS RETURN

- Despite losing four starters from last season, head coach Nate Oats will welcome back the team's top two returning scorers in junior guards Jaden Shackelford and Jahvon Quinerly.
- After testing the NBA waters, Shackelford returns to Tuscaloosa after leading last year's team in scoring average at 14.0 points per game on his way to earning All-SEC second team honors. The Hesperia, Calif., native is also the team's leading returnee in threes made (63) and attempted (184) and field goals made (154) and attempted (376).
- Meanwhile, Quinerly ranked second on the team in scoring average at 12.9 points per game last season and led UA in three-point shooting percentage at 43.3 percent (52-of-120).
- Combined, the duo of Quinerly and Shackelford combined for approximately 34 percent (26.9 points) of the team's 79.7 points per game scoring average, 33 percent (115 threes made) of the team's 348 total threes made and 31 percent (304 threes attempted) of the 989 total threes attempted.

PRIMO AND JONES EACH SELECTED IN NBA 2021 DRAFT

- Two Alabama men's basketball players were selected in the 2021 NBA Draft, which was held in Brooklyn, N.Y., at the Barclays Center on July 30. Guard Joshua Primo was a first round selection of the San Antonio Spurs at No. 12 overall and guard/forward Herbert Jones went No. 35 to the New Orleans Pelicans.
- Primo's selection gave Alabama back-to-back NBA Draft Lottery picks for the first time in program history, while it was also the first time since 1995 that UA had two players selected in the same draft. That year, Antonio McDyess went No. 2 overall to the L.A. Clippers and Jason Caffey was the 20th overall pick by the Chicago Bulls.
- The Tide has now had consecutive first round draft picks for the first time in 25 years (1995 and 1996).
- Primo and Jones became the 44th and 45th Alabama players to hear their name called on draft night.
- The Crimson Tide has had a guard drafted in the NBA Draft Lottery in three of the last four years (Collin Sexton No. 8 overall to the Cleveland Cavaliers in 2018, Kira Lewis Jr. No. 13 overall to the New Orleans Pelicans in 2020).
- Primo became the 17th UA player to be selected in the first round and the eighth who was drafted inside the top 15.
- It was the 11th time Alabama has had two players selected in the same draft in program history.

ALABAMA WELCOMES FIVE NEWCOMERS TO 2021-22 ROSTER

- Head coach Nate Oats added five newcomers to this year's team, which includes three freshmen and a pair of transfers.
- Alabama's five scholarship signees made up the nation's No. 9-ranked class by 247sports and No. 10 nationally according to Rivals. The Crimson Tide freshmen include: Charles Bediako, JD Davison and Jusuan Holt.
- The team recruiting rankings do not include a pair of transfers in graduate student Noah Gurley and sophomore Nimari Burnett. Gurley was a three-time All-SoCon performer at Furman while Burnett was rated a five star recruit out of high school before playing his freshman season at Texas Tech.

ROJAS TEARS ACL, ANTICIPATED TO RETURN FOR 2021-22 SEC SEASON

- Senior James Rojas suffered a torn ACL in his left knee, head coach Nate Oats announced on June 15. The 6-8, 220-pound forward underwent successful surgery and is expected to make a full recovery with the anticipation of playing in the 2021-22 Southeastern Conference season.
- Surgery was performed by Dr. Lyle Cain of Andrews Sports Medicine at St. Vincent's Hospital in Birmingham, Ala. Dr. Cain also performed an ACL on Rojas' right knee in 2019 in which the Jamestown, N.Y., native responded well to an aggressive treatment and made full recovery.
- Last season, Rojas played in 30 contests making one start while averaging 2.9 points and 2.6 rebounds in 11.1 minutes per game.
- He ranked second on the team with 18 floor dives while also earning a pair of Hard Hat awards.

2020-21 IN REVIEW**RECAPPING ALABAMA'S SEASON**

- Alabama finished one of the most successful seasons in program history in 2020-21, ending the year with a 26-7 overall record and a No. 5 Associated Press final ranking – matching the highest end-of-season ranking in program history. The Crimson Tide finished Southeastern Conference play with a 16-2 mark, matching the school record for league victories in a season. Alabama went on to sweep both the regular season and tournament championships, claiming its eighth regular season title and seventh tournament trophy in program history. UA ended as the only Power 5 school to sweep both championship titles last season.
- The Tide ended the year with a final ranking of No. 5 in the nation by both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls. It matched the 1955-56 Rocket 8 squad as the highest final ranking in program history.
- Alabama was given the No. 2 seed in the East Region and the tournament's No. 5 overall seed, which matched the 2002 team as the highest-ever NCAA Tournament seed given to any UA team in program history. Following its victories over No. 15 Iowa (68-55) in the opening round and No. 10-seeded Maryland (96-77) in the round of 32, Alabama fell in the Sweet 16 to No. 12 seed and eventual Final Four participant UCLA in overtime (88-78).
- After beginning the year with a 4-3 record across its first seven games, the Tide finished the year by winning 22 of its final 26 games, with all four losses coming on the road to teams ranked in the top 25. Two of those three defeats were by a combined eight points, falling at then-No. 24 Oklahoma by five (66-61) and at then-No. 18 Missouri by three (68-65), while also dropping games at then-No. 20 Arkansas (81-66) and vs. No. 7 UCLA (88-78, ot).

2021-22 PRESEASON TEAM NOTES

- Guard/forward Herbert Jones headlined the SEC Postseason awards, earning Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year honors, while also earning a spot on the Sporting News All-America Team. Head coach Nate Oats was selected as the league's Coach of the Year.
- In addition to those awards, three additional student-athletes were recognized by the league office. John Petty Jr. earned first team All-SEC honors, while Jaden Shackelford was named All-SEC Second Team. Finally, Joshua Primo earned a spot on the league's all-freshman team.
- Both Jones and Oats were finalists for Naismith Awards. Jones was one of four finalists for the Naismith Defensive Player of the Year while Oats was also one of four head coaches named as a finalist for both the Naismith and USBWA National Coach of the Year.

RECAPPING THE 2020-21 TEAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- In addition to the individual awards, the 2020-21 squad also set numerous program and SEC records throughout the season. Below is a list of what last year's team claimed as new record marks:
 - Second-most wins in program history (26)
 - Tied for most wins in SEC play in a single season in program history (16)
 - Set a school record for 80-point games in a single season with 19 (19-0)
 - Set a school and conference record for threes made in a single game (23), as well as for both threes made (348) and attempted (989) in a season
 - Led the NCAA in threes made and attempted, as well as total number of rebounds (1,343)
 - Tied for highest NCAA Tournament seed in program history (No. 2/No. 5 overall)
 - First SEC regular season championship since 2002 and eighth in program history
 - First SEC Tournament championship since 1991 and seventh in program history
 - Only Power 5 program to win both the regular season and tournament championships this season
 - First Sweet 16 appearance since 2004 and eighth in program history
 - Final ranking of No. 5 in nation – matches the 1955-56 'Rocket 8' team for highest final ranking in program history
 - Program-best final ranking of No. 8 in the final NET rankings
 - First time since 1975-76 that both the Alabama football and men's basketball teams won an SEC Championship in the same season

FOUR EARN ALL-SEC RECOGNITION

- Four Alabama men's basketball student-athletes earned All-SEC honors as Herbert Jones (Player of the Year/Defensive Player of the Year/First Team/All-Defensive), John Petty Jr. (First Team), Jaden Shackelford (Second Team) and Joshua Primo (All-Freshman) were all recognized.
- It marked the second consecutive year – and third time in program history – that Alabama had four different players earn All-SEC honors in the same year.
- Jones, who earned SEC All-Defensive Team honors a year ago, led UA with nine games of five or more assists this season, while leading the team in rebounding 17 times, assists 14 games, steals 14 times and blocks on 14 occasions which are all team-best numbers. Jones also led the team in Blue Collar Points (667), deflections (110), floor dives (23), and-1s (7-of-10) and dunks (19).
- Meanwhile, Petty finished as the top three-point shooter in the SEC for the second consecutive year. In addition to his scoring prowess, the Huntsville, Ala., native finished 17th in the nation and second in the SEC in total threes attempted while leading the league and ranking 22nd nationally in threes made. Petty also ranked 24th in the country in total minutes played (1,001:47), respectively.
- In his second season at the Capstone, Shackelford earned his second consecutive post-season SEC Award. Shackelford finished the year leading the team in scoring average at 14.0 points per contest, while also topping UA in free throw percentage (.756) and field goals made (154) and attempted (376), while ranking second in threes made (63) and attempted (184), free throws made (90) and attempted (119) and minutes per game (29.4). He also ranked as the team leader in double-figure scoring games (26), 20-point scoring games (6) and charges taken (16), ranked second on the team with four Hard Hat Awards, which is given to the player with the most Blue Collar Points after each game.
- Primo made sure his name was known after his first season with the Crimson Tide. The freshman ranked third on the team in three-point field goal percentage, second in free throw percentage and fifth in scoring. After his performance against LSU and Mississippi State, Primo was named SEC Freshman of the Week. The Toronto native

became the fifth straight Crimson Tide player to earn a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team, joining Shackelford (2020), Kira Lewis (2019), Collin Sexton (2018) and Braxton Key (2017).

TEN-GAME WIN STREAK NUGGETS

- Alabama had a 10-game win streak which began with a convincing 85-69 win over East Tennessee State on Dec. 22, 2020, and ended over a month later with a 66-61 loss at then-No. 24 Oklahoma on Jan. 30, 2021. In all, the Tide won six games at home and four on the road.
- Nine of the 10 wins came against SEC opponents, including four in true road contests – at then-No. 7 Tennessee on Jan. 2, at Auburn on Jan. 9, at Kentucky on Jan. 12 and at LSU on Jan. 19.
- Only three of the victories were decided by single digits – eight-point wins at Tennessee (81-73) and vs. Mississippi State (81-73), along with a four-point win at Auburn (94-90). The other seven games were decided by 15 or more points with three coming by 20 or more points.
- Over the 10-game streak, the Tide outscored the opposition by 16.1 points per game (84.9-68.8) and shot 45.7 percent from the floor and 40.5 percent from beyond the arc while also averaging 12.4 made threes per game.
- Individually, John Petty Jr. led the way with 15.3 points and 3.4 threes made per game while shooting 54.9 percent from the field and 52.5 percent (31-of-59) from deep. Jaden Shackelford also played stellar during the 10-game winning streak as he collected 14.4 points a game over the stretch while compiling 30 assists to only 12 turnovers.
