ALABAMA MEN'S BASKETBALL QUICK HITS

TEAM NOTES

- Alabama returns four starters and seven letterwinners for the 2020-21 season, while also welcoming a total of 11 newcomers eight fresh faces and three players who return to the lineup after being forced to miss the 2020-21 season.
- Three of the four returning starters were named as All-SEC performers in seniors John Petty Jr. and Herbert Jones along with sophomore Jaden Shackelford.
- In addition to the returnees, Alabama welcomes a total of eight newcomers six scholarship signees and two invited walk-ons five of which made up the nation's ninth-ranked signing class according to Rivals.com and the No. 12 overall by 247sports.com. The team recruiting rankings did not include graduate transfer Jordan Bruner, who earned First Team All-Ivy League honors last season.
- Oats will also welcome back three players who were forced to redshirt last year (Juwan Gary, Jahvon Quinerly and James Rojas). Quinerly (transfer from Villanova who was not cleared by the NCAA in 2019-20 forcing him to redshirt) was a five star prospect and a McDonald's All-American, Rojas (knee injury) was a JUCO All-American at Hutchinson CC and Gary (knee injury) was the team's highest-ranked signee in the class of 2019 (No. 64 overall, No. 12 small forward and No. 2 player in the state of South Carolina according to ESPN.com).
- Alabama broke every three-point record in program history last year, while also finishing fourth in the nation in tempo and third nationally in scoring offense and three-pointers made per game. The Crimson Tide ended the year by knocking down 334-of-957 (33.4 percent
- Injuries played a major factor on the Crimson Tide's 2019-20 season. Herbert Jones (4.5 games), Beetle Bolden (4 games) and John Petty Jr. (2.5 games) all missed crucial games in SEC play. Combine those with season-ending injuries to forwards James Rojas (32 games) and Juwan Gary (32 games), each of which were expected to play significant minutes last season, injuries cost UA players a total of 75 games

this season which leads the SEC. The next closest team was Vanderbilt with 46 games missed to injuries and/or illness.

- UA finished second in program history with 16 games of scoring 80 or more points. The program record of games of scoring 80 or more points is 17 which was set on three occasions (1986-87, 1978-79 and 1976-77). Furthermore, last year's team reached the 90-point plateau nine times, which tied for second-most in a single season. The 1971-72 team had a school record 12 games of 90 or more points with nine such games also occurring in 2001-02 and 1974-75.
- The Crimson Tide finished league play one victory away from becoming just the second team in Southeastern Conference men's basketball history to earn the 800th win in league history. Alabama will enter the 2021 SEC season with 799 victories and a .561 winning percentage (799-624) which both rank second to only Kentucky.
- Herbert Jones was an important presence for the Crimson Tide despite playing with essentially just one hand through the final stretch of the season. Since he was reinserted in the starting lineup after missing three games with a fractured left wrist, Jones was a defensive force, earning the Hard Hat Award in five of the team's final seven games. Over the seven-game stretch to end the year, the left-handed forward averaged 7.1 rebounds, 2.1 offensive rebounds, 1.9 steals and 1.0 blocks per game — all team-leading numbers. Jones led Alabama on the season in Hard Hat points (593), charges (22), deflections (84) and floor dives (31).

Last year's squad set a school record for consecutive games of scoring 90 or more points with five straight earlier in the year. The program record for games of scoring 90 or more points is 12 set during the 1971-72 season, with nine such games occurring in 1974-75 and 2001-02. UA reached the mark eight times last year.

The Tide had 16 games of scoring 80 or more points. The school record is 17 games set on three separate seasons (1976-77, 1978-79 and 1986-87).

- Formally introduced as head men's basketball coach at The University of Alabama on March 28, 2019
- Promised fans would see an entertaining, up-tempo and fast-paced style of play and that's exactly what he delivered in his first season at the helm of the program
- After ranking near the bottom of the Southeastern Conference in most offensive categories the previous year, Alabama led the league in six offensive statistics in 2019-20, including points per game (82.0), three-point field goal percentage (34.9 percent) and threes made per game (10.8), among others
- Nationally, the new-look offense ranked No. 3 in points and threes made per game, while also ranking sixth with 334 total threes made and fourth with 957 three-point attempts – both of which set program records
- The Tide's pace of play also ranked among the fastest in the country, as UA ranked fourth in raw tempo (76.1) and average possession length (15.2).
- Alabama boasted four student-athletes who earned All-

SEC honors in 2020 as Kira Lewis Jr. (first team), John Petty Jr. (second team), Jaden Shackelford (all-freshman) and Herbert Jones (all-defensive) all received postseason recognition.

- It marked just the second time in program history that the Crimson Tide had four all-conference honorees in the same season (2006 was the only other year).
- His efforts didn't just end on the court. Off the court, Oats and his staff were relentless on the recruiting trail and the results were evident. According to Rivals.com, the Crimson Tide's 2020 recruiting class, which included Canada's No. 1 and No. 3-ranked players as well as the top JUCO prospect in the nation, was ranked No. 9 in the country by Scout.com and No. 12 according to 247Sports. In the classroom, the program boasted 11 student-athletes who earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition.
- Came to Alabama after spending the last four seasons at the University at Buffalo where he led the Bulls to a 96-43 (.691) record, three MAC Tournament Championships and three NCAA Tournament appearances, including reaching the round of 32 in each of the last two seasons
- Named the league's Coach of The Year and National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District
 Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons (2018 and 2019) and finished fourth in voting for the 2019
 Associated Press Men's College Coach of the Year
- Over the last two seasons, Buffalo finished with a combined record of 59-13 (.819), a pair of MAC Tournament and regular season championships, two NCAA Tournament Round of 32 appearances and consecutive MAC Coach of the Year honors
- Prior to joining the Bulls, Oats completed 11 seasons as head coach at Romulus High School in Michigan, winning the school's first state title in 27 years in 2012-13 and finished the season 27-1
- Was named the 2013 Detroit News State Coach of the Year, the Detroit Free Press State Coach of the Year, and BCAM State Coach of the Year

2020-21 PRESEASON TEAM NOTES

ALABAMA BEGINS ITS 108TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL

- Alabama will begin its 108th season of basketball in 2020-21. The Tide's first season
 of hoops came in 1912-13. There was no season in 1943-44 due to World War II.
- The Tide holds an all-time record of 1,691-1,061-1 (.616), which includes a 799-626 (.561) record in SEC play. Alabama is just two league wins shy of joining Kentucky as the only two teams in conference history to reach 800 wins.
- Alabama ranks second in the SEC in league victories and all-time winning percentage.

FOUR EARN ALL-SEC RECOGNITION

- Four Alabama men's basketball student-athletes earned All-SEC honors as Kira Lewis Jr. (First Team), John Petty Jr. (Second Team), Jaden Shackelford (All-Freshman) and Herbert Jones (All-Defensive) were all recognized.
- It marked the first time since 2006 and second time in program history that Alabama had four different players earn All-SEC honors in the same year (2006).
- Lewis, who earned SEC All-Freshman honors a year ago, led the Crimson Tide in scoring (18.5 ppg), assists (5.2 apg), steals (1.8 spg) minutes (37.6 mpg) and field goals made (206) and attempted (449).
- Meanwhile, Petty finished as the top three-point shooter in the SEC. In addition

SHACKELFORD NAMED USBWA NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Jaden Shackelford was tabbed the National Freshman of the Week by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA), which was announced on Feb. 18.
- In games at then-No. 11 Auburn on Feb. 12 and vs. then-No. 25 LSU on Feb. 15, the Hesperia, Calif., native averaged 27.0 points, 4.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists, and 1.5 steals over the two contests – more than any major-conference freshman in the country.
- The rookie opened the week hitting 7-of-17 treys both career bests while tying his career-high of 28 points in the overtime loss to Auburn. Shackelford's performance helped the Crimson Tide set SEC and program single-game records for threes made (22) and attempted (59).
- He followed that up with 26 points against LSU, sinking 50.0 percent (9-of-18) of his shots from the floor and five treys in the victory to assist Alabama in its second win against a ranked opponent this season..

LEWIS, SHACKELFORD ACCOMPLISH A FIRST IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- Sophomore Kira Lewis Jr. was named the Southeastern Conference's Player of the Week and guard Jaden Shackelford earned the league's Freshman of the Week, which were both announced by the conference office for the week of Feb. 17.
- It marked the first time in program history that the Crimson Tide has swept the weekly honors dating back to the 1990-91 season when the SEC began what was then called the Rookie of the Week award.
- Lewis averaged 18.5 points, 8.5 assists, 5.5 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 1.0 block in a
 pair of contests against ranked opponents, including recording the second tripledouble in program history. Shackelford averaged 27.0 points, 4.5 rebounds, 3.0
 assists and 1.5 steals in the Tide's two contests on the week.

PETTY, LEWIS EACH NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK NEARLY A MONTH APART

- Alabama guard John Petty Jr. earned the SEC Men's Basketball Co-Player of the Week, for the week of Dec. 23, while Lewis earned the accolade for the week of Jan.27.
- Petty earned the recognition after leading UA to a pair of victories over Samford (12/18) and Belmont (12/21), when he averaged 26.5 points, 10.5 rebounds and 7.0 made threes per game and finished the week shooting 70.0 percent (14-of-20) from three-point range.
- The Huntsville, Ala., native opened the week when he matched his own school record with 10 made three-pointers in a 39-point, 10-rebound performance in the 105-87 win over Samford in the Chick-fil-A Birmingham Classic. The 6-5, 184-pound junior guard knocked down 10-of-13 shots from deep on his way to scoring the 11th-most points in a single game in program history.
- He followed that performance with his second consecutive double-double knocking down 4-of-7 shots from beyond the arc to finish with 15 points and a game-high 11 rebounds in the 92-72 win over Belmont at the Rocket City Classic in Huntsville, Ala.
- Petty became the first Alabama player to earn SEC Player of the Week honors since Retin Obasohan earned the accolade the week of Feb. 8, 2015. It is the third weekly honor in Petty's three-year career as he was twice named the league's Freshman of the Week during the 2017-18 season (weeks of Nov. 20, 2017 and Jan. 1, 2018).
