#### 2016-17 TEAM NOTES

#### TEAM

- Alabama returns two starters and eight letterwinners from last season's 18-15 team that reached the National Invitation Tournament. The Crimson Tide will have to find a way to replace three of its top four scorers and its top three assist leaders from the 2015-16 squad. Part of that void will be filled with the return of redshirt freshman Dazon Ingram, who started each of the first seven games of the year before suffering a season-ending foot injury. At the time of his injury, Ingram was leading the team in assists and rebounds from his point guard position. Head coach Avery Johnson also welcomes back senior forward Shannon Hale, who returns as the team's leading scorer at 10.8 points per game.
- Hale not only returns as the team's leading scorer, but he also tops all returnees in threes attempted (131) and free throw percentage (.747), while ranking second on the list in threes made (43) and minutes per game (24.6). Junior forward Riley Norris, who started 19 games a year ago, averaged 7.5 points and a team-leading 5.3 rebounds per contest as a sophomore. Norris also led Alabama in threes made (45) and total offensive rebounds (54), while ranking second in three-point field goal percentage (.375) and steals (26). Meanwhile, Ingram was averaging 7.7 points, 5.9 rebounds and 3.3 assists through his first seven games before suffering a season-ending injury.
- Alabama will welcome fifth-year graduate transfer Corban Collins to the Capstone this season. Collins, one of two transfers on this year's team (Daniel Giddens, Ohio State), will be immediately eligible to suit up for the Tide this season after graduating from Morehead State in May of 2016. While at Morehead State, Collins earned second team All-Ohio Valley Conference honors last season, while leading the team in scoring (11.0 ppg), three-point shooting (57-of-134/.425) and assist-to-turnover ratio (90 assists and 36 turnovers).
- In addition to Collins, Avery Johnson also welcomes to the lineup junior Nick King (Memphis) and sophomore Avery Johnson Jr. (Texas A&M), who each sat out the 2015-16 season due to NCAA transfer rules.
- Alabama reached the 2016 National Invitation Tournament, marking the third time in the last four years and 14th time overall the Tide has reached the NIT. It was the 33rd postseason appearance in program history (19 NCAAs and 14 NITs) and marked the fifth time in the last six years an Alabama team has reached a postseason tournament (four NITs, one NCAA).
- Alabama set a new home attendance record in head coach Avery Johnson's first year. The Crimson Tide averaged 13,110 fans per game, which ranked as the highest single-season per game attendance average in program history (full note on page 10). Furthermore, the Tide ranked second in the nation in increased attendance, improving 2,934 fans per game from 10,176 in 2014-15 to 13,110 this past season.
- The Tide had five home sellouts on the season. It was the most games sold out in a single season at Alabama since selling out six during the 2006-07 campaign.
- Alabama was one of just 15 teams in the nation to have beaten four teams ranked in the AP Top 25 on the season. In the four years prior to last season (2011-15), the Tide was a combined 0-18 vs. top-25 opponents.
- Alabama captured back-to-back wins over ranked teams when it downed then-No. 20 Wichita State, 64-60, on Nov. 27 and then-No. 17 Notre Dame, 74-73, on Nov. 29. That was first time a Tide team captured consecutive wins over top-25 teams since defeating then-No. 8 Tennessee (92-79) and then-No. 12 Florida (82-77) on Feb. 18 and Feb. 26, 2006.
- Alabama's win over then-No. 20 Wichita State snapped a 21-game losing streak when playing ranked opponents. The last time the Crimson Tide recorded a victory over a top-25 team came on Jan. 18, 2011, when the Tide defeated then-No. 12 Kentucky, 68-66, in Tuscaloosa. It was also the first win over a non-conference ranked team since defeating then-No. 15 Michigan, 68-66, on Nov. 29, 2009.
- The 2015-16 Alabama men's basketball team set a school record for threes made and attempted in a season. The Tide made 259 treys on the year, besting the previous record of 255 which was set 20 years ago in 1995-96. Furthermore, Alabama's 763 three-point attempts last year crushed the former record of 711 in 2000-01.

- As a team, Alabama ranked among the league leaders in defensive stats. The Tide ranked third in the league in scoring defense (67.9), blocked shots (5.3) and three-point field goal percentage defense (.329), and ranked sixth in field goal percentage defense (.409).
- The Tide ranked among the top shot-blocking teams in the country. Alabama averaged 5.2 blocks per contest, which ranked third in the SEC and was 16th-best in the nation. The Tide was led on the year by Jimmie Taylor (1.8 bpg) and Donta Hall (1.7 bpg) who combined to average 3.5 blocks a game
- A key stat for Alabama on the season was rebounding. The Crimson Tide, which ranked 13th out of 14 teams in the SEC in terms of rebounding margin (-3.6), was 11-2 for the year when it outrebounded the competition. However, the Tide fell to 7-13 on the year when it was outrebounded by its opponents.
- The 2015-16 squad was one of the younger teams in the SEC. Of the 12 available players on the roster (Nick King and Avery Johnson Jr. both had to sit out due to NCAA transfer rules), seven were either freshmen (4) or sophomores (3).

#### BY THE NUMBERS



According to the NCAA, the Crimson Tide ranked second in the nation in "Largest Increase for Average Attendance from Previous Year," improving 2,934 fans per game from 10,176 in 2014-15 to 13,110 in 2015-16.



Alabama was one of 15 teams in the nation that defeated four AP top-25 teams on the year. It was the first time since the 2001-02 campaign that the Tide recorded at least four wins against top-25 competition. The wins included vs. then-No. 20 Wichita State (64-60) on Nov. 27, then-No. 17 Notre Dame (74-73) on Nov. 29, then-No. 19 South Carolina (73-50) on Jan. 13 and then-No. 15 Texas A&M (63-62) on Feb. 10.



Riley Norris tied a school record with eight three-pointers in a win over then-No. 19 South Carolina on Jan. 13. He became the sixth different UA player to achieve the feat and the first since Mykal Riley did so on March 13, 2008.

#### 13

The Crimson Tide won 13 games that were decided by less than 10 points, with seven of those games coming down to the games final possession. The Tide had a record of 13-8 in games decided by 10 or fewer points and 5-2 in one possession games last season.

#### 14

Retin Obasohan recorded 14 games of 20 or more points last season, which ranked as the ninth-most in program history.

#### 15

Alabama has won 15 straight home games when playing against non-conference competition in Coleman Coliseum. The last time an Alabama team lost to a non-conference opponent under the arched roof came on Dec. 21, 2013, against Xavier (lost 77-74).

#### 18

Head coach Avery Johnson's 18 wins this season tied him for the most wins by a first-year head coach at The University of Alabama. Former coach Wimp Sanderson won 18 games during his first year in 1980-81

Alabama ranked 22nd in the nation in average attendance during the 2015-16 season (13,110).



A very Johnson, who will enter his second season with the Crimson Tide, was introduced as Alabama's 20th head men's basketball coach on April 6, 2015. Johnson, who led the San Antonio Spurs to the 1999 NBA title and was named the 2006 NBA Coach of the Year, came to the Capstone after a successful coaching career in the NBA. Johnson's first year at Alabama turned many heads in the college basketball world as it didn't take long for fans and student-athletes alike to heed his motto "Buckle Up" in reference to

the excitement he expects his tenure will offer. During the 2015-16 season, his inaugural as a collegiate head coach, Johnson gave a glimpse of just that. The Crimson Tide finished with an 18-15 record and earned an at-large selection to the 2016 National Invitation Tournament - Alabama's fifth postseason trip in the last seven years. The fan support was tremendous throughout the year. Helped by reseating the student section to create a better in-game atmosphere, Alabama averaged a school record 13,110 fans

per game – a number that ranked 22nd-best in the nation. Furthermore, the Tide also sold out five home games, which was the most sellouts in a single year since the 2006-07 season. On the court, Alabama knocked off four teams that were ranked in the Associated Press' Top 25 during the 2015-16 campaign which led the SEC. It marked the first time since 2001-02 that an Alabama team recorded four AP Top 25 victories in the regular season.

Johnson owned an NBA career coaching record of 254-186 (.577) after spending four seasons with the Dallas Mavericks (2004-08) and two-plus seasons with the Brooklyn Nets (2010-13).

During his time in Dallas, Johnson led the Mavericks to the postseason in each of his three-plus seasons as head coach. He led the Mavericks to a record of 194-70 (.735) and set the record for reaching the 50-win plateau (62 games) and the 150-win plateau (191 games) the fastest.

In 2005-06, Johnson led the Mavericks to their first ever appearance in the NBA Finals en route to earning NBA Coach of the Year honors.

In 16 NBA seasons, he averaged 8.4 points, 5.5 assists, 1.7 rebounds and 25.3 minutes played in 1,054 career games with seven different teams. Known as "The Little General" for his on-court leadership and diminutive stature, Johnson helped guide the San Antonio Spurs to an NBA Championship in 1999.

The New Orleans native played his final two collegiate seasons at Southern University, leading the NCAA in assists in each of his two years at Southern, and was named the Southwestern Athletic Conference Player of the Year and the MVP of the conference tournament as both a junior and senior.

He still owns several NCAA Division I records, including most assists in a single game (22 – shared with two other players), most 20 or more assist games (4), the highest single season assist average (13.3) and the highest career assist average (12.0). As a senior in 1988, he averaged 11.4 points per game, making him the first men's Division I player ever to average double figures in points and assists in the same season.

Johnson received a degree in psychology in 1988 from Southern University. He married his wife Cassandra in July of 1991 in New Orleans. They have two children, Christianne and Avery Jr., a sophomore on the Alabama men's basketball team.

#### ALABAMA SET TO COMPETE IN 104TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL

- Alabama is set to compete in its 104th season of basketball in 2016-17.
- The Tide has an all-time record of 1,618-999-1 (.618), which includes a 765-588 (.565) record in SEC play.
- Alabama ranks second in the SEC in league victories and all-time winning percentage.
- UA has made 33 NCAA (19) or NIT (14) appearances and has won seven SEC regular-season titles and six SEC Tournament championships.

#### AVERY JOHNSON HAS SUCCESSFUL FIRST YEAR AT ALABAMA

- Avery Johnson closed out a successful first season as the head men's basketball
  coach at The University of Alabama. Picked to finish 13th out of 14 teams in the
  Southeastern Conference in a preseason coaches poll, the Crimson Tide closed
  the year with an 18-15 overall record and reached the 2016 National Invitation
  Tournament.
- The Tide accomplished a lot of milestones under Johnson's guidance during the 2015-16 season. Included in those was setting a new single-season average attendance record of 13,110 fans per game. Additionally, Alabama defeated four top-25 teams on the year – the most victories over ranked opponents since the 2001-02 season – after going a combined 0-18 over the previous four years in such contests.
- Other highlights included 18 victories last season which tied Johnson for the most wins by a first-year head coach in program history (matched Wimp Sanderson's 18 wins during his inaugural season in 1980-81). In addition, Johnson led the Tide to eight wins away from Coleman Coliseum which were the most since the 2011-12 campaign. Of those eight road wins, the biggest came when the Tide secured a 61-55 win at Florida, which not only snapped an 11-game losing streak to the Gators, but also was Alabama's first win in Gainesville since 1995.
- Johnson was introduced as Alabama's 20th head men's basketball coach on April
  8, 2015. Johnson, who led the San Antonio Spurs to the 1999 NBA title and was
  named the 2006 NBA Coach of the Year, came to the Capstone after a successful
  coaching career in the NBA. Johnson boasted a 254-186 (.577) career coaching
  record after spending seven-plus seasons as a head coach in the NBA (Dallas
  Mavericks and Brooklyn Nets).
- During his time in Dallas, Johnson led the Mavericks to the postseason in each of
  his three-plus seasons as head coach. He led the Mavericks to a record of 194-70
  (.735) and set the record for reaching the 50-win plateau (62 games) and the 150win plateau (191 games) the fastest.
- In 16 NBA seasons as a player, he averaged 8.4 points, 5.5 assists, 1.7 rebounds and 25.3 minutes played in 1,054 career games with seven different teams. - On March, 28 2003, as a member of the Mavericks, Johnson became the 75th player

  Spurs' all-time leader in assists (4,474) and ranks 28th in NBA history in the same
  category. In recognition for his contributions to the Spurs organization, Johnson's
  No. 6 jersey was retired in December of 2007.
- The New Orleans native played his final two collegiate seasons at Southern University, leading the NCAA in assists in each of his two years, and was named the Southwestern Athletic Conference Player of the Year and the MVP of the conference tournament as both a junior and senior.
- He still owns several NCAA Division I records, including most assists in a single game (22 shared with two other players), most 20-or-more assist games (4), the highest single season assist average (13.3) and the highest career assist average (12.0). As a senior in 1988, he averaged 11.4 points per game, making him the first men's Division I player ever to average double figures in points and assists in the

#### TIDE RANKED NO. 22 IN ATTENDANCE, NO. 2 IN ATTENDANCE INCREASE

- The NCAA released its attendance numbers for the 2015-16 men's basketball season on June 8 and Alabama ranked second in the nation in "Largest Increase for Average Attendance from Previous Year," improving 2,934 fans per game from 10,176 in 2014-15 to 13,110 in 2015-16.
- Furthermore, Alabama's average attendance from the 2015-16 season ranked 22nd in the nation among Division I home attendance leaders, while the Southeastern Conference as a whole ranked second in the nation in average attendance at 11,144. That number was +325 in average from a year ago, which led all conferences.
- The Crimson Tide set a school record by averaging 13,110 fans per game during the first year under Johnson, topping the former mark of 12,484 fans per game during the 2011-12 campaign.

#### ABOUT THE ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE IN 2015-16

- Alabama finished the season with an 18-15 overall record and finished 10th in the SEC with an 8-10 mark in league play. The Tide earned its 14th selection to the National Invitation Tournament, including the fourth appearance in the last six years. Alabama dropped the opening round game at Creighton, 72-54, to fall to 24-17 (.585) all-time in the event.
- Alabama reached the quarterfinals of the 2016 SEC Tournament, which marked the first time since 2013 it reached the event's final eight. The Tide defeated seventh-seeded Ole Miss, 81-73, on March 10. However, Alabama lost to No. 2 seed and 16th-ranked Kentucky, 85-59, on March 11 in the quarterfinals.
- Obasohan, who boasted a team-leading 14 games of 20 or more points and two 30-point games, led Alabama in scoring (17.6 ppg), steals (1.4) and minutes (32.3 mpg) through the Tide's 33 contests. The Antwerp, Belgium, native finished the year ranked fifth in the SEC in scoring average, sixth in field goal percentage (.471, which also led all guards in the conference), eighth in minutes per game and 10th in steals per game.
- Junior forward Shannon Hale and senior guard Arthur Edwards ranked second and third on the team in scoring average at 10.8 ppg and 9.5 ppg, respectively. Hale, who missed five games during the season due to medical afflictions, ranked third on the team in double-figure scoring games (15) and was second in games of 20 or more points (4) and free throw percentage (.747). Meanwhile, Edwards led the team and ranked sixth in the SEC in three-point field goal percentage at 39.4 percent (71-of-180) for the year. He also was second on the team with 17 double-digit games on the year.
- Sophomore Riley Norris stepped up his play during the SEC season. The
  Albertville, Ala., native pulled down a career-high 16 rebounds in the win at LSU
  on Feb. 17 and led the team in league play in rebounding (6.1 rpg), ranked second
  in three-point field goal percentage (.380), while ranking fourth in scoring (8.3
  ppg) and second in minutes per game (31.6) during conference play.
- As a team, Alabama was outscored by the competition by 1.7 points per game (66.8-68.5). The Tide ranked among the top defensive teams in the SEC for the season. By year's end, Alabama ranked third in the league in scoring defense (67.9), blocked shots per game (5.3) and three-point field goal percentage defense (.329), and was sixth in field goal percentage defense (.409). Offensively, the Tide ranked fourth in three-pointers made per game (7.8).

#### ALABAMA WELCOMES FOUR NEWCOMERS

- Alabama welcomes a total of four newcomers to this year's team, including transfers Corban Collins (Morehead State) and Daniel Giddens (Ohio State).
   Collins is a graduate transfer and therefore will be immediately eligible to suit up for the Tide, while Giddens must sit out the upcoming season due to NCAA transfer rules. Also new to this year's team is freshman Braxton Key and junior college transfer Ar'Mond Davis. Below is a breakdown each of the Crimson Tide's four newcomers:
- Corban Collins | Gr. | 6-3 | 190 | G: Comes to Alabama as a graduate transfer after playing his last two seasons at Morehead State ... graduated with a degree in health promotion in December of 2015 ... earned Ohio Valley Conference second team honors in 2015-16 ... played in 30 games, making 28 starts, last season and led the Eagles in scoring (11.0 ppg), assists (3.0 apg) and minutes (29.0 mpg), while also topping the team in threes made (57), attempted (134) and percentage from beyond the arc (.425) ... finished the season second in the OVC in three-point field goal percentage and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.5) ... collected career-bests of 28 points and eight assists against East Tennessee State last season, connecting on 10-of-16 shots from the field including five three-pointers ... boasted a total of

- Ar'Mond Davis | Ir. | 6-6 | 175 | G: Considered one of the top junior college prospects in the nation who played the last two seasons at the College of Southern Idaho ... originally hailing from Tacoma, Wash., Davis was rated as a four-star prospect and ranked No. 6 overall junior college player in the nation by 247sports.com ... led his team in scoring (16.8 ppg), threes made (85) and attempted (225), field goals made (164) and attempted (368) and free throw percentage (81.1 percent), while ranking second in rebounding (6.6 rpg) and minutes (26.1 mpg) ... as a freshman, Davis was second on the team with 10.9 points and 3.9 rebounds per game, helping his team to a 31-3 record ... was invited to attend the All-American JUCO Showcase Elite 80 West in Las Vegas, an event where Davis was one of the top prospects ... played his high school ball under Mike Cocke at Foss High School ... as a senior, he averaged 26.3 points per game.
- Daniel Giddens | So. | 6-10 | 235 | F/C: Transferred from The Ohio State University and must sit out 2016-17 season due to NCAA transfer rules ... as a freshman, Giddens saw action in 33 contests, while making seven starts ... averaged 3.8 points, 3.6 rebounds and 1.5 blocks in 18.2 minutes per game ... continued to improve as the year went on, averaging 5.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocks a game in the Buckeyes' four postseason contests, including going for a season-high 11 points in a loss to Florida in the second round of the 2016 National Invitation Tournament ... came to the Buckeyes out of renowned Oak Hill Academy ... a consensus top 50 player and top 10 center in the nation as he helped his team to a 47-1 record in 2014-15 ... was a part of multiple tournament championships, including the Captured Phenom Hoop Classic, Marshall County Hoop Fest and Nike Extravaganza, among others ... prior to his time at Oak Hill Academy, Giddens, a native of Mableton, Ga., played at Wheeler High School where he averaged 12 points, 10 rebounds and four blocks per game while leading his team to the Georgia Region 5 title. ... was a member of the USA Basketball Men's U-16 National Team that won the gold medal at the 2013 FIBA Americas Championship.
- Braxton Key | Fr. | 6-8 | 240 | F: A highly-touted forward who hails from Nashville, Tenn. ... a consensus four-star recruit, who was rated as the No. 66 overall player in the nation and the No. 13 small forward, according to ESPN.com ... played his senior season at the famed Oak Hill Academy under head coach Steve Smith, where he led the team to an undefeated record and the program's first national championship in 2016 ... had a game-high 20 points, including two free throws in the final seconds, to lift Oak Hill Academy in the championship ... had 10 points and eight rebounds in a semifinal win against Miller Grove (Lithonia, Ga.) and 12 points and seven rebounds in a quarterfinal win against Utah's Wasatch Academy on his way to earning the tournament Most Valuable Player award ... averaged 13.1 points and a team-leading 7.9 rebounds as a senior while also contributing 3.9 assists, 2.4 steals and 1.3 blocks per game ... was named team's Most Outstanding Player ... spent most of his prep career playing for Drew Maddox at Christ Presbyterian Academy ... was a two-time Class AA Mr. Basketball in the state of Tennessee, averaging 20.7 points, 10.5 rebounds and 4.9 assists in leading Christ Presbyterian Academy to a state title in 2014-15 ... as a sophomore, Key averaged 19.6 points, 11.2 rebounds and 3.6 assists, while shooting 67 percent from the floor and 41 percent from deep.

#### DUO ELIGIBLE TO SUIT UP AFTER SITTING OUT 2015-16 SEASON

- Alabama guards Nick King (Memphis) and Avery Johnson Jr. (Texas A&M) are both eligible to suit up this season after sitting out the 2015-16 campaign due to NCAA transfer rules.
- The duo is expected to make an immediate impact in helping replace three departed guards from last season's team, including two of the Tide's top three leading scorers in Retin Obasohan (17.6 ppg) and Arthur Edwards (9.5 ppg).
- King came to Alabama after spending two seasons at Memphis. As a sophomore in 2014-15, King played in 28 games, averaging 18.9 minutes per contest. He was the team's fifth-leading scorer and fourth-leading rebounder with 7.2 points and 4.8 rebounds per game, respectively. During his two seasons at Memphis, King saw action in 62 games and averaged 5.9 points and 4.0 rebounds per game while shooting 44.8 percent from the floor. Coming out of East High School in Memphis, Tenn., King was ranked among nation's elite players by Scout.com (No. 28), ESPN. com (No. 37) and Rivals.com (No. 46) and was a consensus top-10 small forward nationally. King was named Tennessee's Class AAA Mr. Basketball in 2012-13 after averaging 24.4 points, 15.7 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.3 blocks per game as a

- senior. He was selected to the prestigious Parade magazine 2013 high school All-America Team, while also earning first team all-state honors.
- As a freshman at Texas A&M in 2014-15, Johnson played in 13 games and averaged 1.4 points and 4.3 minutes per contest. He saw a season-best 18 minutes of action on opening night, scoring 10 points on 5-of-9 shooting vs. Northwestern State. Johnson was rated as a three-star prospect by 247sports.com as well as the No. 56 point guard recruit nationally in the class of 2014 coming out of high school. He was a three-year starter at John Cooper School (The Woodlands, Texas) before starting as a senior at Plano West High School, where he graduated in 2014. Under the guidance of head coach Anthony Morgan, Johnson averaged 15 points and four assists per game while leading the Wolves to the 2014 District 10-5A Championship. He garnered first team all-district and all-region honors, as well as being voted as Plano West's Most Valuable Player as a senior.

#### INGRAM HEALTHY AND READY TO RETURN TO LINEUP

- Alabama head coach Avery Johnson will get a big boost to the lineup with the return of starting point guard Dazon Ingram.
- A native of Theodore, Ala., and the winner of the Mr. Basketball award for the state
  of Alabama in 2015, Ingram suffered a fractured left foot during a practice and was
  sidelined for the remainder of the 2015-16 season.
- Ingram started each of the Tide's first seven games last season prior to the injury. At the time, he led the team with 5.9 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game, ranked second in steals (1.1 spg), third in minutes per contest (25.6 mpg) and fourth in points per game (7.7) and field goal percentage (.541).

#### SELLING OUT COLEMAN

- Alabama fans responded to the excitement surrounding the current state of the men's basketball program to the tune of five sellouts during the 2015-16 year, resulting in a record-setting turnout.
- Alabama's average home attendance of 13,110 per home game shattered the school record for single-season average attendance by nearly 1,000 fans per game. The former record of 12,484 per game was set during the 2011-12 campaign.
- UA had five sellouts last year, which are the most in a season since selling out Coleman Coliseum on six occasions during the 2006-07 campaign.

#### ALABAMA EARNS SPOT IN 2016 NIT

- Alabama made its 14th NIT appearance in school history, which leads SEC schools.
   Tennessee, which made its last NIT appearance in 2013, is second with 13.
- The Crimson Tide fell to the Creighton Bluejays by a score of 72-54 in the opening round. Despite the loss, Alabama owns an all-time record of 24-17 (.585) in the event. The 24 victories gives the Tide the most NIT wins among SEC schools, surpassing South Carolina's 21 wins in NIT play.
- Alabama was one of seven SEC teams to earn a berth in either the NCAA
  Tournament or NIT. Joining the Crimson Tide in the NIT was South Carolina,
  Florida and Georgia, while Texas A&M, Kentucky and Vanderbilt each earned a
  spot in the NCAA Tournament.

#### ALABAMA REACHES SEC TOURNAMENT QUARTERFINALS

- The 10th-seeded Alabama men's basketball team knocked down 12 three-pointers to defeat seventh-seeded Ole Miss, 81-73, on March 10 at Bridgestone Arena in the second round of the 2016 SEC Men's Basketball Tournament.
- With the win, the Tide advanced to the quarterfinals for the first time since 2013.
   Alabama dropped an 85-59 decision to Kentucky on March 11, as the Wildcats went on to claim the SEC Tournament title.
- In the two SEC Tournament games, the Tide seniors, Retin Obasohan (17.5 ppg) and Arthur Edwards (17.5 ppg), combined to average 35.0 points per game.

#### **2016-17 PRESEASON TEAM NOTES**

Sophomore Riley Norris also had a solid tournament with averages of 9.0 ppg and a team-leading 9.0 rpg.

- Edwards shot an impressive 60.0 percent (12-of-20) from the field and from beyond the arc (9-of-15).
- Donta Hall was the top performer off the bench during the tournament, averaging 4.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and a team-best 3.5 blocks per game in the Tide's two contests.

#### **TOPPLING THE TOP 25**

- Alabama led the SEC with four top-25 victories on the year and owned a record of 4-4 when playing ranked teams on the year. In the four years prior to last season (2011-15), the Tide was a combined 0-18 vs. top-25 opponents.
- It marked the first time since the 2001-02 season that the Tide has secured four top-25 wins during the regular season.
- Alabama captured a 63-62 win over then-No. 15/13 Texas A&M on Feb. 10. It was
  the highest ranked team the Tide toppled since defeating then-No. 12 Kentucky,
  68-66, back on Jan. 18, 2011.
- Other ranked teams Alabama defeated included then-No. 21 Wichita State (64-60) on Nov. 27 followed by a 74-73 victory over then-No. 17 Notre Dame on Nov. 29.
   The Tide also defeated then-No. 19 South Carolina, 73-50, on Jan. 13.
- Alabama's first two victories over ranked teams against Wichita State and Notre Dame came in back-to-back contests. It marked the first time Alabama had won consecutive games against ranked opponents since it defeated then-No. 12 Florida on Feb. 26, 2006, after downing then-No. 8 Tennessee on Feb. 18.
- The victory over Wichita State snapped a 21-game losing streak to ranked opponents dating back to Jan. 18, 2011, when Alabama beat then-No. 12 Kentucky at home (68-66). It also marked the first win over a ranked opponent at a neutral site since Nov. 29, 2009, when the Tide beat then-No. 15 Michigan.

# OBASOHAN EARNS TRIO OF SEC HONORS, PAIR OF ALL-DISTRICT AWARDS

- Retin Obasohan was named the 2016 Southeastern Conference Scholar Athlete
  of the Year and First Team All-SEC, the league office announced on March 8. In
  addition, the Antwerp, Belgium, native earned a spot on the league's all-defensive
  team, giving him a trio of all-conference awards to cap what was an outstanding
  season.
- Furthermore, the senior guard was named to the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) All-District first team and National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District second team. He also earned a spot on the Associated Press' All-SEC second team.
- Obasohan was the third player in program history, and the second in as many
  years, to claim the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year, joining former standouts Levi
  Randolph (2015) and Justin Knox (2009) as past recipients. Furthermore, Obasohan
  was the second player in program history to be named to both the league's first team
  and all-defensive team in the same season. Trevor Releford accomplished that feat
  back in 2013.
- Obasohan, the Tide's senior captain, ranked third in the SEC with an average of 20.6 points per game in league contests on his way to becoming the first player in 30 years to average more than 20 points per game in league play. The last player to accomplish the feat was Buck Johnson, who averaged 20.4 ppg in SEC play during the 1985-86 season. Obasohan finished the conference season ranked third in scoring average, fifth in field goal percentage (.496) and eighth in steals per game (1.4).
- For the season, Obasohan led the Tide and ranked fifth in the SEC with 17.6 points per game. He collected 14 games of 20 or more points – 11 of which came during SEC play – and 27 double-digit scoring games on the year.

#### OBASOHAN NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT FIRST TEAM

- Retin Obasohan was named to the 2015-16 Academic All-District 4 First Team, as selected by College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), the organization announced on Feb. 11.
- With the nod, Obasohan became the third different Alabama player to earn first team academic all-district honors, joining Terrance Meade (2003) and Levi Randolph (2013, 2014, 2015).

- A native of Antwerp, Belgium, Obasohan earned his undergraduate degree in finance in May, 2015, graduating with a 3.30 grade point average. He earned a master's degree in marketing in May of 2016.
- Obasohan, who speaks four languages English, Dutch, French and Edo (dialect
  of Nigeria) also led the Tide's efforts in the community as a two-time SEC
  Community Service Award honoree.

#### EDWARDS NAMED TO SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM

- Graduate transfer Arthur Edwards was named to the Southeastern Conference's
  Community Service team, the league office announced on March 4. The annual
  award handed out from the league office recognizes the accomplishments of
  student-athletes beyond the field of competition.
- In his lone year in Tuscaloosa, Edwards made a large impact by volunteering his time within the community. The Washington, D.C., native built a house with Habitat for Humanity, visited patients and staff at the VA Medical Center and spoke at local elementary schools about the importance of staying in school.
- Over the Christmas holidays, he worked with Project Angel Tree in Tuscaloosa, spending time with children whose parents are incarcerated. He also visited a local soup kitchen and homeless shelter in December.

#### HOME SWEET HOME

- Dating back to the 2009-10 season, Alabama owns a record of 96-26 (.787) on the Coleman Coliseum floor, including a 10-5 mark during the 2015-16 season. During the 2013-14 season, the Tide finished with a 13-4 mark at home, while finishing with a 14-5 record in home games during the 2014-15 campaign.
- Since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, the Tide has won 85 of the last 105 games played under the arched roof of Coleman Coliseum (85-20; .810).
- Overall, Alabama owns a record of 554-129 (.811) following in the facility's 48th season of use in 2015-16.
- Alabama finished the non-conference portion of its schedule at 5-0 to extend the Tide's non-conference win streak to 15 straight games at Coleman Coliseum. The last home loss in the non-conference regular season came when the Tide dropped a 77-74 decision to Xavier on Dec. 21, 2013.
- Since 2009, Alabama owns a home record of 43-17 (.717) against SEC competition. Since 2011, the Tide boasts a 38-13 (.745) mark at home against the conference.

#### RECORD IN CLOSE GAMES

- Twenty-one of Alabama's 33 contests last season were decided by fewer than 10 points. In all, Alabama owned a record of 13-8 in such games.
- Entering the 2015-16 season, Alabama owned a combined 13-22 (.371) record in games that were decided by less than 10 points over the previous two years. Last season, the Tide went 8-10 in such contests, which was an improvement from going 5-12 in such games during the 2013-14 campaign.
- Even more impressive was Alabama's mark in one possession games last year. The Crimson Tide finished 5-2 in one possession games, which is something that has not come easy for Alabama teams in the previous two years. Alabama combined for a record of 5-9 (.357) in one possession games over the previous two years (3-5 in 2013-14 and 2-4 in 2014-15).




