For the 1st time in school history, Alabama advanced to the NCAA tournament s Elite 8 $\,$

Among the teams Alabama defeated in the 2004 NCAA tournament were 2003 defending National Champions, Syracuse, and No. 1 seeded and No. 1 ranked Stanford. Alabama fell to eventual 2004 National Champions, UConn, in the NCAA Elite Eight at the Phoenix Regional.

Alabama went 5-6 vs. the Top 25 in 2004. Seven times during the regular season Alabama faced a Top 25 team. It went 3-1 against the Top 25 in the 2004 NCAA tournament. Ten of Alabama s regular season opponents made the 2004 NCAA field, giving Alabama one of the nation s most challenging schedules.

Mark Gott fried collected his third 20-win season in six seasons as Alabama s head coach with the Tide s 20-13 record in 2004. It was the 23rd 20-win season in school history.

The Tide finished T-2nd in the SEC s Western Division despite having lost its starting lineup from 2003. Sophomore Kennedy W instan returned with the most starts from the previous season, however it was only 10 starts in the 31 games Alabama played in 2003.
