2014-15 TEAM NOTES

- Alabama returns four starters and eight letterwinners from last season's team. Included in the returning players are a pair of transfers who sat out the 2013-14 campain in Ricky Tarrant and Michael Kessens. Both were able to practice with the team but did not suit up for games due to NCAA transfer rules. In addition, the Crimson Tide welcomes five newcomers which includes fifh-year gradaute transfer Christophe Varidel.
- Tarrant and Kessens both transferred to Alabama and sat out the 2013-14 season due to NCAA rules. Tarrant scored over 1,000 points in his two seasons at Tulane and averaged 15.3 points. 3.4 assists and 1.5 steals a game during his career. Meanwhile, Kessens averaged 13.7 points, 8.8 rebounds and 1.4 assists per game, while shooting 54 percent from the floor as a true freshman at Longwood University in 2012-13.
- Varidel, a fifth-year graduate transfer from Chaminade (Hawai'i) University, played just five games during the 2013-14 campaign before an injury sidelined him the rest of the season. He averaged 21.2 points and 4.6 rebounds per game, while shooting 46.8 percent from beyond the arc. He exploded with a career-high 42-point outburst against then-No. 18 Baylor in the team's opening game of the EA Sports Maui Invitational.
- After playing a non-conference schedule that was ranked as the ninth-toughest in the nation a year ago, the Alabama men's basketball team will play another challenging non-conference slate during the 2014-15 season. The Tide will play the likes of Iowa State (Nov. 24), Xavier (Dec. 6), Wichita State (Dec. 16) and UCLA (Dec. 28), among others.
- Alabama played eight teams (a total of nine games) vs. NCAA Tournament squads. In addition, UA faced six teams (a total of nine games) that made the NIT. In all, the Tide's scheduled featured 15 teams (for a total of 18 games) that made the 2014 NCAA Tournament and NIT.
- According to the final ESPN.com's RPI rankings, Alabama finished with the No. 4 overall strength of schedule and the No. 9-ranked non-conference strength of schedule during the 2013-14 season. Only Kansas (1), Kentucky (2) and Wisconsin (3) played a tougher slate.
- Of the Tide's 19 losses during the 2013-14 season, 13 came against teams ranked among the top 80 in the RPI, according to KenPom.com.
- Despite a record of 13-19 on the year, the Tide finished with an RPI of No. 92 in the nation, according to KenPom.com. Alabama owned a record of 6-14 when playing top-100 RPI teams this season.
- Senior Trevor Releford finished the season with 574 points during the 2013-14 campaign, which ranked as the 13th-most points scored in a season in UA program history. It was the most points scored during a season since former standout Rod Grizzard had 611 points (7th in program history) in 2000-01.
- Releford finished his career ranked fourth in total points (1,873) in his career and was first in career steals (263), steals per game (1.9) and total games played (134).
- Forward Shannon Hale earned a spot on the Southeastern Conference All-Freshman team. He became the first Alabama player to earn the accolade since Releford in 2011.

- Alabama boasted six players named to the SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll, which ranked them second among the league's teams. Carl Engstrom (Health Studies), Retin Obasohan (Finance), Levi Randolph (Marketing), Dakota Slaughter (Marketing/Spanish), Ricky Tarrant (Consumer Sciences) and Isiah Wilson (Art) all earned the accolade.
- Alabama's 2014 recruiting class was ranked as high as No. 21 in the nation. Guards Justin Coleman (Birmingham, Ala./ Wenonah HS), Devin Mitchell (Suwanee, Ga./Fort Collins HS) and Riley Norris (Albertville, Ala./Albertville HS) are rated as top-100 recruits nationally and slated to join the Crimson Tide on the court for the 2014-15 season. UA also signed forward Jeff Garrett (Gadsden, Ala./Oldsmar (Fla.) Christian School) during the late signing period.
- In the past four seasons (2010-14), Alabama ranks fourth in the SEC in terms of conference wins with 39. Only Florida (55), Kentucky (50) and Tennessee (40) have more conference victories than the Crimson Tide over that span.
- As good as the Tide was at the line throughout the year (7th in SEC at 68.5 percent), the opposition was even better. Alabama opponents shot an impressive 74.7 percent from the foul line. According to KenPom.com, that number ranked 344th (out of 351 D-I teams) in the nation in opponent's free throw percentage.

2014-15 PRESEASON TEAM NOTES

ALABAMA SET FOR 102ND SEASON OF BASKETBALL IN 2014-15

- Alabama is set to open its 102nd season of basketball in 2014-15.
- The Tide has an all-time record of 1,581-969-1 (.620), which includes 749-568 (.596) in SEC play.
- Alabama ranks second in the SEC in total wins and win percentage.
- UA has made 31 NCAA (19) or NIT (12) appearances and won seven SEC regular-season titles and six SEC Tournament championships.

RELEFORD EARNS ALL-DISTRICT HONORS LAST SEASON

- Both the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) honored senior guard Trevor Releford by naming him to their respective all-district teams. The USBWA recognized Releford as a first-team all-district performer, while the NABC selected him to the second-team.
- It marked the second consecutive season Releford has earned all-district honors from the USBWA. He becomes the first Alabama player to earn back-to-back USBWA All-District accolades since Richard Hendrix achieved the feat in 2007 and 2008.
- Releford also became the first Alabama player to earn NABC All-District honors since JaMychal Green was named to the first team in 2011.

RELEFORD, HALE NAMED 2013-14 ALL-CONFERENCE

- Senior guard Trevor Releford was selected to the SEC All-Conference First Team, while Shannon Hale earned SEC All-Freshman Team honors according to a vote of the league's head coaches, which was announced on March 11.
- It marks the second consecutive season Releford has been named to the league's first team and it is the fourth consecutive year he was named as an all-conference performer. He earned Freshman All-SEC honors in 2011 and second team recognition in 2012.
- The only other players in program history to claim four straight all-league accolades were Jermareo Davidson (2004-07) and Jerry Harper (1953-56).
 Furthermore, Releford becomes the first Alabama player to earn back-toback first team honors since Kennedy Winston achieved the feat in 2004 and 2005.
- Meanwhile, Hale became the 15th player in program history to be named to the All-SEC Freshman Team and the first since Releford achieved the feat in 2011.

LEVI RANDOLPH NAMED FIRST TEAM ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT AGAIN

- Junior guard Levi Randolph was named to the Capital One Academic All-District 4 First Team as selected by College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), the organization announced on Jan. 30.
- With the nod, Randolph becomes the first Alabama player in program
 history to earn academic all-district first team honors in back-to-back
 seasons. He is now eligible for Academic All-America honors, which
 will be chosen in February an honor that no Alabama player has ever
 received.
- A native of Madison, Ala., Randolph maintains a 3.45 GPA as a marketing major and has been named to the Dean's List in three out of four semesters (3.1 GPA or better). He is a two-time SEC Academic Honor Roll recipient and is on pace to earn his undergraduate degree in August of 2014.
- On the court, the 6-5, 205-pound guard was equally as impressive. Randolph finished second on the team in scoring (9.5 ppg), rebounding (3.8 rpg) and minutes (29.7 mpg) and was third in total steals (22). He has played in 103 consecutive games since stepping foot on campus.

OBASOHAN NAMED TO SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM

- Sophomore guard Retin Obasohan was selected to the 2014 Southeastern Conference's Community Service team, it was announced on March 10 by the league office.
- Obasohan's community service has included Habitat for Humanity (2012, 2013), Project Angel Tree Books for Kids (2011-13) and Halloween Extravaganza (2011-13). In addition to those projects, Obasohan has given speeches to numerous local high schools and churches regarding to the importance of staying in school, how to succeed in life and rigors of life as a student-athlete. He also volunteered his time at Sarrell Dental free sports camps for underprivileged kids. Furthermore, back in his hometown of Antwerp, Belgium, Obasohan mentored younger kids at a boarding school.

NEARING THE CENTURY MARK

- Head coach Anthony Grant is one win shy of earning his 100th victory at the helm of the Alabama program. He would become the seventh head coach in the 101-year history to earn 100 victories at UA.
- Grant, has coached 170 total game since coming to Alabama (99-71), is on pace to become the fifth-fastest head coach to reach 100 wins at Alabama.

HALE MAKING IT RAIN

- Freshman Shannon Hale made a solid contribution for head coach Anthony Grant during his rookie season.
- Hale was named to the Southeastern Conference All-Freshman team, becoming the first Alabama player since Trevor Releford in 2011 to earn the honor,
- Hale's best game came on Feb. 26 when he collected a career-best 27 points and tied a career high with nine boards. He also set new bench marks in free throws made (10) and free throws attempted (11). For his efforts, he was named the SEC Freshman of the Week, becoming the first Alabama player to earn the honor since 2011.
- Throughout the season, Hale continuously improved. He recorded 13 double figure scoring games, with 11 of those coming in the Tide's 18-game SEC scheduled
- After seeing limited action during non-conference play during his freshman season, Hale ranked second on the team points (11.6) and rebounds (4.1) per game, while connecting 44 percent from the floor and 35 percent from beyond the arc in league play.

ALABAMA'S TOP-FIVE SCORER

- Guard Trevor Releford finished his career with 1,873 career points, which
 ranks fourth in program history. He finished just ahead of former great
 Buck Johnson (1983-86), who closed his career with 1,869 points. Only
 Reggie King (2,168 points from 1976-79), Eddie Phillips (1,937 points
 from 1979-82) and Leon Douglas (1,909 points from 1973-76) scored
 more points in their Alabama careers.
- During his senior season, Releford became the seventh player in program history and the first since 1993 to reach the 1,800-point plateau for his career. The last time a UA player reached the 1,800-point plateau came in 1993 when former great James "Hollywood" Robinson achieved the feat.
- During the 2012-13 campaign, Releford became the 46th player in program history to reach the 1,000-point plateau, doing so in just 82 contests.

DIFFERENCE IN HOME AND AWAY NUMBERS

 Alabama finished with a 13-4 record in games played at Coleman Coliseum this year. However, the Tide was 0-15 away from home, which included an 0-4mark in neutral site games.

- In its 17 home games, the Tide shot 48.4 percent from the floor and 37.4 percent from beyond the arc. However, when playing away from home, those numbers fall to 39.9 percent shooting from the floor and 28.7 percent from deep.

- Alabama finished the year with a 13-19 overall record, but the Tide's record could look entirely different had it finished some of the close games it lost.
- Alabama finished with a record of 5-13 on the season in contests that were decided by 10 or fewer points.
- In 15 of its 19 losses on the year, Alabama either held the lead or was
 within striking distance late in a game. However, in each instance, the
 Tide allowed the opposition to go on a game-deciding run late in the
 second half.

SIXTY IS SWEET, BUT 50 IS BETTER

- Alabama held seven opponents this season to 60 or fewer points, winning five of those contests.
- Since Anthony Grant's arrival in 2009, his teams have held the opposition to 60 or below a total of 83 times, going 68-15 (.819) when achieving the feat
- The Tide held two teams (North Florida and Charleston Southern) to 50 or fewer points this season.
- Grant's Alabama teams have held opponents to 50 or fewer points a total
 of 34 times in his five seasons at the Capstone. The Tide is 32-2 (.941)
 when hitting that mark.

LEVI LOVING HOME COURT

- Levi Randolph enjoyed playing at Coleman Coliseum better than most of his teammates, which is reflected when breaking down his numbers in home and road games during the season.
- In the Tide's 17 home games, Randolph ranked second in the team in scoring at 11.6 points per game, while shooting 49.6 percent from the floor and 38.9 percent from beyond the arc. However, in UA's 15 contests

HALE NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Alabama freshman forward Shannon Hale has been selected to the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week, league officials announced on March 3.
- Hale became the first Crimson Tide player to earn the league's freshman of the week award since Trevor Releford earned the accolade on Feb. 7, 2011.
- Hale, a 6-foot-8, 220-pound freshman forward from Johnson City, Tenn., earned the weekly honor after averaging 17 points and 6.5 rebounds a game in contests against Ole Miss and Auburn. For the week, Hale shot team-highs of 52.6 percent (10-of-19) from the floor, 66.7 percent (4-of-6) from beyond the arc and 90.9 percent (10-of-11) from the free throw line.
- Against the Rebels, Hale scored a game-high 27 points and pulled down nine rebounds – both season highs. He also contributed seven points and four boards in the win over Auburn.

GETTING TO THE LINE

- Alabama finished the season ranked seventh in the SEC, connecting on 68.5 percent of its free throw attempts for the year.
- Senior guard Trevor Releford finished third in the SEC in free throw percentage (84.8 percent).
- In addition, sophomore guard Retin Obasohan also benefited from the charity stripe this season. The Antwerp, Belgium, native had the most free throw attempts (156) and the second-most free throws made (104) on the team.
- Unfortunately, as good as the Tide was, the opposition was even better. Alabama opponents shot an impressive 74.7 percent from the foul line. According to KenPom.com, UA ranks 344th (out of 351 D-I teams) in the nation in opponent's free throw percentage.

TIDE'S TRENDS

- There were a few noticeable trends throughout the season when it comes to the Alabama basketball team.
- One of the biggest trends to keep in eye was the battle of the boards. The Tide owned a record of 9-1 when outrebounding the opposition, but is 4-17 when getting outrebounded.
- Below is a breakdown of a few other key factors to look into during a game. Alabama is:
- 11-9 when holding teams below 70 points

- 2-10 when allowing 70 or more points
- 10-2 when holding teams to below 65 points
- 3-17 when allowing team to score over 65 points
- 9-1 when outrebounding opponents
- 4-17 when opponents outrebound Alabama
- 13-6 when UA shoots better than opponent
- 0-13 when opponent shoots better than UA
- 8-6 when games decided by 11 or more points
- 5-13 when games decided by 10 or fewer points
- 12-5 when leading at half
- 1-13 when trailing at half
- 11-7 when shooting more free throws
- 1-12 when shooting less free throws

SEC HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

- Over the past two seasons, Alabama has won 16 of its last 18 home games against SEC foes (16-2, .889).
- Since Grant's arrival in 2009, Alabama owns a home record of 34-8 (.810) against SEC competition. Since 2011, the Tide boasts a 30-4 (.882) mark at home against the conference.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Through his five seasons at UA, Grant has a record of 65-16 (.802) on Alabama's home floor. During the 2013-14 season, the Tide finished 13-4 at home and outscored teams by an average of 9.5 points a game (73.4-63.8).
- Since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, Grant has won 61 of the last 72 games played under the arched roof of Coleman Coliseum (61-11; .847).
- Overall, Alabama owns a record of 530-120 (.815) in the facility's 47th season of use.
- Grant also led UA to 24 straight home victories that spanned the final home game of the 2009-10 season through the beginning of the 2011-12 season.

SHUFFLING THE STARTERS

- Head coach Anthony Grant used 14 different starting lineups in the team's 32 games on the year.
- No Alabama player started all 32 contests during the 2013-14 season.

PLAYERS HONORED AT POSTSEASON BASKETBALL BANQUET

- The University of Alabama men's basketball team officially closed the 2013-14 campaign with its annual awards banquet on April 1 at Coleman Coliseum. UA student-athletes, managers and support staff were recognized and honored for their efforts on and off the court throughout the season.
- The Crimson Tide finished the season with a 13-19 overall mark and tied for 10th in Southeastern Conference play with a 7-11 record. Alabama, which ended its season with a loss to LSU in the SEC Tournament, was joined by nearly 400 supporters and members of the Tuscaloosa Tip-Off Club, which sponsored the event along with Tide Pride.
- Following dinner, Grant spoke to the assembled crowd to give a few brief
 comments on the team's growth and success throughout the season and
 extended his heartfelt gratitude and thanks to the many supporters of the
 program.
- In addition to recognizing the entire team and staff, special awards were handed out as Trevor Releford was named the Most Outstanding Player, Shannon Hale was given the Outstanding Freshman Award, while Retin Obasohan was selected for the Hustle Award.
- Carl Engstrom, Levi Randolph and Dakota Slaughter were each given the Student-Athlete Award.


