2012-13 TEAM NOTES

- Alabama finished the 2012-13 season with a 23-13 overall record and a 12-6 SEC record. UA finished tied for second in the SEC.
- The 23 wins during the 2012-13 season marked the Tide's third consecutive 20-win season under head coach Anthony Grant (25-12 in 2011 and 21-12 in 2012). The last time Alabama had three consecutive seasons with 20 or more wins came in 1990, 1991 and 1992 when Wimp Sanderson achieved the feat – a span of just over 20 years.
- In addition, Alabama's 12-6 record in SEC play marked the third straight year that Grant has led his Alabama team to a record of over .500 in conference play. It is the first time since the 1994, 95 and 96 seasons that UA has finished over .500 in conference action in three consecutive seasons.
- Alabama held 24 of its 36 opponents during the 2012-13 season to under 60 points in a game. The Tide held a record of 19-5 (.826) when achieving the feat. In four seasons under head coach Anthony Grant, UA has held teams to 60 or fewer points a total of 76 times, going 62-14 (.816).
- Alabama allows opponents to score an average of 58.4 points per game, which ranked second in the Southeastern Conference and 18th in the nation. It is also the 12th-fewest points allowed per game in SEC history.
- Six of the top seven scorers on the team were either freshmen or sophomores. In fact, freshmen and sophomores account for 73 percent (46.1 combined points a game) of the team's total scoring, 67 percent (21.7 combined rebounds a game) of rebounding and 68 percent (7.7 combined assists per game) of the total assists.
- The Crimson Tide led the SEC in league games only with 9.1 steals per game. In fact, UA recorded 10 or more steals eight times during conference play, going 7-1 when reaching the figure. The Tide reached 10 steals or more on just three occasions in non-conference action.
- Guard Trevor Releford will come into next season as the SEC's active leader in points (1,299) and steals (194) and will rank second behind Tennessee's Trae Golden (344) in assists (298).
- When looking at the numbers, there is no doubt fifth-year senior guard Andrew Steele played a key factor for Alabama, despite just averaging 3.8 points and 2.0 rebounds a game. The lone senior on the 2012-13 team was not available to play in 15 of the Tide's 36 games this season due to injury. The Tide went 6-7 when Steele did not dress out for a game. However, Alabama was 17-6 when he suited up.

When factoring in the record during the months of November (6-0), January (6-2) and February, Alabama had a combined total record of 18-4 (Alabama went 1-5 during the month of December and 4-4 in March).

- For the season, guards Trevor Releford (14.9 ppg) and Trevor Lacey (11.4 ppg) are averaging a combined 26.3 ppg – approximately 42-percent of the team's 63.0 ppg average.
- Alabama ranked 304th among the 347 Division I schools in terms of roster experience, according to KenPom.com.
- The Tide finished with a 21-4 record on the year when it attempted the same or more foul shots in a game than its opponents.

2013-14 PRESEASON TEAM NOTES

ALABAMA SET FOR 101ST YEAR OF BASKETBALL

- The Alabama men's basketball team will play its 101st season of basketball during the 2013-14 season. Last year, the team celebrated 100 years of hoops at the University of Alabama.
- The Tide has an all-time record of 1,568-950-1 (.623), which includes a 742-557 (.571) in SEC play. UA has made 31 NCAA (19) or NIT (12) appearances and won seven SEC regular season titles and six SEC Tournament championships.

EIGHT LETTERWINNERS BACK FOR 2013-14 CAMPAIGN

- Alabama head coach Anthony Grant welcomes back eight letterwinners, including three starters, from last season's 23-13 NIT Quarterfinal team.
- Five of the top seven scorers off last year's team return, led by First Team All-SEC and All-District performer in senior guard Trevor Releford. The Kansas City, Mo., native topped the Crimson Tide last season in scoring (14.9 ppg), steals (2.1 spg), three-point field goal percentage (.407) and minutes (33.2 mpg).
- Junoir guard Rodney Cooper is back as the team's second-leading returning scorer after averaging 10.2 points per game a year ago. He also led the team in rebounding with 4.5 boards per contest.
- Other top players from last season include junior guard Levi Randolph (8.1 ppg and 4.2 rpg), junior forward Nick Jacobs (7.6 ppg, 4.1 rpg) and sophomore guard Retin Obasohan (3.9 ppg and 3.1 rpg).
- Junior center Carl Engstrom, who received a medical redshirt last season, has recovered from a knee injury he suffered early last year and will supply added depth to the post players.

GRANT WELCOMES FIVE NEWCOMERS - THREE ELIGIBLE TO PLAY THIS SEASON

- In addition to the returnees from a year ago, Alabama will also welcome five newcomers – three of which are eligible to suit up for the upcoming season. Below is a breakdown of each of the newcomers to this season's team:
- **Shannon Hale (6-8, 220, F, Johnson City, Tenn./Christ School):** A four-star recruit according to Rivals.com and ESPN.com ... ranked No. 21 in his position and No. 98 nationally by Rivals ... averaged 17.1 points and 6.0 rebounds a game as a senior at the Christ School under head coach David Gaines ... named first-team all-state and the CAA conferece player of the year in 2013 ... first team all-conference in both 2012 and 2013 ... averaged 15.4 points and 5.2 rebounds a game during his junior season ... won three-point competition at the Future150 camp.
- **Algie Key (6-4, 175, G, Decatur, Ga./Barton (Kan.) CC):** A two-time JUCO All-American at Barton Community College under head coach Craig Fletchall ... averaged 17.6 points and 6.2 rebounds a game last season and 18.7 points and 6.5 rebounds a game as a freshman (2011-12) ... finished fourth among the school's all-time scoring (1,214 points) and assist (315) leaders ... a two-time first team all-conference and all-region performer.
- **Jimmie Taylor (6-9, 235, F/C, Greensboro, Ala./Greensboro HS):** Rated in the ESPN Top 100 as the No. 9 player at his position, No. 17 in the region and No. 69 overall recruit ... the No. 1-rated prospect in the state of Alabama and listed among the Boys Super 5 and first team all-state following his senior season according to AL.com ... averaged 13 points, 11.3 rebounds and 3.5 blocks per game as a senior ... named the Regional MVP by the Alabama High School Athletic Association ... tabbed the Tuscaloosa All-Metro Player of the Year in 2013 ... participated in the Alabama-Mississippi All-Star game ... nominated as a 2013 McDonald's All-American ... led Greensboro high school to the 2011 Alabama 3A State Championship ... was named the tournament MVP during his squad's championship title run ... cousin of former Tide standout and Southeastern Conference Player of the Year (2002) Erwin Dudley.
- Junior guard Ricky Tarrant (Pleasant Grove, Ala./Tulane) and sophomore forward Michael Kessens (Nyon, Switzerland/Longwood) both transferred from other Division I schools will have to sit out the 2013-14 season per NCAA rules. The duo will be eligible to suit up for the 2014-15 campaign.

RELEFORD ATOP SEC RANKINGS

- Guard Trevor Releford will come into the 2013-14 season ranking at the

top of several categories among the SEC active leaders.

- With 1,299 career points, Releford will begin the season as the active leader in career points, ranking 16 points ahead of Arkansas' Marshawn Powell.
- He will also be the SEC leader in total steals, with 194 takeaways during his three year career.
- In addition, Releford's 298 career assists also ranks atop the SEC active league leaders.

ALABAMA HAS 69 WINS OVER LAST THREE YEARS

- Alabama head coach Anthony Grant, who is entering his fifth season at the Capstone in 2013-14, has guided the Crimson Tide to 69 victories over the past three seasons – an average of 23.0 wins per year.
- In addition, UA has made three consecutive postseason appearances coming into the new year, including an NIT runner-up finish in 2011, an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2012 and an NIT quarterfinal showing last season.
- Through his four seasons as the Tide's head coach, Grant has a record of 86-52 (.623). The 86 victories are the most wins by any UA men's basketball coach over his first four seasons in school history.
- In seven seasons as a head coach, Grant has compiled a record of 162-77 (.678), with six postseason appearances (3 NCAA and 3 NIT) and six 20-win seasons.

PLAYING WELL IN THE 'NICK' OF TIME

- Sophomore forward Nick Jacobs continued to get better and better throughout the 2012-13 season.
- He reached double figures in nine of his final 14 games. In fact, Jacobs recorded 13 double-digit games in his final 23 games, compared to just one during non-conference play.
- In UA's final 23 games of the season, Jacobs has averaged 9.1 points, 4.7 rebounds and 1.0 blocks a game, while shooting a team-leading 57.4 percent (89-of-155) from the floor.
- In comparison, the Atlanta, Ga., native averaged just 5.0 points and 2.9 rebounds per game in non-conference action.
- Below is a breakdown of Jacobs' numbers in non-conference vs. conference play.

RETIN'S RISE

- Redshirt freshman Retin Obasohan played sparingly over UA's first 11 SEC games, seeing action in only seven of those games. But he was a spark off the bench for the Tide in its final 12 contests.
- During the 12-game stretch, Obasohan averaged 6.8 points, 2.0 rebounds and 1.1 steals per game.
- Below is a break down of his first 11 SEC games compared to the team's final 12 contests.

FIRST TIME IN LONG TIME

- UA compiled a 23-13 record during the 2012-13 campaign, which included a 12-6 mark in SEC play.
- It marked the Tide's third consecutive 20-win season under head coach Anthony Grant (25-12 in 2011 and 21-12 in 2012).
- The last time Alabama had three consecutive seasons with 20 or more wins came in 1990, 1991 and 1992 when Wimp Sanderson achieved the feat – a span of just over 20 years.
- In addition, Alabama's 12-6 record in SEC play marked the third straight year that Grant has led his Alabama team to a record of over .500 in conference play.
- It is the first time since the 1994, 1995 and 1996 seasons that UA has finished over .500 in conference action in three consecutive seasons.

2013-14 PRESEASON TEAM NOTES

RELEFORD NAMED DEFENSIVE ALL-AMERICAN

- University of Alabama junior guard Trevor Releford was named as one of 21 members to the 2013 Lefty Driesell Defensive All-America team, announced CollegeInsider.com. In being selected to the team, Releford becomes the first Alabama player to earn the recognition in the award's four years of existence.
- Releford was one of just two SEC players named to the 21-player list (Nerlens Noel, Kentucky).
- Releford finished the year with 70 steals, which ranked as the third-most steals in a season in program history. In doing so, the Kansas City, Mo., native became the program's all-time steals leader (194) and is just the third player in program history to record 70 steals or more in season.
- For the season, Releford led the Tide, ranked second in the SEC and 36th in the nation in steals per game (2.1). He also topped the team in scoring (14.9 ppg), three-point shooting (.407), free throw percentage (.824) and field goals made (167) and attempted (351) on the year.

GETTING IT DONE WITH DEFENSE

- The Alabama defense during head coach Anthony Grant's tenure once again was ranked among the nation's best.
- Alabama's defense ranked led the SEC in three-point field goal percentage defense (.308), ranked second points per game allowed (58.4), third in steals (8.2) and fifth in field goal percentage defense (.405).
- Nationally, UA finished 18th in points per game allowed, 39th in steals per game and 42nd in three-point field goal percentage defense.
- According to KenPom.com, Alabama is ranked 20th in the nation in overall defensive efficiency.

DEFENSE RANKED AMONG ALL-TIME SEC BEST...AGAIN

- Alabama's 58.4 points allowed per game ranked as the 12th-lowest in SEC history.
- It is the third straight season the Crimson Tide's defense has ranked among the best-ever in the SEC in terms of points allowed to the opposition.
- In 2011-12, UA's 58.1 points allowed ranked sixth-best in league history at the time. The Tide also allowed 59.4 points per contest in the 2010-11 campaign, which is 12th-best.

LEANING ON LEVI

- Sophomore guard Levi Randolph played an important role in UA's wins vs. its defeats.
- Randolph averaged 9.1 points per game, a team-leading 4.7 rebounds a game and shot 46 percent from the floor in the team's 23 wins. However, those numbers dropped to 6.4 ppg and 37 percent shooting from the floor in the Tide's 13 defeats.
- In fact, when Randolph scored at least seven points in a game this season,

Alabama had a stellar record of 16-4.

FREE THROW IMPORTANCE

- Alabama had a record of 21-4 when it got to the foul line more times than its opponents during the 2012-13 season. However, UA was 2-9 when opponents get to the charity stripe more.
- Those figures held even more true during SEC play this year. In Alabama's 12 league victories, it attempted the same or more free throws than its opponents. However, the Tide went 0-6 in conference play when opponents get more free throw attempts in a game.

WISHING DECEMBER NEVER HAPPENED

- Alabama was glad to see the month of December come to an end. The Tide struggled during the month, going 1-5 in the six games, including an 0-3 mark at home.
- It was quite the opposite during the months of November (6-0), January (6-2) and February (6-2). During these three months, the Tide went a combined 18-4 (Alabama went 4-4 in March).

A MILESTONE REACHED

- Guard Trevor Releford scored 26 points in the loss at then-No. 10 Missouri on Jan. 8. In doing so, he became the 46th player in program history to reach the 1,000-point plateau, doing so in just 82 contests.
- The Kansas City, Mo., native finished his third season at Alabama with 1,299 points, which places him in 26th on the school's all-time scoring leaders list.
- In addition, with 194 career steals, Releford is the only player in program history to record at least 1,000 points and 190 steals for his career.

STEALS KING

- With three steals at LSU on Feb. 22, guard Trevor Releford became the all-time steals leader at Alabama (He finished the season with 194 career steals). The former mark was held by Senario Hillman (2007-10), who finished with 176 takeaways in his four-year career.
- Releford recorded 70 steals during the 2012-13 season, which marks the third consecutive year he has had at least 60 steals in a season.
- His 70 takeaways places him third overall among the top-10 single-season steals leaders for a third straight season. His 60 steals as a freshman ranked eighth-best in program history and his 64 takeaways a year ago were the fourth-most in UA lore. He is the only player to have his name among the single-season steal leaders for three different years.
- Moreover, Releford's 1.9 career steals per game average ranks as the program's best average in the record books.

60 IS THE KEY

- During head coach Anthony Grant's tenure, the Alabama men's basketball team has fared well when holding the opposition to 60 points or below.
- Alabama held 16 of its final 20 opponents, and 24 of its 36 opponents this year to below 60 points in a game. The Tide went 19-5 when doing so this season.
- Since the 2009-10 season, Grant's first year at the Capstone, the Crimson Tide has won over 80 percent of the time when it achieves the feat.
- In the 76 occurrences of holding the opposition to 60 points or fewer during Grant's tenure, Alabama owns a record of 63-13 (.829).

ALABAMA GAME TRENDS

- There were a few noticeable trends with the Alabama basketball team during the 2012-13 season.
- Below is a breakdown of a few other key factors to look into during a game. Alabama is:
 - 19-5 when UA holds a team to under 60 points
 - 18-3 when recording at least 8 steals in a game
 - 18-4 when shooting more FTs than opponent
 - 18-6 when leading at halftime
 - 16-4 when scoring 60 or more points
 - 16-4 in home games
 - 16-5 when UA commits fewer TOs than opp.
 - 15-3 when opponents shoot less than 40%
 - 14-4 when UA shoots better than opponent
 - 10-3 when outrebounding opponents
 - 2-9 when opponents shoot more FTs in a game
 - 0-5 when UA allows 70 or more in a game

50 OR FEWER

- Ten times during the 2012-13 season, the Alabama defense held an opponent to 50 or fewer points in a game.
- Having just closed out his fourth season, UA head coach Anthony Grant has held opponents to 50 or fewer points in a game 32 times, owning a 30-2 record when achieving the feat.
- As a comparison, prior to Grant's arrival, Alabama teams held opponents to 50 or fewer points a total of 27 times (27-0) from 1996-97 through 2008-09 – a span of 13 years.

RELEFORD'S RECORD BREAKING DAY

- Alabama's Trevor Releford had a day to remember in the triple overtime loss at LSU on Feb. 22.
- The junior guard connected on 14-of-18 shots from the floor, including hitting all four of his three pointers, to account for a career high 36 points. In addition to his career high in scoring, the Kansas City, Mo., native had career-best marks for field goals made, field goals attempted and minutes played (50).
- Not only that, but with three steals against the Tigers, Releford also became the program's all-time steals leader (currently has 194). He passed former record holder Senario Hillman, who had 176 steals during his four-year career.

WINNING THE CLOSE GAMES

- Alabama played 17 games during the season that were decided by five or fewer points.
- In fact, 10 of the last 19 games were decided by four or fewer points, which includes a trio of one-point games (won, 50-49, vs. Texas A&M and lost, 54-

53, at Tennessee and 58-57 vs. Maryland).

- For the season, the Crimson Tide went 10-7 in games decided by five or fewer points and were 7-5 in contests decided by three or fewer points.

STEALING THE SHOW

- Alabama recorded a season-high 18 steals in the win over Mississippi State (2/20), which were the most takeaways in a game since recording a school record 22 steals in a 99-57 win over Jacksonville State on Dec. 14, 2001.
- According to KenPom.com, the Tide is recording steals on 12.8 percent of its opponents' possessions. That number ranked second in the SEC and 17th in the nation.
- The Crimson Tide led the SEC in league games only with 9.1 steals per game. In fact, UA has recorded 10 or more steals eight times in league play this season, going 7-1 when reaching the figure. The Tide reached 10 steals or more on just three occasions in non-conference play.
- UA's 8.1 steals per game for the year ranked third in the SEC and is tied for 39th nationally.
- Alabama finished 18-3 this season when recording at least eight steals in a game.

COMEBACK KIDS

- Three times in SEC play, the Crimson Tide had a double-digit comeback to record a win.
- Alabama trailed by as many as 14 points (20-6) and by 11 points at halftime vs. Texas A&M on Jan. 19. But Tide outscored the Aggies, 35-23, in the second half to get the win.
- UA trailed by as many as 11 points (31-20) and by nine points at halftime vs. Kentucky on Jan. 22. But again, the Tide had a strong effort in the second half, outscoring the Wildcats 35-22 over the final 20 minutes to record a victory.
- UA trailed by eight at halftime and by as many as 11 in the second half before outscoring Vanderbilt, 35-23, in the final 20 minutes to earn the win.
- Alabama had four games in all in which it trailed by double figures only to come back and win (trailed South Dakota State by 13 and won 70-67).
- Of its 23 victories on the year, the Crimson Tide trailed at some point in 20 of them.

ANOTHER REGULAR-SEASON TOURNAMENT; ANOTHER TROPHY

- For the second consecutive season, Alabama captured a regular-season tournament trophy, winning the 2K Sports Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project.
- The Crimson Tide won all four games in the event, defeating South Dakota State (70-67 on Nov. 9) and West Alabama (80-49 on Nov. 11) at Coleman Coliseum, before a pair of victories in Madison Square Garden in New York City over Oregon State (65-62 on Nov. 15) and Villanova (77-55 on Nov. 16).
- A year ago, UA had three wins to capture the 2011 Puerto Rico Classic.
- Including the three victories in San Juan, Puerto Rico and the four wins in this season's 2K Sports Classic, the Tide has won seven consecutive games in regular-season tournament play.
- Alabama has competed in a total of 86 regular-season tournaments, capturing 32 titles while compiling an overall record of 134-73 (.647).
