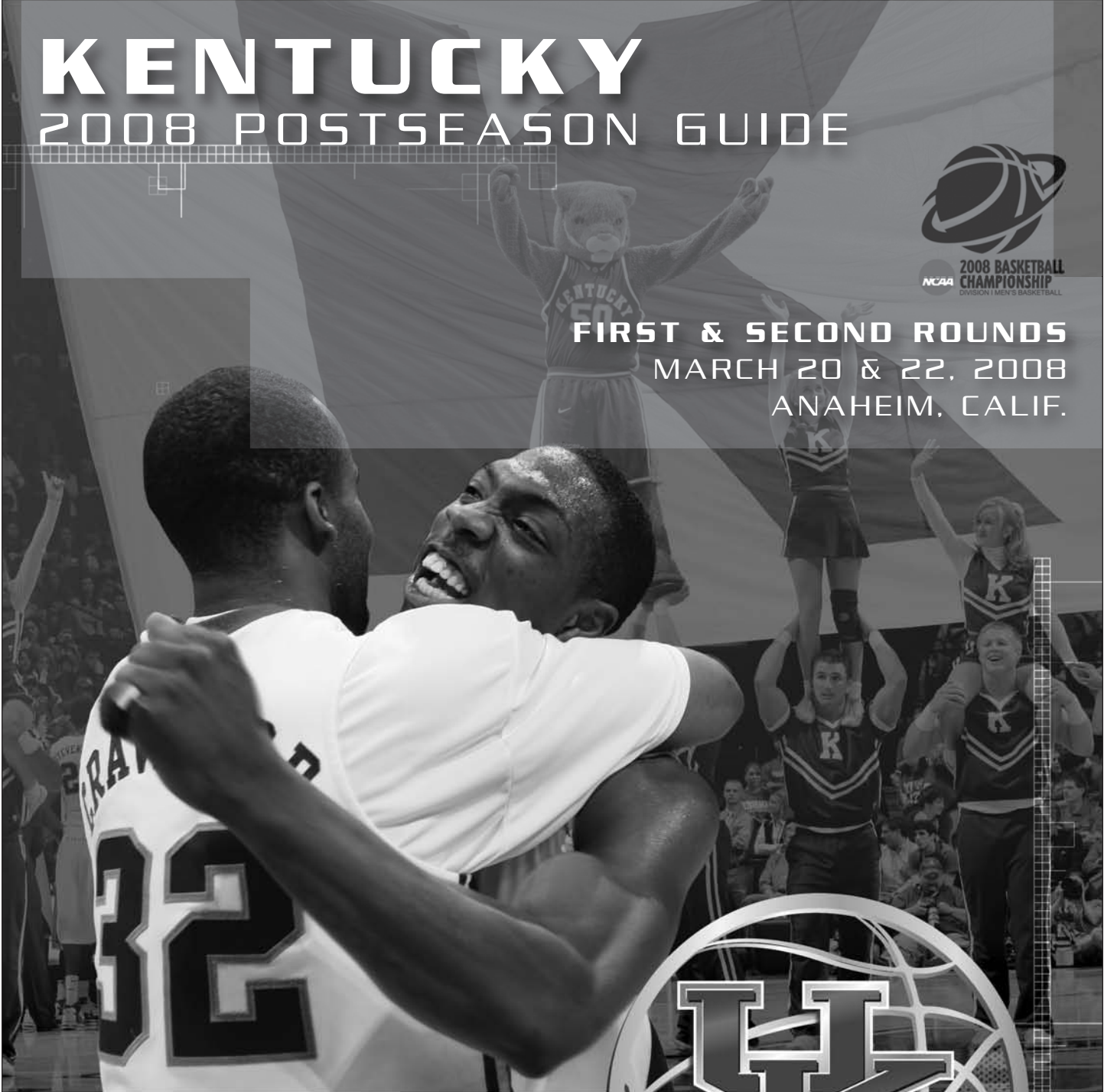

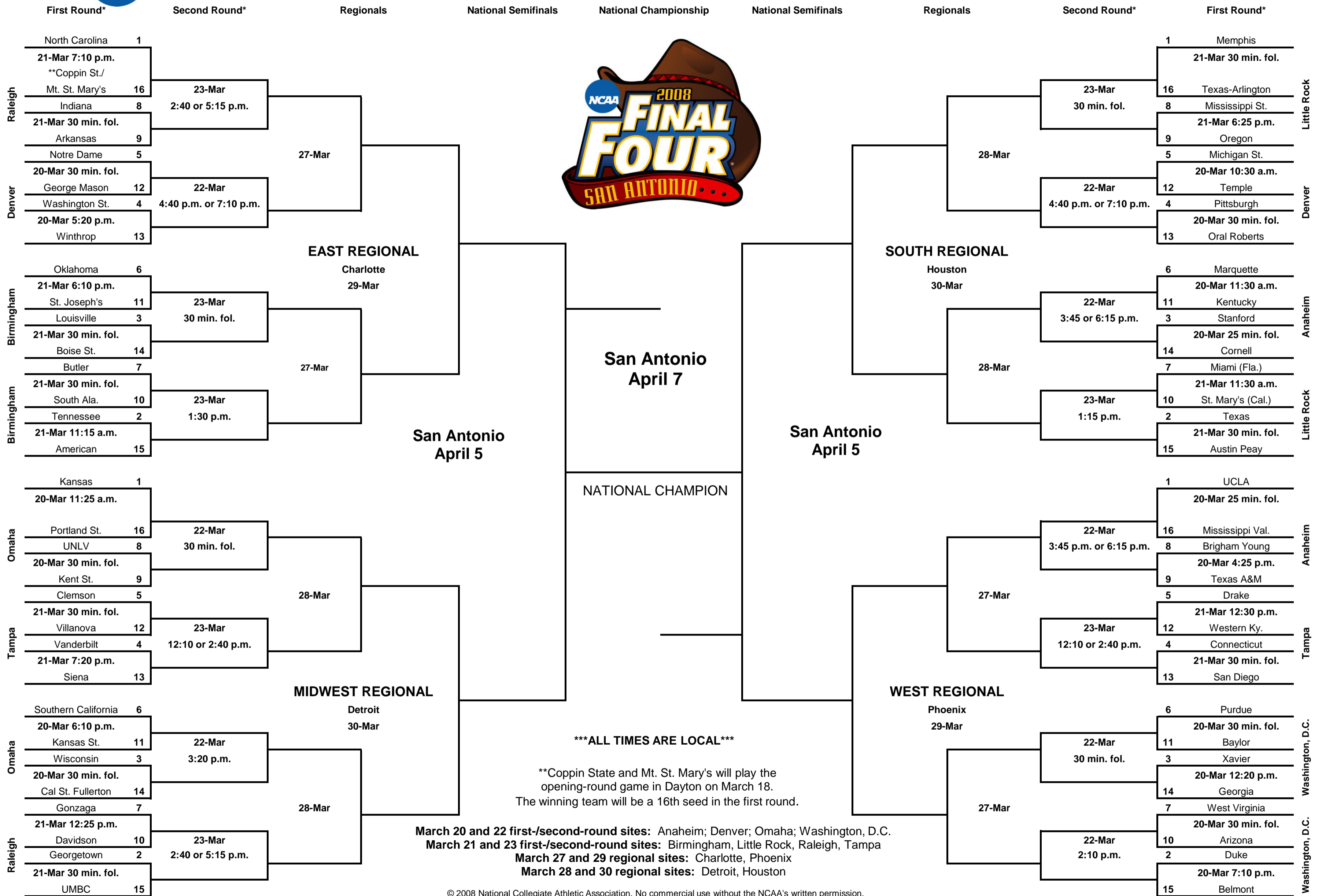

UK SET FOR RECORD 49TH NCAA TOURNAMENT

Kentucky earned its record 49th NCAA Tournament berth, the Wildcats' 17th-consecutive bid to the Big Dance, earning the No. 11 seed in the South Regional in Anaheim, Calif.

The 17-straight appearances is the fifth-longest ever and the third-longest active streak in the nation. Arizona has the longest run with 24 consecutive trips and Kansas is second at 19 straight.

The Wildcats face Big East foe Marquette in Thursday's first round. Kentucky owns a 7-6 record against Marquette, with nine of those meetings coming the NCAA Tournament. UK is 4-5 against the Golden Eagles in NCAA tournament action.

The last time the two met, Dwyane Wade recorded a triple-double (29p, 11r, 11a) and Marquette upset the top-ranked Wildcats 83-69 in the 2003 NCAA Elite Eight.

UK has advanced to the second round in each of the past 16 NCAA Tournaments, the longest such streak in the country.

With more NCAA Tournament games (141) and wins (98) than any other school, Kentucky has won seven national championships and has been to 13 Final Fours, 31 Elite Eights and 40 Sweet 16s.

CAT SCRATCHES

- UK is the all-time NCAA win leader with 1,966 victories.
- Kentucky leads all schools in the number of NCAA Tournament appearances (49), games (141) and wins (98).
- UK is appearing in its 17th-straight NCAA Tournament, which trails only Arizona (24) and Kansas (19) as the longest current consecutive appearances streak.
- UK has advanced to nine of the last 13 Sweet 16s and nine of the last 16 Elite Eights.
- Kentucky has won a first round game in 16-straight NCAA Tournaments (every year since 1992), the longest such streak in the nation. The Cats' last first-round loss came in 1987.
- Kentucky played 13 games against teams in this year's tournament, going 5-8 in those games.
- UK is an 11seed for the first time.
- UK is 1-1 in the Southern California area in NCAA Tournament play. The Wildcats went 1-1 in the 1975 Final Four in San Diego.
- UK was 0-1 against current Big East members this season, including a loss against Louisville. Kentucky 162-67 (.707) all-time against current members of the Big East.
- Billy Gillispie was named SEC Co-Coach of the Year by league coaches.
- Gillispie has been named his league's conference coach of the year in five-straight seasons.
- Patrick Patterson was named SEC Co-Freshman of the Year.
- Ramel Bradley (1st Team), Joe Crawford (2nd Team) and Patrick Patterson (2nd Team) were all named All-SEC by league coaches.

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- UK is 39-9 in tournament openers and has won its last 17 first-round games. The Cats last first-round loss was in 1987, when it lost to 9th-seeded Ohio State as a No. 8 seed.
- Kentucky has earned an 11-5 record in the second round since 1992.
- Since 1992, UK is 81-21 (.794) in postseason play (SEC and NCAA).
- The SEC landed six teams in this year's tournament including Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State, Tennessee and Vanderbilt. That ties with the Pac 10 and Big 12 for second-most behind the Big East's eight teams.
- The Wildcats are facing a Big East foe in the first round of the NCAA Tournament for the second-straight season. Kentucky defeated Villanova last year 67-58.
- UK is playing a Big East opponent for the fourth-straight year in the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats defeated Cincinnati in the second round of the 2005 NCAA Tournament; lost to UConn in the second round of the 2006 tournament; and defeated Villanova in the first round of the 2007 tournament.

KENTUCKY-MARQUETTE NO STRANGERS

The nine meetings between Kentucky-Marquette in the NCAA Tournament makes it the most common series in NCAA Tournament history.

Although UK leads the all-time series, 7-6, Marquette owns a 4-5 advantage in head-to-head NCAA Tournament play.

PERFECT IN THE FIRST ROUND

UK and UConn are the only two teams since 1990 with at least five tourney appearances that are unbeaten in the First Round of action. Kentucky is 16-0 in the NCAA First Round since 1990 and UConn is a spotless 14-0 over that same span. Other records for notable schools in the first round since 1990 are: North Carolina (15-1), Duke (15-2), Kansas (16-2), Arizona (12-6), Michigan State (11-4) and Texas (12-4).

Kentucky has advanced into the second round of every NCAA Tournament since 1992 (16-straight first-round wins).

CURRENT CATS IN THE NCAA TOURNEY

Nine current Cats have seen action in the NCAA Tournament, led by seniors Ramel Bradley and Joe Crawford, who have participated in eight games apiece.

Bradley has started twice while averaging 16.5 minutes. He's averaging 4.3 ppg while shooting (12-14) 86 percent from the free throw line.

Crawford has been in the starting line-up four times averaging 19.3 minutes, while averaging 4.6 ppg.

Sophomores Mark Coury, Ramon Harris, Derrick Jasper, Jodie MEEKS, Dwight Perry, Michael Porter and Perry Stevenson all saw time in last season's tournament.

SCOUTING MARQUETTE

Marquette, located in Milwaukee, Wisc., (470 miles north of Lexington) is a member of the Big East Conference.

The Golden Eagles have four players averaging double-digits, led by junior guard Jerel McNeal (14.3 ppg).

Sophomore forward Lazar Hayward leads the team in rebounding, averaging 6.5 rpg, 20th in the Big East.

Tom Crean is in his ninth season as a head coach and has spent them all at Marquette, where he has posted a 189-95 (.665) record. Crean has led the Golden Eagles to four NCAA Tournaments, including a trip to the 2003 Final Four.

SERIES HISTORY

Kentucky owns a 7-6 record against Marquette, with nine of the meetings coming in the NCAA Tournament, including seven straight and nine of the last 11.

The Dwyane Wade-led Golden Eagles eliminated the No. 1 seed Wildcats in the 2003 Elite Eight. Wade posted a triple-double (29 points, 11 rebounds, 11 assists) against the Wildcats to carry Marquette to the Final Four.

The two schools have not met in the regular season since 1961 in Chicago.

Of the 13 previous meetings, only four have been played in either school's home town.

KENTUCKY-MARQUETTE CONNECTIONS

- Marquette assistant coach Buzz Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2005, 2006) under current UK head coach Billy Gillispie.

- Kentucky's Ramel Bradley and Marquette's Dwight Burke each hail from Brooklyn, N.Y. Bradley attended Manhattan's Park West High School before transferring to IMG Academy (Fla.) for his final year. Burke attended St. Benedict's Prep in New Jersey.

CATS RETURN TO SUNNY CALIFORNIA

Kentucky is 5-3 all-time in California, including a 2-2 record in the Los Angeles area and 1-1 in Anaheim's Honda Center.

The Honda Center saw the Wildcats defeat UCLA, 52-50, in the Dec. 2003 at the John Wooden Classic. UK lost to the Bruins, 82-81, at the same event in Dec. 1994.

the Big East have come against Notre Dame, against whom the Cats are 41-17 (.707). The Wildcats are playing their second Big East opponent this season. UK dropped an 89-75 decision to Louisville earlier this year.

UK posted a 3-0 record against the Big East last year, collecting wins over Depaul, Louisville and Villanova.

GILLISPIE NAMED SEC COACH OF THE YEAR

UK head coach Billy Gillispie was named the SEC Co-Coach of the Year, along with Tennessee's Bruce Pearl, by league coaches. He was also given the honor by Rivals.com.

The Gillispie-led Wildcats overcame numerous injuries to tie for the SEC's second-best league record (12-4) and second-place in the SEC East.

It is fifth-straight year Gillispie has been named his league's conference coach of the year. In 2004, he was the WAC Coach of the Year honor at UTEP. He then won similar recognition by either coaches or a media outlet for each of the three seasons he was at Texas A&M.

It is the 15th time that a Kentucky coach received the league's coach of the year honor as voted on by SEC coaches.

PATTERSON IS SEC FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Patrick Patterson, along with Florida's Nick Calathes, was named the SEC's Co-Freshman of the Year by league coaches, despite missing the final three conference games with a stress fracture in his left foot. He was also given the honor outright by Rivals.com

Patterson finished the regular season as one of two freshmen to rank in the SEC's top 10 in both scoring (8th) and rebounding (7th), and is one of two players in the league's top 10 in points, rebounds, field goal percentage (5th) and free throw percentage (9th).

It marks the first time that a Wildcat has been named the league's freshman of the year.

WILDCATS RECEIVE SEC HONORS

Ramel Bradley, Joe Crawford and Patrick Patterson were all named All-SEC by league coaches.

Bradley was a first team All-SEC selection, while Crawford and Patterson were both second team selections.

Patterson was also voted to the SEC All-Freshman team, while Bradley was named to the SEC All-Defensive team.

STEVENSON FILLING IN NICELY

Sophomore Perry Stevenson has filled in nicely for the Wildcats in the low post since freshman Patrick Patterson was sidelined for the season with a stress fracture in his left foot.

In the four games since Patterson's departure, Stevenson is averaging 9.3 points, 10.0 rebounds, 2.5 blocks and 35.8 minutes.

MARCH MADNESS

The Wildcats enjoy seeing the month of March come around as they have rolled up a 276-106 (.723) record in the third month of the year. The

Cats are 59-15 (.797) at home, 27-22 (.551) on the road and, most importantly, 191-70 (.732) at neutral sites.

CATS CLOSE OUT SEASON ON A RUN

Kentucky's 11-2 record in the final 13 games of the regular season has been surpassed only twice since the league split in 1992. In the 1996 and 2003 seasons, UK finished with a perfect 16-0 conference record.

DEFENSIVE INTENSITY

In two of its last three regular season games, the UK defense held two of the SEC's most prolific scorers (UT's Chris Lofton and USC's Devan Downey) to just 23 points, an average of 11.5 ppg. The Wildcats held Downey to nine points, 10 points below his average.

NO QUIT IN THESE CATS

Kentucky has shown an ability to bounce back following a loss. UK is 7-4 in games following a loss.

The Cats' Feb. 12 loss at Vanderbilt was its worst SEC loss ever. However, UK managed to rebound for a 67-63 win at LSU four days later.

On March 2, in their first game with out Patrick Patterson, the Cats dropped a 63-60 game at No. 1 Tennessee. Three days later, UK picked up another road win, 71-63, at South Carolina.

PATTERSON NAMED ALL-DISTRICT

Freshman Patrick Patterson has been named second-team NABC District 7.

Patterson is now eligible for the State Farm Division I All-America teams to be announced on Saturday, April 5, at the 2008 NABC Convention in San Antonio.

STEVENSON DOUBLES UP AGAIN

Perry Stevenson recorded his second double-double in three games and the third of his career in UK's win over Florida.

Stevenson tied his career high with 18 points while pulling down 10 rebounds. The 6-9 sophomore also registered five blocked shots.

UNPARALLELED TRADITION

The Wildcats own an unparalleled tradition of success. Since 1903, the University of Kentucky has fielded 105 basketball teams. The first national championship was an NIT title in 1946. The first NCAA title came in 1948 and the latest, No. 7 occurred 1998. No other program can claim the unparalleled success that matches the Wildcats' efforts over the past century.

BLOCK PARTY

Kentucky has recorded 32 blocked shots in its last five games, including a season-best 11 against Ole Miss. Not only was it a season high, but it was the most blocked shots since the Cats recorded 11 rejections vs. Morehead State on Dec. 8, 2004.

Perry Stevenson, who ranked third in league games with 2.25 bpg, registered six of the blocks against the Rebels, a season high for the sophomore.

The 6-9 sophomore has recorded 23 blocked shots in his last eight games and has altered a shot in 13 of his last 14 games.

BRADLEY IS CLUTCH

In SEC play, Ramel Bradley averaged 11.1 of his 16.9 points after intermission. He posted double figures after halftime in 12 of the last 15 games in which he has played the second half.

WILDCATS AMONG SEC BEST

Freshman Patrick Patterson (9th, 16.4 ppg) and seniors Joe Crawford (5th, 17.3 ppg) and Ramel Bradley (11th, 15.8 ppg) are among the SEC's top 11 in scoring, while Patterson is one of four SEC players to rank among the top 10 in both points and rebounds (7th, 7.7 rpg).

Patterson also ranks fifth in the league and 28th nationally in field goal percentage (.574).

Bradley (.826) and Crawford (.779) rank second and fourth in free throw percentage, respectively. Patterson is ninth in the SEC in free throw percentage (.731).

Crawford is also among SEC leaders in three-point percentage (.352) and three-pointers made (2.00), ranking 11th, while Bradley (1.90) checks in at 13th.

Furthermore, Kentucky is the only team in the

league to have three players listed among the SEC's top 11 scoring leaders.

IRONMEN

Twenty-six times this season a Wildcat has played every minute of a game. Ramel Bradley has posted 14 complete games, followed by Patrick Patterson (seven), Ramon Harris (three), Joe Crawford (once) and Derrick Jasper (once).

Before he suffered his season ending injury, Patterson was averaging a league high 38.92 minutes in SEC action having played 506 of 535 possible minutes (95 percent) in conference play.

In January, Ramel Bradley played 244 of 245 possible minutes in SEC play. However, a hard foul at the 8:44 mark of the first half at Georgia sent Bradley to the bench for the remainder of the game. Previously he was averaging 42.8 minutes in SEC play. He sat the out the game at Auburn with a viral infection.

Prior to a minute of rest against Tennessee, Bradley had played every minute in a four-game stretch (vs. Louisville, Vanderbilt, Mississippi State and Florida), which included three overtime periods.

Bradley and Patrick Patterson both played all 50 minutes in Kentucky's double-overtime win over Vanderbilt, while Joe Crawford played 48. Bradley then played the full complement of 45 minutes against Florida while Patterson contributed 44 and Crawford 42 minutes.

In UK's SEC Tournament overtime game against Georgia, Bradley and Harris each played the full 45 minutes, while Jasper and Crawford and each played 44 minutes.

PATTERSON OUT FOR SEASON

Freshman Patrick Patterson is out the rest of the season after being diagnosed with a stress fracture in his left ankle. Patterson, the only freshman ranked among the SEC's top 10 scorers (16.4 points per game) and rebounders (7.7 rebounds per game), had an x-ray taken Feb. 29 at the UK Hospital that confirmed the injury.

Patterson is wearing a cast on his left foot and will be out approximately eight weeks.

Prior to his injury, Patterson, along with seniors Ramel Bradley and Joe Crawford, was ranked among the SEC's top 10 scorers. The trio accounted for 68 percent of the Wildcats' offense and were responsible for 66 of UK's 77 double-figure scoring games. And all three reached double figures in 15 of UK's first 26 games.

CATS STRUGGLE WITH INJURIES

The Wildcats have battled a tremendous number of injuries this season. Six of UK's top seven scorers have missed at least one game. Those six have missed a combined 41 contests.

Below is a comprehensive list of Cats who have missed game or practice time with injuries:

- Ramel Bradley - Concussion (Missed final 29 minutes against Georgia); Viral infection (Missed game at Auburn)
- Patrick Patterson - Ankle (Missed Houston game); Stress fracture in ankle (Out for season)

- Jodie Meeks - (Missed 19 games total) Fractured pelvis, early Nov. (six games); Returned against Houston; Right hip flexor (13 games)
- Derrick Jasper - (Missed 11 games total) Microfracture surgery on left knee, June (10 games); sprained MCL in left knee (MSU game).
- Jared Carter - Shoulder surgery on right shoulder, June (Missed offseason conditioning time)
- Joe Crawford - Arthroscopic surgery on left knee, late summer (Missed offseason conditioning); plantar fascia in left foot (Missed USC game).
- Ramon Harris - Stress fracture in left foot, early Nov. (Missed first four games); Hip pointer (Left in second half of Alabama game)
- Michael Porter - Concussion, Oct. (Missed practice time)

HOME SWEET HOME

Kentucky is one of three SEC teams (Tennessee and Vanderbilt) to win every SEC home game this season. Included in UK's eight wins at Rupp are victories over then No. 13 Vanderbilt and then No. 3 Tennessee.

The Wildcats posted better numbers at home in conference play, averaging 68.5 ppg at home compared to 64.1 on the road, while allowing 62.2 ppg in Rupp and 69.1 ppg away from home. UK posted a +4.4 rebounding margin at home compared to -1.3 on the road.

FREE THROW SUCCESS

Kentucky ranks third in the Southeastern Conference and ranks 39th nationally in free throw shooting (.734), led by seniors Ramel Bradley (.826) and Joe Crawford (.779) and freshman Patrick Patterson (.731), who rank second, fourth and ninth, respectively, in the league.

Not to be lost in the shuffle is Perry Stevenson, who is currently shooting .768 (43-56) from the free throw line, which would place him sixth in the league. However, Stevenson does not have enough free throw attempts to qualify him for the SEC rankings.

CLUTCH FREE THROWS

Kentucky is shooting 77 percent (69-for-90) from the free throw line in the final three minutes of regulation and overtime close games (six points or less). In the home win over Tennessee, UK went 12-for-12 in the final 1:30 en route to the 72-66 victory.

Ramel Bradley leads the team, shooting 83 percent (30-36) in clutch situations, including going 8-for-8 in the final 1:30 against Tennessee.

IMPROVEMENT IN SEC PLAY

Once the schedule turned to SEC play, the Wildcats noticeably improved their play. Kentucky protected the ball better, averaging 14.8 turnovers per game compared to 17.3 in its pre-conference schedule. Also, opponents' points off turnover have fallen from 19.2 to 15.8.

POWER IN THE PAINT

The Wildcats have made no secret of their desire to work the ball to the low post on offense. In 19 of UK's 30 games this season, Kentucky has outscored its opponent down low, and only seven times has the opponent outscored the Cats in the paint. In fact, until the Alabama game, UK had either outscored or scored the same number of points in the paint as the opposition in 18-straight games.

DOUBLE-FIGURE GAMES

Joe Crawford had his string of 15 straight games scoring in double-digits snapped against Tennessee. It was the first time a Wildcat had posted double-digits in 15 straight games since Tayshaun Prince did so in the 2002 season.

Crawford has reached double-digits in 26 of 29 games this year.

Patrick Patterson wasn't far behind having hit double-digits in 13 consecutive games.

Prior to Patterson's injury, he had recorded double-digits in 23 of the 25 games they've played in this season.

COURY NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Sophomore Mark Coury was named First Team Academic All-District as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) on Thursday.

Coury, who boasts a 4.00 grade point average, is majoring in Business Management. The sophomore from West Bloomfield, Mich. is averaging 2.2 points and 2.0 rebounds per game for the Wildcats this season. He has started 28 of UK's 29 games this season, tied for most on the team.

CRAWFORD, BRADLEY ON CAREER CHARTS

Seniors Joe Crawford and Ramel Bradley are beginning to find their names on some of UK's career record lists. Crawford is 20th in points (1,403), fifth in three-pointers attempted (524) and seventh in three-pointers made (181). Bradley is 28th in points (1,307), eighth in free throw percentage (.803), seventh in three-pointers attempted (490) and eighth in three-pointers made (174).

1,000 POINT CLUB

Seniors Joe Crawford and Ramel Bradley became the 54th and 55th members, respectively, of Kentucky's exclusive 1,000-point club.

Crawford reached 1,000 on Dec. 1 against North Carolina, while Bradley did so on Dec. 31 against FIU. Crawford, with 1,403 career points, currently ranks 20th on UK's all-time points list, while Bradley's 1,307 career points place him in 28th place.

Kentucky used 11 different starting lineups through its first 13 games. However, until Patrick Patterson's recent injury, the Wildcats used the same starting of Ramel Bradley, Joe Crawford, Ramon Harris, Coury and Patterson in 11 of 13 games. Crawford missed the game against South Carolina with plantar fascia in his left foot. Bradley missed the game at Auburn with a viral infection. The Wildcats were 8-3 with that starting five.

Since Patterson's departure, UK has gone with the starting lineup of Bradley, Crawford, Harris, Jasper and Coury. The Cats are 2-2 with that lineup.

Eleven different players have started this year, with sophomore Mark Coury leading the way with 29 starts.

ROAD WARRIOR

In Kentucky's last 10 road games, senior Joe Crawford has averaged 21.0 ppg. During that span he is shooting 48 percent from the field and 82 percent (40-for-49) from the foul line.

In UK's 12 games away from Rupp Arena, Crawford is averaging 19.7.

20-POINT GAMES

The Wildcats lead the league with 34 20-point performances led by seniors Joe Crawford (12), Ramel Bradley (11) and freshman Patrick Patterson (9). Jodie Meeks has recorded two 20-point games this season.

Crawford is tied for fifth in the league in 20-point efforts, while Bradley is tied for seventh and Patterson is tied for 13th.

Bradley had a streak of six consecutive 20-point games broken against Tennessee.

With 23 points at Florida, he became the first Wildcat to record six-straight 20-point games since Jamal Mashburn had six-straight in the 1993 season. He has tallied 18 such performances throughout his career.

Crawford has 20, 20-point games in his career.

PATTERSON LEADS SEC FRESHMEN

Patrick Patterson made a strong case as the SEC's top freshman. He is one of two freshman to rank in the SEC's top 10 in both scoring (9th) and rebounding (7th), and is one of two players in the league's top 10 in points, rebounds, field goal percentage (5th) and free throw percentage (9th).

PATTERSON AMONG SEC FRESHMAN GREATS

Patrick Patterson is making a bid to become the first freshman in 10 years to rank among the SEC's top 10 in both points and rebounding

He currently ranks eighth in the SEC in points (16.4) and sixth in rebounding (7.7). Georgia's Jumaïne Jones (1997-98) is the only freshman since the SEC expanded in 1992 to rank in the top 10 in points (14.7, 9th) and rebounds (8.5, 3rd).

PATTERSON AMONG BEST UK FRESHMEN

With 411 points, Patrick Patterson finished his freshman season tied with Keith Bogans for fourth all-time in scoring among UK freshmen. With three games remaining in the regular season, Patterson needed only 54 points to break Rex Chapman's UK freshman record of 464 points in 1986-87.

Patterson was also fifth among UK freshman rebounders, and needs 86 more boards to break Chris Mills' mark of 277 in 1988-89.

PATTERSON DOUBLES UP

Patrick Patterson is tied for sixth in the SEC with six double-doubles.

Patterson's double-double against Gardner-Webb, in only his second collegiate game, was the earliest a Kentucky freshman had recorded a double-double since Jules Camara posted 10 points and 11 rebounds in the 1998-99 season opener against Eastern Kentucky.

Patterson's back-to-back double-doubles against Gardner-Webb and Liberty marked the first time a Wildcat freshman achieved the feat since Jamal Mashburn in the 1990-91 season.

He is one of only five UK freshmen to record five double-doubles, and the first since Jamal Mashburn in 1990-91.

MORE DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Patterson wasn't the only Wildcat in double figures against Stony Brook. Sophomore Perry Stevenson recorded the first double-double of his career against the Seawolves, scoring a career-high 18 points and pulling down a career-best 10 rebounds.

It was the first time since last year's 59-54 win over Indiana that two Wildcats recorded double-doubles in the same game (Randolph Morris - 16 points/10 rebounds; Bobby Perry - 11 points/10 rebounds).

20-10

When Patrick Patterson recorded 23 points and 10 rebounds against Liberty, he became the first Kentucky freshman to record a 20-10 game since Jason Parker notched 22 points and 13 rebounds against Southern California in the 2001 NCAA Tournament.

Patterson turned the trick again against Tennessee logging 24 points and 15 rebounds. He is the first freshman since Sam Bowie in the 1979-80 season, to record two 20-10 games in a season.

He then became the first UK freshman ever to record three 20-10 games.

Patterson joins Bowie and Dwight Anderson

(1979 season) as the only freshmen to post multiple 20-10 games.

UK ONE OF NATION'S MOST VALUABLE TEAMS

In a recently released survey by *Forbes* magazine, Kentucky Basketball ranks as the second-most valuable basketball program in the country. The Wildcats are valued at \$24.9 million, while pulling in a profit of \$15.4 million. According to *Forbes*, UK's basketball program accounts for 70 percent of the athletic department's 10-year, \$80 million multimedia deal with IMG College Sports.

SEC DOMINATION

Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats have been the most dominant team in the league, recording an 853-233 mark (.785). Only one other team has won more than 690 regular season SEC games (Alabama) and no other team has a better winning percentage. UK has averaged 11.5 wins and 3.1 losses per season in 74 seasons in the SEC.

- The Wildcats have won 43 SEC titles and 25 SEC Tournament Championships, more than the other 11 teams combined.

- Kentucky has won 10 of the last 16 SEC Tournament titles.

- UK has won 11 SEC East titles in the 16 seasons since the league expanded.

SEASON NOTES

CAREER NIGHT FOR CRAWFORD

Joe Crawford scored nearly half of UK's 71 points in the Cats' 71-63 win at South Carolina. Crawford poured in a career-high 35 points, finishing the evening 10-19 from the field, 4-7 from three point range and 11-12 from the free throw line.

The last time a Wildcat scored 35, was Gerald Fitch (11/28/2003), who had 36 against Tennessee Tech.

STRONG FIRST HALF

In Kentucky's win over Ole Miss, the Wildcats held the Rebels to just 14 points. It was the fewest points UK had allowed in the first half of an SEC game since Jan. 23, 1999, when the Wildcats led Mississippi State 37-14 at intermission.

CATS DOING BETTER WITH THE BALL

On the season, Kentucky is last in the SEC with a -2.60 turnover margin.

However, Kentucky reversed its turnover misfortunes against Georgia, committing a season-low eight turnovers in both of the Wildcats' meetings with the Bulldogs. It was the lowest number for UK since eight giveaways against UAB in the 2006 NCAA Tournament.

In the first half of UK's game in Athens, the Wildcats turned the ball over only three times, the fewest UK turnovers in the first half this season and tied for the fewest turnovers in any half for the Wildcats this year.

WILDCATS LIGHT IT UP AT AUBURN

Kentucky shot a blistering 67 percent (26-39) from the field at Auburn. It was UK's highest field goal percentage since hitting on 69 percent of its shots against Indiana on Dec. 22, 2000.

BEATING RANKED TEAMS

By downing then-No. 13 Vanderbilt and then-No. 3 Tennessee, Kentucky posted back-to-back victories against ranked opponents for the first time since March 19 and 25, 2005, when the Wildcats dispatched Cincinnati and Utah in the NCAA Tournament.

Kentucky's win over UT was Big Blue's first over a top three team since March 8, 2003, when the Wildcats won 69-67 at No. 3 Florida.

UK CHEERLEADERS WIN 16TH TITLE

Kentucky cheerleaders continued their dominance at the Universal Cheer Association National Championships by winning their record 16th title, Jan. 20 at Disney's Wide World of Sports.

The championship is the squad's fourth in the last five years and 12th out of the last 14 years.

Kentucky has won championships in 1985, 1987, 1988, 1992, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2008.

STREAKS ENDED

Ten days after ending Vanderbilt's 16-game winning streak, the Wildcats put an end to Tennessee's 11-game winning streak. Vandy's winning streak was the longest in the SEC this season, while Tennessee's was the third longest.

SLOWING DOWN THE VOLTS

Kentucky held the high powered Tennessee offense to a season low 66 points. The Volunteers came into the game with an offensive attack (85.6 ppg) that ranked first in the SEC and fifth nationally. UK held UT 19 points under its average. Additionally, the Wildcats held the Volunteers, who rank first nationally in assists per game (20.24), to eight assists, 12 under their average.

Kentucky also posted a season best nine blocked shots.

STINGY DEFENSE STOPS DORES

In Kentucky's win over Vanderbilt, the Wildcats held the Commodores to a season-low 22 first-half points. It was the seventh time this season Kentucky had held its opponent to 22 points or less in the first half. And, despite playing two overtimes, VU's 73 points were also a season low.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

In the win over Vanderbilt, UK outrebounded the Dores by 22 (45-23), a season high. It was the Wildcats highest margin since outrebounding Georgia State, 45-23, on Dec. 6, 2005.

UK also outscored Vandy 18-2 in second chance points, its largest differential this season.

A RUPP ARENA FIRST

The win over Vanderbilt was the first time in the 32-year history of Rupp Arena that UK had played a multiple-overtime game. The Cats last double-OT home game came against Tennessee in 1966-67.

It was only the eighth OT game for UK at Rupp, and the first since 1998 vs. Arkansas.

CATS INCONSISTENT ON DEFENSE

When Kentucky has won, its defense has been outstanding. When the Cats have lost, the defense has been lacking.

UK is 16-4 when holding foes under 70 points during regulation play, but 1-8 when opponents reach the 70-point mark in 40 minutes.

In its 18 wins, Kentucky is holding foes to just 56.8 points per game and a 36 percent shooting percentage. In its 12 losses, Cat opponents are averaging 78.2 points and shooting .456.

Overall, the Wildcats rank second in the SEC and 19th nationally in field goal percentage defense (.394).

Kentucky has held its opponent to less than 50 percent field goal shooting 26 times (including 13 straight games at one point), and has limited opponents to 37 percent or lower 11 times.

OFFENSIVE SHOW

Kentucky was clicking on all cylinders offensively against Florida International. While posting a season high 92 points (the most since hanging 95 on South Carolina in Rupp Arena on Feb. 7, 2007), UK had four players reach double figures (Ramel Bradley, Joe Crawford, Jodie Meeks, Patrick Patterson). It was also the first time that three Wildcats netted 20 points (Bradley, Meeks, Patterson) since the 2002-03 season.

The Wildcats also hit 31 of 40 free throw attempts, season highs in both categories. The 31 free throws made were the most by a team in the SEC this season and the most by a UK team since making 33 against Georgia on Jan. 14, 1997.

MILLER, LIGGINS SIGN EARLY WITH CATS

Kentucky men's basketball signed highly-rated high school seniors DeAndre Liggins and Darius Miller to National Letters of Intent during November's early signing period.

Liggins, 6-6 and a native of Chicago, Ill., attends Findlay Prep in Henderson, Nev. He finished his junior year at George Washington High School in Chicago averaging a triple-double: 14 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists. He entered his senior season ranked as the fifth-best point guard in the country and 21st overall according to Rivals.com.

In-state star Darius Miller comes to the Wildcats from Maysville, Ky., where he stars for the Mason County Royals. Standing at 6-8, Miller is ranked the No. 7 small forward in the country and 38th overall by Scout.com. Considered one of the top candidates in the state of Kentucky for Mr. Basketball, Miller averaged 20 points, nine rebounds, four assists and four blocked shots his junior season.

NATIONAL EXPOSURE

Kentucky had 16 regular season games scheduled for national broadcast this season on CBS, ESPN or ESPN2 this year.

UK had nine games on ESPN/ESPN2, including North Carolina (12/1, ESPN2), UAB (12/15, ESPN), Houston (12/18, ESPN), San Diego (12/29, ESPN2), Mississippi State (1/15, ESPN), Florida (1/19, ESPN), Tennessee (1/22, ESPN),

Vanderbilt (2/12, ESPN) and Georgia (2/19, ESPN).

The Wildcats also had seven games slated for broadcast on CBS: Indiana (12/8), Louisville (1/5), Vanderbilt (1/12), Georgia (2/2), Arkansas (2/27), Tennessee (3/2) and Florida (3/9).

THREE MANIA

UK has the nation's third-longest active streak of consecutive games with a made three-pointer. UK has hit a three-pointer in 674 consecutive games, which trails only UNLV and Vanderbilt.

The Wildcats' last game without a three-pointer came 19 seasons ago against Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 1988, a "three-point" loss in the Great Alaska Shootout.

As of March 6, UNLV and Vanderbilt have hit a three-pointer in every game since the three-point rule was adopted to start the 1986-87 season. The Rebels' streak is 697 games, while Vanderbilt's streak is 695 games.

CATS ROCK AT RUPP ARENA

- UK has won 74 of its last 91 home games. The Cats are 415-54 (.885) all-time in Rupp Arena.
- UK has won 19 national attendance titles in the building, including 11 of the last 12.
- The Rupp Arena attendance record of 24,465 was set last season against Florida on Feb. 10.
- The Wildcats have posted a remarkable 238-34 (.875) record in regular season SEC games played in Rupp.

IN SEASON HONORS

Patrick Patterson received his third SEC Freshman of the Week award on Feb. 25, after averaging a double-double in wins over Georgia and Arkansas.

Patterson recorded his ninth 20-point game of the season against Georgia, and hit two key free throws with 51 seconds left against Arkansas to give the Wildcats a 59-55 lead and put the contest out of reach.

The SEC Freshman of the Year candidate recorded his sixth double-double of the season against the Razorbacks, tying him with Jamal Mashburn for fifth on UK's freshman double-double list.

The Wildcats swept the SEC's weekly honors on Jan. 28 when Ramel Bradley and Patterson were named the league's Player and Freshman of the Week.

The duo helped lead the Cats to a 2-0 record on the week including wins over then third ranked Tennessee and South Carolina.

It was the third time since the league instituted a Freshman of the Week award in the 2006 season that a team swept both honors.

Patterson received his first and the team's first SEC award of the season when he was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on 11/26.

UK was tabbed for a second place finish in the East as well by *Blue Ribbon*, *The Sporting News*, *Lindy's* and *Athlon Sports*.

CATS IN THE RANKINGS

The Wildcats were tabbed 20th in the Associated Press preseason Top 25 and 22nd in the ESPN/USA Today preseason Top 25. UK has been ranked nationally in the preseason every year since 1991-92.

The Wildcats were picked in the top 25 of several other preseason publications. *Blue Ribbon* magazine has Kentucky as high as 11th, while *Lindy's* tabbed the Cats for 21st. *The Sporting News* picked the Wildcats at the 24th best team in the country.

BIG BLUE MANIA

KEIGHTLEY RETURNS FOR 47TH SEASON

Equipment manager Bill Keightley returns for his 47th season with the UK basketball team. The beloved "Mr. Wildcat" began assisting in the equipment room during the 1961-62 season and since then, UK has played 1,463 games, owning a 1,113-350 (.761) record.

Kentucky, which has fielded 105 teams, has played 2,585, meaning Keightley has played a role in 56.6% of the games.

The Lawrenceburg, Ky. native, who has a jersey retired in the rafters of Rupp Arena, has worked under six different head coaches at UK - Rupp, Hall, Sutton, Pitino, Smith and Gillispie. The current Cats have a modern nickname for the 80-year old Keightley -- "Smooth."

"SUPER FAN" IN 55TH SEASON

UK fan Bob Wiggins, 79, continues his amazing streak of following the basketball Cats. The 2007-08 season is his 55th watching Kentucky in person and through is own record-keeping, he has attended 1,401 UK games.

His home-court streak spans 46 years and 679 games. During that period, which dates back to 1960-61, UK has a home record of 599-80 (.882).

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Billy Gillispie is a three-time finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year award. He won the honor in 2004, 2005 and 2007. In addition, he was named a finalist for the 2007 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year honor.
- Gillispie is a five-time conference coach of the year winner. In 2004, he was the WAC Coach of the Year honor at UTEP. He was the consensus Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2005 while the *Austin American-Statesman*, *The Dallas Morning News*, *San Antonio Express-News* and the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* tabbed him the Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2006. He won the honor again in 2007, when the Big 12 coaches tabbed him the conference's Coach of the Year. He was named SEC co-Coach of the Year by league peers in his first season at UK.
- Gillispie is also a three-time district coach of the year winner. At the conclusion of the 2004 season, he was named the USBWA District Coach of the Year. He received the honor again in 2005 as well as the NABC District Coach of the Year

award. In 2007 he was selected the NABC District 9 Coach of the Year.

- He led Texas A&M to 27 wins in 2006-07, the most in school history.
- Gillispie also led Texas A&M to three straight 20-win seasons for the first time in history.
- In 2004-05, A&M had the best turnaround in the nation and the best in school history.
- Texas A&M won 31 Big 12 games in three years under Gillispie after winning just 25 in the first eight years of Big 12 play.
- Gillispie is the only coach in college basketball history to coach the nation's most improved team in consecutive seasons (2003-04 and 2004-05).
- His 2003-04 UTEP team tied for the most improved team in college basketball history (+18 wins).
- Gillispie's 2005 Aggies went 8-8 in Big 12 play after finishing 0-16 the previous year, making A&M only the third college team ever to go .500 in a conference after going winless the previous season.

Joe Crawford scored 20 points and No. 20 Kentucky began the Billy Gillispie era with a 67-40 victory over Central Arkansas in the opening round of the 2K Sports College Hoops Classic.

The Wildcats advanced to the second round against Gardner-Webb, which defeated Alabama A&M 69-55.

Crawford, a senior guard who started most of the previous year, was among the last players on the team to see action, not appearing until 13 minutes in.

He was promptly whistled for palming but then started taking over the offense, going 7-of-11 from the field - including two dunks.

Sophomore forward Mark Coury cracked Gillispie's first starting lineup and needed less than 90 seconds to match his career high of four points as Kentucky got off to an 8-0 lead. Coury used a combination of jumpers and layups to account for 10 of Kentucky's first 12 points.

Coury finished with 13 points and 10 rebounds.

The Bears missed their first nine shots, including five from 3-point range, and didn't score until junior center Landrell Brewer hit two free throws more than five minutes in.

Central Arkansas's shooting fortunes didn't improve much as Kentucky held the Bears to 20 percent shooting, including only 12 points in the paint compared to 38 for the Wildcats.

Kentucky led 34-20 at halftime despite shooting just 40 percent. The Wildcats picked up the pace in the second half with 56 percent.

Durrell Nevels led Central Arkansas (0-1) with 10 points.

After point guard Ramel Bradley was called for a technical foul early in the second half to give him four personals in the game, Gillispie spent nearly an entire timeout screaming at the referee. The fans, slow to notice the coach's tirade, roared approval when they finally did.

Gillispie also made substitutions on virtually every dead ball, often bringing in players for just one offensive or defensive play.

The winner of the four-team Lexington regional of the tournament benefiting Coaches vs. Cancer advances to the semifinals on Oct. 15 at Madison Square Garden in New York. No. 3 Memphis, Oklahoma and Connecticut are hosting regionals.

Grayson Flittner scored 22 points to help Gardner-Webb beat No. 20 Kentucky 84-68 in the 2K Sports College Hoops Classic.

Kentucky, Division I's winningest program, hadn't lost a regular-season game to a mid-major since falling to Western Kentucky on Nov. 15, 2001, in that season's opener. It lost to UAB in 2004 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Kentucky's last home loss to an unranked nonconference foe was Dec. 3, 2005, against North Carolina.

The tournament, benefiting Coaches vs. Cancer, had been set up to send four top programs -- No. 3 Memphis, Connecticut, Oklahoma and Kentucky -- to New York next week to play in the semifinals.

However, instead of the Wildcats, Gardner-Webb, which finished 9-21 last season and tied for seventh in the Atlantic Sun Conference, will play the winner of Thursday night's game between Buffalo and Connecticut.

As it turned out, the Wildcats never had control of this game, trailing 14-0 just four minutes in, missing its first four shots and turning the ball over four times during that span.

Flittner hit a critical 3 midway through the first half that opened the Bulldogs' lead to 26-10.

Kentucky cut the deficit to seven less than three minutes later on a long jumper by Joe Crawford but would get no closer.

Crawford, a senior guard and regular starter last year, didn't crack the starting lineup for the second consecutive game under Billy Gillispie despite leading the team with 20 points Tuesday against Central Arkansas.

Gardner-Webb led 38-27 at halftime, and Sanders began the second half with a three-point play to put the Wildcats deeper into a hole.

Among the lone bright spots for Kentucky were its two blue chip freshmen, power forward Patrick Patterson and guard Alex Legion.

Legion tried to single-handedly carry the Wildcats midway through the second half, hitting three 3-pointers and making a key steal in just over two minutes.

Patterson had 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds, including 10 in the first half that accounted for half the Wildcats' total. "They came to play," Patterson said of Gardner-Webb. "Obviously we didn't."

A night after holding Central Arkansas to 20 percent shooting - the Wildcats' best defensive performance since 1995 -- Kentucky allowed the Bulldogs to make 53 percent.

Kentucky was ice cold shooting, hitting just 36 percent. Ramel Bradley led all scorers by tying a career high with 24 points and going 14-for-14 from the foul line.

But every time Kentucky made a basket, the Bulldogs seemed to make a bigger one.

Joe Crawford had a career-high 32 points in his first start of the season and Kentucky cruised past Texas Southern 83-35.

The Wildcats won for the second straight time. It was their largest margin of victory since beating Vanderbilt 106-44 on Mar. 5, 2003.

Crawford, a senior guard who was a regular starter last year, made a major case that he should get his job back under new coach Billy Gillispie.

He matched a career-best with 12 field goals on 17 attempts and provided a spark in the first half from beyond the arc and a spark in the second from the paint.

Up 6-5 early, the Wildcats scored the next 15 points -- 10 of them from Crawford -- to bury the Tigers.

Crawford hit two free throws to begin the streak after drawing a foul on a fourth-chance shot. Then, 11 seconds later, Crawford intercepted a pass and cruised alone down the court to finish with a dunk. He'd add two 3-pointers to pad the lead.

During another span in the second half, Crawford began to misfire from long-range, so he took the ball to the hoop. He made a fastbreak layup, then set a career-high with a 3-point play on an alley-oop from fellow senior Ramel Bradley.

Kentucky made 61 percent of its shots (77 percent in the first half). The Wildcats dominated the much smaller Tigers in the paint with freshman power forward Patrick Patterson, who had 21 points and seven rebounds.

The Wildcats made five of their first seven shots from beyond the arc, and Patterson made his first eight shots from the field, mixing layups and dunks with finesse jumpers.

Texas Southern connected on just 21 percent of its shots and was overmatched on the boards in the first half, failing to get its fourth rebound until 15 minutes had passed. Three Wildcats -- Patterson, Crawford and Bradley -- had more first half rebounds than the Tigers' team leader.

Patrick Patterson had 19 points and matched his career-high 12 rebounds as Kentucky survived a sloppy start and pulled away from Stony Brook 62-52.

Stony Brook trailed by 19 points in the second half but clawed back to cut the lead to 43-37 with less than seven minutes left on a 3-pointer by Michael Tyree. Perry Stevenson dunked home a missed shot seconds later, as the Wildcats padded the lead.

At least for one game, Stevenson -- a specialist at blocking shots -- provided Kentucky a scorer in the post alongside Patterson. He recorded his first career double-double with personal bests of 18 points and 10 rebounds.

Both teams were ice-cold out of the gate, combining for just 10 points in the first 10 minutes.

Kentucky misfired on 12 of its first 13 shots in that span, connecting only on Patterson's put-back of Joe Crawford's missed 3-pointer. Kentucky didn't score again from the field until Patterson's dunk with 9:32 left in the half.

Stony Brook couldn't take advantage of Kentucky's early shooting woes. The Wildcats trailed by just two points after Patterson's dunk and took the lead for good at 14-12 four minutes later on Stevenson's jumper from the free-throw line.

Kentucky went on an 8-0 run the last two minutes of the first half and led 26-14 at the break.

But if Kentucky's offense was poor, Stony Brook's was worse. The Seawolves didn't get their first assist until four minutes into the second half and finished with just five in the game.

Defensively, the Seawolves were outmatched by the bigger Wildcats. Seven different Kentucky players blocked shots, compared with none for Stony Brook.

Stony Brook's Mitchell Beauford led all scorers with 20 points.

Tyler Hansbrough made 10 of 12 free throws as top-ranked North Carolina capitalized on Kentucky's 25 fouls and beat the Wildcats 86-77.

With Hansbrough closely guarded, reserve Danny Green led the Tar Heels with a career-high 20 points.

Hansbrough finished with 14 points and a game-high 11 rebounds, his third double-double of the season.

Patrick Patterson, Kentucky's blue-chip freshman power forward, held his own against North Carolina's tough frontcourt.

Billy Gillispie said he was pleased with the effort. He surprisingly even labeled Perry Stevenson's performance the best of the year, despite scoring only two points and playing just eight minutes.

Hansbrough said Patterson did provide a challenge.

"He's a solid big man," Hansbrough said. "He's very physical and he can get you into weird positions because they run so many things to him."

Up 44-39 early in the second half, the Tar Heels went on a 13-0 run to put the game out of reach. Bobby Frasor finished the streak with two 3-pointers, the last one silencing the Rupp Arena crowd as he pumped his fist.

Patterson ended the Kentucky drought by drawing a foul and hitting one of two free throws, but that was Kentucky's first trip to the line. By then, North Carolina had taken 14 free throws, making 13.

Kentucky's defense helped the Wildcats play with North Carolina early, but every time the Wildcats made a big basket, Green, a junior swingman, seemed to have an answer.

He scored North Carolina's last 10 points of the first half, eight of them in a span of just over a minute, using 3-pointers to answer a 3 by Joe Crawford and a dunk by A.J. Stewart, then a layup to answer Crawford's layup.

It was Green's sixth straight game scoring in double digits, all as a reserve.

Kentucky's regular point guard, Ramel Bradley, was not in the lineup for the tipoff. Bradley entered less than two minutes in, but had only two assists. He did score 19 points, as did Patterson. Crawford led the team with 21.

The Tar Heels led 37-32 at halftime. Patterson scored the first bucket of the second half to cut the deficit to three points, but the Wildcats would get no closer.

Kentucky leads all Division I programs with 1,952 wins, while North Carolina is second at 1,921.

Patrick Patterson led the Wildcats with 15 points in a second straight loss to a traditional power, and for only the third time in the last 14 games of this passionate series.

"They whipped us in every aspect and they did it with a short-handed team," Kentucky coach Billy Gillispie said. "We're not happy about that."

The Hoosiers have won 23 straight home games, and coach Kelvin Sampson is a perfect 21-0 at Assembly Hall since taking over as Indiana's coach last season.

This victory, however, deviated from the Hoosiers' usual script.

Freshman Eric Gordon, the nation's second-leading scorer entering the week, was a late scratch because of a bruised lower back. Sophomore Armon Bassett missed the game because of a suspension for violating team rules, and Sampson said afterward he hasn't yet decided whether Bassett's suspension will be for more games.

Worse yet was losing senior forward D.J. White for most of the last 10 minutes of the first half because of foul trouble. White finished with 16 points and 13 rebounds, joining the Hoosiers' 1,000-point club.

"We've got to figure out what the problem is," Joe Crawford said. "I'm just kind of hurt right now. The most frustrating thing about it was us just not fighting. It's hard to go down like that when we're not making any runs or just not fighting at any time."

Indiana took control midway through the first half with a 15-5 run that expanded the lead to 29-15 with 6:11 left in the first half.

Kentucky closed to 31-23 when Joe Crawford stole the ball from his brother and drove in for a layup. But Jordan Crawford made three of four free throws in the final 90 seconds, during a five-point flurry that gave Indiana a 37-25 halftime lead.

The second half was all Hoosiers.

Indiana scored the first nine points in the second half, building a 46-25 lead, and then things turned ugly for the Wildcats. Bradley fouled out with 13:51 left, and Michael Porter fouled out with 9:58 to go.

The result: Kentucky never got closer than 17 points the rest of the way, and Jordan Crawford walked away with a win and family bragging rights.

Robert Vaden scored a career-high 33 points including the go-ahead 3-pointer with 1:15 to play as UAB rallied past Kentucky 79-76.

Walter Sharpe added 16 points and Reggie Huffman had 10 points and 12 rebounds as the Blazers ruined Kentucky's annual visit to Freedom Hall.

The Blazers trailed by 14 but surged ahead on a 16-0 run fueled by Vaden as the Wildcats finally cooled off. UAB held Kentucky scoreless for more than five minutes, eventually taking a 66-64 lead with 5:22 remaining.

Though the Wildcats managed to tie the game four times in the final minutes, the red-hot shooting that carried them to the lead abandoned them in the end.

Ramel Bradley led Kentucky with 23 points and six rebounds and Patrick Patterson added 18 points and seven rebounds, but Kentucky couldn't overcome 18 turnovers and the scintillating play of Vaden.

The Indiana transfer scored 28 points in the second half as UAB coach Mike Davis was able to do something he rarely did while coaching at Indiana: beat the Wildcats.

After a sluggish first half, the Blazers shot 70 percent from the floor in the second half. Vaden led the way, hitting from all over the floor no matter how the Wildcats tried to guard him. Kentucky's Michael Porter was the primary defender, but Vaden simply shot over the smaller Porter, hitting on an array of jumpers.

Still, Kentucky had its chances. Joe Crawford hit a difficult reverse layup to pull the Wildcats to 77-76 with 37 seconds left. Aaron Johnson hit two free throws for UAB, but Crawford's awkward 3-point attempt clanged off the rim with 5 seconds left and the Blazers were able to run out the clock.

The rally seemed unlikely for the game's first 30 minutes. The Wildcats, who had struggled all season shooting from the perimeter, couldn't miss early.

Kentucky built a 12-point halftime lead behind Bradley and some torrid shooting, a welcome development for a team that has struggled from 3-point range all season.

Bradley hit a pair of 3-pointers during a 9-0 run that gave the Wildcats an early 17-9 edge, and they got hot again late in the half. Porter finished the half with a running 3-pointer at the buzzer, the crowd roaring its approval as Porter leapt in the air before sprinting to the locker room.

The Wildcats were able to hold off an early second-half surge, expanding the lead to 64-50 on a 3-pointer by Crawford with 10:49 remaining.

After a difficult stretch in losses to North Carolina and Indiana, the Wildcats seemed to finally develop the rhythm they've been lacking. But Vaden simply wouldn't let the Wildcats run away. He hit back-to-back 3-pointers -- both with hands in his face -- during the 16-0 run that gave the Blazers their first lead since the opening minutes.

Dion Dowell scored 19 points and Robert McIver added 18 as Houston matched its best start since the days of Phi Slama Jama with an 83-69 victory against Kentucky.

Joe Crawford scored 28 points and Jodie Meeks had 21 in his return from an injury for the Wildcats, who have lost four straight for the first time since 1989-90, when Rick Pitino's first Kentucky team dropped five in a row.

The offense looked better than it has most of the season, with the sharp-shooting Meeks back after missing the previous six games with a stress fracture in his pelvic area. But just as he got healthy, the Cats lost leading rebounder Patrick Patterson to an ankle injury.

Gillispie said Patterson twisted his ankle on Monday and the freshman was ready to play until moments before tipoff.

Tafari Toney had nine points and eight rebounds and Lanny Smith had eight assists for the Cougars, who are off to their best start since the 1983-84 team won 10 of its first 11.

The Cougars outbounded Kentucky 38-33 and forced 18 turnovers to overcome 36 percent shooting.

Houston led 45-33 at halftime, then pulled away with defense and rebounding.

The Wildcats went the final 6:21 of the first half without a field goal, missing four shots and committing four turnovers. Michael Porter hit a 3-pointer from the corner 17 seconds into the second half to snap Kentucky's field goal drought.

But the Cougars went back to the smothering zone defense they used in the first half, and the Wildcats promptly committed two turnovers and lost their shooting touch again.

Toney hit a free throw and McIver made a 3-pointer from the wing to start a decisive 16-5 run. Toney scored twice on putbacks to extend the lead to 53-37.

Crawford picked off a steal, drove for a layup and converted a three-point play for the Wildcats with 14:36 left. But the 6-foot-8 Toney turned another offensive rebound into a three-point play at the other end.

Kentucky made a mild run too late. Crawford converted a three-point play with 2:52 left to cut Houston's lead to 74-64. The Cougars broke the Wildcats' full-court press and Kelvin Lewis finished the fast break with an alley-oop pass to Dowell for a dunk.

Meeks carried Kentucky's offense in the first half, scoring 17 points.

Patrick Patterson posted season-highs with 24 points and 15 rebounds as Kentucky snapped its longest losing streak in 17 years with a 69-47 win over Tennessee Tech.

Ramel Bradley added 12 points and A.J. Stewart scored nine points for the Wildcats.

Bradley and fellow senior guard Joe Crawford started the day on the bench but combined for 17 points, all in the second half as the Wildcats quickly pulled away after they entered the game.

For a day at least, the Wildcats were able to restore a bit of swagger, if not polish. Kentucky held Tennessee Tech to 26 percent shooting and had 10 steals and five blocks while playing with the kind of intensity it has lacked much of the season.

Patterson led the way, dominating at both ends of the floor while collecting his fourth double-double of the season. The freshman was 11-of-14 from the field and showed no ill effects from an ankle injury that kept him out of Tuesday's loss at Houston.

At times, however, it wasn't pretty. The Wildcats turned the ball over 21 times and got off to another sluggish start with their two senior leaders on the bench.

Still, even with a makeshift starting lineup, Patterson made sure the Wildcats snapped out of their weekslong swoon. Kentucky built a 29-21 halftime lead thanks to its defense even as it struggled to hold onto the ball.

It wasn't until the two seniors entered the game early in the second half that the Wildcats were able to take control. Both received ovations from the Rupp Arena crowd upon entering, and they responded by spearheading a 20-7 run that broke the game open.

Bradley had five points during the run while Crawford found open teammates, collecting five assists in his short stint on the floor.

Kentucky held Tennessee Tech scoreless for more than six minutes late in the first half, and didn't back down when challenged. Normally placid forward Perry Stevenson mixed it up briefly with Tennessee Tech's Rashaud Nixon, and teammate A.J. Stewart quickly rose to his defense.

Anthony Fisher led Tennessee Tech with 12 points and Frank Davis added nine, but the Golden Eagles couldn't find the magic that led them to a 17-point road win at Oregon State last Sunday.

The Wildcats played without guard Jodie Meeks, who sat out with a hip flexor strain. Meeks played his first game in six weeks during the loss to Houston, scoring 21 points.

"I'm just furious," Patterson said. "It's just an awful feeling to prepare for this game, coming off a win and everything clicking together."

The Wildcats had lost four in a row before beating Tennessee Tech last weekend.

Gillispie was asked during the post-game media conference what he had to say to fans who don't think the Wildcats are very good this season.

"I couldn't disagree with them very much with the way we're playing," he said.

They did cheer when guards Jodie Meeks and Derrick Jasper were sent into the game. The two sophomores had missed time this season after injuries.

Jasper had not played this season and Meeks had played in one of Kentucky's last eight games. Jasper had knee surgery during the offseason, and still limped a little, but had four assists. Meeks had two points and two rebounds.

The Toreros and Wildcats traded leads twice early in the second half but San Diego took the lead for good on a free throw by Gyno Pomare, making the score 44-43 with 13:49 to play in the game. Pomare led San Diego with 12 rebounds.

The Toreros led most of the first half and led at the break, 35-33. Kentucky tied the game at 31 and 33 but a pair of free throws by Pomare with 3.7 seconds to play gave the Toreros their halftime margin.

It was a meaningless free throw in a game long since decided, but the Rupp Arena crowd rose to cheer on Derrick Jasper anyway.

The Kentucky guard had missed his three previous free throws badly, but this time, bending his surgically repaired left knee, the ball fell through.

The shot was the last of Jasper's four points in Kentucky's 92-49 romp over Florida International on Monday, but for a player who wondered if he'd ever play again after having offseason microfracture surgery, it may as well have been a game-winner.

Jasper ran the offense crisply and didn't hesitate to get in the lane and rebound, a sign that he's getting used to playing with the cumbersome brace that protects his left knee.

Ramel Bradley scored 22 points while becoming the 55th player in school history to top 1,000 career points. Jodie Meeks added 21 and Patrick Patterson chipped in with 20 for the Wildcats, the first time three Cats scored 20 points in the same game since 2002.

Russell Hicks led FIU with 17 points and 11 rebounds, but the Golden Panthers couldn't keep up while losing their sixth straight.

The Wildcats began the game with their 11th different starting lineup of the season, but it didn't take long for familiar faces to come off the bench.

When Joe Crawford and Jasper entered the game less than two minutes in, it marked just the second time this season the Wildcats put their best five players on the floor at the same time.

Kentucky reeled off 10 quick points, spreading the floor with the four guards while Patterson worked the middle.

FIU managed to briefly make it competitive, but the Wildcats broke it open with a 15-3 run fueled by some hot 3-point shooting. The Wildcats made five of their first seven 3-pointers, and the energy translated at the other end of the floor.

A steal by Meeks led to a layup by Mark Coury. Seconds later Coury stepped in front of a pass, leading to a 3-point-er by Crawford. A 3-point-er by Meeks pushed the lead to 21, and Kentucky ended the half with a flourish as Bradley hit an acrobatic layup in the lane and added another one at the first half buzzer after the Golden Panthers threw it away while trying to deal with the Wildcat press.

The second half brought more of the same, as the Wildcats withstood a brief flurry by the Golden Panthers, putting them away with a 14-2 run that gave Kentucky a 59-32 lead.

Using a myriad of defenses that rattled Kentucky and silenced raucous Rupp Arena, Louisville raced to an 89-75 win to snap a three-game losing streak against its biggest rival.

"Our guys played a good, smart basketball game," Rick Pitino said.

Smart enough to extend Kentucky's misery and give the Cardinals a much-needed boost heading into the rugged Big East schedule.

It's a stretch the Cardinals appeared to be ready for after forcing 22 turnovers and playing with the kind of intensity and cohesion they have lacked at times this season.

Senior forward Juan Palacios -- who missed the first 9 games with a knee injury -- scored 17 points to go with six rebounds and four assists, ending three years of frustration against the Wildcats.

"No senior wants to leave Louisville without beating Kentucky," said Palacios, who limped so painfully through practice all week that Pitino wondered if he would even play. "This is big for us. It gives us confidence."

The Wildcats had hoped an upset of their rivals would help erase the memory of stunning home losses to Gardner-Webb and San Diego.

"We have to become a much tougher team," Gillispie said. "We have to become a much better defensive team."

Ramel Bradley led Kentucky with 27 points and Joe Crawford added 19 in his final game against Louisville, but the Wildcats shot just 41 percent and wore down in the second half against the bigger, deeper and more experienced Cardinals.

Jerry Smith had 17 points and Terrence Williams added 15 points and six rebounds for Louisville, which had five players in double figures and received significant contributions from whomever Pitino called off the bench.

Louisville harassed Kentucky freshman forward Patrick Patterson all game, blocking several of his shots and muscling him out of the lane. Patterson finished with six points on 3-of-14 shooting and turned the ball over six times.

The Cardinals trailed by one at the break, but took control with a dizzying 11 minutes at the start of the second half. Louisville reeled off eight straight points to grab the lead, forcing the Wildcats into turnovers and then racing the other way down the floor.

After settling for jumpers in the first half, the Cardinals attacked the basket in the second. The result was easier shots or free throws, and the lead eventually ballooned to 62-40 with just over nine minutes left.

Kentucky frantically trimmed the margin to 10 with 1:22 remaining, but Louisville made enough free throws down the stretch to put it away.

Freshman Patrick Patterson had 23 points and 12 rebounds to lift Kentucky to a 79-73 double-overtime win over No. 13 Vanderbilt.

Ramel Bradley added 20 points, and Joe Crawford had 17 for Kentucky, which gave Billy Gillispie his first win against a ranked opponent this season.

The Wildcats added Vanderbilt to crawl back from 16-point second half deficit, then blew an overtime lead before mounting a comeback.

But the hustle and effort that Gillispie has chastised his team for not having returned, and finally the Wildcats have a win they hope can spark their season.

"When you win a game like that it says a lot about the toughness of your team," Gillispie said. "They didn't give up and we wouldn't give either. That's what made me most proud."

Shan Foster had 20 points for Vanderbilt, which started the day as one of five unbeaten teams in Division I. A.J. Ogilvy struggled early for the Commodores, but ended with 16 points and five rebounds.

Still, Ogilvy admitted the 23,965 fans at Rupp Arena -- the largest crowd he's played in front of with Vanderbilt -- had him rattled.

"I think we got taken out of our game a little bit at the start," Ogilvy said. "We just tried to recover, but never could."

Bradley's jumper in the second overtime put Kentucky ahead 77-73, clinching the first win over a ranked opponent this season.

For a team that had seemed to lose confidence under Gillispie, Kentucky got a much needed boost that comes with an exhausting win over a ranked SEC East opponent.

"We wanted this one, we needed this one and we got this one," Bradley said. "There's a whole new season ahead, and now we need to go out and keeping getting more wins."

Ogilvy's putback with 1.8 seconds left in the first overtime tied it at 72, sending a once blowout game into a second overtime.

After Vanderbilt took a 69-68 lead in the first overtime on a layup by Alan Metcalfe, Bradley answered with a layup for Kentucky. Patterson would then put the Wildcats ahead 72-69 on a tip-in, pumping his fist in a premature celebration.

Foster hit a 3-pointer with 14 seconds left in regulation that tied the game at 65, one possession after the Commodores forced Crawford into a turnover.

But it was the slow start that Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said led to the loss.

Derrick Jasper hit two 3-pointers to cap a 10-0 run that gave the Wildcats a 23-10 lead with 9:36 to play in the opening half. Kentucky then built a 46-30 with 15 minutes to play in regulation.

Vanderbilt tried to creep back, but Foster and Ogilvy couldn't get free from Kentucky's smothering defense, which held them to a season-low five points at halftime.

Mississippi State's Jarvis Varnado finished with a triple-double that included 10 blocked shots in a 69-64 victory over Kentucky in Starkville.

Varnado, the nation's leading shot blocker, finished with 10 points and 12 rebounds. It was just the third triple-double in school history and the first to include blocks. Varnado has had 10 or more blocks three times this season.

"He changes that game around the rim," Mississippi State coach Rick Stansbury said. "That is for sure. Any time you earn a triple-double is impressive, and to do that with blocked shots is even more impressive."

Mississippi State came up with just enough stops to edge past Kentucky after the Wildcats cut the Bulldogs' lead to as little as two points late. The win gave Mississippi State two straight wins over Kentucky for just the second time.

"Any time you can beat a Kentucky team it's special," Stansbury said. "We have had to make some adjustments, but we are finding ways to win as a team."

The Bulldogs, who came into the game as the nation's leader in field goal percentage defense and No. 2 in blocks, are doing it with defense.

They built an 12-point lead early in the second half, but had to hold on late when Kentucky held them without a field goal in the final 6:26.

Kentucky cut the lead to two in the final minute, but Mississippi State made 13 of 18 free throws over the final 3:08 to seal the game.

Jamont Gordon finished with 24 points for the Bulldogs while Charles Rhodes added 12 and Turner 11.

Mississippi State pulled away from Kentucky in the first half with a 20-8 run that made it 32-27 at halftime. But the Wildcats rallied late behind Joey Crawford and Ramel Bradley.

Kentucky got as close as 66-64 on Crawford's 3-pointer in the final seconds. But Barry Stewart sealed the game with two free throws.

Bradley finished with 22 points and Crawford had 20. But Varnado was instrumental in shutting down Kentucky's leading scorer, Patrick Patterson, who finished with 10 points and was ineffective under the basket.

Nick Calathes had 24 points and made several clutch free throws. Walter Hodge hit a huge 3-pointer in overtime and Florida extended its winning streak over SEC rival Kentucky to seven games with a 81-70 victory.

The Gators became the second team in history to win seven in a row against the Wildcats, joining Notre Dame.

Florida missed seven of nine free throws during a four-minute span in the second half, then Kentucky's Ramel Bradley hit a 3-pointer with 2.5 seconds to play to send the game into overtime.

Calathes, Marreese Speights and Hodge bailed the Gators out in the extra frame. Calathes hit a 3, then made two free throws to give Florida a 68-67 lead with 2:03 to play. Speights and Hodge made consecutive baskets that gave the Gators cushion.

Speights sank a one-hander in the lane, then Hodge drained a 3 from the corner to make it 73-68 with 57.8 remaining.

Calathes made eight more free throws in the final 43 seconds to seal the victory. He also had eight assists and eight rebounds. He finished 13-of-17 from the free throw line.

Bradley led the Wildcats with 23 points, his sixth consecutive game with at least 20 points.

Jai Lucas ended UF's free throw woes by making a pair with 1:57 to play in regulation and pushing the lead the 58-53.

The Wildcats stayed in it with Derrick Jasper's 3-pointer from the corner. But Speights answered with a dunk on the other end, making it 60-56 with 19.7 seconds remaining.

Bradley made two free throws for Kentucky with 16.6 seconds to play. His 3-pointer was even bigger -- at least in regulation.

The Wildcats went cold in overtime.

The Gators were up 42-30 early in the second half, getting six points from Speights in a 12-5 spurt coming out of the locker room.

But Kentucky went inside -- attacking Florida's interior defense that has been the team's biggest weakness this season -- and scored nine consecutive points to make it 42-39 with about 12 minutes to play.

Joe Crawford converted a three-point play. Bradley hit a driving basket and freshman Patrick Patterson added two easy buckets.

The Wildcats got even closer when Chandler Parsons missed a dunk on one end and Bradley drained a 3-pointer on the other, making it 46-44.

Jodie Meeks' two free throws tied the game on Kentucky's next possession.

Kentucky led 19-16 with about 5 minutes to play in the opening period, but Florida used a full-court press to force some turnovers that sparked a 14-6 run to end the half.

Even Billy Gillispie smiled about this one.

Playing the kind of gritty defense that was the first-year Kentucky coach's trademark during his days at Texas A&M, the Wildcats smothered No. 3 Tennessee 72-66.

"We're really getting tough," Gillispie said. "I'm telling you they were tired going into the game (but) our guys really fought hard. They dug as deep as they possibly could."

Patrick Patterson led Kentucky with 20 points and eight rebounds. Ramel Bradley had 16 points and Perry Stevenson added 14 points and seven rebounds for the Wildcats, who were 24-of-28 from the free throw line and shot 49 percent from the field.

But it was Kentucky's defense that pushed the Wildcats to their first win over a top five team since beating then-No. 4 Louisville in December 2005.

Kentucky held the Volunteers to just three field goals over the final 10 minutes to snap their 11-game winning streak. Tennessee's 66 points were the fewest the Volunteers have scored this season and nearly 20 points below their average.

Though Tennessee's Chris Lofton scored 22 points, knocking down five 3-pointers to set the SEC record for career 3s with 367 to break the mark held by former Arkansas guard Pat Bradley, Kentucky did an excellent job shutting down the rest of the Volunteers.

Tennessee shot just 39 percent from the field, including 7-of-26 on 3-pointers. Take out Lofton's 5-of-10 effort from behind the arc, and the rest of the Volunteers were 2-of-16. Rather than try to exploit its size advantage in the lane, Tennessee settled for 3-pointers down the stretch, with disastrous results.

The win was Kentucky's second over a ranked opponent at Rupp Arena in less than two weeks. They showed more grit in this one, rallying from 10 points down early in the second half, eventually tying the game at 50 with 11 minutes left on Joe Crawford's second consecutive 3-pointer.

The teams spent the next 9 minutes trading the lead before the Wildcats went ahead for good, 62-60, on two free throws by Bradley with 1:30 left.

Tyler Smith missed a 3-pointer -- a common refrain for the Volunteers in the final minutes -- and Bradley hit two more free throws to push the lead to four. Lofton then missed a rushed 3-pointer and Jodie Meeks hit two free throws to put it away.

Lofton hit a 3-pointer 2 minutes in, then took advantage of some overaggressive Kentucky defense by faking the jumper then slicing through the lane for two layups. He ended the half in style, giving the Volunteers a 36-30 lead with a fallaway 3-pointer just before the horn sounded.

Lofton disappeared for long stretches in the second half and was held without a field goal until the final 12 seconds, likely ending the highest ranking in Tennessee history.

Ramel Bradley had 26 points and 10 rebounds for his second career double-double as Kentucky returned to .500 with a 78-70 victory over South Carolina.

Although the Gamecocks knocked down 12 3-pointers -- a season high in the conference -- Bradley had the accuracy advantage. He was a perfect 5-for-5 from long-range, one shy of his career high.

Kentucky needed the production out of its spirited senior point guard, whose lone previous double-double came last year against Auburn. Freshman center Patrick Patterson nearly joined him, with 22 points and 9 rebounds.

The Wildcats got all but five of their points from four scorers -- Bradley, Patterson, Jodie Meeks and Perry Stevenson. Derrick Jasper got the rest, including a wide-open 3 with five minutes left that gave Kentucky the lead for good.

Until the end, the Gamecocks presented a major threat, particularly the way Devan Downey was shooting. He led South Carolina with 24 points.

South Carolina got a layup from Dwayne Day just before half-time to pull to within 39-34. That began a 14-0 run that included three consecutive 3s early in the second half -- two from Zam Fredrick and one from Evaldas Baniulis that gave the Gamecocks their first lead.

Fredrick added another 3-pointer with 16 minutes to go, pushing the Wildcats' deficit to 46-39 -- their largest of the game.

That's when Kentucky's slumping shooters reawakened.

The Wildcats got three dunks from Stevenson, another from Patrick Patterson and a critical 3 from Ramel Bradley during a key stretch to tie the score.

Joe Crawford scored 26 points, including a 3-pointer to start a 10-0 run to open the second half, and Kentucky overcame the loss of Ramel Bradley to beat Georgia 63-58.

Freshman Patrick Patterson added 16 points for Kentucky, which has won three straight Southeastern Conference games. The Wildcats moved over .500 for the first time since December.

Kentucky lost guard Bradley with 8:44 left in the first half when the senior, attempting a fast-break layup, was knocked to the ground from behind by Georgia's Dave Bliss. Bradley landed hard and appeared groggy when he left the court.

Bradley, who did not return to the bench for the second half, suffered a concussion and a cut on his chin. Kentucky's medical staff was able to close the cut without stitches, contrary to the initial report that Bradley required stitches.

Sundiata Gaines hit a 3-pointer with 5:19 left to give Georgia its last lead at 54-53, but the Bulldogs managed only one more field goal the rest of the game. Troy Brewer sank a 3-pointer with 25 seconds left.

Georgia suffered its third straight loss and had its 11-game home winning streak end, including 10 wins in Athens this season.

Kentucky led only 30-29 at halftime but stretched the lead to 40-29 with the 10-0 run. After Crawford's 3-pointer, Michael Porter's steal set up a basket by Ramon Harris.

Patterson capped the run with a jam.

Georgia, led by Gaines' 15 points, recovered with a 9-0 run and regained the lead at 48-47 on a baseline drive by Terrance Woodbury, who had 12 points.

After Gaines gave Georgia its last lead at 54-53, Crawford answered with his fifth 3-pointer.

Georgia trailed 58-55 when Woodbury committed a turnover which led to an alley-oop jam by Patterson, giving Kentucky a 60-55 lead with 56 seconds left.

Bliss had 10 points and 8 rebounds, helping Georgia take a 40-31 advantage in rebounds.

The Kentucky Wildcats survived the battle of teams whittled down to little more than their starting lineups.

Patrick Patterson hit 3-of-4 free throws over the final 45 seconds and Kentucky shot a season-high 67 percent to hold on for a 66-63 win over Auburn, despite the absence of star guard Ramel Bradley.

The Wildcats sorely missed him when Auburn started aggressively trapping on defense and forcing mistakes to cut down a 10-point lead over the final six minutes. They committed 24 turnovers.

"If you play the way we did (in the SEC), you usually lose," Kentucky coach Billy Gillispie said. "We played pretty ugly tonight but pulled it together so I am happy about that. It's no easy task to do something like that."

The Tigers played only six players while Kentucky played a seventh for just three minutes of the game between two injury-depleted teams.

Joe Crawford scored 20 points and Patterson had 19 points and eight rebounds for Kentucky, which held on for a fourth consecutive SEC win.

Bradley missed the game with a virus. Guard Jodie Meeks remained out with a hip injury.

A 58-48 lead all but disappeared, and Auburn closed to within 64-63 with five quick points. Rasheem Barrett hit a 3-pointer with 30 seconds remaining and DeWayne Reed then had a steal and layup.

Crawford saved the Wildcats from serious trouble with a long heave across midcourt to Michael Porter when Auburn nearly forced a 10-second violation with a full-court press.

The Tigers were forced to foul Ramon Harris, who made 1-of-2 free throws with 14 seconds to play. Reed then tried a long 3-pointer that missed badly, and Patterson grabbed the rebound.

Patterson made one of two free throws with 3 seconds left and Lucas Hargrove rebounded the miss and threw up a desperation shot from before midcourt that went wide right. The result was the ninth straight win in the series for Kentucky, which has won 23 of the last 24 meetings.

Patterson and Crawford fueled Kentucky's hot shooting performance. Patterson made 8-of-10 baskets. Crawford was 8-for-12 and made three 3-pointers for the short-handed Wildcats. Perry Stevenson scored 10 points before fouling out late.

Quan Prowell led Auburn with 20 points and nine rebounds. Rasheem Barrett had 12 points, Quantez Robertson 11 and Frank Tolbert 10.

The Wildcats took advantage of a stretch when Auburn missed eight straight shots to build the 58-48 lead on Patterson's short jumper with 6:22 left.

The Tigers then started to force mistakes. Tolbert got a steal and then hit two free throws with 2:06 to play to cut it to 62-57 and make it a tight game.

Tolbert stole the ball near midcourt and forced Stevenson to commit his fifth foul to prevent an easy layup.

Ramel Bradley had 19 points - including three clutch 3-pointers - in his return to the lineup as the Wildcats cruised 62-52 over an Alabama team playing without leading scorer and rebounder Richard Hendrix, who had the flu.

Kentucky has been rolling in Southeastern Conference play, winning five straight games and lurking just behind Tennessee for first place in the East. The Crimson Tide has now lost seven of its last nine.

Bradley, the spark plug senior guard who seldom misses a minute of a game, let alone an entire one as he did earlier this week against Auburn, had spent most of the week in bed recovering from a concussion and stomach virus.

His return to good health was just what the doctor ordered for Kentucky. He led the team with 19 points.

In two key stretches - first when Alabama was building its own early lead, then later when it was trying to cut into Kentucky's advantage - Bradley's 3-pointers gave the Wildcats a boost.

The Crimson Tide had led by eight points early as Kentucky missed its first seven 3-point attempts. That immediately changed when Bradley nailed two in the span of 40 seconds to cut the Kentucky deficit to 23-21.

Midway through the second half, when Alabama pulled to within three points, Bradley came to the rescue again with a long-range bucket.

Derrick Jasper gave Kentucky its only non-Bradley 3-pointer moments later as the Wildcats were on their way to what turned into a relatively easy victory.

In the absence of Hendrix, who made the trip to Kentucky but stayed behind at the team hotel rather than go to the game, guard Mykal Riley led the Crimson Tide with 19 points.

Hendrix's replacement, sophomore Yamene Coleman, did admirably in Hendrix's absence with 10 points. He also largely contained Kentucky's star freshman center, Patrick Patterson, who had 12 points - one of his lowest outputs of the season.

Shan Foster scored 20 points and A.J. Ogilvy added 19 points and 12 rebounds as No. 24 Vanderbilt beat the NCAA's winningest program 93-52.

Kentucky thought it had fixed the problems that led to a 6-5 start under first-year coach Billy Gillespie. They had won five straight, including a victory against Tennessee, before this blowout.

The Commodores started a four-game homestand by winning their fourth straight. The only SEC team to open league play with six of their first nine away from home had lost 79-73 in double-overtime at Kentucky on Jan. 12.

It was the worst loss for Kentucky since losing by 55 to Kansas on Dec. 9, 1989.

Vanderbilt had never beaten Kentucky by this big a margin. The Commodores' previous best was an 81-51 victory Feb. 8, 1989, and now they have won three straight in Memorial Gym and five of the past six in this series.

Ramel Bradley, who had 18 of his 21 in the second half, said it felt pretty bad.

"Nobody wants to lose like this, on the road, at home regardless. This is just embarrassing," Bradley said.

Kentucky native Ross Neltner added 15 points for Vanderbilt, and Jermaine Beal had 10.

The Commodores led 41-11 at halftime and led by as much as 43 several times, the first when Ogilvy hit two free throws with 11:36 left at 66-23.

Kentucky had held its previous eight SEC opponents below 70 points in regulation. The Commodores hit that on a free throw by George Drake with 9:27 left -- 10 seconds after Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings subbed out all five of his starters leading 69-30.

The Wildcats looked lost from the start. Kentucky struggled to find the basket, hitting only three of 15 from the floor with more turnovers (12) than points (11) in the first half. It was their fewest points by halftime since scoring 11 against Cincinnati on Dec. 20, 1983.

Patterson, the freshman who had been averaging 17.2 points, struggled in his first visit to Memorial Gym. He missed his only shot of the first half, turned it over under the basket and picked up two fouls within 50 seconds. His third came with 6:34 left in the first half.

The Wildcats finished with more fouls (26) than made shots (17).

Joe Crawford scored 23 points and Patrick Patterson added 20 points and nine rebounds as Kentucky held off Georgia 61-55.

Ramel Bradley had eight points and 12 rebounds for the Wildcats, who swept the season series from the Bulldogs to keep a firm grip on second-place in the SEC's Eastern Division.

Terrance Woodbury led Georgia with 15 points and Sundiata Gaines had 10 points, 10 rebounds and six assists, but the Bulldogs shot just 32 percent from the floor and made just one field goal over the game's final six minutes.

Kentucky led by as many as 16, but the Bulldogs managed to hang around and got within three at 55-52 on a 3-pointer by Gaines with 6:22 to play. But Georgia couldn't quite make it all the way back. Six straight possessions the Bulldogs had the ball with a chance to cut the lead to one or tie.

It never happened. Bradley ended a four-minute drought for the Wildcats with a putback off a Patterson miss to push the lead to 57-52, and Kentucky's aggressive defense kept the Bulldogs from getting any closer.

Georgia center Dave Bliss, who knocked Bradley out of the game with a hard foul during Kentucky's win at Georgia on Feb. 2, was booed lustily by the crowd each time he touched the ball. Bradley said before the game that he was over the incident, claiming it was just something that happens during the course of a game.

Bradley's patience was tested again late, when he took an elbow from Billy Humphrey in the game's final minutes. Bradley went sprawling to the floor after the foul but popped back up and collected himself as Rupp Arena roared.

Kentucky's second half didn't seem like it would be necessary during a dizzying opening eight minutes.

Crawford wasted little time heating up, knocking down three 3-pointers in the game's first three minutes as Kentucky roared to a 20-4 lead and seemed ready to do to the Bulldogs what Vanderbilt did to the Wildcats in a 41-point rout last week.

Crawford, however, cooled off while Georgia steadied itself behind a steady dose of Woodbury. The Bulldogs eventually cut the gap to 33-30 before two free throws by Patterson and a layup by Bradley pushed the Wildcats to a 37-30 lead at the break.

Kentucky played without guard Jordie Meeks, who continues to struggle with a strained hip flexor.

Joe Crawford and Ramel Bradley had 18 points apiece as Kentucky spoiled the homecoming of Arkansas coach and former Wildcats standout John Pelphrey with a 63-58 victory over the Razorbacks.

Kentucky remained a perfect six-for-six in Southeastern Conference home games and sits two games behind No. 2 Tennessee for the top record in the East. Arkansas failed to make up ground on West-leading Mississippi State.

Pelphrey, a Kentucky native who was a fan favorite as a member of the "Unforgettables" team that lost to Christian Laettner and Duke in the 1992 NCAA regional final, returned to Rupp for the first time as a visiting head coach.

Moments after his players took the court to a scattering of boos, Pelphrey, wearing a Razorback red tie, received a standing ovation from the crowd as he made his entrance through the tunnel.

During team introductions, Pelphrey got an even more boisterous reception, with his retired No. 34 from his Kentucky playing days shown on the video screen.

And the Arkansas players nearly pulled this one out for their first-year coach.

Midway through the second half, Kentucky had trailed by as many as seven points, but the Wildcats clawed back to regain the lead down the stretch.

First, a fade jumper by Crawford tied the game at 55-55 with just over two minutes left. Then, another fade by Bradley a minute later gave the Wildcats the lead for good.

During long stretches, it seemed the Razorbacks' only hope was SEC player of the year candidate Sonny Weems, who had 26 points -- two shy of his career high.

Down 29-28 early in the second half, Arkansas regained the lead with a 3-pointer by Weems, and he wasn't finished there. He chased down a loose ball just before it bounced out of bounds, then tiptoed the sideline and sprinted to the basket for a fastbreak dunk.

The Wildcats dominated the rebounding battle 37-24 behind freshman Patrick Patterson, who had 11 rebounds to go along with his 14 points for his sixth double-double of the season.

Joe Crawford and Patrick Patterson scored 15 points apiece as Kentucky held off Mississippi 58-54.

Ramel Bradley added 14 points and five rebounds for Kentucky, which moved to within one game of No. 1 Tennessee for first place in the SEC's Eastern Division.

Chris Warren led Ole Miss with 25 points and Dwayne Curtis had 12 points and 15 rebounds, but the Rebels remained winless on the road in the SEC and continued their precipitous fall from the Top 25 last month. Ole Miss shot just 31 percent from the floor and turned the ball over 19 times.

Still, the Rebels had a chance to win it after whittling a 23-point deficit to two in the final seconds. Bradley missed a pair of free throws with the Wildcats up 56-54, and Warren raced up the floor. He missed a contested layup, but Curtis grabbed the rebound and threw it out to a wide-open Trevor Gaskins.

Gaskins' 3-pointer, however, was long. Kentucky's Perry Stevenson collected the rebound and handed it to Bradley, who sank two free throws with 7.6 seconds remaining to seal it.

The last-second scare seemed improbable during a sloppy first half. Kentucky wasted little time taking control, racing to a 22-4 lead as the Wildcats easily disrupted one of the SEC's most potent offenses.

Perplexed and harried by Kentucky's halfcourt trap, the Rebels went through a seven-minute scoreless drought in which the simple act of getting off a shot proved troublesome.

Even when it was easy, it wasn't easy. Ole Miss' David Huertas seemed to have an easy layup after swiping the ball from Bradley but threw up a brick. Jerney Parnell grabbed the rebound but was so flustered he quickly shoveled the ball back to Huertas, who desperately dropped in a layup.

It didn't get much prettier from there for Ole Miss, who needed a late first-half run to end the half with more points (14) than turnovers (12). By then the Wildcats were in control 31-14 and appeared on their way to a rare breather.

Chris Lofton scored 14 points, including a jump shot with 1:15 left, and the Vols beat Kentucky 63-60 to stay atop the Southeastern Conference.

The Vols squandered a big early lead in this one, then hung on to avoid consecutive losses for the first time this season.

Derrick Jasper hit a 3-pointer to cut the Vols' lead to 63-60, but Jasper and Joe Crawford both missed 3-point shots in the final 20 seconds that would have sent the game to overtime.

Tennessee held a 34-27 halftime advantage after leading the entire first half, but Kentucky tied it at 41 when Ramon Harris hit a jumper while being fouled by Duke Crews.

Harris hit the free throw to put the Wildcats up 42-41 with 13:54 left.

The teams then traded the lead until Ramar Smith dunked the ball to put Tennessee up 58-57 with 4:24 left. The Vols held on to the lead for the rest of the game.

Tyler Smith finished with 15 points for the Vols. Ramel Bradley led Kentucky with 17 points. Perry Stevenson added 13 points and grabbed 14 rebounds, and Harris finished with 12 points.

Always a bitter rivalry between bordering states, Tennessee added pomp and circumstance by honoring former All-American Ernie Grunfeld and retiring his No. 22 at halftime.

The rivalry between the Vols and Wildcats thrived when Grunfeld and fellow All-American Bernard King played in the late '70s, during the days of the so-called "Ernie & Bernie Show."

The Vols also dubbed the Sunday game Lofton's senior night, and hung 408 tiny '3' signs around the rim of the upper deck at Thompson-Boling Arena to represent each of his career 3-pointers entering the game.

He hit his only 3 of the game on two attempts with 13:38 left in the first half.

Tennessee jumped out to a quick 11-2 lead, and the Vols built the advantage to 20-5 on a putback shot by Ramar Smith with 11:22 left before halftime.

Tennessee managed only two free throws in 3 1/2 minutes as Kentucky scored nine points.

Bradley hit a jumper with the shot clock expiring to cut Tennessee's lead to 32-27 with 1:16 left in the half.

The Wildcats were playing without freshman phenom Patrick Patterson, who scored 20 points in their 72-66 win over Tennessee in January.

X-rays revealed Friday that Patterson, who was averaging more than 16 points a game, had a stress fracture in his left ankle and will miss the rest of the season.

Joe Crawford had a career-high 35 points as Kentucky continued its late charge to the NCAA tournament with a 71-63 victory over South Carolina.

The Wildcats have won 10 of their past 12 games after a 7-9 start under first-year coach Billy Gillispie left many in the Bluegrass State in shock. Since late January, though, Kentucky has played more like the team that takes a spot in the NCAA tournament for granted.

The win spoiled the final home game for South Carolina's retiring coach Dave Odom.

Kentucky seemed to have the game locked up with about 10 minutes left. Crawford hit two straight 3-pointers - one swished in from about 30 feet away - and followed with a jumper. When Ramel Bradley hit two foul shots with 9:09 left, the Wildcats were ahead 56-40.

The Gamecocks rallied to tighten things up. Brandis Raley-Ross and Zam Fredrick had 3s as South Carolina used a 17-6 run to trail 62-57 with 3:52 remaining.

But Bradley hit a 3-pointer, then broke free for a layup to restore control for Kentucky.

Bradley added 20 points for the Wildcats, who finish the regular season at home against defending national champion Florida.

Crawford surpassed his previous career best of 32 set in November against Texas Southern.

Fredrick led the way for the Gamecocks with 19 points.

Before the game, South Carolina honored Odom, who announced in January he would retire at season's end. Odom's wife, Lynn, his family and Terry Holland, his former boss at Virginia, joined the coach on court for a two-minute video tribute.

Afterward, the crowd at the Carolina Coliseum gave the seven-year coach a standing ovation. Two fans held up a simple sign, "Thanks Dave."

Neither team looked particularly crisp at the beginning, each committing a shot-clock violation before the game was two minutes old.

But after Devan Downey's foul shot put the Gamecocks up 8-7, Kentucky went on a 12-3 run the next nine minutes to take control.

It didn't hurt that South Carolina went 8:42 seconds between field goals, ending an 0-for-12 stretch before Dwayne Day's bucket ended the drought with 7:21 left in the half.

Kentucky snapped one streak in hopes of keeping alive another.

Perry Stevenson had 18 points -- including the game-clinching free throws with 9.6 seconds remaining -- and 10 rebounds as the surging Wildcats held off Florida 75-70, bolstering Kentucky's once fading NCAA tournament hopes.

Joe Crawford added 16 points and fellow senior Ramel Bradley had 14 points and seven assists in their final game at Rupp Arena as Kentucky won for the sixth time in seven games and ended a seven-game losing streak to the Gators.

Marreese Speights led Florida with 20 points and eight rebounds and Nick Calathes had 16 points and six assists, but the two-time defending national champions lost for the seventh time in 10 games.

The Wildcats took control during a nine-minute barrage early in the second half in which they hardly resembled the offensively challenged squad that has risen from the ashes of a poor nonconference schedule on the strength of a suffocating defense.

Kentucky seemed to put the game away during the 27-11 deluge that featured six 3-pointers, a few of them coming from unlikely places.

Derrick Jasper (14 points), hardly the most confident 3-point shooter on the team, knocked down three triples during the run. The first was an awkward bank shot from the corner and the second a line-drive dagger from the top of the key, the result of a desperate heave as the shot clock expired.

By the time Jasper knocked down his third, a more conventional swish from the corner, Kentucky led 60-44 with 8:41 remaining.

Yet nothing has come easy for the Wildcats this season, who have made a habit of throwing away sizable leads at home. Sunday was no different, as Calathes and Speights brought the Gators back. Using fullcourt pressure to fluster the Wildcats, the Gators got to within 73-70 on a layup by Jai Lucas with 23 seconds remaining.

Kentucky burned two timeouts trying to inbound the ball and needed the Gators to knock a couple of balls out of bounds just to get to halfcourt. The ball eventually ended up in Stevenson's hands, and the sophomore who has played well in the absence of injured star Patrick Patterson calmly knocked down two free throws to seal it.

Zac Swansey scored five points in overtime, including an unlikely turnaround 3-pointer with 1.2 seconds left, and Georgia upset Kentucky to 60-56 to continue its surprising SEC tournament run.

The game was originally scheduled for late Friday night at the Georgia Dome. It was postponed after a tornado damaged the facility during Mississippi State's overtime win over Alabama Friday night.

The Southeastern Conference tournament shifted to Alexander Memorial Coliseum on the campus of Georgia Tech. The game was played before an estimated crowd of 1,500, as only a limited number of friends, family and school officials were allowed to attend.

Terrance Woodbury scored 17 points and Sundiata Gaines had 16 as Georgia took its first SEC tournament victory over Kentucky in nine tries.

Swansey, a freshman who averages 4.2 points, was guarded by Ramon Harris as he drove the court before stopping, spinning and launching the 3-pointer in front of the Georgia bench, giving the Bulldogs a 57-56 lead.

Swansey, who did not score in regulation, had his chance after Gaines, a senior, fouled out with 1:33 left in regulation.

"It's something I dream for," Swansey said. "With Sundiata out of the game, it was an opportunity for me to come in the game and show what I could do. I told Sundiata I wasn't going to let his career end like this."

Ramel Bradley's jumper with 8.8 seconds left in overtime bounced around the rim before finally falling to give Kentucky a 56-54 lead.

It was the third overtime of the tournament and the second for Georgia, which beat Mississippi 97-95 in overtime in its opener Thursday night.

Joe Crawford led the Wildcats with 24 points. Bradley added 12. Bliss made two free throws with 59.4 seconds left for a 50-50 tie. Bradley had three misses on Kentucky's final possession in regulation.

Approximately 1,000 Kentucky fans and about 100 Georgia fans were joined by each team's pep band, cheerleaders and dance teams in the unusually intimate setting.

The tornado also caused damage to other hotels and buildings in downtown Atlanta. One Kentucky fan held a sign "Send car. Mine is crushed."

Kentucky made only one of its first nine shots as Georgia took early leads of 8-0 and 14-3.

Kentucky's man-to-man defense began to wear on the Bulldogs, who committed eight turnovers in the half as the Wildcats rallied. Kentucky closed the half with a 21-6 run to lead 25-22 at the break.
