CATS RETURN HOME 3-0 IN SEC PLAY

Riding a three-game winning streak, the Wildcats return home for the first time in a week and a half to host the Auburn Tigers in a regionally televised game on Raycom.

For the 38th time in program history, the Wildcats have started league play with a 3-0 record, the latest victory coming in the form of a 68-45 win at Georgia. Jodie Meeks continued his torid pace on the offensive end, recording a game-high 22 points. It was Meeks fifth straight 20-point game.

UK also had Patrick Patterson (15) and Perry Stevenson (13) scoring in double digits, while Stevenson and Michael Porter shared game high honors with six rebounds. In addition, Porter tallied seven points and three steals in only 17 minutes.

The Wildcats continued their stifling defense, holding the Bulldogs to 31.1 percent shooting from the field.

CAT SCRATCHES

- Kentucky is in its 106th season of basketball.
- Kentucky is the all-time NCAA leader in wins with 1,980.
- The Wildcats are 82-17 all-time against Auburn, including an impressive 42-2 mark in Lexington.
- Jodie Meeks leads the Southeastern Conference and ranks fourth nationally in scoring (25.7 ppg).
- Meeks is averaging 30.5 ppg in his last eight games.
- Patrick Patterson ranks third in the nation in FG percentage (67.7) and 37th in rebounding (9.2).
- Patterson is the only player in the SEC to rank in the top five in scoring (4th 18.2) and rebounding (3rd 9.2).
- UK ranks second in the country in blocked shots per game (7.4), fourth in field goal percentage (50.7), fifth in free throw percentage (79.2) and 10th in assists/game (17.6).
- Patrick Patterson has recorded nine double-doubles this season and 15 in his career, tying him for 22nd on UK's all-time double-doubles list.
- UK is 13-0 when leading at the half this season.
- Kentucky has not allowed an opponent to shoot 50 percent or higher from the field this season.

MEEKS RECEIVES PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Junior Jodie Meeks was named the SEC Player of the Week as announced by the league office on Monday.

The 6-4 Norcross, Ga., native helped lead Kentucky to a 2-0 record on the week with wins at Tennessee (90-72) and Georgia (68-45). Meeks set the school single-game scoring record with 54 points at Tennessee, while breaking the school mark for three-pointers with 10 in the same game. He followed that game with a 22-point effort at Georgia, shooting 8-for-16 from the field and 3for-8 from the three-point line.

In addition to the conference's player of the week honor, Meeks was also named Dick Vitale's, ESPN.com's and FoxSports.com's Player of the Week. He was also Digger Phelps' Highlighter of the Week.

SCOUTING AUBURN

Located in Auburn, Ala. (487 miles south of Lexington), Auburn is in the SEC West division.

Auburn comes of a big 85-71 win over in-state rival Alabama where the Tigers hit a season high 50 percent (10-20) from the behind the threepoint line.

The Tigers posted a seven-game winning streak prior to starting SEC play where they dropped two of their first three games.

Auburn has three players averaging in doubledigits led by DeWayne Reed (13.4). Korvotney Barber leads the team in rebounding (8.7 rpg) and blocked shots (17). Tay Waller leads the way from long range, averaging 36.3 percent (49-135) from three-point range.

Jeff Lebo is in his fifth season as head coach in Auburn where he has recorded a 68-70 (.493) record. Prior to his time on The Plains, Lebo was the head coach at chattanooga and Tennessee Tech. In his 11th season as a head coach, Lebo has amassed a 183-133 (.579) record.

SERIES HISTORY

Wednesday's match-up against Auburn marks the 100th meeting between the two schools. Having won nine straight matchups and 23 of the last 24, Kentucky owns an 82-17 (.828) advantage in the Auburn series. The Wildcats' .828 winning percentage against the Tigers is UK's second highest winning percentage (.896 vs. Ole Miss, .827 vs. Georgia) against an SEC opponent that was in the league prior to the 1992 expansion.

Kentucky won the only meeting between the two schools last year, an exciting 66-63 finish at Auburn.

Kentucky is 42-2 in Lexington against the Tigers, including a 22-9 mark in 23-1 mark in Rupp Arena against AU.

KENTUCKY-AUBURN CONNECTIONS

• UK junior Jodie Meeks and Auburn sophomore transfer Tony Neysmith both hail from Norcross, Ga. Both players attended Norcross High School. The pair led Norcross to a 28-4 record in 2005-06, Meeks' senior season and Neysmith's junior

season.

• Kentucky freshman DeAndre Liggins and Auburn sophomore transfer Brandon McGee are both natives of Chicago. Liggins went to George Washington High School before transferring to Findlay Prep in Las Vegas for his senior season. McGee attended Crane High School. McGee played his freshman year at Indiana last season. He played six minutes in the Hoosiers' 70-51 win over the Wildcats in Bloomington last season.

GILLISPIE FAMILIAR WITH AUBURN

Auburn was one of two SEC schools Billy Gillispie had faced prior to his tenure at UK. His last two Texas A&M squads played both Auburn and LSU, winning games against AU and losing twice to the Bayou Bengals.

The 2005-06 Aggies beat Auburn 72-67 in College Station, and A&M won by 29, 87-58, in the 2007 season on the Plains.

UK VS. THE SEC WEST

Kentucky is 458-111 (.805) against schools comprising the SEC's Western division. Since the Southeastern Conference split into two divisions against in 1992, the Wildcats have gone 105-24 (.814) against SEC West teams, and have won 18 of their last 19 home games against West foes.

UK is 32-3 in regular season play against the SEC West over the last six seasons, and 37-4 overall (including SEC Tournament) in that time.

Auburn marks the Wildcats first West division opponent this season.

FOLLOWING 50

Prior to Jodie Meeks' 54-point effort Tuesday night, two other Wildcats (Dan Issel and Cliff Hagan) had gone for 50 points three times. Following those 50-point games, Issel and Hagan averaged 25.3 points in their next game, led by a 47 point game by Issel.

• The Wildcats have won 43 SEC titles and 25 SEC Tournament Championships, more than the other 11 teams combined.

• Kentucky has won 10 of the last 17 SEC Tournament titles.

• UK has won 11 SEC East titles in the 17 seasons since the league expanded.

RECORD BREAKING PERFORMANCE

Jodie Meeks has had a career season so far, but no night was bigger than his performance against Tennessee.

Meeks broke the 38-year old school record for scoring in game with 54 points, while breaking Tony Delk's 1996 record by hitting on 10 threepointers.

The 6-4 junior also smashed the Thompson-Boling Arena which was set by Chris Jackson with 49 in the 1990 season.

Listed below are a few more accomplishments:

• Only the second 50-point effort in NCAA this season.

• First SEC player to score 50 since Shaquille O'Neal (53).

• First SEC player to score 50 in an SEC game since Chris Jackson (55) versus Ole Miss, Gerald Glass (53) versus LSU and Chris Jackson (50) versus Tennessee, all coming in 1989.

• In the last 38 years, only one SEC player has scored more points in any game. That was Chris Jackson 55 points versus Ole Miss in 1989.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR CANDIDATE

After his record breaking performance at Tennessee, Jodie Meeks was thrown into National Player of the Year talk.

Meeks vaulted into the talk after his 54-point performance at Tennessee.

After defeating Georgia on Sunday, the 6-4 junior is averaging a Southeastern Conference-best 25.7 points per game, which is fourth-best in the nation. He's shooting the ball at a 48 percent clip, including 44 percent from behind the arc, and he's missed just 11 of his 120 free throws this season. Throw in 3.7 rebounds, 1.9 assists and 1.5 steals a game and it becomes a pretty good case for the Player of the Year so far.

COACHING IN THE CONFERENCE

Billy Gillispie has made quite a statement in conference play since joining the league last season. He has posted a 15-4 (.789) record in SEC games.

Gillispie has had the most success of any current coach in the SEC through his first 19 games in the league.

PROTECTING THE BALL BETTER

As a team, Kentucky has drastically reduced its number of turnovers. UK posted four 20+ turnover efforts through their first six games.

Since then, the Wildcats have turned the ball over 20+ times in only two of their last 12 games.

A result of the Wildcats reduction in turnovers has been the points off turnovers stat. Through the first six games, Kentucky was outscored 131-108 in points off turnovers. In the last 12, UK has turned that around and outscored the opponent 230-172 in that category.

In addition, UK has won the turnover battle in six of its last eight outings.

PORTER TURN AROUND

Michael Porter had a rough start to the season, posting 19 assists to 25 turnovers through the first nine games.

He has turned his game around of late, recording 34 assists to 14 turnovers in the last nine games.

MEEKS AND PATTERSON, THE DYNAMIC DUO

Jodie Meeks and Patrick Patterson have been the most prolific offensive tandem in the SEC and one of the most dynamic duo in the country this season. One of the two have managed at least 20 points in a game 14 times this season and both have gone for 20 in the same game three times. The pair each cracked the 30 mark against Tennessee State.

Between the two of them, Meeks and Patterson are averaging 43.9 ppg. while shooting 55.8 percent from the field and 85.6 percent from the free throw line.

UNPARALLELED TRADITION

The Wildcats own an unparalleled tradition of success. Since 1903, the University of Kentucky has fielded 105 basketball teams. The first national championship was an NIT title in 1946. The first NCAA title came in 1948 and the latest, No. 7 occurred 1998. No other program can claim the unparalleled success that matches the Wildcats' efforts over the past century.

Additionally the two are a double threat, with Patterson getting the bulk of his scoring down low, while Meeks is one of the deadliest outside shooters in college basketball.

Meeks and Patterson are currently the most electric offensive pairing for the Wildcats since Dan Issel (33.9) and Mike Pratt (19.3) averaged 53.2 ppg for UK in the 1969-70 season.

And as if sharing offensive responsibilities on the floor wasn't enough, the two also share a room at Wildcat Lodge.

MEEKS ON FIRE

Jodie Meeks didn't let up any after his 46-point outing against Appalachian State. The junior proceeded to dump 32 points on Tennessee State and is averaging 30.5 ppg in his last eight games. During that span he's shooting 52.9 percent from the field and 51.2 percent from behind the three-point line. Meeks has also maintained his focus at the free throw line hitting on 94.8 percent of his attempts.

MEEKS SCORING EARLY AND OFTEN

Jodie Meeks is making up for lost time, having missed 20 games last year to various injuries. He has led the Wildcats in scoring in 11 of 18 games this season including a school record 54 points against Tennessee, 46 points against Appalachian State, 39 points in the season opener against VMI, 37 against Kansas State and 32 against Tennessee State.

The 6-4 junior is averaging 25.7 ppg, the best 18-game start for a Wildcat since Jamal Mashburn averaged 21.9 ppg through the first 18 games of the 1992-93 season.

During his current 18-game stretch, Meeks has reached double-figures in the first half 12 times, including 27 against Tennessee State, 26 against Tennessee and 24 against Kansas State and Appalachian State. Meeks has pulled the trick in seven of the Cats last eight games.

JODIE MEEKS FREE THROW WATCH

After going 14-for-14 from the free throw line at Tennessee, Jodie Meeks had made 34 consecutive free throws. He hit his first two from the line against Georgia pushing his streak to 36, however he missed on his next attempt.

His 36 straight free throws made was the 13th longest single season streak in SEC history, and the third longest in school history.

APPROACHING 1,000

Kentucky junior Jodie Meeks and sophomore Patrick Patterson are quickly approaching 1,000 points for their career at UK.

Meeks currently needs only 145 more points to reach the 1,000 point club. The Wildcats currently have 13 games left in the regular season and given the Wildcats play at least two postseason games Meeks will only have to average 9.7 ppg from here on out to reach 1,000. The single game scoring leader is currently averaging 25.7 ppg this season and 13.6 ppg for his career.

Patterson needs 262 more points to reach the

1,000 mark. Presuming UK plays 15 more games throughout the season as stated above, Patterson will have to average 17.5 ppg to reach 1,000. He is averaging 18.2 this season and 17.2 for his career.

WILDCATS RANKED NATIONALLY

Kentucky currently ranks fourth in the nation and leads the SEC in field goal percentage, hitting at a 50.7 percent clip.

The Wildcats can also be found among the nation's best in blocked shots (2nd - 7.4), free throw percentage (5th - 79.2), assists (10th - 17.6), field goal percentage defense (12th - 36.7) and rebound margin (23rd - +7.2).

MEEKS, PATTERSON AMONG NATION'S BEST

Patrick Patterson ranks third in the nation in field goal percentage (67.7) while Jodie Meeks ranks fourth in the nation in scoring (25.7 ppg) and sixth in free throw percentage (90.8). Both Wildcats lead the league in their respective categories.

Joining Meeks and Patterson among the nation's elite is Perry Stevenson, who ranks 20th nationally in blocked shots with 41.

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT

The Wildcats are currently averaging 79.7 points per game through their first 18 games of the season. That's the highest offensive output 18 games into the season since the 2002 team averaged 80.4 ppg through the first 18 games that year.

DOUBLING UP

Patrick Patterson recorded three straight double-doubles against Longwood, Kansas State and West Virginia. It was the first time since Randolph Morris pulled the trick at the end of the 2006-07 season.

The sophomore's nine double-doubles this season is the most in the SEC.

Patterson picked up his 15th career doubledouble against Louisville, placing him in a tie for 22nd on UK's all-time double-double list.

30-POINT GAMES

The Wildcats had an offensive outburst against Tennessee State, led by Patrick Patterson's 33 points and Jodie Meeks' 32.

The last time two Wildcats managed 30 or better in a game was in 1975 when Jack Givens and Rick Robey.

In addition, it was Meeks second straight 30 point effort, marking the first time a Wildcat has scored 30 in back-to-back games since Derrick Miller pulled the feat in 1989.

TURNAROUND

The Wildcats made significant improvement through the pre-conference portion of the schedule, compared to last season. Prior to starting SEC play in the 2008 season, UK posted a 6-7 record, while the Wildcats were 11-4 heading into league play this year.

In addition, the Cats averaged 80.5 ppg, compared to last year's 72.4 ppg heading into league play.

Interestingly enough, UK is still playing the same rugged defense allowing opponents just 65.1 ppg and 37.3 percent from the field compared to 65.3 ppg and 37.4 last season before SEC play.

TOP PERFORMANCES

The Wildcats have had some of the best single game performances in the league this year. Jodie Meeks' 54-point effort against Tennessee is tops in in the league and second in the nation. Additionally, Meeks' 46-point effort against Appalachian State is third nationally and second in the SEC, while his 39-point effort against VMI and 37point effort against Kansas State rank as the third and fourth highest individual scoring games in the league this season.

Meeks owns the top three three-point performances in the league with 10 (at Tennessee), nine (vs. Appalachian State) and eight (vs. Tennessee State). His 10 treys against Tennessee is tied for the for the most in the country this year. His nine three-pointers against ASU is tied for second nationally.

The junior from Norcross also owns the top two free throws made performances in the league this season with 14 (14-for-14 at Tennessee), 12 (12-for-12 vs. WVU). Patterson's 16-rebound effort against Miami is tied for the fourth highest in the SEC.

As a team, the Wildcats' .688 field goal percentage against Kansas State is the top single game percentage in the SEC this season.

PATTERSON WELL-ROUNDED IN SEC

Patrick Patterson is the only player in the league to rank in the top five in scoring (4th - 18.2) and rebounding (third - 9.2).

SWAT TEAM

Perry Stevenson (41) and Patrick Patterson (37) have combined for 78 blocked shots in Kentucky's first 18 games ranking them second and third in the SEC respectively.

Kentucky ranks second nationally and second in the league in blocked shots per game (7.4). UK has reached double digits in blocked shots seven times this season.

Kentucky blocked a season best 12 shots against Appalachian State and Indiana, 11 shots against Mississippi Valley State and 10 each against VMI, Delaware State and Longwood.

MUSCLE IN THE PAINT

The Wildcats pulled down 50 rebounds in the 91-57 win over Longwood. It was the most rebounds by UK since pulling down 51 against Houston on January 3, 2007.

In addition, Kentucky dominated the Lancers in the paint, outscoring them 54-16. The Wildcats have controlled the paint, outscoring their opponents 688-447 so far this season. UK also put up an impressive 70 points in the paint in the season opener against VMI.

BALANCED ATTACK

The Wildcats have one of the most balanced attacks in the conference. Kentucky leads the league in field goal percentage at 50.7 percent while ranking second in the league in field goal percentage defense at 36.7 percent.

C NOTES

For the third time this season, the Wildcats hit the century mark, totaling 102 points against Tennessee State, marking the first time since the 1996-97 season UK has posted three 100 point games.

Earlier in the season, the Wildcats scored 103 against VMI and dropped 103 on Lamar.

PATTERSON ON NAISMITH AND WOODEN WATCH LISTS

Patrick Patterson has been named to a couple of prestigious watch lists this season including the John R. Wooden Award and the Naismith Trophy.

Patterson was named to the Top 50 watch list for the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy.

In mid-January, the Wooden Award Committee will release the Midseason Top 30 list, followed in March by the National Ballot, consisting of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The 6-9 sophomore was also a unanimous First Team preseason All-SEC team choice by league coaches. Jodie Meeks was selected Second Team All-SEC.

*-Rather than assembling first, second, third and fourth team squads, the collegeinsider.com All-America team is one team consisting of 16 players.

SEC PREDICTIONS

Once again, the Wildcats have been selected as one of the top teams in the SEC. Kentucky was selected to finish third in the SEC East Division behind the Tennessee Volunteers and Florida Gators by media members throughout the conference.

UK received two first place votes from media members.

HOOD, ORTON, VILARINO SIGN EARLY

The University of Kentucky men's basketball program received three National Letters of Intent from Jon Hood, Daniel Orton and GJ Vilarino, Coach Billy Gillispie announced on Wednesday.

Jon Hood, a senior at Madisonville North Hopkins, is a 6-6 shooting guard. A native of Madisonville, Ky., Hood averaged 21.4 points, 8.5 rebounds, four assists, and two blocks per game as a junior. He shot 52 percent from the field and 41 percent from behind the three-point line. He also tallied three triple doubles last season on his way to first team All-State honors.

Daniel Orton, a senior at Bishop McGuinness High School, hails from Oklahoma City, Okla. The 6-10 center is a three-time class 4A state champion in Oklahoma and was named the 2008 state tournament MVP. Orton averaged 15.3 points, 9.7 rebounds, 6.8 blocks and five assists as a junior en route to first team All-State honors.

Point guard GJ Vilarino, from McKinney, Texas, is currently a senior at McKinney High School. A 2008 first team All-State performer and District MVP, Vilarino averaged 20.5 points and 4.63 assists last season while shooting 48 percent from the field and 78 percent from the free throw line.

CATS IN THE RANKINGS

UK finally made a push to get back in the Top 25 on Jan. 19 when the Wildcats received votes in both the Associated Press and *USA Today* Top 25 polls.

Including the pre-season polls, it was the first time since 1990-91, UK could not be found among the top 25 teams in the country. Prior to this year, UK had been ranked nationally in the preseason every year since 1991-92.

Dick Vitale was the lone media member that has the Wildcats ranked, placing them 24th in his preseason Top 25.

NATIONAL EXPOSURE

Kentucky will play 13 games on CBS, ESPN or ESPN2 this year. The Wildcats first appeared on national television this season in the second game of the regular season against top-ranked North Carolina on ESPN.

Kentucky returned home for two games in the Las Vegas Invitational and then traveled to Las Vegas for the remainder of the tournament. UK's first game in Vegas against Kansas State aired on ESPNU, followed by the championship game against West Virginia on ESPN2.

In addition, UK played Miami (12/6) and Tennessee (1/13) on ESPN and still has Ole Miss (1/27), Florida (2/10) and Vanderbilt (2/17) on the ESPN schedule.

The Wildcats also have six games slated for broadcast on CBS having already played Indiana (12/13) and Louisville (1/4) with Arkansas (2/14), Tennessee (2/21), LSU (2/28) and Florida (3/7) left on the schedule.

THREE MANIA

UK has the nation's third-longest active streak of consecutive games with a made three-pointer. UK has hit a three-pointer in 691 consecutive games, which trails only UNLV and Vanderbilt.

The Wildcats' last game without a three-pointer came 19 seasons ago against Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 1988, a "three-point" loss in the Great Alaska Shootout.

As of Jan. 19, UNLV and Vanderbilt have hit a three-pointer in every game since the three-point rule was adopted to start the 1986-87 season. The Rebels' streak is 725 games, while Vanderbilt's streak is 715 games.

CATS ROCK AT RUPP ARENA

• UK has won 82 of its last 101 home games. The Cats were 14-4 at home last season and are 9-2 in the venerable arena this season. The Wildcats are 423-56 (.883) all-time in Rupp Arena.

• UK has won 20 national attendance titles in the building, including 12 of the last 13.

• The Rupp Arena attendance record of 24,465 was set in 2007 against Florida on Feb. 10.

• The Wildcats have posted a remarkable 238-34 (.875) record in regular season SEC games played in Rupp.

BIG BLUE MANIA CATS WITHOUT KEIGHTLEY THIS SEASON

On March 31, 2008, long time Kentucky basketball manager Bill Keightley passed away at the age of 81 in Cincinnati.

Affectionately known as "Mr. Wildcat", he had been associated with the Wildcats' basketball program since 1962. Keightley, who manned the "Bill Keightley Equipment Room" in Memorial Coliseum, was as much a fixture around UK basketball as the seven national championship trophies on display in the Joe Craft Center.

His career spanned five decades, six head coaches, 1,113 victories and three national championships. A crowd of over 3,000 paid their respects at a tribute to Mr. Keightley held in Rupp Arena. Former players, coaches and managers traveled from across the country to eulogize him.

KEIGHTLEY HONORED AT MVSU GAME

The University of Kentucky honored the legacy of former equipment manager Bill Keightley, also known as Mr. Wildcat, at the Kentucky-Mississippi Valley State basketball game.

Keightley's family consisting of his widow Hazel, daughter Karen Marlowe and son-in-law Alden Marlowe, were honored in a ceremony at halftime at which time his jersey was retired a final time in Rupp Arena.

A representative of Mr. Keightley's family was the first of a season long program that will reflect Mr. Keightley's legacy and his well-known respect for Kentuckians from all walks of life. Beginning Dec. 7, fans could register at UKathletics.com for an opportunity to sit in Mr. Keightley's seat on the Kentucky bench from pre-game through the first media timeout of a game.

The game program as well as the game ticket also honored Mr. Wildcat.

"SUPER FAN" IN 56TH SEASON

UK fan Bob Wiggins, 80, continues his amazing streak of following the basketball Cats. The 2008-09 season is his 56th watching Kentucky in person and through his own record-keeping, he has attended 1,411 UK games.

His home-court streak spans 47 years and 688 games. During that period, which dates back to 1960-61, UK has a home record of 607-81 (.882).

Last Time vs. Auburn • Kentucky 66, Auburn 63 (2/6/08)

The Kentucky Wildcats survived the battle of teams whittled down to little more than their starting lineups.

Patrick Patterson hit 3-of-4 free throws over the final 45 seconds and Kentucky shot a season-high 67 percent to hold on for a 66-63 win over Auburn, despite the absence of star guard Ramel Bradley.

The Wildcats sorely missed him when Auburn started aggressively trapping on defense and forcing mistakes to cut down a 10point lead over the final six minutes. They committed 24 turnovers.

"If you play the way we did (in the SEC), you usually lose," Kentucky coach Billy Gillispie said. "We played pretty ugly tonight but pulled it together so I am happy about that. It's no easy task to do something like that."

The Tigers played only six players while Kentucky played a seventh for just three minutes of the game between two injury-depleted teams.

Joe Crawford scored 20 points and Patterson had 19 points and eight rebounds for Kentucky, which held on for a fourth consecutive SEC win.

Bradley missed the game with a virus. Guard Jodie Meeks remained out with a hip injury.

A 58-48 lead all but disappeared, and Auburn closed to within 64-63 with five quick points. Rasheem Barrett hit a 3-pointer with 30 seconds remaining and DeWayne Reed then had a steal and layup.

Crawford saved the Wildcats from serious trouble with a long heave across midcourt to Michael Porter when Auburn nearly forced a 10-second violation with a full-court press.

The Tigers were forced to foul Ramon Harris, who made 1-of-2 free throws with 14 seconds to play. Reed then tried a long 3-pointer that missed badly, and Patterson grabbed the rebound.

Patterson made one of two free throws with 3 seconds left and

Lucas Hargrove rebounded the miss and threw up a desperation shot

Patterson and Crawford fueled Kentucky's hot shooting performance. Patterson made 8-of-10 baskets. Crawford was 8-for-12 and made three 3-pointers for the short-handed Wildcats. Perry Stevenson scored 10 points before fouling out late.

Quan Prowell led Auburn with 20 points and nine rebounds. Rasheem Barrett had 12 points, Quantez Robertson 11 and Frank Tolbert 10

The Wildcats took advantage of a stretch when Auburn missed eight straight shots to build the 58-48 lead on Patterson's short jumper with 6:22 left.

The Tigers then started to force mistakes.

Tolbert got a steal and then hit two free throws with 2:06 to play to cut it to 62-57 and make it a tight game.

Tolbert stole the ball near midcourt and forced Stevenson to commit his fifth foul to prevent an easy layup.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Billy Gillispie didn't mention Gardner-Webb, but his postgame assessment was verbatim from the last time his Kentucky team was shocked like this.

"They whipped us," Gillispie said of the Wildcats' 111-103 upset to Virginia Military Institute Friday night.

The upset came just over a year after Gardner-Webb's 84-68 stunner over the Wildcats in Gillispie's second game as coach. The sequel came in the opener of year two, which was supposed to be a tuneup for the Wildcats' trip to No. 1 North Carolina next week.

VMI's shoot-first approach was lethal to Kentucky's youthful backcourt. Not since 1989 against North Carolina had a Kentucky team given up so many points, although it was also the first time in five years the Wildcats had passed the century mark.

Travis Holmes led six Keydets in double-digits with 30 points and was beaming afterward.

Even a 39-point effort from Kentucky's Jodie Meeks -- nearly double his career high of 21 -- wasn't enough to keep pace.

The Keydets took an 83-60 lead, their largest of the game, on Keith Gabriel's 3-pointer with 14:10 to go. It was VMI's 13th 3-pointer of the game, but the next wouldn't come until 10 minutes later.

In between was a furious Kentucky comeback.

Down 90-73 with 11 minutes to go, Kentucky scored the next 19 points -- nine of them by Meeks -- to cut the deficit to 1.

The Wildcats tied the game at 95 with 5 minutes left on Perry Stevenson's tip-in and took their first lead on Ramon Harris' layup seconds later.

But the Keydets had one last run left, and it was too much. After Kentucky's Patrick Patterson hit a layup to pull the Wildcats to 104-103, the Keydets scored the final 7 points to ice the game.

Patterson, UK's star center, finished with only 8 points

Kentucky was sloppy early, racking up 13 of its 25 turnovers in the first 11 minutes. That, coupled with the Keydets' apparent inability to miss a 3-pointer -- good on 7 of their first 8 attempts -made for an anxious first half for the capacity Rupp Arena crowd.

VMI jumped out to a 14-3 lead three minutes in and stretched their advantage to 42-21 at the 10-minute mark after two free throws from Willie Bell.

Then the tide seemed to turn for the Wildcats, albeit briefly. The Keydets finally started misfiring from long range, connecting on only one of seven attempts the rest of the half, and Kentucky finally started showing signs of offensive life.

The Wildcats strung together three straight dunks in less than a minute, including one apiece by Perry Stevenson and Meeks. The highlight came from freshman guard Darius Miller, who grabbed Meeks' missed 3-pointer out of the air and slammed it home.

Kentucky trailed 57-47 at halftime, but VMI made its first two 3s of the second half to stretch its lead. VMI's game plan had called for 50 three-point shots. Instead, it attempted 31, making 14.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. -- Deon Thompson scored a career-high 20 points to help North Carolina beat Kentucky 77-58 on Tuesday night, his second straight confidence-building performance in Hansbrough's absence to start the season. But freshman 7-footer Tyler Zeller suffered a wrist injury late in the game that had coach Roy Williams sounding pessimistic.

Zeller, who has started the first two games for Hansbrough, was injured after taking a hard foul by Ramon Harris in transition after a turnover. Zeller fell to the ground under the basket and got up holding his left wrist before heading to the locker room with 1:26 left and eventually being taken to a hospital for X-rays.

The apparent injury put a damper on an otherwise easy victory for the Tar Heels (2-0), who led by double figures 4 minutes into the game and never looked back in a matchup of the winningest programs in men's college basketball. The Tar Heels have beaten the Wildcats in each of the past five seasons.

Hansbrough has missed almost three weeks of practice with a stress reaction in his right shin, while top defender Marcus Ginyard is out until December after foot surgery. But the Tar Heels didn't need them to send the Wildcats to their first 0-2 start since the 2001 season

Their trapping defense forced 28 turnovers by Kentucky -which had 25 in its opening loss to VMI -- while Thompson led an offense that spent much of the game on cruise control with a comfortable lead

After matching his previous high with 17 points in the opener, Thompson was 10-of-16 from the field and had nine rebounds before leaving to a standing ovation and fans chanting his name after he fouled out with 2:45 left.

Patrick Patterson had 19 points and 11 rebounds to lead Kentucky, which was coming off a 111-103 loss to the Keydets for the Wildcats' second stunning early season home loss in as many seasons.

North Carolina's traps caused all kinds of problems early, speeding up the Wildcats and keeping them from getting the ball inside to Patterson -- the matchup that most concerned Williams with Hansbrough sidelined. Instead, the Wildcats committed six turnovers in the first 5 1/2 minutes to help the Tar Heels run out in transition to a 15-2 lead.

The Tar Heels guickly increased the margin, converting a backcourt turnover into a 3-pointer from Wayne Ellington then forced another one that led to an alley-oop pass from Ty Lawson to Ellington for a dunk and a 25-6 lead midway through the half.

Kentucky never had an answer. The Wildcats got no closer than 11 points, fell behind by 16 at halftime and trailed by as many as 21 midway through the second half.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Jodie Meeks and his Kentucky teammates made it clear from the beginning of their game against Delaware State on Saturday that they had no plans to lose their third game in a row to open the season.

They had lost their home opener to VMI, then took a second defeat at No. 1 North Carolina.

Kentucky's stifling defense frustrated the Hornets and Meeks scored from all over the floor to give the Wildcats their first win of the season. The Wildcats had not been 0-3 since 1926.

The junior guard scored 22 points to lead Kentucky to a 71-42 victory.

Meeks made 5 of 8 of his 3-point attempts. He has been the scoring leader, or shared that honor, for Kentucky (1-2) in each game

The Wildcats kept the defensive pressure on the Hornets (1-5), forcing 22 turnovers -- 13 in the first half. Delaware State made only 1 of 9 3-point attempts.

"This is probably the most talented team defensively we'll play all year," Hornets coach Greg Jackson said.

The Wildcats fans roared their approval on one defensive play by Ramon Harris. Though he didn't come up with the steal, Harris went to the floor for a loose ball near the sideline, tried to throw a saving pass while sliding on his backside, but found a Delaware State player.

Jackson knew the deck was stacked against his team, coming into Rupp Arena against a team -- and fans -- starving for a win, on the fourth of eight consecutive games on the road.

"We could've come in here with a full tank and still gotten the same result," Jackson said. "We couldn't match their intensity, and not only their intensity, but their talent."

Trevor Welcher and Arturo Dubois led the Hornets with 10 points each. Frisco Sandidge had eight rebounds for Delaware State. DSU had eight offensive rebounds, one in the first half, and one second-chance point in the game.

Kentucky scored first in the second half on a 3-pointer by Michael Porter. DSU looked like it might make a game of it after that, when Dubois made three field goals in a row to make the score 40-29. Then Kentucky made its run.

The Wildcats scored 14 in a row in an assault from all over the court -- fast break layups, dunks, free throws and 3-pointers. With 9:21 to play, the Wildcats had made the score 54-29.

The loss was the fifth in a row for the Hornets since winning their first of the season.

Patterson, seven months removed from surgery to repair a stress fracture in his left ankle, added 12 rebounds and a careerhigh six assists for Kentucky (2-2), which needed just nine minutes to build a 24-point lead in winning its second straight.

Jodie Meeks added 17 points, Josh Harrellson scored 12 and Ramon Harris had nine points and eight rebounds for the Wildcats, who shot 52 percent from the field and outrebounded the Lancers 50-33

Ryan Bogan led Longwood (3-3) with 20 points, including six 3pointers, and Dana Smith had 18 points and six rebounds for the Lancers.

Patterson's aggressiveness was a marked departure from his somewhat tentative play at times during Kentucky's first three games as he slowly working his way back into shape after a lengthy layoff following surgery.

Judging by the way he played against the Lancers, particularly during his 22-point outburst in the first half, Patterson's rehab may almost be over.

Using his size to create plenty of room on the block, Patterson had little trouble getting his shot off against whoever Longwood threw at him. He made 12-of-15 field goals, most of them within a foot or two of the basket

The Wildcats got off to a quick start, scoring the game's first seven points and using their pressure to force the Lancers into careless turnovers which Kentucky turned into easy baskets at the other end.

A putback by Ramon Harris gave Kentucky a 31-7 lead, though Bogan led a mini-rally by knocking down four 3-pointers over the next five minutes to cut the deficit to 38-24. The Wildcats, with more than a little urging by coach Billy Gillispie, ended the half with a 13-0 run to go up 51-24. Longwood never made a serious run in the second half.

Kentucky heads west to continue play in the Las Vegas Invitational over the weekend. The Wildcats play Kansas State on Friday and either West Virginia or Iowa on Saturday.

LAS VEGAS, Nev. - Jodie Meeks scored a game high of 37 points along with six rebounds and four steals to lead Kentucky over Kansas State 74-72 in the third round of the Las Vegas Invitational Friday night.

Meeks outscored Kansas State (5-1) by himself in the first half, 24-23. For the game, he went 11-of-17 from the field, 11-of-13 from the free-throw line for Kentucky (3-2), which next plays West Virginia in the championship game Saturday night.

Also for Kentucky, Patrick Patterson added 14 points and 10 rebounds, while Ramon Harris added 12 points.

Jacob Pullen led Kansas State with 20 points and five steals. Sutton added 15 points and Darren Kent had 12 for Kansas State, which plays lowa in the third-place game on Saturday.


After Kansas State jumped to a 16-7 advantage. Kentucky went on a 14-0 run and led at halftime 37-23.

DeAndre Liggins added 16 points, seven rebounds and five assists for the Wildcats (5-2). Kentucky shot 64 percent from the floor while overpowering the Cardinals to win its fifth straight.

The Wildcats played most of the game without Ramon Harris, was taken to a local hospital for tests after colliding with teammate Michael Porter in the first half.

Harris and Porter appeared to bang heads while scrambling near a loose ball, with both players falling to the floor. Harris struggled to get to his feet before falling back to the floor. He lay motionless for several minutes before being taken off the floor on a stretcher.

Porter received 10 stitches over his left eye but was back on the bench by the end of the first half, though he did not return.

Kentucky had a season-high 25 assists on 38 field goals and turned it over just 16 times while playing with the kind of precision it has lacked for long stretches early in the season.

It took the Wildcats less than five minutes to build a double-digit lead and went seven minutes without turning it over, heady territory for a team that was giving it away once every 90 seconds coming in.

Liggins hit Patterson with a pair of fullcourt passes that led to easy layups, and he even showed off a little range. He knocked down a pair of 3-pointers in the second half that gave Kentucky a 74-37 lead.

Coy Custer and Kenny Dawkins led Lamar (5-1) with 11 points apiece. The Wildcats outscored Lamar 46-24 in the paint and had a 20-2 advantage in fastbreak points.

Patterson had his way in the lane, making 11 of 12 field goals and 9 of 11 free throws.

Gillispie stressed the Wildcats couldn't afford to get off to a slow start against the smaller, quicker Cardinals and his team responded by making 16 of its first 20 shots. The Wildcats cruised to a 26-point halftime lead and Lamar didn't make a serious run at the lead in the second half.

LEXINGTON, Ky. - Jack McClinton scored 23 points and James Dews added a season-high 18 as No. 21 Miami defeated ice-cold shooting Kentucky 73-67 on Saturday.

The tale of the tape in this one was found beyond the 3-point arc. Miami (5-2) matched a season best with eight 3s, while Kentucky (5-3) misfired on 23 of 25 from behind the line.

Dews matched his career high with four 3s.

The Wildcats had their worst shooting game, going 25-70 (35.7 percent).

Down 49-28, Kentucky went on a 12-1 run to cut the deficit to 10. The Wildcats would get within four a few minutes later after a fastbreak layup by DeAndre Liggins and another one by Jodie Meeks, fed by Liggins following a steal.

But Miami's victory was preserved by two long jumpers by Brian Asbury.

The first appeared to be a 3, but his foot was ruled on the line. The second was a no-doubter, pushing the Hurricanes' lead to 65-56 with under two minutes left.

Asbury's 3 was Miami's only one of the second half, but it appeared early that the Hurricanes' sharp-shooting guards were going to overwhelm the Wildcats much the way VMI did earlier this season in an upset win.

Miami opened the game with two 3-pointers in the first minute and nailed two more, both by Dews, in the final minute before halftime. In between, things weren't much better for a Kentucky defense that couldn't seem to guard jump shots and a Kentucky offense that couldn't seem to make them.

Miami closed the half on a 15-4 run, including the two last-minute 3s by Dews, to take a 46-26 lead.

The taller Wildcats did the things they were expected to do, such as dominate the paint with 36 points compared to Miami's 18, and outrebound the Hurricanes 45-35.


Kentucky's Patrick Patterson had a career-high 16 rebounds to go along with his 19 points, his fifth double-double of the season.

Liggins, a freshman, also had a standout offensive game with several highlight reel plays en route to a career-high 18 points, but he was 0-for-8 from 3-point range. Meeks, Kentucky's usual long-range specialist, wasn't much better, hitting just two 3s in the first half and missing his other 10 tries.

Miami was fighting to remain in the Top 25 after a home loss last week to Ohio State. Kentucky hasn't beaten a ranked opponent since topping Tennessee last January.

Kentucky point guard Michael Porter, wearing a headband to cover up a laceration that required 10 stitches after his collision with teammate Ramon Harris, started the game but fouled out with only two points. Harris attended the game wearing a neck collar.

Miss. Valley St. 65 Kentucky 88

LEXINGTON, Ky. - Jodie Meeks had 24 points and Patrick Patterson added 21 as Kentucky rebounded from its sluggish shooting a day earlier with a 88-65 blowout over Mississippi Valley State on Sunday.

Kentucky (6-3) made 54 percent of its shots and held the Delta Devils (0-10) to 34 percent.

Nobody had more of a resurgence than Meeks, who missed 10 of 12 3-point attempts Saturday in Kentucky's loss to No. 21 Miami. His shooting returned in a hurry as he made 8 of 12 shots from the floor and scored half of his points from long-range.

Kentucky led 42-36 with 18 minutes left in the game after a 3pointer by MVSU's Shannon Behling, but then the Wildcats went on a 17-1 run to erase any doubt.

But it wasn't just Meeks' jump shots that were clicking for Kentucky. The Wildcats consistently got the ball inside to their big man, Patrick Patterson, who had his sixth double-double of the year, with 10 rebounds to go along with his 21 points. Perry Stevenson had a game-high 12 rebounds.

During one play in the Wildcats' second half run, freshman DeAndre Liggins hit Patterson with a crisp pass through several defenders, setting up the easy bucket.

Liggins led the team with five assists to go along with his 10 points.

The Wildcats wore black uniforms with the name Keightley on the back, a tribute to their longtime equipment manager Bill Keightley who died of a brain tumor this year. At halftime, a Keightley uniform bearing the number 48 – representing the 48 years the man affectionately known as "Mr. Wildcat" spent on the Kentucky bench – was lifted to the Rupp Arena rafters.

A 3-pointer by Shannon Behling pulled the Delta Devils to within 30-28 with three minutes to go before halftime. Behling led the Delta Devils with 20 points and 7 rebounds.

Kentucky quickly padded the lead by scoring the next nine points, seven by Meeks within the span of 30 seconds. After sinking two free throws, Meeks scored from the lane off a steal, then hit his second 3-pointer to put the Wildcats up by 11.

Junior college transfer Kevin Galloway made the first start of his Kentucky career, and freshman Landon Slone saw his first significant playing time and first points – two 3-pointers in the first half.

LEXINGTON, Ky. - So much for slow starts. Kentucky cured its early-game ills in a flash Saturday and, in the process, got a little vengeance for last year's thumping by interstate rival Indiana.

All week, Wildcats coach Billy Gillispie had preached the idea of showing more energy out of the gate, considering two of Kentucky's three losses were the result of sluggish starts in which a ferocious comeback fell short.

This time, Kentucky got off to a 14-0 lead, and it was the Hoosiers who were forced to play catch up. They never did.

Josh Harrellson scored 15 points off the bench to lead four other Wildcat players in double-digits as Kentucky dominated Indiana 72-54 Saturday in the annual interstate rivalry between the two storied but struggling programs.

Kentucky (7-3) won for the 29th time in 52 meetings between the two schools, and the Wildcats increased their record to 7-1 against the Hoosiers (5-5) at Rupp Arena. The game traditionally had been played at a neutral site, either Indianapolis or Louisville, but that changed two years ago due to a scheduling conflict.

The Wildcats overwhelmed the Hoosiers from the opening tip, scoring the first 14 points of the game—all from the paint, including four dunks.

Kentucky stretched the lead to 32-6 with 8 minutes to go before halftime after back-to-back 3-pointers by Meeks and Harrellson.

The Hoosiers, known for their own second half comebacks this season that fell short, were able to shave Kentucky's lead somewhat. Two free throws by Verdell Jones made it 41-26 midway through the second half, and a flurry of fouls and fastbreaks at the end provided the final margin.

Five Kentucky scorers accounted for all but 12 of the points. Joining Harrellson in double-digits were Jodie Meeks (13), Patterson (12), DeAndre Liggins (10) and Perry Stevenson (10). Stevenson also led the Wildcats with 9 rebounds and 6 blocks, the most by a Kentucky player since he accomplished the feat last season.

While both teams were turnover-prone in the first half, combining for 36, the mistakes were lethal to the Hoosiers but barely fazed the Wildcats. Kentucky turned Indiana's 15 first half turnovers into 10 points, while the Hoosiers had nothing to show for Kentucky's 11 turnovers.

Indiana made just 37 percent of its shots—and just 23 percent in the first half. It made just 4 of 20 3-point attempts and didn't get a single free throw attempt in the first half. The Wildcats led 36-13 at the break.

Appalachian St. 69 Kentucky 93

LOUISVILLE, Ky. - Jodie Meeks scored a career-high 46 points as Kentucky blew out Appalachian State 93-69 on Saturday.

Meeks did it all, making 14-of-21 field goals, including 9-of-14 3-pointers and hitting 9-of-10 free throws as the Wildcats (8-3) won for the eighth time in nine games. Meeks' total was the most by a Kentucky player since Dan Issel scored 47 against Alabama in '70.

Patrick Patterson added 19 points and seven rebounds for UK.

Kellen Brand had 16 points and Ryann Abraham added 14 points for Appalachian State (4-4), but the Mountaineers shot just 33 percent from the field and had no answer for Meeks.

Meeks outscored the Mountaineers by himself in the first half, pouring in 24 points as the Wildcats took a 53-21 lead at the break.

The only suspense over the final 20 minutes would be whether Meeks would become the fourth Kentucky player in the program's long history to top 50 points. He gave it a shot but tired late before departing to a standing ovation with less than a minute to go.

Working off screens for jumpers, driving through the lane, getting out on the break, Meeks appeared to be all the way back from a series of health problems that plagued his sophomore season.

Meeks got started early, hitting a 3-pointer during Kentucky's game-opening 10-0 run. The Mountaineers managed to cut the deficit to six before the Wildcats put together a 15-0 burst midway through the first half to give themselves enough cushion. Kentucky went nearly 10 minutes without turning it over.

The game was the first of two visits by Kentucky to Freedom Hall, the home of archrival Louisville. Meeks certainly looked comfortable in enemy territory as the Wildcats played with the kind of urgency coach Billy Gillispie was looking for against Appalachian State's up-tempo attack.

The Mountaineers came in averaging 80 points a game but couldn't get it going against the bigger, stronger Wildcats. Appalachian State tried to pound the ball inside early but missed its first eight shots.

Kentucky forward Ramon Harris scored four points had two rebounds in nine minutes in his first game since being hospitalized with a neck injury on Dec. 3.

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Patterson scored a career-high 33 points and grabbed 11 rebounds and Meeks had 32 points and six boards as Kentucky dominated the overmatched Tigers 102-58 on Monday for its fourth straight victory.

Patterson, who entered the game making a remarkable 68 percent of his shots, improved upon that number against Tennessee State. Patterson made 15-of-17 field goals — almost all of them lay-ups or dunks — and hit all three of his free throws for Kentucky (9-3).

Meeks, coming off a 46-point performance in a win over Appalachian State on Saturday, followed it up with a scintillating first half. He outscored the Tigers 27-24 in the first half, the second straight game he's beaten the competition by his lonesome in the opening 20 minutes.

Gerald Robinson had 25 points for the Tigers (3-7), who shot just 32.2 percent (19 of 59) and struggled to stop Meeks.

Meeks' performance was his fourth 30-point game of the season. He appeared to be on his way to duplicating record-setting performance over Appalachian State before Patterson got hot in the second half.

Kentucky opened the game with a 15-0 run as Tennessee State missed its first seven shots. The Wildcats had no such problems.

Meeks scored 17 points during a scorching four-minute stretch to close the half, knocking down three straight 3-pointers in the process. He finished the half with seven 3s, tying a school record held by Tayshuan Prince and Derrick Miller.

The Wildcats led 59-24 at the break and Meeks quickly knocked down a 3-pointer to pull within one of the school record for 3s in a game, a mark he tied against Appalachian State. He finished 10-of-19 from the field, including 8-of-15 3-pointers.

While the Tigers stretched the defense to shut down Meeks, the middle opened up for Patterson. Working hard to create space in the lane, Patterson called for the ball and his teammates made sure the sophomore got it.

Patterson did a little bit of everything, adding a couple of assists and two blocks. He finished his night in spectacular fashion, getting out for a breakaway dunk and drawing the foul as Kentucky's lead ballooned to 94-47. He exited after making the free throw and Meeks soon followed, each of them drawing a standing ovation as they made their way to the bench.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Patrick Patterson had 27 points and 14 rebounds for his eighth double-double of the season and Kentucky held off persistent Florida Atlantic 76-69 Saturday afternoon.

While the post-holiday Kentucky offense hardly resembled the one that averaged 89 points the previous four games, nor did its defense give Florida Atlantic many extra chances. The Wildcats committed a season-low seven turnovers and allowed only seven second-chance points.

On a day when shooting star Jodie Meeks wasn't connecting from long range, Patterson and to a lesser degree fellow big man Perry Stevenson off the bench took matters into their own hands underneath the basket. The Wildcats (10-3) dominated points in the paint, 48-24.

Patterson, who came into the game with the best shooting percentage in the Southeastern Conference at 71.1 percent, added to that by making 12 of 16 shots from the floor and all three free throws.

After the Owls (4-9) cut the lead to 68-66 on two free throws with under 3 minutes to go, Patterson scored the next four points to ice the victory. The seesaw game featured nine ties and 19 lead changes.

Stevenson chipped in 10 points, all in the second half. Meeks finished with a quiet 18 points, missing four of six 3-point attempts.

Kentucky's victory came despite a career-best performance by Florida Atlantic's senior guard Paul Graham, who led all scorers with 31 points.

A jumper by Graham with 15 minutes left gave the Owls their largest lead at 51-46, but Kentucky seemed to awaken from its post-holiday slumber behind Patterson and Stevenson. They accounted for eight points in a 10-0 Kentucky run that put the Wildcats ahead for good.

After Patterson's second-chance layup, Stevenson slammed home two dunks within 30 seconds. One was set up by a crisp crosscourt pass from DeAndre Liggins, the other resulting from a fierce block by Patterson at the other end.

By the time Mike Jarvis could call timeout, the Wildcats led 52-51. They wouldn't stop there, stretching the lead to eight on Stevenson's layup in traffic with 7 minutes to go.

The first half was an entirely different story. Meeks and Patterson combined for Kentucky's first 17 points, and no other Wildcat got on the board until Liggins' bucket 10 minutes in.

Largely outplayed throughout the first half, Kentucky needed a block at the buzzer to head to the locker room tied at 37.

After starting the season with consecutive losses to VMI and North Carolina, the Wildcats have won 10 of their last 11. Florida Atlantic continued its slide, losing for the eighth time in nine games.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Jodie Meeks scored 23 points and Patrick Patterson added 15 points and nine rebounds as the Wildcats rolled by Central Michigan 84-52 on Monday for their sixth straight win to setup a showdown with the No. 18 Cardinals on Sunday.

Freshman walk-on Landon Slone starred off the bench for the second straight game, scoring eight points to bring the Wildcats (11-3) to life after a dismal start.

Sione's energy sparked a 36-8 surge to end the first half as Kentucky held the Chippewas (3-9) without a field goal for more than 10 minutes.

Jacolby Hardiman led Central Michigan with 12 points and Marcus Van added 11 points and eight boards but the Chippewas shot just 31 percent from the field (18 of 58) and had no answers when the Wildcats turned up the pressure.

The victory gives the Wildcats plenty of momentum heading into the annual Dream Game against the Cardinals. Kentucky has won 11 of 12, most of them looking an awful lot like their dismantling of the Chippewas.

Central Michigan took control early and led by as much as nine as Kentucky's unconventional starting lineup - a unit that included guards Meeks, Michael Porter and DeAndre Liggins - struggled to get any rhythm.

Kentucky coach Billy Gillispie quickly went to the bench and summoned Slone, a schoolboy star from Paintsville, Ky. - about two hours east of Rupp Arena - who is rapidly becoming a folk hero.

Slone showed off something else against the Chippewas: a deft shooting touch. He hit a 3-pointer and followed it up with a little pullup jumper in the lane that got the Wildcats going. A couple of possessions later, he hit the deck diving for a loose ball and got elbowed while pulling in one of his five rebounds - two less than he had in his previous eight games combined.

As Kentucky and Slone surged, the Chippewas slumped after a hot start. A Robbie Harman jumper gave Central Michigan a 17-15 lead with 11:03 remaining in the first half.

It would be the last time the Chippewas actually put the ball through the cylinder for more than 16 minutes. Central Michigan managed just six free throws and a basket on a generous goaltending call for the rest of the half as Kentucky raced to a 42-23 haltime lead.

Central Michigan wouldn't get much closer, as Kentucky continued to amp up the pressure and ride Meeks' hot hand.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. -- In the midst of a season on the verge of spinning out of control, Louisville coach Rick Pitino told enigmatic point guard Edgar Sosa maybe it would be best if the talented but troubled junior got a fresh start somewhere else.

Sosa told Pitino he just needed one more last chance in a career full of last chances. On Sunday, he backed it up with the biggest shot of his life.

Sosa's 30-footer with 2.8 seconds remaining lifted the 18thranked Cardinals to a 74-71 victory over archrival Kentucky.

Kentucky (11-4) nearly sent the Cardinals out of the polls entirely after a miraculous rally in the final 51 seconds.

Louisville seemed in control after Sosa made two free throws to give the Cardinals a 71-64 lead.

Kentucky's Jodie Meeks scored seven straight points on five free throws and a layup - thanks to two careless turnovers by Louisville's Earl Clark - to tie the game at 71 with 23 seconds left.

The Cardinals inbounded to Sosa, who dribbled calmly over halfcourt and waited for the clock to wind down. When it got to 6 seconds, he took two dribbles toward the basket and pulled up over Kentucky's Michael Porter. The shot was good all the way as Freedom Hall erupted.

Porter's last-second heave from 40 feet was off the mark, letting Louisville escape with its first home win over the Wildcats since 2002.

Meeks led the Wildcats with 28 points and Patrick Patterson added 22 points and 15 rebounds, but Kentucky had its six-game winning streak snapped thanks to a familiar culprit: turnovers. The Wildcats, who were averaging 18.2 turnovers a game, gave it away 21 times, including six by Meeks.

The Cardinals used a 12-0 run, including a three-point play by Sosa, to go ahead 54-43. Williams hit a 3-pointer moments later to push it to 57-45 with 13:06 left.

Williams finished with 19 points and eight rebounds, Smith had 11 points, two assists and two blocks and Earl Clark added 10 points and eight rebounds as the Cardinals used their depth to offset Kentucky's two stars.

Patterson dominated his matchup with Louisville freshman center Samardo Samuels, who managed four points and a rebound in 11 foul-plagued minutes.

The Wildcats, however, were hardly taking solace in getting close. They were hoping a win over the Cardinals would signify their rise in Gillispie's second year. It'll have to wait until Southeastern Conference play starts on Saturday against Vanderbilt.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- In Gillispie's eyes, his team doesn't need three options, it needs 20, though he'd settle for five. Judging by Kentucky's 70-60 win against undermanned Vanderbilt on Saturday, Gillispie may finally have some volunteers.

While Meeks led the way with 21 points, it was the performance of Kentucky's role players that gave the Wildcats (12-4, 1-0 SEC) a much-needed momentum boost heading into a showdown with No. 15 Tennessee on Tuesday.

Ramon Harris had 12 points and seven rebounds while making all five of his shots, Perry Stevenson added 10 points and Kentucky overcame a foul-troubled performance by Patterson (11 points, a season-low one rebound) to snap Vanderbilt's six-game winning streak.

Against the Commodores (11-4, 0-1), those roles included picking up the slack for Patterson - who faced constant double-teams and not letting up even though Vanderbilt played without leading scorer and rebounder A.J. Ogilvy, who watched from the bench after being injured in practice on Friday.

Jermaine Beal led Vanderbilt with 18 points and Jeffery Taylor had 15 points and 11 rebounds, but the Commodores shot just 31.6 percent (18 of 57) and turned it over 15 times.

Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings refused to place blame for the loss on Ogilvy's absence, though the Commodores had little inside presence without the 6-foot-11 Ogilvy. Vanderbilt was outscored in the paint 32-20 and had seven shots blocked.

Maybe, but the Commodores could have used him during Kentucky's 21-4 burst early in the second half that helped the Wildcats break it open. Meeks helped get it started by banking in a 3-pointer and Harris finished it with a putback that gave Kentucky a 55-35 lead.

The Commodores got as close as six in the final minute, but Kentucky made its free throws to avoid a late-game collapse.

The Commodores entered the game second in the county in field goal percentage, allowing opponents to shoot just 35.6 percent from the floor.

The Wildcats, however, had little trouble getting good shots despite an off night by Patterson. Kentucky shot 44 percent (24 of 55) from the floor and became just the second school all year to reach 70 points against the Commodores.

Kentucky trailed by as many as seven early before a 12-2 run over the last five minutes of the first half gave the Wildcats a 31-27 lead at the break. Kentucky made the surge without Patterson, who sat the last 10 minutes of the half after picking up his second foul.

The teams split the two meetings last year, with each club winning on its home floor. Vanderbilt, meanwhile, hopes Ogilvy is ready when the Commodores host Georgia on Wednesday.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. -- Jodie Meeks was just trying to get a victory. He didn't fathom having a chance at earning a spot among Kentucky's greatest players.

Meeks scored a school-record 54 points to help Kentucky cruise to a 90-72 win over No. 24 Tennessee on Tuesday night.

"It means a lot to be in the same sentence as Dan Issel. It's mind-boggling," he said. "I was just out there playing to win."

Meeks, who broke Issel's 39-year-old record of 53 points set at Ole Miss, was mobbed by his Kentucky teammates in the middle of the Thompson-Boling Arena court, where the Wildcats (13-4, 2-0 SEC) handed the Volunteers their third loss in January.

The Southeastern Conference's leading scorer surpassed his previous high of 46 points, which he set Dec. 20 against Appalachian State, with 4:50 left as he hit an open 3, one of 10 3-pointers he would make for the night. He set the record with free throws with 1:31 left.

Meeks entered the game ranked fourth in the nation in scoring with an average 24.2 points per game.

"I have never seen anything like it," Kentucky coach Billy Gillispie said. "Jodie Meeks had 46 against Appalachian State, and they are a nice team, but not near a team the quality of Tennessee and on the home court."

The 54 points was also the biggest individual SEC performance since Chris Jackson's 55 for LSU against Mississippi in 1989.

"There have been so many great players - this is the greatest basketball tradition in the world at the collegiate level - and to be able to put your name up there with some of those greats is quite an accomplishment," Gillispie said.

Down by 6 at the half, Tennessee (10-5, 1-1) cut Kentucky's lead to 43-41 on a fastbreak basket by Wayne Chism a minute and a half into the second half.

But the Vols' spotty defense couldn't contain Meeks, who hit a layup and two 3-pointers to help the Wildcats on a 10-0 run that gave them a 53-41 lead.

"Defensively we tried to guard him as a team," Tennessee coach Bruce Pearl said. "We didn't have any one guy on him, but none of our guards could guard him."

Kentucky began stumbling into foul trouble with 9:34 left, and Tennessee - which to that point had shot 35 percent from the freethrow line - sank 11 straight bonus shots to cut the Wildcats' lead to 71-64 with 6:52 left.

But Meeks, who also went a perfect 14-for-14 from the freethrow line, scored nine straight points to put the game away. No other Kentucky player scored in double figures. Patrick Patterson grabbed 12 rebounds.

With two 3-pointers and a fast break layup by Meeks, Kentucky used a 12-0 run to grab a 28-20 lead with 7:27 in the first half. Meeks had 26 points in the first half, including going 5-for-7 from behind the arc.

ATHENS, Ga. -- Kentucky didn't need another record performance from Jodie Meeks to take another SEC road win.

Meeks scored 22 points in his return to his home state and Kentucky never trailed in coasting to a 68-45 win over Georgia on Sunday.

Meeks, from Norcross, Ga., didn't come close to matching his school-record 54 points in Kentucky's win at No. 24 Tennessee on Tuesday night. Meeks left the game with 5:14 remaining and the Wildcats leading 62-36.

Patrick Patterson added 15 points and four of Kentucky's 11 blocked shots. Perry Stevenson had 13 points.

Kentucky (14-4, 3-0 Southeastern Conference) has won three straight and 9 of 10 as it makes its bid to move into the Top 25 on Monday for the first time this season.

Georgia (9-9, 0-3) suffered its fifth straight loss.

Terrance Woodbury led the Bulldogs with eight points while making only 4 of 14 shots from the field. Freshmen Dustin Ware and Trey Thompkins each had seven points.

Georgia made only 2 of its first 13 shots as Kentucky pushed its lead to double figures in the first 10 minutes.

Despite making only 8 of 31 shots in the first half, Georgia managed only five second-chance points. Kentucky had 17 defensive rebounds in the half, compared with only 14 total rebounds for Georgia, and took advantage of that statistic by making high-percentage shots near the basket.

Kentucky finished with a 34-24 advantage in points scored in the paint.

The Wildcats increased their all-time record against Georgia to 110-23, including a 38-15 record in Athens.
