WILDCATS RETURN HOME FOR FOUR STRAIGHT

The Wildcats return home to Rupp Arena for four straight home games, fresh off a 54-43 win over West Virginia in the championship game of the Las Vegas Invitational.

Meeks was named the tournament MVP after averaging 23.8 ppg including a game-high 19 points in the championship. Patrick Patterson and Josh Harrellson were both named to the All-Tournament team after contributing double-doubles in the final game.

For Patterson (15p, 10r) it was his third consecutive double-double, and fourth of the season, while Harrellson recorded his first double-double as a Wildcat with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

After falling behind by 12 early in the second half, UK used clutch shooting from the free throw line, where they were 17-for-17 in the second half, to earn its first regular season tournament championship since 1996.

CAT SCRATCHES

- Kentucky is in its 106th season of basketball.
- Kentucky is the all-time NCAA leader in wins with 1,970.
- Jodie Meeks' is averaging 25.5 ppg through the first six games of the season, the best six-game start by a Wildcat since Jamal Mashburn averaged 25.3 through the first six games of the 1992-93 season.
- Meeks leads the Southeastern Conference and ranks sixth nationally in scoring (25.5 ppg) while Patrick Patterson leads the league and ranks sixth nationally in field goal percentage (.709).
- The Wildcats won the battle in the paint for the fifth time in six games, outscoring West Virginia 24-22 in the paint, while also recording 12 second chance points to the Mountaineers' eight.
- Kentucky has outrebounded five of their six opponents this season.
- Kentucky ranks first in the SEC in field goal percentage (.503) and third in the league in free throw percentage (.757).
- UK has held its last four opponents to 36 percent or less from the field.

SCOUTING LAMAR

Located in Beaumont, Texas (983 miles southwest of Lexington), Lamar is a member of the Southland Conference.

The Cardinals are off to a hot start, posting a spotless 5-0 record for the first time in 11 years, matching the start by the 1997-98 team. Only the 1981-82 and 1968-69 squads opened their campaigns with better starts. Interestingly, UK Director of Basketball Operations Alvin Brooks, was a graduate assistant on the 1982 squad.

The Cardinals have four players scoring double figures including Kenny Dawkins who is averaging a team best 17.0 ppg. Jay Brown, who ranks third on the team in scoring (16.0) is the leader in rebounds, averaging 9.8 boards per game.

Lamar is coached by Steve Roccaforte, who is in his third season at the helm of the Cardinal program. Roccaforte has posted a 39-28 record at Lamar.

SERIES HISTORY

Kentucky won the only meeting between the two schools, a 71-56 victory in the 1987-88 season.

UK VS. THE SOUTHLAND

The Wildcats aren't very familiar with the Southland, having only played three schools comprising the conference while totaling a 4-1 record. Kentucky is 1-0 against Central Arkansas, Lamar, and Texas State and 1-1 against Northwestern State. UK defeated Central Arkansas last season 67-40.

UK VS. THE LONESTAR STATE

Over the years, the Wildcats have met with success against schools from the state of Texas. Kentucky possesses a 27-5 (.843) record against teams from the Lonestar State, with most of the action and success coming against Baylor (6-0, 1.000).

KENTUCKY-LAMAR CONNECTIONS

UK Director of Basketball Operations Alvin Brooks is no stranger to Lamar. A 1992 graduate, he was a two-year letterwinner for the Cardinals (1979-81) averaging 10.4 points and 6.9 assists in his career. He was named All-Southland in 1981 and was the starting point guard on the 1980 team that reached the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament. Additionally, he was a graduate assistant with the program in the 1981-82 season, when the Cardinals posted their second best start in program history at 9-0.

UK assistant coach Glynn Cyprien was an assistant at Lamar for the 1990-91 season, when he helped the Cardinals improve from 7-20 to 15-12.

UK WINS LAS VEGAS INVITATIONAL

The Wildcats laid claim to the 2008 Las Vegas Invitational Championship, the first regular season tournament title for Kentucky since winning the 1996 Great Alaska Shootout.

Jodie Meeks was named the tournament MVP after averaging 28.5 points in wins over Kansas State and West Virginia.

Josh Harrellson and Patrick Patterson were both named to the all-tournament team.

MEEKS SCORING EARLY AND OFTEN

Jodie Meeks is making up for lost time, having missed 20 games last year to various injuries. Meeks has led the Wildcats in scoring in five of six games this season including 39 points in season opener and 37 against Kansas State.

The 6-4 junior is averaging 25.5 ppg the best five game start for a Wildcat since Jamal Mashburn averaged 25.3 ppg through the first six games of the 1992-93 season.

During his current six game stretch, Meeks has reached double-figures in the first half in four of the first six games, including 20 against VMI and 24 against Kansas State.

MEEKS NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Based on his performance in the Las Vegas Invitational, Jodie Meeks was named the SEC Player of the Week on Monday.

The 6-4 Norcross, Ga., native helped lead Kentucky to the Las Vegas Invitational championship and was named the tournament MVP after averaging 28.5 points in the two games in Las Vegas. He posted his second 30 point effort this season with a 37 point explosion against Kansas State, including a career high for points in a half with 24 in the first 20 minutes.

He followed up with a 19 point effort against West Virginia in the championship game, including going 12-12 at the free throw line. He has shot 90 percent (27-30) from the charity stripe in his last three games.

He finished the week, which also included a 17-point effort against Longwood, averaging 24.3 points, 4.3 rebounds and 1.3 assists.

UNDEFEATED FOES

Lamar will represent the fourth opponent UK will face this season that comes into the game undefeated. The Wildcats lost to undefeated North Carolina and then handed Kansas State and West Virginia their first losses of the season in Las Vegas.

WILDCATS RANKED NATIONALLY

Kentucky currently ranks 18th in the nation and lead the SEC in field goal percentage, hitting at a 50 percent clip.

The Wildcats can also be found among the nation's best in blocked shots (ninth - 6.8/game), rebound margin (26th - +8.8), free throw percentage (36th - .757) and field goal percentage defense (38th - .373).

Jodie Meeks ranks fifth in the nation in scoring (25.5 ppg) while Patrick Patterson is ranked seventh in field goal percentage (.709). Both Wildcats lead the league in their respective categories.

TOP PERFORMANCES

The Wildcats have had some of the best single game performances in the league this year. Jodie Meeks' 39 point effort against VMI and 37 point effort against Kansas State rank as the top two individual scoring games in the league this season.

Meeks also owns the top three free throws made performances in the league this season as well.

As a team, the Wildcats' .688 field goal per-

centage against Kansas State is the top single game percentage in the SEC this season.

Defensively, the Wildcats 42 points allowed against Delaware State and 43 points allowed to West Virginia rank as the top two defensive performances by a team so far this season.

PATTERSON WELL-ROUNDED IN SEC

Patrick Patterson is the only player in the league to rank in the Top 10 in scoring (10th - 15.5) and rebounding (fourth - 9.0).

LAST TIME OUT

Jodie Meeks led all scorers with 19 points, in helping the Wildcats to the Las Vegas Invitational championship, defeating West Virginia 54-43. Meeks was an impressive 12-for-12 from the free throw line while Patrick Patterson recorded his third straight double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds.

SWAT TEAM

Perry Stevenson and Patrick Patterson have combined for 26 blocked shots in Kentucky's first six games of the season ranking them third and fifth in the SEC respectively.

Kentucky ranks third in the league in blocked shots with 41. UK has reached double digits in blocked shots in three of their first six games this season. Kentucky blocked 10 shots in games against VMI, Delaware State and Longwood.

MUSCLE IN THE PAINT

The Wildcats pulled down 50 rebounds in the 91-57 win over Longwood. It was the most rebounds by UK since pulling down 51 against Houston on January 3, 2007.

In addition, Kentucky dominated the Lancers in the paint, outscoring them 54-16. The Wildcats have controlled the paint, outscoring their opponents 236-154 so far this season. UK also put up an impressive 70 points in the paint in the season opener against VMI.

C NOTES

Kentucky and VMI combined for 214 points in the season opener in Rupp Arena.

- The last time Kentucky scored 100-plus points in a game was when they notched 101 against Eastern Kentucky on Dec. 23, 2003.
- It was the most points Kentucky gave up since Dec. 27, 1989, when it lost 121-110 at North Carolina.
- The 111 points were the most given up in Rupp Arena since a 116-113 overtime loss to Louisiana-Lafayette on Dec. 23, 1989.
- The last time Kentucky gave up 100-plus points was on Feb. 10, 1993, when Arkansas tallied 101 in Fayetteville.
- The last time Kentucky scored 100-plus points and lost was a 104-103 overtime loss to Duke on March 28, 1992.

CAREER OUTING

A lot of career highs came out of Kentucky's 103 point effort in its season opener against VMI.

Three Wildcats recorded personal bests in points led by Jodie Meeks' 39, Perry Stevenson's 20 and Ramon Harris' 16.

Stevenson also recorded a career high 40 minutes of action.

UK DEBUTS

Newcomers Josh Harrellson, DeAndre Liggins and Darius Miller all made their UK debuts against VMI. Miller was one of four Wildcats in double-figures, while Liggins had a solid line of six points, seven rebounds and five assists. However, the freshman also committed seven turnovers. Harrellson pulled down two rebounds in six minutes.

Kevin Galloway and Landon Slone both made their Wildcat debuts against Delaware State.

PATTERSON ON WOODEN WATCH LIST

Patrick Patterson was named to the Top 50 watch list for the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy.

The list is composed of 50 student athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor.

In mid-January, the Wooden Award Committee will release the Midseason Top 30 list, followed in March by the National Ballot, consisting of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament.

WILDCATS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Sophomore Patrick Patterson was named pre-season First Team All-SEC by selected media at the SEC Media Day in Birmingham, Ala.

Patterson was one of three sophomores on the first team and four sophomores on both teams.

The 6-9 sophomore was also a unanimous First Team preseason All-SEC team choice by league coaches. Jodie Meeks was selected Second Team All-SEC.

PATTERSON NAMED ALL-AMERICAN

In addition to the SEC preseason honors, Patrick Patterson received various other preseason honors from national publications.

Lindy's listed Patterson as the top rebounder in the SEC as well as the league's top NBA prospect. Below are the various media entities that listed him among their preseason All-American teams.

The first NCAA title came in 1948 and the latest, No. 7 occurred 1998. No other program can claim the unparalleled success that matches the Wildcats' efforts over the past century.

SEC PREDICTIONS

Once again, the Wildcats have been selected as one of the top teams in the SEC. Kentucky was selected to finish third in the SEC East Division behind the Tennessee Volunteers and Florida Gators by media members throughout the conference.

UK received two first place votes from media members.

HOOD, ORTON, VILARINO SIGN EARLY

The University of Kentucky men's basketball program received three National Letters of Intent from Jon Hood, Daniel Orton and GJ Vilarino, Coach Billy Gillispie announced on Wednesday.

Jon Hood, a senior at Madisonville North Hopkins, is a 6-6 shooting guard. A native of Madisonville, Ky., Hood averaged 21.4 points, 8.5 rebounds, four assists, and two blocks per game as a junior. He shot 52 percent from the field and 41 percent from behind the three-point line. He also tallied three triple doubles last season on his way to first team All-State honors.

Daniel Orton, a senior at Bishop McGuinness High School, hails from Oklahoma City, Okla. The 6-10 center is a three-time class 4A state champion in Oklahoma and was named the 2008 state tournament MVP. Orton averaged 15.3 points, 9.7 rebounds, 6.8 blocks and five assists as a junior en route to first team All-State honors.

Point guard GJ Vilarino, from McKinney, Texas, is currently a senior at McKinney High School. A 2008 first team All-State performer and District MVP, Vilarino averaged 20.5 points and 4.63 assists last season while shooting 48 percent from the field and 78 percent from the free throw line.

CATS IN THE RANKINGS

Both the Associated Press and *USA Today* Top 25 polls have been released and for the first time since 1990-91, UK could not be found among the top 25 teams in the league. Prior to this year, UK had been ranked nationally in the preseason every year since 1991-92.

Dick Vitale is the lone media member that has the Wildcats ranked, placing them 24th in his preseason Top 25.

SEC DOMINATION

Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats have been the most dominant team in the league, recording an 853-233 mark (.785). Only one other team has won more than 650 regular season SEC games (Alabama) and no other team has a better winning percentage. UK has averaged 11.5 wins and 3.1 losses per season in 74 seasons in the SEC.

- The Wildcats have won 43 SEC titles and 25 SEC Tournament Championships, more than the other 11 teams combined.

- Kentucky has won 10 of the last 17 SEC Tournament titles.

- UK has won 11 SEC East titles in the 17 seasons since the league expanded.

NATIONAL EXPOSURE

Kentucky will play 13 games on CBS, ESPN or ESPN2 this year. The Wildcats first appeared on national television this season in the second game of the regular season against top-ranked North Carolina on ESPN.

Kentucky returned home for two games in the Las Vegas Invitational and then traveled to Las Vegas for the remainder of the tournament. UK's first game in Vegas against Kansas State aired on ESPNU, followed by the championship game against West Virginia on ESPN2.

In addition, UK has five games on ESPN, including Miami (Fla.) (12/6), Tennessee (1/13), Ole Miss (1/27), Florida (2/10) and Vanderbilt (2/17).

The Wildcats also have six games slated for broadcast on CBS: Indiana (12/13), Louisville (1/4), Arkansas (2/14), Tennessee (2/21), LSU (2/28) and Florida (3/7).

THREE MANIA

UK has the nation's third-longest active streak of consecutive games with a made three-pointer. UK has hit a three-pointer in 680 consecutive games, which trails only UNLV and Vanderbilt.

The Wildcats' last game without a three-pointer came 19 seasons ago against Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 1988, a "three-point" loss in the Great Alaska Shootout.

As of Nov. 28, UNLV and Vanderbilt have hit a three-pointer in every game since the three-point rule was adopted to start the 1986-87 season. The Rebels' streak is 711 games, while Vanderbilt's streak is 705 games.

CATS ROCK AT RUPP ARENA

- UK has won 76 of its last 94 home games. The Cats were 14-4 at home last season and are 417-55 (.883) all-time in Rupp Arena.

- UK has won 20 national attendance titles in the building, including 12 of the last 13.

- The Rupp Arena attendance record of 24,465 was set in 2007 against Florida on Feb. 10.

- The Wildcats have posted a remarkable 238-34 (.875) record in regular season SEC games played in Rupp.

BIG BLUE MANIA

CATS WITHOUT KEIGHTLEY THIS SEASON

On March 31, 2008, long time Kentucky basketball manager Bill Keightley passed away at the age of 81 in Cincinnati.

Affectionately known as "Mr. Wildcat", he had been associated with the Wildcats' basketball program since 1962. Keightley, who manned the "Bill Keightley Equipment Room" in Memorial Coliseum, was as much a fixture around UK basketball as the seven national championship trophies on display in the Joe Craft Center.

His career spanned five decades, six head coaches, 1,113 victories and three national championships. A crowd of over 3,000 paid their respects at a tribute to Mr. Keightley held in Rupp Arena. Former players, coaches and managers traveled from across the country to eulogize him.

"SUPER FAN" IN 56TH SEASON

UK fan Bob Wiggins, 80, continues his amazing streak of following the basketball Cats. The 2008-09 season is his 56th watching Kentucky in person and through his own record-keeping, he has attended 1,404 UK games.

His home-court streak spans 47 years and 682 games. During that period, which dates back to 1960-61, UK has a home record of 601-81 (.881).

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Billy Gillispie is a three-time finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year award. He won the honor in 2004, 2005 and 2007. In addition, he was named a finalist for the 2007 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year honor.
- Gillispie is a five-time conference coach of the year winner. In 2004, he was the WAC Coach of the Year honor at UTEP. He was the consensus Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2005 while the *Austin American-Statesman*, *The Dallas Morning News*, *San Antonio Express-News* and the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* tabbed him the Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2006. He won the honor again in 2007, when the Big 12 coaches tabbed him the conference's Coach of the Year. He was named SEC co-Coach of the Year by league peers in his first season at UK.
- Gillispie is also a three-time district coach of the year winner. At the conclusion of the 2004 season, he was named the USBWA District Coach of the Year. He received the honor again in 2005 as well as the NABC District Coach of the Year

award. In 2007 he was selected the NABC District 9 Coach of the Year.

- He led Texas A&M to 27 wins in 2006-07, the most in school history.
- Gillispie also led Texas A&M to three straight 20-win seasons for the first time in history.
- In 2004-05, A&M had the best turnaround in the nation and the best in school history.
- Texas A&M won 31 Big 12 games in three years under Gillispie after winning just 25 in the first eight years of Big 12 play.
- Gillispie is the only coach in college basketball history to coach the nation's most improved team in consecutive seasons (2003-04 and 2004-05).





LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Billy Gillispie didn't mention Gardner-Webb, but his postgame assessment was verbatim from the last time his Kentucky team was shocked like this.

"They whipped us," Gillispie said of the Wildcats' 111-103 upset to Virginia Military Institute Friday night.

The upset came just over a year after Gardner-Webb's 84-68 stunner over the Wildcats in Gillispie's second game as coach. The sequel came in the opener of year two, which was supposed to be a tuneup for the Wildcats' trip to No. 1 North Carolina next week.

VMI's shoot-first approach was lethal to Kentucky's youthful backcourt. Not since 1989 against North Carolina had a Kentucky team given up so many points, although it was also the first time in five years the Wildcats had passed the century mark.

Travis Holmes led six Keydets in double-digits with 30 points and was beaming afterward.

Even a 39-point effort from Kentucky's Jodie Meeks -- nearly double his career high of 21 -- wasn't enough to keep pace.

The Keydets took an 83-60 lead, their largest of the game, on Keith Gabriel's 3-pointer with 14:10 to go. It was VMI's 13th 3-pointer of the game, but the next wouldn't come until 10 minutes later. In between was a furious Kentucky comeback.

Down 90-73 with 11 minutes to go, Kentucky scored the next 19 points -- nine of them by Meeks -- to cut the deficit to 1.

The Wildcats tied the game at 95 with 5 minutes left on Perry Stevenson's tip-in and took their first lead on Ramon Harris' layup seconds later.

But the Keydets had one last run left, and it was too much. After Kentucky's Patrick Patterson hit a layup to pull the Wildcats to 104-103, the Keydets scored the final 7 points to ice the game.

Patterson, UK's star center, finished with only 8 points. Kentucky was sloppy early, racking up 13 of its 25 turnovers in the first 11 minutes. That, coupled with the Keydets' apparent inability to miss a 3-pointer -- good on 7 of their first 8 attempts -- made for an anxious first half for the capacity Rupp Arena crowd.

VMI jumped out to a 14-3 lead three minutes in and stretched their advantage to 42-21 at the 10-minute mark after two free throws from Willie Bell.

Then the tide seemed to turn for the Wildcats, albeit briefly. The Keydets finally started misfiring from long range, connecting on only one of seven attempts the rest of the half, and Kentucky finally started showing signs of offensive life.

The Wildcats strung together three straight dunks in less than a minute, including one apiece by Perry Stevenson and Meeks. The highlight came from freshman guard Darius Miller, who grabbed Meeks' missed 3-pointer out of the air and slammed it home.

Kentucky trailed 57-47 at halftime, but VMI made its first two 3s of the second half to stretch its lead. VMI's game plan had called for 50 three-point shots. Instead, it attempted 31, making 14.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. -- Deon Thompson scored a career-high 20 points to help North Carolina beat Kentucky 77-58 on Tuesday night, his second straight confidence-building performance in Hansbrough's absence to start the season. But freshman 7-footer Tyler Zeller suffered a wrist injury late in the game that had coach Roy Williams sounding pessimistic.

Zeller, who has started the first two games for Hansbrough, was injured after taking a hard foul by Ramon Harris in transition after a turnover. Zeller fell to the ground under the basket and got up holding his left wrist before heading to the locker room with 1:26 left and eventually being taken to a hospital for X-rays.

The apparent injury put a damper on an otherwise easy victory for the Tar Heels (2-0), who led by double figures 4 minutes into the game and never looked back in a matchup of the winningest programs in men's college basketball. The Tar Heels have beaten the Wildcats in each of the past five seasons.

Hansbrough has missed almost three weeks of practice with a stress reaction in his right shin, while top defender Marcus Ginyard is out until December after foot surgery. But the Tar Heels didn't need them to send the Wildcats to their first 0-2 start since the 2001 season.

Their trapping defense forced 28 turnovers by Kentucky -- which had 25 in its opening loss to VMI -- while Thompson led an offense that spent much of the game on cruise control with a comfortable lead.

After matching his previous high with 17 points in the opener, Thompson was 10-of-16 from the field and had nine rebounds before leaving to a standing ovation and fans chanting his name after he fouled out with 2:45 left.

Patrick Patterson had 19 points and 11 rebounds to lead Kentucky, which was coming off a 111-103 loss to the Keydets for the Wildcats' second stunning early season home loss in as many seasons.

North Carolina's traps caused all kinds of problems early, speeding up the Wildcats and keeping them from getting the ball inside to Patterson -- the matchup that most concerned Williams with Hansbrough sidelined. Instead, the Wildcats committed six turnovers in the first 5 1/2 minutes to help the Tar Heels run out in transition to a 15-2 lead.

The Tar Heels quickly increased the margin, converting a back-court turnover into a 3-pointer from Wayne Ellington then forced another one that led to an alley-oop pass from Ty Lawson to Ellington for a dunk and a 25-6 lead midway through the half.

Kentucky never had an answer. The Wildcats got no closer than 11 points, fell behind by 16 at halftime and trailed by as many as 21 midway through the second half.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Jodie Meeks and his Kentucky teammates made it clear from the beginning of their game against Delaware State on Saturday that they had no plans to lose their third game in a row to open the season.

They had lost their home opener to VMI, then took a second defeat at No. 1 North Carolina.

Kentucky's stifling defense frustrated the Hornets and Meeks scored from all over the floor to give the Wildcats their first win of the season. The Wildcats had not been 0-3 since 1926.

The junior guard scored 22 points to lead Kentucky to a 71-42 victory.

Meeks made 5 of 8 of his 3-point attempts. He has been the scoring leader, or shared that honor, for Kentucky (1-2) in each game.

The Wildcats kept the defensive pressure on the Hornets (1-5), forcing 22 turnovers -- 13 in the first half. Delaware State made only 1 of 9 3-point attempts.

"This is probably the most talented team defensively we'll play all year," Hornets coach Greg Jackson said.

The Wildcats fans roared their approval on one defensive play by Ramon Harris. Though he didn't come up with the steal, Harris went to the floor for a loose ball near the sideline, tried to throw a saving pass while sliding on his backside, but found a Delaware State player.

Jackson knew the deck was stacked against his team, coming into Rupp Arena against a team -- and fans -- starving for a win, on the fourth of eight consecutive games on the road.

"We couldn't come in here with a full tank and still gotten the same result," Jackson said. "We couldn't match their intensity, and not only their intensity, but their talent."

Trevor Welcher and Arturo Dubois led the Hornets with 10 points each. Frisco Sandidge had eight rebounds for Delaware State. DSU had eight offensive rebounds, one in the first half, and one second-chance point in the game.

Kentucky scored first in the second half on a 3-pointer by Michael Porter. DSU looked like it might make a game of it after that, when Dubois made three field goals in a row to make the score 40-29. Then Kentucky made its run.

The Wildcats scored 14 in a row in an assault from all over the court -- fast break layups, dunks, free throws and 3-pointers. With 9:21 to play, the Wildcats had made the score 54-29.

The loss was the fifth in a row for the Hornets since winning their first of the season.
