CREDENTIALS

Credentialing by the Texas A&M Athletics Department for event coverage is based on several factors which together are intended to provide a working atmosphere conducive to professional media coverage and practices.

Credentialing priority for all sports is given to professional media outlets that cover Texas A&M Athletics on an active, consistent and comprehensive basis. Authorized outlets are established, active, legitimate journalistic organizations with a proven history of comprehensive coverage.

A complete list of credential policies for Texas A&M athletics can be found at 12thMan.com/media. To request credentials visit www.sportssystems.com/clients/seccredentials.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photo credentials should be requested in the same manner as regular media credentials. Photographers will be placed along both ends of the court where space permits. Photo credentials will be issued according to the following protocol:

 Local newspapers, wire services, national publications, local TV stations and newspapers and television stations regularly covering the opponent.

- 2. Other daily newspapers and television stations with preference to those covering A&M on a regular basis.
- 3. Non-daily newspapers and other publications with a preference to those covering A&M on a regular basis.

MEDIA PARKING

Parking passes must be requested at least one week in advance of the game and will be mailed if time permits. Requested parking passes may also be picked up at the Athletics Communications Office in Kyle Field on campus. Parking passes may not be picked up at Reed Arena. Parking passes are good for all lots at Reed Arena except the loading dock area. Season parking passes will be issued to media covering A&M on a regular basis.

MEDIA WORK ROOM

A media work room is located on the floor-level in the south corridor of Reed Arena. Power will be available as well as wireless internet access.

PHOTO WORK ROOM

A photographers work area is located near the loading dock entrance at Reed Arena. Power and wireless internet access are available.

NCAA RESOLUTION

On August 20, 2021 the NCAA announced the completion of a negotiated resolution process with the university related to four isolated violation in the Aggie men's basketball program between April 2019 and June 2020.

- 1. The head men's basketball coach allowed six non-coaching men's basketball staff members to participate in on-court basketball activities and engage in technical or tactical basketball instruction, thus resulting in the men's basketball program exceeding NCAA limits on countable men's basketball coaches by three.
 - 2. Impermissible recruiting activities:
 - a. The head men's basketball coach had contact with a prospect during an evaluation period;
- b. An assistant men's basketball coach impermissibly observed an unofficially visiting prospect who was participating in an open gym; and
- c. An assistant men's basketball coach conducted two impermissible basketball tryouts with an unofficially visiting prospect and arranged a non-coaching men's basketball staff member to participate in those two tryouts.
 - 3. Impermissible recruiting activities, countable athletically related activities and personnel activities:
- a. In May and June 2020 on approximately 24 occasions, an assistant men's basketball coach conducted and supervised off-campus workouts with a then-men's basketball prospective student-athlete (i.e., tryout violations for the prospect) and several men's basketball student-athletes in many of the workouts even though the activities were prohibited due to the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- b. During the impermissible workouts from May and June 2020, the assistant men's basketball coach also arranged for non-coaching men's basketball staff members to participate in the on-court activities when they supervised and conducted workouts with the involved prospect and the men's basketball student-athletes, resulting in the men's basketball program exceeded the limits on countable men's basketball coaches by four.
- 4. The head men's basketball coach violated NCAA head coach responsibility rules when he did not promote an atmosphere of compliance because of his personal involvement in the violations and because he did not monitor his staff.

The university and the NCAA imposed the following penalties as a result of these violations:

- 1. Two years of probation, ending June 30, 2023;
- 2. A \$5,000 fine paid to the NCAA;
- 3. Recruiting restrictions:

@AggieMBK

- a. A reduction in men's basketball official visits for the 2021-22 academic year by five;
- b. No unofficial visits for the first three Southeastern Conference home men's basketball games during the 2021-22 academic year;
- c. The institution shall have no recruiting communication for three weeks to begin at either the end of the upcoming dead period or the beginning of the fall of 2021 recruiting period; and
- d. A reduction in men's basketball recruiting days by 5% (i.e., 7 days) during the 2021-22 academic year;
- 4. A two-game suspension (during the regular season) for the head men's basketball coach for the 2021-22 men's basketball season:
 - 5. Public reprimand and censure through the release of the negotiated resolution agreement;
- a. The institution shall issue a letter of reprimand to the special assistant to the head men's basketball coach; and
- b. The institution shall issue a letter of reprimand to the involved assistant men's basketball coach for his knowledge of violations.

The head coach and involved assistant men's basketball coach did not have any prior Level I, Level II or any other major violations. The NCAA noted the institution, head coach and assistant coach had prompt acknowledgement of the violations, accepted responsibility and took meaningful corrective measures and penalties. Texas A&M Athletics is committed to abiding by NCAA rules and regulations. None of the penalties resulting from the violation will have any negative effect on the experience of our men's basketball student-athletes, and the men's basketball program remains eligible for the NCAA post-season. The future is bright for Aggie Men's Basketball.

Reed Arena, a 12,989-seat special events center located on the west side of campus, opened in the fall of 1998.

Reed Arena serves as the home for the Texas A&M men's and women's basketball teams. Complete with the amenities of an NBA arena and the atmosphere of a collegiate setting, Reed Arena provides A&M with one of the best basketball arenas in the southwest and provides first-class accommodations not only for Aggie basketball but for major concerts, commencement ceremonies and a variety of other events.

The arena is named for Houston veterinarian Dr. Chester J. Reed, a 1947 graduate of A&M, and his wife, Billie Jean. In 1986, the Reeds contributed 265 acres of undeveloped land west of Houston to the university, forming the nucleus of assets used to fund the facility.

The playing surface was re-designed for the 2019-20 athletic year. The new court features the popular Lone Star logo in maroon at mid-court, which makes this the fourth iteration of the Reed Arena court that features the shape of Texas. The court markings are maroon, including the 3-point line of 22 feet, 1.75 inches.

The hardwood court is surround by a maroon apron, which for the first time, features the text "Gig 'Em Aggies" in white. Additionally, Texas A&M's online presence is featured on the court with athletics' Twitter and Instagram handle of @12thMan and the web address of 12thMan.com.

There are 10 meeting rooms in Reed Arena which can house a variety of events. Pregame and postgame gatherings are planned for many games and will regularly occupy the 6,000 square foot room high atop the second level on the east side.

The weight room was completely overhauled with windows, graphics, state-of-the-art equipment and brand-new flooring.





The Aggies are proud to call Reed Arena their home as they enter their 22nd season inside the 12,989-seat arena.

Texas A&M has enjoyed great success at Reed Arena as they hold a 284-102 record at the facility and have not had a home losing season since 2003-04.

The 12th Man plays a critical role at all home games as the Reed Rowdies, Texas A&M's student section, create a raucous environment behind both goal posts, giving the Aggies one of the best environments in the country.

Adding to the ambience of the game are a DJ and emcee that entertain fans of all ages pregame and throughout the game during media timeouts.

Texas A&M has averaged more than 6,900 fans per game five of the last seven seasons, giving the Aggies one of the best home-court advantages in the SEC and NCAA.











THE NATION'S BEST PLAYERS


- 50 SEC players have been selected in the last five NBA Drafts. That leads all conferences: 45 ACC, 33 Big Ten, 33 Pac-12, 25 Big 12 and 14 Big East.
- 28 SEC players have been selected in the first round of the last five NBA Drafts. That ranks as the second-most in the nation: ACC 29, Pac-12 18, Big 12 14 and Big Ten 11.
- 14 NBA Draft Lottery picks in the last five years are the most in the nation. That leads the nation: ACC 13. Big 12 nine, Big Ten eight, Pac-12 six.
- Six No. 1 overall NBA Draft picks since 2010.
- 12 NBA Draft picks in 2021, 2020 and 2019.
- Seven first round NBA Draft picks in 2021.
- 80 players from SEC schools were on 2022-23 NBA Opening Day rosters.
- Four players from SEC schools named 2022 NBA All-Stars: Devin Booker (UK/Phoenix); Darius Garland (VU/Cleveland); Khris Middleton (AM/Milwaukee) and Karl-Anthony Towns (UK/Minnesota).
- Kentucky's Oscar Tshiebwe was named the 2022 National Player of the Year by virtually every outlet, joining the likes

- of Pete Maravich, Shaquille O'Neal and Anthony Davis as SEC players who have won national player of the year awards.
- Auburn's Jabari Smith earned 2022 National Freshman of the Year awards from the USBWA and NABC, joining Chris Jackson, John Wall, Anthony Davis and Ben Simmons as SEC players who have been named national freshman of the year.
- Four players earned All-America honors from the Associated Press in 2022: Kentucky's Oscar Tshiebwe (1st team), Auburn's Jabari Smith (2nd team), Arkansas' JD Notae (3rd team) and LSU's Tari Eason (honorable mention).

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

- 27 NCAA Tournament selections over the last three tournaments.
- Eight NCAA Tournament selections in 2018 are the most in league history.
- 78-49 (60.5 percent) in the NCAA Tournament since 2012 (10-3 in 2012, 4-3 in 2013, 12-3 in 2014, 6-5 in 2015, 3-3 in 2016,





- 14 of 14 SEC teams have made at least one NCAA Tournament appearance in the last seven tournaments.
- The SEC has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in 31 of the last 32 tournaments.
- Nine different SEC teams have advanced to the Sweet 16 in the last five NCAA Tournaments. All 14 SEC members have advanced to the Sweet 16 since 1996.
- The SEC has advanced at least one team to the Elite Eight in nine of the last 12 tournaments.
- The SEC has advanced a team in the Final Four six of the last 11 tournaments.
- Eight different SEC teams (Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU, Mississippi State and South Carolina) have appeared in the Final Four.
- The SEC won the ninth annual Big 12/SEC Challenge by winning six of the 10 games on January 29, 2022. It is the second year in a row the SEC won the Challenge. The SEC has lost the Challenge just one time in the last six years.



- Auburn became the eighth different SEC school to be ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press Poll on January 17, 2022 (Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Kentucky, Missouri, South Carolina and Tennessee).
- Four coaches enter the 2022-23 season ranking among the winningest active coaches in the nation: John Calipari (4th with 768 wins), Rick Barnes (6th with 754 wins), Bruce Pearl (15th with 626 wins) and Kermit Davis (29th with 467 wins).
- Three coaches have been named national coach of the year: Bruce Pearl, John Calipari and Rick Barnes.

DEVELOPMENT AND ACHIEVEMENT

- LSU's Skylar Mays was named the 2020 CoSIDA Academic All-America of the Year. He was a two-time first team CoSIDA Academic All-America (2019 and 2020).
- 81 men's basketball students were named to the 2021-22 SEC Academic Honor Rolls for having a grade point average of 3.00 or above for either the preceding academic year or a cumulative grade point average of 3.00 or above.

- 31 men's basketball student-athletes wore the SEC Graduate patch on their uniforms in 2021-22.
- Three Men's Basketball Academic All-America of the Year hail from the SEC: Alec Kessler, UG (1989 & 1990); Bruce Elder, VU (1993), Matt Bonner, UF (2002 & 2003), Canyon Berry, UF (2017) and Skylar Mays, LS (2020).
- The Men's Basketball Leadership Council is one component of the SEC Student-Athlete Leadership Council. The others are the Women's Basketball Leadership Council and the Football Leadership Council. The student-athletes who comprise the SEC Men's Basketball Leadership Council are: Adam Cottrell, Alabama; Cade Arbogast, Arkansas; Babatunde Akingbola, Auburn; Kowacie Reeves, Florida; Jabri Abdur-Rahim, Georgia; Brennan Canada, Kentucky; Justice Hill, LSU; Matthew Murrell, Ole Miss; Isaac Stansbury, Mississippi State; Kobe Brown, Missouri; Chico Carter Jr., South Carolina; Jahmai Mashack, Tennessee; Henry Coleman III, Texas A&M; Quentin Millora-Brown, Vanderbilt.



















t was a winding road that had no shortage of drama along the way, but the 2015-16 Texas A&M basketball team was able to do something that no other Aggie squad had been able to do in 30 years - win a conference title.

For the first time since 1986, Texas A&M cut down the nets as regular season conference champions, following the victory over Vanderbilt during the regular season finale. The Aggies shared the league crown with Kentucky, who also posted a 13-5 SEC mark, but A&M took the top seed at the SEC Tournament by virtue of a 79-77 overtime victory over the Wildcats on Feb. 20.

The Aggies' path to the title saw them earn seven straight victories to begin SEC play and climb to No. 5 in the national polls, the highest ranking in program history. A lull followed that saw A&M drop five consecutive SEC games, four by five or less points, before the Aggies got hot to close the regular season with six straight wins.

Overall, the league title was the 12th in Texas A&M men's basketball history.





Texas A&M has made 14 appearances in the NCAA Tournament and has made the field in eight of the last 14 years.

The Aggies are 13-15 all-time in 14 appearances in the NCAA Tournament and have advanced to the round of 16 five times - 1951*, 1969†, 1980, 2007, 2016 (* 16-team field; † 25-team field).

This included a trio of Sweet 16 appearances since the tournament field expanded to 48 teams - in 1980, under the direction of Shelby Metcalf, in 2007, led by head coach Billy Gillispie, and in 2016 under Billy Kennedy.

A&M head coach Buzz Williams led Marquette and Virginia Tech to eight tournament appearances in 11 years and has four career Sweet Sixteen appearances and one Elite Eight berth.





Texas A&M embraces its large and growing presence in the local, state and national media.

Since the inception of the SEC Network, Texas A&M's presence has grown exponentially with nearly every game on the ESPN family of networks. For the seventh consecutive year, all conference games air on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU or SEC Network.

Additional home non-conference games air on SEC Network+, which can be seen throughout the United States on the Watch ESPN app.

With the additional exposure, student-athletes are requested for numerous interviews throughout the season on various platforms (television, print and podcasts/radio).

Following every game, two student-athletes and head coach Buzz Williams address the media.











The Texas A&M Men's Basketball team travels in a firstclass manner to all of their road games.






A staple of every Buzz Williams' program, Boot Camp signals the unofficial start to each season. Boot Camp occurs each year prior to the start of official practices and pushes the team to their physical and mental limits. Each session helps prepare the student-athletes to become better teammates and persevere through all of the obstacles they may face throughout their season and careers.

The week-long program features sessions that mostly occur in the morning before sunrise. Each player must successfully pass each session before advancing to the next. The week culminates as every player dons their game jersey and staff dresses up in gameday attire as the team literally runs through their schedule. Beginning with the exhibition game and ending with national championship, each game on the schedule represents a different drill the team must complete.

While Boot Camp tests the players physically, there is nothing that compares to the team chemistry that is built during the grueling week. Players are forced to rely on their teammates and new leaders emerge. Players see firsthand the level of teamwork needed to complete Boot Camp and form a tight bond that lasts over the course of the season. After completing the final drill, all the blood, sweat and tears turns into pure joy as the players are gifted with adidas gear for the new season.












While Texas A&M is known for its traditions, head coach Buzz Williams has a tradition of his own with his program, Buzz's Bunch.


During the summer of 2019, the weight room went through a complete overhaul with new flooring and equipment that is outfitted with the latest technology. New lights and an audio system were installed to help student-athletes get the most out of their workouts.

Under the guidance of Director of Sport Performance Steve Gephardt, the Aggies' strength and conditioning program is one of the best in the nation. Coach Gephardt's workouts are based on the fact that no two players are built the same.

Individual programs are built for each player to help them maximize their strength, stability and mobility. In an effort to prevent injuries over the course of a season, workouts are comprised of Olympic lifts as well as bilateral movements.







The Sports Medicine Department at Texas A&M is committed to providing quality health care to student-athletes. The goal of the sports medicine staff is to provide the most comprehensive individual sports medicine care available in a professional, efficient and service-oriented manner.


Texas A&M's dedicated staff of physicians, athletic trainers and physical therapists implement strategies to help prevent and manage athletic related injuries or illnesses while promoting athletic performance of all Aggie studentathletes.

The Cox-McFerrin Center contains a fully-equipped athletic training room that went through a complete overhaul during the summer of 2020. The area features examination rooms, multiple training tables and a cold tubs. Associate Athletic Trainer Eddie Benion and the sports medicine staff handle all aspects of treatment and the rehabilitation of injuries from this room.

Team orthopedic surgeon, James S. Distefano, D.O. joined Texas A&M in 2007. He attended the University of Louisiana-Monroe as an undergraduate and attended medical school at Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine and graduated in 1992. In addition to his duties at Texas A&M, Dr. Distefano is a practicing physician at Cornerstone Sports Medicine.


Texas A&M has made tremendous steps in not only the physical aspect of sports medicine, but the mental aspect as well. The athletics department employs two full-time sports psychologists in Dr. Ryan Pittsinger and Dr. Lauren Craig.

Ryan Pittsinger, PhD, came to Texas A&M in 2016 and serves as Assistant Athletic Director and Director of Counseling and Sport Psychology Services. In his role, Dr. Pittsinger serves the needs of all student-athletes by honoring the unique demands and experiences they are often faced with and striving to offer support in meaningful ways that is tailored to each student-athlete's specific needs.



Dr. Pittsinger completed his Bachelor's degree in Psychology from the University of Utah and Master's degree in Sport Psychology from California State University, Long Beach. He earned a PhD in Counseling Psychology from the University of Iowa, where he worked in the Athletic Department, in addition to teaching sport psychology and resiliency courses in the Kinesiology Department.





SLOCUM NUTRITION CENTER

The R.C. Slocum Nutrition Center is an athletics dining facility that offers a tremendous selection of well-prepared food options, giving student-athletes the best opportunity to satisfy their individual food tastes as well as their nutritional and performance goals.

Named in honor of College Football Hall of Fame member and former Aggie head football coach R.C. Slocum, the \$12 million Nutrition Center opened in the fall of 2013. It is conveniently located adjacent to both the Alice and Erle Nye '59 Academic Center and the athlete training and rehabilitation center in the Bright Building at the south end of Kyle Field.

The Director of Performance Nutrition works directly with the Executive Chef of the Nutrition Center to plan daily balanced menus offered at the facility. He also educates student-athletes about the endless healthy food choices available and how to most effectively fuel the body for maximum athletic performance.

Standard food options available include a full salad bar, pasta station, fruit bar, smoothies and grilled options, as well as cooked-to-order "action stations" that can be used for interactive culinary nutrition education.











The sports nutrition team at Texas A&M offers a variety of different options for the student-athletes to properly fuel themselves for their performance. The team of full-time nutritionists provide pre- and post-workout nutrition, competition nutrition, and meal planning for team travel.

Prior to every contest, the team gathers for a pre-game meal that is catered to fit their needs prior to the taking the court. Each meal brought in features an assortment of meats and vegetables to maximize their potential in the game.


Additionally, the locker room's nutrition center is specifically tailored to meet the team's needs and preferences.

A variety of services are available to student-athletes to help create a healthy lifestyle that allows them to succeed both on and off the field. The Texas A&M Performance Nutrition staff who is committed to making nutrition the foundation of student-athlete success.

The men's basketball nutritionist uses evidence-based practices in assessment, education and targeted nutrition interventions to optimize performance, prevent injury and enhance overall health.







Student-athlete engagement serves as the model for comprehensive student-athlete engagement where Aggie student-athletes are challenged to maximize their potential in pursuit of the Texas A&M University core values of excellence, integrity, leadership, loyalty, respect and selfless service.

Led by Amanda Hernandez and her staff, student-athlete engagement provides Aggie student-athletes opportunities to develop through personalized interactions and dynamic and engaging programming focusing on the areas of career development, personal growth, civic engagement, selfless service and leadership.

One of the largest components of student-athlete engagement is the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), which serves as a forum for providing input to the Athletics Department the SEC and the NCAA regarding present and future issues, both on- and off-campus, pertaining to student-athletes.

SAAC is also responsible for organizing Aggies CAN, the largest student-athlete run canned food drive in the country, with collections taking place throughout one week and concluding at Kyle Field the day of a home football game. SAAC is comprised of two student-athlete representatives from each intercollegiate sport, and is led by an Executive Board.

Student-athlete engagement creates an awareness of the personal and societal benefits of Texas A&M's core value of selfless service through community outreach initiatives that will continue to impact student-athletes beyond their time at Texas A&M University. Student-athletes impact numerous organizations in the Brazos Valley as community service hours routinely eclipse 5,000 hours.

STUDENT-ATHLETE ACADEMIC SERVICES

Complex on the second floor of the Bright Football Complex on the south end of Kyle Field near the Slocum Nutrition Center, the 24,550-square foot Alice and Erle Nye '59 Academic Center is the premier center of its kind in the country.

The main focus of the Nye Academic Center is to help student-athletes develop consistent study patterns by providing them with supervised quiet study areas and academic support for all student-athletes. The center has many different resources to help each student-athlete reach his/her academic goals including 23 full-time staff members housed within the academic center as well as a part-time staff that includes 50+ learning assistants and over 100 subject specific tutors.

The Nye Academic Center also features 36 individual and group tutoring rooms, 18 Learning labs, two conference rooms, a 36-seat classroom, subject labs for math & writing specific walk-in tutoring sessions, 115 desktop computers for student use located throughout the building, 15 laptops available for check out during study hall & team travel, and TI-84 Plus and TI-30 calculators available for check out each semester.

Under the direction of Senior Associate Athletic Director Joe Fields, Texas A&M posted its second-highest Graduation Success Rate since the NCAA began recording the metric in 2003. Eight Texas A&M programs posted multi-year scores of over 990 on the NCAA's Academic Progress Rates, which measures eligibility, retention and graduation of student-athletes competing on every Division I sports team. Every Texas A&M program significantly cleared the NCAA-mandated threshold of 930.















BACK-TO-BACK NBA CHAMPIONS

ometown legend Alex Caruso reached the top of the basketball world on October 11, 2020, as he and the Los Angeles Lakers defeated the Miami Heat to win the NBA Finals.

In the clinching game six victory, Caruso entered in to the starting lineup and registered four points, five assists and three rebounds in 33 minutes of action.

The College Station native was an integral part in the Lakers success during the 2020-21 season as he played in 64 games, averaging 5.5 points, 1.9 rebounds and 1.9 assists per game.

During his time at Texas A&M, Caruso etched his name into the record book as he holds the school records for assists with 649 and steals with 276. He and the Aggies won a share of the 2016 SEC Regular Season Championship and later advanced to the Sweet Sixteen after a dramatic comeback against Northern Iowa that will live in infamy.

Former Texas A&M men's basketball standout Khris Middleton and the Milwaukee Bucks won the 2021 NBA Championship, defeating the Phoenix Suns in six games.

Middleton was dominant throughout the entire NBA Playoffs. A 2011 All-Big 12 performer, Middleton averaged 23.6 points per game while adding 7.6 rebounds and 5.1 assists.


In game four of the NBA Finals, Middleton went off for 40 points in the Bucks' 109-103 victory. Prior to game five of the Finals, Middleton had made 15 field goals to tie or take the lead in the fourth quarter or overtime, which tied him with LeBron James for most all-time in a single playoff run in the past 25 years.

Additionally, Middleton, Giannis Antetokounmpo and Jrue Holiday became the first trio of teammates to each record 25 points on 50 percent shooting in a game since 1985.

Middleton accomplished all of this in the NBA Playoffs while also taking seven hours of classes during the Summer I semester at Texas A&M.









BUZZ WILLIAMS

HEAD COACH FOURTH SEASON AT TEXAS A&M OKLAHOMA CITY '94

Buzz Williams was named the 22nd head coach of the Texas A&M men's basketball program on April 3, 2019.

Williams led the Aggies to 27 wins in the 2021-22 season, which ties for the second-most in a single season, as well as championship game appearances at the SEC Tournament and NIT. Williams' squad won its last four regular season games which included a 16-point victory at No. 25 Alabama before advancing to the SEC Tournament final with wins over Florida, No. 4 Auburn and an 18-point triumph over No. 15 Arkansas. After being left out of the NCAA Tournament, the Aggies made the most of their opportunity and secured the program's first trip to the NIT Championship Game at Madison Square Garden, winning their first four games of the tournament by double digits. Under Williams' tutelage, Quenton Jackson became the first Aggie since 2018 to earn all-conference honors.

In his first season at the helm, Williams reinvigorated the program as the Aggies shattered preseason expectations and finished in a tie for sixth in the Southeastern Conference after being projected to finish 12th. Williams was voted as the Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year as Texas A&M won 10 SEC contests, which was the most since the Maroon & White won the league in 2016. During conference play, the Aggies sported the SEC's best scoring defense, limiting opponents to 67.4 points per game. Texas A&M closed out the regular season with five wins in its last seven games, which included a 78-75 road victory over No. 17 Auburn, which ended the Tigers' 19-game home winning streak.

Fresh off his third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance, Williams returned to Aggieland after spending five seasons at Virginia Tech. His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach, and he has been at the NCAA Division I level for 21 seasons. Williams has recruited and coached more than 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league Players of the Year, two conference Freshman of the Year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

In his five years in Blacksburg, Williams led the Hokies to four consecutive 20-win seasons and four consecutive 10-win seasons in Atlantic Coast Conference play. In 2018-19 Williams guided a nationally-ranked Tech team to a 26-9 record, finishing 12-6 in the ACC. The Hokies earned a 4-seed in the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Sweet 16 for just the second time in program history. Williams earned his 100th victory as the head coach at Virginia Tech when the Hokies knocked off Liberty in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

To cap off the 2017-18 season, the Hokies made a second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance, the first time the school could claim that in more than three decades. The Hokies finished the season 21-12 overall and 10-8 in the ACC. Tech made it three consecutive 20-win season and three consecutive 10-win ACC seasons.





The Hokies took care of business in the regular season. They defeated four nationally-ranked teams for the first time in school history, including three wins against top 10 programs. The Hokies also finished 11-2 in the non-conference regular season slate. On Jan. 29, 2017, the Hokies defeated Boston College, 85-79, to give Williams his 200th career victory.

The 2016-17 season was their most successful season in the last decade. Tech finished the season 22-11 overall and earned its first NCAA Tournament bid since 2007. Tech was 10-8 in the ACC regular season for the second consecutive season. The Hokies claimed three top 25 victories against ACC foes and finished with an impressive 11-1 record in non-conference regular season action.

In his second season, the Hokies were one of the most improved teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference and the NCAA. Predicted, once again, to reside near the bottom of the league standings, the Hokies finished with a 20-15 overall record under Williams, including a 10-8 mark in the ACC. Tech advanced to the second round of the 2016 NIT, defeating Princeton at home in overtime before falling at BYU two days later.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record. He began building the culture that would allow the Hokies to enjoy future successes. The team went a long ways toward establishing an identity — one predicated on hard work, accountability both on and off the court and playing with a tough, competitive nature

Williams made the move to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, he had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season – the same season that the team won the Big East Conference regular-season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. During Williams' tenure, six Marquette players made it to the NBA.

Williams was an assistant at Marquette during the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.


Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07. His roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top 50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06. The previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, where he served as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40 best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure, and HoopScoopOnline.com named him one of the top assistants in the country.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M-Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple have two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.









DEVIN JOHNSON

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH FOURTH SEASON AT TEXAS A&M NEW ORLEANS '08

A former student-assistant for Coach Williams at New Orleans, Devin Johnson is in his fourth season as at Texas A&M and enters his 12th season as a member of Williams' staff.

Johnson spent the first three season in Aggieland as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2022-23 season. Johnson played an integral part in one of the best seasons in program history in 2021-22 in which the Aggies won 27 games, the second-most in school annals. The Maroon & White went on a historic run to close the season, advancing to the SEC Tournament and NIT championship games.

In his first campaign in Aggieland, Johnson helped the Aggies tie for sixth in the SEC as the Aggies posted 10 wins in conference play, the most since 2016. Texas A&M's defense topped the SEC in scoring during league play, and the Aggies ended the season winning five of their last seven regular season games.

Johnson served as an assistant coach at Virginia Tech in 2018-19, helping the Hokies to their first Sweet Sixteen appearance since the tournament expanded in 1985. Johnson played a vital part in helping take the Hokies to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in program history. Johnson spent the first four campaigns as the Hokies' director of player personnel where he oversaw the program's video needs, exchange procedures, academics and players' scheduling and time management.

Prior to his arrival at Virginia Tech, Johnson spent two years at Marquette on Williams's staff. He played a crucial role in community initiatives and summer camps in addition to supervising all of the program's video needs, including staff scouting efforts and exchange procedures.

Prior to his time at Marquette, Johnson worked for the NBA's (former) New Orleans Hornets. During his five-year tenure, Johnson served as game presentation associate, group sales coordinator, and group service manager. Johnson interned for the New Orleans Hornets from 2005-2007.

The Louisiana native was a member of Williams' staff as an undergraduate assistant at the UNO during the 2006-07 campaign. He was involved in game day activities associated with the program, as well as assisting with the team's opponent scouting process and game plan development.

A 2008 graduate of the University of New Orleans, Johnson earned his Bachelor's degree in Business Management and earned a Minor in Sport Management.

Johnson is married to Shantè and the couple has one son, Dean and one daughter, Sanaa.











STEVE ROCCAFORTE

ASSISTANT COACH SECOND SEASON AT TEXAS A&M LAMAR '89

Steve Roccaforte, a 35-year coaching veteran, enters his second season as an assistant coach at Texas A&M.

Roccaforte (PRONOUNCED: rock-uh-fort) immediately brought success to Aggieland as he helped the Aggies win 27 games in 2021-22, the second-most in program history. Additionally, the Aggies advanced to the SEC Tournament game after knocking off a pair of ranked teams (No. 4 Auburn, No. 15 Arkansas) and the program made its first appearance in the NIT championship after winning the first four games of the tournament by double digits.

Roccaforte worked for head coach Buzz Williams previously for four years at Virginia Tech, three as an assistant and one as associate head coach. Roccaforte comes to Aggieland after spending the last three seasons at East Carolina as an associate head coach under Joe Dooley.

Known nationally as a tireless recruiter and enthusiastic floor coach, Roccaforte helped the Hokies earn back-to-back NCAA Tournament at-large bids in 2017 and 2018 and post three consecutive 20-win seasons (2015-18). He also helped the Hokies win 10 ACC games in three consecutive seasons for the first time since joining the conference in 2004.

Roccaforte joined the coaching staff at Virginia Tech following three years as an assistant coach at South Florida. He played a large role in USF getting a top-15 recruiting class for both the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons

and helped the Bulls advance to the round of 32 in the 2012 NCAA Tournament. Consistently toward the top of the list, he was ranked as the 23rd best assistant coach in the country that season.

Prior to USF, Roccaforte was the head coach at his alma mater, Lamar University, for five seasons after serving as an assistant coach at Lamar (2003-06), Memphis (2000-03), Wyoming (1998-00), Tulane (1994-98) and Centenary (1989-94) to begin his career.

Roccaforte has worked with some of the top coaches in the business and has recruited some of the top talent in the country. He has served under national coaches of the year in John Calipari, Perry Clark and Billy Tubbs to develop multiple nationally-ranked recruiting classes.

Roccaforte helped assemble top 20 recruiting classes at seven institutions, including the nation's top-rated class at Memphis in 2001. He also aided in the construction of a pair of top 10 classes at Lamar, three additional top 15 classes at Memphis, USF and East Carolina and three top-25 groups at both Tulane and Virginia Tech. In total, Roccaforte has facilitated 14 top-25 units, including four top-10. According to former ESPN Senior Recruiting Analyst and current San Antonio Spurs Director of Player Personnel Dave Telep, Roccaforte is one of the 25 hardest-working coaches in the nation as well as one of the top 15 recruiters in the country. During his career, Roccaforte has coached, signed or received commitments from 29 future NBA players

including six-time All-Star Amare Stoudemire and Kendrick Perkins, member of the 2008 NBA Champion Boston Celtics, along with first-round draft picks Dejuan Wagner, Antonio Burks, Qyntel Wood, Rodney Carney, Nickeil Alexander-Walker. Additionally, Roccaforte coached current NBA star Mike James (Brooklyn Nets) during his stint as the head coach at Lamar.

Roccaforte is also no stranger to postseason play, having served on the staff of eight teams that extended their seasons. He has been to five NCAA Tournaments, two with Virginia Tech and one with USF, Tulane, and Memphis along with NIT appearances at Tulane, Wyoming, Memphis and Virginia Tech. Tulane advanced to the NIT Final Four at Madison Square Garden in 1996. He helped Memphis reach MSG in 2001, win the NIT title in 2002 and advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2003 for the first time in seven years.

In all, Roccaforte's teams have made 11 postseason appearances with the Hokies' 2018 NCAA appearance being the most recent.

Roccaforte finally got his chance to be a head coach after Tubbs resigned his post at Lamar to focus on his Director of Athletics duties in March 2006.

In his five seasons, Lamar was a sparkling 55-20 at home in the Montagne Center and guided LU to its first SLC regular-season championship in 28 years in his second season with an impressive 13-3 conference mark. During



the 2006-07 and 2007-08 seasons, Lamar registered 20 consecutive home victories. He coached nine all-conference selections at Lamar.

The 2007-08 season featured a number of impressive streaks and great players. Among them were a 14-2 home record, a school-record six-consecutive conference road victories and the eighth-largest home crowd in school history. Lamar ranked eighth in the nation in scoring offense (81.5 ppg) and in the top 50 in both field goal percentage (46.9) and 3-point field goal percentage (38.2).

For his efforts, Roccaforte was named the 2007-08 Southland Conference Coach of the Year. Seniors Lamar Sanders and Kenny Dawkins were both named first team All-SLC, with Dawkins matching his teammate as SLC Newcomer of the Year. The success of that season led to a top-25 ranking in the mid-major poll the following year. Lamar ranked 12th in the NCAA in assists at 17.3 per game, 31st in 3-pointers made per game (8.3) and 52nd in 3-point percentage (.379).

Individually, Sanders led the SLC, and ranked 12th in the NCAA, in rebounding at 9.8 per game. The Cardinals set a new single-season school record for 3-point attempts (702) and posted the second-best mark in 3-pointers made (266).

Academics are a high priority for Roccaforte as evidenced by the fact that Lamar's increase in Academic Progress Rate (APR) was among the best in the country. Lamar's APR moved up 101 spots to No. 20 in the country during Roccaforte's tenure. Nineteen of 20 seniors earned their degrees while he was the head coach as did 100 percent of the seniors at USF from 2011 to 2014.

During his four years at Tulane, the Green Wave consistently ranked among the top-25 recruiting classes in the nation and included an All-America and seven All-Conference USA selections. The final recruiting class that he helped sign was ranked eighth nationally.

Roccaforte helped lead the Green Wave to three consecutive 20-win seasons during his tenure (1994-97). The Green Wave advanced to the NCAA Tournament second round in 1995, the NIT Final Four in 1996 and made another NIT appearance in 1997. The program also captured Conference USA Red Division titles in 1995-96 and 1996-97.

He earned his Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences degree from Lamar in 1989. He has two daughters, Victoria Elise and Sofia Rose, and a son, Lucien Anthony.



LYLE WOLF

ASSISTANT COACH FOURTH SEASON AT TEXAS A&M TRANSYLVANIA '10

yle Wolf enters his fourth season as an assistant coach after spending the last 10 seasons with Coach Williams at Virginia Tech and Marquette.

In 2021-22, Wolf was instrumental in the Aggies' 27 wins which tied for the second-most in program history. The Aggies had a historic month of March where they advanced to the SEC Tournament championship game after knocking off a pair of ranked teams in No. 4 Auburn and No. 15 Arkansas. A&M continued to make history advancing to the NIT championship game in Madison Square Garden, and won the first four games of the tournament by double digits.

In his first season at Texas A&M, Wolf helped orchestra the Aggie defense that finished first in scoring in SEC play at 67.4 points per game. Additionally, the Aggies led the league in defensive turnover rate and free-throw rate in conference play.

Wolf spent the 2018-19 season as Virginia Tech's director of men's basketball operations and previously served as the assistant to the head coach and director of student-athlete development.

In his previous duties with the Hokies, he assisted Williams and the staff with a wide-range of responsibilities, including team travel, scouting, budgeting, summer camps and the staff's day-to-day operations.

Wolf contributed to the program's turnaround as Virginia Tech made four postseason appearances including three straight trips to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history.

Wolf began his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant at Marquette. He assisted in the day-to-day operations of the program and supervised the team's managerial staff before obtaining a Master's degree in sports leadership in the spring of 2014.

A member of the basketball team in 2006-07, Wolf graduated from Transylvania (Ky.,) in 2010 with a degree in business administration. Following graduation, the Lexington, Kentucky, native served as the junior varsity basketball coach at Sayre School, a position he held during the 2011-12 campaign.

Wolf earned his Doctorate of Education in global sports leadership from East Tennessee State in March 2018.

Wolf and his wife, Perren, married in May of 2021.











DALE LAYER

SPECIAL ASSISTANT TO THE HEAD COACH FOURTH SEASON AT TEXAS A&M ECKERD COLLEGE '80

D ale Layer enters his fourth season as the special assistant to the head coach at Texas A&M. Layer and Coach Williams have a long history of working together, including stops at Colorado State, Marquette and Virginia Tech.


Layer served in a similar role at Virginia Tech in 2018-19 after one season as an assistant coach at Mercer. He spent the 2016-17 season as an assistant coach with the Greensboro Swarm of the NBA G League.

Layer joined the Swarm after six seasons as head coach at Liberty. In his time in Lynchburg, he led the Flames to a Big South Tournament Championship and NCAA Tournament appearance in 2013, set a school record for conference wins in a season with 13 during the 2011 season.

Layer's head coaching tenure at Liberty was his second stint with the school, after serving as an assistant coach under Ritchie McKay. Between his years at Liberty, he spent a season as an assistant at Marquette under Williams. At Marquette, he helped the Golden Eagles reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament and a 24-9 mark, ranking as high as eighth nationally.

Prior to his time with Liberty, he served as the head coach at Colorado State for seven seasons, where he led the Rams to 103 wins and an NCAA Tournament berth in 2003 off the heels of the program's Mountain West Conference Tournament title, the first NCAA berth for the school in 13 years. Williams was an assistant to Layer at CSU from 2000-04.

Layer took the reigns over in Fort Collins after two-year stint as an assistant coach with the Rams, helping guide the team to two top-25 wins in 1998 over UCLA and Utah followed by an NIT appearance in 1999.



Layer made the trip to Colorado after 10 years at Queens University in Charlotte, serving as head coach and athletic director. After starting the program following the university's transition to a co-ed school in 1988, he led the Royals to eight winning seasons in his nine years with 167 wins and a pair of NCAA Division II Tournament appearances to go along with two conference tournament titles.

Layer's coaching career began as an assistant at his alma mater, Eckerd College, in 1980 for two seasons before spending a year as a graduate assistant at Eastern Kentucky. He returned to Eckerd for five more seasons as an assistant.

Layer graduated from Eckerd College in 1980 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology and received his Master of Arts degree in counseling from Eastern Kentucky in 1983.





VINCE WALDEN

DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS FOURTH SEASON AT TEXAS A&M LONGWOOD '01

Vince Walden is in his fourth season at Texas A&M and holds 22 years of coaching experience with stops at Elon, Arkansas State, Liberty and the IMG Academy.

During his time at Arkansas State, he helped develop and coach USBWA All-District VII, NABC All-District 24 and All-Sun Belt selection Ty Cockfield. Prior to his time with the Red Wolves, Walden had two stints with IMG Academy basketball program in Bradenton, Fla. from 2006-12 and 2015-17 as the national team head coach. He also had a spent three seasons from 2012-15 as an assistant coach at Liberty University.

Walden, a 2017 Naismith Trophy High School Boys Coach of the Year finalist, guided IMG Academy to a 26-2 record in 2016-17, as well as an appearance in the DICK's Sporting Goods High School Nationals as the No. 2 seed. He helped the team to a No. 1 ranking in the Max Preps poll in 2016-17 and finished with a 53-12 record over his last two seasons with the Ascenders. Trevon Duval, a McDonald's All-American and Jordan Brand Classic invitee, shined for Walden during his last season at IMG Academy, becoming the first player in the program to be invited to McDonald's All-American game and third to play in the Jordan Brand Classic.

As head coach at IMG Academy, he oversaw four basketball teams and four coaches and was responsible for retention, player transitions and organizing future plans for graduating seniors. He is widely credited with building a culture that was centered on a positive and energetic atmosphere for players while teaching team and individual skills that developed character and leadership qualities, both on and off the court.

During his tenure at Liberty, Walden was an integral part in Liberty's 2013 Big South Tournament championship run. The Flames rallied to win four-straight games against three of the top seeds in the tournament to advance to the NCAA Tournament. While at Liberty, Walden trained and developed guard Davon Marshall, who was awarded the Big South Tournament MVP connecting on 17-of-24 3-point field goals. Marshall surpassed Seth Curry (102) for the most three-point field goals in a season with 107 in the 2012-13 season.





Prior to joining the Liberty staff, Walden had his first stint with the IMG Academy basketball program as the national team head coach and recruiting coordinator from 2006-12. He compiled a record of 146-56 record in that span and has a combined record of 201-68 in his time with the Ascenders.

He has coached or developed more than 50 professional players, including 2014 second round NBA Draft picks Dwight Powell and DeAndre Daniels.

Walden graduated with a degree in social work from Longwood in 2001, and was a four-year letterwinner in basketball and a three-year captain for the Lancers.

Walden and his wife, Lakeesha have two sons, Vinson Jr. and Zachary, and a daughter, Kari.

DIRECTOR OF SPORTS PERFORMANCE THIRD SEASON AT TEXAS A&M ARIZONA STATE '04


S teve Gephardt enters his third season as the Director of Sports Performance with the Texas A&M Men's Basketball program after a 13-year stint at TCU.

John Sharp was appointed Chancellor of The Texas A&M University System by the Board of Regents on Sept. 6, 2011.

On September 7, 2017, Governor Greg Abbott named him the commissioner of the Governor's Commission to Rebuild Texas, which is dedicated to rebuilding critical public infrastructure along the Gulf Coast in the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey.

As Chancellor, Sharp leads one of the nation's largest systems with an annual budget of \$\$6.3 billion. Enrollment at the A&M System's 11 universities has grown to more than 153,000 and externally funded research expenditures are in excess of \$996 million.

The System's flagship, Texas A&M University, stands among the nation's top 20 research universities for total research expenditures, according to the National Science Foundation.

Sharp brings with him more than three decades of public service. He earned a bachelor's degree in political science from Texas A&M University in 1972, where he was a member of the Corps staff of the Corps of Cadets, a member of the 1972 rugby team and was elected student body president. Upon graduation, Sharp was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the United States Army Reserve.

In 1976, Sharp received a master's degree in public administration from Southwest Texas State University while working full-time with the Legislative Budget Board in Austin.

In 1978, he opened a one-man real estate firm in Victoria and became a successful small business owner. That same year he was elected to the Texas House of Representatives.

In 1982, he won a seat in the Texas Senate. Four years later, he was elected to the Texas Railroad Commission. Sharp was elected state comptroller in 1990 and re-elected in 1994.

He came to the A&M System from Ryan & Company, where he was a principal with the largest state and local tax consulting firm of its kind in Texas.

Sharp, who was married 43 years to the late Charlotte Han of Austin, has a son, Spencer; a daughter-in-law, Brigitte; a daughter, Victoria; and granddaughters, Simone and Freya. Sharp is a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in College Station and is involved in many community and humanitarian efforts.

n addition to being an Aggie mom and strong supporter of Aggie Athletics, Dr. M. Katherine Banks is known as a visionary strategist, leader, researcher and educator. She is committed to upholding the university's core values of respect, excellence, leadership, loyalty, integrity and selfless service while propelling the university on an upward trajectory. To position Texas A&M as the 21st century public university, Dr. Banks streamlined all

administrative operations to reallocate funds, energize the campus and enhance the educational experience. Among her key initiatives: securing a \$50 million gift from Arch "Beaver" Aplin III — one of the university's most successful entrepreneurs — to establish an academic center that will serve as an immersive hospitality and entrepreneurship learning laboratory. She also has championed growth of the iconic Texas A&M Corps of Cadets and its leadership training through "March to 3,000", a campaign that includes her \$50 million Patriot Scholarship program. In addition to overseeing one of the nation's largest and most prestigious research universities, Dr Banks also serves as Vice Chancellor of National Laboratories and National Security Strategic Initiatives for The Texas A&M University System. Previously, Dr. Banks served for nine years as Vice Chancellor of Engineering and Dean of Texas A&M's College of Engineering. Before joining Texas A&M in 2012, Dr. Banks was an administrator and faculty member at Purdue University. She earned engineering degrees from the University of Florida, University of North Carolina and Duke University. She is a member of the National Academy of Engineering







ROSS BJORK TEXAS A&M DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

With more than 25 years of sports administration experience, Ross Bjork has built an impressive career highlighted by academic excellence, enhancing the student-athlete experience, and consistent competitive success.

Guided by a mission of creating opportunities through championship athletics, Bjork, who was hired as Texas A&M's 16th Director of Athletics on May 23, 2019, wasted little time to make his mark in Aggieland. Bjork's vision is to make the Home of the

12th Man the pinnacle in opportunities realized through sports: championships won, diplomas earned, leaders equipped, and launched to impact the world.

With an eye on laying the foundation for a new era of excellence at Texas A&M, Bjork and the 12th Man Foundation recently introduced the ambitious Centennial Campaign, which will feature the construction of an Academic and Wellness Center, Football Indoor Performance Center and Indoor Track Stadium as well as a redevelopment of the Bright Football Complex. Through the Centennial Campaign, the 12th Man Foundation has committed to securing \$120 million in donor contributions, which represents the largest philanthropic fundraising effort in the organization's history outside of the historic redevelopment of Kyle Field.

Bjork's commitment to academic success has led to record-setting showings in overall grade point average (GPA), NCAA Graduate Success Rate (GSR) and NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) under his watch. Most notably, prior to Bjork's arrival Texas A&M's student-athletes had never posted a semester or cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher. Since his arrival, the Aggies have achieved the feat in five of six possible semesters.

Texas A&M's 2021 GSR was a school-record 84%, which came on the heels of an 82% rating in 2020. Texas A&M's most recent APR results had every program well above the 930 score threshold, including six teams that surpassed the 990 multi-year APR and three programs with perfect scores. For the 2021-22 academic year, the Aggies posted cumulative GPAs of 3.0 in the fall and 3.056 in the spring, and more than 300 student-athletes were named to the AD Honor Roll in both semesters. An impressive 115 student-athletes earned degrees during the school year.

With deep connections throughout college athletics, Bjork has been able to identify and hire an impressive group of head coaches. Since Bjork's arrival in Aggieland he has hired five head coaches: Gerrod Chadwell (women's golf), Brian Kortan (men's golf) and Jim Schlossnagle (baseball) in 2021, and former conference coaches of the year Trisha Ford (softball) and Joni Taylor (women's basketball) in 2022. All three of Bjork's 2021 head coach hires had tremendous first seasons with women's golf advancing to the semifinal match at the NCAA Championships and baseball battling its way to the final four at the Men's College World Series, while men's golf qualified for the national meet for the first time since 2019.

The progressive Bjork and his team launched a successful Change.org campaign following the racial strife around the country in the summer of 2020. The Unify Aggies campaign centered around education on the history of our country, injustices and current events; and engaging in a healthy dialogue in our communities.

From there, Texas A&M Athletics launched The Aggie Commitment and its student-athletes created The B.L.U.E.print - Black Leaders who Undertake Excellence. The Aggie Commitment and B.L.U.E.print initiatives have provided new opportunities for personal and professional

growth and development for student-athletes and staff. The initiatives celebrate and honor Black History at Texas A&M and provide student-athletes with an unparalleled experience, while also serving as a change agent in the fight against social injustice.

Bjork provided input and guidance to leadership in the Texas legislature as they developed a comprehensive Name, Image, Likeness law in the spring of 2021. He then oversaw the creation and implementation of AMPLIFY and AMPLIFY Local Exchange, which has equipped Aggie student-athletes with tools and training to maximize their brand and platform. AMPLIFY has provided Texas A&M student-athletes with best-in-class education and resources related to personal branding, networking, finance and media training.

Bjork's leadership extends outside of Aggieland and onto a national scale. He currently serves as the NACDA 2nd Vice president, is on the NCAA Student-Athlete Experience Committee and just completed a stint on the NCAA DI Working Group on Transfers. Bjork has served in numerous leadership roles around college athletics during his career including NAADD President in 2006-07, NACDA Executive Committee, SEC awards committee chair, NCAA men's basketball oversight committee and the NCAA transfer working group.

He came to Aggieland from the University of Mississippi, where he served as the Director of Athletics for seven years and was the youngest AD among the Power 5 conferences when hired. During his tenure at Ole Miss, revenue generated within Athletics more than doubled, from \$57 million to \$117 million.

His many achievements include finishing in the Top 40 of the Directors' Cup in consecutive years for the first time, as well as the university's first appearance in the Men's College World Series in 42 years in 2014. New facilities and renovation improvements flourished under his leadership including the Manning Center, Baseball Performance Center, Gillom Performance Center, new outdoor track, indoor tennis complex, the Pavilion at Ole Miss and a large renovation at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Bjork arrived in Oxford after a stint as Director of Athletics at Western Kentucky University where he quickly established an atmosphere of success. After Bjork made a midseason coaching change, the Hilltopper men's basketball team went on to capture the 2012 Sun Belt Conference Tournament title and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Women's Volleyball reached the NCAA tournament twice, while cross country swept the conference team titles in 2011. WKU's football program posted the greatest one-season improvement in conference wins in the history of the Sun Belt with a 7-1 league mark.

In the classroom, each of WKU's men's and women's athletic teams exceeded the NCAA required 925 APR threshold, and WKU had more individuals honored for their academic achievements by the Sun Belt Conference than any other institution in 2011-12. For the first time in program history, the overall cumulative average GPA was over 3.0 for all 391 student-athletes and 228 maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.

Bjork has an extensive career in intercollegiate athletics with more than two decades of experience as an administrator and student-athlete, having worked on the senior staffs at UCLA, the University of Miami and the University of Missouri. He began his administrative career at WKU as an Assistant Development Coordinator in 1996-97.

Bjork is a native of Dodge City, Kansas, and received his bachelor's degree in recreation administration from Emporia State University in 1995 where he was a two-year starter at fullback. Bjork was honored by Emporia State with the 2017 distinguished alumni award and currently serves on the ESU Foundation Board of Trustees. He earned a master's degree in athletic administration from Western Illinois University in December 1996.



JUSTIN MOORE EXECUTIVE DEPUTY AD, ADMINISTRATION

Justin Moore serves as the Executive Deputy Athletics Director and Chief Operating Officer of Texas A&M Athletics. Moore works alongside the Director of Athletics in directing the overall planning, implementation, administration, and day-to-day operations of the athletics department.

He will play an integral role in the department's upcoming capital projects and Centennial Capital Campaign and will continue to serve as the sport administrator for football and men's basketball.

His previous administrative roles at Texas A&M include serving as Deputy Athletics Director for Administration from 2019-2021, Senior Associate Athletics Director from 2016-2019 and Associate Athletics Director for Football from 2012-15. During his tenure with the Aggies, Moore has touched nearly every area of the department, including student-athlete performance and wellness, facilities and event management, fundraising, facility planning and capital projects, academics and life skills, compliance, budgeting, team operations and logistics, and scheduling. He also spearheaded an extensive leadership development program for the athletics department that offers specific courses and continuing education opportunities for coaches, staff and student-athletes. In addition, he has served as the sport administrator for many of the Aggies' key sports including football, men's basketball, men's and women's track and field / cross country, men's golf, and women's tennis.

In Moore's role as the Aggies' Associate Athletics Director for Football, he oversaw every aspect of the Aggie football program including personnel and staffing, departmental budget, recruiting, team logistics, bowl game coordination, day-to-day operations and football-related facility projects, including the design process for the Davis Player Development Center, the R.C. Slocum Nutrition Center and Bright Football Complex Renovation, and worked closely with the 12th Man Foundation on the \$485 million Kyle Field Redevelopment project.

Moore's involvement with the football team coincided with one of the most successful periods in the program's history. From 2012-15, the Aggies won 36 games, earned a bowl berth every season (with three bowl victories) and produced eight first-team All-Americans, as well as the first freshman Heisman Trophy winner in college football history and the school's first Outland Trophy recipient.

In addition to the Aggies' on-field success, the team's multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) and overall team grade point average were both the highest in program history and football student-athletes earned close to 100 SEC Academic Honor Roll citations.

A Texas A&M graduate, Moore returned to Aggieland after spending four years at the University of Houston as the Assistant Athletics Director for Football. The Cougars won the most games in any four-year period in school history and earned a pair of Conference USA West Division titles during his time at UH.

Prior to Houston, Moore spent two years as the special assistant to the athletics director at Texas A&M, when he coordinated and led the NCAA certification process, assisted with football scheduling and coordinated all student financial aid. He also scheduled and supervised all activities associated with player agent interviews, NFL pro-day and educational seminars and activities for student-athletes and their parents.

Moore graduated from Texas A&M in 2004 with a degree in finance and later earned a master's degree in sport management. After graduation, he worked in the private sector as a consultant for Deloitte & Touche LLP, consulting with top-level executives of Fortune 500 companies on both their business cycles and information technology processes.

A two-time captain for the Aggie baseball team, Moore was named a Freshman All-American pitcher in 2001, twice named to the All-Big 12 Team and was a two-time recipient of the Pat Olsen Most Valuable Pitcher Award (2001-2002). He also earned Academic All-Big 12 Team honors for four straight years.

A three-sport standout in high school, Moore graduated from Katy Taylor in 1999 and was inducted into the Katy Taylor Athletics Hall of Fame (2012). Moore and his wife, Dory (A&M Class of 2003), have three children, Kate (13), Tysen (11), and Tatum (9).



WINNINGEST SOUTHWEST CONFERENCE COACH

In 27 seasons as Texas A&M's head basketball coach, Shelby Metcalf became the winningest coach in Southwest Conference history with an overall record of 438-306. Metcalf owns league records for total victories (438), league victories (239), total games coached (744) and most seasons coached (27). Metcalf led the Aggies to six conference titles and two SWC Postseason Classic crowns. His 1979-80 team advanced to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament before losing to eventual national champion Louisville in overtime. Metcalf's 1969 team also made the Sweet 16 and his 1979 and 1982 teams came within one game of the NIT Final Four.






