## tipoff

• Florida finished the 2004-05 season with a 24-8 mark and its seventh straight NCAA Tournament appearance...Along the way the Gators won their first SEC Tournament title...The 24 wins for the Gators were the fourth most in school history...With a win over Ohio in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, Billy Donovan became the first Florida coach to reach double figures in NCAA Tournament wins...Anthony Roberson was the runner-up for SEC Player of the Year and was the only player in the league to average over 20.0 points per game in conference play (20.8 ppg)...David Lee ended his career with a 20-point, 10-rebound effort against Villanova in the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament for his 12<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season and the 22<sup>nd</sup> of his career...Lee ended his career at UF with 1,436 points, 14<sup>th</sup> in school history...Matt Walsh finished second on the Gators in scoring at 14.6 points per game and hit 42.6 percent from three-point range on the year...Roberson earned First Team All-SEC honors from both the AP and Coaches for the second straight year while Lee earned Second Team honors from both and Walsh Second Team honors from the coaches...The trio has a combined 4,242 career points, the highest total of any trio in the SEC...Al Horford finished with 51 blocked shots, the highest total by a UF player since Andrew DeClercq finished with 51 in 1993-94...Corey Brewer started all 32 games for the Gators and finished with a team-high 46 steals...Florida finished 18-1 on the year when holding opponents to under 70 points... Florida finished third in the league in points per game allowed (63.1) a year after finishing 11th in the same category...The Gators led the SEC in points per game scored at 76.2 and margin, +13.1...The scoring margin was the fourth highest in school history as five of the top six all-time marks in that category have come under Billy Donovan...UF scored 80+ points on 16 occasions in 2004-05, all wins...Aside from scoring 80 points against Mississippi State and 70 against Kentucky in the SEC Tournament final, Florida won six games during its late-season eight-game streak without reaching 70 points...The eight-game winning streak by the Gators before the loss to Villanova was the longest since a school record 14-game streak in 2002-03 and was the fifth longest in school history...The Gators blocked 146 shots, the second highest total in school history, as five different Gators reached double figures in the category...Florida knocked down 244 three-pointers, the ninth straight year they've hit 200 or more...The Gators have hit 200+ three-pointers in all of Billy Donovan's nine years at UF after never reaching the mark prior to his arrival.

## gators finish with fourth highest win total in school history

• With 24 wins on the season, UF matched the fourth highest win total in school history, joining the 2000-01 squad...Four of the top five highest win totals in school history have come under Billy Donovan, including his 29-8 squad in 2000 team that reached the Final Four and NCAA title game.

## gators post third highest win total heading into ncaas in school history

• With 23 wins heading into the NCAA Tournament, Florida posted its most wins heading into the NCAA Tournament since 2003 when the Gators entered with a 24-7 mark...It was the fourth highest total of wins in school history heading into the NCAA Tournament with the 2000 National Runner-up squad also having 24 wins going into the tournament while the 1994 Final Four team holds the record with 25 wins going into NCAA Tournament play.

## gators experience march success

• Florida jumped out of the gates in the month of March to the tune of a 6-0 mark and within one win of the school record for victories in the month before falling to Villanova in the NCAA Tournament Second Round...The 1994 Final Four squad won seven games in the month of March while the 2000 NCAA runner-up team won six and the school's only victory ever in the month of April.

## gators' winning streak among best in school history

• Florida's eight-game winning streak from late February to mid-March was among the best in school history, as the Gators came up two wins shy of only the fourth double-digit win streak in school history...The Gators' streak was the longest by a UF club since the 2002-03 team matched the school record with 14 straight wins...Four of the top five streaks in school history have come under Billy Donovan.

## roberson reaches 1,500-point plateau

• On a free throw with :26 remaining in the second half on Friday, Anthony Roberson reached 1,500 career points, only the 11th Gator to do so...Roberson moved from outside the top 35 to just outside the top 10 during his junior season...He is 39 points shy of reaching the top 10 in scoring...He is the first Gators to reach 1,500 points since Matt Bonner during the 2002-03 season...He finished the 2004-05 season at 1,505 career points.

## seeding history

• Florida's No. 4 seed was the third highest seeding in school history and the first time they were a No. 4 seed...Florida's highest seeding ever was in 2003 when they were a No. 2 seed...They've been a Top Five seed in seven of their 12 appearances...A look at Florida's seeding in the NCAA Tournament:

## florida one of only four schools to be a top six seed each of the last seven years

• For the seventh straight year Florida was at least a top six seed and for the sixth straight year, a top five seed...Florida, Kentucky, Kansas and Duke are the only teams in the country to be at least a top six seed each of the past seven years.

## finishing games down the stretch

• The University of Florida learned the subtle art of finishing games off, as seven of their last nine victories came as a result of solid play down the stretch...Against Tennessee on Feb. 12, the Gators trailed 65-64 with 7:43 remaining and outscored the Vols 20-8 over the remainder of the game...Against Vanderbilt on Feb. 23, the Gators trailed 49-48 with 6:35 remaining before outscoring the Commodores 21-12 down the stretch...Against South Carolina on Feb. 27, Florida trailed 57-42 with 11:09 remaining before shocking the Gamecocks with a 24-8 run to close the game...The Gators once again trailed by nine on March 2 against Georgia and went on a 21-2 run, part of a 27-6 stretch to finish the game.. Florida trailed Kentucky by four points with 2:06 remaining and again with 1:09 remaining on March 6 before scoring the final five points of the game to take a 53-52 decision...At the SEC Tournament, the Gators trailed Alabama 36-35 in the semifinals before scoring 33 points over the final 13:08...Most notably, trailing Kentucky 44-40 in the SEC Tournament final, Florida went on a 21-2 run and outscored UK 30-9 over the final 11:53...In the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, despite allowing Ohio to

mount a furious comeback, the Gators outscored the Bobcats 7-2 after the game was tied at 60-60.

## gators tightening the clamps defensively

• The University of Florida ranked either No. 1 or No. 2 in the SEC in every major offensive category a year ago, leading the league in field goal percentage, three-pointers per game and free throws while finishing second in three-point percentage and assists...Conversely, they were No. 9-12 in nearly every major defensive category...Associate Head Coach Anthony Grant broke down every possible defensive sequence after the season and the Gators' entered the 2004-05 season with a commitment to defending better...The results were remarkable as the Gators went from 11th in the league in points per game allowed to third (63.1 ppg)...Florida held five SEC opponents under 55 points and held eight of 16 opponents to 65 points or less (and all three SEC Tournament opponents)...Florida held Alabama to just 54 points on Feb. 5, Ole Miss to 53 points on Feb. 16, SEC regular season champion Kentucky to just 52 on March 6 and 53 on March 13 and held Georgia to 47 and 38 points respectively in their two victories...Over the Gators' late-season eight-game winning streak they held opponents to just 57.1 points per game.

## florida among elite company

• The Gators made their seventh straight NCAA Tournament appearance, after having only five NCAA Tournament appearances in school history prior to Billy Donovan's arrival...Florida is one of only 11 schools to appear in each of the last seven NCAA Tournaments:

## roberson, lee, walsh, earn all-sec honors

• Anthony Roberson, David Lee and Matt Walsh each earned All-SEC honors for the second straight year...Roberson was a First Team All-SEC selection by both the league coaches and Associated Press for the second straight year while Lee earned Second Team honors in each...Walsh earned Second Team honors from the coaches...Roberson was the runner-up for SEC Player of the Year, losing out on Player of the Year by a single vote.

## taking care of the ball

• The University of Florida averaged 15.8 assists per game and had a +1.16 assist to turnover ratio in its 24 wins while the Gators averaged just 12.0 assists and are a -1.00 in their eight losses, as they averaged four more turnovers per game...When the Gators' backcourt of Anthony Roberson and Matt Walsh spread the ball out effectively, positive results followed...The Gators are 15-1 over his career when Walsh has five-plus assists and are 13-3 all-time when Roberson has five-plus assists.

## gators dominated glass

• One of the biggest criticisms of the University of Florida following the 2003-04 season was its inability to rebound the ball effectively against SEC and top level competition...The Gators completely reversed that trend in 2004-05...The Gators are outrebounding opponents by 5.7 boards per game on the year, a number that escalated to 7.2 rebounds per game in SEC play...The tandem of David Lee and Al Horford formed one of the league's top rebounding frontcourts, as the two combined for 18.1 rebounds per game in SEC play as Lee had 17 and 14-rebound games against Vanderbilt and Horford an 18-rebound game against Alabama...Lee had a UF SEC Tournament record 17 rebounds in the SEC title game...The Gators did a much more effective job on the offensive glass and got 36.5 percent of their missed shots back in league play and 11.3 offensive boards per game...A year ago the Gators got only 32.1 percent of their missed shots back...The Gators also grabbed 71.5 percent of their potential defensive rebounds in league play, a six percent improvement over a year ago...In the SEC Tournament the Gators out-rebounded Mississippi State 41-26 and Kentucky 48-31.

## a run to the sec title...

• Trailing 44-40 with 11:53 remaining in regulation of the SEC title game against Kentucky, rather than wilt, the Gators made a run that decided its first SEC Tournament Championship...Matt Walsh drained back-to-back three-pointers to give UF the lead, followed by a lay-up by Roberson and another three-pointer by Walsh for an 11-0 run...The Gators never looked back, putting together a 21-2 run to jump out to a 61-46 lead...The Gators closed the game on a 30-9 run over the final 11:53.

## hard path to the sec title

• Entering the 2004-05 season Kentucky was picked to win the SEC East, while Alabama and Mississippi State were considered co-favorites for the SEC West and the overall SEC title...Florida's road to the SEC Tournament title took it against all three...After defeating Mississippi State by 16 points, Florida defeated the West and East division champions in back-to-back games, taking down Alabama, 68-62, before taking a 70-53 decision in the title game against East and regular season champion Kentucky.

## walsh earns sec tourney mvp, lee sec all-tournament team

• Matt Walsh's 26-point outburst in the SEC Tournament final earned him MVP honors, only the second Gator to ever win the award...Walsh averaged 19.3 points per game and hit 13 three-pointers in the tournament...David Lee made the All-Tournament Team after averaging a double-double with 13.7 points and 11.0 rebounds...Lee had a UF SEC Tournament record 17 rebounds against Kentucky in the title game.

## gators defeat UK twice in eight days, first team in 85 years to do so twice in less than 10 days

• Florida is the only team to beat Kentucky twice in eight days or less since the Wildcats joined the Southeastern Conference in 1933. Prior to Florida's 70-53 win on March 13, 2005, Vanderbilt was the only SEC team to beat Kentucky twice in less than two weeks (two wins in 13 days, 1972-73 season). Six teams beat the Wildcats twice in seven days or less from 1909-1920. An additional two teams beat the Wildcats twice in 10 days; Georgetown in 1904 and Cincinnati in 1926.

## roberson offense ignites gator success

- Anthony Roberson completed his best SEC season in a Gator uniform, a huge compliment to a player that has earned SEC Freshman of the Year and First Team All-SEC honors each of the last two years...He led the SEC in scoring in league play at 20.8 ppg and was the only player in the league to average 20+ points in SEC action...He's been criticized at times for taking too many shots but what's lost at times is that he's doing exactly what head coach Billy Donovan is asking of him...There is a direct correlation between Roberson's offensive output and the Gators' success - over his career when he hits 4+ three-pointers, the Gators are an astounding 27-5...He has 31 20-point games in his career and the Gators are 23-8 in those games...Also critical is his ability to get to the line...A career 86.4 percent free throw shooter (best in school history), his ability to get to the basket and draw contact is vital - the Gators are 14-4 in his career when he gets to the line 5+ times.

## roberson comes up big again

- With 34 points against Auburn on Jan. 12 and 30 points against Vanderbilt on Jan. 15, Anthony Roberson recorded the second and third 30-point games of his career...His 34 points against Auburn were the most points by a Gator on an opposing team's court since 1986...He became the first Gator to record back-to-back 30-point games since Andrew Moten in 1986 and the first to do so on the road since Andy Owens in 1970...Roberson has eight games of 25+ points for his career including three this season...Roberson had four games of 25+ points last season and had a 26-point game against Coastal Carolina his freshman year...Three of his eight games of 25+ have come against Vanderbilt, as he is averaging 28.3 ppg in his last four meetings with the Commodores.

- With 26 points, including 12 in the deciding 21-2 run in the SEC Tournament Final, Matt Walsh earned the fifth MVP award of his three-year career...Earlier this season he won his third straight Orange Bowl Classic MVP award in Miami after scoring 21 points in the Gators' win over Providence...Add his MVP showing at last year's MassMutual Tip-Off Classic Springfield, Mass., when he torched Arizona for 27 and Walsh has earned the last five possible MVP awards for Gator players.

## walsh offense sparks gators

- Matt Walsh has gone for 15+ points 46 times in his career and it usually means success for the Gators...Florida is 35-11 when Walsh goes for 15+ points, including 14-2 this season...Walsh went for 15+ in nine of the last 13 games.

## lee steps it up in SEC play

- David Lee posted his 11th double-double of the season and his ninth in SEC play against Kentucky on March 6, scoring 11 points and adding 10 rebounds...Lee has double-doubles in nine of his last 16 games...Included in that stretch was a career-high 17-rebound performance against Vanderbilt on Jan. 15...Since a four-point performance against Florida State, Lee has taken his game to another level and averaged a double-double...In SEC play Lee averaged 13.9 points per game and 10.3 rebounds per contest...He hit 51.3 percent from the floor and had 40 assists in league play, second on the team...He became the first Gator since Dwayne Schintzius in 1990 to average a double-double in SEC play.

## horford registers second best rebounding performance by a UF freshman ever, sets UF freshman block record

- Al Horford grabbed an eye-popping 18 rebounds against Alabama on Feb. 5, the second highest total ever by a UF freshman...He matched his father Tito Horford among others with the fourth best rebounding performance ever at the O'Connell Center, just three shy of the record of 21 by former Gator Eugene McDowell...Andrew DeClercq had 20 rebounds while Shaquille O'Neal had 19 rebounds at the O'Connell Center during his playing days at LSU...On Feb. 16, he blocked seven shots, a UF freshman record and the second best performance in school history overall.

## "baby gators" contribute big minutes, stats

- Florida head coach Billy Donovan relied heavily on four freshmen for significant amounts of time for the first time in a number of years...This year the quartet of Corey Brewer, Al Horford, Taurean Green and Joakim Noah performed well beyond its years and will be remembered as one of Florida's best freshmen classes ever under Billy Donovan...Brewer started all 32 games while Horford became a regular in the starting rotation on Dec. 19 and started the final 25 games of the season...Green was the first off the bench 12 times while Noah finished fourth on the team in blocked shots and became a force on the glass...The four averaged a combined 75.8 minutes, 20.5 points and 13.4 rebounds per game.

## block party

- The University of Florida blocked only 3.2 shots per contest in 2003-04 but improved significantly in that area in 2004-05...The Gators blocked 4.6 shots per contest and blocked 63 more shots than their opponents did on the year...Florida's 146 blocks were the second most in school history and the most since the 1987-88 club blocked a school record 168...Florida blocked 10 shots against Ole Miss (including seven by Al Horford), nine shots against both Eastern Kentucky and Sam Houston, eight against Ohio in the NCAA Tournament opener, seven against Vanderbilt (Feb. 23), five against South Carolina (Jan. 29), Florida State and Kentucky (Feb. 8) and six against Arkansas, South Carolina (Feb. 27) and Kentucky (March 6)...Al Horford led the way with 51, the highest total by a Gator since Andrew DeClercq blocked 51 in 1993-94.

## hot shooting gators

- Florida hit better than 50 percent from the floor 11 times in 2004-05, including eight games of 55 percent or better...The Gators hit a season-high 64.0 percent against Ole Miss, including 70.8 percent in the second half and 64.7 percent from three-point range on the night...The Gators went 10-1 when hitting better than 50 percent from the floor and are 87-11 all-time under Billy Donovan when doing so.

## honors pour in for Roberson

- After scoring 30+ points in back-to-back games on Jan. 12 and 15, the league and the nation took notice of Anthony Roberson's accomplishments...Roberson was selected as the SEC Player of the Week that week, the only Gator to be honored in 2004-05...It marked Roberson's second such honor and the first since his freshman season...Roberson received national attention as SI.com's National Player of the Week, Dick Vitale's co-Player of the Week on ESPN.com and the Sporting News Player of the Week...Roberson opened the week with a 34-point effort against Auburn, 10 of which came in overtime when his team needed it the most, then followed with 30 points in a 17-point victory over Vanderbilt, Florida's biggest ever win in Nashville...His back-to-back 30-point games were the first by a Gator since Andrew Moten 1986 and the first by a Gator in consecutive road games since Andy Owens in February of 1970.

## gators getting it done on both ends

- It's not surprising that Florida led the SEC in scoring at 76.2 points per game, there has never been a shortage of offense in

Billy Donovan's nine years at UF...They were vastly improved on the defensive end, however, and finished third in the SEC in points per game allowed at 63.1 per contest - a vast improvement over a 2003-04 when they finished 11th in the SEC in scoring defense...The Gators held 12 of 32 opponents under 60 points, including holding Georgia to just 38 points on March 2 and 47 points on Jan. 25, holding the Bulldogs to just 12 field goals in the March 2 meeting...They held high-scoring Alabama to just 54 points on Feb. 5 and 62 points in the rematch on March 12...Florida held Ole Miss to just 53 points and 18 field goals on Feb. 16 and held Kentucky to just 52 points on March 6 and 53 a week later in the SEC Tournament final...As a result, they led the SEC in point differential, outscoring their opponents by 13.1 points per game...The Gators led the league in field goal percentage and were second in three-point percentage and third in assists.

## getting to the line with more frequency

- The Gators did a much more effective job of getting to the free throw line in 2004-05, including 31 times against Louisville, 36 times against Georgia Southern and Vanderbilt (Jan. 15), 38 times against Arkansas and 32 times at Tennessee (Feb. 12)...Florida got to the line nearly 23 times per game, a jump from a year ago when they got to the line only 19.9 times per game...The Gators too, exactly 100 more free throws than they did a year ago (716-616) in only one more game played (32-31).

## donovan the "dean" of sec coaches

- As a player he was known as Billy the Kid...No kid anymore, Donovan is in his ninth season at Florida and has the longest tenure at his current school of anyone in the SEC...There have been 15 head coaching changes in the league since Donovan's arrival prior to the 1996-97 season...His nine seasons at UF matches the longest consecutive tenure in school history (Norm Sloan, 1981-89).

## what have you done for me lately?

- Florida out-rebounded its opponents by a margin of 5.7 rebounds per game on the year, a number that reached 7.2 in SEC play...The Gators pulled down 40+ boards 13 times and were out-rebounded only nine times...Florida out-rebounded Mississippi State 41-26 and out-rebounded Kentucky 48-31 in the SEC Tournament.

- Florida forced 479 turnovers on the year and converted them into 584 points, or 18.3 points per game...The Gators forced Ohio into 20 turnovers, converting them into 27 points in the NCAA Tournament opener and got 21 points off of turnovers against Villanova.

- Florida held Georgia to just 38 points on March 2, the lowest total by a Billy Donovan-coached team in SEC play while holding them to just 13 points and four field goals in the second half.

- The Gators held Kentucky to just 52 points on March 6 while forcing the Wildcats into 17 turnovers on the game...Florida followed it by holding the Wildcats to just 53 points in the SEC title game including 2-19 from three-point range.

- Florida torched Ole Miss, hitting 64.0 percent from the floor and 64.7 percent from three-point range....Florida hit over 50 percent from the floor in 11 times and 55 percent or better eight times...UF went 10-1 when hitting 50 percent from the floor...The Gators hit 48 or 49 percent in five of their other 14 wins.

- The Gators hit 12 three-pointers against Mississippi State in the SEC Tournament on March 11, and hit 10+ three-point attempts on eight occasions in 2004-05...UF is averaged 7.6 three-pointers per game.

- The Gators held South Carolina to just two field goals in the final 10 minutes of play and outscored the Gamecocks 37-19 over the final 16 minutes of play after falling behind by 17 points.

- The Gators shot 48.2 percent from the floor and 39.0 percent from three-point range in 2004-05 and were over 50.0 percent from the floor for much of the season...The Gators shot 39.8 percent from three-point range in SEC play.

- Florida has grabbed 366 offensive rebounds, grabbing 35.4 percent of its misses an improvement over 2003-04 when they grabbed 32.1 percent of their missed shots...Nowhere was this improvement been more evident than in league play where the Gators pulled down 36.7 percent of their missed shots and averaged 11.3 offensive rebounds per game against SEC competition.

- **Anthony Roberson** came up with a season-high 34 points against Auburn, the second highest total of his career and followed that with 30 points against Vanderbilt and then 26 against Tennessee giving him 90 points over that three-game stretch...Roberson became the first Gator since 1986 to record back-to-back 30-point games and the first Gator to do so on the road since 1970.

- Roberson finished second in the SEC in scoring at 17.5 points per game but led the league in scoring during SEC play at 20.8 ppg, the only player to average over 20.0 ppg in league play...He scored in double figures in 29 of 32 games this season...He had had 15+ points in 19 consecutive games before scoring 13 against Alabama in the SEC Tournament semifinals and had 15+ in all 16 SEC games...Roberson has 31 games of 20+ points in his career and the Gators are 23-8 in those games.

- Roberson became the 36th member of Florida's 1,000-point club against Miami, hitting a three-pointer from the top of the arc to reach the mark.

- Roberson moved into sole possession of second place on UF's all-time three-pointers made list with 267 and in second with 665 attempts...He needs just seven more three-pointers to tie the school record...He set the UF single-season record with 99 three-pointers in 2003-04 and followed with 94 three-pointers in 2004-05.

- **David Lee** posted the 22nd and final double-double of his career in his final outing as a Gator, scoring 20 points and pulling down 10 rebounds against Villanova...Lee posted 12 double-doubles on the year and his 9.0 rebounds per game were the highest by a Gators since 1988-89...Lee has double-doubles in 10 of the last 19 games and moved past former teammate and current Toronto Raptor Matt Bonner for 10th on the schools all-time double-double against Geor-

gia on March 2 and into ninth place in his final collegiate game...UF was 16-6 when Lee records a double-double over his career.

- Over the last 19 games of his career Lee has hauled in 201 rebounds including a 17-rebound performance in the SEC Tournament final, setting a UF SEC Tournament record... It matched his career high set against Vanderbilt on Jan. 15...His 17 rebounds against Vandy were the most by a Gator player since Mike Miller had 18 against Kentucky on Feb. 8, 2000...Florida was 26-10 during his career when he scored 15-plus points (9-4 this year)...Lee scored in double figures in 26 of 32 games and had 15 games of 14+...He had six-plus rebounds in all but three games.

- Lee averaged a double-double in SEC play with 13.9 points and 10.3 rebounds and has had fewer than seven rebounds in league play just twice...He became the first UF player since Dwyane Schintzius in 1990 to average a double-double in SEC play.

- Lee came up with 16 points and seven rebounds against Providence and had a 16-point, eight-rebound effort against Miami...Against Louisville he had 18 points and nine rebounds and 20 points and 10 rebounds against Villanova.

- Lee set the tone for the Gators in the SEC opener against Arkansas and delivered 17 points, seven rebounds and five assists, leading the team in each category...Lee hit 6-of-7 shots from the floor and was the emotional leader the team needed.

- **Matt Walsh** finished second on the Gators in scoring at 14.6 ppg and had six 20-point games this season, second on the Gators...He returned to action on Jan. 19 against Tennessee after missing four games with a syndesmotom ankle sprain...He found his stroke again vs. Alabama, hitting 6-of-12 shots from the floor and scoring 18 points and then matched his 18-point outburst with the same number against Kentucky...Walsh guided the Gators to their first SEC Tournament title, winning MVP honors by scoring 26 points in the title game...He averaged 19.3 points per game in the tournament while hitting 13 three-pointers...Walsh is hit 45.3 percent from the floor and 42.6 percent from three-point range on the season...Walsh reached 1,000 career points on Dec. 19 against Georgia Southern, doing so on a three-pointer in the first half..He went for 14 or more in 18 of his 28 games this season.

- Walsh led the Gators in assists with 3.0 apg and had 5+ assists in five of the last 16 games, including four seven-assist games (last vs. Ohio in the NCAA Tournament opener)...Florida was 5-0 in those games and is 15-1 all-time when Walsh posts 4+ assists.

- Walsh moved into the top five in all-time three-pointers at UF on March 18, moving past Teddy Dupay as his career total reached 192.

- **Lee Humphrey's** offense came to life in the six games he started in Matt Walsh's absence..Humphrey hit 5-of-11 shots from the floor and 3-of-8 three-point attempts for a career-high 15 points against Florida State, then added 10 points and hit 3-of-4 attempts from beyond the arc against Arkansas...Humphrey had a successful homecoming on Feb. 12, dropping eight points and two three-pointers on Tennessee...Of his 52 total baskets, 37 were three-pointers (71.2 percent).



- **Corey Brewer** got the starting nod in the season opener and caused havoc on the defensive end...He tied the UF freshman opening night record for steals with five and was instrumental in the Gators scoring the first 10 points of the second half...Brewer also finished 3-of-5 from the floor with nine points, including a spectacular three-point play in the first half...Brewer led the Gators with 1.4 steals per game and also added four against Providence...During a key run in the second half, he stripped All-American Ryan Gomes and took the ball to the basket where he scored and got Gomes to foul him.

- Brewer set a career-high with 17 points against Mississippi State in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals, connecting on 7-of-12 shots from the floor and 3-of-5 from beyond the arc...He followed that with 10 points and eight rebounds against Alabama in the semifinals...Five of his seven double-figure scoring games came against SEC teams...He finished fourth on the team in scoring at 7.5 points per game and is hit 51.5 percent from the floor...Always in the right place at the right time, 49 of his 110 total rebounds (44.5 percent) came on the offensive end...Brewer pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds at Tennessee on Feb. 12, five offensive and five defensive.

- **Al Horford** moved into the starting rotation against Georgia Southern on Dec. 19 and responded with his first double-figure scoring game, posting 10 points on 5-of-5 shooting and four rebounds...Horford followed that with his first career double-double against Eastern Kentucky, scoring 14 points while adding 12 rebounds...Against Louisville, Horford stepped it up another notch, grabbing seven rebounds, including four offensive, all of which came in the second half when the Gators made a furious comeback bid.

- Horford grabbed national attention on Feb. 5 when he scored 14 points and added a career-high 18 rebounds (nine offensive) in the Gators' 31-point rout of Alabama...The 18 rebounds were the second most by a UF freshman (record is 21 by Eugene McDowell) and the fourth most in the history of the O'Connell Center, tying him, ironically, with his father Tito Horford among other people...It was the most rebounds by a Gator since Mike Miller pulled down 18 against Kentucky on Feb. 8, 2000.

- On the season Horford blocked 51 shots, the fourth highest single season total in UF history and the highest since Andrew DeClercq also had 51 in 1993-94...He had a UF freshman record seven blocks against Ole Miss on Feb. 16, the second highest total in UF history overall.

- **Adrian Moss** gave the Gators a tremendous presence against Jacksonville, turning in 10 rebounds, including six offensive...It was the second double-figure rebounding game of his career and one off his career-high of 11 against FAMU last year...Moss was effective on the offensive glass as 25 of his 54 total rebounds have been offensive (46.3)...He missed the Sam Houston and Eastern Kentucky games with back spasms but returned against Florida State and played in the first two SEC games before the injury sidelined him again on Jan. 15...He returned to action on Feb. 12 against Tennessee, scoring two points in three minutes of play and has played in each game since...He had three rebounds and two points and was extremely instrumental defensively in the Gators' 17-point comeback against South Carolina on Feb. 27...He had six points and seven rebounds against Mississippi State in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals.

- **Chris Richard** stepped up big-time down the stretch in 2004-05, posting nine points and five rebounds against South Carolina on Jan. 29 before coming up with a seven-rebound effort against Alabama on Feb. 5...He gave a tremendous effort in the SEC title game, posting six points and six rebounds and was a presence on the offensive glass, critical in UF getting 14 second-chance points.

- Richard came up with four blocks against Ohio and was third on the Gators in blocked shots with 20.

- Richard came up huge against Florida Atlantic with 11 points and six rebounds while hitting 5-of-6 shots on the night...Richard also blocked three shots and dished out two assists...His 11 points was one short of his career high...Richard matched his career-high with eight rebounds against Georgia Southern and is hit 61.6 percent from the floor this season and was been first off the bench four of the last 13 games.

- **Taurean Green** played a tremendous role off the bench and was the Gators' first sub in 12 times...He finished third on the team in assists at 2.2 per game...He took his game to another level against Florida Atlantic, dishing out eight assists and then matched it against Eastern Kentucky on Dec. 22...Green got into double figures for the first time against Providence, scoring 13 points on 3-of-4 shooting while going 6-of-6 from the line...Green averaged 18.9 minutes per game, most of any player off the bench.

- **Joakim Noah** brought the O'Dome to life against Florida Atlantic in his first outing as a Gator...Noah posted one of the most interesting lines of the night, finishing with 11 points and nine rebounds in just 10 minutes of play...Noah hit 5-of-6 shots from the floor...He came up with a career-high 14 points in the Gators' victory over Georgia Southern on Dec. 19, hitting 3-of-4 shots and more impressively, 8-of-9 free throw attempts and followed it with seven points and eight rebounds against Eastern Kentucky...A tremendous shot-blocking presence, Noah was fourth on the team in blocks with 19 and had four against South Carolina and three at Kentucky...He hit 60.0 percent from the floor.

- **Cornelius Ingram** made the most of his opportunities in 2004-05 and against Eastern Kentucky he came to life with a career-high nine points on 4-of-8 shooting...He saw 6.6 minutes per game and against Florida A&M on Nov. 30, even saw time at the point when Taurean Green injured his ankle.

- Florida held Jacksonville to just 59 points, the second lowest opening night defensive effort under a Billy Donovan-coached team at UF and followed that by holding Florida Atlantic to 45...The Gators held Georgia to 47 points including just 15 in the first half, the lowest first half total in an SEC game under Billy Donovan...Florida followed that in the rematch on March 2 by holding the Bulldogs to 38 points including 13 in the second half, both SEC lows under Donovan...The Gators held Alabama, the league's No. 2 scoring team to just 54 points on Feb. 5 and Ole Miss to just 53 on Feb. 16...Florida held 12 of 32 opponents to 60 points or less and held opponents to 63.1 points per game overall on the season...The Gators held their opponents under 55 points 11 times...Florida held only six of 31 opponents under 60 points in 2003-04...Averaging 76.2 points per game on the offensive end, UF

had a scoring margin of 13.1 points per contest to lead the SEC.

- The Gators grabbed a season-high 17 steals against Eastern Kentucky, the highest total by a UF team since registering 18 against High Point on Dec. 18, 2001...UF has had 10+ steals on nine occasions in 2004-05 and averaged 7.1 per contest, an improvement over 2003-04 when they averaged 6.5 per game.

### gators depth significantly improved

- The University of Florida has used at least 11 players 14 times and used 10 players against Florida State, Arkansas and Auburn even when injury set in to Matt Walsh, a sign of improved depth and better ability to handle injury...The Gators were still able to throw nine bodies out there when Adrian Moss and Walsh both missed the Vanderbilt game...Thirteen different players scored for the Gators in their wins over Stetson on Dec. 8, and Georgia Southern on Dec. 19 while all 12 scored against Eastern Kentucky on Dec. 22...At least nine players have scored in 17 of the 32 games in 2004-05.

### gators get contributions off the bench

- The Gators are getting much greater contributions off the bench through the early stages of this season, receiving 18.0 points per game off the bench and have outscored the opponent's bench in all but 12 games...Last year the Gators got only 15.4 points per game off

- The Gators had a solid blend of geographic diversity of the 2004-05 roster, as eight of the 10 scholarship athletes were from areas outside of Florida...David Lee is from Missouri, Adrian Moss from Texas, Anthony Roberson from Michigan, Matt Walsh from Pennsylvania, Lee Humphrey and Corey Brewer from Tennessee, Al Horford went to high school in Michigan, but hails from the Dominican Republic and Joakim Noah is from New York but has lived in France and Guadeloupe. Only Chris Richard and Taurean Green are from Florida.

- Newcomers Taurean Green, Joakim Noah and Al Horford all came to Florida with strong athletic lineage... Green is the son of former NBA player and UNLV standout Sidney Green, who was the head coach of Florida Atlantic University, the Gators' opponent in its home opener on Nov. 23 ...Florida head coach Billy Donovan played with Sidney briefly in the NBA as a member of the New York Knicks...Noah is the son of flamboyant former tennis star Yannick Noah, the 1983 French Open champion... Horford is the son of former NBA player Tito Horford... Ironically, Donovan had the best game of his collegiate career against Horford's Miami Hurricanes, as he dropped 38 points in a Providence win in South Florida.

## walsh returns to lineup

• Recovering much faster than the original four-to-six weeks he was diagnosed to be out, Matt Walsh returned to the Gators' lineup on Jan. 19 against Tennessee seeing 13 minutes of play off the bench...Walsh suffered a syndesmotic ankle sprain of his left ankle and missed four games, the first four games he missed in his career...Walsh had started all 74 previous games dating back to opening night of his freshmen season in 2002... Walsh suffered the injury on Dec. 30 and returned to practice on Jan. 17.

## lee, roberston and walsh on naismith watch list

• The University of Florida men's basketball team was well represented on the Naismith Award Preseason Watch List, as the Gators landed three members on the 50-man list, announced on Nov. 5...David Lee, Anthony Roberson and Matt Walsh each earned a spot on the Naismith Preseason Watch List as Florida joined Arizona, Duke and North Carolina as the only schools with three members... After having two members on the preseason list each of the past three years, it marks the first time Florida has ever had three members on the squad... The Top 50 list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, comprised of leading basketball journalists, coaches and administrators from around the country.

## roberston, walsh reach 1,000 points

• Anthony Roberson became the 36th member of Florida's 1,000-point club and the eighth under Billy Donovan, doing so with a three-pointer mid-way through the Miami game on Dec. 4... Roberson did so in 68 games, the 10th fastest player to reach 1,000 points in UF history and the fastest since 1986...Matt Walsh joined Roberson as the 37th member of the UF 1,000-point club on Dec. 19 against Georgia Southern, also doing so on a three-pointer....The last time two Florida players reached 1,000 points in the same season was in 2001-02 when Brett Nelson and Matt Bonner both reached the mark...Combined with David Lee, the Gators have three 1,000-point scorers on the same roster for the first time since 2001-02 when Nelson, Bonner and Udonis Haslem were all on the same roster.

## success against the sec west

• Florida has gone 32-10 (.762) against the SEC West over the past seven regular seasons, including 6-0 in three of the previous five seasons...Billy Donovan is 23-4 all-time against the SEC West at the O'Dome, with only losses to LSU in 1998 and 2004, Ole Miss in 1999 and Mississippi State in 2004...Florida has gone 4-2 against the West each of the past two yers, beating Arkansas, Alabama, Auburn and Ole Miss while losing to Mississippi State and LSU both years.

## the polls

• Florida had been ranked a school-record 99 consecutive weeks in the coaches' poll and a school-record 94 consecutive weeks in the *Associated Press* polls, the second longest streak in the nation until dropping out on Feb. 16, 2004...The Gators had been ranked since Feb. 8, 1999...Florida was ranked to begin the 2004-05 season in both polls, the sixth straight year in the preseason polls...The Gators had been ranked in all of the preseason and regular season polls in both the Associated Press and Coaches until Dec. 6...Florida returned to the Coaches poll for one week on Feb. 14, entering at No. 24 and then re-entered on March 7.

• Florida had been ranked in the AP poll just 42 times in school history before Donovan took over as head coach...UF has been ranked 98 times in the AP poll under Donovan...UF has appeared in the top 10 of the AP poll 73 times and in the top five 19 times.

• Florida has reached No. 1 in the nation in both major polls in both 2002-03 and 2003-04, the only times in school history the Gators have ever been ranked No. 1.

• Florida has averaged 24 wins per year during the past six seasons, having won 144 games over that stretch (2000-05)...The Gators are 144-51 over the past six seasons (.738).

• UF is **117-16 during the last five-plus seasons** when it gets 15-plus assists in a game (47-41 when it gets less than 15 assists)...Florida recorded 24 assists on its 32 field goals in its victory over Ole Miss on Feb. 16.

• UF has 24 100-point games under Donovan in 285 games or one every 11.9 games, including a 100-68 victory over Georgia Southern on Dec. 19...Donovan has 35 century scoring games in his 340 career games or one every 9.7.

• UF has made a three pointer in a school-record 428 consecutive games (dating back to Jan. 11, 1992 vs. Kentucky).

• Florida scored 80+ points on 16 occasions in 2004-05, winning each time.

• The Gators won 14 of their 24 games in 2004-05 by 15+ points.

## **gator defense**

- Florida opened the NCAA Tournament by holding Ohio to just 19 field goals while forcing 20 turnovers...The Gators got steals on 11 of them and turned the 20 turnovers into 27 points, or 40.3 percent of their total points on the afternoon.
- The Gators held Georgia to just 38 points on March 2, the lowest total by a Billy Donovan-coached team in SEC play...The Gators limited the Bulldogs to just 13 points in the second half and 12 total field goals on the evening...The Gators limited the Bulldogs to just 24.5 percent from the floor and 17.6 percent from three-point range.
- Florida held Kentucky to just 52 points and forced the Wildcats into 17 turnovers on March 6 and followed that by holding the Cats to 53 points in their rematch in the SEC Tournament final a week later.
- Florida held Alabama and Kentucky to a combined 5-of-38 from three-point range in the SEC Tournament, 13.2 percent.
- The Gators held South Carolina to two field goals in the final 10 minutes of the game, erasing a 17-points deficit while out-scoring the Gamecocks 37-19 over the final 16 minutes.

- Florida opened the season with a disruptive performance defensively against Jacksonville...The Gators forced 24 turnovers while limiting the Dolphins to just 20 field goals.
- UF held Jacksonville to just two field goals over the final 12:28 of the first half, turning a three-point deficit into an 11-point advantage heading into the locker room.
- Florida followed that outing with an even more impressive showing against Florida Atlantic, limiting the Owls to 28.8 percent from the floor, forcing 23 turnovers and yielding just 17 field goals.
- Florida held Florida A&M to just 15 total field goals while forcing 17 turnovers.
- The Gators held Eastern Kentucky to just 31.8 percent shooting, including 27.3 percent and just 19 points in the first half...UF forced 22 turnovers, getting steals on 17 of their turnovers...The Gators limited ECU to just 2-15 from three-point range.

## **walsh wins third straight Orange Bowl MVP**

- Matt Walsh has found American Airlines Arena to be the friendliest of confines through his first three seasons as a Gator, as he has earned MVP honors at the Orange Bowl Classic against a Big East team in each of his first three trips to Miami...Walsh had a 33-point, 11-rebound effort against Miami in 2002, an Orange Bowl Classic record for points...He followed that with a 17-point, eight-rebound showing against West Virginia last season...On Nov. 27 he won his third straight Orange Bowl Classic MVP award, torching Providence for 21 points on 7-of-11 shooting...He is averaging 23.7 points, 6.7 rebounds and has hit 24-of-24 free throw attempts in his Orange Bowl career...Walsh and former Gator great Udonis Haslem are the only three-time MVPs.

## **gators land three on coaches' preseason all-sec squad**

- The Southeastern Conference unveiled its first annual men's basketball coaches' preseason All-SEC team on Oct. 21 with the University of Florida leading the way with three First Team selections... Florida was the only team to have multiple First Team selections, while they tied with Alabama and Tennessee for most overall selections with its three members...Returning First Team All-SEC point guard Anthony Roberson was one of only two unanimous selections, with Lawrence Roberts of Mississippi State being the other...Forward David Lee and guard Matt Walsh, both All-SEC selections a year ago, each were selected for the First Team as well.

## **november success**

- After four consecutive wins to open the season, the Gators improved to 30-4 in the month of November under Billy Donovan and were perfect in the month for the second straight year...The Gators have won seven straight and 10 of their last 11 overall in

November.

### **bahamas trip postponed**

- The Gators began practice on Aug. 23 for what they thought would be a preseason tour of the Bahamas in which they were to play three games over a two-day stretch, Sept. 4-5...Due to the effects of Hurricane Frances, however, the trip was postponed (to a make-up date sometime after this season)...The Gators did get eight practices in before the trip was officially postponed.

### **midnight madness**

- Gator fans celebrated the beginning of basketball season at the University of Florida's annual Midnight Madness on Oct. 15. A crowd of 9,417 fans witnessed the Midnight Madness activities on Oct. 15 in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. Fans were treated to performances from special celebrity and former American Idol contestant William Hung who performed three songs on the evening. As the clock struck midnight the Gator women's basketball team was introduced and the men's squad followed soon after. In a mixed three-point shootout, the combo of Anthony Roberson and Tamia Williams edged Matt Walsh and Tashia Morehead. In the annual slam dunk contest, defending champion David Lee was edged by guest entrant Mike Morrison, the SEC high jump champion for Florida's track and field team. Despite a dunk in which William Hung fed Lee with a bounce pass, Morrison won on a dunk where he leapt from the free throw line.

## the gators at home

• UF is 94-14 (.870) in the O'Connell Center during the last six-plus years and 103-18 (.851) during the last seven-plus seasons...Overall, Donovan is 111-24 (.822) in the O'Dome...UF has put together win streaks of 19, 13, 12, 12 and 11 under Donovan.

• UF's average margin of victory at home this year 20.8 points per game as the Gators won 11+ home games for the eighth straight season.

• UF averaged over 10,000 fans for the fifth straight year, including a building record 12,602 fans in the Gators' 53-52 victory over third-ranked Kentucky.

• Florida attendance is up over 4,600 since Donovan's first year.

• Florida is 49-3 vs. non-conference opponents in the O'Dome over the last seven seasons and did not lose a home non-conference game over a stretch of five consecutive seasons (1999-2003).

• To follow up the \$8.1 million face lift the O'Dome received in the summer of 1998, another \$2.5 million construction project was completed in 2001. All four gates and lobby areas were renovated and the third level seating areas added concession stands and restrooms. State of the art Daktronics scoreboards and a brand new \$80,000 hardwood floor were also added at the end of October 2000.

• A \$10 million state-of-the-art private basketball practice facility opened in October 2001. The two-story 47,505 square foot facility includes multiple practice gyms, a training room, weight room, locker room, coaches' offices, conference rooms, equipment room, team lounge area and film/video rooms with theatre style seating.

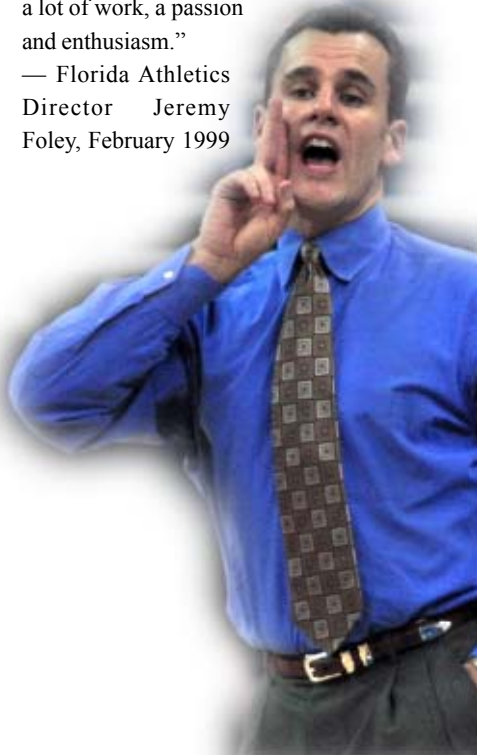

# billy donovan

“What UK’s basketball bluebloods need to understand is this: Billy Donovan doesn’t need to go to Kentucky if he wants to coach a powerhouse program. He’s built one at Florida.”

He believes it helped hold the team together when its SEC record was 1-3 and postseason outlook looked bleak.”

It was going to take a lot of work, a passion and enthusiasm.”

For those who have followed Billy Donovan’s career it should come as no surprise that he has made Florida basketball a winner.

Under Donovan, Florida has set a school record with eight straight post-season appearances, including seven straight NCAA Tournament bids. UF made the school’s first-ever appearance in the National Championship game in 2000 and also made back-to-back Sweet 16 appearances for the first time in school history in 1999 and 2000. Donovan is already the winningest NCAA Tournament coach in UF history and his 10 NCAA Tournament wins surpasses the total of seven in school history before his arrival.

After the school had just one Southeastern Conference Championship in 77 seasons prior to his arrival, Donovan has tallied two SEC titles (2000 and 2001). Florida and Kentucky are the only two SEC schools to capture consecutive league crowns in the past 28 years. He led the Gators to their first SEC Tournament title in 2004-05.

Florida’s 144 wins during the past five-plus years is the best such stretch in school history. After only being ranked in the national polls 42 times prior to Donovan’s arrival, UF had been ranked a school-record 94 consecutive weeks in the Associated Press poll and 99 weeks by the ESPN/USA Today poll before falling out on Feb. 16 of last year. The Gators were in both preseason polls this season and had been ranked until Dec. 6 this season before returning to the Coaches poll for a week on Feb. 14 and then re-entering on March 7.

His winning percentage at UF (.677) is the best among all Gator coaches who spent more than one season at UF and he reached the 100-victory mark at UF quicker than any coach in school history, needing just 154 games to reach the century plateau. His current total of 193 wins in his first eight-plus seasons is already good enough for second on the UF all-time coaching victory list, while he reached 200 career wins on Feb. 25, 2004 vs. South Carolina.

Donovan’s teams have knocked off 32 ranked opponents during his tenure. UF has won 23 of its last 39 meetings with ranked teams.

Donovan’s squads have led the SEC in a statistical category 23 times, including 20 offensive categories. Twelve of his players have captured All-League honors and nine of his freshmen have been recognized. Three of Donovan’s players have been first round draft picks in the NBA Draft, after the school boasted only two before his arrival, and he has inked nine McDonald’s All-Americans after UF had just three prior to his arrival. The fans are taking notice, attendance is up nearly 5,000 since Donovan’s arrival.
