

COACH BABE McCARTHY

Mississippi State's super salesman, Babe McCarthy, is

a man who wastes little time in getting a job done.

When McCarthy took over the Mississippi State coaching duties seven years ago the Bulldogs' basketball fortunes were at a low ebb.

McCarthy, who wasn't even in coaching when given the job as head coach of the Southeastern Conference Bulldogs, took the job with the understanding "produce or else."

To say Babe McCarthy has produced is an understate-

ment.

The personable 39-year-old native of Baldwyn has led State to 128 victories against only 46 defeats, a .736 winning percentage. Even more important is the three SEC basketball championships that have come to Mississippi State in the past four years.

McCarthy's 1961-62 club finished the season with the best regular-season record of any major college basketball team in America, 24 victories against a single loss. Both wire service polls ranked the Bulldogs fourth in the national polls.

One of the victories was a 49-44 thriller over Kentucky on the Wildcats home floor in Lexington. It marked the third time in seven meetings for McCarthy's teams to defeat Kentucky.

For guiding the '61-'62 team to a co-championship with the Wildcats (each team had a 13-1 conference record) Mc-Carthy was chosen SEC "Coach of the Year" for the third time.

He was runnerup in the voting on another occasion.

With Bailey Howell, the fabulous All-American in the lineup, it was no surprise the 1958-59 Mississippi State team won the SEC crown, finishing with a 24-1 record, same as this past season.

McCarthy, a former World War II transport pilot, who never played a single college basketball game, began his coaching career at his hometown, Baldwyn, Miss., in 1947, turning out a state championship team his first season.


He coached at Baldwyn three seasons before being recalled to active duty during the Korean conflict. While serving his second hitch in the service Babe coached an Air Force team at Memphis, Tenn., his team finishing third in the worldwide Air Force Tournament.

After being discharged McCarthy accepted a coaching job at Tupelo, Miss., Junior High School where he coached both football and basketball and officiated SEC basketball

The affable McCarthy left this job to take a position with an oil company in Clarksdale, Miss., where he continued to serve as a basketball official until taking over at

Mississippi State in July, 1955.

McCarthy, who is married and the father of two sons, Jim, 14, and Tim, 12, holds a Master's Degree from Mississippi State.



JERRY SIMMONS Assistant Coach

Born in Columbia, Simmons graduated from high school at Brookhaven, Miss. He entered Mississippi State in 1948 and won SEC hurdle events in 1951–52. Played freshman basketball at State.

Joined Bulldog staff as track coach, Feb. 1953. Later appointed ticket manager and took over coaching of freshman basketball squad when Babe McCarthy joined Mississippi State

athletic staff.


During his five years as freshman coach the Bulldog yearlings won 84 games, lost just 14. This is his third season as varisity assistant and chief scout. His track team won the SEC title last May and his cross country teams have won SEC titles three consecutive years.

No. 22 DOUG HUTTON

5-10 Guard - Junior Clinton, Miss.

A graduate of the 1960-61 freshman team, Hutton averaged 22 points for State's yearling team, which has a 17-4 season record.

Last year he averaged 9.5 and was often referred to as the "best No. 6 man in college basketball." He is the lone newcomer in the starting lineup, replacing Jack Berkshire, last year's captain.

Quick as a cat, Hutton is a dangerous shooter and a deft ball hawk. He has the distinction of performing on two SEC championship teams last season, basketball and track. He ran a leg on State's winning 440 relay team and finished third in the broad jump.

An All-State performer in high school, Hutton led Clinton to the state A-AA title, scoring 48 points in the semi-finals of the state tournament for a new individual game scoring mark. He broke his own record the next night in the finals, scoring 54 points as his Clinton team whipped Florence for the A-AA crown. Played in Mississippi All-Star game. High school coach Billy Ray Smith.




No. 31 LARRY LEE

6-0 Guard - Sophomore Jackson, Miss.

A fine shooter, Lee teamed with Jackie Wofford at guard on last year's frosh team. He is majoring in Business Administration.




No. 32 JACKIE WOFFORD

6-0 Guard - Sophomore Starkville, Miss.

Nicknamed "Cooter," Jackie was the sparkp'ug of Starkville's A-AA state clampions two years ago. Averaging 18 points per game, Wofford made All-Little Ten Conference, All-Mississippi, honorable mention All-American and played in Mississippi All-Star game.

Last year Wofford was the playmaker for the freshman team and the second leading scorer with a 14 point average. He also was a fine baseball player in high school. His high school coach was Clyde Muse. He is majoring in Physical Education.

6-5 Forward - Senior Benton, Ky.



An able rebounder and a fine all-round performer, Gold is the steady, dependable type. Some ob-

servers regard Gold as the Most Valuable player on State's talent-rich squad.


No. 34 DON POSEY

Known as "Goose" to his teammates, Posey is another graduate of last year's freshman team. And his record is even more outstanding when you consider he missed his entire senior year with a knee injury.

His junior year in high school under Coach John Derhammer, Don scored at a pace of 29 points a game and made All-Delta Valley Confer-

ence. Also as a junior at Indianola Don set the Mississippi high jump mark of 6' 5 1/2". He helped lead the State frosh to an unofficial SEC track crown last May. He is majoring in Physical Education.



No. 41 W. D. STROUD

6-1 Guard - Senior Forest, Miss.

The "Most Valuable Player" in the Southeastern Conference I as t season (AP and Coach & Athlete Magazine), Stroud was named on several All-American second teams. He was a first team All-SEC choice of the coaches and the AP.

Named to third All-SEC team, Also All-SEC Sophomore team in 1960-61. Had a 12.4 average as

a sophomore. His average last season was 15.9.


He set a new school free throw percentage mark of .847 (116 of 137), a figure that ranked high nationally. He is a great clutch performer, best when under extreme pressure. Was responsible for two victories last season on last second shots.

Stroud was also named "Most Valuable Player" in the 1961 Sugar Bowl Basketball Tournament. His best shot is a jump shot.

Played with 1959-60 frosh team that averaged 98.4 in winning 21 games without defeat. Stroud, who also has a fine two hand set shot, averaged 13.3 as a freshman.


No. 42 BILLY ANDERTON

One of seven returning letterimen from the 1961-62 SEC cochampionship team, Nichols is regarded as the No. 3 guard (behind Stroud and Hutton).


A fine defensive performer, Nichols is also an accurate shooter.

A tremendously aggressive player, Mitchell is a fine rebounder as well as a top scoring threat.


This is his third year as a regular,

Moved into starting lineup midway of past season and was perhaps most improved player on squad at season end.


A strong rebounder, Shows has a good hook shot.

6-5 Forward - Junior Metropolis, III.


Played first half of last season as starting center before being side-lined by illness. Likely will divide playing time between forward and post this time around. He is a dangerous outside shooter.






