COACH BABE McCARTHY

James Harrison McCarthy has made winning Southeastern Conference championships a habit at Mississippi State.

The 40-year-old McCarthy (born Oct. 1, 1923) has directed the Bulldogs to three consecutive SEC basketball titles and four championships in the last five years.

When McCarthy took over the Mississippi State coaching duties nine years ago the Bulldogs basketball fortunes were at a low ebb.

McCarthy, who wasn't even in coaching when given the opportunity to coach Mississippi State by the late C. R. (Dudy) Noble, longtime director of athletics, took the job with the understanding, "Produce, or else."

To say McCarthy has produced is a vast understatement.

The personable native of Baldwyn, Miss., has led State to 150 victories against just 52 losses in eight seasons, a .742 winning percentage.

Even more important is the four SEC championships that have come to Mississippi State in the past five years. Besides Kentucky, no other SEC team has ever won three SEC basketball titles in succession.

State's 1962-63 team completed the regular season with a 21-5 overall record, finishing sixth in the final national polls.

The Bulldogs captured their fourth SEC crown with a 12-2 record. One of the victories was a 56-52 win over Kentucky, the fourth time McCarthy's teams have whipped an Adolph Rupp coached team in eight meetings.

As a climax to their fine campaign the Bulldogs participated in their first NCAA Basketball Tournament (they had declined the bid on three previous occasions), taking part in the Mid-East Regionals in the Michigan State Field House at East Lansing, Mich.

Loyola of Chicago, who went on to capture the National Championship at the NCAA finals in Louisville, Ky., a week later, defeated the gallant Bulldogs, 61-51, in a first-round game. McCarthy's SEC champs took the Mid-East consolation honors, defeating Bowling Green of Ohio, 65-60. For guidinghis '62-'63 team to the NCAA playoffs, McCarthy

was named Coach of the Year in the Southeast by several publications, an honor that has come his way on several previous occasions. He first was named SEC Coach of the Year in 1956-57, his second season at State.

McCarthy, a former World War II transport pilot, who never played a single college basketball game, began his coaching career at his hometown, Baldwyn, Miss., in 1947, turning out a state championship team his very first season. He coached Baldwyn three seasons before being recalled to

active duty during the Korean conflict. While serving his second hitch in the service Babe coached an Air Force team at Memphis, Tenn., to a third place finish in the world-wide Air Force Tournament.


After being discharged McCarthy accepted a coaching job at Tupelo, Miss., Junior High School where he coached both foot-ball and basketball and began officiating SEC basketball games.

The affable McCarthy left this job to take a position with an oil company in Clarksdale, Miss., where he continued to serve as a basketball official until taking over at Mississippi State in July, 1955.

At State McCarthy has coached three All-Americans – Jim Ashmore (1956–57), Bailey Howell (1958–59) and W. D. (Red) Stroud (1962–63). Howell is now one of the top stars in the

NBL, playing for the Detroit Pistons. Two of McCarthy's teams have won all but one game, the '58-'59 club led by Howell had a 24-1 record, while the 1961-62 guintet also had a 24-1 mark. His only losing year was a 12-13 finish in 1959-60.

McCarthy, who is married and the father of two sons, Jim, 15, and Tim, 13, holds a Master's Degree from MSU.



JERRY SIMMONS Assistant Coach

Born in Columbia, Simmons graduated from high school at Brookhaven, Miss. He entered Mississippi State in 1948 and won SEC hurdle championships in 1951-52. Played freshman basketball at State.

Joined Bulldog staff as track coach, Feb. 1953. Later ap-pointed ticket manager and took over coaching of freshman basket-ball squad when Babe McCarhty joined Mississippi State athletic staff.

During five seasons as freshman coach the Bulldog yearlings won 84 games, lost just 14. This is his fourth season as varsity assistant and chief scout. McCarthy terms Simmons, "The best assistant coach in the country, my right hand." Jerry's track team won the SEC title in 1962. His cross

country teams have won four SEC crowns.

No. 22 DOUG HUTTON

5-10 Guard - Senior Clinton, Miss.

One of two holdover regulars from last year's SEC championship team. Was named on the "small All-America" team (players under 5-10) this past campaign. He was State's fourth-ranking scorer with 10.4 average.

A graduate of the 1960-61 freshman team, Hutton averaged 22 points for State's yearlingteam, which had a 17-4 record.

As a Sophomore he averaged 9.5 and was often referred to as the "best No. 6 man in college basketball."

Quick as a cat, Hutton is a dangerous shooter and a deft ball hawk. He has the distinction of playing on two SEC championshi basketball teams and a SEC track championship team. In track he is a broad jumper and a sprinter.

A pitcher on the State baseball team, Hutton had a 5-0 hurling record in 1963.

An All-State performer in high school, Hutton led Clinton to the state A-AA title, scoring 48 points in the semi-finals of the state tournament for a new individual game scoring mark. He broke his own record the next night in the finals, scoring 54 points as his Clinton team defeated Florence for the title. Played in Mississippi All-Star game. High school coach Billy Ray Smith.

No. 31 LARRY CARTEE

6-1 Guard - Sophomore Reidland, Ky.

A guard-forward on the 1962-63 frosh club, Cartee was the yearlings second leading scorer with a 14 point average.

At Reidland he was an All-Regional performer under Coach Erwin Johnston. Averaged 20.5 per game as Reidland captured District II championship and finished as runnerup in Region 1. CTATA

Also a fine baseball player, Cartee played shortstop and batted .340.

Saw limited duty with last year's championship outfit, averaging 1.4 points in eight games.

Nicknamed "Cooter," Jackie was the sparkplug of Starkville's A-AA state champions two years ago. Averaging 18 points per game, Wofford made All-Little Ten Conference, All-Mississippi, honorable mention All-American and played in Mississippi All-Star game.



As a freshman, Wofford was valuable as a playmaker and was the team's second high scorer with a 14 point average. He was also a fine baseball player in high school. His high school coach was Clyde Muse. He is majoring in Education.

Another member of last season's frosh squad, Jim Earl Taylor was a 13.3 scorerat forward and was the team's leading rebounder. He has improved steadily since his arrival and his presence should be felt in the future.

Under Coach Richard McGrew, Taylor was All-Chicago Area his senior year, averaging some 18 points per contest. He is originally a Mis-


sissippian, having moved to Illinois after entering grade school.

6-3 Forward - Junior Indianola, Miss.


A returning member of last year's SEC title-winning squad, Posey saw duty in 17 games, averaging 2.0 points a game.

His junior year in high school under Coach John Derhammer, Don scored at a pace of 29 points a game and made All-Delta Valley Conference. Also as a junior at Indianola, Don set the Mississippi high jump mark of 6'5 1/2". He helped lead the State frosh to an unofficial SEC championship two years ago and last year was a consistent point-getter for the varsity. He is an Education major

The 23 point average he amassed last year was the top freshman average since All-American Bailey Howell started his career.

Under Coach John D. Seals, Smith won All-State honors in Kentucky, averaging 33 points his senior year while leading Lerose to the Kentucky District 56 championship. His average was the top mark in Kentucky prep circles two years ago.

No. 42 BILL ANDERTON

6-3 Guard - Junior Florence, Miss.

Saw limited duty with last year's SEC champions, averaging 1.4 points in 14 games.

The leading scorer on the 1961-62 yearling team with a 15 point average, Anderton is one of rhe top shooters on the current State edition.

Played high school basketball at Florence under former State star Coyt Vance, averaging 25 points a game while leading his team to the Little Dixie championship. He was selected twice to the Little Dixie All-Conference team.

Nicknamed "Wild Bill" or "Curly", Anderton played in the Mississippi All-Star game following his senior year. He is an Education major.

No. 43 AUBREY NICHOLS


6-1 Guard - Senior New Hope, Miss.


No. 45 HOWARD HEMPHILL

6-8 Center - Sophomore Chula Vista, Calif.


Played frosh ball two years ago, was held out of action this past season.


One of the State tri-captains. He also sees action at a forward slot.
