Bulldogs Complete Remarkable Turnaround Season

BOUNCING BACK: It began with Butler relegated to second division status in the BIG EAST. It ended with the Bulldogs in the Round of 32 in the 2015 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. In between, the Bulldogs engineered one of the most remarkable turnarounds in BIG EAST conference history. Butler, coming off a 14-17 campaign and a ninth place finish in the conference, was picked to tie for seventh place in the annual preseason poll of BIG EAST coaches. Then, right before the start of the season, head coach Brandon Miller requested and was granted a medical leave of absence. Under the direction of interim head coach Chris Holtmann, the Bulldogs jumped out to a 10-3 start, including a victory over #5/6 North Carolina and a third place finish in the rugged Battle 4 Atlantis. That momentum helped spark Butler to four more "Top 25" wins, a tie for second place in the BIG EAST and a No. 6 seed in the 2015 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The Bulldogs posted a win over Texas, 56-48, in the second round of the national tournament, before falling to #8 Notre Dame, 67-64 in overtime, in the round of 32. Butler finished the season with a 23-11 record, matching the 11th-highest single season win total in school history. Holtmann, who was named Butler's permanent head coach in January, became just the third coach in school history to lead the Bulldogs to the NCAA Tournament in his first season. Butler's climb from 4-14 in the BIG EAST in 2013-14 to 12-6 in the conference this season tied the fourth-best turnaround (+8) in BIG EAST history!

Butler recorded its 20th NCAA Tournament victory in 2014-15.

BONUS PLAY: The Bulldogs advanced to post-season play for the 16th time in 19 years with their 2014-15 NCAA bid. Butler earned berths in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship in 1997, 1998, 2000, 2001, 2003, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013 and 2015, and to the National Invitation Tournament in 1999, 2002 and 2006. In 2012, the Bulldogs advanced to the semifinals of the College Basketball

TOP TWENTY: The 2014-15 Bulldogs became the 20th Butler team to record 20 victories in a season with a win over Marquette on Feb. 25. Butler has won at least 20 games in nine of the past 10 campaigns, including a school-record 33 victories in 2009-10. **Chris Holtmann** became the fourth head coach in Butler history to win 20 games in his first season.

RANKING WINS: Butler's five wins against teams ranked in the "Top 25" in 2014-15 matched the most "Top 25" wins in school history. The Bulldogs defeated #5/6 North Carolina at the Battle 4 Atlantis and picked up victories over #15/17 St. John's, #21 Seton Hall, #24 Seton Hall and #24/23 Providence during the BIG EAST season. The five ranked wins tied the 2009-10 Butler team, which defeated #13 Ohio State, #25 UTEP, #4 Syracuse, #7 Kansas State and #13 Michigan State on the way to the national championship game.

Butler was 5-4 against teams ranked in the "Top 25" in 2014-15.

POLLING DATA: The Bulldogs ended the season with a No. 24 national ranking in the Associated Press National Poll and a No. 23 national rank in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Butler, which began the season without a mention in either national poll, was among teams receiving votes or ranked in the "Top 25" in 16 of the 17 weeks since Dec. 1. The Bulldogs climbed as high as No. 15 (Dec. 8) in the A.P. poll and No. 18 (Feb. 9) in the USA Today poll.

Butler has been ranked in the "Top 25" in seven of the past nine seasons.

NCAA RECAP: Butler was knocking at the door of the NCAA "Sweet 16" in its third round game against Notre Dame, but three attempts for the win in the closing seconds of regulation came up short and the Bulldogs wound up falling in overtime. With the game tied at 59-59, Butler held the ball for the final possession. Junior Roosevelt Jones missed a lay-up with five seconds remaining, but a turnover returned the ball to the Bulldogs. Junior Kellen Dunham had a shot blocked out of bounds with 0:00.6 left, and senior Kameron Woods came up short on a tip attempt at the buzzer. The Fighting Irish jumped in front in the overtime period and held on behind a couple of key three-point field goals. Two nights earlier, Butler used a strong defense and a solid performance at the free throw line to defeat Texas, 56-48, and advance to the third round the Tournament. The Bulldogs, who led for 32 minutes of the game, secured the win with a 12-5 run in the final two minutes of the game. Dunham started the decisive run with a free throw and a three-point field goal. The Bulldogs then held on by hitting eight of 10 at the charity stripe in the final minute. Butler converted only five field goals in the second half, but hit 19 of 26 free throw attempts in the final 20 minutes to secure the victory. The Bulldogs held Texas to its lowest scoring output of the season.

POINTING UP: Butler scoring leader Kellen Dunham, who led all players with 20 points in the Butler-Texas game, boosted his season scoring total to 561 points during the NCAA Tournament. That total stands as the sixth-highest single season scoring production by a Butler junior, 30 points behind A. J. Graves (2006-07) in the No. 5 spot. Dunham scored in double-figures in 30 games this season and boosted his career total for twin-digit scoring performances to 72. His performance against Texas was the ninth time this season that he scored at least 20 points in a game.

Kellen Dunham finished third in the BIG EAST in scoring in 2014-15 (16.5).

TRIPLE THREAT: Kellen Dunham extended his streak of consecutive games with a three-point field goal to 18 straight with two three-pointers against Texas and two more against Notre Dame. The 6-6 guard hit at least one three-point field goal in 32 of 34 games in 2014-15 and has had a three-pointer in 87 career games. He sits in sole possession of fifth place on Butler's all-time list for three-point field goals with 212 career three-pointers.

1,000-POINT CLUB: Juniors Kellen Dunham and Roosevelt Jones both scored their 1,000th career point in 2014-15. Dunham reached the 1,000-point plateau in Butler's game at Tennessee in December, while Jones reached the milestone at home in the Bulldogs' victory over Marquette. The last time Butler had two players score their 1,000th career point in the same season was in 2006, when both Avery Sheets and Bruce Horan topped the mark. Dunham stands in 14th place on Butler's all-time scoring list with 1,411 career points, 28 points shy of Bobby Plump (1954-58) in the No. 13 position. Jones is 34th on the all-time list with 1,077 career points, nine points behind Sheets.

BOARD ACTION: Senior Kameron Woods grabbed 24 rebounds in the NCAA Tournament, including a game-high 15 boards against Notre Dame, and finished his career in second place on Butler's alltime rebounding list. He closed out his four seasons with 953 rebounds, just five shy of the school record held by Daryl Mason (1971-74). Woods became just the third player in Butler basketball history to record 900 career rebounds in the Bulldogs' home game against Georgetown, joining Mason and Jeff Blue (953 rebounds, 1961-64). The 6-9 forward led the Bulldogs in rebounding in 18 of his final 20 games and in 27 contests overall in 2014-15.

Kameron Woods led the BIG EAST in rebounding (9.9) in 2013-14 and 2014-15.

STEAL MAN: Senior Alex Barlow led the Bulldogs with four steals in the NCAA Tournament and finished the year with a share of the Butler single season record for thefts. Barlow capped his career with 74 thefts in 2014-15, matching the school record set by Thomas Jackson in 2001-02. The 6-0 point-guard had at least one steal in Butler's last 17 games and in 31 total games this year. He finished his career in third place on Butler's all-time list for steals with 185.

BIG WEEKEND: Senior Alex Barlow didn't reach his dream of playing in the Final Four, but he did have a prominent presence during the tournament's final weekend. On Thursday, April 2, the Butler senior finished runner-up in the State Farm Three-Point Championship at Hinkle Fieldhouse, losing to Kevin Pangos of Gonzaga by a single point. One day later, he was named recipient of the Senior CLASS Award, given annually to the outstanding senior student-athlete in Division I men's basketball. The award focuses on notable achievements in four areas of excellence: classroom, community, character and competition. Barlow was the fourth Butler player since 2011 to be named a finalist for the award, joining Matt Howard (2011), Ronald Nored (2012) and Andrew Smith (2013), and the first to win it. The Senior CLASS Award capped off an impressive stretch that saw Barlow named Academic All-America, receive the BIG EAST Sportsmanship Award and be chosen BIG EAST Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the second straight season.

STAR PERFORMANCE: Senior Kameron Woods finished his season in the NABC College All-Star Game at Lucas Oil Stadium, and he turned in the kind of performance that Butler fans have come to appreciate. The 6-9 Butler forward, playing for the East Team, led all players with 14 rebounds, including 11 defensive boards. He added two points, three assists and two blocked shots in his 17-minute stint.

HONOR SQUADS: Juniors Kellen Dunham and Roosevelt Jones were named to a pair of postseason teams in March. Dunham was tabbed first team and Jones was named second team on the 2014-15 All-BIG EAST Team. The two Butler players then were picked second team on the 2015 NABC Division I All-District V Team.

LEAGUE FAVORITE: Junior Roosevelt Jones picked up all-conference recognition in his third different league this season. Jones, who was named second team All-BIG EAST, previously had been named to the Atlantic 10 Conference All-Defensive Team in 2012-13 and the Horizon League All-Newcomer Team in 2011-12. Jones missed the 2013-14 season with a wrist injury.

TOURNAMENT NOTES

- Butler is 20-13 all-time in NCAA Tournament play. The Bulldogs are 17-8 with two trips to the Final Four and two additional "Sweet 16" appearances in their last eight visits to the NCAA national championship.
- The Bulldogs made their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1962 and then went 35 years before earning a second tournament berth. Butler's 2015 bid was the team's 12th in 19 years.
- In a five-year span (2011-2015), Butler made three NCAA Tournament appearances representing three different conferences. The Bulldogs were members of the Horizon League when they reached the NCAA Tournament in 2011. They then earned a tournament berth in their one season in the Atlantic 10 Conference (2013), and in 2015 they reached that national tournament as a member of the BIG EAST.
- Butler became the first team in NCAA history to reach the Final Four in consecutive years as a No. 3 seed or lower. The Bulldogs were seeded No. 5 when they reached the national title game in 2010 and they were a No. 8 seed when they advanced to the national championship game in 2011.
- The Bulldogs were the first team in NCAA Tournament history to defeat both a No. 1 and a No. 2 seed before the Final Four in consecutive years. Butler beat topseeded Pittsburgh in the third round of the 2011 tournament and then defeated No. 2 seed Florida in the Southeast Regional championship game. In 2010, Butler beat top-seeded Syracuse in the West Regional semifinals and then upended No. 2 seed Kansas State in the regional championship.
- •Butler is one of 12 schools to reach the Final Four in consecutive years since the tournament expanded to 64 teams in 1985. The other 11 are Duke, Kentucky, Louisville, Michigan State, Maryland, Kansas, North Carolina, Florida, UCLA, Michigan and UNLV.

10/2/14

COACHING CHANGE: Two days before the Bulldogs opened practice this fall, Butler Vice President and Athletic Director Barry Collier announced that head coach Brandon Miller had requested and been granted a medical leave of absence. In Miller's absence, assistant coach **Chris Holtmann** was named interim head coach. Holtmann previously had been head coach at Gardner-Webb for three seasons, earning Big South Conference and NABC District 3 Coach of the Year honors in 2012-13.

10/22/14

PRESEASON POLL: BIG EAST coaches picked Butler and Marquette in a tie for seventh place in the league's annual preseason poll. Defending champ Villanova was tabbed the league favorite, followed by Georgetown, St. John's, Xavier, Providence, Seton Hall, Butler, Marquette, Creighton and DePaul. Butler guard Kellen Dunham was selected first team All-BIG EAST, while junior Roosevelt Jones was given honorable mention on the preseason all-league team.

10/29/14

PLAYER ADDITION: The Bulldogs added sophomore Trey Pettus to their roster, following the team's walk-on tryouts. Pettus, a 6-4 guard, earned all-conference and all-district honors after leading MICDS in St. Louis, Mo., in scoring (14.5) in 2012-13. He was the leading scorer on Butler's club basketball team last year as a freshman.

11/5/14

HOME IMPROVEMENT: Hinkle Fieldhouse, the home of the Bulldogs, underwent a \$36 million renovation this summer bringing about significant changes and upgrades the the 86-year-old historic facility. Highlights of the project included new offices and locker room suites for both men's and women's basketball, a new training room with a hydrotherapy area, a new student academic center, a new weight room, a new scoreboard with video playback capability, added and more comfortable chair-back seating in the main arena, new administrative offices, added concession stands and restrooms and an elevator for public and ADA accessibility.

11/12/14

FALL SIGNING: For the second straight year, Butler landed a pair of top prospects on the first day of the fall signing period. On Nov. 11, Coach Chris Holtmann received signed letters of intent from 6-10 Nate Fowler of Cincinnati Moeller High School and 6-6 Sean McDermott of Pendleton Heights (Ind.) High School. Fowler, widely regarded as the top center prospect in Ohio this year, averaged 12.4 points and 10 rebounds as a junior. McDermott, a skilled long-ranger shooter, checked in with a 14.6 average. A year ago, Butler picked up current freshmen Kelan

Martin and **Tyler Wideman** on the first day of the fall signing period.

11/12/14

RETURN ADDRESS: Junior Roosevelt Jones admitted after the game against Maine that he was a little "extra" excited for this year's season-opener. After missing all of last season with a wrist injury, the 6-4 guard wasted little time making his presence felt in Saturday's game. He scored six of Butler's first 11 points against the Black Bears, and he had assists on the other five points. Jones finished the first 20 minutes with ten points and six assists! He went on to post 14 points, four rebounds, nine assists, two steals and one blocked shot in 29 minutes of work.

11/17/14

HOT SHOTS: Butler used a record-setting shooting performance to record a season-opening, 99-57, victory over Maine. After hitting a sizzling 68% (17-25) from the field in the first half, the Bulldogs turned it up a notch with 75% (24-32) marksmanship in the final 20 minutes! The team's final 71.9% figure for the game broke the previous Butler single game field goal percentage record of 69.7% (23-33), set against Illinois State on Dec. 9, 1993. Ten different Bulldogs had a field goal attempt against Maine, and nine of those players shot 50% or better! Butler's five starters combined to shoot 73.5% in the win.

11/27/14

RANKING ORDER: The Bulldogs' victory over #5/6 North Carolina at the Battle 4 Atlantis in the Bahamas was Butler's first over a nationally-ranked team since Jan. 19, 2013. That night, the Bulldogs defeated #8 Gonzaga, 64-63 on a shot at the buzzer by Roosevelt Jones in front of a sold-out crowd and a national television audience. The Bulldogs also had victories over #1 Indiana and #9 North Carolina in the 2012-13 season.

12/18/14

SCORING COLUMN: Junior Kellen Dunham scored his 1,000th career point during Butler's game at Tennessee. He led Butler in scoring against the Volunteers with 16 points, boosting his career scoring total to 1,013 points in 77 career games. He's the 36th player in Butler history to score 1,000 career points.

1/3/15

COACHING APPOINTMENT: Butler University Vice President and Director of Athletics Barry Collier announced on Friday (Jan. 2) that Chris Holtmann has been named Butler's 23rd men's basketball Head Coach. Holtmann had been serving as interim head coach since October, when former Head Coach Brandon Miller requested and was granted a medical leave

of absence. Miller, who served for one season as Butler's Head Coach, will not be returning following a University-approved medical leave.

2/3/15

BIG WEEKEND: Sophomore Andrew Chrabascz continued the hottest stretch of his young Butler tenure with the best performance of his Butler career in the Bulldogs' win at Marquette. The 6-7 forward led all players on both teams with a careerhigh 30 points in a career-high 38 minutes. He grabbed a career-best eight rebounds in the game, and he matched his career-high with seven (of seven) free throws made. He scored 13 of his points in the final nine minutes of action. It was the the third time in the last six outings that Chrabascz led the Bulldogs in scoring. The life-long Patriots fan then watched his favorite team win the Super Bowl on Sunday on a game-saving play by a defensive back named Butler.

2/9/15

TOP DOG: Kellen Dunham, who led Butler in scoring in back-to-back wins last week, was named BIG EAST Men's Basketball Player of the Week (Feb. 9). Dunham averaged 22.5 points, while helping the Bulldogs to conference victories over St. John's and DePaul. The 6-6 guard scored 21 points in Butler's 85-62 victory over St. John's, and then he came back with 24 points in the Bulldogs' 83-73 win against DePaul. He shot 50% (12-24) from the field, 40% (6-15) from 3-point range and 100% (15-15) from the free throw line in the two wins. He's the first Butler player to earn the BIG EAST honor this season.

The Butler point-guard was chosen second team on the national honor squad. He's the eighth player in Butler basketball history to earn Academic All-America recognition, joining Andrew Smith (2013), Ronald Nored (2012), Matt Howard (2009, 2010, 2011), Gordon Hayward (2010), A. J. Graves (2007, 2008), Drew Streicher (2008) and Chris Miskel (1995). Barlow is the reigning BIG EAST Men's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION: Butler head coach Chris Holtmann, who has engineered the Bulldogs' remarkable turnaround this season, has been named one of 15 semifinalists for the Naismith Coach of the Year Award. Holtmann began the season as interim head coach and wasn't named Butler's permanent head coach until January. He's guided the Bulldogs to 22 wins and a "Top 25" national ranking. Butler already has tied the fourth-best single season turnaround (+8 wins) in BIG EAST history. The Bulldogs,

coming off a 14-17 campaign, were picked to tie for seventh in the conference in the league's preseason poll. Todd Lickliter (2006-07) is the only men's basketball coach in Butler history to be named National Coach of the Year.

ALL-BIG EAST: Butler's duo of Kellen Dunham and Roosevelt Jones were among 21 players honored when the BIG EAST released the 2014-15 All-BIG EAST Men's Basketball Team on Sunday (March 9). Dunham, Butler's leading scorer on the season, was named first team All-BIG EAST, while Jones, the Bulldogs' secondleading scorer and rebounder, was tabbed second team all-conference. A year ago, Dunham was a second team All-BIG EAST player. Jones completed his first season in the conference.

RECORD RECOVERY: Four days after shooting a season-low 45.5% (10-22) from the free throw line in a loss to Georgetown, the Bulldogs broke a 41-year-old school record for free throw excellence in their victory at Providence. Butler hit 20 of 20 charity attempts against the Friars, topping the previous school mark for free throw accuracy (16-16) set in 1974 against Cleveland State. Five different players contributed to the new

record, led by junior **Roosevelt Jones** who hit eight of eight charity attempts in the Butler win. Senior **Kameron Woods** (4-4), junior **Kellen Dunham** (4-4), senior **Alex Barlow** (2-2) and freshman **Kelan Martin** (2-2) also were perfect at the line. (*Note: Current Butler Director of Athletics Barry Collier was five for five from the free throw line when Butler set the original free throw record in 1974.)*

LEAGUE RECOGNITION: Freshman Kelan Martin and senior Kameron Woods both were honored by the BIG EAST for their performance in Butler's final regular season week. Martin was named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week after helping Butler to its victory at Providence. He came off the bench with 14 points and five rebounds in just 19 minutes of action. He became the first Butler player to earn the league's Rookie of the Week award. Woods averaged 10.5 points and 14.0 rebounds in Butler's games against Georgetown and Providence. With the selection of the 6-9 forward, all five Butler starters earned a spot on the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll at least once this season. Junior Kellen Dunham was named to the Weekly Honor Roll five times, while junior Roosevelt Jones claimed a spot on the Honor Roll three times. Senior Alex Barlow and sophomore Andrew Chrabascz each were named to the Weekly Honor Roll once.

Chris Holtmann Head Coach, Butler University



Just one year after leaving a position as head coach at Gardner-Webb to become an assistant coach at Butler, Chris Holtmann found himself back in the lead chair. On Oct. 2, 2014, Butler Head Coach Brandon Miller requested and was granted a medical leave of absence. Holtmann was appointed interim head coach and given the task of leading the Bulldogs through the start of the 2014-15 season. Three months later, on Jan. 2, 2015, Butler Vice President and Director of Athletics Barry Collier removed the "interim" tag and named Holtmann head coach of the Bulldogs.

To say that Holtmann's intial season at the helm of the Bulldogs was a success would be an understatement. The 43-year-old coach guided a Butler team that was picked to tie for seventh in the BIG EAST to a 23-11 campaign, a tie for second place in the BIG EAST regular season race and a berth in the 2015 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. Along the way, the Bulldogs knocked off five teams ranked in the "Top 25" at the time, including No. 5/6 North Carolina at the Battle 4 Atlantis, and picked up a second round NCAA Tournament win. Butler, unmentioned in the national polls at

the start of the season, was among teams receiving votes or ranked in the "Top 25" in 16 of the final 17 weeks of the season. The Bulldogs climbed to as high as No. 15 in the A.P. national poll and No. 18 in the USA Today national poll. Butler tied the fourth-best turnaround in BIG EAST history (+8) and matched the 11th-highest single season win total in school history. For his efforts, Holtmann was named a finalist for both the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award and the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award.

Holtmann served as head coach at Gardner-Webb for three seasons (2010-13), leading the North Carolina school through a successful rebuilding effort. He took the Runnin' Bulldogs from eight wins in 2009-10 to a school Division I record 21 victories and a berth in the Collegelnsider. com postseason tournament in his last year. Gardner-Webb won ten of its final 11 games in 2012-13 and finished a game out of first place in the Big South Conference. For his efforts, Holtmann was named Big South Conference Coach of the Year and NABC District 3 Coach of the Year.

Holtmann has earned a reputation as a strong recruiter. During his career, he's recruited seven all-conference players, one Rookie of the Year, one conference Player of the Year, one Division I All-American and one first team Academic All-American. He's recruited and/or coached 13 players who have signed professional basketball contracts.

Prior to taking the head coaching position at Gardner-Webb, Holtmann spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio University under former Butler assistant John Groce. He helped build back-to-back top classes as recruiting coordinator for the Bobcats, and he was part of the staff that led Ohio to the 2010 Mid-American Conference Tournament title and an upset of No. 3 seed Georgetown in the opening round of the 2010 NCAA Tournament. Before his stint at Ohio, he served for five seasons as an assistant coach at Gardner-

Webb, including four seasons as Associate Head Coach.

A native of Nicholasville, Ky., Holtmann was an NAIA All-American guard at Taylor University. He helped lead Taylor to a 25-9 record, a No. 1 national ranking and a berth in the NAIA National Tournament in 1993-94. He served as a graduate assistant coach at Taylor in 1997-98, spent one season as an assistant coach at Geneva College and then returned to Taylor as an assistant coach under head coach Paul Patterson. In his final two seasons at Taylor, the Trojans posted a 50-16 record, won back-to-back conference titles and ranked in the "Top 15" of the NAIA national poll.

Holtmann earned a degree in psychology from Taylor in 1994 and a Master's Degree in athletic administration from Ball State in 2000. He and his wife, Lori, have one daughter, Nora Jane.






