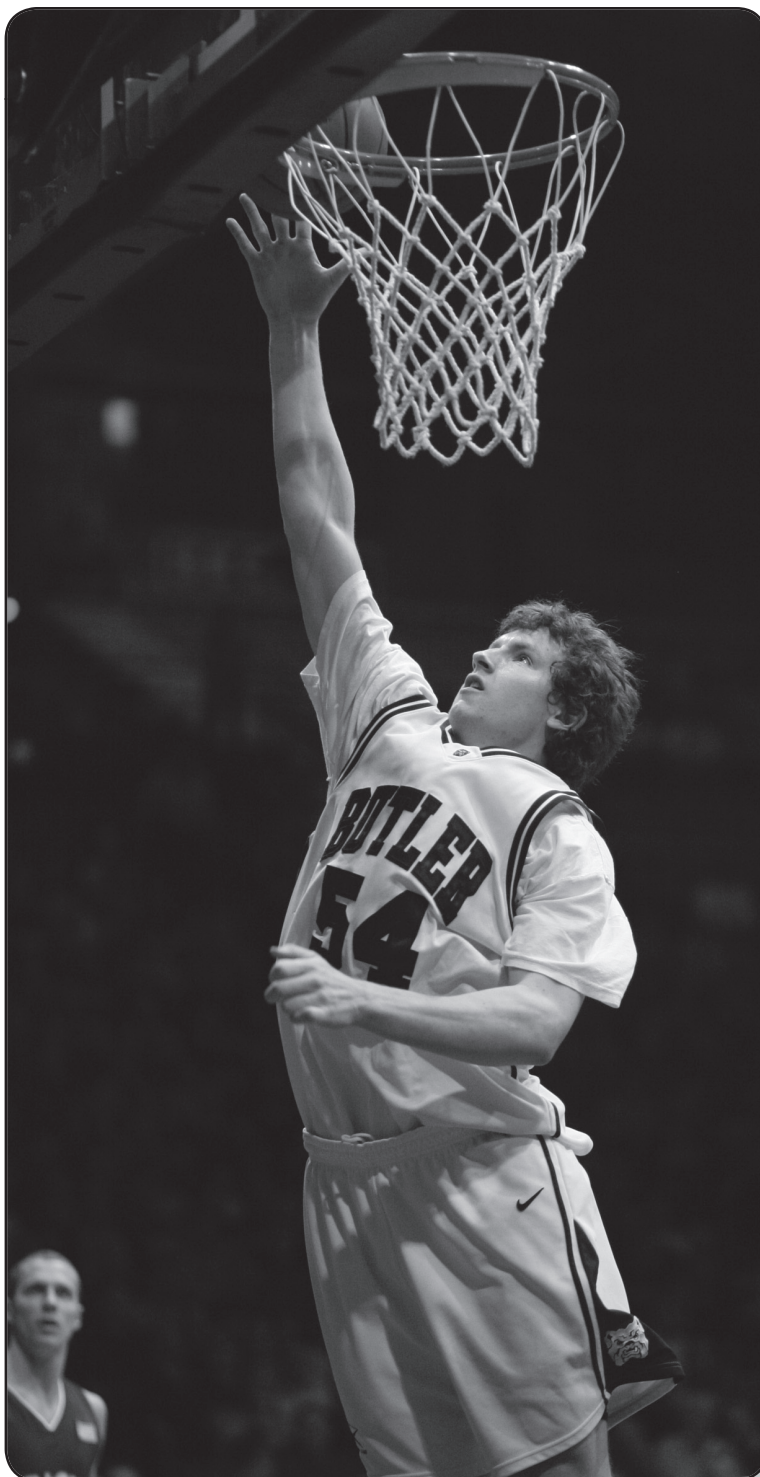
2007-08: Came off the bench with 14 points, 5 rebounds and a team-high four assists at Ball State in his first collegiate game. His 14 points were the most by a Butler freshman in his first game since 1990 when Jermaine Guice scored 16 against Western Illinois... posted second consecutive double-figures game with 10 points in 16 minutes against Indiana State...had seven rebounds and two blocked shots, despite being limited by foul problems at Evansville...had Butler's first 2007-08 double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds in 29 minutes in Butler's victory over Michigan...scored 11 points in 13 minutes of reserve action against Texas Tech in the championship game of the Great Alaska Shootout...came off the bench with a career-high 23 points and a team-high seven rebounds in 29 minutes to help lead Butler past Ohio State...given first collegiate start at Detroit and responded with 20 points, 12 rebounds and three blocked shots in a career-high 38 minutes...had a team-high eight rebounds and three blocked shots at Wright State...scored 11 points against Florida State...had 14 points and six rebounds in 24 minutes against Bradley...scored 12 points in 18 minutes at Florida Gulf Coast... had 15 points, five rebounds and two blocked shots at Southern Illinois...limited by foul trouble, but still scored 12 points in 17 minutes against Valparaiso at Hinkle Fieldhouse... led the Bulldogs with 19 points and five rebounds in just 20 minutes at Loyola...topped Butler with 22 points and added nine rebounds and two blocked shots in the Bulldogs' victory at home over Green Bay...led the Bulldogs with 17 points, seven rebounds and three blocked shots in 26 minutes against Milwaukee at Hinkle Fieldhouse...had team-highs of 16 points and eight rebounds and a career-high four blocked shots at Cleveland State...posted a team-high 20 points and shared the team lead with eight rebounds at Youngstown State...recorded his third double-double with team-highs of 15 points and 10 rebounds against Loyola at Hinkle Fieldhouse...led the Bulldogs with 20 points in 29 minutes against UIC at Hinkle Fieldhouse...posted team-highs of 17 points and eight rebound in Butler's victory over Cleveland State...had 16 points and a team-high nine rebounds against #16 Drake...notched 12 points, five rebounds, three blocked shots and two steals in Butler' title-clinching victory over Wright State...posted 16 points, five rebounds, three steals, two blocked shots and one assist against Cleveland State in the championship game of the Horizon League Tournament...scored 11 points against South Alabama in his first NCAA Tournament action.

High School: All-State forward at Connersville High School...rated as a "Top 100" player by several recruiting publications prior to his senior season...named to the Indiana All-Star Team for the two-game summer series against Kentucky...four-time all-conference performer...two-time team co-captain...finished as the all-time leading scorer and all-

time leading rebounder at Connersville...averaged a double-double in scoring and rebounding in each of his final two high school seasons...led the state of Indiana in rebounding as a senior with an average of 14.4 rebounds per game...posted a high game of 20 rebounds...ranked eighth in the state in scoring in 2006-07 with a 23.6 average...had a high game of 42 points...stood second in the state in blocked shots (3.9 bpg)...ranked 17th in Indiana in field goal percentage (.618)...averaged 19.1 points and 10.6 rebounds as a junior...shot 57.8% from the field and 81.1% from the free throw line in 2005-06...averaged 4.3 blocked shots in junior season...named to the core group of the Indiana Junior All-Star Team in 2006...led Connersville to four straight winning seasons, including a 19-3 mark in 2005-06 and an 18-4 record in 2006-07...earned four varsity basketball letters...named Most Valuable Player of the Bob Gibbons Tournament of Champions and the Hoosier Shootout in the summer before his senior season...

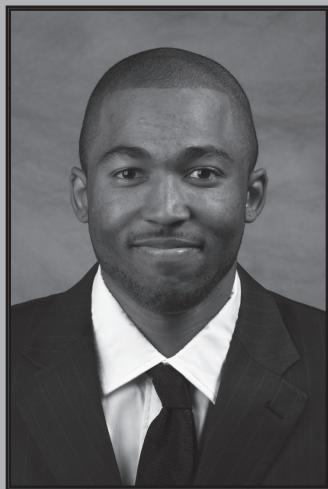

2007-08: Missed Butler's first four games with a knee injury...scored four points in first action of the season against Virginia Tech...had three rebounds in nine minutes of action against Ohio State...scored five points and matched his career-high with two blocked shots in 23 minutes against Florida State...scored a career-high 12 points and grabbed four rebounds in 24 minutes against Bradley...came off the bench with eight points, all in the first half, and three rebounds against Valparaiso at Hinkle Fieldhouse...had four points and four rebounds in 12 minutes at Loyola...came off the bench with seven points, a career-high 11 rebounds, two blocked shots and two steals against Green Bay at home...had six points, seven rebounds, two assists and two steals in 20 minutes against Milwaukee at Hinkle Fieldhouse...came off the bench with seven points, five rebounds and two steals against Loyola on Butler's homecourt...matched his career-high with two blocked shots in Butler's home win over UIC...came off the bench with eight points at Valparaiso...matched his career-high with 12 points in a career-high 34 minutes at Milwaukee...had eight points and four rebounds in a reserve stint in Butler's home victory over Detroit...scored four points and grabbed two rebounds in 17 minutes in the Horizon League Tournament championship game.

2006-07: Played in 35 games in his initial season with the Bulldogs...connected on 17 of his last 23 shots...came off the bench with a season-high 10 points to help spark the Bulldogs past Florida Gulf Coast. He hit all four shots that he attempted against the Eagles, while playing a season-high 29 minutes...scored eight points and added four rebounds and two assists in Butler's victory over UIC...came off the bench with five points and five rebounds in the first half at Loyola...had seven points and a season-high nine rebounds in 28 minutes in Butler's victory over Purdue...grabbed seven rebounds against Ball State...pulled down four rebounds and had two blocked shots in Butler's double-overtime win over Kent State...had a key tip-in to give Butler the lead for good against Indiana in the NIT Season Tip-Off at Consecro Fieldhouse...came off the bench at Tulane with three rebounds and three assists in 22 minutes...suffered a broken bone in his left hand in the win at Tulane and had to play the first 11 games of his collegiate career with a padded cast on his hand.

High School: Four-year varsity starter at Freeport High School ...ranked as one of the top prep players in Illinois by several recruiting publications ...named NIC-9 Conference Player of the Year in 2005-06, after finishing runner-up for that honor in 2003-04 and 2004-05 ...first team All-State pick by the *Champaign News-Gazette* ...second team All-State selection by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association in 2006 ...named to the IBCA North All-Star Team in 2006...two-time team Most Valuable Player ...two-time All-Tournament pick at the Pekin Holiday Tournament ...averaged 24 points and 11 rebounds as a senior ...broke Freeport's 10-year-old school career scoring record in January of his senior year...scored a career-high 40 points against Rockford East High School as a senior ...averaged 15.5 points and 8.8 rebounds as a junior ...averaged 14.7 points, 10.1 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 0.8 blocked shots as a sophomore ...helped Freeport to a 24-5 record as a senior ...helped lead high school to four consecutive winning seasons and 74 wins over four years ...scored 21 points in the 10th Annual Rising Stars Classic following his senior season...played for the Illinois Wolves AAU team during the summer...named MVP of the Five Star Camp in Pennsylvania ...High School Coach: Jeff Lawfer.

First Class

They didn't arrive at Butler together, and they came from places near and far. But Julian Betko, Pete Campbell, A. J. Graves, Mike Green and Drew Streicher combined to help lead Butler to unprecedented basketball heights and the best two-year run in school and Horizon League history! Streicher, from Washington, Ind., was the first to arrive, joining the Bulldogs as a walk-on in 2003-04. At mid-season that year, Betko, from Ruzomberok, Slovakia, transferred to Butler from Clemson. The following season, Graves showed up from Switz City, Ind., and a year later Campbell and Green both transferred to Butler. Campbell, from Yorktown, Ind., joined the Bulldogs after playing one season at IPFW, while Green, from Philadelphia, Pa., came to Butler after playing two seasons at Towson. The five took the floor together for the first time in 2006-07, on a Butler team that was picked to finish sixth in the Horizon League! They proceeded to lead the Bulldogs to a 29-7 campaign, a regular season title in the Horizon League, championships at the NIT Season Tip-Off and the Wooden Tradition, a "Top 10" national ranking and the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Last year, they guided Butler to a school- and league-record 30-4 campaign, Horizon League regular season and tournament titles, championships at the Great Alaska Shootout and the Wooden Tradition, another "Top 10" national ranking and a first round win in the NCAA Tournament. The Bulldogs were 55-10 in games in which all five players appeared!

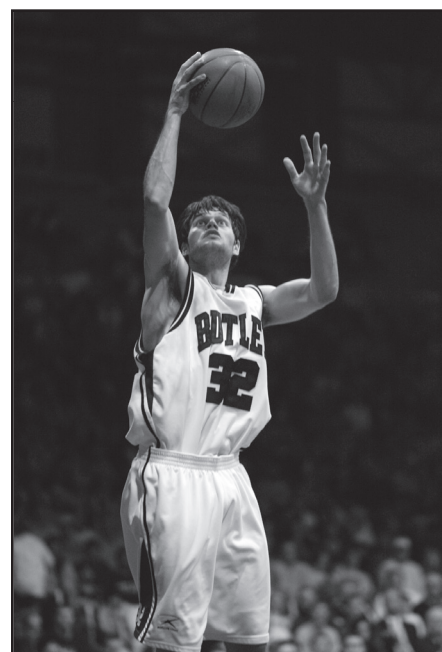
