WORKING CREDENTIALS: Requests for working press credentials should be directed to the Butler Sports Information Office as far in advance of the game as possible. Credentials will be mailed if time permits, or will be left at the Will Call table in the West Gym of Hinkle Fieldhouse. Credential priority is given to print and electronic media who cover Butler or its opponent on a regular basis. To qualify for a credential, a news agency must have a full-time sports editor or director. Weekly publications will be considered on a space available basis.

PRESS PARKING: Parking is available to credentialed members of the media in the north lot behind Hinkle Fieldhouse. Requests for media parking passes should be made to the Butler Sports Information Office far enough in advance of the game to allow for mailing time.

SCOUTING PASSES: In accordance with NCAA rules, scouting passes will not be issued to Division I college scouts. Non-Division I scouts will be seated on press row as space permits. Requests should be made to the Butler Sports Information Office in advance of the game. Professional scouts will be accommodated, as space permits, if the request is made by the team's main office.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photo passes will be issued by the Butler Sports Information Office to certified news photographers only. Photographers are limited to working at either end of the court at the right of the basket (Photo Box), and **flashes are not permitted**.

TELEVISION BROADCASTS: Application for television origination must be made to the Butler Sports Information Office at least ten days prior to the game. Courtside seating will be provided for up to four persons.

RADIO BROADCASTS: Application for broadcasting permission must be made in writing to the Butler Sports Information Office at least one week prior to the game. Courtside seating will be provided for up to four persons. Butler University will provide courtesy phone lines for the designated official station of each visiting school.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: Butler coaches and players will be available for interviews following the game in the basketball interview area, located on the northwest side of the arena. Head Coach Brad Stevens will be available to all media following a 10-minute cooling-off period. Requests for Butler players should be given to Butler's SID prior to the end of the game.

IN-SEASON INTERVIEWS: Head coach Brad Stevens and Butler players are available to the media immediately following Tuesday practices, or by appointment. **Players are not available for interviews on game days.** Contact Butler's Sports Information Office for assistance in lining up interviews in-person or by phone.

PRACTICE SESSIONS: Butler's practice sessions are open to the media. Please make advance arrangements with Butler's Sports Information Office.

WXNT REMAINS HOME OF BUTLER BASKETBALL

Butler University and WXNT Radio signed a two-year agreement this fall to keep the Indianapolis station as the radio home of Butler men's basketball through the 2009-10 season. Under the agreement, all Butler regular season and post-season men's basketball games will be broadcast on WXNT (1430 AM).

The new agreement calls for a continuation of the 30-minute pre-game and post-game shows in conjunction with each game broadcast. Butler Basketball Tonight, a one-hour program featuring basketball news and conversation with Butler head coach Brad Stevens, has been moved from Tuesday nights to Monday nights, 6-7 p.m. In addition to the over-the-air coverage, all games and coach's shows also will be streamed at www.newstalk1430.com.

Play-by-play broadcast duties for the Butler games again will be handled by Joe Gentry, Butler's Director of Sports Marketing and Corporate Sponsorships, while former Butler basketball player Nick Gardner returns as color analyst.



Why Bulldogs?

Prior to 1919, Butler's athletic teams were known as the "Christians." But numerous losses in the 1919 football season caused Butler followers to grow weary of that nickname. During the week leading up to Butler's football game with the heated rival Franklin "Baptists," Butler Collegian editor Alex Cavins and his staff, which included cartoonist George Kickson, decided something "hot" needed to be conceived for the school's weekly pep session. About that time, the mascot of a Butler fraternity - a bulldog named Shimmy (you couldn't shake him) - wandered into the Collegian office. The idea was born! The next day the school paper came out with a big page one cartoon showing Shimmy the Bulldog, labled Butler, taking a bite out of the pants seat of a figure labled "John the Baptist." The caption was: "Bring on that Platter, Salome!" (Butler lost the game to Franklin, 14-0, but the name "Bulldogs" took hold.)

New Look Bulldogs Seek Continued Success

Butler's basketball opponents pretty much knew what to expect from the Bulldogs for the past two seasons. No so in 2008-09!

The Bulldogs compiled the best two-year run in school and Horizon League history! In fact, only five NCAA Division I teams - Memphis, Kansas, North Carolina, UCLA and Wisconsin - recorded more victories than Butler's 59 wins from 2006 to 2008.

Butler capped that two-year run with a school- and league-record 30-4 mark last season. The Bulldogs won the Great Alaska Shootout, captured a second straight Wooden Tradition trophy, posted a second straight Horizon League regular season title and claimed the Horizon League Tournament championship. Butler won a first round NCAA tournament game for the second straight year, before falling to Tennessee in overtime in the second round. That successful run lifted the Bulldogs into the national "Top 25" for a school and league record 19 consecutive weeks, including five weeks in the "Top 10!"

But graduation stripped five seniors who were at the core of Butler's record performance, including Horizon League Player of the Year Mike Green and first team All-League guard A. J. Graves. Those two backcourt stars, along with forwards Pete Campbell, Julian Betko and Drew Streicher, were the face of Butler's program over the past two years and the focus of most opposing coaches.

Absorbing the loss of 69% of the team's scoring and 57% of the squad's rebounding will be a major challenge facing second-year head coach Brad Stevens. But Stevens is more focused on the things his five graduated seniors left behind.

"The goal is not to start over, but the goal is to build on the tradition and the culture that's been established here and the attitude that (the seniors) brought to the table every day," stated Stevens. "You hope that attitude is shared by the guys who were on the team with them last year."

"We have to recognize that this is a new team with new players, and they get

to write their own script," added the Butler head coach.

The 2008-09 Bulldogs will feature just one returning starter and only three other players who saw action in 30 or more games last season. The team doesn't have a senior and includes six newcomers. Only one player, junior **Willie Veasley**, has more than 35 collegiate games under his belt!

It's that profile that makes the Bulldogs somewhat "unknown" for the upcoming season, even to the Butler coaches.

"You assess your strengths and tailor the team to those strengths," said Stevens.

"I think we have a fairly good idea going into the season, but some of those things will be discovered over a period of time. We need to play with great passion, and we need to take pride in defending.

If we do those two things, we can achieve the results we seek."

While most of Butler's players will be seeking their own niche this season, one returnee is already firmly established. Sophomore **Matt Howard** broke into the Bulldogs' starting lineup as a freshman last year, and he wound up as the team's second-leading rebounder and third-leading scorer. He posted the second-highest freshman scoring total in Butler basketball history (417 points), and he became the first Butler freshman to score 400 points and grab 175 rebounds. He led all freshmen in the Horizon League in scoring, rebounding, blocked shots, field goal shooting and free throw shooting, and he was named both second team All-Horizon League and Horizon League Newcomer of the Year.

Stevens looks for more of the same from his 6-8 forward.

"I don't anticipate anything less than a great last three seasons from (Matt)," stated the Butler head coach.

"He is extremely coachable, and he cares about winning. Matt is going to do whatever it takes to win the basketball game. He is more than capable when it comes to shooting, and he's going to have a green light to shoot it. But at the same time, Matt recognizes what he does on the interior and what he does on the glass is a unique trait, and he's one of the better guys around at it."

Howard started Butler's final 26 games a year ago. Butler's 13 other players have a combined zero collegiate starts. But Stevens is more concerned with the quality of his players than an overall lack of experience.


"I think we've got really good young people; guys who can play the game of basketball and guys who are versatile," said Stevens.

"I know they believe in themselves and their teammates, and I know they're going to make every effort to make it the best year possible."


Butler's most experienced returning player is Veasley, who was one of the Bulldogs first players off the bench last season. He was fourth on the team in

rebounding and sixth in scoring, while seeing action in 30 games. He played in 35 games two years ago, the most ever by a Butler freshman!

Also back from last year's record-setting squad are juniors **Avery Jukes**, **Nick Rodgers** and **Alex Anglin**, redshirt-sophomore **Grant Leiedecker**, and sophomores **Zach Hahn** and **Shawn Vanzant**.

Hahn and Vanzant both saw regular playing time in their first year with the Bulldogs. Hahn played in 34 games in a back-up role and averaged just under two points per game, while hitting 17 three-point field goals. Vanzant, who emerged as a strong backcourt defender, saw action in 33 games.

Jukes, a transfer from Alabama, became eligible at mid-season and saw action in 22 of Butler's final 24 games. Leiedecker played in 12 games, while Rodgers and Anglin were limited to just four games each.

The rest of Butler's squad will be first-year players. Stevens added six freshmen to this year's squad, the most at Butler in more than a quarter of a century! The group of newcomers add size, speed and skill to the Butler lineup.

"Without a question, there is a lot of talent among our younger players," noted Stevens.

"How those guys develop and grow as players will be largely determined by their

approach. Our goal is to give them the benefit of what we know and coach them to the best of our ability so their approach to the game every day is a good one."

All six of the freshmen played for successful high school teams. **Gordon Hayward**, a 6-8 forward, was a top performer at Indiana 4A state champ Brownsburg, while 6-0 **Ronald Nored** played for Alabama 6A state runner-up Homewood. **Chase Stigall**, a 6-3 guard, helped New Castle Chrysler to an Indiana 3A state championship in 2006-07, while playing in the same backcourt with current Butler teammate Zach Hahn. **Shelvin Mack**, a 6-3 guard from Bryan Station in Kentucky, helped his team to a #1 state ranking as a senior, while 6-7 **Garrett Butcher** helped Edgewood to an unbeaten regular season and a #1 ranking in Indiana in 2006-07. **Emerson Kampen**, a 6-9 forward, played for 18-5 Yorktown (Ind.) last year.

Hayward averaged 18.0 points, 8.4 rebounds and 3.6 assists as a senior and hit the game-winning shot in the Indiana 4A state championship game. He was a member of the Indiana All-Star Team, along with Stigall and Butcher. Stigall ranked 19th in Indiana in scoring as a senior with a 21.2 average, and he finished his high school career as the third all-time leading scorer at New Castle Chrysler. Butcher wound up as the all-time leading scorer and rebounder at Edgewood. He ranked

sixth in the state in scoring as a senior with a 25.2 average.

Mack, who played on the Kentucky All-Star Team, ranked 10th in the state in scoring as a senior with a 23.7 average, and he scored over 1,700 points in his high school career. Nored, a member of the Alabama All-Star Team, averaged 15.3 points, 6.9 rebounds and 5.2 assists as a senior, while Kampen averaged 14.9 points and 7.3 rebounds in his final high school season.

The diverse skills of the newcomers, combined with the returning players, give Stevens multiple lineup options, a situation he embraces.

"One of the things we are is even more versatile than we've been in a long time," noted the Butler coach.

"We have guys who can play multiple positions; we just have to figure out who will fit and where. What we've tried to do is recruit a team of good basketball players and not necessarily label them as fitting a particular position. We want them to be the best that they can, figure out where they fit and then ride that out."

They didn't arrive at Butler together, and they came from places near and far. But Julian Betko, Pete Campbell, A. J. Graves, Mike Green and Drew Streicher combined to help lead Butler to unprecedented basketball heights and the best two-year run in school and Horizon League history! Streicher, from Washington, Ind., was the first to arrive, joining the Bulldogs as a walk-on in 2003-04. At mid-season that year, Betko, from Ruzomberok, Slovakia, transferred to Butler from Clemson. The following season, Graves showed up from Switz City, Ind., and a year later Campbell and Green both transferred to Butler. Campbell, from Yorktown, Ind., joined the Bulldogs after playing one season at IPFW, while Green, from Philadelphia, Pa., came to Butler after playing two seasons at Towson. The five took the floor together for the first time in 2006-07, on a Butler team that was picked to finish sixth in the Horizon League! They proceeded to lead the Bulldogs to a 29-7 campaign, a regular season title in the Horizon League, championships at the NIT Season Tip-Off and the Wooden Tradition, a "Top 10" national ranking and the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Last year, they guided Butler to a school- and league-record 30-4 campaign, Horizon League regular season and tournament titles, championships at the Great Alaska Shootout and the Wooden Tradition, another "Top 10" national ranking and a first round win in the NCAA Tournament. The Bulldogs were 55-10 in games in which all five players appeared!





Head Coach



No coach in Butler men's basketball history can boast of a better career start than Brad Stevens. In fact, only three coaches in the history of NCAA Division I basketball can make that claim!

Stevens, who was named Butler's head coach on April 5, 2007, wasted little time re-writing Butler's record books. He guided the Bulldogs to a school- and Horizon League-record 30-4 mark in his initial season as a collegiate head coach, including a school-record 16 league victories. He became the first coach in school and league history

to post a 30-win season and just the sixth first-year coach in NCAA history to finish with 30 victories. Only three Division I coaches in NCAA history - Bill Guthridge of North Carolina (34-4 in 1997-98), Bill Hodges of Indiana State (33-1 in 1978-79) and Jamie Dixon of Pittsburgh (31-5 in 2003-04) - recorded more wins in their first season as a head coach!

Stevens, 31, became the third-youngest NCAA Division I coach to guide his team to 30 wins and the youngest in more than half a century! Bradley's Fordy Anderson won his 30th game the day before his 31st birthday in 1950, and North Carolina's Ben Carnevale was 30 when he led the Tar Heels to 30 wins in 1946. Only 11 NCAA Division I coaches in their 30's have posted 30-win seasons.

The 2007-08 Bulldogs, under Stevens, won the Great Alaska Shootout, captured a second straight Wooden Tradition trophy, claimed a second consecutive Horizon League regular season championship, won the Horizon League Tournament title and notched a first round NCAA Tournament win for the second straight year. Butler was ranked in the "Top 25" of both the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today national polls for a school- and Horizon League-record 19 consecutive weeks, including a record five weeks in the "Top 10." The Bulldogs climbed to No. 8 in the nation on Feb. 18, the highest national ranking in school history!

Stevens was an assistant coach under Todd Lickliter for six seasons, 2001-07, at Butler. During that period, the Bulldogs compiled a 131-61 record, won three Horizon League regular season championships, made four trips to postseason tournament play and achieved Butler's first "Top 10" national ranking. He became the first assistant coach in Butler basketball history to help the Bulldogs reach the NCAA Sweet 16 twice (2003 and 2007), and he contributed to more NCAA Tournament wins (4) than any previous Butler assistant basketball coach. Teams during his tenure as an assistant coach compiled the top three single season win totals in Butler basketball history prior to 2007-08.

Stevens joined the Bulldogs' staff under Thad Matta in 2000-01 as coordinator of basketball operations, handling a variety of administrative duties. He was offered a full-time assistant coaching position by Lickliter in 2001-02.



Just one year after graduating from college, Stevens left a position as a marketing associate at Eli Lilly and Company in Indianapolis to pursue a career in basketball coaching. He served in a volunteer capacity in Butler's basketball office during the summer of 2000, before eventually gaining a full-time administrative position on the Bulldogs' staff under Matta in the fall of 2000.

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, Stevens served as a volunteer basketball coach at Carmel High School, working with coach Pete Smith. He further served as an assistant coach for the 17-year-old Municipal Gardens AAU team, helping the squad to a 12th place finish in the national tournament.

Stevens completed a stellar high school basketball career in 1995 as the all-time basketball scoring leader at Zionsville High School in Indiana with 1,508 career points. During his prep career, he also set team all-time records for three-point field goals (since broken) and assists (444), and he tied the all-time mark for steals (156). He set single season records for points (644) and scoring average (26.8). Stevens went on to earn all-conference and academic all-conference honors as a four-year member of the basketball team at DePauw University. He played in 101 games in four seasons, and he served as a team captain as a senior. He received DePauw's "Coaches Award" in 1998-99.

Stevens earned a B.A. degree in economics from DePauw in 1999. He and his wife, Tracy, have a three-year-old son, Brady.

Maybe You Missed This:

The top five single season win totals in Butler basketball history have been recorded since Brad Stevens joined the Bulldogs' staff. He led the Bulldogs to 30 wins as head coach (2007-08), served as an assistant coach for Butler teams that won 29 games (2006-07), 27 games (2002-03) and 26 games (2001-02), and he was Director of Basketball Operations for Butler's 24-8 team in 2000-01.

Assistant Coach Matthew Graves



Matthew Graves, who helped lead the Bulldogs to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances as a player, is in his sixth season as an assistant coach for the Bulldogs. He spent two seasons (2001-03) on the Bulldogs' staff as coordinator of men's basketball operations, handling a variety of administrative duties for the Bulldogs before assuming an assistant coaching post in 2003. He's gained acclaim for his skill in both coaching and recruiting, and he was recognized as

one of the "Top 10" Mid-Major Assistants by FoxSports.com in the spring of 2008. During his tenure as an assistant coach, the Bulldogs have compiled a 108-53 record.

The former Butler player joined coach Todd Lickliter's staff in 2001-02, after serving assistant basketball coaching stints at both North Central High School and Ben Davis High School in Indianapolis. He was an assistant to former Butler player/coach Doug Mitchell at North Central.

Graves was a four-year basketball letterwinner at Butler, 1993-98. He was the third leading scorer for the Bulldogs in 1996-97, while helping Butler to a conference championship and its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 35 years. The following season, he was named Butler's most valuable player, while the Bulldogs repeated as league champion and made a return trip to the national tournament. He led the conference in free throw shooting in 1997-98, and he was named to the league All-Tournament team in 1998, after scoring a team-high 18 points in the league title game.

The sharpshooting guard finished his collegiate career in second place (he currently stands seventh) on Butler's all-time list for three-point field goals with 175 and in third place (now fifth) on the Bulldogs' all-time list for free throw shooting with a .846 mark. He scored a career-high 42 points (the fifth-highest single game scoring total in Butler history) against Cleveland State as a senior, and one game later scored 30 points against Detroit. Those two games were the best back-to-back scoring performances by a Butler player in more than a decade! He finished his Butler career with 994 career points.

Graves, who was a GTE Academic All-District selection in 1997-98, earned a B.S. degree in education (chemistry) from Butler in 1998. He received his Master's Degree in education administration from Butler in 2003. He and his wife, Susan, have two daughters, Abigail and Lillian.



Assistant Coach Terry Johnson



Terry Johnson, who formerly held an administrative post with the Bulldogs, was named assistant men's basketball coach at Butler in April of 2007. As a full-time assistant, he has recruiting, individual skills instruction, on-court coaching and game preparation responsibilities. During Johnson's first season as a full-time assistant, the Bulldogs, who were nationally ranked for 19 consecutive weeks, won the Great Alaska Shootout championship, captured

Horizon League regular season and tournament titles and posted a first round NCAA Tournament win.

Johnson spent the 2006-07 season as assistant men's coach at IPFW. From the summer of 2004 through the 2005-06 season, he was director of basketball operations at Butler. As director of basketball operations he handled administrative and operational duties for the Bulldogs, including team travel, working closely with the Blue Team, Butler men's basketball booster organization, and duties with Butler's summer basketball camps.

Prior to his 2004-06 position as Butler's director of basketball operations, Johnson coached at Auburn (2003-04), Lincoln Trail Junior College (2001-03), and Indiana Tech (1999-2001). Johnson began his coaching career at IPFW (1997-1999).

A three-sport athlete at Anderson (Ind.) High School, Johnson played both basketball and baseball at Lincoln Trail in Robinson, Ill., 1992-94. He was the first Lincoln Trail athlete to be named All-Conference in two sports, and he earned honorable mention All-America recognition in basketball. He went on to play both sports at Lamar University in Texas, 1994-96, and he led the basketball team at Lamar in assists and steals for two straight years.

Johnson earned his Bachelor's degree from IPFW in 1998. He played baseball for the Mastodons and was named All-Conference, team MVP, and Co-Male Athlete of the Year. He played professional baseball with the Tri-City Posse (Pasco, Wash.) in the Western League for two years and with the Anderson Lawmen in the Heartland League for one year.

Johnson and his wife, Kristen, were married in May of 2008 and the couple resides in Indianapolis.

Micah Shrewsberry, former head coach at IU-South Bend, is in his first season as an assistant coach with the Bulldogs. He joined Coach Brad Stevens' staff as Coordinator of Basketball Operations in 2007-08, handling administrative and organizational duties with the basketball program, including team travel, film exchange, booster club and summer camps. He assumed a full-time coaching position with the Bulldogs in July of 2008, taking on duties in

recruiting, skills instruction, game preparation and on-court coaching.

Shrewsberry came to Butler after guiding the basketball program at IU-South Bend for two seasons. He was named the first full-time men's basketball coach at the NAIA Division I school in 2005, and he directed all phases of the basketball program. He started the Titan Tip-Off Club, and he initiated the school's first Alumni Game. He further served as the Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference (CCAC) Division I Men's Basketball Chair in 2006-07.

Prior to his stint at IU-South Bend, Shrewsberry served as Director of Basketball Operations at Marshall University for two years, 2003-05. He also served as an assistant men's basketball coach at DePauw University (2001-03), where he helped the Tigers to a 42-12 record and a pair of conference championships, and at Wabash College (2000-01). He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant basketball coach at the University of Indianapolis (1999-2000).

A former basketball player at Cathedral High School in Indianapolis, Shrewsberry was a three-year starting guard and team tri-captain (1998-99) at Hanover College. He led the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference in free throw shooting (.833) and assists (4.4) in 1998-99.

Kevin Kuwik, a former assistant basketball coach at Ohio University, was named Coordinator of Basketball Operations at Butler in August of 2008. He has responsibility for administrative and organizational duties with the basketball program.

Kuwik brings 13 years of collegiate basketball coaching and administrative experience, which he coordinated around a 10-year military service. He was deployed to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2004, and he was awarded a Bronze Star for meritorious service, the highest award given by the Army

for merit. He received an honorable discharge in April of 2006.

Kuwik joined the coaching staff at Ohio University in 2001 and helped the Bobcats to a 120-95 record and two postseason tournament appearances during his tenure. He was on leave of absence in 2004-05 to fulfill an 18-month mission as an Army engineer captain, but he returned to the bench to help Ohio win the 2005 MAC Tournament championship and advance to the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament. He also helped the Bobcats to the inaugural College Basketball Invitational in 2008.

Kuwik began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Christian Brothers University in 1998. In 2000, he was named assistant coach at Saint Michael's, where he helped lead the Buccaneers to a 27-4 record, the best in school history, and a berth in the NCAA Division II Northeast Regional Final.

A native of New York, Kuwik attended the University of Notre Dame, where he served as a student assistant under men's basketball coach John MacLeod for three seasons, 1993-96. He graduated summa cum laude with a mechanical engineering degree ('96) and was a Distinguished Military Graduate in Notre Dame's Army ROTC program.

Ryan Galloy was named head athletic trainer at Butler in the summer of 2007, after serving as Associate Athletic Trainer during the 2006-07 school year. He previously had served for two years as an Assistant Athletic Trainer. He is the primary athletic trainer for men's basketball and men's and women's golf, while overseeing football coverage. He also serves as an adjunct professor in Butler's College of Education.

A 2000 graduate of Butler University, where he was a member of the football team, Galloy returned to the Bulldogs' staff in 2004, after serving as an assistant athletic

trainer at Concordia University in Illinois for one year. He was the head trainer for Concordia's football team, while also working closely with men's basketball and baseball. He also served for one year as Head Athletic Trainer at La Costa Canyon High School in California (2002-03) and as a graduate assistant athletic trainer at San Diego State (2000-02).

Originally from northern Illinois, Galloy enrolled at Butler in 1995. He was a linebacker on the football team for four seasons, and he finished as the team's fifth-leading tackler as a senior. He earned varsity letters in 1996 and 1998, while missing the 1997 season with a knee injury. The sports medicine major was named recipient of the team's Hilton U. Brown Mental Attitude Award as a senior.

Galloy earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Butler and a Master's Degree from San Diego State ('03). He's been certified as an athletic trainer by the National Athletic Trainers' Association and as a strength and conditioning specialist by the NSCA. He's engaged to Ball State athletic trainer Casey Chambers.

Barry Collier Director of Athletics

Two days after entering the school's Athletic Hall of Fame, Barry Collier was named athletic director at Butler University. Collier, the head men's basketball coach at the University of Nebraska for six seasons, was formally introduced as Butler's top athletic administrator by University President Dr. Bobby Fong at a press conference on campus on August 1, 2006.

The announcement returned Collier to Butler for the second time since he graduated from the north side Indianapolis school in 1976. He served as the Butler men's basketball coach for 11 seasons, 1989-2000, and compiled the second-highest win total in school history before leaving for the position at Nebraska. Butler had nine winning seasons during Collier's 11 years, and the Bulldogs made six postseason tournament appearances.

In six seasons at Nebraska, Collier led the Huskers to an 89-91 record and two trips to the National Invitation Tournament. His last three squads produced a 51-41 (.554) mark and both of the school's postseason tournament bids. Collier's teams averaged 11 wins at home per season during his six years, and his 2003-04 squad posted the second-highest win total in Devaney Center history with 15 victories.

During Collier's tenure in Lincoln, the Huskers saw an unprecedented rise in academic standing. Nebraska had a league-leading 15 first-team academic All-Big 12 selections between 2003 and 2006, including two academic all-district performers in 2006. In addition, 16 of the 20 Huskers who completed their senior seasons under Collier earned their college diplomas, and one is on pace to earn his degree.

Collier, 54, began his head-coaching career at Butler in 1989. In 11 seasons, he guided the Bulldogs to a 196-132 record, including a school-record five 20-win seasons. Prior to his arrival, Butler had just two 20-win seasons in 91 years of intercollegiate basketball. In his last four seasons at Butler, Collier guided the Bulldogs to a 90-39 record and four straight postseason tournament appearances. His 196 career wins remain the second-highest total in Butler history.

The former Butler basketball Most Valuable Player led the Bulldogs to the school's first Midwestern Collegiate Conference (now Horizon League) regular season men's basketball championship in 1996-97 and to back-to-back conference tournament titles in 1997 and 1998. He added another regular season title and a third tournament crown in 1999-2000, his final season at Butler. His 11-year conference record was 93-58 (.616) with seven first or second place regular season finishes. He was named league Coach of the Year in 1991, 1997, 1999 and 2000.

Three of Collier's Butler teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament and three others reached the NIT. During his 11 seasons as head coach at Butler, Collier had two players earn conference Player of the Year honors. He had one player named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America team and had one player earn a prestigious NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship. Of the 37 players who completed their senior season under him, 36 earned their degree.

Collier prepared for his step into the head coaching ranks by serving as an assistant coach at five different schools over a 13-year period. He began his coaching career at Rose Hulman Institute in 1976-77, and then followed with assistant coaching stops at Seattle Central Community College (1977-78), the University of Idaho (1978-83), the University of Oregon (1983-86) and Stanford University (1986-89). During his three seasons at Stanford under head coach Mike Montgomery, he helped lead the Cardinal to berths in the 1988 NIT and the 1989 NCAA Tournament.

When Butler selected Collier as men's basketball coach in 1989, it marked a homecoming for the former Bulldog. He first came to Butler as a student-athlete in 1974, following two years at Miami-Dade Community College. He played basketball under coach George Theofanis for two seasons at Butler, and he was named a team captain and co-MVP in 1975-76. As a senior, he averaged 15.2 points and a team-high 7.5 rebounds while earning first team all-conference recognition in the Indiana Collegiate Conference.

Collier attended Miami Palmetto High School in Miami, Fla., and later received an Associate of Arts degree from Miami-Dade. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Butler in 1976 and a Master of Science degree from Indiana State University in 1977. He has been a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches for 29 years, and he was named to the NABC Board of Directors in 2002.

Collier and his wife, Annette, are parents of three sons, Casey, Brady and Clay. Casey graduated from Nebraska in 2005, and he's currently in his third year of medical school at the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Brady graduated from Nebraska last spring and Clay is in his third year at Nebraska.



More Than 150 Years of Excellence and Innovation



The five faculty and 113 students present when Butler University opened in 1855 laid a solid foundation for more than 150 years of creative change and progress. As the University remembers its Sesquicentennial birthday in 2006, today's more than 4,000 students continue to look ahead while treasuring the traditions unique to Butler.

The young school, originally named North Western Christian University, was unusually innovative. It was the first in Indiana, and only the third in the nation, to admit women on an equal basis with men. With the appointment in 1858 of Catherine Merrill as Demia Butler Professor of English, the institution became the second in the country to appoint a woman faculty member, the first to establish an endowed chair specifically for a female professor and the first to establish a professorship in English literature. The school was also the first in Indiana to allow its students, with parental consent, to choose subjects suited to their needs under a new "elective" system.

As Indianapolis grew, the city's commercial district began to penetrate the heavily-wooded campus at what is now the corner of Thirteenth Street and College Avenue. In 1873, the board of directors decided to sell the downtown campus and accept a gift of 25 acres in Irvington, then a suburb east of Indianapolis. In 1877, North Western Christian University became Butler University, taking the name of its founder and benefactor, Indianapolis attorney Ovid Butler.

Butler moved again 50 years later, as the "Circle City" continued to grow. In 1928, classes were held for the first time in Jordan Hall, an imposing new Gothic structure erected on the beautiful Fairview Park Site, a wooded tract north of the city on the White River and the Inland Waterway Canal.

Today's students come from nearly every state in the nation and from many foreign countries to enroll in degree programs in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, or in one of four professional colleges -- Business Administration, Education, Fine Arts or Pharmacy and Health Sciences. Butler is one of only 21 private schools in the country offering a pharmacy program.



True to the vision of its founders, the University continues to offer an array of professional and pre-professional programs within the context of a strong commitment to the traditional arts and sciences and to the values of liberal education. Butler continues to welcome highly motivated, intellectually curious men and women, and to prepare them for lives of professional and community service and creative, ethical action. Butler is one of the top 20 U. S. colleges for producing business executives, is in the top 10% for preparing future Ph.D.s and is located in the #2 city for college graduates starting a career.

Although the thriving city of Indianapolis has once again grown to surround Butler University, the 290-acre campus remains a serenely beautiful area with 25 buildings, playing fields, a formal botanical garden, and a nature preserve surrounded by well-established residential communities. Located only five miles from "The Circle," the heart of the city, the campus offers easy access to cultural and sporting events in downtown Indianapolis.

Butler's mission is to provide the highest quality of liberal and professional education and to integrate the liberal arts into profession education by creating, and fostering a stimulating intellectual community built upon interactive dialogue and inquiry among faculty and students. Butler University is fully accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The University is licensed for teacher training by the State Department of Education in Indiana and appears on the approved list of the American Association of University Women.



Just when it seemed the sporting scene in Indianapolis couldn't get any better, it did! Long recognized as the "Amateur Sports Capitol of the World", Indianapolis is in the midst of another sports explosion. From the Indiana Pacers to the Final Four, Peyton Manning to the spectacular Victory Field, the Butler Bulldogs, the NCAA, and Conseco Fieldhouse, everywhere you turn sports are booming!

It's not surprising. Sports have played a key role in the development of the Hoosier state capital. Indianapolis gained an international reputation as host of the largest single-day sporting event in the world - the Indianapolis 500. In fact, the city hosts the two largest single-day sporting events in the world - the Indy 500 and the Brickyard 400, plus the Moto GP. Indianapolis hosted the Pan American Games in 1987, the NCAA Final Four in 1980, 1991, 1997, 2000 and 2006 (and will serve as host again in 2010), the World Gymnastics Championship in 1991, the World Rowing Championships in 1994, the World Basketball Championship in 2002, the World Swimming Championship in 2004, has hosted Olympic trials in swimming, diving, and synchronized swimming, national championships in gymnastics, boxing, track and field, rowing, canoe/kayak, swimming, diving, synchronized swimming, archery and ice skating, and numerous NCAA championships.

Indianapolis boasts the Indiana Pacers of the NBA, the Indiana Fever of the WNBA and the Indianapolis Colts of the NFL. The Triple A Indianapolis Indians play in one of the finest minor league baseball parks in the nation - Victory Field, and the city is called home by the Indianapolis Ice hockey team. Indy has hosted the 1993 U. S. Women's Open Professional Golf Tournament, the 1991 PGA, the Brickyard Crossing Senior Golf Classic and the 2005 Solheim Cup. The Indianapolis Tennis Championships at the Indianapolis Tennis Center is one of the major tournaments in the world.

The Hoosier capital houses the headquarters for numerous national amateur sports governing bodies, including the United States Gymnastics Federation, USA Track and Field, U. S. Diving, U. S. Synchronized Swimming and the United States Rowing Association. The Horizon League headquarters is located in Indianapolis and the NCAA national office moved to Indianapolis in 2001.

Not surprisingly, Indianapolis features a wide array of world-class sports facilities. The new state-of-the-art, 63,000-seat Lucas Oil Stadium is home to the Indianapolis Colts and will host NCAA basketball tournaments and numerous other events. The Indiana Pacers play in the 18,500-seat Conseco Fieldhouse. The city is home to the Indiana University Natatorium, featuring one of the fastest swimming pools in the world, the state-of-the-art National Institute for Fitness and Sport, the Indianapolis Tennis Center which houses 24 tennis courts and an 8,000-seat stadium, the 12,500-seat IU Track and Field Stadium, the Major Taylor Velodrome, historic Hinkle Fieldhouse and Victory Field.





The famed Indianapolis 500 is the world's largest single-day sporting event, drawing more than 400,000 fans annually.

While sports is a passion in Indianapolis (even the governor's mansion features a basketball goal in the driveway), the city offers much more. The 12th-largest city in the nation, boasting a population of more than 800,000, Indianapolis has a rich diversity of cultural and educational opportunities. There are 12 institutions of higher learning in or near the city, and Indianapolis boasts a number of outstanding museums, including the Indianapolis Museum of Art, the Eiteljorg Museum (American Indian and Western art), the Children's Museum (the world's largest), and Conner Prairie (given the highest ranking among living history museums).

The Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra performs at the historic Hilbert Circle Theatre and the Indiana Theatre Building serves as home to the Indiana Repertory Theatre and Dance Kaleidoscope, a modern dance company. Indianapolis' Ballet Internationale performs at the Murat Centre. The "Circle City" boasts the Indianapolis Children's Choir (the largest in the nation), two professional opera companies, the International Violin Competition of Indianapolis, the Madame Walker Theatre Center and numerous jazz and blues clubs. The Indianapolis Zoo, located near downtown Indianapolis, features more than 2,000 animals.



Lucas Oil Stadium, located in downtown Indianapolis, is the home of the NFL Indianapolis Colts, and it will serve as host to a wide variety of events, including the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship.

College Basketball's Original Palace

Hinkle Fieldhouse has reigned as one of the nation's great sports arenas for nearly eight decades. The classic facility was constructed in 1928 and it has stood up to the test of time, maintaining the splendor, character and atmosphere that made it one of the nation's most famous basketball arenas more than half a century ago.

The Fieldhouse, which remained virtually unchanged for more than 60 years, received a major face-lift during the summer of 1989. Among the changes to the historical building were new chairback seats in the lower arena, new doors and windows on the south side of the exterior, new basketball offices, a training room and locker rooms off the main arena, a VIP lounge, repaved parking lot, outside landscaping, extensive interior painting and a new public address system. More recently, the Fieldhouse has received a new weight room, new football offices, sports information/marketing offices, and administrative offices. All of the renovations have been geared toward upgrading the facility, while retaining the history and nostalgia of the home of "Hoosier Hysteria."

The original construction of Butler Fieldhouse was part of a massive project designed to give Butler one of the finest athletic plants in the nation. The project was financed by a corporation of 41 prominent and farsighted Indianapolis businessmen. Completion of the Fieldhouse

was guaranteed when Butler signed a lease agreement with the Indiana High School Athletic Association allowing the high school state tournament to be played in the massive new facility. Butler's association with the IHSAA continued from 1928 to 1971, with a brief interruption during the war years, 1943-45.

Butler played its first basketball game in the Fieldhouse on March 7, 1928, defeating Notre Dame 21-13, in overtime. Since the Fieldhouse was not entirely completed at that time, the building dedication was held off until December 21, 1928. The name of the facility was changed in 1966 from Butler Fieldhouse to Hinkle Fieldhouse in honor of Butler's

legendary coach and athletic director Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle, who built the University's athletic fame over nearly half a century.

In addition to being the home of Butler basketball, the Fieldhouse has been host to six U. S. presidents (Herbert Hoover, Dwight Eisenhower, Richard Nixon, Gerald Ford, Bill Clinton and George H. W. Bush), the Billy Graham Crusade, the Sonja Henie Ice Show, four professional basketball teams, the U.S. Olympic basketball trials, the first USA-USSR basketball game, all-star basketball games for the NBA and ABA as well as the East-West College All-Stars, the nationally-prominent Butler Relays in track, tennis matches of both Bill Tilden and Jack Kramer, the 1982 World Goal Ball Championships, a three-ring circus, several equestrian events, the Roller Derby, and a six-day bicycle race. The building also housed the U. S. military as a barracks during World War II. And Butler's homecourt was in the spotlight world-wide as the site of the championship game in the popular movie "Hoosiers."

During the summer of 1987, Hinkle Fieldhouse again received national and international attention as the site for the volleyball competition at the tenth Pan American Games. The largest crowd (14,500) ever to see a volleyball match in the United States gathered in the Fieldhouse to see the USA defeat Cuba in the men's gold medal match.

When the Fieldhouse was originally constructed, it was the largest basketball arena in the United States, and it retained that distinction for more than 20 years. Renovation in the early 1990's reduced the seating capacity from 15,000 to 11,043, and the current seating capacity is 10,000. But the aura and atmosphere that made Hinkle Fieldhouse the nation's first great basketball arena remains today.

"HOOSIERS"

In December of 1985, Hinkle Fieldhouse was turned into a Hollywood stage for the filming of the popular movie "Hoosiers," inspired by the 1954 Indiana High School state championship game at Butler Fieldhouse. Tiny Milan Indiana won the 1954 state championship when Bobby Plump hit a last second shot to defeat Muncie Central, 32-30. Plump later attended Butler University.

The production crew moved into the Fieldhouse for one week to shoot the climactic final scene in the movie. When the finished product was released to the general public, it became an instant hit. "Hoosiers" was recently named one of the "Top 10" sports movies ever!

"Home of the Bulldogs"

In 1989, the Bulldogs moved into a new basketball office/locker room complex located behind the west side of the main arena in Hinkle Fieldhouse. The newly constructed suite, which was part of a \$1.5 million renovation of Hinkle Fieldhouse, featured a main reception area, four basketball offices, a team film room, a film editing area and the team locker room and was both impressive and functional. That complex received a significant upgrade in 1998, and the resulting expanded facility rates among the finest in the Horizon League.

The "Home of the Bulldogs" is a combination locker room and team room. The dressing area includes individual wood cabinet lockers, bench seating and full-length mirrors, showers and restroom. Each locker is spacious and has multiple storage areas. The team room features soft furniture, a wood-shelf entertainment center, a big screen television and full-length wooden storage cabinets. The team room is available to players for use as a study lounge or a relaxation area, in addition to being used for team meetings and film sessions.

Both areas are spacious and well-lit. The complex has direct access to Butler's basketball office area, the Butler training room area and the main playing floor in Hinkle Fieldhouse.



Strength Training

All of Butler's athletes, including the men's basketball team, benefit from an extensive strength and conditioning program under the direction of a full-time strength and conditioning coordinator. The purpose of Butler's strength training program is twofold. One is to decrease injury potential, while the second is to increase performance potential. By increasing the strength of each athlete's muscles, bones and connective tissues, the chance of incurring an injury while performing lessens. And the increase in functional strength helps Butler athletes realize their athletic potential.

The strength and conditioning program stresses flexibility, agility, jumping skills, speed and reaction time, as well as strength. The program utilizes free weights, strength machinery, manual resistance and additional innovative techniques to help maximize the chance for Butler athletes to succeed.


The center of Butler's strength and conditioning program is the 4,000-square-foot weight training room located in Hinkle Fieldhouse. The weight room, which features an entire outside wall of glass, is stocked with free weights, weight machines, stationary bikes, and stairmasters, and allows Butler athletes to train in a comfortable environment.

Academic Support



The Athletic Academic Support Offices are located in Hinkle Fieldhouse. Student-athletes know that either the Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance or the Assistant Athletic Director for Student Development are available to assist them in solving academic and non-academic problems. Student athletes who need or desire academic support services are encouraged to seek assistance by either going to the athletic academic support staff

directly or to their coach for academic referral.


The Athletic Academic Support Office is organized by sport. In order to pro-actively monitor the academic progress of their student-athletes, the academic support staff has regularly scheduled meetings with student-athletes who have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or less. Additionally, any incoming freshmen who are identified as requiring specific academic performance standards, and/or student-athletes who are recommended by their coaches also meet on a regular basis with their athletic academic assistant. The academic support staff help student-athletes with the registration process, by making one-on-one and small group tutorial referrals, and by monitoring class attendance, grades and degree programs.

2008 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

Butler seniors A. J. Graves and Drew Streicher both were named to the 2008 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America University Division Men's Basketball Team. Graves, who earned Academic All-America recognition for the second straight year, was chosen to the second team of the national honor squad, while Streicher was picked to the third team. Butler was the lone school to have more than one student-athlete named to the 15-player Academic All-America Team.

Graves, a math/actuarial science major, became Butler's first two-time Academic All-American. As a junior, he became the first player in Butler men's basketball history to be named first team Academic All-America.

Streicher, who graduated with honors in chemistry in 2007, boasted a perfect grade point average as a graduate student in Butler's MBA program.



The James J. McCafferty Trophy is presented annually to the Horizon League's All-Sports champion. A symbol of a successful broad-based athletic program, the McCafferty Trophy is awarded to the league member compiling the greatest number of performance points in league championships. Schools earn performance points based on their finish in all 18 championship sports offered by the Horizon League. For the sports of men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball, men's and women's basketball, baseball and softball, points are awarded based on combined regular season and championship finish. In all other sports, points are based on finish in the championship.

The Bulldogs won the Great Alaska Shootout on the way to a school- and Horizon League-record 30 wins in 2007-08. Butler was ranked as one of the "Top 50" men's basketball programs since 1984-85 by ESPN.

Eighteen of Butler's 19 intercollegiate teams compete in the Horizon League, along with Cleveland State, Detroit, UIC, Loyola, UW-Green Bay, UW-Milwaukee, Valparaiso, Wright State and Youngstown State. The Butler football program is affiliated with the Pioneer Football League, which includes Campbell, Dayton, Drake, San Diego, Valparaiso, Davidson, Morehead State and Jacksonville. All of Butler's teams compete at the NCAA Division I level.

It was clear from the earliest days that athletics was destined to play a major role in shaping Butler University. When the school moved to its current Fairview Campus location in the 1920's, two of the first structures completed were a 15,000-seat fieldhouse and a 36,000-seat football stadium. The fieldhouse, which was the largest of its kind when it was completed in 1928, is now a historical landmark. The Butler Fieldhouse, renamed Hinkle Fieldhouse in 1966, came to symbolize not only Butler athletics, but also "Hoosier Hysteria" in Indiana. The building became the combined home of Butler basketball and the Indiana High School State Tournament. The legends of Indiana basketball, from Oscar Robertson to George McGinnis to Larry Bird, all played in the Fieldhouse at one time or another. The football stadium, named the Butler Bowl, was down-sized from 36,000 seats to a 20,000-seat stadium in the mid-1950's, and then underwent another major overhaul, including the addition of a new Pro Grass surface, in 2005. Currently, the Butler Bowl is home to Butler's football and soccer teams.

While Hinkle Fieldhouse provided a nationally acclaimed setting for Butler

athletics, it was Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle who brought national recognition to the school as a coach and athletic administrator. He came to Butler in 1921 and remained with the University until his death in 1992. Hinkle served as a teacher, coach and athletic administrator for nearly half a century, and he compiled more than 1,000 victories as coach of Butler's football, basketball and baseball teams. He made a particular impact on Butler's basketball program, winning 560 games from 1926 to 1970. Hinkle is enshrined in the James Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

The Bulldogs have carried on the winning tradition set forth by Hinkle. In the past decade, Butler teams have captured 44 conference championships. The Bulldogs have made appearances in NCAA National Championships in men's and women's basketball, men's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's cross country, lacrosse, men's tennis, men's and women's track and baseball. Butler captured the James J. McCafferty trophy, awarded annually by the Horizon League for all-sports excellence based on conference championship points, in six of the last 12 seasons.



In its 30th year, the Horizon League continues to aspire toward its goal of being one of the nation's leading athletics conferences while being recognized as a leader in the development of student-athletes as leaders and role models.

The Horizon League membership features ten public and private institutions that have impressive academic reputations and a storied tradition of broad-based athletic programs. Current membership includes Butler University, Cleveland State University, the University of

Detroit Mercy, the University of Illinois at Chicago, Loyola University Chicago, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Valparaiso University, Wright State University and Youngstown State University.

The Horizon League's primary focus is on adding value to the educational experience through its four platforms of athletic performance, academic achievement, community outreach, and personal responsibility and accountability. It is the League's belief that athletics is a powerful and visible resource tool that can be used to enhance student-athletes' collegiate experience. The Horizon League's goals are to enhance the holistic university experience for the student-athlete, to create an affiliation of institutions with similar athletic goals, and to adhere to the principals of integrity, diversity, excellence and growth.

The Horizon League sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis) and 10 for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis and volleyball). In all sports, all teams participate in their respective postseason League championships regardless of regular-season performance, allowing all student-athletes an opportunity to qualify for NCAA championships. The League receives automatic bids to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

The Horizon League is headquartered in Indianapolis, the "Amateur Sports Capitol of the World," with offices in the Pan American Plaza (201 S. Capitol Avenue), located just blocks from Lucas Oil Stadium, Conseco Fieldhouse and the NCAA national office.

BASKETBALL SUCCESS

The Horizon League has experienced unprecedented success on a national stage in recent years, highlighted by three Sweet 16 appearances in the past six seasons. Butler reached the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship in 2003 and 2007, while Milwaukee advanced in 2005. Horizon League teams have won nine NCAA Tournament games and six NIT (postseason) games since 2000. The league was represented by two teams in the 2003 and 2007 NCAA championships and in the 2002 NIT. Last year, Butler again brought national attention to the league by climbing as high as 8th in the national polls.





Mike Green started 70 consecutive games and helped Butler to 59 wins in just two seasons.

VICTORY MARK: For the second straight year, Butler ended a record-setting season in the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. And for the second consecutive season, the Bulldogs left the national tournament with a school single season record for victories. Butler defeated South Alabama, 81-61, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, before falling in overtime to #5/6 Tennessee, 76-71, in the second round. The win over South Alabama gave Butler 30 wins for the first time in school history and broke the previous school mark for victories (29), set last year. The two games in Birmingham, Ala., also capped off a season that saw the Bulldogs win the Great Alaska Shootout, capture a second consecutive Wooden Tradition Trophy, wrap up a second straight Horizon League regular season championship and claim the Horizon League Tournament title. The Bulldogs final 30-4 ledger established a Butler and Horizon League record for best 34-game mark.

Butler became the first team in Horizon League history to win 30 games.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS: Butler's berth in the 2008 NCAA Tournament was the 10th post-season tournament bid for the Bulldogs in the last 12 years. Since 1997, the Bulldogs have earned seven bids to the NCAA Tournament (1997, 1998, 2000, 2001, 2003, 2007 and 2008), and three berths in the National Invitation Tournament

(1999, 2002 and 2006). Butler improved its post-season record over that stretch to 10-10 (6-7 NCAA, 4-3 NIT), while winning a first round game for the fourth time in its last four NCAA Tournament appearances.

TWENTY PLUS: Butler posted its third consecutive 20-win season and its 10th 20-win campaign in the past 12 years. The Bulldogs also won more than 20 regular season games for the fourth time in school history. Butler had 16 victories away from Hinkle Fieldhouse this season, matching the school record set in 2006-07.

Butler set a school record with 27 regular season wins in 2007-08.

VICTORY LEDGER: Butler was one of just nine NCAA Division I teams to record 30 wins in 2007-08. Memphis set a Division I record with 38 victories, while national champ Kansas finished with 37 wins. North Carolina had 36 victories, followed by UCLA (35), Wisconsin (31), Tennessee (31), Texas (31), Butler (30) and Xavier (30).

TWO-YEAR RECORD: The Bulldogs established Butler and Horizon League records for best two-year win total with their 59 victories in 2006-07 (29) and 2007-08 (30). The previous record of 53 wins was set by Butler from 2001-03 (26 in 2001-02 and 27 in 2002-03). Only five NCAA Division I teams (Memphis 71-6, Kansas 70-8, North Carolina 68-10, UCLA 65-10, and Wisconsin 61-11) posted more wins than the Bulldogs over the past two years.

POLLING DATA: Butler ended the 2007-08 campaign with a "Top 15" national ranking in both the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today national polls for the first time in school history. The Bulldogs finished in the No. 11 spot in the A. P. national poll and with a No. 14 ranking in ESPN/USA Today poll. Butler was ranked in the "Top 25" of both national polls for 19 straight weeks, reaching as high as No. 8 in both polls on February 18.

Butler was ranked in the "Top 10" (A.P and/or ESPN/USA Today polls) for a school-record five weeks in 2007-08.

CAREER START: Head coach **Brad Stevens** became the first coach in Butler men's basketball history to own an 30-4 career record. Stevens' former boss, Todd Lickliter (2001-02), legendary coach Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle (1926-28), and Harlan O. "Pat" Page (1920-22) each posted a 28-6 record through their first 34 games.

FINAL FIVE

Butler's final winning percentage of .882 (30-4) ranked fifth in the NCAA Division I in 2007-08, topped only by the Final Four teams - Memphis (.950, 38-2), Kansas (.925, 37-3), North Carolina (.923, 36-3) and UCLA (.897, 35-4). Only national champ Kansas (3), national runner-up Memphis (2) and North Carolina (3) had fewer losses than the Bulldogs in 2007-08.

Stevens became the first men's basketball coach in Butler history to lead the Bulldogs to 30 wins in a season.

YOUTH GROUP: Butler's **Brad Stevens**, 31, became the third-youngest NCAA Division I coach to guide his team to 30 wins and the youngest in more than half a century! Bradley's Fordy Anderson won

his 30th game the day before his 31st birthday in 1950, and North Carolina's Ben Carnevale pick up 30 wins at age 30 in 1946. Only 11 Division I coaches in their 30's have posted a 30-win season.


ALL-AMERICA: Butler senior guard **Mike Green** earned honorable mention on both the Associated Press All-America Basketball Team and the CollegeHoops.net All-America squad. He further was named first team Mid-Major All-America by CollegeInsider.com and CollegeHoops.net. Senior guard **A. J. Graves** earned first team Mid-Major All-America honors by CollegeInsider.com and fourth team recognition by CollegeHoops.net. Graves also was named second team Lowe's Senior Class All-America.

TOP HONOR: Senior **Mike Green** became the third Butler player in seven years to be named Horizon League Player of the Year. The Butler guard received 42 of 46 votes from league coaches, media and SID's for the league's top individual honor. Green, who transferred to Butler from Towson, was named Horizon League Newcomer of the Year in 2006-07. He follows Rylan Hainje (2002) and Brandon Polk (2006) as recent Butler players named league Player of the Year.

GREEN PARTY: **Mike Green** was one of just eight players in the NCAA Division I to lead his team in scoring, rebounding and assists in 2007-08. He became the first Butler player to accomplish the feat since 1988-89, when Darren Fowlkes led the Bulldogs in all three categories. Green led the Horizon League and set a Butler single season record with 172 assists. He finished seventh in the league in scoring (14.6) and eighth in rebounding (6.5).

FRESH LOOK: Freshman forward **Matt Howard** became the second Butler player in as many years to be named Horizon League Newcomer of the Year. Howard, who followed teammate **Mike Green** as league Newcomer of the Year, became the first true freshman to earn the league honor since T. J. Lux of Northern Illinois received the award in 1995-96. Howard also was named to the CollegeInsider.com Freshman All-America Team.

ALL-DISTRICT: Butler seniors **Mike Green** and **A. J. Graves** were among 10 players named to the All-District 10 team by the National Association of Basketball Coaches. Green was named first team All-District 10, while Graves earned second team recognition. Green also was named to the All-District V Team by the U. S. Basketball Writers Association.



A. J. Graves finished his Butler career with 1,807 career points.

HANDLE WITH CARE: Butler wound up leading the Horizon League and ranking among the top five teams in the NCAA Division I in fewest turnovers per game for the seventh consecutive season. The Bulldogs, who led the nation in fewest turnovers in 2006-07, ranked fourth in Division I (10.4) in 2007-08. Butler had a season-low five turnovers in a victory at home over Milwaukee.

FIRST DEFENSE: The Bulldogs led the Horizon League and ranked seventh in the NCAA Division I in team scoring defense (58.4). It was the third straight year that Butler topped the Horizon League in scoring defense. The Bulldogs also topped the league in three-point field goal percentage defense (.318). The Bulldogs held 16 opponents below 60 points in 2007-08.

FAMILY PRIDE

A. J. Graves, who followed two older brothers to Butler, closed out his collegiate career as Butler's third all-time leading scorer with 1,807 points. He wound up second in all-time three-point field goals (303) and in all-time free throw shooting (.900). And he tied for sixth place on Butler's all-time list for assists (316). Graves set a Butler record for games played (130) and games started (124).

• Butler captured its first Horizon League Tournament championship since 2001 with a 70-55 victory over Cleveland State in the league title game at Hinkle Fieldhouse. The championship game win gave the Bulldogs their league-high fifth Horizon League Tournament trophy.

• Senior **Mike Green** matched his career-highs with 24 points and 13 rebounds in the Horizon League Tournament championship game. He also led the Bulldogs to a 66-50 victory over UIC in the tournament semifinals with 19 points, seven rebounds and seven assists. Green became the fifth Butler player to be named the Horizon League Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.



• Senior **Drew Streicher** hit a career-high three three-point field goals and finished with a season-high 11 points in Butler's championship game victory over Cleveland State.





2008 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship



•The Bulldogs' 81-61 victory over South Alabama in the first round of the 2008 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship marked the fourth time since 2001 that Butler began NCAA Tournament play with a win.

•The 81 points the Bulldogs scored against South Alabama were a Butler NCAA Tournament record for a regulation game (Butler scored 87 points in overtime against Western Kentucky in 1962). Butler also set a school mark for largest margin of victory in an NCAA Tournament game with the 20-point win.

•Butler's 20-point victory over South Alabama matched the fourth-highest first round win ever by a No. 7 seed, equaling the mark set by Wichita State's 86-66 win over Seton Hall in 2006.

•Senior forward **Pete Campbell** matched the Butler single game NCAA Tournament scoring record with 26 points against South Alabama. He also tied the school mark for field goals (9) and three-point field goals (8) in NCAA Tournament play, while setting a new school record for field goal percentage (.918, 9-11).

•Senior **A. J. Graves** scored a team-best 39 points in Butler's two NCAA Tournament games, including 21 in Butler's overtime loss to Tennessee. He finished his Butler career with 87 points in five NCAA Tournament games.

•Senior **Mike Green** finished with 54 points, 33 rebounds and 19 assists in five NCAA Tournament games.

•Butler's game against second-seeded Tennessee marked the first time in NCAA Tournament history that two teams with 30 wins met in the second round.

•Butler has been to the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship more times than any other team in the Horizon League. The Bulldogs own eight NCAA Tournament appearances, including seven in the past 12 years. Butler improved to 8-8 all-time in NCAA Tournament play.

2009 Horizon League Men's Basketball Championship

Under the tournament's format, the championship will begin on Tuesday, March 3, with four first-round games matching teams seeded three through ten, with the four higher seeded teams hosting their respective contests. Friday, March 6, will feature the second-round contests at the home of the top-seeded team. The top two seeds will play the winners of Friday's games in the semifinals on Saturday, March 7.

The Horizon League championship game will be played on Tuesday, March 11, at the site of the highest remaining seed. The championship game will be nationally televised on ESPN at 9 p.m. (ET).

Butler won both the Horizon League regular season title and the Horizon League Tournament championship in 2007-08. The Bulldogs defeated UIC, 66-50, in the semifinals of the league championship at Hinkle Fieldhouse and then beat second-seeded Cleveland State, 70-55, in the title game before a national television audience on ESPN.




Duane Lightfoot set a Butler season record for field goal shooting by hitting 155 of 236 (.657) field goal attempts in 2002-03.




Thomas Jackson set a Butler single game assist record with 15 against Detroit in the 2000 MCC Tournament.



Darnell Archey 85 Consecutive Free Throws Made 2001-03

Butler's Darnell Archey established an NCAA Division I record by hitting 85 consecutive free throws over three seasons. His streak began at Hinkle Fieldhouse on Feb. 15, 2001, and ended in the Fieldhouse on Jan. 18, 2003. Archey, who did not miss a free throw during the entire 2001-02 season, tied the previous NCAA record of 73 consecutive free throws (set by Gary Buchanan of Villanova, 2000-01) in the championship game of the Rainbow Classic in Hawaii, and then he broke the record with his first free throw at UIC on Jan. 4, 2003. Archey's record streak came to an end with 3:42 remaining in Butler's home victory over Youngstown State on Jan. 18, 2003.



NABC National Coach of the Year



Butler men's basketball coach **Todd Lickliter** was selected as the 2007 Division I Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). He received his award on April 1, 2007 at the AT & T/NABC Awards Show at the Sydney Marcus Auditorium in Atlanta, Ga., during Final Four weekend.

Lickliter guided the Bulldogs to a school and Horizon League record 29 victories in 2006-07. He led Butler to a regular season co-championship in the Horizon League and then took the Bulldogs to the Sweet 16 of the 2007 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. Butler defeated Old Dominion in the first round of the tournament and then beat #18 Maryland in the second round, before falling to eventual national

champion Florida in the Sweet 16.

Butler was picked sixth in the Horizon League's preseason poll, but the Bulldogs wasted little time proving the predictors wrong. Lickliter's club opened the season with a 40-point win at Tulane and then captured the Midwest Region title of the NIT Season Tip-Off with back-to-back victories over Notre Dame and Indiana. The Bulldogs continued to roll in New York, defeating #22 Tennessee and #23 Gonzaga to capture the NIT Season Tip-Off title.

Lickliter led the Bulldogs to 10 straight wins to open the season, including a victory over Purdue in the Wooden Tradition. The 10 wins matched the second-fastest start in school history and the fifth-longest winning streak in school annals. Butler cracked the "Top 25" on Nov. 27 and the Bulldogs were nationally-ranked for a school and league record 16 consecutive weeks (broken in 2007-08). Lickliter's club became the first team in Horizon League history to break into the nation's "Top 10" on Feb. 5!

The 2006-07 Bulldogs became the first team in league history to record 20 wins before February and the first Horizon League team to win 26 regular season games. Butler had three wins over teams that were ranked in the "Top 25" and eight victories over squads that advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Lickliter became the first Butler basketball coach to be selected for the NABC's highest award. He's also became the first coach in Horizon League history to be honored by the national coaches organization.



Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle (1898-1992)



Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle was the man who molded Butler University's athletic tradition. He served Butler for nearly half a century as a teacher, coach and athletic administrator, and then continued to stay active at the university following his retirement in 1970, filling the position of special assistant to the president.

The legendary coach came to Butler in 1921 and, except for a brief interruption in the early 1940's when he served as a naval officer, he remained with the university until his death in September, 1992. Among his many accomplishments was a basketball national championship in 1929. He led Butler to its first NIT berth in 1958 and to its first NCAA Tournament berth in 1962. In 1966, the Butler Fieldhouse was renamed Hinkle Fieldhouse in his honor. He coached in the East-West College All-Star game, the Indiana-Kentucky College All-Star game, and in the first game between the United States all-star team and the Soviet Union all-stars. While serving in the navy in 1943, he coached the Great Lakes team to a memorable upset of previously unbeaten Notre Dame.

During his time at Butler, Hinkle coached the school's football, basketball and baseball teams to over 1,000 victories, placing him among the nation's all-time winningest collegiate coaches and earning him a reputation as one of the nation's top three-sport coaches of all-time. His 560 career basketball wins rank him among the NCAA's "Top 40" all-time winningest basketball coaches, and his 41 years of coaching service rank fifth on the NCAA's all-time list behind Phog Allen of Kansas, Jim Phelan of Mount St. Mary's, Ed Diddle of Western Kentucky and Ray Meyer of DePaul.


Hinkle, born Dec. 19, 1898, was a member of the James Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame, the Helms Foundation Football and Basketball Halls of Fame, the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame and the NACDA Hall of Fame. He was a president of the National Collegiate Basketball Coaches Association, and in 1962, he received the NCBCA's top award for his contributions to the game. He was also voted a special citation from the Football Writers Association of America for his work in college football.


Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle is the man who originated the orange colored basketball. Until the late 1950's, basketballs were dark brown, but Hinkle wanted a ball that could be better seen by players and fans. He worked with The Spalding Company to come up with a new ball, which was tested at the 1958 NCAA Finals in Louisville. The NCAA was impressed and the new orange ball was adopted.



The team won the NIT Season Tip-Off with victories over Notre Dame, Indiana, #22 Tennessee and #23 Gonzaga, and then cracked the "Top 25" for a school- and league-record 16 consecutive weeks! Butler became the first school in league history to achieve a "Top 10" national ranking. Seeded fifth in the NCAA Tournament, the Bulldogs reached the "Sweet 16" for the second time in five

years with wins over Old Dominion and #18 Maryland, before falling to eventual national champion Florida. Butler coach Todd Lickliter was named NABC National Coach of the Year.


Coming off the best season in school history and featuring five key seniors, head coach Brad Stevens knew expectations would be high in 2007-08. His squad met and exceeded expectations! The first-year Butler coach led the Bulldogs to a championship at the Great Alaska Shootout, a second consecutive Wooden Tradition trophy, a second straight Horizon League regular season title and the team's first Horizon League Tournament championship since 2001. The Bulldogs won a first round NCAA Tournament game against South Alabama, before falling in overtime in the second round to second-seeded Tennessee. Butler became the first team in Horizon League history to win 30 games and just the second team ever to win 16 league games. The Bulldogs were ranked in the "Top 25" for a school and league-record 19 consecutive weeks, including a school and league-record five weeks in the "Top 10." Senior guard Mike Green became the fifth Butler player to be named Horizon League Player of the Year, and freshman Matt Howard was chosen league Newcomer of the Year.






