Bulldogs Return To The Final Four

RETURN VISIT: Butler is returning to the Final Four of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship for the second consecutive year. The Bulldogs (27-9), champions of the Southeast Regional, will face No. 11 seed Virginia Commonwealth (28-11) in the first semifinal game on Saturday, April 2. The contest is scheduled to tip at 6:09 p.m. (ET) at Reliant Stadium in Houston, Texas. The second semifinal will match No. 3 seed Connecticut (30-9) against No. 4 seed Kentucky (29-8) at 8:49 p.m. Butler, a No. 8 seed, began its march to the Final Four with dramatic victories over Old Dominion, 60-58, in the second round and top-seeded Pittsburgh. 71-70, in the third round. The Bulldogs then defeated No. 4 seed Wisconsin, 61-54, in the Southeast Regional semifinals, before knocking off No. 2 seed Florida, 74-71 in overtime, in the regional championship game. Butler is the lone school returning to this year's Final Four. The Bulldogs advanced to the national championship game a year ago.

Butler is the first school from Indiana to earn consecutive trips to the Final Four.

BONUS PLAY: The Bulldogs have advanced to post-season tournament play for the 13th time in 15 years. Butler earned bids to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship in 1997, 1998, 2000, 2001, 2003, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010 and this season, and to the National Invitational Tournament in 1999, 2002 and 2006. Butler's post-season record since 1997 is 15-12 (11-9 NCAA, 4-3 NIT).

TOP 20: Butler recorded its sixth consecutive 20-win season and its 13th 20-win ledger in the past 15 campaigns with a victory at UIC on Feb. 19. The Horizon League record for most consecutive 20win seasons is seven, set by the Bulldogs from 1996 to 2003. Butler, coming off a school and league record 33-win campaign a year ago, has averaged 29.0 wins over the past five seasons, including two 30win campaigns, and posted a winning percentage of .824. The Bulldogs are the only team in Horizon League history to record five or more consecutive 20-win seasons and they've done it twice (1996-2003 and 2006-2011)!

The Bulldogs have tied the fourth-highest win total (27) in school history.

SUCCESS STREAK: Butler has won its last 13 games, including four in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship. The Bulldogs' last loss came on Feb. 3 at Youngstown State, 62-60. The 13-game winning streak is Butler's longest of the season and the second-longest streak under head coach Brad Stevens.

The Bulldogs have tied the third-longest winning streak in Butler history.

MARCH GLADNESS: The Bulldogs are 17-3 in the month of March in four seasons under head coach Brad Stevens. Butler has won 12 straight March contests, since dropping a game to LSU in the 2009 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship.

PLANTING SEEDS: Butler is the first team in NCAA Tournament history to defeat both a No. 1 and a No. 2 seed before the Final Four in consecutive years. The Bulldogs beat top-seeded Pittsburgh in the third round of this year's tournament and then defeated No. 2 seed Florida in the Southeast Regional championship game. A year ago, Butler beat top-seeded Syracuse in the West Regional semifinals and then upended No. 2 seed Kansas State in the regional championship.

PULLING RANK: Butler's victory over #15-ranked Florida was the Bulldogs' third against a nationally-ranked squad in eight days. The Bulldogs, who beat #4 Pittsburgh and #16 Wisconsin prior to the Florida win, have eight victories in their last 10 games against nationally-ranked opponents. Both setbacks during that stretch came to Duke. Butler has beaten nine nationally-ranked foes since Brad Stevens took over as head coach in 2007-08, including eight in NCAA Tournament play. A year ago, the Bulldogs posted consecutive victories over #4 Syracuse, #7 Kansas State and #13 Michigan State on the way to the NCAA Division I national championship game.

REGIONAL REVERSAL: Butler took two different routes to the championship stage at the Southeast Regional in New Orleans. The Bulldogs pulled away to a nine-point halftime lead in the semifinals against Wisconsin and then stretched that margin to as many as 20 points midway through the second half, before holding off a late Wisconsin rally. Two days later, Butler found itself trailing Florida by 11 points midway through the final period, before rallying to tie the game in the final 30 seconds and send it into overtime. The Bulldogs out-scored Florida, 14-11, in the extra session to claim their second consecutive regional title.

PRIME TIME: Junior Shelvin Mack grabbed the spotlight on Butler's biggest stage this season and led the Bulldogs to the Southeast Regional championship with a game-high 27 points against Florida. The 6-3 guard scored 14 points in the first half and then added 13 more in the second half and overtime period. His three-point field goal with 1:21 left in the extra session gave Butler the lead for good at 72-70, and he later added Butler's final points with a pair of free throws with 0:10 left. Mack had four rebounds and a team-high four assists in the victory.

Shelvin Mack has scored in doublefigures in 27 of Butler's last 29 games.

SEEING DOUBLE: Senior Matt Howard led the Bulldogs against Wisconsin with 20 points and 12 rebounds. It was his ninth double-double this season and the 20th of his Butler career. The 12 rebounds are the most Howard has had in his NCAA Tournament career, while the 20 points are the second-most he's scored in 12 NCAA Tournament games (Howard had 22 points against LSU in 2009). The 6-8 forward tied Butler's NCAA Tournament single game rebounding record (first set by Jeff Blue against Bowling Green in 1962).

Matt Howard has led the Bulldogs in rebounding in 23 games this season.

TOP PERFORMERS: Butler's Shelvin Mack was named the Most Outstanding Player at the Southeast Regional, after leading the Bulldogs to the team title. Mack had 40 points in Butler's two wins in New Orleans, including a game-high 27 in the championship game. Senior Matt Howard, who tallied 34 points in Butler's wins over Wisconsin and Florida, joined Mack on the All-Tournament squad. The other three All-Tournament slots went to Florida's trio of Alex Tyus, Vernon Macklin and Kenny Boynton. Mack made the NCAA Regional All-Tournament squad for the second consecutive year.

BOARD ROOM: Butler out-rebounded both Wisconsin and Florida on the way to the Southeast Regional championship. Despite giving away considerable size to both opponents, the Bulldogs came away with a 37-31 rebounding advantage over Wisconsin and a 41-34 advantage over Florida. Butler had 16 offensive rebounds against Florida and out-scored the Gators, 18-12 on second chance points. Senior Matt Howard led the Bulldogs with 17 rebounds in the two wins.

Butler has out-rebounded three of its four NCAA Tournament opponents.

Coach of the Year: Rob Jeter, Milwaukee TOURNAMENT DRAMA: The Bulldogs, led by senior forward Matt Howard, turned in two performances in Washington, D.C., that weren't for the faint-of-heart. Butler went to the final second against Old Dominion, before Howard converted a layup at the buzzer to pull out a 60-58 victory. Two days later, Butler's Andrew Smith hit a lay-up with under three seconds remaining to give the Bulldogs a 70-69 lead over topseeded Pittsburgh. But it didn't end there! On the ensuing in-bounds pass, Butler's Shelvin Mack fouled Pittsburgh's Gilbert Brown with under two seconds left. The Pitt forward made the first free throw to tie the game, but missed the second. Howard grabbed the rebound and was fouled by Pitt's Nasir Robinson with less than a second on the clock. Howard made the first free throw to give Butler a 71-70 lead and then intentionally missed the second.

SENIOR MOMENT: Forward **Matt Howard**, who shared team scoring honors against Old Dominion with junior **Shelvin Mack**, scored eight of his 15 points in the final 7:25 against the Monarchs. His lay-up at 7:25 put Butler on top, 51-50, and erased Old Dominion's final lead in the game, and then he gave Butler its biggest lead in the final 10 minutes, 58-52, with a pair of free throws at 2:43. He capped his closing run with his buzzer-beater.

OFF THE GLASS: Butler head coach Brad Stevens repeatedly stressed the importance of rebounding against Old Dominion, the nation's No. 1 rebounding team. The Bulldogs responded by outboarding the national leaders, 32-29. Butler pulled down a season-high 18 offensive rebounds in the game, including a team-high five by junior Garrett Butcher. Sophomore Andrew Smith and Butcher tied for team rebounding honors with six apiece, while senior Matt Howard added five. The Bulldogs were just the second team to out-rebound Old Dominion this season and the first since Jan. 13.

DEPT. OF DEFENSE: The Bulldogs held Old Dominion to its lowest point total (58) in more than a month and nearly eight points below its season scoring average. It was the fourth time in five games that Butler held its opponent under 60 points. The Bulldogs held five straight foes below 60 points in last year's march to the NCAA National Championship game.

The Bulldogs are yielding 59.6 points during their current winning streak.

LOOKING LONG: The Bulldogs' 12 three-point field goals against Pittsburgh were Butler's second-highest single game

total this season, trailing only the 13 threepointers the Bulldogs had at Valparaiso. Butler posted nine three-pointers against Florida, seven against Old Dominion and five against Wisconsin in its other three NCAA tournament games.

Butler is 17-3 this season when hitting eight or more three-point field goals.

RANKING WINS: The Bulldogs' victory over #4-ranked Pittsburgh was Butler's fourth against a "Top 10" nationally ranked opponent since 2000 and its third in the past two NCAA Tournaments. Butler defeated #4 Syracuse and #7 Kansas State in the West Regional of last year's NCAA Tournament. Butler's other "Top 10" win came at Wisconsin in January of 2000.

2011 NCAA Tournament 2nd/3rd Round Notes

SEEDING SEASON: Butler's No. 8 seed in this year's NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship is the fourth-highest in school history. The Bulldogs earned a No. 5 seed in 2007 and again last year and a No. 7 seed in 2008. Butler has had a single digit seed in each of the last five NCAA Tournaments.

HOME TEAM: With the victory over Old Dominion, Butler improved to 5-0 in NCAA Tournament play as the higher (lower number) seeded team. Two of those five wins have come against Old Dominion.

CLOSE COMPETITION: Butler's game against Old Dominion was tied 10 times and featured 21 lead changes. The Bulldogs' biggest lead in the game was six points, 49-43, with 10:17 remaining, while Old Dominion's biggest margin was five points, 18-13, midway through the first half.

FIRST DEFENSE: Butler held Old Dominion to its lowest point total (58 points) in the past 12 games. It was the sixth time in seven NCAA Tournament games that the Bulldogs kept an opponent below 60 points. The Monarchs managed just five field goals in the second half against Butler and just 16 for the game. The 16 total field goals were the second-lowest total for Old Dominion this season.

HOT SHOTS: Top-seeded Pittsburgh shot 61.9% (13-21) in the second half against Butler and 56.5% (26-46) for the game. It was the best shooting performance by a Butler opponent this season.

DIALING LONG DISTANCE: The Bulldogs' eight first-half three-point field goals against Pittsburgh were the most by Butler in an opening half this season and the total matched the most in a half this season. It also ranked as the most three-point field goals allowed in a half by Pittsburgh in 2010-11.

RECORD TOTAL: Shelvin Mack became the first player in Butler basketball history to score 30 points in an NCAA Tournament game with his 30-point performance against Pittsburgh. It boosted his all-time NCAA Tournament scoring total to 155 points, also a Butler record. Mack had a Butler tournament record 10 field goals in the win.

BOARDING PASS: Two days after outrebounding Old Dominion, the nation's No. 1 rebounding team, the Bulldogs recorded a season-low 22 rebounds against Pittsburgh. The Panthers out-rebounded Butler 33-22.

SEEDING TIME: Butler became the 10th No. 8 seed to defeat a No. 1 seed since the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship moved to 64 teams in 1985.

SCORING STREAK: Junior Shelvin Mack posted his 20th consecutive double-figures scoring performance with 27 points in Butler's win over Florida. He had 13 points against Wisconsin, 30 in the win over Pittsburgh and 15 against Old Dominion. The 30 points against Pittsburgh were the most ever scored by a Butler player in NCAA Tournament action. Mack has 85 points in Butler's four tournament contests.

Shelvin Mack needs 10 points to tie Butler's NCAA Tournament scoring record, held by Gordon Hayward (2010).

CENTURY MARK: Junior Shelvin Mack became the first player in Butler basketball history to score 100 points in NCAA Tournament action with his first field goal in last year's national title game. Former teammate Gordon Hayward became the second later in the game, while senior Matt Howard became the third in Butler's victory over Pittsburgh this year. Mack is Butler's all-time tournament scoring leader with 195 career NCAA points, while Howard stands second with 148. Hayward is third with 107.

RECORD APPEARANCE: Seniors Matt Howard, Shawn Vanzant and Zach Hahn tied the Butler record for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances (4), set by former teammate Willie Veasley last year. The three seniors passed also set a school record for most NCAA Tournament games played with 13.

TOURNAMENT CHAMPS: Butler used a rock-solid defensive effort to knock off topseeded Milwaukee, 59-44, and successfully defend its title in the Horizon League Men's Basketball Championship. The Bulldogs limited Milwaukee, playing on its home floor in front of its largest crowd of the season, to just one field goal in the first 11 minutes of the game, while jumping out to a 23-6 lead. The Panthers managed just four field goals, while shooting 21.1%, in the entire first half! Milwaukee did make a charge in the second half, trimming the Butler lead to 42-39 with 9:45 remaining, but the Bulldogs responded with a 16-1 run to put the decision out of reach. The Panthers' 44 points were the fewest allowed by Butler this season, as were Milwaukee's 12 total field goals.

Butler has picked up four championship trophies this season.

MVP: For the second straight year, senior Matt Howard led the Bulldogs in the Horizon League Tournament championship

Butler vs. VCU

•Butler and Virginia Commonwealth are meeting for just the second time as basketball opponents and for the first time since Dec. 2, 1970. The Bulldogs won that first meeting, 99-97, at Hinkle Fieldhouse.

Butler vs. Kentucky

- •Butler and Kentucky have met as basketball opponents on three previous occasions, including once in the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats won each of the three previous meetings.
- •The Bulldogs' last meeting with Kentucky came at Rupp Arena on Nov. 27, 1982. The No. 4-ranked Wildcats ran away with a 90-53 decision in that game.
- •Butler and Kentucky played in the round of 16 in the 1962 NCAA Tournament in Iowa City, Iowa. The Wildcats, ranked third in the nation, defeated the Bulldogs, 81-60, in the regional semifinals, before falling to Ohio State in the regional finals.

game, and for the second consecutive year, Howard was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player. The 6-8 Butler forward finished with a game-high 18 points, five rebounds, three assists, two steals and a blocked shot against Milwaukee, and he averaged 16.0 points and 6.5 rebounds in the Bulldogs' two tournament wins. He hit 12 of 18 (.667) shots in the two tournament games at U. S. Cellular Arena, including seven of nine in the championship game. Howard became just the third player in Horizon League history to claim the league's tournament MVP award in consecutive years.

Matt Howard is the first player in Horizon League history to earn league All-Tournament honors four times.

ALL-TOURNAMENT: Senior Matt Howard was one of three Butler players named to the All-Tournament Team at the conclusion of the 2011 Horizon League Men's Basketball Championship. Junior Shelvin Mack was picked to the All-Tournament squad for the third consecutive year, while senior Shawn Vanzant made the honor squad for the first time. It was the fifth time (all since 2000) that Butler placed three players on the

league All-Tournament Team. The Bulldogs set a league record with four players named to the 2010 All-Tournament Team.

FINISHING TOUCH: Senior Shawn Vanzant averaged 13.0 points at the Horizon League Men's Basketball Championship, including a team-high 18 points in Butler's semifinals victory over Cleveland State. Vanzant, playing in his final Horizon League Tournament, hit five of eight three-point field goal attempts to help the Bulldogs to the two tournament wins.

BOARDING PASS: Sophomore Andrew Smith posted his third career double-figures rebounding performance with a game-high 10 rebounds against Milwaukee in the Horizon League Tournament championship game. Smith also shared the team rebounding lead with eight against Cleveland State in the tournament semifinals. Smith has averaged a team-best 7.2 rebounds during Butler's current winning streak.

BANNER WIN: Butler's victory over Loyola in the final regular season game gave the Bulldogs a share of a league-record fifth consecutive regular season championship. It was Butler's tenth overall league regular season title, also a league record. The Bulldogs have won nine Horizon League regular season titles in the past 12 years.

TROPHY ROOM: Butler captured its league-record seventh Horizon League Tournament championship with its victory over Milwaukee in the league final. The seven titles broke the previous league mark that the Bulldogs shared with Xavier.

ALL-DISTRICT: Butler's duo of senior Matt Howard and junior Shelvin Mack were among 10 players named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) 2011 All-District 12 Team. Howard was named to the All-District Team for the third consecutive year and was chosen first team

for the second time in three years. Mack, a first team All-District pick a year ago, was named to the second team this year. Both Butler players are now eligible for the NABC Division I All-America Team, which will be announced on April 2 in Houston.

ALL-LEAGUE: Senior Matt Howard and junior Shelvin Mack both were honored on the 2010-11 Horizon League Men's Basketball All-League Team. Howard was named to the All-League squad for the fourth consecutive year and was tabbed first team All-League for the third successive season. He's the 12th player in league history and the second Butler player (Chad Tucker, 1985-88) to earn first team All-League honors three times. Mack was named second team All-League, after being a first team pick in 2009-10.

ALL-DEFENSIVE: Senior Matt Howard and junior Ronald Nored were named to the five-player Horizon League All-Defensive Team. It was the second straight year on the team for Nored, who was league Co-Defensive Player of the Year in 2009-10, while Howard earned a spot on the defensive squad for the second time in three years.

QUICK START: Butler head coach Brad Stevens owns the top spot on the NCAA Division I list for Best Career Starts By Wins, 4 seasons. The Bulldogs' coach, who boasts a four-year record of 116-24, climbed past previous four-year leader Everett Case of North Carolina State, who compiled a 107-22 record from 1947-50. Stevens also holds the NCAA three-year record with 89 victories, and he's second on the two-year list with 56 wins.

Brad Stevens ranks fifth in all-time coaching victories at Butler.

TOURNAMENT TIME: Brad Stevens is the first Butler head coach to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of his first four seasons at the helm of the Bulldogs. He also participated in the NCAA Tournament as Butler's director of basketball operations in 2000, and as a Butler assistant coach in 2003 and 2007. He's been on the sidelines with the Bulldogs for 15 of Butler's 17 all-time NCAA Tournament wins.

LEAGUE LEADER: Butler leads all Horizon League members in NCAA Tournament wins with 15 since the league was formed in 1979-80. All other current members have combined for 10 NCAA Tournament wins during their time in the league. Former league member Xavier has the secondmost wins with five during its 16 years in the conference.

2011 NCAA Tournament Southeast Regional Notes

PERFECT MARK: Butler improved to 2-0 in the NCAA Regional finals with its win over Florida and advanced to the Final Four for the second straight year. The last team to advance to consecutive Final Fours was Michigan State in 2008-09 and 2009-10.

OVERTIME PAY: Butler's overtime game against Florida was the Bulldogs' first in NCAA Tournament play since 2008, when Tennessee prevailed, 76-71, in an extra session contest. The Bulldogs, who lost to Florida in overtime in 2000, improved to 2-2 in NCAA Tournament overtime games.

DEPT. OF DEFENSE: Butler limited Wisconsin to just 29 points in the first 30 minutes of the Sweet 16 victory and just 58 points for the game. The Badgers were averaging 68.4 coming into the game and had posted a 71.0 average in their first two tournament games. The Bulldogs held Wisconsin scoreless for the final 3:11 of the first half and the first 14:03 of the second half, while building a 20-point advantage.

END GAME: Butler handed Florida its first Regional Final loss. The Gators had advanced to the Final Four in each of their previous four Regional Final appearances. The Bulldogs also beat Florida for the first time in three tournament meetings.

LOOKING LONG: The Bulldogs hit 14 three-point field goals in their two wins in New Orleans and now have connected on 33 three-pointers (8.3) in their four tournament contests. Butler's tournament record for three-point field goals is 44, set in six games a year ago.

SUNSHINE DUO: Butler senior Shawn Vanzant, a native of Tampa, Fla., finished with seven points and seven rebounds in 38 minutes of action against Florida, while freshman Kyle Marshall, who's from Davie, Fla., came off the bench with 10 points and seven offensive rebounds. Vanzant attended Wharton High School in Tampa, while Marshall played at Flanagan High School in Pembroke Pines, Fla.

BENCH PRESS: Butler's non-starters out-scored Florida's reserves, 23-2, in the Bulldogs' Southeast Regional championship tilt. The Bulldogs picked up 10 points from Khyle Marshall, six from Zach Hahn, four from Ronald Nored and three from Chrishawn Hopkins in the win.

LUCKY 13: With the 61-54 victory over Wisconsin and the 74-71 overtime win against Florida in New Orleans, the Bulldogs have now won their four 2011 NCAA Tournament games by a total of 13 points.

TOURNAMENT NOTES

- •Butler is 17-10 all-time in NCAA Tournament play. The Bulldogs are 15-6 with two trips to the Final Four and two additional "Sweet 16" appearances in their last six visits to the NCAA national championship.
- •The Bulldogs made their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1962 and then went 35 years before earning a second tournament berth. This year's bid is Butler's 10th in the past 15 years.
- •A year ago, Butler was the fourth team from a non-BCS conference to advance to the Final Four since 1996, when UMass made it from the Atlantic 10. George Mason from the Colonial Athletic Association advanced in 2006, while Memphis of Conference USA reached the championship game in 2008.
- •The Bulldogs were the only team in the 2010 NCAA Tournament to defeat both a No. 1 and No. 2 seed. Butler eliminated No. 1 Syracuse in the semifinals of the West Regional, and then defeated No. 2 Kansas State for the regional title two days later.
- •Current junior Shelvin Mack is Butler's alltime leading scorer in NCAA Tournament action. He's scored 195 points in 11 tournament games (17.7), with a high game of 30 points against Pitt in this year's tournament. Mack has scored in doublefigures in each NCAA Tournament game in which he has played.
- •Butler seniors Matt Howard, Zach Hahn, Shawn Vanzant, Grant Leiendecker and Alex Anglin are making their fourth consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament, matching the Butler record set by last year's duo of Willie Veasley and Nick Rodgers.
- •The Butler record for most NCAA Tournament games is 13, held by current seniors Matt Howard, Zach Hahn and Shawn Vanzant. Matt Howard has the Butler tournament record for games started (13).

Former Butler coach Todd Lickliter participated in four NCAA Championships - 2000 and 2001 as an assistant coach and 2003 and 2007 as head coach.

- •Matt Howard has been named the 2010-11 Academic All-American of the Year. Howard was named to the Capital One Academic All-America Team for a schoolrecord third consecutive year.
- •Matt Howard is one of 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented for notable achievement in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.
- •Matt Howard has broken the record of former teammate A. J. Graves (2004-08) for most career starts at Butler with 131. Howard also owns the Butler career record for games played (139), breaking the mark (134) of former teammate Willie Veasley (2006-10).
- •Matt Howard stands third on Butler's all-time scoring list with 1,915 career points. He's also third on Butler's all-time rebounding list with 870 career rebounds. Howard is Butler's all-time leader in free throws made (635).
- •Matt Howard is the first player in Butler basketball history to score 1,500 career points and grab 800 career rebounds.

- •Matt Howard is Butler's all-time leader for free throws made in NCAA Tournament play with 54.
- •Matt Howard has averaged 14.9 points and 7.2 rebounds during Butler's current 13-game winning streak. He's shot 48% from the field and 38.6% from the three-point arc over the past 13 games.

- Butler head coach Brad Stevens recorded his 100th career win in his 120th career game. Only five coaches in NCAA men's basketball history reached 100 wins faster. and none has done it in the last three decades. Stevens is tied for sixth on the NCAA Division I coaching list for "Fastest To 100 Wins." He's tied for fifth on the list for "Fastest To 50 Wins."
- •Brad Stevens was chosen to serve as an assistant coach for the 2011 USA Men's World University Games Team. Matt Painter of Purdue was named head coach of the team and Cuonzo Martin of Missouri State was selected as an assistant coach. The World University Games will be held August 12-23 in Shenzhen, China.
- •Senior Matt Howard was named the Most Valuable Player at the 2010 Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii, after leading Butler to the team title. Howard averaged 18.7 points and 8.7 rebounds, while helping Butler to victories over Utah, Florida State and Washington State. He finished third in the tournament in rebounding (26) and fourth in scoring (56). The 6-8 Butler forward was joined on the All-Tournament Team by teammate **Shelvin Mack**, who led the Bulldogs with 20 points in the tournament championship game against Washington State. Mack wound up tied for sixth in the tournament in scoring with 50 points.
- Shelvin Mack was recognized on several preseason All-America teams. Mack was chosen first team All-America, along with Kyle Singler of Duke, Harrison Barnes of North Carolina, Jared Sullinger of Ohio State and Jacob Pullen of Kansas State, by Fox Sports.com, and he was named honorable mention All-America by the Associated Press. The 6-3 Butler guard also was ranked fourth among top 2010-11 point guards and combo guards by Gary Parrish of CBS Sports.com. He was named to the John Wooden Award 2010-11 Preseason Top 50 list, and he's on the 2010-11 Naismith preseason watch list. Mack was chosen as the Horizon League Preseason Player of the Year and named first team preseason All-League.
- •The Bulldogs' trip to the Final Four wrapped up the most successful 10-season period in Butler basketball history. Over the past ten seasons, Butler compiled a 244-84 (.748) record, including eight seasons of 20 or more wins. The Bulldogs advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times, made three "Sweet 16" appearances, earned one "Elite Eight" berth and became the first team in Horizon League history to reach the Final Four during the ten-year period. Butler captured seven Horizon League regular season championships and three league tournament titles during the decade, and the Bulldogs advanced to post-season tournament play in eight of the ten seasons.

•Butler's 118 wins over the four seasons from 2006-2010 set a school and Horizon League record for most wins in four consecutive years. The Bulldogs also own the Horizon League's two-year (59, 2006-08 & 2008-10) and three-year (89, 2007-10) records for victories.

Butler has won at least 20 games in six consecutive seasons and in 13 of the past 15 campaigns.

- •Butler is one of just three NCAA Division I schools to win at least 25 games in each of the four seasons prior to 2010-11. The other two are Kansas and BYU.
- •Butler head coach Brad Stevens landed four recruits on the first day of the NCAA's fall signing period. Joining the Bulldogs' 2011-12 freshman class were 6-4 Roosevelt Jones of O'Fallon, Ill., 6-1 Jackson Aldridge of Sydney, Australia, 6-6 Andy Smeathers of Bargersville (Center Grove H.S.) and 6-9 Kameron Woods of Louisville, Ky. (Eastern H.S.). Jones averaged 20 points and 12 rebounds for 30-4 O'Fallon last year, while Aldridge was a gold medal-winning point-guard on Australia's U18 team. Smeathers, averaged 14 points for 17-4 Center Grove, while Woods averaged 7.0 points and 7.0 rebounds at Eastern, one of the top prep teams in Kentucky.

Brad Stevens Head Coach, Butler University



In just his fourth year as a collegiate head coach and 11 years after leaving a business position as a marketing associate, Brad Stevens sits on top of the list for best basketball coaching starts in NCAA History.

Stevens, who owns two Horizon League Coach of the Year awards, has guided the Bulldogs to 116 wins in his brief career, breaking the previous four-year NCAA Division I record of 107 wins set by Everett Case of North Carolina State from 1947 to 1950. He also holds the NCAA three-year record with 89 victories, and he's second on the two-year list with 56 wins. This season, he's guided Butler to a 27-9 campaign, the school's league-record fifth consecutive Horizon League regular season championship, a second straight Horizon League Tournament title, a fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament and a return visit to the Final Four.

Last year, Stevens engineered the most remarkable season in Butler basketball history! The Bulldogs posted a 33-5 overall record, the Horizon League's first 18-0 conference mark and fourth overall unbeaten record, a fourth consecutive league regular season championship, a second Horizon League Tournament crown in three years and a national runnerup finish in the NCAA Tournament. The Bulldogs were nationally-ranked for the fourth straight year, and Butler compiled a school-record, 25-game winning streak, the longest winning streak in the nation! The Butler coach was named NABC All-

District 12 Coach, and he was a finalist for several additional national coaching awards. Butler ended the season as the No. 2-ranked team in the final ESPN/USA Today national poll.

Ín his debut season in 2007-08, Stevens helped Butler become the first team in school and Horizon League history to record 30 wins. The 30-4 Bulldogs captured the Great Alaska Shootout, won a second consecutive Wooden Tradition trophy, and wrapped up Horizon League regular season and tournament championships. Butler won a first-round NCAA Tournament game, before falling in overtime to #5 Tennessee in the second round. The Bulldogs were ranked in the "Top 25" of the A. P. and ESPN/USA Today national polls for 19 consecutive weeks, including a record three weeks in the "Top Butler set school- and league-records for regular season wins (27) and became just the second team in league history to record 16 league victories.

Only three coaches in NCAA Division I history - Bill Guthridge, North Carolina (34), Bill Hodges, Indiana State (33) and Jamie Dixon, Pittsburgh (31) - posted more first-year wins than the Butler coach. And at 31, Stevens became the third-youngest Division I coach to guide his team to 30 wins - the youngest in more than half a continual

In addition to becoming the first men's basketball coach in Butler history to lead the Bulldogs to 30 wins, Stevens broke the 34-game Butler coaching record (28-6) shared by three coaches. He moved into seventh place on Butler's all-time list for coaching victories after just one season.

His second season produced perhaps an even more remarkable record! He guided a Butler team picked fifth in the Horizon League, with no seniors and just one returning starter, to 26 wins, a "Top 25" national ranking, a second consecutive Horizon League regular

season championship and another trip to the NCAA Tournament. He recorded his 50th career win faster than any other coach in Butler men's basketball history, and faster than all but four coaches in Division I history! One coach in NCAA Division I history - Bill Guthridge of North Carolina (58-14, 1998-99) - posted more wins in his first two seasons! Stevens was the mid-season recipient of the Hugh Durham Mid-Major Coach of the Year Award, and he was cited as the Horizon League Coach of the Year.

Stevens, 34, was introduced as the new men's basketball head coach at Butler University on April 4, 2007, just three days after his former boss, Todd Lickliter, was named head coach at the University of Iowa. Stevens became the third consecutive former Butler assistant coach to be named head coach of the Bulldogs, and he served under the previous two Thad Matta and Lickliter.

Stevens worked with Lickliter for six seasons, 2001-07. During his tenure as an assistant coach with the Bulldogs, Butler compiled a 131-61 record, won three Horizon League regular season championships and made four trips to postseason tournament play. In 2006-07, Butler compiled a 29-7 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The Bulldogs won the NIT Season Tip-Off at Madison Square Garden in New York, and the team was ranked in the "Top 25" of both the Associated Press (A.P.) and ESPN/USA Today national polls for 16 consecutive weeks.

Stevens joined the Bulldogs' staff in 2000-01 as coordinator of basketball operations, handling a variety of administrative duties. He was offered a full-time assistant coaching position by Lickliter in 2001-02.

The Butler coach left a position as a marketing associate at Eli Lilly and Company in Indianapolis to pursue a career in basketball coaching. He served in a volunteer capacity in Butler's basketball office during the summer of 2000, before eventually gaining a full-time administrative position under Matta.

Stevens earned a B.A. degree in economics from DePauw in 1999. He was a four-year member of the basketball team at DePauw, earning the squad's "Coaches Award" in 1998-99. He and his wife, Tracy, have two children, son Brady and daughter Kinsley.
