






































#25 STEVEN BENNETT G, 6-2, 195, Jr. New Castle, Ind./Chrysler

Head Coach Chris Holtmann



To say that Chris Holtmann's initial season at the helm of the Butler program was a success would be an understatement. He guided a Butler team that was picked to tie for seventh in the BIG EAST to a 23-11 campaign, a tie for second place in the BIG EAST regular season race and a berth in the 2015 Tournament. Along the way, the Bulldogs knocked off five teams ranked in the "Top 25" at the time, including No. 5/6 North Carolina at the Battle 4 Atlantis, and picked up a second round NCAA

Tournament win.

Butler, unmentioned in the national polls at the start of the season, was among teams receiving votes or ranked in the "Top 25" in 16 of the final 17 weeks of the season. The Bulldogs climbed to as high as No. 15 in the AP national poll and No. 18 in the USA Today national poll. Butler tied the fourth-best turnaround in BIG EAST history (+8) and matched the 11th-highest single season win total in school history. For his efforts, Holtmann was named a finalist for both the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award and the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award.

Holtmann left a position as head coach at Gardner-Webb to become an assistant coach at Butler prior to the 2013-14 season. After one year as an assistant, Holtmann found himself back in the lead chair. On Oct. 2, 2014, Butler Head Coach Brandon Miller requested and was granted a medical leave of absence. Holtmann was appointed interim head coach and given the task of leading the Bulldogs through the start of the 2014-15 season. Three months later, on Jan. 2, 2015, Butler Vice President and Director of Athletics Barry Collier removed the "interim" tag and named Holtmann head coach of the Bulldogs.

Holtmann served as head coach at Gardner-Webb for three seasons (2010-13), leading the North Carolina school through a successful rebuilding effort. He took the Runnin' Bulldogs from eight wins in 2009-10 to a school Division I record 21 victories and a berth in the CollegeInsider.com postseason tournament in his last year. Gardner-Webb won ten of its final 11 games in 2012-13 and finished a game out of first place in the Big South Conference. For his efforts, Holtmann was named Big South Conference Coach of the Year and NABC District 3 Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the head coaching position at Gardner-Webb, Holtmann spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio University under former Butler assistant John Groce. He helped build back-to-back top classes as recruiting coordinator for the Bobcats, and he was part of the staff that led Ohio to the 2010 Mid-American Conference Tournament title and an upset of No. 3 seed Georgetown in the opening round of the 2010

Assistant Coach Terry Johnson



In Terry Johnson's eight seasons as a Butler assistant coach, the Bulldogs have captured four conference regular season championships, three league tournament titles and made six NCAA tournament appearances, including two trips to the National Championship game. He's helped the Bulldogs achieve a "Top 25" national ranking in six of his eight seasons, while helping the Bulldogs to four of the "Top 5" records in school history. During his tenure, Butler

has had seven players earn Academic All-America recognition, and the Bulldogs have sent two players to the NBA.

Overall, Butler is 203-77 in the eight seasons since Johnson became an assistant coach. That success was part of the reason that Johnson was invited to be part of the Villa 7 Consortium in 2015, which brings together university athletic directors and the country's elite assistant coaches in an effort to prepare the next generation of college basketball leaders.

Johnson returned to Butler in April of 2007 after he spent the 2006-07 season as assistant coach at IPFW under then head coach Dane Fife. From the summer of 2004 through the 2005-06 season, he was director of basketball operations at Butler.

Prior to his 2004-06 position as Butler's director of basketball operations, Johnson served an administrative position at Auburn (2003-04), and coached at Lincoln Trail Junior College (2001-03) and Indiana Tech (1999-2001). Johnson began his coaching career at IPFW (1997-1999).

A three-sport athlete at Anderson (Ind.) High School, Johnson played both basketball and baseball at Lincoln Trail in Robinson, III., 1992-94. He was the first Lincoln Trail athlete to be named All-Conference in two sports, and he earned honorable mention All-America recognition in basketball. He went on to play both sports at Lamar University in Texas, 1994-96, and he led the basketball team at Lamar in assists and steals for two straight years.

Johnson earned his Bachelor's degree from IPFW in 1998. He played baseball for the Mastodons and was named All-Conference, team MVP, and Co-Male Athlete of the Year. He played professional baseball with the Tri-City Posse (Pasco, Wash.) in the Western League for two

Assistant Coach Michael Lewis



Michael Lewis, wellknown as a prep and college basketball player in Indiana, begins his fifth season as a member of the Butler coaching staff. In his four years, Butler has twice advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament and orchestrated the fourthbest win improvement in BIG EAST history. Lewis was invited to be part of the Villa 7 Consortium in 2015, which brings together university athletic directors and the country's elite assistant

coaches in an effort to prepare the next generation of college basketball leaders.

Lewis was named an assistant men's basketball coach at Butler in May of 2011. He joined the Bulldogs' staff after spending six seasons as an assistant basketball coach at Eastern Illinois University.

Lewis had a successful stint at Eastern Illinois, where he was named one of the "Top 5" assistant coaches in the Ohio Valley Conference by FoxSports.com in 2010. He was responsible for recruiting several top players to Eastern Illinois, including 2009-10 All-OVC players Tyler Laser and James Hollowell. He helped the Panthers to a 19-12 mark in 2009-10, the third-highest win total since Eastern Illinois became a Division I program.

The Jasper, Ind., native left Eastern Illinois to join the staff of new head coach Porter Moser at Loyola, before accepting the position at Butler. He also served as an assistant coach for one season (2004-05) at Stephen F. Austin and for two seasons as a graduate assistant under Coach Bob Knight at Texas Tech.

A talented backcourt player, Lewis had a successful undergraduate career at Indiana, 1997-2000. He was a team captain and earned third team All-Big Ten honors as a senior, when he was also named MVP of the 1999 Hoosier Classic. He was named to the Big Ten All-Star Team that toured Europe in 1997, and he finished his collegiate career as Indiana's all-time leader in assists with 545. In 2012, Lewis was picked No. 46 on a list of the Top 50 players all-time at Indiana compiled by the Indianapolis Star.

Following his graduation from Indiana in 2000, he played professional basketball in the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) in 2001 and in the United States Basketball League (USBL) in 2000 and 2001. He

The 1996 Jasper graduate was named to the Indiana All-Star Team following a senior season that saw him named the Gatorade Player of the Year.

The Bulldog assistant coach earned a master's degree from Texas Tech in 2004. He and his wife, Nichole, have two daughters, Avery and Emma.





Assistant Coach Ryan Pedon



Ryan Pedon joined the Butler coaching staff as an assistant in April, 2015. He brings 13 years of coaching experience to the Butler sidelines.

Pedon spent the past two seasons on the staff at Illinois under Head Coach (and former Butler assistant) John Groce.

"We are excited about adding Ryan to our staff. Ryan is a tireless worker and brings terrific and broad experience. He could not have come more highly recommended from everyone he has worked

for," said Chris Holtmann. "His success in recruiting, player development and coaching, as well as his understanding and appreciation for Butler University make him a great fit with our program."

During Pedon's three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Toledo, the Rockets made an incredible jump from four wins in 2010-11 to 19 wins, including the school's first postseason victory in 11 years, in 2011-12. That turnaround was the second best in the nation! In his final season at Toledo, the Rockets tied for first in the MAC's West Division, securing the school's first division title and most conference wins since 2007.

Pedon experienced similar success at Miami, Ohio, where he helped the Redhawks to winning conference records in all five seasons in Oxford. The RedHawks won the MAC Tournament title in 2007 and earned the school's first NCAA Tournament bid since 1999. And during his time at Kent State, the Golden Flashes recorded three 20-win seasons and finished first in the MAC's East Division in both 2003 and 2004.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Pedon played college basketball at Wooster (Ohio). He was a three-year varsity letterwinner and helped the Fighting Scots to three regular season North Coast Athletic Conference championships and three NCAA Division III Tournament bids.

He earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Wooster in 2000 and a master's degree in sport organization from Miami, Ohio, in 2002.

He and his wife, Stephanie, have a son, Maddox.

Emerson Kampen

Basketball Analyst



Emerson Kampen, a 2013 Butler graduate and former Butler basketball player, will serve the Butler staff as basketball analyst for the upcoming season. Kampen is a trusted aide to Butler coach Chris Holtmann, having previously served in assistant coach and graduate assistant positions.

Kampen began the 2014-15 season as a graduate assistant for the Bulldogs. He stepped in to fill an assistant coach position when Holtmann was elevated to head coach just prior to the start of the season, and he helped the Bulldogs to a 23-11 season, a tie for second place in the

BIG EAST and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Butler advanced to the Round of 32.

He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant, handling a variety of administrative and on-court duties in his first year on then Coach Brandon Miller's staff. Then in October of 2014, Kampen was appointed to an assistant coach position, when Miller requested and was granted a medical leave of absence.

A former Yorktown High School basketball standout, Kampen was a four-year letterwinner and five-year team member with the Bulldogs, 2008-13. He played on Butler's two Final Four teams, and he served as a co-captain of the Bulldogs' 2012-13 team, which posted a 27-9 record and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament. During his five seasons at Butler, the Bulldogs compiled a 136-45 record and made five straight postseason tournament appearances.

Kampen earned a marketing degree from Butler in 2013. He and his wife, Kylie, have a son, Emerson IV.

Brandon Crone

Coordinator of Basketball Operations



Brandon Crone, a four-year letterwinner and two-time team captain with the Bulldogs, begins his second season on the Butler staff as Coordinator of Basketball Operations. He handles a variety of organizational and administrative duties for the Bulldogs, including scheduling and team travel.

Crone enjoyed a successful playing career at Butler, helping the Bulldogs to 78 victories and two postseason tournament berths over his four seasons. He was named Butler's Most Valuable Player in 2006-07, after leading the Bulldogs to a 29-7 record and a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Crone first arrived at Butler in 2003, following a successful high school basketball career at Frankfort High School. He was a two-time All-State performer at Frankfort, and he was named to the Indiana All-Star Team following his senior season. He was one of just nine players in the state to average a double-double as a senior.

After graduating from Butler, Crone went on to play professional basketball for three seasons in Europe. He returned to the U.S. in 2010 and accepted a position as assistant basketball coach at Park Tudor High School in Indianapolis, where he helped lead the Panthers to the 2011 Indiana Class 2A state championship. He went on to serve as an assistant coach for three seasons at Nova Southeastern, an NCAA Division II school in Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

A 2007 Butler graduate with a marketing degree, Crone and his wife, Morgan, are the parents of a son, Kellar.

Butler University




The five faculty and 113 students present when Butler University opened in 1855 laid a solid foundation for 157 years of creative change and progress. Today's more than 4,000 students continue to look ahead while treasuring the traditions unique to Butler.

The young school, originally named North Western Christian University, was unusually innovative. It was the first in Indiana, and only the third in the nation, to admit women on an equal basis with men. With the appointment in 1858 of Catherine Merrill as Demia Butler Professor of English, the institution became the second in the country to appoint a woman faculty member, the first to establish an endowed chair specifically for a female professor and the first to establish a professorship in English literature. The school was also the first in Indiana to allow its students, with parental consent, to choose subjects under a new "elective" system.

As Indianapolis grew, the city's commercial district began to penetrate the heavily-wooded campus at what is now the corner of Thirteenth Street and College Avenue. In 1873, the board of directors decided to sell the downtown campus and accept a gift of 25 acres in Irvington, then a suburb east of Indianapolis. In 1877, North Western Christian University became Butler University, taking the name of its founder, Indianapolis attorney Ovid Butler.

Butler moved again 50 years later, as the "Circle City" continued to grow. In 1928, classes were held for the first time in Jordan Hall, an imposing new Gothic structure erected on the beautiful Fairview Park Site, a wooded tract north of the city on the White River and the Inland Waterway Canal.

Today's students come from nearly every state in the nation and from many foreign countries to enroll in degree programs in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, or in one of four professional colleges -- Business Administration, Education, Fine Arts or Pharmacy and Health Sciences. Butler is one of only 21 private



schools in the country offering a pharmacy program.

True to the vision of its founders, the University continues to offer an array of professional and pre-professional programs within the context of a strong commitment to the traditional arts and sciences and to the values of liberal education. Butler continues to welcome highly motivated, intellectually curious men and women, and to prepare them for lives of professional and community service and creative, ethical action. Butler is one of the top 20 U. S. colleges for producing business executives, is in the top 10% for preparing future Ph.D.s and is located in the #2 city for college graduates starting a career.

"The Classic Arena Keeps Getting Better"

Hinkle Fieldhouse has reigned as one of the nation's great sports arenas for more than eight decades. The classic facility was constructed in 1928 and it has stood up to the test of time, maintaining the splendor, character and atmosphere that made it one of the nation's most famous basketball arenas for nearly a century. And during the summer of 2014, the Fieldhouse underwent a major \$36 million renovation that provided significant upgrades and improvements to make a great facility even better!

Highlights of the project included wider concourses for better accessibility, an elevator for public use and ADA accessibility, added restrooms (including family restrooms that are ADA accessible), improved and expanded concessions, added and more comfortable chairback seating in the main arena, a new scoreboard with video playback capability and kiosks marking historic moments in Hinkle Fieldhouse history. A new student-athlete academic center was added, as well as a new sports medicine center with a hydrotherapy unit. The project included a new and expanded weight room, new administrative and coaches offices, an expansion of the Wildman Room for hospitality, new office/locker room suites for men's and women's basketball and new team meeting rooms with video screens.

In addition to the interior improvements, the 86-year-old facility also received extensive exterior renovations, including the tuck-pointing of 282,000 bricks, the replacement of more than 9,700 windowpanes with energy-efficient glass and an update of the utilities.

The Fieldhouse, which remained virtually unchanged for more than 60 years after its original construction, received its first major face-lift during the summer of 1989. Among the changes to the historical building were new chair-back seats in the lower arena, new doors and windows on the south side of the exterior, new basketball offices, a training room

and locker rooms off the main arena, a VIP lounge, repaved parking lot, outside landscaping, extensive interior painting and a new public address system. Additional improvements included a new weight room, new football offices, sports information/marketing offices, and administrative offices.

The original construction of Butler Fieldhouse was part of a massive project designed to give Butler one of the finest athletic plants in the nation. The project was financed by a corporation of 41 prominent and farsighted Indianapolis businessmen. Completion of the Fieldhouse was guaranteed when Butler signed a lease agreement with the Indiana High School Athletic Association allowing the high school state tournament to be played in the massive

new facility. Butler's association with the IHSAA continued from 1928 to 1971, with a brief interruption during the war years, 1943-45.

Butler played its first basketball game in the Fieldhouse on March 7, 1928, defeating Notre Dame 21-13, in overtime. Since the Fieldhouse was not entirely completed at that time, the building dedication was held off until December 21, 1928. The name of the facility was changed in 1966 from Butler Fieldhouse to Hinkle Fieldhouse in honor of Butler's legendary coach and athletic director Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle, who built the University's athletic fame over nearly half a century.

In addition to being the home of Butler basketball, the Fieldhouse has been host to a Nobel laureate, six U. S. presidents (Herbert Hoover, Dwight Eisenhower, Richard Nixon, Gerald Ford, Bill Clinton and George H. W. Bush), the Billy Graham Crusade, the Sonja Henie Ice Show, four professional basketball teams, the U.S. Olympic basketball trials, the first USA-USSR basketball game, all-star basketball games for the NBA and ABA as well as the

East-West College All-Stars, the nationally-prominent Butler Relays in track, tennis matches of both Bill Tilden and Jack Kramer, the 1982 World Goal Ball Championships, a three-ring circus, several equestrian events, the Roller Derby, and a six-day bicycle race. The building also housed the U. S. military as a barracks during World War II. And Butler's homecourt was in the spotlight world-wide as the site of the championship game in the popular movie "Hoosiers."

During the summer of 1987, Hinkle Fieldhouse again received national and international attention as the site for the volleyball competition at the tenth Pan American Games. The largest crowd (14,500) ever to see a volleyball match in the United States gathered in the Fieldhouse to see the USA defeat Cuba in the men's gold medal match.

When the Fieldhouse was originally constructed, it was the largest basketball arena in the United States, and it retained that distinction for more than 20 years. Renovation in the early 1990's reduced the seating capacity from 15,000 to 11,043, and later it was reduced to 10,000. The current capacity after the most recent renovation is 9,100. The Fieldhouse was named to the National Register of Historic Places in 1983, and declared a National Historic Landmark in 1987.

"HOOSIERS"

In December of 1985, Hinkle Fieldhouse was turned into a Hollywood stage for the filming of the popular movie "Hoosiers," inspired by the 1954 Indiana High School state championship game at Butler Fieldhouse. Tiny Milan Indiana won the 1954 state championship when Bobby Plump hit a last second shot to defeat Muncie Central, 32-30. Plump later attended Butler University.

The production crew moved into the Fieldhouse for one week to shoot the climactic final scene in the movie. When the finished product was released to the general public, it became an instant hit. "Hoosiers" was recently named one of the "Top 10" sports movies ever!

The "new" Home of the Bulldogs

The Hinkle Fieldhouse renovation project included a significant change in the men's basketball office/locker room complex. The "Home of the Bulldogs" received a complete overhaul, including a new larger locker room, a new dedicated video room and increased office and meeting space.

The Bulldogs moved into their current basketball office/locker room complex, located behind the west side of the main arena in Hinkle Fieldhouse, in 1989. The suite was part of a \$1.5 million renovation of Hinkle Fieldhouse and featured a main reception area, four basketball offices, a team film area, a film editing area and the team locker room. The new locker room complex has added to the original space, while significantly upgrading all aspects of the former basketball team area.

The Bulldogs have a dedicated state-of-the-art video room featuring multi-level seating. Completion of the new team video area was made possible by a gift from former Butler player Gordon Hayward, now in the NBA with the Utah Jazz.
