COLTS GO FOR 10-0 VS. STREAK-BREAKER CINCY; STREAKING BEARS & PANTHERS SQUARE OFF

Records are being set...coaches are taking *big* chances...and the Colts keep marching on.

So let's see what happens in the NFL *this* week.

Coming off a kickoff to the second half of the season that saw the longest play in NFL history (108-yard TD return by Chicago's **NATHAN VASHER** of a missed field goal)...Minnesota score TDs on kickoff, punt and interception returns – another first in an NFL game...and for the second week in a row, a team (Tampa Bay) go for the win in the last seconds rather than opt for a tie and overtime -- things definitely look to be unpredictable in the NFL for the next seven weeks.

Plus, the Indianapolis Colts are undefeated, and go for a nice round 10-0 this week against a division co-leader (Cincinnati) that halted the NFL's last big streak. If Indy reaches 10-0, it will be the 16th club in NFL history to do so, starting with the 1929 Green Bay Packers and ending most recently with the 1998 Denver Broncos.

It's nice to be undefeated, say the Colts. But speak to us later in the season, when an undefeated record *really* means something. "Talk to us about 16-0 when we get to 15-0," says Colts defensive tackle **COREY SIMON**. "The talent in this league won't allow us to look any farther ahead."

Looking at just Week 11, there are some notable games on tap:

INDIANAPOLIS COLTS (9-0) at CINCINNATI BENGALS (7-2)

STORYLINE: Peyton vs. Palmer.

Beware, Colts! The last team to go 9-0 in the NFL, Kansas City, was defeated two years ago this week (11/16/03) in Cincinnati 24-19, led by the Bengals current backup QB, **JON KITNA**.

A year ago, Cincinnati **QB CARSON PALMER** and **WR CHAD JOHNSON** drove to Indianapolis on a Monday night to sit in the stands and learn from the magic of Colts **QB PEYTON MANNING** and **WR MARVIN HARRISON**.

Now they get to see them up close. And although Manning is in his eighth year and Palmer only in his second as a starter, the two share an NFL record. Palmer's nine 100.0 passer-rating games in a row dating back to last season tie the NFL record of Manning in 2004.

Offensively, the teams are matched well. Indy is ranked second in the NFL, Cincy fifth. The key components of each's quarterbacking, running and rushing games are all ranked in the top 10 in the league (Colts' Manning, **RB EDGERRIN JAMES**, and WRs Harrison and **REGGIE WAYNE**; and Bengals' Palmer, **RB RUDI JOHNSON** and WR Johnson).

Defensively, the Colts (No. 4 in the NFL) would seem to have the edge, especially with sack-meisters **ROBERT MATHIS** (NFL-leading 9.0 sacks) and **DWIGHT FREENEY** (7.0, who goes against Bengals Pro Bowl **T WILLIE ANDERSON**). But...the Bengals lead the league in interceptions (20) and total takeaways (29) for an NFL-high take/give margin of + 20. Topping the league in pickoffs is Cincy's **DELTA O'NEAL** with six.

Cincinnati is not interested in just playing the spoiler. They're only interested in building upon *their* record. "We're playing for ourselves," says **LB BRIAN SIMMONS**. "We don't have to play the spoiler. We don't have to worry about what

anybody else is doing. We've got to play for ourselves."

CAROLINA PANTHERS (7-2) at CHICAGO BEARS (6-3)

STORYLINE: Two division leaders. Two streaking teams. One windy city.

And if it's anything like last Sunday at Soldier Field, get ready for some wind-aided crazy bounces!

The Panthers (6-0) and Bears (5-0) are two of the four hottest teams in the NFL (Indianapolis, 9-0; Seattle, 5-0). They've built those streaks on steady quarterbacking (Carolina's **JAKE DELHOMME** has the league's second best TD percentage, 6.3; Chicago rookie **KYLE ORTON** doesn't have great stats, just five wins in a row)...two receivers who were Panthers teammates last year (Carolina's **STEVE SMITH** and Chicago's **MUHSIN MUHAMMAD**)...and, most of all, staunch defenses.

The Bears – harking back to their heritage – boast the league's top defense (253.7 yards per game) and have surrendered the fewest points (107). The Panthers are tied for the NFC lead in takeaways/giveaways with a + 9, and trail only Cincinnati in total takeaways (29 to 26).

Red-zone battle to watch: Carolina ranks first in NFL red-zone offense, Chicago first in red-zone defense.

TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS (6-3) at ATLANTA FALCONS (6-3)

STORYLINE: Battle of the lefties.

It will be a sight you don't often see in the NFL – two left-handed quarterbacks squaring off. And off last week's performance by one of them, it is a pairing the NFC South may be seeing a lot of in the future.

Tampa Bay **QB CHRIS SIMMS** may have come of age in Week 10 while leading the Bucs to their go-for-the-two-points 36-35 win over Washington. Simms threw for 279 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions, including the TD that led to the game-deciding two-point conversion. "He has a rare ability to throw the ball down the field, and accurately, and he proved that last week," says Bucs head coach **JON GRUDEN**.

Of course, the game's *other* lefty – **MICHAEL VICK** -- has already established himself as one of the NFL's most versatile, exciting quarterbacks. Vick – the same age as Simms (25) -- is 29-14-1 (.670) as a starter in his five years.

With both teams tied for second in the division behind Carolina, the key to the game could be the Falcs' No. 1 NFL rush game against the Bucs' No. 5 rush defense. Former Buccaneers **RB WARRICK DUNN** – No. 3 in the league in rushing (896 yards) -- has never broken 100 in four games against his former team.

PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (4-5) at NEW YORK GIANTS (6-3)

STORYLINE: A big divisional game...and they do it again in three weeks.

"We have an opportunity in the next seven games to determine our own fate," says Giants head coach **TOM COUGHLIN**. That goes for both teams, and it starts in the division.

The Giants are tied with Dallas for the lead. The Eagles are in last place. The division games are getting short (Giants have three left after this week, the Eagles two). Things are definitely serious.

The matchup pits a Giants' defense that has not allowed more than 138 total yards (and no 100-yard rusher/receiver) to each of their past three foes against an offense that has averaged 348.7 yards in its last three. Something has to give.

MINNESOTA VIKINGS (4-5) at GREEN BAY PACKERS (2-7) (Monday night, ABC, 9:00 PM ET)

STORYLINE: Boy, what a win will do!

Just when things seemed dire for these two NFC Northerners, they pull off exciting Week 10 wins, and things are sunnier.

The Vikings have won three of their last four, two of them with **QB BRAD JOHNSON** replacing injured starter **DAUNTE CULPEPPER**. Former Packers **S DARREN SHARPER** returns for the first time to Green Bay. Pack **QB BRETT FAVRE** knows him well. Sharper leads the NFL in interception-return yards (241) and is tied for second in pickoffs (5).

For the Packers, just when their 30th-ranked running game seemed in dire straits with injuries to **AHMAN GREEN** and **NAJEH DAVENPORT**, along comes former Division I-AA (Liberty) **RB SAMKON GADO** last week to upright their attack. The aspiring doctor, in his first start on his 23rd birthday, rushed for 103 yards on 25 carries and scored three TDs.

"In some ways, he came out of nowhere," says Favre. "But in some ways I did too."
