## UK HOOPS TRAVES TO MIAMI UNVERSTY FOR EARLY ROAD TEST

After a season-opening 82-48 win over Morehead State on Friday, No. 9/10 Kentucky has little time to rest as it travels to Oxford, Ohio to take on the Miami RedHawks Sunday in the Cats' first road test of the season. UK is the highest ranked team to ever play at Millett Hall.

Despite a sluggish start offensively, UK's tenacious defense forced Morehead into 36 turnovers and held the Eagles to just 27.8 percent shooting from the floor (15-of-54). Reigning Southeastern Conference Player of the Year Victoria Dunlap and SEC Freshman of the Year A'dia Mathies scored 18 points apiece in leading the Cats over Matthew Mitchell's former school. Dunlap also grabbed a team-high nine rebounds to go with a game-high seven steals and four blocks. Four UK freshmen earned their first career points led by Bernisha Pinkett (12), Maegan Conwright (8), Samantha Drake (4) and Kastine Evans (4).

Kentucky extended its home winning streak to 19 games, which ties for the second-longest home winning streak in school history and currently ranks 10th nationally.

Miami opens its season against UK after defeating Tiffin University in exhibition play. The RedHawks return four starters and six letterwinners from last year's squad that finished 9-22 overall, 6-10 in Mid-American Conference play. That includes last year's MAC Freshman of the Year and third-team All-MAC member in sophomore Courtney Osborn.

## UK HOOPS RUNS AWAY FROM MOREHEAD STATE 82-48 IN SEASON OPENER

Scoring 18 of the first 20 points of the second half, No. 9/10 Kentucky ran away from visiting Morehead State to claim a season-opening 82-48 victory before 6,793 fans Friday morning in Memorial Coliseum.

Senior forward Victoria Dunlap and sophomore guard A'dia Mathies scored a game-high 18 points each while redshirt-freshman Bernisha Pinkett added 12 points as Kentucky extended it current home-win streak to 19 games. Dunlap also grabbed a team-high nine rebounds to go with a game-high seven steals and four blocks.

Chynna Bozeman led Morehead State with 16 points. Ashar Harris snagged a game-high 12 rebounds to go with three points for the Eagles.

After MSU's Bozeman made a pair of free throws to trim UK's lead to 27-22 at 18:29 in the second half, the Wildcats posted 18 consecutive points over the next 5:45 to grab a 45-22 cushion. UK sophomore forward Brittany Henderson (Pasadena, Calif.), freshman guard Maegan Conwright (Arlington, Texas) and Dunlap scored four points each during the run.

Kentucky turned up its defensive intensity in the second half, causing the Eagles to commit 20 of its 36 turnovers after intermission and holding them without a field goal for the first 7:30. The Wildcats scored 40 points off Morehead State miscues for the game while limiting the Eagles to 15 -of-54 shooting (27.8 percent).

## UK HOOPS DUO NAMED TO NAISMITH WATCH LIST

Senior forward Victoria Dunlap and sophomore guard A'dia Mathies have been named to the prestigious 2010-11 Naismith preseason watch list, the Atlanta Tip Off Club announced.

## DUNLAP ON WADE TROPHY AND WOODEN WATCH LIST

Senior forward Victoria Dunlap is one of 25 players on the 2010-11 preseason Wade Watch list for the State Farm Wade Trophy and one of the top 30 preseason candidates for the prestigious John R. Wooden Award announced by The Los Angeles Athletic Club.

Dunlap enters her senior season as one of the most decorated players in UK Hoops history. She was named the 2010 Southeastern Conference Player of the Year by The Associated Press and the league's coaches and was one of the 10 State Farm All-Americans named by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association last year, becoming UK's first All-American since Valerie Still in 1983. She is also on the Wade Trophy watch list awarded to the nation's top player.
Dunlap averaged a team-high 18.1 points, 8.4 rebounds, 3.1 steals and 1.9 blocks per game in helping lead the Wildcats to the NCAA Elite Eight and the school's sixth straight postseason appearance in 200910. Along the way, Dunlap set single-season school records for blocks (66) and steals (107) and became the 27th member of UK's prestigious 1,000-point club, climbing up to No. 14 with 1,284 career points.

## DUNLAP NAMED CANDIDATE FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Senior forward Victoria Dunlap has been selected as one of 30 national candidates for the prestigious Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in women's basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.
Dunlap, a native of Nashville, Tenn., is on track to graduate in May of 2011 with a bachelor's degree in family studies and a minor in psychology. Throughout her Wildcat career, she has been an active member in the community and a leader on the hardwood. She has volunteered at several community service events in her four years, including playing bingo the at Kentucky Children's Hospital, participating in the "Cats Cultivating Character" program, where student-athletes teach character lessons once a month to third grade students at a local elementary school, volunteering to pack food for God's Pantry BackPack program, visiting patients at UK's Markey Cancer Center, and guest speaking at various elementary schools and camps in the local area.

On the court, the 6-foot-1 forward is already revered as one of the most heralded players in UK Hoops history. The preseason Southeastern Conference Player of the Year and first-team All-SEC selection by the league's coaches and media is coming off a banner junior season that saw her average an impressive 18.1 points, 8.4 rebounds and a SEC-high 3.1 steals per game. She is also a candidate for the State Farm Wade Trophy and John R. Wooden Award for the 2010-11 season awards that go to the nation's top player.

## CATS RANK IN TOP 15 OF PRESEASON MAGAZINES; DUNLAP NAMED PRESEASON ALLAMERICAN

On the heels of a record-breaking season, Kentucky earned top-15 preseason rankings by Sporting News Magazine, Athlon Sports Magazine and Lindy's Basketball Annual.

The Wildcats, whose remarkable season included an NCAA Elite Eight appearance, the most wins (28) in program history, a school-record 11 Southeastern Conference victories and the highest conference finish (second) in 28 years, were ranked No. 9 by Lindy's, No. 11 by Athlon Sports and No. 12 by Sporting News.

One of the main cogs last season was senior Victoria Dunlap. She was named a first-team preseason All-America choice by Sporting News, while Athlon and Lindy's chose Dunlap as a second-team selection.

## ELZY PROMOTED TO ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

After serving two seasons as an assistant coach at Kentucky, Kyra Elzy was promoted to associate head coach by Coach Matthew Mitchell in August.
Elzy, a LaGrange, Ky., native, has almost 10 years of experience as a collegiate basketball coach, including the last two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Kentucky. With her assistance, UK has garnered some of the top recruits in the country, including the No. 5 recruiting class for the upcoming season, according to Blue Star Basketball.
In addition to her recruiting responsibilities, Elzy also coaches UK's guards. Under her tutelage, freshman guard A'dia Mathies was named SEC Freshman of the Year last season and was named to the Full-Court Press Freshman All-America team, UK's first freshman All-American since 1980.

## KENTUCKY PICKED SECOND IN THE SEC BY MEDIA; DUNLAP, MATHIES NAMED ALL-SEC

Kentucky was picked to finish second in the Southeastern Conference this season in a voting of a select panel of both Southeastern Conference and national media members.

Tennessee, which returns all five starters from a squad that went 32-3 and won both the 2010 SEC regular-season and tournament championships last year, earned 15 -of-17 first-place votes. Kentucky received one first-place vote, as did Auburn. The Wildcats finished 28-8 overall, $11-5$ in SEC play last season, and advanced to the regional finals of the NCAA Tournament after defeating Liberty, No. 24/25 Michigan State and No. $4 / 4$ Nebraska. The Cats' run to the Final Four ended with a loss to No. 12/12 Oklahoma.

Tennessee topped the order of finish with 202 points, with Kentucky (183), Vanderbilt (157), Georgia (150), LSU (147) and Auburn (120) rounding out the top half of the league. South Carolina (84), Arkansas (81), Alabama (65) and Ole Miss (47) were next with Mississippi State (45) and Florida (45) tied for last place. Kentucky returns three starters, including Victoria Dunlap, A'dia Mathies (Louisville, Ky.) and Keyla Snowden (Lexington, Ky.), while adding one of the top recruiting classes in the nation.
Dunlap was the overwhelming choice by the media for SEC Women's Basketball Player of the Year with 13 votes. The remaining votes were for Tennessee's Angie Bjorklund and Shekinna Stricklen. Dunlap led Kentucky in almost every statistical category last season, averaging 18.1 points and 8.4 rebounds per game and guiding the Wildcats to the NCAA Elite Eight. She was

## UK HOOPS RANKED NO. 9 IN PRESEASON AP POLL; 10TH IN USA/TODAY COACHES POLL

After a record-breaking season which included an NCAA Elite Eight appearance, the most wins (28) in program history, a school-record 11 Southeastern Conference victories and the highest conference finish (second) in 28 years, Kentucky was picked to start the 2010-11 season at No. 9 by The Associated Press and No. 10 by the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll.
It marks the highest preseason ranking by the AP since the Wildcats began the 1982-83 season at No. 8 and the highest ranking in the preseason Coaches poll in school history. Kentucky is one of four SEC teams to rank in the Top 25 with Tennessee (No. 4), Georgia (No. 19), and Vanderbilt (No. 24). Other Kentucky opponents in the polls are Duke (No. 6) and Notre Dame (No. 12).

UK has appeared in the AP poll 102 times in the poll's 35 -year history. UK's longest streak in the poll is 61 consecutive weeks from week 11 during the 1979-80 season to week 17 of the 1982-83 season.

Kentucky is one of eight schools in the nation to have both its men's and women's teams ranked in the top 25 of the AP poll. The others are: Baylor, Tennessee, Duke, North Carolina, Georgetown, Ohio State, Michigan State.

## CATS PERRRRRFECT AT HOME

With 19 consecutive victories in Memorial Coliseum, the Cats have tied the second-longest home winning streak in school history and the nation's 10th-longest home winning streak.

The Cats charted an unblemished 17-0 home record last season, marking just the second undefeated home record in school history. The only other team to accomplish that feat was the 198081 squad as it went 15-0 in Memorial Coliseum.
The 17 home wins also set a new school record for the most regular-season wins in Memorial Coliseum.

The Cats have won 15 consecutive games at home against non-conference opponents, dating back to 2008.

UK is 38-10 at home in the Matthew Mitchell era.

Bishop chose Kentucky over Ohio State.
Goss, Indiana’s leading Miss Basketball candidate, is listed as the nation's 17 th overall player and the No. 4 guard in the country, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. After helping lead the Giants to a No. 2 national ranking in 2009-10, Goss was named first-team Indiana All-State (2010), first-team All-Metro Super Team (2010) and first-team AP Indiana All-State. She also is a two-time first-team AllMetropolitan Interscholastic Conference (2009 and 2010) choice and two-time first-team AllMarion County (2009 and 2010) selection. During her prep career, Ben Davis High School has charted an impressive 83-2 record, including 58 consecutive wins.

Goss chose the Cats over Maryland, South Carolina, Purdue and Indiana.

With Bishop and Goss signing, UK Hoops has the nation's No. 10 recruiting class, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, marking Mitchell's second consecutive top-10 recruiting class.

## KENTUCKY ONE OF NATION'S MOST IMPROVED TEAMS LAST SEASON

At season's end Kentucky was one of the nation's most improved teams. UK finished the 2008-09 campaign with a 16-16 record and one year later was $28-8$ overall, having recorded the most wins in school history (28). That equals a +10.0 improvement which tied for ninth nationally. Not even the skeptics saw this coming as the Cats were picked to finish 11th in both the media and coaches preseason polls.

## CATS TO BE TELEVISED A SCHOOL-RECORD 16 TIMES DURING REGULAR SEASON

Fresh off one of the most successful seasons in school history, which included an Elite Eight appearance, Kentucky will be televised a schoolrecord 16 times during the regular season. The previous high was 12 regular-season televised games last year and 18 total contests, which included six postseason games.

Five games will be televised on the ESPN family of networks, including two Southeastern Conference games on ESPN2 at Memorial Coliseum (Tennessee on Feb. 7 and LSU on Feb. 13). Five were chosen by the Big Blue Sports Network and FSN South and FOX Sports Net will carry three games. The SEC Network picked up two road games at Vanderbilt (Feb. 20) and at Auburn (Feb. 27) while Wazoo Sports will televise the intrastate battle with Louisville on Dec. 5.

Kentucky head coach Matthew Mitchell's teams are known for using three "winning tools" for success: honesty, hard work and discipline. So it's no surprise that in just three seasons, he has used these winning tools to build a program that has quickly ascended back into the national spotlight.

In three seasons, the Wildcats have advanced to three consecutive postseason tournaments, including an NCAA Elite Eight appearance last season, defeated nine nationally-ranked opponents, finished in the top 10 of the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll, had seven players receive All-SEC accolades, including UK's first SEC Player and Freshman of the Year, had six SEC Academic Honor Roll members, one SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year, one State Farm/WBCA All-
American and all eight players in their final season of eligibility received their degree.
Year Three proved to be the best year yet as Mitchell was named SEC Coach of the Year for his remarkable job in turning around a team that went $16-16$ overall, $5-9$ in conference play last season to a $28-8$ overall record in 2009-10. The Cats' 28 overall wins, including 11 SEC wins were school records and UK finished second in the league despite being picked to finish 11th in the preseason polls.
In his first season with the Wildcats, Mitchell led UK to a school-record fourth consecutive postseason tournament. The Wildcats posted a $17-16$ overall record and finished fourth in the SEC with an 8-6 mark, just one win shy of the school record. The eight league wins were the most conference wins by a first-year head coach in UK Hoops history. Mitchell also became the first head coach in UK Hoops history to lead their team to the semifinals of the SEC Tournament in his/her debut season. The Wildcats earned a first-round bye and upset No. 23/21 Georgia in the quarterfinals (57-50) before falling to the NCAA Final Four ${ }^{\oplus}$ participant LSU in the semis. UK went on to defeat Middle Tennessee and James Madison in the postseason WNIT before falling to eventual champion Marquette in the quarterfinals, 69-64.

Despite another tough schedule and injuries to key players throughout the season, the Wildcats again advanced to postseason play with a second-round finish in the WNIT in his second season. It marked their school-record fifth consecutive postseason tournament appearance. Mitchell became the first head coach since Terry Hall in the 1980-81 and 1981-82 seasons to advance to postseason play in the first two seasons as head coach.

The Cats finished 16-16 overall, 5-9 in the SEC and defeated No. 13/19 Tennessee 66-56, their first win over the Lady Vols in Memorial Coliseum in 23 years.
