MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Credentials are required for access on the floor at all University of Alabama home women's basketball games. Media credential requests should be sent in writing on company letterhead to the Alabama athletics communications office. Placecards on press row identify media seating. Credentials may be picked up at the media will call table in Foster Auditorium.

Photographer credential requests should also be made in writing, on company letterhead. The photo area includes both ends of the court.

Media must notify the athletics communications office within 48 hours if planning to attend the game for parking purposes. Media cannot be added to the parking list inside the 48-hour window and will have to find parking on their own.

INTERVIEWS

Alabama head coach Kristy Curry and studentathletes are available for interviews in person or, with prior arrangement, by telephone. Alabama practices are in Foster Auditorium. Practices are closed to the media, unless prior arrangements have been made. Curry and studentathletes can be made available following the completion of practice, depending upon class schedules, travel or other plans. Media wishing to attend practice should contact athletics communications at least one day in advance. Practice plans can be obtained through the athletics communications office.

On game day, only postgame interviews are allowed. Please arrange all interviews through the athletics communications staff.

RADIO BROADCASTS

Visiting teams wishing to broadcast games from Foster Auditorium are provided access to one phone line. Calls are charged to the visiting radio network. Should an additional line be required, broadcasters must arrange their own hookup through The University of

Alabama Telecommunications Office at (205) 348-6300. Visiting radio broadcasters must call in advance or have their media relations office notify Alabama that they will be broadcasting the game and will require credentials. Alabama provides a monitor that is hooked up to the computer stats program, providing electronic media up-to-the-second stats.

GAME SERVICES

Complete team and individual statistics (box score), quotes and a running play-by-play are provided to the media who cover the Crimson Tide at home. Copies of stats, game notes, media guides and roster sheets are available in the media alcove, located on the upper level. Complete books, which include the box and play-by-play, will be brought to the media alcove/postgame interview room promptly following the game's conclusion. Brief guotes from Kristy Curry and the visiting coach, as well as some of Alabama's student-athletes, are included in the postgame package. At home games, with five minutes remaining, a member of the Athletics Communications staff will collect postgame interview requests. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, the two head coaches and the players requested will come to the interview room adjacent to press row in Coleman Coliseum or in the team video room in the back of Foster Auditorium.

Ample electrical outlets and phone jacks are available in the workroom in Foster Auditorium. Media wishing to install a private phone line must do so several weeks in advance by calling the University Telecommunications Office (205) 348-6300.

INTERNET

Information about The University of Alabama athletics can be found online at RollTide.com. Site offerings include rosters, schedules, results, stats, boxscores and biographical information. Members of the media can access high-resolution photos of Tide student-athletes and teams via the Crimson Tide Digital Media platform (CrimsonTideMedia.com), which also provides access to a centralized location for helpful information on covering the Tide and credential requests.

From the web site, Tide fans can find a link to listen to Alabama games live via the internet and follow home game action via live stats.

Wireless internet is available throughout Foster Auditorium.

VIDEO FOOTAGE/SATELLITE FEEDS

The University of Alabama, through Crimson Tide Sports Marketing and the Crimson Tide Sports Network, offers a weekly 15-minute satellite feed consisting of interviews with coaches and athletes, taped highlights and a

narrated taped package. The package is offered September through May. During the season, the women's basketball team is included in this package. For its key home games, Alabama may offer a feed following the game that night.

The University of Alabama Athletics Department renovated and expanded Foster Auditorium to create a new home for the Crimson Tide's volleyball and women's basketball programs, beginning in 2011. The remodel of Foster included refurbishing the arena portion of the building with new seating, both on the floor level and the second level that overlooks the court, creating an impressive competitive atmosphere for both sports.

The restoration of the venerable three-story building was completed in January of 2011, in time for the women's basketball game between Alabama and Florida on Feb. 13, 2011, when the Tide defeated the Gators, 64-59.

The renovation also included suites for both programs to house locker rooms, team areas, meeting and video rooms and coaches offices. A weight room and athletic training facilities also were included in the project.

Originally built in 1939, Foster Auditorium was named in 1942 for Richard Clarke Foster, president of The University of Alabama from 1937-41. It was the largest and most expensive of 14 buildings added to campus between 1936 and 1939 using funds from the Public Works Administration.

In its original capacity, Foster served as home for intramural sports, graduations, concerts, lectures and campus meetings. It also served as the home of several varsity athletic programs over the years, including men's basketball from 1939-68, women's volleyball from 1974-81 and 1989-95, women's basketball, which played selected games in Foster, from 1975-81, and gymnastics from 1975-84.

Additionally, the women's athletic program, including coaches and administrative offices, was located in Foster during the 1970s through the early 1980s.

The volleyball program, which began in 1974, practiced and competed in Foster for 15 seasons (1974-81 and 1988-95). The volleyball program was the last team to leave Foster, moving

to Coleman Coliseum beginning with the 1996 season. After playing four seasons (1996-99) on the main Coleman Coliseum floor, volleyball competed in the Coleman Auxiliary Volleyball Extension (CAVE) for 11 seasons (2000-10), before returning to Foster Auditorium in 2011.

Women's basketball played 35 games in Foster from 1975-81, splitting time between Foster Auditorium and the main floor of Coleman Coliseum, until permanently moving to Coleman Coliseum from 1981-2011. Following the completion of the renovation, women's basketball played its final three home games of the 2010-11 season in Foster before its first complete season in the building during the 2011-12 campaign. The Crimson Tide owns a 60-39 overall record in Foster.





ON YOUR CAMPUS...









Dr. Stuart R. Bell became the 29th president of The University of Alabama on July 15, 2015. Founded in 1831, the University is the state's flagship and a student-centered, comprehensive research university.

Dr. Bell has broad administrative experience and is a nearly 30-year veteran of higher education. He previously served at UA for 16 years where he founded and directed an interdisciplinary research center.

"I certainly look forward to leading this university as its next president and working alongside the many men and women who have made it a great university today and who will also make it a great university in the future," Bell said on the day he was named UA president. "It's just great to be here in Tuscaloosa, and it's great to be in Alabama and to, once again, be able to say Roll Tide!"

Immediately prior to becoming UA's president, Dr. Bell was executive vice president and provost at Louisiana State University. During Dr. Bell's tenure there and earlier at the University of Kansas, where he served as dean of its College of Engineering, those institutions opened new facilities, and student recruitment, retention and success were emphasized.

First joining UA in 1986 as an assistant professor in the UA College of Engineering's department of mechanical engineering, Dr. Bell was named department head nine years later.

With research interest in combustion engines, Dr. Bell has expertise in alternative fuels for engines, innovative engine designs and modeling of engine and engine processes. He directed UA's Center for Advanced Vehicle Technologies.

Dr. Bell was awarded the Society of Automotive Engineers' Ralph Teetor Award for Outstanding Contributions to Research and Teaching in 1988. He was presented the T. Morris Hackney Faculty Leadership Award for the UA College of Engineering in 2001, and, in 2005, he received the Richard S. Woodbury Award from the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

A native of Abilene, Texas, Dr. Bell earned a nuclear engineering degree from Texas A&M University in 1979. He earned his master's and doctorate degrees in mechanical engineering from Texas A&M in 1981 and 1986, respectively.

He and his wife, Susan, have three adult children, Stuart, Stacy and Stephen.

- Enrollment at The University of Alabama reached a record high of 37,100 for fall 2015. The entering freshman class, at 7,211 students, is the largest and best qualified in UA history. More than one-third (36 percent) of the freshman class scored 30 or higher on the ACT, placing them in the top 5 percent of students taking the ACT.
- The University of Alabama is a leader among public universities nationwide in the enrollment of National Merit Scholars with more than 600 currently enrolled.
- Ranked among the top 50 public universities in the nation in U.S. News and World Report's annual college rankings for more than a decade, UA ranked 38th among public universities in the 2015 rankings. UA's latest college rankings include:
- The School of Law is ranked 22nd among all law schools in the nation, spring 2015.
- The School of Library and Information Studies is ranked 18th nationally in the latest rankings for library schools, spring 2013.
- University of Alabama students continue to win prestigious national awards. Forty-five UA students have been named Goldwater Scholars, including four in 2015. The University of Alabama has produced a total of 15 Rhodes Scholars, 14 Truman Scholars, 30 Hollings Scholars and six Boren Scholars.
- Twenty-eight UA faculty have received NSF CAREER Awards, the nation's most prestigious recognition of top-performing young scientists, in disciplines ranging from nanoscience and engineering to biological sciences.
- Dr. Samantha Hansen, UA assistant professor of geological sciences, is one of many faculty recognized nationally for research. Hansen is one of 102 scientists who received the 2014 Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers, the highest honor bestowed by the U.S. government on science and engineering professionals in the early stages of their independent research careers. Fourteen University of Alabama graduates have accepted Fulbright awards to study and teach abroad during 2015-2016. Three will be based in Spain and two each in Brazil, Malaysia and Turkey. Others will be in Czech Republic, Cyprus, France, Peru and South Korea.
- U.S. News and World Report ranks The University of Alabama's Manderson Online Business Master's programs 12th in the nation, up from 75th last year. The rankings are based on level of accreditation, faculty credentials, admissions selectivity, reputation for excellence among peer institutions and academic and career support services offered to students.
- Public Accounting Report's 2014 rankings place UA's Culverhouse School of Accountancy's undergraduate and master's programs eighth in the nation and the doctoral program 12th.
- PRWeek Magazine has recognized the public relations program in The University of Alabama's College of Communication and Information Sciences as one of the top five programs in the nation six times.

BILL BATTLE

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



William R. "Bill" Battle is in his third year as Director of Athletics The University of Alabama. Battle took over the job on Friday, March 22, 2013, succeeding Mal Moore who had held the position since November,

1999. Battle joined the Crimson Tide after a career as a college football coach and entrepreneur that was consistently hallmarked by innovation and foresight.

A native of Birmingham, Ala., Battle attended The University of Alabama on a football scholarship and enjoyed a successful playing career as a three-year starter at end for the Crimson Tide under legendary head coach Paul "Bear" Bryant from 1960-62. Battle was a member of Bryant's first national championship team at Alabama in 1961. Generally regarded as the team's best end throughout his playing career, Battle came to Tuscaloosa after starring in three sports at Birmingham's West End High School.

An excellent student, Battle earned a bachelor's degree in Biology (minor in Psychology) from The University of Alabama in 1963 and a master's degree in Education from The University of Oklahoma in 1964. He was an Academic All-SEC selection as a senior in 1962 and was selected to play in the Senior Bowl all-star game in Mobile, Ala., in January of 1963. He was named first team tight end and second team defensive end on The University of Alabama All Decade Team of the 1960s.

Battle entered the coaching profession as a graduate assistant at The University of Oklahoma in 1963 under famed head coach Bud Wilkinson. In 1964 and 1965, he served as an assistant coach at the United States Military Academy while serving a two-year military tour. In 1966, he moved on to the University

of Tennessee, where he served as an assistant coach under head coach Doug Dickey for four seasons (1966-69) until he was named head coach of the Volunteers in 1970. When he was named head coach, Battle was the youngest head coach in college football at the age of 28.

During his seven-year tenure as head coach (1970-76), Battle's teams went 59-22-2, finished three seasons ranked in the nation's top 10 among five top-20 finishes and won four out of five bowl games. Battle's Tennessee teams won 11 games once (1970) and at least 10 games in three different seasons (1970, 1971 and 1972). His first Tennessee team finished the season ranked fourth in both national polls. His 1971 team finished ranked ninth in both national polls and the 1972 Tennessee squad finished ranked eighth by the Associated Press and 11th in the Coaches' poll.

Battle began a career in the private sector after his coaching career ended. He held various positions within Circle S Industries in Selma, Ala., and served as president of two different companies, as well as vice chairman of the Circle S Holding Company Board. During his six years at Circle S, the organization grew from two companies earning \$12 million in annual sales to 10 companies earning \$60 million.

Battle founded The Collegiate Licensing Company (CLC) in 1981, and served as president and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) until 2002. He also served as chairman of the board of Licensing Partners International (LPI), which was created in 2001 to represent the licensing interests of non-collegiate sports properties, as well as corporate and entertainment properties.

A 1981 inductee into the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame, Battle was inducted as the first member of the charter class of the National Collegiate Licensing Association Hall of Fame in 2000. He was the recipient of the 2005 Paul W. Bryant Alumni Athlete Award at The University of Alabama and was inducted into the International Licensing Industry Merchandisers' Association (LIMA) Hall of Fame in 2008.

Battle received a National Football Foundation award in December 2008 for Outstanding Contributions to Amateur Football. In June 2010, Bill was inducted into the National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators' (NACMA) Hall of Fame. He was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame, receiving its Lifetime Achievement Award in 2011. He currently serves on the boards of the Bryant-Jordan Student-Athlete Foundation, The University of Alabama A-Club Educational & Charitable Foundation, the Crimson Tide Foundation, and the National Football Foundation.

Battle's wife, Mary, is a summa cum laude graduate of the University of Texas School of Nursing with a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing. She earned a Master of Science in healthcare administration from the University of Alabama-Birmingham. For many years Mary worked in the healthcare industry both in the clinical setting and for healthcare corporations that developed and managed physician provider networks including the development of strategically significant relationships with payors and business and industry.

Mary currently serves on the Arthritis Foundation National Board of Directors and is the chairperson of the Arthritis Foundation Leadership Council for the Birmingham market. She is also a member of the Volunteer Engagement Task Team for the Arthritis Foundation. In addition, Mary is an inaugural member of the UAB School of Medicine Board of Visitors and is active in fundraising activities for UAB that support research projects targeting more effective treatment for rheumatoid arthritis.

The Battles are part of UAB's Stem Cell Institute Board and are both active in their support of UAB's Department of Rheumatology. In their leisure time, the Battles enjoy life on their ranch in Georgia. Mary is an avid equestrian while Bill enjoys working on various projects around the ranch.

2015-16 SEASON OUTLOOK

The University of Alabama women's basketball program came up with a new twist to an old phrase in August: When the going gets tough, the tough get going ... to Italy.

With athletic programs able to take an educational trip abroad every four years, the Crimson Tide spent 10 days enjoying Rome, Florence, Venice and Como, and along the way participated in 10 practices and games against the Cameroon National Team, Basket Montecchio Maggiore and a Lithuanian university team.

Besides being a trip of a lifetime, it was an opportunity for the student-athletes to visit somewhere they might never get to see unless they go on to play professionally oversees.

"There are a lot of benefits," head coach Kristy Curry said. "It's part of the foundation. We're going to compete at the highest level in every aspect of the program, with how we travel, how we educate you. It's just a commitment."

While the program's growing pains continued in 2014-15, when Alabama finished 13-19, Curry knows she's likely looking at one more season in which many of Crimson Tide's newcomers have to contribute immediately.

While she continues to add to the roster this season's squad will only have two seniors and one active junior.

"I feel like we've made huge strides in recruiting," said Curry, who is entering her third season at Alabama. "Having signed the

high school player of the year in Alabama and the high school player of the year in Mississippi in our second year, we're thrilled that they're on camps now. With the attitude of this class we're excited about the future."

Shaquera Wade out of Huntsville was the player of the year in Alabama, while Trista Magee won the Mississippi version of the award while playing for Presbyterian Christian School in Ellisville.

Both are listed as 6-foot guards, which is reflective of the growing size of the Crimson Tide's roster. Wade averaged 18.4 points, 10.8 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 3.2 steals last season, while Magee became her program's all-time leading scorer with more than 3,000 career points.

She was also the first player to commit to Alabama after Curry was hired, and along with C'Coriea Foy, a 5-11 wing from Fayetteville, N.C., headlined the recruiting class ranked 24th in the nation by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report.

"The pieces are starting to fall into place," Curry said. "I feel like with another recruiting class a year from now we feel like we're going to really start to look the way we want to look with size and athleticism. This is a league of depth, it's not for the weak and the weary. It's about size, athleticism and numbers."

However, one of the reasons why all four could get early playing time is that Alabama will be without its leading scorer and rebounder from last season as Ashley Williams will miss all of 2015-16 for medical reasons.

Named to the Southeastern Conference All-Freshman Team in 2014 she averaged 13.7 points and 6.1 rebounds as a sophomore, and also led the Crimson Tide in minutes, field-goal percentage and free throws. The 6-foot forward had made 54 career starts.

Her absence leaves three-year starter Nikki Hegstetter as the only returning frontcourt staple. She averaged 5.3 points and 5.3 rebounds last season, but tied Williams for the most offensive rebounds with 71 and tied for the most team blocks with 25.

The product of Kennesaw, Ga., comes into the fall with 68 career starts, and not only did she complete her undergraduate degree in marketing in the spring, but Hegstetter was named the Austin Scholar for Outstanding Senior in the Culverhouse College of Commerce, which is presented annually to the outstanding undergraduate student in the Culverhouse College of Commerce and Business Administration, as selected by the entire college faculty.

Additionally she received the James Larry Carmichael Department of Marketing Outstanding Student Service Award, which is given to the student with the most distinguished reputation for service to the entire University community.

"She's just everything that's great about being a student-athlete," Curry said. "That's contagious on our team. On the floor, classroom, community, locker room, she's 'it' for us. With her anchoring that five-spot, her talent and ability on the court, off the court is huge for us."

Alabama will be looking for more consistency from sophomore forward Quanetria Bolton, who entered 29 games off the bench last season and averaged 5.1 points and 3.5 points while tying for the team lead in blocks.

Meanwhile, sophomore forward Diamanté Martinez might be the most improved player on the roster and during the Italy trip received a player of the game award. She might be in the same boat as second-year guard Meoshonti Knight, who appears ready to contribute.

"You know the best thing about freshmen is that they become sophomores, and I definitely see that with her," Curry said. "The light has come on with the intensity and the pace of play. I'm expecting big things from her, Hannah Cook as well. Those kids were thrown into the fire early in their career, they started and played a lot of minutes, and you'll see some of the benefits of that now."

Sophomore Karyla Middlebrook, who was thrust into the starting lineup at point guard last season, is back as the leader of the backcourt after averaging 7.1 points and 3.2 assists, while junior Breanna Hayden is poised for her first full season with the Crimson Tide.

She had to sit the fall semester due to transfer rules and the former Baylor player suited up for just 18 games in 2014-15. Curry will be looking to both her and senior guard Khadijah Carter to provide a spark and leadership.

"Those seven have an opportunity to impact us in a big way on the perimeter," Curry said.







Hardworking, energetic, aggressive and disciplined all are words that can be used to describe Alabama head women's basketball coach Kristy Curry, who enters her third season with the Crimson Tide. Curry and her staff came in and immediately made an impact at Alabama, which was clearly evident both on and off the court.

In 2013-14, the Tide won seven Southeastern Conference games marking the most since the 2001-02 season. Included in those wins was the first in Lexington against Kentucky since 2002, the first against Georgia since 2004, snapping a 23-game losing streak to the Lady Bulldogs, and the first in program history at Vanderbilt's Memorial Gym. Last season, the Tide reached double-digit wins in non-conference play for the first time since 2010, which included a victory over 12th-ranked Nebraska.

Overall, Alabama has won 27 games under Curry in her first two seasons at the Capstone bringing her overall coaching record to 336-184 (.646) in 16 seasons.

Home-game attendance has increased significantly in Curry's first two seasons as well as season ticket sales have gone up 53 percent since she took over at UA. Foster Auditorium drew a crowd of 2,678 for its win over Georgia on Jan. 26, 2014, setting a new record attendance for women's basketball in the historic building. Fans then answered the call to top that number the next week against Tennessee, and would set another record as 3,002 packed into Foster to watch the Tide and Lady Vols. The record was broken, yet again, last season when 3,133 were on hand for the Mississippi State game. Alabama's average attendance has continued to grow and is up an average of 1,405 per game since Curry's arrival (1,145 in 2012-13; 1,992 in 2013-14; 2,550 in 2014-15).



Another area that has seen dramatic improvement is the team's involvement in community service. The Tide has taken part in several activities throughout local communities and established its Community Caravan, which is now in its second season. The Tide has visited and worked with several local organizations and groups such as Habitat for Humanity, Walk to End Alzheimer's, Hoops for Heart at Huntington Place Elementary School, Upward Basketball, MDA Lock-Up, playing games and serving dessert to the residents of Capstone Village Retirement Community, making gingerbread houses with the students of the CrossingPoints transition program, Project Angel Tree and the program's annual 5th Grade Fastbreak. The team was recognized for its efforts during the athletic department's 2013-14 year-end banquet as the women's team with the most service hours throughout the year.

Curry also received a special honor of her own at the 2014 Women's Basketball Coaches' Association Convention in Nashville, Tenn., as she was awarded the Kay Yow Heart of a Coach Award, presented by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. The award, established in 2008 to honor the late Kay Yow, recognizes a basketball coach who has coached according to Biblical principles, and to the heart, body and mind of the athlete.

Prior to arriving at The Capstone, Curry spent seven seasons at the helm of the Texas Tech Lady Raider basketball program where she compiled a record of 130-98 (570). She guided the Lady Raiders to a 21-11 record in 2012-13 and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament for the second time in three years.

In her final season in Lubbock, senior guards Monique Smalls, Casey Morris and Chynna Brown picked up All-Big 12 Conference Team honors in 2012-13, led by Brown as a first team selection. Tech was the only Big 12 team to have all three starting backcourt members named to the all-conference team.

In addition to her time on the court, Curry has spent time off the court contributing on several national and regional committees. She currently is a member of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association, serving on the Defensive Player of the Year Award committee and is also a member of the USA Today Sports Board of Coaches that votes on the NCAA Division I Top 25 Coaches Poll.

After establishing herself as one of the most successful women's basketball coaches in Purdue history, where she coached from 1999-2006, Curry took over the reins of the traditionrich program at Texas Tech on March 30, 2006.

On Nov. 23, 2007, Curry added another milestone to her resume as she captured her 200th career win in a 78-56 victory over Kennesaw State during the Basketball Travelers Classic in Lubbock. That 2007-08 season also saw the Lady Raiders return to postseason play, as they competed in the Postseason WNIT.

In her first stint as a head coach, Curry was hired at Purdue in April of 1999, becoming the first women's basketball coach in NCAA history to inherit a national championship-winning team. She led her first squad to four-straight wins in the 1999-2000 season, extending Purdue's school-record win streak to 34 consecutive games, a mark that ranks sixth in NCAA history.

In her seven years at the helm of the Boilermakers, Curry compiled a record of 179-51 (.778) and was 86-26 (.768) in Big Ten Conference games. Curry's teams won two Big Ten regular-season (2001, '02) and three Big Ten Tournament (2000, '03, '04) championships. She also guided her teams to seven NCAA Tournament appearances, including the Final Four and championship game in 2001. Curry

became only the second coach in NCAA history to guide her team to the NCAA championship game in her second year as a head coach.

In her fourth season at Purdue, Curry collected her 100th career coaching win with a 74-48 victory against Indiana on Feb. 27, 2003. Curry needed only 126 games to reach that milestone, getting there faster than any coach in Purdue history. Curry also recorded her 100th victory quicker than coaching icons such as Pat Summitt of Tennessee, Geno Auriemma of Connecticut, Tara VanDerveer of Stanford and Jody Conradt of Texas.

Not only did Curry have successful teams, but she also had coached some very successful student-athletes in West Lafayette. Under Curry's leadership at Purdue, Katie Douglas became the third player in Big Ten history, and the first Purdue player, to earn two Kodak All-America honors (2000, 2001). Douglas was the 2000 and 2001 Big Ten Player of the Year and was named the 2001 Big Ten Female Athlete of the Year. A two-time All-Big Ten pick, Douglas is one of six Purdue players from the Curry era to earn first team all-conference honors.

Shereka Wright, an assistant on Curry's staff at Texas Tech and now an assistant at Alabama, was the 2000 USA TODAY and Gatorade High School Player of the Year out of Copperas Cove, Texas, and finished her four-year career under Curry as Purdue's second all-time leading scorer. Following her senior season, in which she led the Big Ten in scoring during conference games, Wright earned first-team honors on the inaugural Wooden Women's All-America Team. Lubbock native Erika Valek, a four-year starting point guard for the Boilermakers, capped her career by receiving the 2004 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award as the nation's top player under 5-foot-8.

The on-court success of Curry's teams has carried over into the classroom as well. Curry has coached several all-conference, all-academic and All-America players over the span of 16 successful seasons, including eight Southeastern Conference honor roll recipients in 2014 and nine in 2015. In seven years at Texas Tech, her student-athletes received Academic All-Big 12 honors 13 times and were named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team five times. Curry's student-athletes received Academic All-Big Ten distinction 24 times during her career at Purdue. Every Boilermaker who finished her playing career at Purdue during Curry's tenure went on to graduate.

Curry began coaching in her home state of Louisiana, as she started at the prep level as a head coach at Weston (1988-90) and Mansfield (1990-91) high schools. From there, Curry quickly moved to the college ranks as an

assistant at Tulane for two seasons (1991-93). She then spent a year at Stephen F. Austin (1993-94) before moving on to Texas A&M for the next two seasons (1994-96).

Curry later returned to the state of Louisiana to be an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech for Hall of Famer Leon Barmore, during three seasons from 1996-99. In 1996-97, Louisiana Tech went 31-4 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Lady Techsters then posted another 31-4 record in 1997-98 and finished as the NCAA runner-up. In Curry's final season in Ruston, Louisiana Tech went 30-3 and advanced to the NCAA Final Four.

Off the court, Curry has placed a high priority on giving back to the community. She has been heavily involved with several organizations, including: the American Cancer Society Coaches vs. Cancer, Joe Arrington Cancer Center, Junior League, of Lubbock, Salvation Army, South Plains Food Bank, Women's Protective Services, Komen for the Cure, Ronald McDonald House, UMC Children's Center, AMBUC's of Lubbock, Shoes for Orphan Souls, Toys for Tots, United Way, Girl Scouts and Habitat for Humanity.

A highly sought-after guest speaker, Curry was a keynote speaker for the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal's "A Time for Women" event and has been a spokeswoman for the Muscular Dystrophy Association's "Aisles of Smiles." Curry also has made personal appearances for numerous fundraising events and has recorded several public service announcements.

A native of Olla, La., Curry graduated from LaSalle High School and then went on to earn her bachelor of science degree in health and physical education at Northeast Louisiana in 1988. She earned a master's degree in education at Stephen F. Austin in 1994.

Curry and her husband Kelly have two daughters, Kelsey and Kendall.





Kelly Curry is entering his third season with the Crimson Tide women's basketball team, working primarily with the post players, while also handling scheduling, recruiting and scouting.

In his first season with the program, Alabama won seven Southeastern Conference games marking the most since the 2001-02 season. Included in those victories was the first in Lexington against Kentucky since 2002, the first against Georgia since 2004, snapping a 23-game losing streak to the Lady Bulldogs, and the first in program history at Vanderbilt's Memorial Gym. Overall, the Tide won 14 games, playing one of the most difficult schedules in the nation.

Freshman forward Ashley Williams became the first Alabama player in three years to be named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. The two-time SEC Freshman of the Week and member of the Cavalier Classic All-Tournament Team, Williams finished as the only freshman in the SEC to rank in the top 20 in scoring and top 15 in rebounding against league opponents coming in at No. 17 in scoring, averaging 13.8 points, and No. 14 in rebounding with 6.9 boards per contest.

In 2014-15, Alabama collected double-digit wins in non-conference play for the first time since 2010 and had several finish in the final Southeastern Conference rankings, including Williams, who ranked No. 1 in field goal percentage for the entire season.

Curry came to Tuscaloosa after serving in the same position at Texas Tech from 2006-13. Throughout his tenure, the Lady Raiders made



five postseason appearances and had three 20-plus win seasons.

Prior to his seven-year stint in Lubbock, Curry spent seven seasons at Purdue, where he also coached the post players and was heavily involved in recruiting and scheduling. The Boilermakers advanced to the NCAA tournament in each of those years, making the national championship game in 2001. In addition, Purdue won three Big Ten Tournament Championships (2000, 03, 04) and two Big Ten regular season titles (2001, 02).

Curry began his coaching career at Louisiana Tech in 1998, where he spent one season on the sidelines under Hall of Famer Leon Barmore. That year, the Lady Techsters posted a 30-3 record and reached the NCAA Final Four.

Curry graduated from Texas A&M with a degree in business administration management in 1990 and received his teaching certification in 1993 from Stephen F. Austin.

He and his wife Kristy have two daughters, Kelsey and Kendall.



Shereka Wright, former collegiate standout at Purdue and member of the WNBA, enters her third season at Alabama as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. Wright works primarily with the guards and also assists with scouting.

In her first season in Tuscaloosa, the Crimson Tide had several notables including the most Southeastern Conference wins since the 2001-02 season with seven, as well as its highest seed in the conference tournament since 1999. Alabama collected its first win in Lexington against Kentucky since 2002, its first against Georgia since 2004, snapping a 23-game losing streak to the Lady Bulldogs, and the first in program history at Vanderbilt's Memorial Gym.

Following season No. 1, Wright helped construct a signing class that ranked in the top 25 nationally, featuring both the Alabama and Mississippi high school players of the year in Shaguera Wade and Trista Magee.

In 2014-15, Alabama reached the double-figure win column in non-conference play for the first time since 2010 and had several individuals make the final Southeastern Conference rankings.

Wright began her coaching career at Texas Tech and was responsible for the perimeter players, recruiting, scouting, academics and equipment. She spent seven seasons in Lubbock with head coach Kristy Curry, helping the Lady Raiders advance to the postseason five times and win 20 or more games in her final three seasons at Tech.

Prior to coaching, she spent two seasons in the WNBA, averaging 3.1 points and 1.6 rebounds for the Phoenix Mercury, but missed all of the



2006 season after suffering a torn Achilles tendon during training camp.

Wright was selected as the 13th overall pick in the 2004 WNBA Draft by the Detroit Shock after a stellar collegiate playing career under Kristy Curry at Purdue. She was the third player in program history to be named to the All-Big Ten First Team on three occasions and was also honorable mention Kodak All-America as well as a finalist for the Wade Trophy, Naismith Award and Wooden Award. As a freshman in 2001, Wright was named to the NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team.

Throughout her four-year career, the Boilermakers appeared in four NCAA tournaments, advancing to the national championship game in 2001, the Elite Eight in 2003 and the Sweet 16 in 2004, and won two Big Ten regular season titles (2001, 02) and a pair of Big Ten Tournament crowns (2003, 04).

Wright graduated from Purdue in 2004 with a degree in health and fitness.



Grant Fausset, who has overseen the daily organization of Kristy Curry's programs for the past seven seasons, enters his third year at Alabama.

In this position, Fausset is responsible for coordinating all travel; serving as the team liaison with equipment, facilities, housing, the business office, event management, marketing, athletics communications and nutrition; coordinating logistics for all official and unofficial visits and serving as the director of the team's booster club. In addition, he will handle the team's



video needs including practice footage and exchange.



He and his wife Lindsey have a daughter Bellamy and a son Tress.







































FLORIDA A&M 44 ALABAMA 60

Alabama won its 2014-15 season opener by a score of 60-44 over Florida A&M on Friday evening in Coleman Coliseum. Sophomore Ashley Williams recorded the sixth double-double of her career to pace the Crimson Tide with 21 points and 11 rebounds.

The game was the first the women's basketball team played in Coleman Coliseum since it moved back in Foster Auditorium at the end of the 2010-11 season. The Tide is 17-2 when opening the season in Tuscaloosa.

Williams was joined in double figures by freshmen Hannah Cook and Meoshonti Knight, who added 10 points apiece. The Rattlers were led in scoring by junior Olivia Atilla with 14 points and in rebounding by senior Taneka Rubin, who had nine boards.

For the game, Alabama shot 36.1 percent (22-61) from the floor, while limiting Florida A&M to 27.3 percent (18-66) of its attempts. The Tide outrebounded the Rattlers, 55-45, and outscored Florida A&M 32-14 in the paint.

The Rattlers scored six points in just over a minute to take the early lead in the contest, but Alabama would go on a 17-2 run over the next 10 minutes to distance itself from Florida A&M. The Tide led by nine or more for the duration of the half and took a 30-18 advantage into the locker room at halftime.

Florida A&M used a 12-6 run out of the break to pull within six, but a three-pointer by Cook at the 11:10 mark put the Tide back in front by nine. Alabama outscored the Rattlers 13-6 to end the game.

Alabama put up 16 unanswered points to start the game, holding Arkansas-Pine Bluff scoreless for nearly five minutes. The Tide continued to lead throughout the period, pulling ahead by as many as 37 and took a 42-11 advantage into the locker room at halftime. halftime

UA picked up right where it left off after the break and outscored the Lady Lions, 29-16, in the second half. The Tide took its largest lead of the game for the first time at the 6:29 mark when it went ahead by 44. Its lead would again reach 44 with 52 seconds to go.

Alabama fell in its first Southeastern Conference road contest of the season, 64-47, at No. 19/19 Georgia in Stegeman Coliseum. With the loss, the Crimson Tide dipped to 11-6 overall and 0-2 in league play, while the win lifted the Lady Bulldogs 13-2 on the season and 1-1 in the SEC.

Sophomore Ashley Williams and freshman Quanetria Bolton led Alabama in scoring with 12 points apiece, while Williams and senior Sharin Rivers led the Tide on the boards with six each. Junior Tiaria Griffin had a game-high 16 points for UGA, 14 of which came in the first half.

Georgia scored nine unanswered points to start the game before Williams laid in the first basket for Alabama at 16:36. From there the Lady Bulldogs went on to hit eight of their next nine attempts to pull ahead 23-7 with 12:21 remaining in the period. The Tide would score 15 of the next 25 points, but a 9-1 run for Georgia to close out the half gave the home team a 41-23 advantage heading into the break.

Alabama outscored the Lady Dogs 11-5 over the first seven of the second half to pull within 12, but six straight from Georgia pushed the lead back out to 18 with 11:21 to go. The Lady Dogs led by as many as 21.

Alabama shot 30.2 percent (16-53), while Georgia was 46.0 percent from the floor (23-50). For only the third time all season, the Tide was outrebounded as the Lady Dogs collected 41 boards compared to Alabama's 32. The Tide also struggled from the free throw line, hitting 11 of 24 attempts.

a team-high seven rebounds, matching her career
best. Sophomore Ashley Williams (9) and freshman
Quanetria Bolton (8) rounded out the top scorers for
the Tide. Florida junior Cassie Peoples dropped a
game-high 18 points for the Gators.

Florida got on the board first, but back-to-back threes, one from Middlebrook and one from Rivers put Alabama on top at the 15:41 mark. From there, the Gators scored eight unanswered points over the next four minutes gave Florida the 12-6 edge. Alabama bounced back with a 10-2 run to end the half, capped off by a three-pointer from freshman Hannah Cook to lead 25:22 at the break.

The Tide continued its run in the second half, outscoring the Gators, 7-2, over the first four minutes. Alabama remained in front until a 9-2 run by Florida late in the half gave the Gators a one-point edge with 5:10 left on the clock. UA tied the game on two more occasions, but Florida held on in the end, making key free throws in the final seconds.

For the game, Alabama shot 39.1 percent (18-46), while Florida finished the night at 41.3 percent (19-46). The Gators scored on 14 of their 18 free throws and edged the Tide in rebounds, 30-29.

Freshman Hannah Cook scored a careerhigh 24 points in an 80-73 loss to Auburn in Alabama's regular season finale at Auburn Arena.

Joining Cook in double figures for Alabama was sophomore Ashley Williams with 15 and freshman Quanetria Bolton with 10. Junior Nikki Hegstetter finished as the team's leader in rebounds with seven. Auburn had four players in double figures, led by sophomore Brandy Montgomery, who scored 30 points.

Turnovers proved costly for the Tide as the Tigers scored 30 points off 24 UA miscues. Alabama hit 49.0 percent (24-49) of its shots, while Auburn was 48.3 percent (29-60) from the floor. The teams were nearly identical from the free throw line as the Tide was 18-for-28, while the Tigers were 16-for-25.

Cook knocked down her first of five three pointers only 18 seconds into the game to get Alabama on the board first. Auburn scored the next seven straight before two more threes, one from redshirt freshman Karyla Middlebrook and another from Cook, put the Tide back in front at the 16:32 mark. From there, the Tigers used a 20-6 run to take a 27-15 advantage with 7:59 to play in the period. Alabama trailed by 17, but outscored Auburn, 10-2, over the final 3:18 to cut it to nine, 38-29, at halftime.

The Tigers remained in front throughout the second half, extending their lead out to as many as 21. The Tide gradually chipped away at its deficit and cut it to nine before running out of time on the clock.

Alabama lost its opening round game at the 2015 Southeastern Conference Tournament to Vanderbilt, 66-56, at Verizon Arena. With the loss, the Crimson Tide ends its season with a 13-19 overall record.

Sophomore Ashley Williams scored a gamehigh 21 points and was joined in double figures by junior Nikki Hegstetter with 10. Freshman Hannah Cook collected a team-best seven rebounds, while Hegstetter dished out a team-high five assists. The Commodores had three finish in double figures, led by freshmen Rebekah Dahlman and Paris Kea, who had 16 apiece.

Cook started the game the same as she did last time out, knocking down a three pointer to get Alabama on the board first. The Tide continued to lead over the next three minutes until Vanderbilt evened the score at 7-7 before taking the lead on its next possession. The Commodores built an 11 point advantage midway through the half, but Alabama came back to score 10 unanswered to cut it to one, 22-21, with 4:52 to go. A jumper from freshman Cuanetria Bolton with 43 seconds left tied the game, but freshman Audrey-Ann Caron-Goudreau countered on the other end to give Vanderbilt a 26-24 edge at the half.

Hegstetter converted on the opening possession of the second half to tie the game, however so would the Commodores on their first attempt of the period for the 28-26 lead. Alabama evened the score one more time before Vanderbilt went on to outscore the Tide 10-2 over the next two minutes to extend its lead out to eight. Alabama was able to cut it to three but would come no closer down the stretch.

For the game, Alabama shot 42.3 percent (22-52), while Vanderbilt hit 50.0 percent (29-58) of its attempts. The Commodores also outrebounded the Tide, 34-27.
